San Diego State Aztecs (9-9, 2-5 MWC) at New Mexico Lobos (13-7, 3-4 MWC)

- **When & Where:** Wednesday, Jan. 31, 2007, at The Pit (18,018), Albuquerque, N.M., 7 p.m. (MST).
- **Webcast/Live Stats:** Live stats and a live audio broadcast featuring Bill Earley will be available via SDSU's official website www.goaztecs.com for Wednesday's contest.
- **The Records:** The San Diego State women's basketball team finishes the first round of Mountain West Conference play Wednesday with its second consecutive road game at New Mexico at 7 p.m. at The Pit. The Aztecs, who fell at TCU on Sunday afternoon 83-57, are looking to stay above .500 by claiming their first victory over the Lobos since 2001. SDSU is currently seventh overall in the league standings with a 2-5 mark, but has boasted a lead of five or more points in six of the seven outings. New Mexico enters the game at 13-7 overall, including a 3-4 record in league action with wins over Air Force, Colorado State and UNLV.
- **SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns:** Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the second year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 244-181 in 15 seasons, while she is 163-116 in 10 campaigns at SDSU.
- **New Mexico Head Coach Don Flanagan:** Flanagan is in his 12th season at New Mexico. His school and career coaching record is 252-111.
- **New Mexico Series History:** New Mexico leads the series 19-13 and is 9-5 in games played in Albuquerque. The Lobos have claimed the last 14 contests with the most recent SDSU win coming at home in 2001. (Last: New Mexico def. San Diego State, 75-48, on Feb. 25, 2006 in San Diego, Calif.).

Aztec Women's Hoops Completes First Round Of League Action Wednesday At New Mexico

The Aztec women's basketball team will look to stay above .500 when it heads to New Mexico Wednesday for its final game of the first round of Mountain West Conference play. SDSU is in search of its first victory over New Mexico since 2001, when the two schools collide at The Pit at 7 p.m. in Albuquerque. The outing with the Lobos is the second straight on the road for the Aztecs, who are playing five of their first eight conference games away from Cox Arena. San Diego State has dropped its last two games to schools receiving votes in both national polls, including a 83-57 loss at TCU on Sunday.

Last Time Out: TCU Uses Strong Second-Half To Down SDSU, 83-57

San Diego State, playing its second straight game against a team receiving votes in both national polls, was outscored 53-35 in the second half as TCU pulled off its 17 straight victory at home 83-57 Sunday at Daniel-Meyer Coliseum. With the loss, the Aztecs fell to 2-5 in league action and 9-9 overall, dropping to .500 for the first time since early December. The Lady Frogs, meanwhile, improved to 15-6 and 5-2 in



SDSU junior **Jennifer Layton (Sacramento, Calif.)** scored nine of her team-high 14 points in the first half, making 5-of-12 shots from the field, including a pair of three-pointers to go with seven rebounds. Senior **Erin Jackson (Sparks, Nev.)** had 11 points off the bench all in the second half, while **Shannon Clay (Inglewood, Calif.)** added seven boards and a career-best three blocks in just 18 minutes of action.

The first half saw a combined 23 fouls and 24 turnovers between the two schools. The Lady Frogs took an early 3-0 lead, but the Aztecs responded with two free throws and a three-pointer by Layton to go up by a pair at 5-3. After TCU tied the game at five points apiece, another Layton bucket was quickly answered with a Lady Frog three-pointer by Adrienne Ross at 8-7. TCU never trailed the rest of the half, leading by as many as 11 points before going into the locker room up eight at 30-22.

The Lady Frogs nearly doubled their first-half point total coming out of the break, racing out early to extend their lead back into double-figures and eventually jumping ahead by as many as 32 points at the 6:37 mark of the second half before claiming the 83-57 victory.

Other TCU Notes

- TCU's 83 points and 29 field goals were the most by an Aztec opponent in 2006-07.
- SDSU has held a lead in all seven of its Mountain West Conference games this season. The Aztecs have had at least a five-point lead at one point in six of the seven outings, but have come out on top in the end in just two of them.
- The Aztecs have tallied five three-pointers in each of the last two games. For the season, SDSU has at least four triples in a game 12 times, including in six of the seven league contests.
- For the first time this year, SDSU freshman **Quenese Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** did not lead the Aztecs in assists, logging just one in the second half at TCU.
- After recording a season-low 12 turnovers for the second time this year against BYU, SDSU had 28 in the loss to TCU, marking the first time the Aztecs have eclipsed the 20-mark in league action. San Diego State had 20 or more turnovers in eight of its 11 non-conference games.

Blocking Trio

Junior forward **Shannon Clay** became the third Aztec this season to record three or more blocks in a game, when she tallied a career-best three against the Lady Frogs on Sunday. Clay joins fellow newcomer **Jennifer Layton**, who has three blocks or more three times in 2006-07, including four versus Cal Poly. Center **Desiree Johnson (Kahuku, Hawaii)** also has a season-high four blocks in a single outing against Air Force, while eclipsing the three-mark on two other occasions. She needs just four more to enter the school's career top 10 in just two seasons in an Aztec uniform.

SDSU continues to lead the league in blocks per game with a 4.78 average, which ranks 33rd in the nation. The team had a season-high 10 rejections against Cal Poly, its most in a single game since also tallying 10 on Dec. 22, 2002 against Creighton. Overall, 10 different Aztecs have combined for the team's 86 rejections, including eight or more in three separate outings. SDSU had 95 blocks in 27 games a year ago, while the 1987-88 squad holds the school record with 162 in 31 outings.

15 and Counting

Aztec junior guard **Kate Eveland (Southlake, Texas)** kept her streak alive Sunday against TCU, making a three-pointer late in the second half for the 15th straight game with at least one triple. Eveland has one or more three in 17 of the team's 18 games, including a career-best four treys against both Wichita State and Brown, which translated into a pair of Aztec victories.

Eveland has a team-high 32 triples in 2006-07, after tallying just 21 combined in her first two campaigns. She is currently ninth in SDSU career history in three-point field goal attempts with 170 and needs four more makes (53 career three's) to enter the school's top 10 in that category. Her career three-point shooting percentage of .312 is ninth all-time, while her .395 mark this year would be sixth-best in Aztec single-season history.

times this year, with junior **Shanna Demus (Palmdale, Calif.)** doing so for the second time in 2006-07 against Colorado State. Demus also had a career-best six against Pepperdine and later tallied five versus Brown. Quenese Davis had six steals in the victory against Brown, matching the same effort put forth by Tamika Lipford in the overtime contest with Wichita State. Overall, six different SDSU players have recorded three or more steals in a game 17 times in 2006-07.

As a team, SDSU remains the conference leader with 10.33 per game (186 in 18 games) and ranks 63rd in the nation entering the week. The Aztecs have tallied double-figures in steals nine times, including last Thursday against BYU, after doing so on eight occasions in 27 games a year ago.

Sudden Impact

San Diego State freshman Quenese Davis has had a huge impact on the team in her first 18 contests at the collegiate level. Davis is leading the conference in assists per game with a 5.39 mark and ranks 24th nationally and second best among freshmen entering the week.

The Sacramento native currently has 97 assists to her credit, which is already the most by an Aztec since Jamey Cox had 111 in 28 games in 2001-02. If the season were to end today, Davis' 5.39 assists per game would be the program's best since Shannon Lee averaged 5.9 in 1999-2000. Davis, who has led the team in assists in all but one of the 18 games, still needs 33 more helpers to enter the Aztecs' single-season top 10.

In addition to her efforts in the assist column, Davis leads the team in double-figure scoring outings with 12, including in five of the seven conference contests.

Every Game

Six of the team's 12 players on its active roster have played in every game since coming to San Diego State. The group is led by junior Kate Eveland, who has played in all 73 contests since she was a freshman in 2004-05. Senior Desiree Johnson and junior Shanna Demus, who both began play a year ago, have appeared in 45 straight games, while three of the team's newcomers have logged minutes in every outing in 2006-07.

At The Top

An Aztec remains on top of a pair of stat categories in overall games in the Mountain West Conference. With one blocked shot apiece against TCU, senior Desiree Johnson and junior Jennifer Layton remained tied for the league lead in blocked shots per game with a 1.33 mark.

Freshman Quenese Davis is still the league's assist leader in overall games (5.39/g), ranking 24th nationally. Davis, however, slipped to second in league only (5.29) outings, after recording just one assist at TCU on Sunday. Junior Shanna Demus ranks first in the MWC in steals per conference game (2.57) and is third in overall games with 2.44, an average that put her 80th in the nation.

Double-Double

With 10 double-doubles by five different players, San Diego State continues to lead the Mountain West Conference in that category. Senior Desiree Johnson has a team-best three double-doubles with her most recent coming against Colorado State when she had 11 points and 10 rebounds. SDSU has recorded two double-doubles in the same game on four occasions this year versus Nevada, Wichita State, Cal Poly and Colorado State.

Other members of the Aztecs' elite double-double club include freshmen Quenese Davis and Lauren Hoisington and junior Jennifer Layton who have all turned the trick on two occasions apiece. Junior Shannon Clay is the latest edition with her 12 points and 12 rebounds against Colorado State.

The last time SDSU had five players record a double-double in the same season was in 2001-02.



Inside The Numbers

- San Diego State has trailed in eight of its nine victories this season, including six times in the second half. The Aztecs' trailed Cal Poly by 10 points, its largest deficit in a victory since Jan. 7, 2005, when the team was behind by 14 in the second half in a 63-59 victory against Eastern Washington.

- SDSU won its first six games when head coach Beth Burns first used the starting five of guards Tamika Lipford and Quenese Davis, forwards Shanna Demus and Jennifer Layton and center Desiree Johnson at Southern Utah.

- Aztec opponents have attempted 20 or more free throws in all but four games this season, including a season-high 40 by Saint Mary's.

-SDSU has outrebounded its opponent in seven games this season, after doing so on only eight occasions in 27 games in 2005-06.

-SDSU shot exactly 45.3 percent from the field in both of its first two games, with one being a win and the other a loss. In 2005-06, the Aztecs shot above 45 percent from the field just once in a victory over Portland State, when SDSU logged a 53.1 field-goal percentage.

-SDSU has had a player reach double-figures in rebounds in a game on 11 occasions this season. In 2005-06, the Aztecs to only managed to meet the 10-rebound mark in a game five times.

-The Aztecs have broken the 40 percent mark in field-goal percentage seven times this season, including a season-best 46.7 effort in the win over Colorado State. The performance is the team's top effort since shooting 53.1 percent against Portland State on Dec. 16, 2005. It is SDSU's best in a conference game since making 23 of its 42 shots from the field (.548) at Air Force in February 2005. A year ago, the Aztecs eclipsed the .400 mark just once in regular-season league action and six times overall in 27 outings.

- SDSU's four lowest turnover totals have all come in MWC play with the 12 against Air Force and BYU, 14 at Utah and 16 versus UNLV.

What's Up With Those Wins

- SDSU's nine wins are its most since 2002-03 ... One more victory will give the team its first 10-win season since 2001-02 ... SDSU has already tripled its win total from all of last season when the team went 3-24 ... The six-game turnaround is the program's biggest improvement in back-to-back campaigns since the 1993-94 team won a program-record 26 contests after claiming 19 the season before.

- SDSU's eight victories at home is its most since the 2000-01 team also won eight ... The last time the Aztecs had at least nine victories on its home floor in a single season was 1996-97, when the team went 11-2 en route to the NCAA tournament.

- SDSU notched back-to-back home conference wins versus Air Force and Colorado State for the first time since 2001.

An SDSU victory over New Mexico will mean:

►SDSU records its first 10-win season since 2001-02.

►SDSU claims three conference victories in the first half of league play for the first time since 2001.

►SDSU picks up its first win over the Lobos since 2001 and its first victory in Albuquerque since 1996.

►SDSU wins its first MWC road game since 2005.

►SDSU head coach Beth Burns improves to 14-3 all-time versus the Lobos.

New Mexico Tidbits

New Mexico enters Wednesday's game with a 13-7 overall record and a 3-4 mark in league action ... The Lobos have won three of their last four games since dropping four straight from Dec. 30 to Jan. 10 ... The Lobos and Aztecs did not play a common opponent during non-league action ... UNM has three players averaging double-figures in scoring, including Julie Briody (15.9 ppg.), Dionne Marsh (13.1 ppg.) and Kate Montgomery (11.6 ppg.) ... Marsh is her team's leading rebounder (6.3 rpg.), while Montgomery has a team-best 65 assists and 50 three-pointers ... New Mexico leads the league in scoring defense, allowing only 54.3 points per game ... Lobo assistant coach Yvonne Sanchez held a similar position at SDSU in 2000.

The San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish seventh in the Mountain West Conference in a preseason poll released at the league's basketball media day in Las Vegas, Nev. The voting panel consisted of the MWC's nine head coaches, as well as selected media.

Recapping 2006-07 So Far

- Against Nevada, Jennifer Layton and Quenese Davis became the first Aztecs to record double-doubles in the same game since 2002, when Nicolette McCartney and Ashlee Dunlap did so against American University. It was also the first double-double by an Aztec since Michelle Strawberry had 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Portland State on Dec. 16, 2005.

- An Aztec true freshman has recorded 10 or more assists in a game in each of the last two seasons. Quenese Davis did so in her first career outing against Nevada, logging assists, while Tamika Lipford had 11 versus Portland State in 2005-06.

- A true freshman has started at the point guard position in a season-opener in each of SDSU's last four campaigns. Davis is joined by Lipford (2005), current junior Kate Eveland (2004) and Courtney Fritz (2003).

- Jennifer Layton went 10-for-10 from the field in the second half of the UC Davis game, finishing the night with 20 points. She averaged a double-double in her first three career outings (15.7 ppg., 10.0 rpg.).

-The Aztecs' 20 assists versus UC Davis are the most by SDSU in a single-game since the team had 23 in a 91-45 victory against Utah Valley State in Feb. 2005.

- SDSU had just eight players in uniform for its first two games and nine for its next two outings. Thus far this season, four Aztecs have combined to miss 21 games due to injury.

-San Diego State logged a season-best 20 steals against Wichita State. The 20 steals are the team's most in a single outing since Jan. 27, 2005, when the Aztecs logged 21 in a 48-44 loss to Air Force at Cox Arena.

- Freshman Lauren Hoisington was named the Mountain West Conference co-basketball player of the week on Dec. 4. Hoisington helped the Aztecs rally from a six-point deficit with less than three minutes remaining in regulation in the team's overtime win over Wichita State on Dec. 3. She scored eight of the team's final 10 points of the second half and ended the afternoon with a career-high 18 points and 11 rebounds. She became the sixth SDSU player in the league's eight-year history to be named player of the week.

- San Diego State played back-to-back overtime games for the first time in program history against Wichita State and Cal Poly.

-With its victory over Pepperdine on Dec. 21, the Aztecs doubled their win total from all of last season. This marks the second time Beth Burns has had an SDSU team double its win total from her first to her second season at the helm. In her first stint on The Mesa (1989-97), Burns' first squad in 1989-90 won seven games, while her second doubled that with 14 victories in 1990-91.

-Junior Jennifer Layton and freshman Quenesa Davis both earned all-tournament honors at the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. Layton averaged 12.5 points in the two contests, while Davis chipped in 8.0 ppg., 4.0 rpg. and 4.5 app. This marks the second straight season that SDSU has had two players garner honors at the Surf 'N Slam.

- SDSU's six-game win streak was its longest since the 2000-01 squad also won six in a row ... The Aztecs' seven non-conference victories are the program's most since the 2001-02 team claimed eight.

- The Aztecs had five players score in double-figures in the team's win over Colorado State. The last time SDSU had five players score in double-figures in the same game was Jan. 11, 2003, at Sacramento State.

Aztecs Sign Stellar Fall Recruiting Class

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 8 of four highly-rated recruits - centers **Paris Johnson (San Diego, Calif.)** and **Geneshia Dunbar (Dallas, Texas)** and guards **Coco Davis (Sacramento, Calif.)** and **Christen Myles (Chino, Calif.)**. Johnson, Dunbar and Davis will join the Aztecs in 2007, while Myles, who is eligible to compete in December 2007, has already begun practicing with the team.

SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa on April 8, 2005. In her first stint as head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regular-season titles.

A three-time WAC coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 15-year overall head coaching record of 244-181, while her mark school record stands at 163-116 over 10 seasons.
