Aztecs Play Host To USD For 35th All-Time Mee	eting Thursday At Viejas Arena

▶ When & Where: Thursday, Dec. 8, 2011, Viejas Arena (12,414), San Diego, Calif., 7 p.m. PT.

►TV: The game will be televised live on The Mtn. with Tracy Warren (play-by-play) and Krista Blunk (analysis calling the action.

► Other Live Media: Live audio ONLY webcast with Chris Ello, as well as live stats will be available on goaztecs.com.

► SDSU Head Coach Beth Burns: Burns (Ohio Wesleyan, 1979) is in the seventh year of her second stint as head coach at San Diego State. She led the Aztecs for eight seasons from 1989 to 1997, before returning in 2005. She has an overall head coaching record of 328-240 in 20 seasons, while she is 247-175 in her 15 campaigns at SDSU.

► USD Head Coach Cindy Fisher: Fisher is in her seventh season at USD and has compiled a school record of 105-84. Her overall heading coaching record stands at 158-165 in 11 campaigns.

▶ Series History: The Aztecs and Toreros are meeting for the 10th consecutive season and the 35th time overall. SDSU won last year's contest in overtime at Jenny Craig Pavilion on Nov. 30, by the score of 72-63. The Aztecs also claimed the last match-up at Viejas Arena 79-52 in 2009. SDSU leads the series 27-7 and is 17-3 at home.

NEWS & NOTABLES

■ After playing three consecutive contests against Pac-12 foes, including the final two on the road, San Diego State returns to Viejas Arena to face the University of San Diego on Thursday at 7 p.m. PT.

■ The Aztecs took a well deserved break from action after traveling to UCLA last Wednesday and hitting the road again on Friday at Washington State. Unfortunately, SDSU came out on the losing side in both, falling to the Bruins, 78-71, and to the Cougars, 65-50.

■ SDSU rallied from early double-figure deficits in the losses, storming back from 16 points down to take the lead in the second half at UCLA. On Friday, it cut a 23-point deficit down to only 11 in the second half at Washington State.

Thursday's contest with USD is the Aztecs' third in a

row against teams they also faced last season. After the annual series resumed with the Toreros in 2002, USD won five straight years and six of the first seven. Since then, the Aztecs have claimed back-toback outings and three of the last four.

■ Beginning with Thursday's contest, San Diego State will stay in California until Jan. 14, when the team travels to UNLV for its first conference road game. That streak in all covers eight games and 42 days.

■ With a win on Thursday, San Diego State will still be off to its best start since the 2008-09 team also went 5-3 through the first eight games. A year ago, the Aztecs were 1-4 when they played USD and the victory started a three-game win streak to get the team back to .500.

■ The month of December has been particularly good to the Aztecs over the last six seasons as the program has compiled an impressive 23-7 record.

LAST TIME OUT

San Diego State cut a 23-point deficit down to just 11 points, but was never able to overcome a poor shooting performance as the Aztecs dropped their third game of the season 65-50 to host Washington State last Friday at Beasley Coliseum. With the loss, SDSU fell to 4-3, while the Cougars avenged last year's Aztec victory to improve to 5-4 overall.

SDSU was led by junior Chelsea Hopkins' (Las Vegas, Nev.) career-high 14 points. The team's leading scorer entering the night, junior Courtney Clements (Long Beach, Calif.), was limited to only 13 all in the second half, but did manage a career-best nine rebounds. Clements was helped on the glass by senior Kalena Tutt (Long Beach, Calif.), who added seven.

After **Chairese Culberson (Oakland, Calif.)** scored the Aztecs' first basket of the night to tie the score at two, SDSU missed its next eight shots and fell behind 14-2 until Hopkins finally ended the drought with a layup at the 13:43 mark. The two sides traded buckets, but the visitors' shooting woes continued as they missed nine of their next 11 field-goals attempts and also committed seven turnovers during that same span to fall behind by 20 points at 31-11.

After trailing by 19 at the break, San Diego State came out strong from the locker room, putting together a 9-2 run, including Clements' first five points of the game to trim the deficit to 12. SDSU also trailed by 12 with 13:05 remaining, but missed four shots on one possession alone and Washington State took advantage with an 11-0 run, including its first three triples of the night for its largest lead at 51-28.

A three-point play from Culberson sparked the Aztecs' final charge of the game as they shaved 12 points off that deficit to get to within only 11 with just under five minutes to play at 57-46. After each side hit a 3-pointer, San Diego State managed only one more point the rest of the way and ultimately ended up falling by 15 points, 65-50.

The Aztecs shot a season-low 28.6 percent from the field, including a 20.0 mark in the first 20 minutes of action. They also had 20 turnovers, but did manage to draw even in the rebounding department at 44 apiece. Washington State, meanwhile, shot over 42 percent for the game, converted five second-half 3-pointer and recorded 12 steals.

ON THE BOARDS

For the sixth time this year, SDSU did not get outrebounded, tying host Washington State with 44 boards apiece after trailing by five at halftime.

The Aztecs currently rank second in the Mountain West in rebounding margin at +6.1 and continue to lead in both offensive rebounds (17.0/g) and offensive rebounding percentage (42.5).

San Diego State has eclipsed the 40-rebound mark five times in the seven games, a figure it reached on only eight occasions in 29 outings in 2010-11.

Last season, the Aztecs held an advantage on the boards 16 times, accounting for eight of their 12 victories.

KEEPING THE STREAK

San Diego State junior Courtney Clements kept her streak of double-figure scoring games alive, despite getting shutout in the first half on Friday at Washington State.

Clements notched all 13 of her points after the break against the Cougars on 5-for-10 shooting. She also added a career-high nine rebounds to fall just short of her first career double-double.

The Long Beach, Calif., native has scored more than 10 points in all seven of the team's outing this season and has 20 or more on three occasions. She ranks second in the conference in scoring average at 18.3 and is first in 3-pointers made with 17.

Clements seven double-figure scoring games are five more than the next Aztec and gives her 39 for her collegiate career.

STILL MONEY AT THE LINE

Clearly one of the most improved statistical categories for the Aztecs this season is at the free-throw line. As a team, SDSU is shooting a conference-best 79.3 percent, making 96 of its 121 attempts.

In the opener, the team shot 91.3 percent (21-for-23) and followed that up with a 24-for-30 (80.0) performance against No. 18 DePaul. San Diego State made both of its free-throw chances against Hawai'i and then was only 11-of-15 (73.3) in the loss to Portland. The team followed that up with a 78.9 free-throw percentage in the win over Washington.

In the back-to-back losses at UCLA and WSU, the Aztecs' average dropped slightly, going 23-for-32 (71.9 percent).

Four Aztecs are currently perfect at the stripe thus far in 2011-12, while junior Chelsea Hopkins (12-for-13) and senior Kalena Tutt (10-for-11) have missed just one attempt.

SDSU enters this week ranked 11th nationally in team free-throw percentage. A year ago, the team shot 62.8 percent at the free-throw line to rank 308th nationally out of 333 Division I teams. SDSU only crossed the 80-percent mark three times in the 29 contests.

LOW ON TOS

Despite having seven players on this year's roster who did not compete a year ago, San Diego State has kept its turnover total at a minimum, averaging just over 16 a contest to rank first in the conference in turnover margin at +2.6.

The Aztecs committed more than 20 giveaways just once in the first seven games with that being in the opener against Arkansas-Pine Bluff when they had 22. The 13 turnovers against Washington on Saturday are a season low and are the team's fewest since having 12 against Air Force on Jan. 19, 2011.

SDSU had more than 20 turnovers in 11 games in 2010-11.

SWEET DECEMBER

With four of its next five games scheduled for Viejas Arena, SDSU has sported an impressive record during the month of December, especially at home.

The Aztecs are a combined 23-7 during the year's final month since 2006. Four of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll in No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other three defeats were last Friday at Washington State, vs. Pepperdine in overtime in 2009, and against Quinnipiac in the opening contest of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam.

Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 24 of those 30 December contests at home.

WITH A WIN

An SDSU victory over the USD will mean:

■ SDSU improves to 28-7 all-time against the Toreros, winning three straight and four of the last five meetings.

■ SDSU stays unbeaten at home this season, moving to 3-0 overall.

■ SDSU defeats USD at Viejas Arena for the third consecutive year.

■ SDSU moves to 1-2 against teams it also faced last season.

■ SDSU's 5-3 record is its best to start a season since the 2008-09 squad also went 5-3.

SDSU is now 24-7 during the month of December over the last six years.

RECENT SDSU-USD SERIES NOTES

■ Since the annual series restarted in 2002, the two sides have only reached the 70-point barrier four times in the nine games. Each occasion, the team to score over 70 points came away with the win.

Only three of the last nine contests have been decided by five points or fewer. The other six have been by an average of over 18 points.

■ Each school has a victory of more than 25 points in the last nine meetings.

• The losing school has failed to score more than 60 points in eight of the last nine contests.

2010 SDSU-USD REWIND

■ San Diego State outscored host University of San Diego 15-6 in overtime to cap a dramatic rally, as the Aztecs came away with a 72-63 victory on Nov. 30.

■ SDSU, which trailed by 12 points with just 8:25 left to play, won for the first time at Jenny Craig Pavilion since the annual series restarted in 2002.

■ Aztecs Paris Johnson and Courtney Clements combined for 40 of the team's 72 points. Johnson finished with 22 points, including a 10-for-12 effort at the stripe. Clements, meanwhile, had 18 points, six rebounds and a career-high three steals.

■ USD led 25-22 at the break and then went up by as many as 12 at 47-35.

■ It was only a three-point game heading into the final two minutes, as Aztec Coco Davis converted a threepoint play to tie the score at 55-55. USD went up by two after a steal in the backcourt, but Johnson equalized with two free throws to force overtime.

■ SDSU opened the extra period with a 6-0 run. The Toreros cut that deficit in half with a 3-pointer until Johnson matched that with a three-point play and the Aztecs made all six free throws in the final 25 seconds to secure the 72-63 victory.

■ The overtime victory was San Diego State's first on an opponent's home court. The Aztecs had been 0-5 all-time in overtime outings on the road prior to the win.

minutes remaining in a 63-59 win over Eastern Washington in January of 2005.

RECEIVING VOTES

SDSU received votes in both national top-25 polls Nov. 21-22 after opening the season with a 3-1 mark, including an upset of then No. 18 DePaul. The Aztecs garnered 13 votes in the Associated Press top-25 poll, while they also received one vote in the *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll.

The last time San Diego State received votes in either poll was on Nov. 22, 2010, in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were last listed in both polls in the same week during the 2010-11 preseason.

SDSU was last ranked in the top 25 in 2010, when it finished 20th in the final *ESPN/USA Today* Coaches poll. It marked the first time the Aztecs had been ranked in the final coaches poll in program history.

BEATING RANKED FOES

San Diego State's win over No. 18/18 DePaul on Nov. 18 is the program's first vs. a ranked foe since 2010, when it knocked off No. 10 West Virginia in the NCAA Second Round.

Overall, the victory against the Blue Demons is the Aztecs' sixth against a top-25 squad over the last four seasons. SDSU wins have come against Texas twice when the Longhorns were ranked No. 4 in 2008, and again when they were the No. 17 team on their home floor in 2010. League foes New Mexico (No. 23 - 2009) and TCU (No. 23 - 2010) have also been upset.

Prior to the win over Texas in December 2008, San Diego State had not beaten a ranked team since Dec. 28, 1994, when it handed No. 6 Alabama a 79-76 loss in a tournament held at St. John's in Jamaica, N.Y.

OTHER SEASON NOTES

• With its wins over UAPB and No. 18 DePaul, SDSU scored over 80 points in back-to-back outings for the first time since scoring 85 in consecutive wins over Montana State and Loyola Marymont in Dec. 2008.

The team did not surpass the 80-point barrier all of last season and that streak dates back to a 87-52 win over Air Force on March 6, 2010.

 The Aztecs' 43-point margin of victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff is SDSU's largest margin of victory since defeating Air Force by 51 in 2009.

■ SDSU's 86 points vs. UAPB are the most in a season-opening game since scoring 101 against McNeese State on Nov. 23, 1990 (101-55 victory). The 86 points are the most in any game since it lit up Air Force for 87 in the 2010 regular-season finale.

The Aztecs claimed the tournament title at the Jack In the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic in Honolulu, Nov. 18-20. It is the first time SDSU has won a non-conference event since going 2-0 at its own San Diego Surf 'N Slam in 2009.

Courtney Clements and Kiyana Stamps, were named to the six-player all-tournament squad at the Rainbow Wahine Classic. Clements was tabbed the tournament MVP, becoming the first Aztec so honored since 2010. This is the first time in both Clements and Stamps' Aztec careers that they have been named to an all-tournament team.

■ Clements was named the Mountain West Player of the Week for the first time in her career on Nov. 21, after averaging 21.3 points and shooting .536 (30-for-56) from the field, including a .522 (12-for-23) mark from 3point range, and .813 (13-for-16) from the free-throw line in the team's opening four outings.

PRESEASON POINTS

For the fourth straight season, the San Diego State women's basketball team has been picked to finish in the top two in the Mountain West in 2012, earning its second consecutive second-place selection and third in the last four years in a vote by the league's eight head coaches and select media members.

The preseason poll, which was released Oct. 11, at the conference's annual media day in Denver, Colo., had the Aztecs with 127 total points and seven of the 20 first-place votes.

TCU was tabbed as the preseason favorite with 136 points and 12 first-place votes. Colorado State was selected third behind the Aztecs, earning the final firstplace vote, and was followed by New Mexico, UNLV, Wyoming, Air Force and newcomer Boise State.

INDIVIDUAL ACCOLADES

For the second campaign in a row, San Diego State swept both the preseason newcomer and freshman of the year awards, which were released at the league's annual media day in October.

Junior guard Chelsea Hopkins was chosen as the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, following in the footsteps of current teammate Courtney Clements and recent graduate Jessika Bradley, who earned the honor both in the preseason and at the end of the year in 2010 and 2011.

SDSU's Chairese Culberson was chosen as the conference's top freshman, after leading Berkeley High School to a runner-up performance at the California state Division I tournament this past March. The 6-0 forward was the top ranked recruit in the Mountain West by *Hoopgurlz*, receiving a rating of 46th overall and seventh at the wing position.

A year ago, current Aztec sophomore Melissa Sweat was named the league's preseason freshman of the year, while former standout Paris Johnson was picked in 2007.

CLARK, HOPKINS TABBED CAPTAINS

Aztec juniors Chelsea Hopkins and **Gabrielle Clark** (Los Angeles, Calif.) were tabbed team captains for the 2011-12 season.

Hopkins sat out a year due to NCAA transfer rules, but was able to practice with the team. The 5-foot-8 guard has started the first seven contests and also has two years of collegiate experience under her belt at Duke from 2008-10.

Clark, meanwhile, is in her fourth season on The Mesa and served as one of the squad's two captains a year ago. She is a two-time winner of the Tammy Blackburn coaches' award and has appeared in 59 career

outings, starting twice.

SCURRY TO REDSHIRT

Head coach Beth Burns announced earlier last month that freshman forward **Deajanae Scurry (Los Angeles, Calif.)** will redshirt the upcoming 2011-12 season. Scurry will continue to practice with the Aztecs, but will not compete in any games in her first year on campus.

NOTING THIS YEAR'S TEAM

San Diego State returns two starters and six other letterwinners from last year's squad. Only three Aztecs had played more than one season in the Red & Black entering 2011-12.

■ Of the 15 student-athletes on this year's roster, seven players did not compete for San Diego State a year ago.

Two of the seven were on campus, but junior Chelsea Hopkins sat out after transferring from Duke and redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps missed part of the campaign due to injury and the other half to concentrate on academics. Stamps competed in only two games in 2009-10 after tearing her ACL.

■ The Aztecs' roster boasts five true freshmen, including four post players in forwards Erimma Amarikwa, Chairese Culberson, Khristina Hunter (Fairfield, Calif.) and Deajanae Scurry to go with guard Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.). The last time SDSU had five true freshman on its roster was 2008-09, when the squad also had five.

■ Entering this season, five players accounted for 280 of the 338 total career games played (82.8 percent) in an Aztec uniform by the entire SDSU 2011-12 roster.

AZTECS SIGN PAIR TO NLIS

San Diego State women's basketball head coach Beth Burns announced the signing Nov. 9, of forward Aleiah Brandon (Corona, Calif.) and point guard Tia Levi-Dixon (San Diego, Calif.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors will join the Aztecs in 2012.

10-11 RECRUITING CLASS EARNS PRAISE

San Diego State's 2010-11 recruiting class was rated best in the Mountain West and 18th nationally according to *Espn.com's HoopGurlz* rankings, which are based solely on high school prospect signings. The Aztecs are also the only team in a "non-automatic BCS qualifying" conference rated in the top 30.

The 2010-11 recruiting class included three, fourstar recruits according to *HoopGurlz*, including forward Chairese Culberson, who was the No. 7 rated wing and 46th overall, forward Deajanae Scurry (No. 31 forward) and point guard Ahjalee Harvey (No. 32 point guard). Forwards Khristina Hunter and Erimma Amarikwa both received three stars and round out the class.

A year ago, San Diego State's 2010 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West and 31st nationally, while the Aztecs did not appear in the websites rankings in either 2008 or 2009.

THE WELCOME MAT

Aztec head coach Beth Burns added one new member to her staff over the summer with the hiring of assistant coach Tammi Reiss (pronounced Reese).

Reiss, who works with the Aztec guards, was an assistant coach for the WNBA Utah Starzz from 2001-02, before joining the franchise in its move to San Antonio in 2003.

The Eldred, N.Y., native spent three seasons as an assistant coach at her alma mater, when Virginia advanced to the Elite Eight in 1995 and 1996, made it to the Sweet 16 in 1994 and claimed a pair of ACC regular-season titles in 1994 and 1995.

One of the all-time greats in Virginia basketball history, she played for the Cavaliers from 1988-92, when the team made three consecutive Final Four appearances and earned two ACC regular-season and tournament titles. Reiss garnered both Kodak and USBWA All-America honors as a senior in 1992.

Following her collegiate career, Reiss was chosen by the Utah Starzz in the first round (fifth pick overall) of the inaugural WNBA Draft in 1997.

WOODS PROMOTED

San Diego State head basketball coach Beth Burns announced this past April that Jualeah Woods has been promoted to the position of associate head coach.

Since Woods' arrival in May of 2005, the Aztecs have won a Mountain West Conference regular season and tournament title, and recorded back-to-back NCAA appearances, including a trip to the Sweet Sixteen in 2010. On the court, she helped tutor four-time all-conference center Paris Johnson, who finished her career as the school's all-time leader in blocks and consecutive starts. Woods also mentored 2010 MWC Newcomer of the Year forward Jessika Bradley, who was tabbed a third-team all-league pick as a senior.

2010-11 REWIND

Here are some of team's notes from last season:

■ SDSU won at least 12 games for the fifth consecutive season and advanced to the championship game of each of its three non-conference tournaments.

■ The Aztecs had 11 contests decided by five or fewer points and nine by three or less, including six in league play. Only five of the team's 17 losses were by more than 10 points and the 10 regular-season conference defeats were by 74 total points. SDSU also had at least a four-point lead in 13 of 17 losses.

■ SDSU set a Mountain West record for most blocked shots in league play with 115 to its credit. The Aztecs easily surpassed the previous high of 101 set by the 2008-09 SDSU squad.

■ San Diego State finished fifth nationally with 6.4 blocks per game. The Aztecs trailed only Baylor (7.4), Saint Mary's (6.8), High Point (6.7) and North Carolina (6.5) in that category and had 34 more blocks than any other Mountain West squad, despite playing the fewest number of games.

SDSU led the MWC and ranked 27th nationally in three-point field-goal defense (28.1). Opponents failed to shoot above 30 percent from three-point land in 17 of the 29 contests.

■ Senior Coco Davis led the Mountain West and ranked fifth nationally in assists per game with a 6.3 mark. Her

(126). She also was only the third player in school history to score 1,500 points. AZTECS OVERSEAS

San Diego State currently has five of its recent stand-

outs playing professionally overseas. Guard Jené Morris (Girona) and forward Jessika Bradley (Arixil) both compete in Spain, while guard Quenese Davis (PAOK) plays in Greece and center Paris Johnson (Gorzow Wlkp.) is in Poland. Quenese's younger sister, Coco, also recently joined a team in Israel.

A year ago, Morris was in both Poland and Israel after playing for the Indiana Fever, who made her the first-ever Aztec to be selected in the WNBA Draft (first round/11th pick overall) in 2010. Davis, the Aztecs' all-time career assists leader, competed professionally in Austria and was named the *Eurobasket.com* All-Austrian AWBL Guard of the Year with the Flying Foxes.

THE NEW LEAGUE LOOK

For the first time since TCU joined the conference in 2005, the Mountain West will have a new look this season. Gone are BYU and Utah, who claimed the league regular-season and tournament titles a year ago, while Boise State is the newcomer after participating in the Western Athletic Conference.

The Aztecs will now have just 14 league games instead of 16, meaning the MW regular-season slate will start a week later in January and finish up three days earlier in late February. San Diego State will have additional days to prepare for the Mountain West Championships, which will be one day shorter and feature four quarterfinal games on Wednesday, before the semifinals on Friday and the finale on Saturday.

AZTECS ON TV

The Aztecs will have at least 10 of its contests televised in 2011-12, with seven regular-season outings slated for The Mtn. and two contests scheduled to be shown on CBS College Sports Network. In addition, three of The Mtn. games will also be broadcast locally on Channel 4 San Diego and the opening contests of the 2012 Mountain West Conference Championships in Las Vegas next March will be carried on The Mtn.

LISTEN/WATCH LIVE

For the 11th straight year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-byplay of nearly every regular season game (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alum Chris Ello will have the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the fifth straight season.

Again in 2011-12, all regular season Aztec home contests, with the exception of certain televised games, will also feature a live video feed to go along with the audio call from Viejas Arena on www.goaztecs.com.

BURNS TABBED WBCA SECRETARY

This past July, San Diego State head coach Beth Burns was appointed as the secretary of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors' Executive Committee. Burns previously served as a Division I at-large representative on the organization's 23-member board the last two years.

SDSU HEAD COACH BETH BURNS

The winningest coach in SDSU women's basketball history, Beth Burns returned to Montezuma Mesa in April 8, 2005, and enters the seventh season of her second stint with the Aztecs.

Most recently, Burns has taken the program to new heights, including a trip to the 2010 NCAA Sweet Sixteen, back-to-back NCAA tournament appearances (2009, 2010) and both a conference regular-season (2009) and tournament title (2010).

The Aztecs advanced to three straight Mountain West Conference championship games from 2008-10, after not winning one tournament game in the league's first eight years of existence. SDSU has scored five wins over top-25 foes, including two vs. teams in the top 10 in No. 4 Texas and No. 10 West Virginia.

Including 2010-11, SDSU has recorded at least 12 victories in five consecutive seasons with Burns at the helm, highlighted by back-to-back campaigns with at least 23 victories.

In her first stint as Aztec head coach from 1989-97, Burns took the SDSU women's basketball program full circle, going from 7-23 her first year to 23-7 in her final campaign. During her eight seasons, she compiled a 151-83 record and a 64.5 winning percentage, the best in school history. The Aztecs went to the NCAA tournament on four occasions (1993, 1994, 1995, 1997), won a pair of tournament championships and three regularseason titles.

A four-time conference coach of the year, Burns was the head coach at Ohio State for five seasons (1997-02). She has a 20-year overall head coaching record of 328-240, while her school record stands at 247-175 over 14 seasons.

Last fall, Burns signed a five-year contract extension to stay as SDSU's head coach through the 2014-15 campaign.

SAN DIEGO - For the fourth time in the last five years, the San Diego State women's basketball team started the season off on the right foot, defeating visiting Arkansas-Pine Bluff 86-43 at Viejas Arena. With the victory, the Aztecs moved to 1-0 overall, while the Golden Lions dropped to 0-2, following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

SDSU had three players finish with double-figure points, including leading scorer Courtney Clements, who notched 21 points on 7-for-13 shooting for her third career 20-point outing as an Aztec. Redshirt sophomore Kiyana Stamps added 17 points in her first contest since 2009, while junior co-captain Gabrielle Clark contributed a career-high 12 points by making four of her seven attempts.

Forward Chairese Culberson hauled in a team-high nine rebounds and point guard Ahjalee Harvey tallied seven assists in their collegiate debuts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat led the defensive effort with four of the Aztecs' 14 steals on the night.

San Diego State never trailed in the game, going up by 13 points at the 12:29 mark of the first half. The Lady Lions used a pair of triples from Markita Quarles and a jumper from Jenise Gentry to cut their deficit down to only seven at 18-11, but the Aztecs then went on a 14-1 run to build a 20-point advantage before setting for a 41-24 lead at the break.

Čoming out of the locker room, the UAPB offense continued to struggle as it did not record a field goal until six and a half minutes into the second half on a 3-pointer by Lakendra Marsh at 52-28. The Aztecs would eventually lead by as many as 43 and outscored the visitors 45-19 in the final 20 minutes to secure the 86-43 season-opening win.

SDSU shot over 41 percent from the field, made nine 3-pointers and posted a phenomenal 91.3 free-throw percentage (21-for-23). On the flip side, UAPB shot just 22.2 percent for the game, converting only five second-half field goals.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team went on a 10-0 run with just over five minutes remaining in the game to turn a two-point contest into a 12-point advantage and went on to claim a 82-74 upset victory over 18th-ranked DePaul in the first game of the Jack In The Box Rainbow Wahine Classic. The win was the Aztecs' sixth over a top-25 team in the last four seasons and improved them to 2-0 overall in 2011-12, while the Blue Demons dropped to 2-1.

The Aztecs had four players score in double-figures, led by junior Courtney Clements, who eclipsed the 20-point mark for the second consecutive outing with 25, including 13 in the first half. Sophomore Kiyana Stamps continued to give the Aztecs an offensive punch off the bench with 17 points for the second game in a row. Sophomore Melissa Sweat and freshman Chairese Culberson both chipped in career highs with 14 and 10 points respectively.

Sweat was a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc and Culberson hauled in nine boards to fall just one rebound short of a double-double. Clements tied a career high with eight rebounds, junior Chelsea Hopkins had seven assists and senior Kalena Tutt added three steals.

After the game was tied three times in the first four minutes, the Aztecs utilized a three-point play from Sweat to spark a 12-0 run at 18-6. DePaul eventually caught up with the help of three triples to knot the contest at 27 points apiece. The Blue Demons took the lead on the pair of free throws, but the Aztecs managed to even the score heading into the locker room at 33-33.

The two sides traded free throws coming out of the break, before SDSU's Culberson made a jumper and hit a pair at the line to give the team a lead they would never end up relinquishing. The Aztecs had two nine-point advantages, but saw that cut down to only a pair with 5:50 remaining in the game.

From there, San Diego State started a 10-0 run with baskets by four different players to go up by 12 and go on to secure an eight-point upset victory 82-74.

The Aztecs attempted just one free throw in the first half, but tried 29 in the second half to go 24-for-30 (80.0 percent) at the stripe. SDSU owned a 47-38 advantage on the boards and hit six 3-pointers, which was two more than a De-Paul squad that had a combined 25 in its opening two contests this season.

HONOLULU - The San Diego State women's basketball team stayed perfect on the season with a dominating 71-44 victory over Hawai'i at the Stan Sheriff Center in Honolulu. The Aztecs moved to 3-0 on the year and 2-0 at the three-day, fourteam tournament, while UH dropped to 1-2 and 0-2.

All 13 players on SDSU's active roster saw action against the Wahine with all but two getting on the scoreboard. San Diego State came out of the break on a 9-0 run with a triple and two free throws by Clements, a jumper by Sweat and a steal that led to a lay-up from Hopkins. The Wahine would go on a slight run to get to within as few as 21 points on two occasions with the final one being with the score at 61-40.

Over the final 2:49, the Aztecs ended the game on a 10-4 run to secure its third victory in as many tries this season at 71-44.

SDSU dominated the boards with a plus-20 advantage and shot 47.8 percent from the field, including over 50 percent in the opening 15 minutes. Hawai'i, meanwhile, only made 10 field goals over the entire game and scored 23 of its 44 points at the charity stripe, while make only one 3-pointer.

Day then made both free throws to secure the 59-58 victory as the Aztecs' full-court baseball pass was intercepted to end the game.

Despite the loss, SDSU got another standout offensive performance from junior Courtney Clements, who surpassed the 20-point mark for the third time in four outings this season. Clements was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc and 8-for-13 from the field to end up with 21 of the team's 58 points. She was the only Aztec in double-figures as Stamps had eight points and Tutt contributed seven to go with her SDSŬ-best seven rebounds.

The match-up was tied twice within the first three minutes before Portland notched three consecutive lay-ups over a span of just over a minute to take a six-point lead at 10-4. San Diego State responded with three baskets by Clements, including a lay-up, a jumper and a 3-pointer out of the left corner to put the team up by one at 11-10.

After three lead changes and another tie, the Aztec offense went scoreless for nearly five and a half minutes as the Pilots built a 21-14 lead. A Hopkins basket

ended the draught and SDSU ended up catching up by the break at 27-27. Coming out of the locker room, San Diego State fell behind by three points on three occasions within the first four minutes and that deficit grew to nine at 45-36 on a 3-pointer and a last-second lay-up by Pilot Cassandra Brown. A basket by Sajoyia Griffin at the 11:35 mark started a brief 4-0 run as the Aztecs were within five points three times before being behind by eight heading into the final five minutes of the contest.

SDSU shot just 36.2 percent from the field, while committing 17 turnovers. Portland shot just slightly better and made 18-of-23 free throws, while owning just a slight plus-one advantage on the boards.

SAN DIEGO - The San Diego State women's basketball team had three players notch career highs in scoring to stay perfect at home with a 63-51 victory Saturday over visiting Washington at Viejas Arena. The Aztecs, who are receiving votes in both national top-25 polls, improved to 4-1 overall, while the Huskies dropped to 3-2 on the year following the first-ever meeting between the two sides.

Four of the five SDSU starters scored in double-figures including three with career-high point totals. Freshman Chairese Culberson notched a team-high 14 points, including her first career 3-pointer, to go with four of the team's 13 steals. Senior Kalena Tutt had a career-high 13 points and six rebounds, while junior Chelsea Hopkins posted career bests in both points (12) and rebounds (7) and also recorded five assists and three steals in 27 minutes of action. Junior Court-ney Clements was the fourth Aztec with at least 10 points, contributing 11 for her fifth consecutive double-figure scoring outing in as many games this season.

San Diego State trailed just twice, giving up the opening basket to UW's Regina Rogers and falling behind by one point on a lay-up at the 17:32 mark of the first half at 4-3. The Aztecs took the lead on a pair of Tutt free throws and had a two-possession advantage until going on a 13-5 run to jump ahead by double figures for the first time at 26-16. Following a timeout, the Huskies trimmed their deficit to eight three times, including at the break with the score 32-24.

Coming out of the locker room, the two sides traded baskets before Tutt sparked a 6-0 Aztec run with a jumper and a basket following a UW turnover to give her team a 14-point advantage at 40-26. The San Diego State lead would grow out to as many as 16 points at the 8:17 mark until Washington made a final push in the final four minutes on four lay-ups in the paint from Rogers to close to within eight at 57-49.

Sophomore Kiyana Stamps restored the SDSU lead into double figures just 21 seconds later and both Clements and Hopkins hit a pair of free throws each to close out the 63-51 victory.

UCLA 78, San Diego State 71 Game 6 Nov. 30 John Wooden Center Los Angeles, Calif.

LOS ANGELES - The San Diego State women's basketball team rallied from a 16-point deficit to take a three-point second-half lead, but wasn't able to come out with a victory, as the Aztecs fell 78-71 to host UCLA at the John Wooden Center. With the loss, SDSU dropped to 4-2, while the Bruins improved to 4-2 after defeating the visitors for the second year in a row.

Aztec junior Courtney Clements led the team in scoring with 19 points, but made just seven of her 24 field-goal attempts. Sophomore Melissa Sweat matched her career high with 14 points, highlighted by 12 in the second half, while freshman Erimma Amarikwa and junior Chelsea Hopkins both finished with eight points apiece. Hopkins had six of the team's nine assists and she, along with Clements and senior Kalena Tutt all added six rebounds.

The Aztecs got off to a quick start with a 6-0 lead on baskets from three different players, but the Bruins finally got on the board at the 17:35 mark and took their first lead of the night at 9-8. UCLA then utilized some hot shooting and got a number of second-chance buckets, putting together what would later amount to be a 22-0 run to go up by 16 points with the score at 24-8.

San Diego State, however, would battle back, as a jumper from junior Malia Nahinu ended a near seven-minute. Clements then notched 10 of SDSU's next 12 points and received help from three of the squad's freshmen, who contributed a basket apiece to cut the deficit all the way to just four points at 35-31. The Bruins converted on a 3-point play in the final eight seconds by Rhema Gardner to extend the lead back out to 38-31 heading into the locker room.

Coming out of the break, the Aztecs quickly made a dent in their deficit, getting a bucket from Clements and two lay-ups from Hopkins in under a minute. SDSU successfully completed the come back on a 3-point play from Amarikwa to take its first lead since the first half at 40-39 with 17:48 remaining.

The two sides were tied twice and traded advantages three times before UCLA outscored the Aztecs 15-4 to push it once again to a double-figure Bruin lead at 59-49. The home squad reached the double bonus by the 9:45 mark and made good on four of six free throws while adding a wide-open triple from Thea Lemberger to open the gap to 14 points on two occasions.

The Aztecs cut that deficit in half with under 30 seconds remaining before ultimately falling by that same seven-point margin, 78-71.

PULLMAN, Wash. - The Aztec women's basketball team cut a 23-point deficit down to just 11 points, but was never able to overcome a poor shooting performance as the Aztecs dropped their third game of the season 65-50 to host Washington State on Friday at Beasley Coliseum. With the loss, SDSU fell to 4-3, while the Cougars avenged last year's Aztec victory to improve to 5-4 overall.

SDSU was led by junior Chelsea Hopkins' career-high 14 points. The team's leading scorer entering the night, junior Courtney Clements, was limited to only 13 all in the second half, but did manage a career-best nine rebounds. Clements was helped on the glass by senior Kalena Tutt, who added seven.

After Chairese Culberson scored the Aztecs' first basket of the night to tie the score at two, SDSU missed its next eight shots and fell behind 14-2 until Hopkins finally ended the drought with a lay-up at the 13:43 mark. The two sides traded buckets, but the visitors' shooting woes continued as they missed nine of their next 11 field-goals attempts and also committed seven turnovers during that same span to fall behind by 20 points at 31-11.

After trailing by 19 at the break, SDSU came out strong from the locker room, putting together a 9-2 run, including Clements' first five points of the game to trim the deficit to 12. SDSU also trailed by 12 with 13:05 remaining, but missed four shots on one possession alone and Washington State took advantage with an 11-0 run, including its first three triples of the night for its largest lead at 51-28.

A three-point play from Culberson sparked the Aztecs' final charge of the game as they shaved 12 points off that deficit to get to within only 11 with just under five minutes to play at 57-46. After each side hit a 3-pointer, San Diego State managed only one more point the rest of the way and ultimately ended up falling by 15 points, 65-50.
