What's On Tap

The San Diego State Aztecs (6-7-2, 2-0-2 MWC) travel to New Mexico before returning to the SDSU Sports Deck for their final home game of the 2006 season. SDSU will play New Mexico on Thursday at 1 p.m. MT before facing No. 15 Utah at 1 p.m. PT on Sunday.

Series History

▶ SDSU leads the series versus New Mexico, 6-3-3, having gone 2-0-1 in their last three matches. Last season in Albuquerque, the Lobos and Aztecs played to a 1-1 tie.

▶ The Utah Utes currently lead the all-time series versus SDSU, 8-3-2, with the last Aztec victory coming in 2001 when they defeated Utah, 2-1, in overtime. Head coach Mike Giuliano has never beaten Utah during his tenure with SDSU. In their most recent matchup, the Utes downed the Aztecs, 2-1, in San Diego on Oct. 20, 2005.

A Look at the Opponents

▶ The Lobos (6-6-3, 0-2-2 MWC) will be the third straight opponent that the Aztecs have faced with a goals against average of less than one. Lobos' keeper Shannon Adranga has a 6-6-3 record with four shutouts and a 0.82 GAA. New Mexico comes into Thursday's match with the Aztecs allowing 0.82 goals per game while scoring 1.13.

▶ Utah (11-4-0, 4-0-0 MWC) enters the week after having won its last seven games. Adele Letro leads the Utes in goals (7) and points (17) and is second on the team in shots (33) and shots on goal (14). Her seven goals and 17 points are second in the MWC behind Aztec forward Jen Mello. In goal for Utah is Ashley Mason. Mason brings an 9-4-0 record with four shutouts and a 0.94 GAA. The Utes have been able to put the same team on the field consistently, with seven of their players having started all 15 matches. A Mountain West opponent has yet to score against the Utes.

What to Watch For

▶ SDSU's defense versus the Lobos' offense in the second half. New Mexico has outscored its opponents, 11-6, in the second period and SDSU has given up more goals in the second half (13) than in the first half (8).

SDSU's offense versus the Utah defense - Utah hasn't allowed a goal in its last six games.

The Mello and Sutton Connection

They're back... A year after leading the team in scoring as freshmen and accounting for 44.6 percent of the team's points, sophomores Jen Mello and Erika Sutton could have an even better season in 2006.

Over the course of the last two seasons, the Aztecs are 12-2-1 (3-0-1 in 2006) when Sutton records at least one point, 11-2-1 (5-0-1 in 2006) when Mello does the same and 7-1 (2-0 in 2006) when each contributes at least one point.

The sophomore duo has 53.3 (8-of-15) of the squad's assists, 52.6 (30-of-57) percent of its points, and 52.4 (11-of-21) percent of the team's goals.

Earlier this season, Sutton became the fourth Aztec to be named to the *Soccer Buzz* Elite Team of the Week and also earned MWC Offensive Player of the Week honors. Mello became the third Aztec in 2006 to garner MWC Player of the Week honors, winning the award for her three-goal, one-assist performance last week versus No. 15 BYU and Wyoming.

Last season, Sutton earned Soccer Buzz Freshman All-Far West Region accolades and was named second-team all-MWC.

Aztec Notes

▶ 19 of 21 goals this year for SDSU have come from underclassmen.

- ▶ The Aztecs have started eight underclassmen in 13 of 15 games this season.
- ▶ 25 Aztecs have seen playing time this year.
- ▶ The Aztecs have used 11 different starting lineups in 13 games in 2006.

Not Mello-ing Out

In her sophomore year, Jen Mello is continuing to be an integral part of the Aztec offense. She currently leads the team in goals (8), points (19) and shots on goal (21). Mello has three multi-goal games in 2006 (Sept. 8 at UC Irvine, Oct. 8 vs UNLV and Oct. 15 at Wyoming). The Pleasanton, Calif., native currently leads the Mountain West in goals (8), goals per game (0.53), points (19) and points per game (1.27). Mello's performance over the past week earned her the Mountain West Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week for Oct. 9-15. During the week, Mello scored three goals and tallied one assist (two goals versus Wyoming; one goal, one assist at No. 15 BYU). In her last three games, Mello has scored five goals after scoring three in her first 12.

Sutton On Point

Despite playing defender for the last few matches, sophomore Erika Sutton has tallied 11 points through 15 contests this season, which has her fifth in the Mountain West. Sutton's five assists are tied for the lead in the MWC with Utah's Amanda Feigt. The Arvada, Colo., native was named a Breitbard Star of the Month for August by the San Diego Hall of Champions for her two-goal, two-assist performance at the Purdue Boilermaker Cup, which also earned her the MWC Offensive Player of the Week award.

Strength of Schedule

The coaching staff certainly didn't make things easy for a young squad with a schedule that features 10 opponents that advanced to the 2005 NCAA soccer tournament. Here is a look at how far those teams advanced:

A Look Back

SDSU remained unbeaten in Mountain West play, going 1-0-1 over the week on the road. Jen Mello scored three goals and had one assist during the week while Cat Burson notched her third shutout of 2006 on Sunday at Wyoming.

SDSU 2, Wyoming 0

LARAMIE, Wyo. – After a double-overtime tie with No. 15 BYU on Thursday, the San Diego State women's soccer team went into Laramie and shut out the Cowgirls, 2-0, at the Louis S. Madrid Sports Complex. With the victory, SDSU remains unbeaten in conference play.

Sophomore forward Jen Mello (Pleasanton, Calif.) scored both of the Aztecs goals in the victory, which gives her a career-best 19 points on the season. Mello has now scored five goals in her last three games after scoring three goals through the first 12 games. Her eight goals tie a career-best and lead the Aztec squad.

A strong Aztec defense led by goalkeeper Cat Burson, who had nine saves in 90 minutes of play, held strong against the Cowgirl offensive. Burson now has three shutouts in 2006 and needs one more to tie her total from all of last season. Wyoming outshot the Aztecs, 20-9, but it was San Diego State making the most of its opportunities. In the 10th minute of the game, Mello took a cross from freshman Jessica Gordon (Tujunga, Calif.) and sank it into the lower right corner for her seventh goal of 2006.

It would remain a 1-0 game for most of the match, with each defense keeping the opposing team off the scoreboard until the 88th minute when SDSU was awarded a penalty kick. Mello lined up and nailed the kick to make it 2-0 Aztecs.

Freshman Cat Walker (Folsom, Calif.) led SDSU with three shots, followed by sophomores Erika Sutton (Arvada, Colo.) and Mello with two. Classmates Mariko Strickland (Kaua'i, Hawaii) and Leann Sgobba (Los Olivos, Calif.) each registered one shot.

San Diego State 2, No. 15 BYU 2

PROVO, Utah – The San Diego State women's soccer team played its second double-overtime game in the past three matches, tying No. 15 BYU, 2-2, at South Stadium. Sophomore Jen Mello (Pleasanton, Calif.) scored her sixth goal of the season while freshman Heather Vandevanter (Alamo, Calif.) scored her third tally of 2006.

The Cougars were the first to strike when their leading goal scorer, Katie Larkin, dished a pass to Jenavieve Phillips, who shot the ball off the far post and in to make it 1-0 BYU. A resilient Aztecs squad would come right back and tie the game at one.

Freshman Cat Walker (Folsom, Calif.) took one of the Aztecs' three first half shots at Cougars' goalkeeper Erika Woodbury. Woodbury bobbled the ball off of her chest and then BYU's Haylee Cuthbert attempted to clear the ball. Cuthbert's ball when right into the chest of the Cougars' Andrea Willis and Mello was there to clean it up and put it in to tie the game.

With just over five minutes left in the first half, Mello drove the ball down the right side of the field and crossed it toward the center. Vandevanter was there to finish the play and give the Aztecs the lead, 2-1.

The Cougars would score 39 seconds into the second half to tie the game. Neither team would score again. SDSU did have two shots in the second overtime period but was unable to find the net.

Junior goalkeeper Cat Burson (Poway, Calif.) was busy in goal, making 10 saves while playing all 110 minutes of the double-overtime contest.
