### @AztecWBB Prepares for Home Clash with USD on Thursday

Fresh off a sweep in the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic last weekend, San Diego State looks to keep the momentum rolling on Thursday when it renews acquaintances with the University of San Diego in the annual city showdown at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. Opening tip is set for 6:30 p.m. PT. A live video stream courtesy of the Mountain West Network will be available on GoAztecs.com, with SDSU alumnus Chris Ello handling the play-by-play responsibilities.

The Aztecs are coming off a thrilling 63-57 overtime victory over Wisconsin last Sunday, rallying from an 11-point deficit in the second half despite yielding 11 three-pointers and finishing with a 45-30 deficiency in rebounds. However, SDSU forced 20 turnovers and kept the Badgers off the free-throw line for the entire afternoon to help complete the comeback.

Individually, the Aztecs have been sparked by sophomore McKynzie Fort (Fontana, Calif.), who collected Mountain West Player of the Week honors after averaging 17.3 points and shooting 66.7 percent from the field (24-36) the past three games. Against North Dakota State in the opener of the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic, Fort led all scorers with 20 points on a career-high 10-for-12 performance from the floor and added a personal-best five steals to propel her team to a 64-54 triumph. The Scarlet and Black has also received a boost from fellow classmate Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.), who matched her career-high with 12 points on a 4-for-7 effort from beyond the three-point arc against Wisconsin.

The Aztecs-Toreros clash will mark the 39th edition of the intra-city showdown, which dates back to February 1978. The two sides have battled one another on a yearly basis since 2002 after the series went on hiatus from 1997-2001. SDSU owns a 28-10 advantage over its crosstown adversary, but has dropped the last two encounters, including a 66-44 setback at Jenny Craig Pavilion a year ago.

Defense has typified the series recently, with the two schools reaching the 70-point plateau just four times in the past 16 meetings. On each occasion, the team to score over 70 points came away with the win. Similarly, the losing side has failed to score more than 60 points in 11 of the last 14 engagements. In addition, the annual city skirmish has featured a winning margin of five points or less in just five of the last 13 games. The other eight encounters have been decided by an average of nearly 18 points, with each team posting a victory of more than 25 points.

During its four-game losing streak to open the season, SDSU averaged nearly five more turnovers per night and allowed opponents to shoot 50 percent from the floor. However, the Aztecs reversed that trend in their two wins last weekend, finishing with a plus-8 turnover margin and a 37.3 field-goal percentage on defense.

Following Thursday's clash, San Diego State will head north to the Los Angeles area next week for a pair of games at CSUN (Dec. 7) and Loyola Marymount (Dec. 10).

## Scouting the Toreros

USD (6-0) has matched its best start in program history to earn a No. 9 ranking in the latest College Insider Mid-Major Top-25 poll. The Toreros collected two wins at the USD Courtyard San Diego Central Classic last weekend, notching a 76-60 triumph over Valparaiso, followed by an 86-65 victory of Akron. Earlier this season, the Toreros also claimed an 86-64 decision over CSUN, whom the Aztecs will face in their next outing on Dec. 7.

Individually, USD is led by Malina Hood (19.8 ppg), a first-team all-West Coast Conference selection from a year ago who has drained a team-high 17 three-pointers and has connected on 20 of 23 free throws (.870). Not to be outdone, twin sister Maya Hood (17.3 ppg) has also figured prominently in the Toreros' success this season, averaging a team-best 9.5 rebounds while shooting 50 percent from the field (39-78). In addition, Sydney Williams boasts a double-digit scoring average (10.0 ppg), while Katherine Hamilton tops the squad in assists (4.0/g).

Collectively, USD is shooting 45.0 percent from the field, including a 38.2 percent clip from three-point range (34-89), which ranks 24th in the country. In addition, the Toreros occupy the 17th spot nationally in free-throw percentage (77.3). For the season, USD is outscoring its opposition by 19 points per game (75.5-56.5) and owns a stout plus-8.5 rebounding advantage.

Now in her 11th season, head coach Cindy Fisher has compiled a 203-127 record at the helm of the Torero program and has amassed a 262-208 mark in 16 years overall. Prior to taking over the reins at USD, Fisher served as head coach at Wyoming from 1998-2003, followed by a two-year stint as an assistant at Nebraska.

The Aztecs are 76-63 against current members of the West Coast Conference. However, 29 of those defeats occurred at the hands of former Western Athletic Conference and Mountain West rival Brigham Young.

### Notes With a 'W'

An SDSU victory over San Diego on Thursday will mean:

- The Aztecs extend their win streak to three games.
- SDSU snaps a two-game slide vs. the Toreros.
- The Aztecs raise their all-time record to 29-10 against USD, including a 20-5 mark at home.
- SDSU moves to 77-30 at home since the 2008-09 campaign.
- The Aztecs improve to 36-17 in December games since 2006.
- SDSU raises its record to 77-63 all-time against current WCC schools.

### Flashback: Aztecs-Toreros 2014 Road Edition

Visiting San Diego State was unable to overcome a slow start in its annual crosstown battle with the University of San Diego last season, falling by a 66-44 count at Jenny Craig Pavilion on Dec. 9, 2014.

The Aztecs misfired on their first six field-goal attempts, allowing USD to build a 9-0 advantage in the opening three minutes of the game. SDSU subsequently broke its scoring drought with consecutive baskets by Erimma Amariqwa and a layup by freshman McKynzie Fort, but found themselves in pursuit mode for the remainder of the evening.

After the Toreros answered with an old-fashioned three-point play by Maya Hood at the 13:08 mark, the Scarlet and Black managed to pull within four points on five occasions over the ensuing four-and-a-half minutes, including a 20-16 spread following a pair of free throws by junior Ahjalee Harvey. However, USD began to seize control at this juncture, as another and-one opportunity by Hood capped an 11-5 spurt that put the host school up 31-21 with 4:32 remaining in the first half.

The Aztecs seemed poised to creep back into contention after a layup by freshman Cheyenne Greenhouse and a clutch jumper by Fort with 18 ticks left on the clock. However, the Toreros picked themselves off the mat following six straight misses from the perimeter, as a layup by Brooke Jelniker at the buzzer snuffed out the SDSU momentum and gave the contest its 33-25 score at intermission.

The Aztecs trimmed the margin to five at 37-32 on a Harvey layup with just under three minutes elapsed in the second half, but could draw no closer. USD uncorked a 10-1 spurt over the next five minutes to build a 47-33 advantage that essentially quashed SDSU's comeback hopes. During that span, the Aztecs committed three turnovers and

came up empty on three shots from the floor.

San Diego State cut the deficit to 10 three times over the ensuing six-plus minutes, including a 53-43 margin on a Greenhouse layup with 4:57 remaining, but Maya Hood's trio of three-pointers highlighted a 13-1 closing run, as USD won going away.

Greenhouse (11 pts.) and Fort (10 pts.) each surpassed double digits in scoring for SDSU, while Khristina Hunter grabbed eight rebounds in the loss.

Conversely, the Toreros were paced by Malina Hood's 22-point performance, while twin sister Maya Hood added 14 points of her own to go with a game-high seven assists. In addition, USD received eight points, eight rebounds and three blocks by Sophia Ederaine, while Katelyn McDaniel contributed eight points and four boards.

Despite maintaining a slim 38-36 advantage in rebounds, the Aztecs were outscored by a 20-12 margin on second-chance points and a 17-4 spread off turnovers by USD, which also drained 10 more field goals (27-17) to help key its victory. Its lead in the fourth quarter as Plum recorded 13 points in an eight-minute span, capped by another three-point play, while a layup by Alexis Atchley closed out the scoring. Conversely, the Aztecs tallied just nine points during the frame and were held scoreless over the final 4:03.

Fort finished with nine points and contributed four assists and two steals, while junior Ariell Bostick recorded nine points as well, followed by Smith and Brandon, who notched six points apiece.

### Rewind: Aztecs-Badgers Recap

San Diego State picked up its second consecutive win with a thrilling 63-57 overtime victory over Wisconsin in the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic on Nov. 29. The Aztecs (2-4) overcame an extended offensive drought, misfiring on 21 of 22 field goals during one stretch, before engineering a furious second-half rally to eventually force the extra session.

Mired in the aforementioned slump, SDSU found itself on the wrong side of a 32-21 score with three minutes elapsed in the third quarter before uncorking a timely 23-7 blitz to grab a 44-39 advantage by the 7:30 mark of the fourth period. Sophomore McKynzie Fort scored seven of her team-high 16 points during the run, while the Aztecs connected on 9 of 13 field goals as a team. In addition, SDSU benefited from six Badger turnovers in that span as the visitors shot just 4 of 14 from the floor.

Still, the Aztecs were unable to put Wisconsin (2-3) in their rear-view mirror after the Badgers scored five straight points on a Roichelle Marble layup and a Nicole Bauman triple to tie the score at 46-46 with 5:06 left in the fourth period. After an exchange of baskets, a three-pointer by sophomore Geena Gomez gave the Aztecs a slim 49-46 advantage, but Bauman quickly answered with another trey to knot things up once again at 49-49 with 2:40 remaining.

Moments later, a jumper by Tessa Cichy put Wisconsin back on top 51-49 with 49 seconds to go in regulation before SDSU received some last-second heroics by junior Ariell Bostick to save the day. With 15 seconds left, Fort's layup attempt was off-target. However, Bostick kept the ball alive with a key offensive rebound then drove the lane and rolled in a shot to send the game into overtime.

In the extra period, Fort converted an old-fashioned three-point play on the Aztecs' first possession before Cichy tied the score at 54-54 on a deep three. However, senior Ahjalee Harvey (Mountain View, Calif.) scored the next four points on a layup and two free throws, while Fort soon followed with a jumper to give the Scarlet and Black a six-point bulge at 60-54 with 43 remaining in the game. Bauman nailed another three-pointer to narrow the gap to 60-57 on the Badgers' next trip up the court, but Bostick drained three free throws in the closing seconds to ice the win.

SDSU shot 53 percent from the field after intermission (16-30) and maintained a 26-18 advantage in the paint despite getting out-rebounded by a 45-30 margin, including a 21-11 spread on the offensive glass. Strangely however, Wisconsin did not attempt a single free throw the entire afternoon, while the Aztecs drained 12 of 18 foul shots to help key their win.

In addition to Fort's performance which included a game-high four steals, SDSU received a season-high 11 points from Bostick, while junior Aleiah Brandon reached double-figures with 10 points, highlighted by a pair of treys.

On the flip side, the Badgers were led by Bauman, who led all scorers with 24 points on 6-of-12 shooting from beyond the arc to go with six assists, while Roichelle Marble added 13 points off the bench in the loss.

SDSU jumped out to a 12-5 lead in the early going, but Marble drained two triple during an 11-1 spurt that gave Wisconsin a 16-13 edge by the end of the first quarter. The Aztecs mustered just three points in the second frame as the Badgers built a 26-19 cushion by halftime.

### SDSU-Wisconsin Postgame Notes

- The Aztecs played their first overtime game since knocking off UNLV 66-62 at home on Jan. 14, 2012.
- SDSU snapped a 10-game losing streak to teams from "Power 5" conferences. The Aztecs defeated USC 80-46 in their last victory over a "Power 5" conference opponent on Nov. 30, 2012.
- The Aztecs won for the first time this season when trailing at halftime. SDSU also emerged victorious for the first time this year when shooting under 40 percent (38.3) and dishing out fewer assists (12-8).
- The Aztec bench outscored the Wisconsin reserves by a 17-15 count. For the season, the SDSU bench has amassed 115 points (19.2/g).

### Fort Tabled MW Player of the Week

McKynzie Fort has been named Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week for her stellar performances in three games from Nov. 23-29, as announced Monday by the league office. With her award, the Aztec sophomore garnered weekly conference accolades for the first time in her career and first for SDSU this season.

Fort averaged 17.3 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 3.3 steals, helping the Aztecs to a 2-1 record last week. The 5-9 guard was the team's top scorer in all three games, connecting on 66.7 percent of her shots on 24 of 36 field-goal attempts, all inside the three-point arc.

After recording 16 points on 8-of-13 shooting and four rebounds in a tough road loss to Washington on Nov. 23, Fort almost single-handedly propelled the Scarlet and Black to a 64-54 triumph over North Dakota State in the opener of the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic last Friday, posting a game-high 20 points and a personal-best five steals. Against the Bison, the Etiwanda High alumna drained a collegiate-high 10 field goals on 12 tries (83.3 pct) and matched her season best with four rebounds.

Not to be outdone, Fort capped off her brilliant week with a 16-point, 4-steal effort in the Aztecs' thrilling 63-57 overtime victory over Wisconsin on Sunday, sinking 6 of 11 attempts from the floor to go with four clutch free throws. Against the Badgers, she converted two critical and-one opportunities, including one to punctuate a timely 23-7 run that erased an 11-point deficit in the second half.

For the season, Fort is averaging a team-high 15.7 points per game on 50.7 percent shooting and leads SDSU with 15 steals. She now has four double-digit scoring performances this year and 24 for her career.

In addition, Fort set a career high with 25 points against UC Riverside in the Aztecs' home opener on Nov. 16, and established collegiate bests in three-pointers made (2), field-goal attempts (17), free throws (11) and free throw attempts (12).

### Decembers to Remember

The Aztecs are a combined 35-17 during the month of December since 2006. Eight of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll, including a defeat to Washington (rv) on Dec. 18, following a pair of setbacks to No. 23 Texas A&M and North Carolina State (rv) last season. The Aztecs have also come up short in previous years against No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 14 Oklahoma State, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other nine defeats were against CSUN and USD in 2014, vs. UCLA in 2013, at Washington in 2012, at Washington State and against USD in 2011, vs. Pepperdine in overtime in 2009 and against Quinnipiac in the opener of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam. Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 37 of those 52 December contests at home.

### @AztecWBB Picked Sixth in MW Preseason Poll

San Diego State has been predicted to finish sixth the Mountain West preseason poll released on Oct. 28 by the league office. The voting panel consisted of the MW's 11 head coaches and select women's basketball media from around the conference.

during the 2014-15 campaign, earned 135 points from the panel, trailing fifth-place UNLV (132) by just three points while topping seventh-place Wyoming (125) by 10 points.

Two-time defending regular-season champion Colorado State was picked to repeat once again after receiving 21 of 28 first-place votes and 237 points, just ahead of New Mexico, which garnered seven first-place votes and 221 points, while 2015 MW tournament champion Boise State followed closely in the third spot with six first-place votes and 215 points.

With the league's forecast, SDSU has not been selected to finish among the top three places in the MW preseason rankings in back-to-back years for the first time since the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns. The Aztecs completed conference play where they were projected last season, landing in the seventh spot with an 8-10 record.

## Back Again

San Diego State returns three starters from a year ago, featuring sophomore McKynzie Fort, along with seniors Ahjaleé Harvey and Deidra Smith. A 5-9 guard, Fort earned Mountain West all-freshman honors last spring after finishing third among conference rookies with 10.9 points per game in league play while averaging 3.2 rebounds and 1.7 assists. In addition, Harvey made a successful recovery from a knee injury that sidelined her for the final 22 games of the 2013-14 campaign with 25 starts in 29 appearances last season. The 5-6 point guard was SDSU's top ball-handler and main three-point threat in 2014-15, dishing out 2.3 assists per contest to go with 21 triples. Meanwhile, Smith has played in all 62 games for the Aztecs the past two years following her transfer from Boston College. The tallest member on the squad as a 6-2 forward, Smith is the team's top returning rebounder after averaging 3.5 caroms last season.

Third-year head coach Stacie Terry and staff welcome back four additional letterwinners, including juniors Ariell Bostick and Aleiah Brandon and sophomores Cheyenne Greenhouse and Lexy Thorderson. Fellow classmate Allison Brown, who made seven spot appearances last season, also finds herself in the mix once again.

## Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, four players will be wearing a Scarlet and Black uniform for the first time during the 2015-16 campaign. Guard Kymberly Ellison (Columbus, Ga.) practiced with the squad last year, but did not compete after transferring from Georgia Tech, while fellow backcourt mate Geena Gomez (Huntington Beach, Calif.) utilized her redshirt season as well following her transfer from St. Joseph's (Pa.).

With the departure of forwards Erimma Amarikwa, Khristina Hunter and Desi Culberson, who accounted for 43 percent of SDSU's rebounding total and 38 percent of the team's scoring offense from a year ago, a pair of newcomers look to gain significant experience on the frontline this season. Junior Kylie Herd (Phoenix, Ariz.) received second-team All-America recognition and was named the Arizona JC player of the year as a sophomore last year at Mesa Community College, following a solid freshman campaign when she helped the Thunderbirds to the NJCAA Division II national championship. Not to be outdone, freshman Arantxa Gómez (Valencia, Spain) brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after sharpening her skills as a six-year member on the Spanish club circuit, including an MVP performance in U18 regional competition last April.

SDSU alumnus Chris Ello begins his ninth season of calling the action and is a familiar voice in the San Diego area. In addition to his responsibilities with the Aztec women's basketball squad, Ello is a member of the football broadcast team as a sideline reporter for the school's flagship station, The Mighty 1090 AM.

Ello started his career in sports talk radio in San Diego on XTRA Sports 690 in the summer of 1994. He has accumulated a wealth of experience doing play-by-play for a variety of sports at every level, including stints with the SDSU football (1985), baseball (1998-99) and men's basketball (2006-07) squads.

From 1996-2006, Ello was the voice of the San Diego Gulls hockey team and has called the action for the San Diego Sockers (indoor soccer), San Diego Spirit (outdoor soccer), San Diego Wildcards (CBA) and San Diego Riptide (arena football). He also has experience broadcasting high school CIF football and basketball games since 2000.

For the third straight year, nearly all regular-season Aztec home contests in 2015-16 will feature a live video stream via the Mountain West Network to supplement the audio call from Viejas Arena.

### 2015-16 By the Numbers

With excitement brewing for head coach Stacie Terry's third season on Montezuma Mesa, below are a few trends to watch for in 2015-16:

- SDSU enters the year having claimed 43 of its last 59 home games and has gone 75-28 on the Viejas Arena floor since the start of the 2008-09 campaign.
- The Aztecs have recorded 81 Mountain West victories in the last eight seasons after posting 31 wins in the league's first nine years.
- SDSU has won 44 straight games and is 74-1 over the last three seasons when leading with five minutes to go in the game, including an 12-0 mark in 2014-15. The Aztecs' lone blemish during that stretch was a heartbreaking 59-58 defeat at Washington in December 2012.
- SDSU is 35-17 in December games dating back to the 2006-07 campaign, with seven of those losses coming against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national polls.
- The Aztecs have advanced to finals of the MW Championship in five of the last eight years after not winning a single game in the tournament's first eight years of existence.
- For the third straight season, SDSU will play 18 conference games. The Aztecs will complete a home-and-away slate with eight squads, while facing Nevada (home) and Air Force (away) just once.

### NCAA Rule Changes at a Glance

#### Game Format

- Beginning with the 2015-16 campaign, NCAA women's basketball games will be played in four 10-minute quarters.
- Teams will now reach the bonus and shoot two free throws on the fifth team foul in each quarter. Previously, teams reached a one-and-one bonus on the seventh team foul of each half and reached the double bonus (two shots) on the 10th team foul.
- In the four-quarter format, team fouls reset to zero at the start of each quarter. However, if a team reaches the bonus in the fourth quarter, that team would remain in the bonus during any additional overtime periods.

#### Advancing the Ball

- Teams will be allowed to advance the ball to the frontcourt following a timeout immediately after a made basket in the last 59.9 seconds of the fourth quarter and any overtime periods.
- Teams will also be allowed to advance the ball to the frontcourt following a rebound or a change of possession. In these scenarios, the ball would be inbounded at the 28-foot mark on the side of the court where the scorer's table is located.

#### 10-Second Backcourt Exceptions

- For the upcoming season, a team will not receive a new 10-second backcourt count when a throw-in results from the following situations:
  - The ball is deflected out of bounds by the defense.
  - There is a held ball and the possession arrow favors the offensive team.

→ A technical foul is called on the offensive team while the ball is in its backcourt.

#### Post Defense

- Defenders will be allowed to place a forearm or an open hand with a bend in the elbow on an offensive post player with the ball whose back is to the basket.

#### Bands and Amplified Music

- In an effort to improve the overall fan experience, bands or amplified music may be played during any dead-ball situation during a women's basketball game. Previously, rules allowed music to be played only during timeouts and intermission.

### SDSU Holds Grand-Opening Ceremony for Jeff Jacobs JAM Center

San Diego State held a grand-opening ceremony for the 23,500-square foot Jeff Jacobs JAM Center on Sunday, Aug. 23. The event marked the official opening of the Aztecs' on-campus basketball performance center, which broke ground almost a year to the date on Aug. 27, 2014.

Speaking before the ceremonial ribbon cutting was SDSU president Elliot Hirshman, men's basketball head coach Steve Fisher and women's hoops senior guard Ahjalee Harvey.

Preliminary site work started in July 2014, just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields. The facility, which will support the continued growth and development of the SDSU men's and women's basketball teams, includes two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film room, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms.

Hundreds of supporters contributed to the effort to make the Jeff Jacobs JAM Center a reality. In addition to the naming gift from Jeff Jacobs, Hal and Debby Jacobs, Steve and Lisa Altman and Jim Morris, creating the name "JAM" Center, sizeable donations were made from the Manna Charitable Foundation and the Walter and Betty Zable Foundation. The total cost of the project was \$15 million.

The project was designed by JCJ Architecture and was built by The Hunt Construction Group.

San Diego native Stacie Terry enters her third year at the helm of the Aztec women's basketball team after she was named the eighth head coach in program history on May 15, 2013.

Despite a 12-19 record and an 8-10 mark in the Mountain West, Terry's squad still showed dramatic improvement on defense last season, finishing second in the conference and 34th nationally in opponent three-point field goal percentage, compared to 2014 when SDSU ranked last in the league and near the bottom of Division I in that statistic.

In addition, the Aztecs were fourth in scoring defense during MW play a year ago, allowing nearly 10 points per game fewer than the previous campaign and topped the conference in rebounding defense for the second straight season.

Under Terry's watch, forward Erimma Amarikwa capped off her collegiate career with honorable mention all-MW accolades, while guard McKynzie Fort gave SDSU's its second consecutive all-conference freshman honoree.

Terry's charges also made tremendous strides in the classroom, with the squad posting the highest collective GPA in program history during the fall of 2014, while five Aztecs landed a spot on the MW all-academic team, the most since 2001-02.

During her first season on Montezuma Mesa, Terry was saddled with the unenviable task of replacing four senior starters who accounted for nearly 64 percent of the team's scoring offense from the previous year, as well as overcoming the loss of two key players to injuries prior to conference play, Amarikwa, who was a preseason all-MW selection, and starting point guard Ahjalee Harvey.

Despite those obstacles and a demanding schedule featuring nine games against teams that eventually advanced to postseason competition, Terry's squad flashed its resiliency during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing with a 13-17 overall record and a 9-9 ledger in the MW.

With Terry at the controls, the Aztecs led the league in rebounding margin and rebounding defense while ranking second in field-goal percentage.

Individually, Terry also oversaw the progress of senior center Cierra Warren, who became the fifth SDSU player in a six-year span to receive first-team all-MW recognition.

Prior to her arrival on The Mesa, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level for 14 years, including five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. During that season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

Prior to her appointment at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA

tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN Hoop-Gurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyingifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Greutz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at the University of Texas at Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to UT Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry prepped at El Capitan High and held the Vaqueros' career scoring record for three years following her graduation. She was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
