OFF THE BOUNCE (through the games of December 2)

- Making its first appearance at Grand Canyon since the 2016-17 campaign and returning a game from the 2019-20 season, the San Diego State Aztecs face Grand Canyon University in Phoenix, Ariz., on Tuesday evening.
- The Aztecs and Antelopes are meeting for the fifth time, with San Diego State trailing 1-to-3 in the all-time series, but as Division I institutions the Aztecs won the only meeting between the programs 86-61 on Nov. 13, 2019 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena. (complete list of results between San Diego State and Grand Canyon are listed in the column on page 4)
- When San Diego State tips off at GCU Arena it will play the only team it doesn't have a winning record against in the current makeup of the Western Athletic Conference. (also: 4-0 vs. Seattle U, 3-2 vs. Southern Utah, 1-0 vs. UT Arlington)
- Once again San Diego State's metrics rank among the best in the nation. Through the games of December 2, the Aztecs were ranked No. 27 in Kenpom, No. 11 in T-Rank, No. 15 in Sagarin, No. 6 in KPI and No. 50 in BPI. The first NET rankings for the season will be published on Dec. 4.
- The Aztecs are among the elite programs in the country and that includes winning on their opponent's floor. Since the beginning of the 2009-10 campaign, SDSU has the fifth best road record in the nation, 102-60 (63.0 percent). **Since March 14, 2019, SDSU has a 32-10 road record (76.2 percent), which is the second best in the nation trailing only Gonzaga which has won 87.9 percent (29-4) of its road contests in that time frame.**
- San Diego State, which won both the 2022-23 Mountain West regular season and tournament titles and reached the league tournament championship game for the sixth time in head coach **Brian Dutcher's** six seasons, looks for its unprecedented 17th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2023-24 season, San Diego State has won nine regular season and seven Mountain West tournament titles.
- For the fifth time since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State opened the season ranked No. 17 in the preseason AP Top 25 Poll and after dropping out for two weeks, returned at No. 25 this week. The Aztecs No. 17 ranking in the initial poll is the second highest in program history, trailing only the 2014-15 preseason poll in which it was No. 16. Since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, SDSU has appeared in the AP poll for 103 weeks, more than any program in the state of California, ahead of UCLA (86 weeks), Saint Mary's (53 weeks), Southern California (38 weeks) and California (11 weeks).
- San Diego State owns a 115-24 record (82.7 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That is the third best record in the nation, trailing only Gonzaga (126-14, 90.0 percent) and Houston (124-22, 84.4 percent).
- In its 63-62 win at UC San Diego on Friday night, San Diego State's senior wing **Michah Parrish** scored 15 points and moved to within four points of 1,000 for his college career. If he reaches the milestone, he will join **Darrion Trammell** as the only current Aztecs with at least 1,000- career points. (A list of current SDSU players who have scored at least 500 career-points is located on page 12.)
- **Michah Parrish** (15 points, 10 rebounds) and **Jaedon LeDee** (13 points, 10 rebounds) finished the UC San Diego game with double doubles. It marked the 54 time since 1979 that two Aztecs had a double double in the same game and first since Winston Shepard (20 points, 10 rebounds) and Malik Pope (10 points, 12 rebounds) did it against Washington on March 21, 2016 in the second round of the

- SDSU has advanced to the postseason in 15 of the last 17 seasons in which a champion was crowned (2006 NCAA, 2007-09 NIT, 2010-15 NCAA, 2016 NIT, 2018, 2021-23 NCAA).
- SDSU has won 64 of last 69 games when leading at the half.
- SDSU has won its last 101-of-108 when having a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 5th nationally in winning percentage (.760) since the beginning of the 2009-10 season.
- Since its founding in 1999, no men's basketball program has won more Mountain West championships (regular-season and tournament) than San Diego State's 16.
- Since 2006, SDSU's 14 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for second most in Division I.

- Sophomore forward **Elijah Saunders** finished the UCSD game with his third 10-plus point effort (13 points) this season. He was 5-of-6 from the floor (a team single-game season high 83.3 percent), including knocking down a career-high matching three 3-pointers.
- Senior guard **Lamont Butler** returned to the double-digit scoring column with 10 points at UC San Diego, his best game since a 14-point effort against Long Beach State (11/14).
- Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** recorded his fifth double double of the season (No. 3 in the country) finishing with 13 points and 10 boards at UC San Diego. The Houston native has five double doubles in eight games this season and is already nearly halfway to the program's single-season top-10 in the category (T-No. 9 - 12). In eight games, he has drawn 65 fouls, an average of 8.1 per game, and nationally ranks No. 3 in free throw attempts (68) and No. 7 in free throws made (52).
- **Darrion Trammell**, a senior guard, scored eight points and added season-highs of five assists & three steals and matched season-best with three rebounds.
- **Brian Dutcher** is in his seventh season as San Diego State's head coach and his 25th season on the Aztec sidelines. In his six-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to five conference titles, six Mountain West championship game appearances, a 157-48 (.766) overall record, the 2023 NCAA national championship game, has been named the national coach of the year, and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

BIG NOTES

- **Micah Parrish** (15 points, 10 rebounds) and **Jaedon LeDee** (13 points, 10 rebounds) finished the UC San Diego game with double doubles. It marked the 54 time since 1979 that two Aztecs had a double double in the same game and first since Winston Shepard (20 points, 10 rebounds) and Malik Pope (10 points, 12 rebounds) did it against Washington on March 21, 2016 in the second round of the 2016 NIT.
- **Jaedon LeDee** recorded his fifth double-double (13 points & 10 rebounds) and made the game winning shot against UC San Diego as time expired and off his 10th rebound of the game.

- San Diego State moved to 102-60 (.630) in true road games with its 63-62 win at UC San Diego, since the start of the 2009-10, season which is the sixth best record in the nation in that timeframe.
- With its win at UC San Diego, San Diego State moves to 138-35 (.798) against Division I teams in California since the start of 1999-00.
- Through eight games, junior wing **Reese Waters** is perfect from the free throw line (30-of-30) to be tied with eight other Division I players who have yet to miss a shot from the charity stripe with a minimum of 15 attempts...however no player in the nation besides Waters has made as many as 27 free throws with a miss.
- Against Point Loma Nazarene, forward **Jaedon LeDee** recorded a double-double in the first half and finished with 15 points and 13 rebounds overall for his fourth double-double in seven games this season.
- Versus Washington & California, San Diego State wins back-to-back overtime games for the first time since Dec. 21, 1993 vs. CSUN & Dec. 23, 1993 at Loyola Marymount.
- Versus Washington & California, San Diego State played in back-to-back overtime games for the first time since Feb. 12, 2005 vs. UNLV & Feb. 19, 2005 at Colorado State.
- Reese Waters** was named the SoCal Showcase MVP; scored a career-high 24 points and grabbed a career-best seven rebounds while also going 10-of-10 from the charity stripe vs. California.
- Against Washington, **Jaedon LeDee** became the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 to have at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent.
- Following the Washington game, **Jaedon LeDee** was the second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 enroute to the Wooden Award.
- Against Washington, San Diego State was the only team in the nation with a combined top-25 offense, top-25 defense and top-100 strength of schedule, according to Kenpom.
- SDSU defeated Washington 100-97, the last time San Diego State gave up at least 97 points and won was a 123-103 victory over U.S. International on February 27, 1991.
- San Diego State won the Continental Tire Main Event (CTME) championship and has won the tournament title in three of its four appearances in MTEs in Las Vegas. (also: 2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic & 2019 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational and was the runner up at the 2015 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational).
- Jaedon LeDee** was named the Tournament MVP and along with **Micah Parrish** were selected for the all-tournament team at the Continental Tire Main Event.
- A day after being named the CTME Most Valuable Player, LeDee was honored as the Mountain West Player of the Week and earned National Player of the Week distinction by NCAA March Madness National, the Lute Olson Award, Oscar Robertson Award and ESPN.**
- Following the Saint Mary's game, San Diego State was one of just two teams which had handed the Gaels multiple 20-plus point beatings since Feb. 23, 2001 (also: Gonzaga).

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

San Diego State will play three neutral site and 13 true road games during the 2023-24 regular season and here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 102-60 (.630) record in road games is the fifth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 67-32 (.677) record in neutral site games (min. 95 games) is the sixth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 169-92 (.648) record in road/neutral games is the sixth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 101-59 (.631) record in road games against the Mountain West, leads the conference.

PHOENIX NOT FRIENDLY

San Diego State has had a lot of success in a lot of places, but Phoenix Arizona is not one of them.

- Since the start of the 1999-00 season, San Diego State is 2-5 in games played in the Valley of the Sun.
- San Diego State is 1-1 in neutral site games, both against Saint Mary's in the Jerry Colangelo Classic. (63-53 win on Dec. 17, 2021 & 61-68 loss on Dec. 10, 2022)
- SDSU is 0-1 at Grand Canyon. (72-76 loss on Dec. 7, 2016)
- The Aztecs have won one of their four games (1-3) at Arizona State. (85-99 loss on Dec. 18, 1999, 52-55 loss on Dec. 19, 2009, 68-90 loss on Nov. 14, 2017 and 80-68 win on Dec. 10, 2020)

ON THE PRECIPICE OF 1,000 POINTS

When the Aztecs play at Grand Canyon on Tuesday senior wing Micah Parrish will start the game with 996 career points.

- With four points Parrish will reach the 1,000 career-point plateau.
- Parrish will be the fourth player to reach 1,000-career points while wearing an Aztec kit since the start of the 2019-20 season. (also: Malachi Flynn & Matt Mitchell in 2019-20, Jordan Schakel in 2020-21 and Matt Bradley in 2022-23). Note: Flynn scored 564 of his 1,355-career points while at SDSU and Bradley who scored 2,322-career points had 1,033 at San Diego State and 1,289 at California.

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON TUESDAY

When the Aztecs play at Grand Canyon on Tuesday here are the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 42-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better.
- 29-game win streak when scoring between 80-89 points.
- 27-game win streak when attempting more free throws than its opponent.
- 23-game win streak when holding its opponent 40.0 percent or less shooting from the floor.
- 16-game win streak when outrebounding its opponent.
- 13-game win streak when leading with five minutes to play.
- 12-game win streak when leading at the half.
- 5-game win streak in games played in December.

MEANINGLESS STAT OF THE WEEK

Major League Baseball Hall of Fame inductee Tony Gwynn (SDSU class of 1981) had more assists in his college career at SDSU (590), than strikeouts in a 20-year major league career (434). His 590 assists are still the program's career-best and more than 100 assists more than

any Aztec since at least the 1972-73 season.

PERFECT FROM THE LINE

Junior wing Reese Waters is off to a nice start from the line, going 30-of-30 in the team's eight games.

- Through the games of Dec. 1, nine players are perfect from the free throw line, but Waters is the only one who has made at least 24 free throws without a blemish.
- Since the start of the 1999-00 season, only two players have been perfect from the line for a season on a minimum of 30 attempts...the Citadel's Matt Frierson and Wichita State's Connor Frankamp.
- Frierson ended the 2018-19 campaign 44-of-44 on free throw attempts, but through his first eight games was 10-of-10.
- In 2017-18, Frankamp finished 35-of-35 from the stripe and was 9-of-9 through his first eight contests.
- In available records, no Aztec has finished a season without a miss. The single-season free throw percentage leader at San Diego State is Kim Goetz who was 74-of-82 (90.2 percent) from the charity stripe in the 1978-79 campaign.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 138-35 (.798) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 98 home games against those same 24 opponents, and starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 89-11 (.890).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 472-325 (.592) overall.

San Diego State has already defeated in-state foes Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, Saint Mary's, California and UC San Diego and still has games vs. UC Irvine (12/9), vs. Stanford (12/21), vs. Fresno State (1/3), at San Jose State (1/9), at Fresno State (2/24) & vs. San Jose State (2/27).

SOCAL SHOWCASE

On its 76-67 overtime victory over California on Saturday, Nov. 25 in San Juan Capistrano, Calif., San Diego State won the inaugural SoCal Showcase.

- With the win, SDSU has won each of its three regular-season neutral site games in the 2023-24 season.
- The Aztecs complete a regular season sweep of its neutral site games, a minimum of three games played, for the fifth time in the Dutcher/Fisher era (also: 2019-20, 3-0; 2016-17, 3-0; 2011-12, 3-0; 2010-11, 5-0)
- Junior wing **Reese Waters** was named the game's inaugural Most Valuable Player, finishing with career-highs with 24 points and seven rebounds.
- In combination with its 100-97 overtime win against Washington at the Continental Tire Main Event, San Diego State has played in back-to-back overtime games for the first time since Feb. 12, 2005 vs. UNLV & Feb. 19, 2005 at Colorado State.
- San Diego State won back-to-back overtime games for the first time since Dec. 21, 1993 vs. CSUN & Dec. 23, 1993 at Loyola Marymount.

OVERTIME GAMES

When San Diego State went to overtime in its 76-67 win against California at the SoCal Showcase in San Juan Capistrano, Calif.;

- It improved its overtime record to 42-41 since it went to the Division I level prior to the 1970-71 season.
- In the California game, the Aztecs won their straight overtime affair and since the 2005-06 season SDSU is 27-4 in overtime games.
- In neutral site games which have gone into overtime, San Diego State improved to 8-3.
- Since the start of the 1970-71 campaign, the Aztecs are 5-4 in double overtime contests and 0-2 in triple overtime games.

GETTING TO THE LINE

In the Aztecs' overtime wins over Washington & California, the team got to the line again...and again...and again.

- Against Washington, SDSU's 41 free throw attempts are its most in a game since it went to the line 41 times against Fresno State on Jan. 15, 2014 and are tied for the third most in the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- SDSU's 31 free throws made in both its Washington and California games are its most in a game since it knocked down 31 versus Wyoming on March 1, 2006 and are tied for the third most in the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- Since at least the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era, the Aztec record for free throw attempts is 44 vs. CSUN on Dec. 1, 2001, and its record for makes is 33, which it achieved against CSUN on Dec. 1, 2001 and versus UNLV on Feb. 12, 2005.
- Since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era, the team's 78 free throw attempts vs. Washington (41) and California (37) are its most in back-to-back games and the most since the team attempted 75 in back-to-back games vs. Saint Mary's (37) and at Loyola Marymount (38) on Dec. 14, 2004 and Dec. 18, 2004, respectively.

- In its last 408 games in which it has forced at least 10 turnovers, San Diego State has won 326 times (326-82; 79.9 percent).

- San Diego State is 32-4 (88.9 percent) when **Lamont Butler** has multiple steals in a game.
- San Diego State is 25-5 (83.3 percent) when **Jaedon LeDee** shoots at least 50.0 percent in a game.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, San Diego State has the seven-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 202-25 home record, winning 89.0 percent of its home games during that span.

In the midst of the 2023-24 season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 238 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 212-26 mark (89.1 percent), including a 111-12 record (90.2 percent) in its last 123 home games against non-conference competition.
- Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 145-30 (82.9 percent) home record against conference opponents.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 157-21 (88.2 percent) at home, including a 70-9 (88.6 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 67-7 (90.5 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 77-11 (87.5 percent) in their last 88 conference home games and 74-9 (89.2 percent) in their last 83 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 62 home games, San Diego State is 57-5, with an average scoring margin of +16.5 points in those victories. In 44 of those 57 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs current 16-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 9, 2021, against UC Riverside, equals the second-longest in school history; a win streak that began on February 2, 1966 and ran to December 23, 1968.
- San Diego State is 68-6 in its last 74 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 47-5 in their 50 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home enroute to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on nine occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22 and 2022-23).

CONTINENTAL TIRE MAIN EVENT

With its 100-97 win in overtime against Washington on Sunday, Nov. 19, San Diego State won the Continental Tire Main Event at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas.

- With the win, SDSU has emerged the champion in three of its four MTEs (Multi-Team Event) played in Las Vegas - 2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2019 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational & 2023 Continental Tire Main Event & was the runner-up at the 2015 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.
- Jaedon LeDee, in two games, averaged 29.5 points, 12.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists while adding three steals and a block. LeDee shot 54.1 percent from the floor (20-of-37), 33.3 percent from the bonus distance (1-of-3) and 78.3 percent from the line (18-of-23). Among his 25 boards, 12 were on the offensive glass and he drew 19 fouls.
- LeDee was named the Most Valuable Player for the event and earned inclusion on the all-tournament team.
- Micah Parrish was named to the all-tournament team after averaging 13.0 points, 3.5 assists, 3.0 rebounds and added seven assists, three steals and a block. Parrish shot 42.9 percent from both the floor and 3-point range, knocking down 6-of-14 shots from the field and 3-of-7 from distance, and 91.7 percent from the line (11-of-12).

A JAEDON LEDEE WEEK

For **Jaedon LeDee**, his three games during the week of Nov. 14 are to be remembered for a number of reasons:

- LeDee matched his career-high in points on Nov. 14 vs. Long Beach State and then bettered it on Sunday against Washington with 34 and also grabbed a career-best 17 rebounds.
- LeDee is the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 to have at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent (10-of-20 FG).
- Is the first Aztecs with at least 34 points in a game since Aerick Sanders vs. Portland on Dec. 31, 2003.
- Had two of his four double doubles on the year: 27pts/11 rebs vs. Long Beach State & 34 pts/17 rebs vs. Washington.
- Had his fifth 20+ point effort to start the season, becoming the first Aztec to accomplish that in the first five games of a season since at least the start of the 1996-97 campaign.
- He is the first Mountain West player ever to average 25.0+ points and 10.0+ rebounds over his first five games of a season.
- LeDee is the second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 enroute to the Wooden Award.
- His 86 points in three games last week mark the first time an Aztec has totaled at-least 80 points in three games since Matt Bradley combined for 80 points in a three-game stretch at the end of the 2021-22 season. LeDee's 86 points are the most since Jamaal Franklin scored 84 in three games from Feb. 25-March 3, 2012.
- He finished the week averaging 28.7 points, 12.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists, 2.0 steals and added a block. In three games he shot 57.1 percent from the floor (28-of-39), including 50.0 percent from the bonus distance (2-of-4) and 84.8 percent from the line (28-of-33).

JAEDON LEDEE GARNERS FOUR NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS

- LeDee is the first Aztec to receive national player of the week recognition since Matt Bradley was honored by ESPN and NCAA March Madness on March 7, 2022.

JAEDON LEDEE NAMED MW PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Senior forward **Jaedon LeDee** was named the Mountain West Conference Player of the Week for the week ending Sunday, November 19. The announcement was made for the conference office in Colorado Springs, Colorado on Monday, Nov. 20.

The Houston, Texas native, led the Aztecs to a 3-0 record while averaging 28.7 points, 12.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists, 2.0 steals and added a block. In three games he shot 57.1 percent from the floor (28-of-39), including 50.0 percent from the bonus distance (2-of-4) and 84.8 percent from the line (28-of-33). In addition, he dished out seven assists, had six steals and a block.

After wins over Saint Mary's on Friday night and Washington on Sunday evening at the Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas, LeDee earned inclusion on the all-tournament team and was honored as the tournament MVP.

In the championship game, a 100-97 overtime thriller against Washington on Sunday evening, he became the first Aztec since at least the start of the 1996-97 season to total at least 34 points and 17 rebounds in a game and is the only player in Mountain West history to do it and shoot at least 50.0 percent from the field. It was his second double double of the week. He shot 50.0 percent from the field (10-of-20), and 77.8 percent from the charity stripe (14-of-18), with three assists, a steal and a block.

His 34 points against the Huskies marked the first time that an Aztec had scored 34 points in a game since Aerick Sanders versus Portland on Dec. 31, 2003.

To start the week, LeDee equaled his career-high with 27 points against Long Beach State where he was 8-of-12 (66.7 percent) from the field, including 1-of-1 from beyond the arc, and 10-of-10 from the line with eight rebounds, three steals and two assists.

In the opener of the Continental Tire Main Event against Saint Mary's, LeDee went for 25 points on 10-of-17 shooting (58.8 percent), including 1-of-2 from distance (50.0 percent) and 4-of-5 from the line (80.0 percent). He had eight boards, two assists and two steals.

LeDee is the second Division I player over the last 10 seasons to score 20+ points on at least 55.0 percent shooting in the first five games of a season, joining Obi Toppin in 2019-20 en route to the Wooden Award.

This is LeDee's first Mountain West Player of the Week award of the year and his career and the first for an Aztec this season.

JAEDON LEDEE NAMED CONTINENTAL TIRE MAIN EVENT MVP: PARRISH HONORED

For averaging 29.5 points, 12.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists while adding five steals and a block in wins over Saint Mary's, 79-54, and Washington, 100-97 in overtime, **Jaedon LeDee** was named the Most Valuable Player of the tournament and was included on the all-tournament team. He totaled 77 minutes and committed just three turnovers while drawing 19 fouls.

Micah Parrish scored at a 13.0 points per game clip at the tournament while dishing out 3.5 assists and grabbing 3.0 rebounds to go along with three steals and a block to garner all-tournament team honors.

THE CENTURY MARK

When San Diego State defeated Washington 100-97 on Sunday, Nov. 19, it was the 43rd time in its Division I history that the Aztecs reached the century mark.

- With the win, San Diego State moves to 40-3 when it scores at least 100 points in a game and has won 28 straight when reaching 100 points.
- SDSU cracked triple digits for the first time in 169 games: a first since a 103-64 win over Texas Southern on Nov. 14, 2018.
- All three losses, when scoring at least 100 points, occurred in the 1976-77 season and within a six-game span. The first two came within nine days and three games of each other: a 113-118 loss to then No. 5-ranked UNLV on Dec. 11, 1976 in the Sports Arena and a 104-107 defeat at New Mexico on Dec. 20, 1976. The third came on Jan. 3, 1977 against North Texas in Peterson Gym with the final score of 100-108.

CHECK THE COLLAR

If you look closely at the back of the Aztecs uniforms, you'll notice a silver tag on the collar, and here is what it signifies:

- On the outside of the tag is the intertwined San Diego State SD logo and on the inside of the collar is the term "Elite."
- The collar tags are given by Nike to signify a team that has participated in the Final Four.
- The Aztecs will wear the tag on their home, away and N7 jerseys.

WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 45 victories at Thomas & Mack Center. That is the most victories by any school in the nation in any venue in which they have not played a home game during that span. In second place is Villanova in Madison Square Garden with 37 victories.
- San Diego State is 17-1 in its last 18 games in Las Vegas and 34-8 in its last 42 games in the city, regardless of facility.
- In four regular-season MTEs in Las Vegas, San Diego State has three tournament titles (2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2019 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational & 2023 Continental Tire Main Event) and was the runner up at the 2015 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational.
- In going 7-1 in its Las Vegas MTEs, the Aztecs are 2-0 vs. ranked opponents with wins against No.14/13 California & No. 14/22 West Virginia in 2015.

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING...AND ROLLING

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for now 25 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 544 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 17 postseason tournaments, including 12 NCAA appearances, a three of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014, 20223) and last season past the Sweet 16, to the Elite 8, Final Four and 2023 national championship game.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his first six years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first six seasons.
- His 151 wins in his first six seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first six campaigns.
- His 158 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.

DUTCHER FEATURED IN CBS SPORTS "HOME COURT"

CBS Sports' original series "Home Court" returns with three episodes featuring San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher, UConn coach Dan Hurley, and Indiana coach Mike Woodson. All three episodes will premiere on CBS Sports Network, with Dutcher's interview with CBS Sports college basketball analyst Seth Davis. The episode of "Home Court: Brian Dutcher" will debut on CBS Sports Network on Sunday, Nov. 19, at 2 p.m. ET/11 a.m. PT.

Davis talked with Dutcher after San Diego State's first Final Four appearance in program history. The Aztecs reached the national championship game before falling to Connecticut to end their magical March Madness run. Dutcher and Davis talk about SDSU's success in the 2023 NCAA Tournament, his relationship with former Aztecs coach Steve Fisher and Dutcher's years as an assistant coach at Michigan.

SERIES HISTORY VS. GRAND CANYON

- Tonight's game against Grand Canyon marks the fifth meeting between these programs, and the second as Division I opponents.
- The Aztecs trail in the series, which began on February 30, 1980, 1-3 three of those four games contested on SDSU's home floor.
- In the initial encounter, on the aforementioned date, San Diego State fell 68-86 at the Sports Arena. Nearly 35 years later, on December 15, 2015, the Antelopes earned a 52-42 win at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena and then went 3-0 against the Aztecs with a 76-72 win at GCU Arena on December 7, 2016. San Diego State got in the win column in the last meeting, an 86-61 drubbing on Nov. 13, 2019 at Viejas Arena.
- The game will be the second matchup since the start of the 2019-20 season and the second as Division I opponents (last: Nov. 13, 2019).

SAN DIEGO - First a win at BYU and then finally, a win against pesky Grand Canyon.

It's been a big five-day stretch for San Diego State, which dominated inside and outside against Grand Canyon to win 86-61 Tuesday night. Malachi Flynn and Nathan Mensah each scored 14 points.

KJ Feagin added 13 points for SDSU (3-0), which was coming off a big 76-71 win at former conference rival BYU on Saturday.

Grand Canyon (0-3) had won its previous two games against the Aztecs in San Diego, plus the most recent game in the series, a 76-72 victory in Phoenix on Dec. 7, 2016.

"Coach Dutch (Brian Dutcher) was really on edge coming into this game," Feagin said. "I knew he wanted this win. Coach Dave (Velasquez) talked about how we'd never beat them before and being a part of the team that got the win at BYU, now let's turn around and get Grand Canyon, so I'm happy that we accomplished both missions."

Dutcher said the win was "very satisfying. We knew that we'd lost, since we've been here, Coach (Steve) Fisher and I, twice to Grand Canyon, both important, critical games. At the time it doesn't seem that way but when the season finishes up you have that loss on your record and we knew it hurt us. We wanted to come out and play at a high level because we knew they were a very good opponent."

Dutcher succeeded Fisher as head coach after the 2016-17 season.

Leading 15-14, SDSU got hot from inside and outside and raced to a 30-18 lead. Matt Mitchell hit a 3-pointer and a fall-away jumper during the big run.

The Aztecs twice hit consecutive 3-pointers in the first half. Feagin and Mitchell did it early on and then Adam Seiko and Keshad Johnson did it to give SDSU a 36-22 lead with six minutes before halftime.

GCU went scoreless for the final five minutes of the first half as SDSU jumped to a 40-24 lead.

"Offensively when you have 35 baskets and 25 assists, you're playing the game the right way," Dutcher said. "Overall, offensively we shared the ball as well as we have all year. We ended up outrebounding them for the game, which pleased me."

Flynn had nine assists and Feagin had seven.

"I'm proud of the way we played," Feagin said. "I think it was right in our game plan and coaches were preaching that to us at halftime, just to keep sharing the ball."

Lorenzo Jenkins scored 15 for GCU, while Jovan Blacksher Jr. had 14 points and 10 rebounds, and Isiah Brown and Carlos Johnson had 10 points each.

"We're not going to turn this around anytime soon until they figure it out," GCU coach Dan Majerle said. "It's just not good enough. We're not tough enough, we're not playing hard enough, we're not playing disciplined enough. Just very disappointed. We have stretches where we play well, and then we go away from it."

SDSU had a 21-point lead early in the second half before GCU closed to 11.

"We knew they had a run in them and they put a little run in the second half but we kind of withstood it and kind of maintained it for a while, then built the lead back," Dutcher said.

BIG PICTURE

Grand Canyon: Majerle was unhappy with his players most of the night. To make things worse, Mitchell made a nice shot during SDSU's big run and then said something to the former NBA player, who jumped out of his seat. A referee said, "I'll take care of this," and whistled Mitchell for a technical.

San Diego State: The Aztecs are off to their first 3-0 start since their NCAA Tournament season of 2014-15. It has advanced to the NAAs each of the last three times it started 3-0.

SAN DIEGO STATE VS. THE WESTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

- San Diego State is 9-5 vs. current members of the Western Athletic Conference and has won its last two games against an opponent from the conference.
- San Diego State has a winning record against three of the four current members of the Western Athletic Conference that it has played (exception: Grand Canyon, 1-3).

- Since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00), San Diego State is 5-2 against the current member of the WAC.
- Overall San Diego State has won 64.2 percent (9-5) of its games against current Western Athletic Conference teams (H: 7-4, A: 1-1, N: 1-0).
- The game at Grand Canyon is SDSU's first against a current member of the WAC since a 68-62 victory over UT Arlington at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena on Nov. 20, 2021.
- San Diego State was a member of the Western Athletic Conference from 1978-79 through 1998-99, when it joined the Mountain West. As a member of the WAC, SDSU was not the program it is today. In the 21 years it competed in the league, the Aztecs posted a 112-222 record (33.5 percent), which included just two winning seasons. But among those two seasons, San Diego State qualified for the 1985 NCAA Tournament with a 23-7 regular-season record, including an 11-3 conference mark.

LAST TIME OUT

San Diego State 63, UC San Diego 62

LA JOLLA, Calif. - Four Aztecs scored in double figures, led by double doubles from senior wing Micah Parrish and senior forward Jaedon LeDee as the San Diego State men's basketball team escaped an embarrassing loss to UC San Diego 63-62 on Friday evening at LionTree Arena.

With less than a second on the clock and trailing by a point, LeDee grabbed the rebound off a missed Lamont Butler 3-pointer with two seconds remaining and scored on the putback at the buzzer to rally the Aztecs to victory.

"Needless to say, this was a hard-fought victory," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "Sometimes, you have to be at your best when your best is required. We got down 14 in the second half, but we didn't give in. We stayed tough minded, and we found a way to make the basket at the end of the game to squeak out a win. This environment was incredible. Credit to UCSD, on short rest after a long road trip. They played at a high level, and we were fortunate enough to get a win today."

Trailing by 14 points, 57-43 with 7:36 to play, San Diego State went on a 13-0 run over the next 5:20 to get SDSU to within a point with 2:16 to go.

LeDee had a layup with 38 seconds left to play to pull the Aztecs (7-1) within 62-61. Bryce Pope missed a 3-pointer with 10 seconds to go and LeDee grabbed the rebound setting up the final second drama.

Parrish topped San Diego State with 15 points and 10 rebounds. LeDee and Elijah Saunders scored 13 apiece with LeDee adding 10 boards. Butler scored 10 with five assists.

In its first appearance at UC San Diego, the win improves the SDSU's record against the Tritons to 14-0 in the all-time series and is now 239-122 against the current members of the Big West Conference.

"Obviously, our locker room is disappointed," Triton head coach Eric Olen said. "I just told them that I was proud of their effort. I thought we played good basketball, in particular, coming off a long road trip where we didn't feel like we played our best basketball. I was really proud of their response and just the way they competed. I'm proud of them."

Francis Nwaakorle, Hayden Gray and Pope all finished with 15 points for the Tritons (4-4). Gray added five assists.

KEEPING IT THE FAMILY

With an opening on the coaching staff following the national championship game at the 2023 NCAA Tournament, head coach **Brian Dutcher** didn't look too far to fill the vacancy when he announced the hiring of one of the most beloved Aztecs of all time, **Aguek Arop**. Arop's responsibility to the program includes scouting, film preparation, camps and academics.

He earned a bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies in 2022 and is working on completing a master's degree in homeland security at San Diego State.

The native of Omaha, Neb., finished his five-year playing career at the national championship game of the 2023 NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament. A team captain in both the 2021-22 and 2022-23 seasons, he completed his career ranked No. 5 in conference victories (54), No. 6 in games played (135) and No. 7 in total victories (102) in the 102 years of SDSU men's basketball.

AZTECS FINISH AT A PROGRAM-BEST NO. 2 IN FINAL 2022-23 COACHES POLL

Reaching the 2023 NCAA Tournament national championship game, San Diego State garnered a No. 2 rank in the final Coaches Poll of the 2022-23 season.

The ranking is the highest in program history in the Coaches' final poll and the sixth time SDSU has been ranked at the end of the year by the coaches. The previous high ranking at the end of a season was No. 5 in 2010-11. The Aztecs have also slotted in at No. 6 (2019-20), No. 11 (2013-14), No. 18 (2020-21) and No. 23 (2011-12).

- San Diego State opened its 103rd basketball campaign on The Mesa with an 83-57 victory over Cal State Fullerton and improved to 70-33 (.680) in season opening games, regardless of location.
- This is the 54th season of Division I basketball at San Diego State and the Aztecs are now 35-19 (.648) in DI season-opening games.
- San Diego State has won its last 19 home openers, regardless of if the game was the season opener.
- The Aztecs have won 11 consecutive season openers, regardless of location.

AZTECS PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

- San Diego State has won an unprecedented 16 Mountain West titles in men's basketball (nine regular season & seven tournament), double the next highest Mountain West program (New Mexico - 8), and after its run to the 2023 NCAA Tournament national championship game, but losing despite losing five seniors and 50.7 percent of its scoring from a year ago, has been predicted to finish in first by a poll of the media that regularly cover the conference.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last 10 years.
- It is also the 15th time in the last 19 years that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the Mountain West's preseason poll.

and **Reese Waters**, were included on the conference's list of preseason honors. Butler was included on the All-MW Team and Waters was named the Newcomer of the Year by the media who regularly cover the Mountain West.

- Last season Butler, a physical guard, was a member of the league's All-Defensive Team and a third-team all-league performer who exploded in the postseason being named to the NCAA All-South Regional Team and a spot on the NCAA All-Tournament Team after hitting the biggest shot in program history, the game winner against Florida Atlantic to send the Aztecs to the national championship game.
- Butler led the Aztecs in 2022-23 in assists (126) and steals (57), ranked No. 2 in field goals (128), and No. 3 in points (345) and minutes (1,010). Among returners from last year's team, he leads the squad in made baskets, assists, steals and ranks second in points, minutes, and assists-to-turnover ratio (1.59:1), and is third in 3-pointers (40) and rebounds (105).
- Butler is the third Aztec to be named to the preseason All-Mountain West in the last four seasons, joining Matt Mitchell who was named to the team prior to the 2020-21 campaign and Matt Bradley, who garnered the distinction prior to the 2022-23 season. Mitchell went on to be named the Mountain West Player of the Year and a first-team performer following the 2021-22 season and Bradley was a first-team all-league honoree last season.
- Waters, a transfer from Southern California and the reigning Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year, is one of four players in the nation in the last two seasons to have shot at least .439 from the field, .359 from the distance, and .809 from the line while playing in at least 62 games and starting no more than eight times.
- In 2022-23, Waters, the Trojans' third leading scorer, averaged 9.8 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.1 assists in 25.3 minutes per game. A starter in eight of 29 appearances, the native of Long Beach, Calif., shot 43.8 percent (102-of-233) from the field, 29.6 percent (24-of-81) from beyond the arc, and 77.5 percent (55-of-71) from the line. In addition, he set career-bests in rebounds (93), steals (21), blocks (12) and minutes (734). He reached double figure scoring in 13 contests, including a career-best 20 points vs. Long Beach State on December 14.
- Joining Malachi Flynn (2019-20), Matt Bradley (2021-22), and Darrion Trammell (2022-23), Waters becomes the fourth Aztec in the last five seasons to be recognized by the media as the preseason Newcomer of the Year. Both Flynn and Bradley proved the prognosticators correct by earning the award when the season was complete.

BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Seventh Season • 25th Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his seventh season as head coach after leading the Aztecs to six Mountain West title games, their conference-high 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th Mountain West titles and four trips to the NCAA tournament, including a run to the 2023 national championship game.

Dutcher, who ascended to head coach following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Over the course of his 24 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 17 times, including 12 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 18 seasons of at least 20 victories. He is the only coach in the 102-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first six seasons and his 151 victories are the most of any first-time Division I head coach who began at their current institution since the start of the 2017-18 season.

His .763-win percentage (151-47) entering the 2023-24 season is the best in program history, as is his .550-win percentage (11-9) against top-25 opposition.

In 2017-18, Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors, Trey Kell and Malik Pope, that had won multiple league titles and had NCAA tournament experience. The Aztecs won six consecutive games to end the regular season and captured the program's 11th crown, the Mountain West tournament title, and returned to the NCAA tournament. Dutcher was the only first-year head coach to guide his team to the 2018 NCAA tourney and one of six to have won at least 20 games. SDSU finished the campaign with a 22-11 record, with the 22 wins representing the most by a first-year Aztec men's basketball head coach and the second-most among first-year coaches that season.

The 2018-19 season saw the Aztecs return to the Mountain West championship game after twice defeating nationally ranked Nevada, including a 65-56 victory over the Wolf Pack in the semifinal of the MW tournament. The team was 21-13, the 13th consecutive season with at least 19 victories.

In 2019-20, his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at No. 4 in both the AP and Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), NABC Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and USBWA District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was a finalist for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, the team's 30 wins are the fifth most and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in MW play are the most in program history. Its one loss in league action is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak also which set a Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, who would be a first-round selection of the NBA Toronto Raptors, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. In addition, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point loss in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic, three days after the Utes beat No. 6 Kentucky.

In the COVID-affected season of 2020-21, the Aztecs were once again the cream of the Mountain West crop posting a 23-5 record, including a 14-3 mark in league play. San Diego State earned the league's regular season and tournament crowns in the NCAA tournament were a 6-seed. For the second consecutive campaign, Dutcher was named Coach of the Year of both the Mountain West and NABC Division I District 17.

The Aztecs opened 2020-21 with a win over No. 22 UCLA and later won at No. 23 Arizona State. The team reached the MW title game for the fourth straight season earning a measure of revenge in the championship game, defeating Utah State, 68-57, which had had knocked them off in the previous two league title games.

The team was led by seniors Matt Mitchell and Jordan Schakel, who became the 34th and 35th players in program history, respectively, to score 1,000 points in their careers. Mitchell was named an honorable-mention AP All-American honors, Mountain West Player of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, Mountain West All-Defensive Team, NABC first-team All-District 17, USBWA first-team All-District IX, Basketball Times West Coast All-District Team, Mountain West Tournament Most Valuable Player, Mountain West All-Tournament Team and was the sixth player, and first Aztec, in Mountain West history to earn Player of the Year & Tournament MVP in the same year. Schakel was second-team All-Mountain West, NABC second-team All-District 17 and a Mountain West All-Tournament Team honoree.

The 2021-22 campaign demonstrated that despite losing its top three scorers from the previous

season, the Aztecs reload while other programs rebuild. For the fifth consecutive year, Dutcher guided the Aztecs to 20-plus wins (23-9), and a bid to the NCAA tournament, the third since taking the helm of the program. If not for the cancellation of the 2020 NCAA tournament, SDSU, which was projected to be a No. 1 or No. 2 seed with a 30-2 record, the 2021-22 season would have marked the program's third straight, and fourth overall, NCAA appearance under Dutcher.

San Diego State authored a 79-49 dismantling of No. 20 Colorado State at Viejas Arena, the worst beating SDSU has ever handed to a ranked opponent, and a 63-58 win over the No. 23 Rams in the semifinal of the Mountain West Championship. Entering 2022-23, Dutcher was 5-0 against top-25 opponents in Viejas Arena and 9-6 overall against ranked teams.

Matt Bradley, a transfer from California, slipped seamlessly into the Aztecs offense, led the team in scoring, 16.9 points per game, and was named the Mountain West Newcomer of the Year, first-team All-Mountain West, second team NABC All-District 17 and earned both ESPN and NCAA March Madness National Player of the Week honors. In addition, sophomore guard Lamont Butler was a Mountain West All-Defensive Team designee and Chad Baker was the league's sixth man of the year.

The years leading to 2022-23 set the stage for men's basketball history. Following its 15th and 16th Mountain West Crowns, San Diego State earned a No. 5-seed in the NCAA Tournament and began the most epic run in program history. In its 10th appearance in the last 13 NCAA Tournaments, the Aztecs ended five multi-game win streaks in snapping the College of Charleston's 10-game win streak in the NCAA First Round and Furman's seven-game win streak in the second round. It then ended No. 1/2 Alabama's five-game win streak in the Sweet 16, Creighton's three-game win streak in the Elite 8 and Florida Atlantic's 11-game win streak in the Final Four.

SAN DIEGO - Jaedon LeDee scored six of his career-high 27 points in the first three minutes of the second half and No. 17 San Diego State broke open a close game to beat Cal State Fullerton 83-57 in their season opener Monday night.

LeDee also pulled down 10 rebounds for SDSU, runner-up for last season's national title. Before the game, the school unveiled banners for being an NCAA finalist and for winning the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns. The Aztecs reached their first Final Four, beat Florida Atlantic 72-71 on Lamont Butler's buzzer-beater and then lost to UConn 76-59 in the championship game.

"It's great. I'm going to look at it every day and then go to work," coach Brian Dutcher said. "Step onto Steve Fisher Court and look at a Final Four banner. A lot of good stuff's happened here. And the crowd tonight, come on. The energy in the building was incredible. We feed off that. It's a fun place to play and a fun place to come watch a game. It was exciting."

Micah Parrish had five 3-pointers and scored 17 for SDSU, while newcomer Reese Waters added 15.

The Aztecs went on a 15-4 run after the Titans closed to 39-38 on Grayson Carper's 3 early in the second half. The spurt started when LeDee scored six straight points, including a coast-to-coast dunk and a 3-point play. Elijah Saunders had a steal and dunk, Parrish hit a 3 and Butler sank a jumper to make it 54-42.

The Aztecs say it's time to move on from last year's thrilling run through March Madness.

Dominic Brewton scored 13 for the Titans. Max Jones had 11 points and Donovan Oday added 10.

San Diego State lost five key players from last season's team, including leading scorer Matt Bradley and leading rebounder Nathan Mensah. Aztecs guard Darrion Trammell, the leading returning scorer, has been sidelined with a shoulder injury since early October.

SDSU is at former league rival BYU on Friday night, where the Aztecs are 4-30 overall but have split the last two games there.

Micah Parrish cut the deficit to two on back-to-back baskets, but the Aztecs were unable to draw closer. Hall made a pair of free throws and followed with a pair of baskets to help boost BYU's lead to 66-57 with 2:34 remaining.

Hall, who is working his way back from a knee injury, played for 25 minutes.

Jaedon LeDee led San Diego State with 21 points and seven rebounds and Reese Waters chipped in 15 points.

Keeping BYU off the glass proved to be a chore for the Aztecs. The Cougars outrebounded San Diego State 42-32.

The Cougars missed 13 of their first 17 shots as they struggled to create a consistent rhythm against a stifling Aztec defense.

Once Robinson got going, however, San Diego State struggled to cool off the Cougars.

BYU took its first lead midway through the half, going up 17-15 on Robinson's 3-pointer that capped a 7-0 run. Robinson then made back-to-back baskets to fuel a 10-0 run that put the Cougars up 29-20.

The Aztecs went 5 1/2 minutes without making a basket late in the first half. They missed seven straight shots and committed four turnovers in that stretch.

BYU outscored San Diego State 42-9 in bench points. Hall, Robinson, and Saunders — three of the Cougars' top four scorers — did not start. Hall and Robinson combined for six of BYU's 10 3-pointers.

The Aztecs were thin on bench depth because of injuries to rotation players Miles Byrd and Demarshay Johnson, Jr.

San Diego State: Prolonged scoring droughts and a lack of depth put the Aztecs in a tough position. San Diego State has some work to do to reach a similar level it enjoyed a season ago when it reached the national championship game.

SAN DIEGO - Senior forward Jaedon LeDee matched his career-high with 27 points to lead the San Diego State Aztecs in an 88-76 win over Long Beach State on Tuesday evening at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

LeDee also contributed 11 rebounds and three steals for the Aztecs who improve to 2-1 on the year. Reese Waters scored 15 points for the third time in as many games while shooting 5-of-10, including 3-of-6 from beyond the arc. Lamont Butler had 14 points and shot 5-for-10 (2-of-6 from 3-point range) and 2-of-3 from the free throw line. Micah Parrish added 13 points also on 5-of-10 from the floor and Elijah Saunders set a career-best with 11 points and pulled down six rebounds. Each of the aforementioned five players started the game and the contest marked the first time all five SDSU starters reached double digits in the scoring column since Feb. 16, 2020, when the Aztecs won 72-55 at Boise State.

SDSU won its 36th straight game against a current Big West school. In addition, SDSU defeated Long Beach State for the 16th time in the last 17 meetings between these programs, regardless of location, and for the eighth straight time.

San Diego State got the first bucket of the contest, a LeDee layup just 16 second in, and never trailed in the game for the second time in three games this season. SDSU used a 10-0 run over 2:08 of the first half to turn a 15-12 lead into a 25-12 advantage with 10:36 to play before intermission and took a 47-39 lead into the break.

The Beach (1-2) which were led in scoring by Marcus Tsohonis, who finished with 17 points, cut the lead to three twice early in the second half. But the Aztecs put together a 12-2 run midway through the half to go up 78-63 and never looked back in the 12 point victory.

San Diego State returns to action on Friday, when it plays Saint Mary's College in its opening game at the Continental Tire Main Event in Las Vegas.

Elijah Saunders made 3 of 3 from 3-point range and scored 16 points for San Diego State (4-1). Micah Parrish added 15 points and Reese Waters 13.

Keion Brooks Jr. scored eight of his 22 points in overtime, Sahvir Wheeler finished with 19 points and six assists, and Moses Wood added 18 points for Washington (3-2). Paul Mulcahy had 11 points and tied his career-high with 13 of the Huskies' 27 assists - their most since recording 30 against California on February 10, 2011.

LeDee made two free throws with 1:17 to play and hit layup with 36 seconds left gave the Aztecs the lead for good at 98-97. Waters made two free throws to cap the scoring with 9 seconds left and Moses Wood missed a potential tying 3-point shot as time expired.

Wheeler made a layup with 50 seconds left in regulation, Mulcahy also made a layup and Wheeler followed with a third that trimmed Washington's deficit to 85-84 with 7 seconds left. After a tie-up on the inbound, Washington gained possession, threw the ball in to Mulcahy, who drove into the lane and drew a foul on a fadeaway with 1.0 seconds left. The grad transfer from Rutgers missed the first of two free throws but made the second to force overtime.

San Diego State plays California at the SoCal Showcase on Saturday and Washington is off until the Huskies play host to UC San Diego on Nov. 28.

SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO, Calif. - Jaedon Ledee knocked down a pair of jumpers and Reese Waters was 4-for-4 from the line in overtime and San Diego State hit 9-of-10 free-throw attempts in overtime as the Aztecs beat California 76-67 in the SoCal Showcase Saturday in San Juan Capistrano.

San Diego State is now 8-6 all-time against the Golden Bears and 3-0 in games played on a neutral court this season. The Aztecs (5-1) entered the game after winning the 2023 Continental Main Event tournament while Cal (2-5) lost both of its games at the SoCal Classic tournament.

Ledee hit two free throws with 6:15 left to take a 63-54 lead but did not score again in regulation. Rodney Brown Jr. hit back-to-back 3-pointers and Fardaws Aimaq hit 3 of 4 from the line to tie the game with 1:42 left and force overtime.

Waters hit 6 of 11 from the field, including 2 of 3 from long range, and was 10-for-10 from the line to lead the Aztecs with 24 points. Ledee added 19 points, going 7 of 10 from the line. The Aztecs collectively were 31 of 37 from the line (83.8%).

Jaylon Tyson hit 9 of 21 from the field, including 2 of 10 from distance, to lead the Golden Bears with 23 points before fouling out of the game. Aimaq had a double-double, scoring 14 points and grabbing 18 rebounds.

San Diego State plays host to Point Loma Nazarene Monday. Cal will look to snap a four-game losing streak when it plays host to Santa Clara December 2.

SAN DIEGO - Three Aztecs scored in double figures led by senior forward Jaedon LeDee's 15 points, 13 rebound double double, his fourth in seven games this season, as San Diego State beat Point Loma Nazarene 71-51 on Monday evening at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

"That was a good game for us" Aztec head men's basketball coach Brian Dutcher said. "Point Loma is a ranked Division II program. They played us without their best player tonight. They stretch the floor, they shoot threes, and they provide a whole different challenge than we have faced this year. We've played teams where we're not even guarding certain players because they can't shoot, and we're trying to over-help, and this is a game where you really can't help off anybody because they shoot the ball so well. They do a good job spreading the floor, they run a good offense, and they have a good team. We played a pretty good first half, even though we got down, we had 15 baskets, and 13 of them assisted. We shot 51% from the field, made a lot of threes, and we played good offensive basketball."

Junior wing Reese Waters shot 4-of-9 from the floor, including 3-of-6 from 3-point range, and was 3-of-3 from the free throw line for 14 points and added four rebounds, two assists and a steal. Lamont Butler, a senior guard, had 10 points shooting 4-of-9 from the field with three rebounds, three assists and a steal. Senior guard Darrion Trammell finished with game-highs of five assists and three steals while totaling eight points.

Point Loma Nazarene hit two early 3-pointers to forge a 6-2 lead, but the Aztecs (6-1) responded with a 14-0 run over the next 3:38 of game time to turn that four-point deficit into a 16-6 advantage and never looked back. SDSU led by 15 at the half on its way to a 20-point victory.

San Diego State shot 45.6 percent for the game (26-of-57) while limiting the Sea Lions (4-3) to just 29.3 percent (17-of-58). It is SDSU's 15th straight win when holding its opponent to under 35 percent and the team improved to 50-2 in Brian Dutcher era when holding its opponent to less than 35 percent.

Luke Smith led the way for the Sea Lions with 19 points. Zack Paulsen added 13 points, six rebounds and two steals.

LA JOLLA, Calif. - Four Aztecs reached double figures highlighted by double-doubles from Micah Parrish and Jaedon LeDee as San Diego State beat UC San Diego at the buzzer 63-62 on Friday night in LionTree Arena in La Jolla, California.

LeDee had a layup with 38 seconds left to play to pull the Aztecs (7-1) within 62-61. Bryce Pope missed a 3-pointer with 10 seconds to go and LeDee grabbed the rebound. Lamont Butler misfired from beyond the arc at the other end with two seconds remaining, but LeDee was there to grab the miss and score the winning basket.

Parrish topped San Diego State with 15 points and 10 rebounds. LeDee and Elijah Saunders scored 13 apiece with LeDee adding 10 boards. Butler scored 10 with five assists.

Francis Nwaakorrie, Hayden Gray and Pope all finished with 15 points for the Tritons (4-4). Gray added five assists.

Prior to LeDee's game winner, San Diego State only led for 28 seconds at the beginning of the second half. With 7:36 remaining in the game, the Aztecs trailed 57-43 following a 10-0 Triton run. The Aztecs did not lose faith, going on a 13-0 run to bring the score to 57-56 with just over two minutes to go.

"We've got to weather the storm." Parrish said on the team's attitude when they trailed by 14. "We knew they were going to come in here and play hard. They had a great environment tonight. They have a great team. We knew we had to come in and step it up. We knew that we had to get stops and rely on defense getting stops and getting stops. We got three stops in a row at the end of the game. We knew we were going to go down and score. We just needed to get stops."

The Scarlet and Black outshot UC San Diego 41.3 percent (26-of-63) to 39.7 percent (23-of-58) from the field and 38.1 percent (8-of-21) to 34.5 percent (10-of-29) from beyond the arc. The biggest Aztec advantage came in rebounds, where SDSU led by a 43-28 margin overall and 14-5 on the offensive glass.

San Diego State faces a tough road test in its next matchup, when it travels to Phoenix to face the Grand Canyon Antelopes at 7 p.m. MT on Tuesday night. The game will be broadcast by ESPNU on television and San Diego Sports 760 on radio.
