No. 18/22 San Diego State Closes Out O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic Action with Road Test at Miami

No. 18/22 San Diego State finishes its season-opening five-game road trip with a date at Miami Monday night inside Millett Hall. The final match-up of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic's Oxford Subregional is set for 7 p.m. ET on the Oxford, Ohio, campus.

The fifth of five consecutive season-opening games away from Viejas Arena can be heard in Southern California on AM 600 KOGO with Ted Leitner handling the play-by-play duties. There is no television coverage for the event.

SDSU enters the game nationally ranked in both the Associated Press Top 25 and USA Today/ESPN Top 25 Coaches poll for the first time in school history. The Aztecs, who entered the campaign having never been ranked in the history of the program, have been in all three AP polls this season and moved up seven spots to No. 18, which represents the biggest jump of the week. San Diego State's No. 22 ranking in the coaches poll marks the first time the Scarlet and Black has ever cracked the poll. In the first two coaches polls of the 2010-11 season, SDSU was the first team out at No. 26.

The Aztecs remained perfect on the season by defeating IUPUI, 61-46, Sunday night. SDSU used a stifling defense and a 15-0 run in the second half to pull away from the Jaguars. Sophomore forward Kawhi Leonard led all players with 20 points and 10 rebounds and frontcourt teammate Billy White added 14 points and six boards. Sophomore Chase Tapley spearheaded the defensive charge with a career-high tying four steals, while adding nine points, and Leonard added three steals of his own.

On Monday, Leonard was named Mountain West Conference player of the week after averaging a double-double and leading the Aztecs to a road win at then-No. 11 Gonzaga and neutral-site victories over Green Bay and IUPUI. The sophomore led the team with averages of 20.3 points, 10.7 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.0 steals, while shooting 50.0 percent from the field and 50.0 percent from three-point distance. Leonard has won both of the league's weekly awards this season and is a five-time honoree.

With a win on Monday, the Aztecs can wrap up their season-opening five-game trip with a unblemished 5-0 mark. A victory would improve SDSU's record to 5-0 for the first time since 2007-08 and a decision would give the school five wins in its first five road/neutral games for the first time since 1984-85. San Diego State is also looking to win its first three true road games of a season since that same 1984-85 team, which advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

The RedHawks, the Oxford Subregional hosts, have split the first two games on their home floor, beating IUPUI and losing to Green Bay on Sunday night. Prior to the subregional, Miami went to Duke and lost, 79-45, in the opening game of the CBE Classic.

What You Need to Know

- San Diego State is looking to start the season with a 5-0 record for the first time since the 2007-08 campaign.
- SDSU is looking to win its first five road/neutral games since 1984-85. That year, the Aztecs won their first six road/neutral contests en route to the NCAA Tournament and a 23-8 record.
- San Diego State has won 14 consecutive games against non-ranked opponents and has won 16 consecutive home games against teams from outside the AP Top 25.
- As a freshman, Kawhi Leonard nearly averaged a double-double with numbers of 12.7 points and 9.9 rebounds. But through four games this season, he not only is averaging 20.5 points and 11.0 rebounds, the sophomore is averaging 13.6 points and 10.0 rebounds for his career, which is just 38 games old.
- With Tuesday's win at No. 11 Gonzaga, San Diego State has gone 3-2 in its last five vs. teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 and have gone 5-4 over the last nine meetings with AP ranked squads. Prior to the victory over the Zags, the Aztecs dropped a three-point decision to No. 15 Tennessee in the 2010 NCAA Tournament, defeated No. 8 New Mexico in Las Vegas at the MWC tournament, fell at No. 13 BYU and downed No. 23 UNLV at Viejas Arena.
- San Diego State is in the midst of a season-opening five-game stretch which takes them to Long Beach, Calif., to Spokane, Wash., to Oxford, Ohio. This is the first time the Aztecs have started with five straight away from home since the 1985-86 season. That year, SDSU started with two games at the Sun-Met Classic in Fresno (vs. Louisiana Tech and Eastern Washington) before traveling for true road games at Arkansas, Oral Roberts and Arizona. San Diego

State went 0-5 on the trip.

- SDSU started the season with two true road games. This year marked the first time in program history the Aztecs have taken on this type of challenge since the 1975-76 campaign. San Diego State went on to advance to the NCAA Tournament later that year.
- Dating back to last season, the Aztecs will play their 10th straight game away from campus on Monday, while recording an 8-1 record in the previous nine. The only blemish was a three-point loss to No. 15/14 Tennessee in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. After starting this season with five consecutive contests away from Viejas Arena, SDSU will have played 10 in a row away from America's Finest City. San Diego State's last regular-season home game was vs. Colorado State on March 3, 2010. The Aztecs' first home game this season is Nov. 26.
- Fisher returns five starters for just the third time in his coaching career. While at Michigan, the 1992-93 squad returned everyone from the season before, reached the NCAA championship game and finished with a 31-5 record. In 2008-09, Fisher's Aztecs had all five starters back and that group went on to win a school-record 26 games and advanced to the NIT semifinals.
- The 2010-11 campaign represents the 10th time Fisher has brought back at least four starters from the previous year. The other nine times have resulted in postseason appearances (6 NCAA, 3 NIT) and at least 21 victories each time. This is the fifth time Fisher has had at least four starters return while on Montezuma Mesa.
- When at least four starters from the previous season return, Fisher's teams have gone a combined 220-83 (.726).
- San Diego State enters the 2010-11 campaign in the midst of its most successful run in school history. The Aztecs have won 20 or more games and advanced to the postsea-

Noting the IUPUI Win

Below are some notable tidbits on the Aztecs' victory vs. IUPUI.

► San Diego State improved to 4-0 for the first time in three seasons. Prior to this season, the Aztecs last 4-0 start occurred in 2007-08.

► The Aztecs have now won their first four road/neutral games of the season since 2008-09.

► SDSU has won its last 14 games against non-ranked opponents.

► San Diego State has won nine of its last 10 games and 13 of its last 15 dating back to last season.

► The Aztecs caught fire from behind the three-point arc in the second half, going 7-for-10, including a 4-for-4 performance by Kawhi Leonard in the final 20 minutes.

► San Diego State outrebounded its fourth opponent in as many games this season (27-18).

► For the fourth time this year, SDSU shot 50.0 percent or above. The Aztecs finished right at 50.0 percent (25-50).

► The Aztecs were a perfect 4-for-4 from the free-throw line after finishing at 58.3 percent vs. Green Bay.

► **Kawhi Leonard (Game-high 20 points, game-high 10 rebounds, 3 assists, game-high 3 steals)** - Recorded his third 20-point scoring game of the year and his sixth of his career... Posted his 28th career double-figure scoring performance; he has led the team in scoring three this season and 14 times in his career... Logged his 23rd career double-digit rebounding game and the effort marks the 23rd time he has led the Aztecs in rebounding... His double-double is his 21st of his young career and his seventh in a row dating back to last season... Finished with a season-high tying three assists... His three steals were a season high as well... Knocked down four three-pointers, all in the second half, to set a career high.

► **Billy White (14 points, 6 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 block, 1 steal)** - Recorded his 47th career double-digit scoring game and his second this season... The six rebounds is his second-highest figure of the season... Blocked one shot to

match his season high... At one point in the second half, he scored eight straight points for the Aztecs.

► **Chase Tapley (9 points, 2 rebounds, 1 assist, career-high 4 steals)** - Finished third on the team in scoring... Recorded a career-high tying four steals, which represented half of SDSU's game total... The four steals also led all players.

► **Other Player Notes: D.J. Gay** led the team with a season-high four assists... **LaBradford Franklin** scored his first career points on an and-one opportunity; he finished with a career-best three points and one assist in eight minutes...

Jamaal Franklin saw his first action as an Aztec and played four minutes.

Noting the Green Bay Win

Below are some notable tidbits on the Aztecs' victory vs. Green Bay.

► The Aztecs rallied from 22 points down with 11:15 left in the first half to record the nine-point win. The winning rally was SDSU's largest deficit overcome in a win in the Steve Fisher era. Prior to tonight, the largest deficit overcome for a victory was an 18-point rally vs. Monmouth on Nov. 22, 2004, when the Aztecs trailed the New Jersey school, 26-8, with 10:58 left in the first half, before emerging with a 69-65 decision.

► San Diego State improved to 3-0 for the first time in three seasons. Prior to this season, the Aztecs last 3-0 start occurred in 2007-08.

► The Aztecs have now won their first three road/neutral games to open a season since 2007-08.

► SDSU has won its last 13 games against non-ranked opponents.

► San Diego State has won eight of its last nine games and 12 of its last 14 dating back to last season.

► San Diego State shot a season-best 60.4 percent from the field (29-48), including 70.8 percent in the second half (17-24). The Aztecs have shot over 50 percent from the field in all three games this season.

► SDSU outrebounded the Phoenix, 40-30, marking the third straight game this season the Aztecs have finished with an advantage on the boards.

► The Aztecs dominated the paint as they outscored Green Bay, 54-24, in the painted area.

► **Kawhi Leonard (Game-high 23 points, game-high 10 rebounds, 2 assists)** - Posted his 27th career double-figure scoring performance; he has led the team in scoring twice this season and 13 times in his career... Logged his 22nd career double-digit rebounding game and the effort marks the 22nd time he has led the Aztecs in rebounding... His double-double is his 20th of his young career and his sixth in a row dating back to last season.

► **Chase Tapley (14 points, team-high 3 assists)** - Scored in double figures for the second time in three games this season... Has reached double-digits in scoring 15 times in his career... His 14 points is a season-best... Led the team in assists for the first time this season and for the sixth time in his career... Connected on a season-best six field goals... Played a season-high 29 minutes.

► **Malcolm Thomas (12 points, 8 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 blocks)** - Scored in double-digits for the first time this season and for the 18th time in his Aztec career... The 12 points is a season high... Had three assists, marking the second time he has led the team in the category this season; he has led the team in assists 12 times in his SDSU career... Blocked two shots, which is a season-best.

► **Tim Shelton (8 points, 3 rebounds, 1 assist)** - Scored a season-high eight points, including six in the final four-plus minutes... His three rebounds were a season-best as were his 15 minutes of action.

Noting the Gonzaga Win

Below are some notable tidbits on the Aztecs' victory at No. 11 Gonzaga.

- ▶ The victory snapped a 33-game road losing streak to teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25.
- ▶ The win represented the highest-ranked team the Aztecs have ever defeated on the road.
- ▶ It was just the second road win over an AP Top 25 team in school history and the fourth road/neutral victory over a ranked opponent in school history.
- ▶ It was the fifth-highest ranked team the Aztecs have defeated in school history.
- ▶ San Diego State is 5-4 in its last nine games against teams ranked in the AP Top 25. The Aztecs were 4-41 in their previous 45 games against nationally-ranked teams prior to this stretch.
- ▶ Snapped a nine-game losing streak to non-conference AP Top 25 teams, dating back to a Dec. 8, 2001 victory over 21st-ranked Fresno State.
- ▶ It was the first time SDSU has ever defeated a top-25 team in the month of November.
- ▶ It was San Diego State's 17th victory over an AP Top-25 team, with seven of those victories coming during the Steve Fisher era.
- ▶ With the victory, San Diego State snapped Gonzaga's 12-game homecourt winning streak dating back to last season.
- ▶ San Diego State handed Gonzaga its fifth-ever loss in the McCarthy Athletic Center, dropping the Zags to 77-5 all-time in the facility. The Aztecs became the first visiting team to win at the facility since Wake Forest came away with a victory on Dec. 5, 2009.

Leonard on Naismith Watch List

Kawhi Leonard added another honor to his long list of accolades as he was named to the Naismith preseason watch list on Nov. 16. The sophomore is one of 50 players representing 44 schools on the list. This comes six weeks after Leonard was named to the Wooden preseason top-50 list.

Leonard Named MWC Player of the Week

Kawhi Leonard was named MWC Player of the Week, the league announced Nov. 15. The award, which is the fourth of his career, comes after he helped the Aztecs defeat Long Beach State, 81-65, on the road.

Leonard scored a game-high 21 points and led all players with 12 rebounds to record his 18th career double-double. Leonard also completed his 29th consecutive starting assignment with three assists, one blocked shot and two steals.

After sharing the scoring lead with D.J. Gay in the first half with 13 points, Leonard went to work on the boards and nearly outrebounded the 49ers by himself in the second half. The sophomore collected 12 rebounds to Long Beach State's 16 and had 11 on the defensive end, which was equal to LBSU's second-half total.

For the game, Leonard shot 9-of-17 from the floor and went a perfect 3-for-3 from the charity stripe en route to his fourth career 20-point output and 19th career double-figure scoring game. His rebounding performance marked his 20th career double-digit effort and the 20th time he has led the Aztecs in the category

Iron Man

D.J. Gay is arguably one of the nation's iron men as he has played in every game since he has stepped foot on

campus. The guard from Sun Valley, Calif., has seen action in all 107 games, while earning the starting nod 87 times. In each of his three seasons on campus, Gay has seen his minutes per game increase from 23.8 as a freshman to 26.7 as a sophomore to a team-best 34.6 minutes last year as a junior. This season, he is averaging 35.2 minutes. The senior has also started 38 straight games.

White Closing in on 1,000

Billy White is closing in on the 1,000 career point mark. The four-year starter has 981 career points, which puts him 17th on the school's all-time Division I career scoring list (since 1970-71). Once he hits 1,000 points, he will become the 25th player in school history and the 17th player in Aztec Division I history to reach the milestone.

Double-Double Machine

Just a sophomore, Kawhi Leonard is currently in fourth-place for most double-doubles in school history (since 1975-76 season) with 21 career doubles-doubles. Leonard's 17 double-doubles last year were a freshman school record, which was previously owned by Michael Cage when he had 10 in 1981, and were the fourth-most in a single season in program history. Another 10 double-doubles this season would put him second all time, ahead of Marcus Slaughter's 30, but behind Cage's 61 career double-doubles.

Fisher Picks Up Win No. 200

Steve Fisher inherited a team in 1999-2000 that won just four games the season before his arrival. Fast forward to now and seven postseason berths and six 20-win efforts later, he is one of two men's basketball coaches at San Diego State to have at least 200 victories after the Aztecs beat No. 11 Gonzaga. The 12th-year head coach owns a 202-149 record and that is with a 5-23 (0-14 MWC) record in 1999-2000 under his belt. He is currently the second all-time winningest coach in SDSU history, behind only George Ziegenfuss' 316 victories from 1948-69.

Rahon Makes Splash in Debut

James Rahon made a splash in his first official game as an Aztec in the season opener at Long Beach State. The San Diego native came off the bench and finished with 14 points and four rebounds. A transfer from Santa Clara, Rahon connected on four three-pointers, including three straight on three consecutive possessions in the second half that helped SDSU expand its one-point lead to 10 with under seven minutes left in regulation.

Aztecs Ranked for First Time in School History

San Diego State started the 2010-11 campaign ranked 25th in the preseason Associated Press Top-25 poll. The Aztecs' preseason ranking marked the first time the program has been ranked in any of the two major polls (AP, Coaches) in school history.

Entering its 90th season and its 41st at the Division I level, SDSU received 158 votes to earn its No. 25 ranking.

According to collegepollarchive.com, San Diego State became the seventh school since 1974 to make its AP poll debut in the preseason rankings. The Aztecs join UNLV (1974), Charlotte (1977), UAB (1982), Cleveland State (1987), Rhode Island (1998) and Gonzaga (2000) as the only schools to have accomplished the feat.

This marks the first time since the 2000-01 season that a

team has made its debut in the AP poll. That season, Gonzaga was coming off a Sweet 16 appearance in the NCAA Tournament and the Bulldogs went on to post a 26-7 record and advanced to the 2001 NCAA Sweet 16.

In the first regular season poll, which came out Nov. 15, the Aztecs maintained their position in the 25 hole.

Aztecs First in Preseason MWC Media Poll

San Diego State was picked to win the Mountain West Conference in the league's preseason media poll. The Aztecs earned 261 points, including 21 of a possible 30 first-place votes. SDSU finished ahead of second-place BYU, which had 220 points and five first-place tallies.

The 261 points and 21 first-place votes are the most the Aztecs have earned in school history and the first-place prediction marks the third time the MWC media has made SDSU the preseason favorite. In 2005-06, the Aztecs were the favorite and wound up winning the regular-season and tournament championship. The other time, 2006-07, San Diego State finished in third place.

Leonard, Thomas Preseason All-MWC Picks

Forwards Kawhi Leonard and Malcolm Thomas were voted in the preseason all-MWC team by the conference media. The starting frontcourt enters 2010-11 as the nation's top returning rebounding duo after averaging 17.5 boards last season.

Leonard, who is on the preseason Wooden Award Top 50 List, is coming off a fantastic freshman campaign in which he was named MWC freshman of the year, Mountain West tournament most valuable player and became the first freshman in the history of the league to garner all-MWC first-team accolades. Leonard, who was the only freshman in Division I last year to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament while leading his team in scoring and rebounding, averaged 12.7 points and 9.9 rebounds. The Riverside, Calif., native also set the freshman school record for double-doubles with 17, a figure that ranked 13th among all Division I student-athletes. Leonard is the only non-senior on the five-man preseason team.

Thomas, meanwhile, enters his senior season after averaging 10.9 points and 7.6 rebounds, while shooting 54.3 percent from the floor as a junior in 2009-10. Hailing from San Diego, the 6-9 Thomas earned all-MWC second-team honors a year ago and finished the season leading the team in blocked shots, while handing out the second-most assists on the team.



Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 12 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become of the best programs on the West Coast and has the Aztecs routinely mentioned among the elite teams in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that the school exercised its contract option on Fisher prior to the 2010-11 season, which keeps the coach on Montezuma Mesa until 2012-13.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, the postseason NIT in 2003, the 2006 NCAA Tournament, the 2007-09 NIT, including the NIT semifinals in 2009, and the 2010 NCAA Tournament. In addition, the Aztecs have one of their deepest teams ever, which will keep SDSU competitive this season and seasons ahead.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three

trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last four seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to four additional 20-win seasons and postseason appearances, including a school-record 26 wins and an NIT semifinal berth in 2009 and a MWC tourney crown and a spot in the NAAs in 2010, and he doesn't look like he is stopping anytime soon.

LONG BEACH, Calif. - No. 25 San Diego State went on the road and defeated Long Beach State, 81-65, to open the 2010-11 season before a Walter Pyramid-record 5,143 fans.

The Aztecs used three consecutive three-pointers from sophomore newcomer James Rahon with just over nine minutes to play in the second half to pull away from the 49ers.

San Diego State was nursing a 56-55 lead in a back-and-forth affair when Rahon caught fire. The guard knocked his first three-pointer with 9:01 left in regulation and his teammates found him on the next two trips and were rewarded with two more threes, the last of which gave the Aztecs a 65-55 cushion with 6:49 remaining.

Long Beach State tried to rally and used an 8-1 run after Rahon's third three-point field goal to cut the lead to four, but the nationally ranked Aztecs proved to be too much down the stretch and emerged with the decision.

In the first half, the 49ers raced to a 16-9 lead in the first seven minutes of the game. The Aztecs, however, hung around and eventually took an eight-point lead with 3:51 left before the half. Then in the final two minutes, LBSU closed the half on a 7-0 run and forced the Aztecs into three missed three-point field goals and a turnover as the frame ended in a 42-42 tie.

Kawhi Leonard led all players with 21 points and 12 rebounds, all of which came in the second half. In comparison, the 49ers only had 16 rebounds themselves in the second period. D.J. Gay added 20 points, while Rahon finished with 14 points off the bench. Malcolm Thomas ended with 10 boards and a career-high matching six assists.

The Aztecs became just the fifth team to defeat the Bulldogs in 82 games at "The Kennel." The victory snapped a 33-game road losing streak to teams ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 and marked the highest ranked team the Aztecs have defeated on the road.

San Diego State scored the first basket of the night and was able to keep the Zags at arm's length for much of the first half. The Aztec lead swelled to 10 with 6:20 remaining in the half, but the Bulldogs crept to within five, 42-37, at the halftime buzzer.

A 7-0 Gonzaga run to start the second half gave the Bulldogs a brief two-point lead, but D.J. Gay answered 11 seconds later with a three to help SDSU reclaim the lead.

Minutes later, White caught fire and scored 11 straight points in a 2 minute, 51 second span to keep GU in a seven-point hole with 9:40 left in regulation.

Gonzaga, led by Steven Gray's career-high 35 points, rallied to within one point at 77-76 with 23 seconds on the clock. Following two Kawhi Leonard free throws, Gray turned the ball over and the Zags fouled Chase Tapley, who missed the front end of a bonus situation. After securing the rebound, Gray had a chance to tie the game with a halfcourt shot, but the attempt was well short and the Aztecs emerged with the decision.

OXFORD, Ohio - San Diego State, ranked 25th in the Associated Press Top-25 poll, overcame a sluggish start and rallied to defeat Green Bay, 79-70, at the Oxford Subregional of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic.

The Aztecs found themselves down 22 points (28-6) with 11:15 to go in the first half before emerging with the nine-point win. The rally was the largest winning comeback of the Steve Fisher era, which is in its 12th season.

Green Bay scored the first four points of the game and used a swarming defense down low to create problems for SDSU. Couple that with the fact the Phoenix hit four of seven three-pointers and went 10-of 12 from the line in the first half resulted in the Aztecs trailing by 22 early.

With a daunting task ahead of it, San Diego State continually pounded the ball inside and fought their way back into the game. At halftime, the Aztecs trailed, 38-33.

SDSU opened the second half on an 8-0 run, all of which were scored in the paint, and took a 41-38 lead and an advantage it would not relinquish.

Down the stretch, the Phoenix cut the SDSU lead to three, but the Aztecs went on a 12-5 run to enjoy its first 10-point lead of the game with 1:52 left in regulation. Green Bay got to within 76-70 with 31 seconds left, but three Kawhi Leonard free throws iced the outcome for SDSU.

Leonard led all players with 23 points and 10 rebounds and was joined in the frontcourt by Malcolm Thomas, who finished with 12 points, eight boards and three assists. Chase Tapley, meanwhile, chipped in 14 points and three assists.

Green Bay was led by Rahmon Fletcher's 18 points.

OXFORD, Ohio - No. 25 San Diego State overcame a slow start for a second straight game, used a suffocating defense in the second half and ultimately erased a seven-point deficit to defeat IUPUI, 61-46, in the Oxford Subregional of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic.

The Aztecs fell behind, 11-4, in the first five minutes of the game and chipped away at the Jaguar lead before finally taking a 20-19 lead with 3:50 left in the opening half. IUPUI, however, scored the last three points of the half and carried a 23-20 lead into the locker room.

The first seven minutes of the second half was a back-and-forth affair. A long-range jumper by James Rahon and a three by Rahon on consecutive possessions kickstarted the Aztecs, which led to a 15-0 run and a 48-36 lead with 9:33 remaining.

IUPUI cut the SDSU lead to eight points with 7:31 left on the clock, but eight straight points by Billy White and two three-pointers from Kawhi Leonard, who made all four three-point attempts in the second half, helped the Aztecs run away with the 15-point win.

Leonard finished with a game-high 20 points and 10 rebounds to post his fourth double-double in as many games this season. The sophomore, who entered the game 0-for-6 from three-point distance for the season, went 4-for-5 from behind the arc. The four threes were a career best. White, meanwhile, recorded 14 points and six rebounds. Chase Tapley added nine points and a career-high tying four steals.

Alex Young and Mitchell Patton led IUPUI with 12 points apiece.
