► San Diego State enters the 2012-13 campaign having won 25 or more games in four straight seasons after last season's 26-8 effort. The two-time defending Mountain West regular-season champions also appeared in their third consecutive NCAA Tournament in 2012.

► Head coach Steve Fisher returns four starters and seven letterwinners, and welcomes six newcomers. Of the six newcomers, three are Division I transfers who sat out 2011-12 and practiced with the team. The other three are highly regarded prep athletes who garnered national recognition as seniors.

► The 2012-13 campaign represents the 11th time Fisher has brought back at least four starters from the previous year. The other 10 times have resulted in postseason appearances (7 NCAA, 3 NIT) and at least 21 victories. This is the sixth time Fisher has had at least four starters return while at SDSU and first time since 2010-11. That squad reached the Sweet 16 and finished with a 34-3 record.

► San Diego State has won 20 or more games and advanced to the postseason seven straight years for the first time in school history (The previous record was four from 1939-42). SDSU has also won at least 25 games in each of the last four seasons (26 in 2008-09, 25 in 2009-10, 34 in 2010-11, 26 in 2011-12).

► The 2012-13 Aztecs enter the upcoming season having played in 479 career Division I games, which includes 243 starts. In comparison, SDSU's 2010-11 record-setting 34-3 Sweet 16 squad entered that season having played in 523 career games.

► San Diego State's award winners from last year who will return for the 2012-13 season include **Jamaal Franklin** (AP Honorable Mention All-American, MW Player of the Year, all-MW first team, USBWA and NABC all-district), **Chase Tapley** (all-MW second team, NABC all-district), and **Xavier Thames** (MW honorable mention).

# Team Notes

## San Diego State

- ▶ San Diego State returns seven letterwinners off a squad which...
  - Finished 26-8, shared the Mountain West regular-season title for the second straight year and advanced to the school's third consecutive NCAA Tournament.
  - Ended the season ranked No. 22 in the Associated Press Top-25 Poll.
  - Matched the school record for the second-most wins in a single season (26).
  - Won at least 25 games for the fourth consecutive season.
  - Won 20+ games for a school-record seventh straight season, reaching the 20-win plateau for the eighth time during Steve Fisher's tenure and the 10th time in SDSU's Division I history.
  - Reached the postseason for a seventh straight season (4 NCAA, 3 NIT).
  - Set school records for most victories in a two-year period (60) and four-year period (111), and matched the three-year record of 85.
  - Advanced to a Mountain West-best fourth straight tournament championship game.
  - Spent the final 11 weeks of the regular season ranked in both national top-25 polls.
  
- ▶ SDSU's seven straight 20-win seasons is tied for the fourth-longest streak nationally (Syracuse - 15, North Carolina - 8, Ohio State - 8, SDSU - 7, Brigham Young - 7). The Aztecs' four consecutive 25-win campaigns, meanwhile, is tied for the sixth-longest streak (Kansas - 7, Brigham Young - 6, Duke - 5, Gonzaga - 5, Saint Mary's - 5, SDSU - 4, Syracuse - 4).
  
- ▶ The Aztecs are the class of California having won 23 straight games vs. schools from the state. Last year, San Diego State went 9-0 vs. California schools. SDSU also went 3-0 vs. the Pac-12 Conference in 2011-12 and have won nine straight vs. the current Pac-12 configuration.
  
- ▶ SDSU welcomes the No. 24 recruiting class, according to Rivals.com, to campus this season.
  
- ▶ San Diego State returns what could be considered the deepest and most experienced guard group in the nation with the return of **Jamaal Franklin**, **Chase Tapley**, **James Rahon** and **Xavier Thames**. The quartet returns as the top four scorers from a season ago and all four averaged 8.9 points or more (Franklin - 17.4, Tapley - 15.8, Thames - 10.1, Rahon - 8.9). The foursome was also the team's top three-point shooters in 2011-12.
  
- ▶ **Franklin** transformed into one of the top players in the country last season in just one summer. As a true freshman, Franklin 2.9 points and 1.9 rebounds in 22 games. A year later, Franklin finished his sophomore campaign by averaging a team-best 17.4 points and 7.9 rebounds and was named an AP Honorable Mention All-American. The 2012 Mountain West Player of the Year also improved his free-throw shooting by a large margin. Franklin was 9-for-17 (52.9 percent) as a freshman and improved his sophomore accuracy to 80.0 percent (160-for-200). The MW's leading scorer also led the team in double-doubles with 12 and registered nine 20-point games, including three 30-point efforts.
  
- ▶ **Franklin**, CBSSports.com's 2012 Most Improved Player, was ranked among the national leaders in scoring and rebounding improvement from 2010-11 to 2011-12. Franklin's 14.49-point improvement ranked second to Eastern Kentucky's Jaron Jones (+14.52) as did his 6.04-rebounding improvement. Illinois' Meyers Leonard finished the season with a 6.96-rebound improvement over his 2010-11 season average.
  
- ▶ **Tapley** enters his final season on Montezuma Mesa as the most experienced Aztec having started his previous three seasons and becoming the first player in SDSU history to play in three straight NCAA Tournaments a year ago. Tapley has played (101) and started (82) more games than any other Aztec on the roster and is coming off a career season in which he averaged a career-high 15.8 points, 4.3 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 43.3-percent three-point shooting. The second-team all-MW pick scored in double figures a team-high 30 times and put forth a team-high-tying nine 20-point performances.
  
- ▶ **Thames** made the seamless transition from sitting out 2010-11 to starting all-league point guard. The Sacramento, Calif., product was steady at the 1, averaging 10.1 points and a team-high 4.1 assists, while shooting 82.8 percent from free-throw line. **Rahon**, meanwhile, begins his third season at SDSU as a returning starter after averaging an Aztec career-high 8.9 points and a personal-best 2.7 rebounds.
  
- ▶ The team will welcome **JJ O'Brien**, **Dwayne Polee II**, and **James Johnson**, all of whom have Division I playing experience. **O'Brien**, a 6-7 Utah transfer forward, is a steady player who can play either forward positions. The Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., native sat out last season and is expected to step in and contribute immediately after starting as a true freshman at Utah. **Polee II**, meanwhile, is a 6-7 forward who arrived at San Diego State from St. John's. A native of Los Angeles, the Westchester High graduate also sat out the entire 2011-12 season and is expected to produce immediately. The athletic wing, like O'Brien, started as a true freshman at St. John's in 2010-11. **Johnson**, meanwhile, arrived on campus in January from Virginia and will be eligible once Fall 2012 grades are posted. A native of Wildomar, Calif., Johnson, at 6-9, 238 pounds, will give the Aztecs much-needed size in the middle.
  
- ▶ Joining SDSU's three Division I transfers in the newcomer group are three highly touted high school players in **Winston Shepard**, **Matt Shrigley** and **Skylar Spencer**. **Shepard** is a five-star recruit and the No. 21 player in the nation according to Rivals.com and arrives at SDSU from Findlay Prep in Henderson, Nev. The 6-8 forward led the Pilots to a 32-1 record, No. 2 national ranking and the ESPNHS National High School Invitational championship. **Shrigley** is a local product who guided La Costa Canyon to the CIF Division II state championship game, while **Spencer** was a member of a Price High team in Los Angeles that advanced to the Division IV state title game. Shrigley and Spencer are both three-star athletes with Spencer ranked No. 126 on the Rivals 150 and No. 22 at his position (center).
  
- ▶ The Aztecs also return **LaBradford Franklin**, **DeShawn Stephens** and **Narbeh Ebrahimian**. **Franklin** is a junior guard who saw his most extensive playing time last year (33 games) and produced his best season as an Aztec. **Stephens** is an athletic forward, who plays with a high motor. The 6-8 forward showed flashes of stardom in his first season at the Division I level and just his third real season of organized basketball. **Ebrahimian** is a solid, hard-working player who Steve Fisher trusted in key moments last season.

**Junior, Guard, 6-5, 195, Hawthorne, Calif. (Westwind Prep Int'l)**

- ▶ 17.4 ppg, 7.9 rpg, 1.5 apg, 43.3 FG Pct., 80.0 FT Pct.
- ▶ Returns as the team's leader in scoring, rebounding, free throws made, 20-point games, 30-point games, 10-rebound games and double-doubles.
- ▶ Is the team's second-leading returner in three-point field goals and steals.
- ▶ Enters season as the Mountain West's leading scorer and third-leading rebounder. Finished 2011-12 ranked in the top 10 in seven MW categories.
- ▶ Scored in double figures 29 times last season (nine 20-point games), including 31-point efforts vs. UC Davis and Colorado State and a 35-point showing at TCU.
- ▶ Led the team in scoring a team-best 16 times in 2011-12, rebounding a team-high 18 times and assists on five different occasions.
- ▶ Posted a team-best 12 double-doubles last season.

## Chase Tapley

**\*\*\* All-America, All-Conference, All-Region Candidate \*\*\***

**Senior, Guard, 6-3, 195, Sacramento, Calif. (Sacramento High)**

- ▶ 15.8 ppg, 4.3 rpg, 2.3 apg, 1.8 spg, 45.5 FG Pct., 43.3 3FG Pct.
- ▶ San Diego State's top returner in steals, minutes played and games played/started.
- ▶ Returns as the MW's second-leading scorer to teammate Jamaal Franklin. Returns as the MW's top shooting guard in terms of field-goal percentage and is the second-leading returner in the category. Returns as the MW's top returning player for three-point field-goal percentage and minutes played. Finished the season ranked in the top 10 in six MW stat categories.
- ▶ Reached double figures in scoring a team-best 30 times and had nine 20-point scoring outbursts, including a 28-point showing at nationally ranked Baylor where he connected on 8-of-10 three-pointers.
- ▶ Led the Aztecs in scoring 13 times and assists seven times.
- ▶ Committed one turnover or less 17 times in 2011-12 and owned the second-best assist-to-turnover ratio (1.40) on the team.
- ▶ Last season, he became the 27th player in SDSU history to reach 1,000 career points. He enters his final campaign with 1,079 points, which is good for 20th all-time.

## Xavier Thames

**\*\*\* All-Conference, All-Region Candidate \*\*\***

**Junior, Guard, 6-3, 195, Sacramento, Calif. (Washington State)**

- ▶ 10.1 ppg, 3.2 rpg, 4.1 apg, 1.64 A-TO Ratio, 82.8 FT Pct.
- ▶ San Diego State's top returner in assists and assist-to-turnover ratio. Is the second-leading returner in free-throw percentage and steals, and third-leading scorer.
- ▶ Is the third-leading returner in the MW in assists, assist-to-turnover ratio and free-throw percentage. Finished in the top 10 in the MW in assists, free-throw percentage, assist-to-turnover ratio and minutes last season. Also finished 19th in scoring in the MW.
- ▶ Scored in double figures 13 times last season, which also included three 20-point games. He scored 20 at UC Santa Barbara, 21 vs. No. 22 Creighton and a career-high 22 at New Mexico.
- ▶ Led the team in scoring three times, rebounding three times and assists a team-high 21 times. He also had two double-doubles.
- ▶ Only missed 21 free throws last season and ended the campaign by making 20 of his last 21 attempts from the line.
- ▶ Dished out five assists or more 11 times in 2011-12, including a career-high 11 at San Diego.

## Impact Transfers

### JJ O'Brien

**Sophomore, Forward, 6-7, 215, Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. (Utah)**

- ▶ **At Utah:** 6.4 ppg, 5.5 rpg, 1.2 apg, 27.7 mpg
- ▶ Eligible in 2012-13 after sitting out the 2011-12 campaign due to NCAA transfer rules.
- ▶ Played 22 games and started 21 times as a true freshman at Utah in 2010-11.
- ▶ Averaged the third-most minutes on the squad and his 21 starts were the fourth most on the team.
- ▶ Ranked second on the team in rebounds and fifth in scoring.
- ▶ In conference games only, he finished in a 10th-place-tie in rebounding and was tied for fifth in offensive rebounding.
- ▶ Reached double figures in scoring six times, all of which occurred in his final 15 games of his true freshman season, and grabbed at least 10 rebounds on five different occasions.
- ▶ Posted two double-doubles, including an 18 and 10 performance vs. New Mexico, and led the team in rebounding six times.

### Dwayne Polee II

**Sophomore, Forward, 6-7, 195, Los Angeles, Calif. (St. John's)**

- ▶ **At St. John's:** 4.4 ppg, 2.5 rpg, 45.6 FG pct., 14.9 mpg
- ▶ Eligible in 2012-13 after sitting out the 2011-12 campaign due to NCAA transfer rules.
- ▶ Played in all 33 games and made 27 starts as a true freshman for the 2011 NCAA Tournament participants, St. John's Red Storm (21-12; 12-6 Big East).
- ▶ Was one of five players to see action in all 33 games and his 27 starts were the fourth most on the team.
- ▶ His field-goal percentage ranked fifth on the team and his 15 blocked shots were the second most on the squad.
- ▶ His minutes (15.1) and field-goal percentage (.476) increased during the 2011 Big East Conference campaign.
- ▶ Led the senior-laden St. John's team in scoring and rebounding once.
- ▶ Scored in double figures five times, including a 16-point effort at Saint Mary's and a 12-point performance vs. Gonzaga in the NCAA Tournament.

### James Johnson

**Sophomore, Forward, 6-9, 238, Wildomar, Calif. (Virginia)**

- ▶ **At Virginia:** 1.5 ppg, 1.3 rpg, 6.2 mpg
- ▶ Eligible at midseason of the 2012-13 campaign after transferring from Virginia and enrolling at SDSU at the semester break during the 2011-12 season.
- ▶ Played in six games as a redshirt freshman at Virginia, a team that advanced to the 2012 NCAA Tournament and finished with a 22-10 record.
- ▶ Gives SDSU the type of body at 6-9, 238 pounds, it lacked during the 2011-12 campaign.
- ▶ Graduated from Elsinore High as a highly decorated player, who was ranked as the No. 22 power forward in the nation and the 108-best player nationally by Rivals.com.
- ▶ As a senior at Elsinore High, he averaged 18 points, 12 rebounds and three blocked shots en route to league MVP honors and first-team all-CIF Southern Section accolades.

Not only do the Aztecs return their top four scorers next season – including leading scorer and rebounder Jamaal Franklin, who was the Mountain West Player of the Year – but Steve Fisher's team adds plenty of depth, which was a significant weakness that held them back this year when injuries came into the equation. A trio of transfers – Dwayne Polee (St. John's), JJ O'Brien (Utah) and James Johnson (Virginia) – should help make San Diego State one of the nation's most versatile clubs, while it will likely remain one of America's toughest to crack mentally." – Ryan Greene, *Yahoo! Steve Fisher has guided the Aztec basketball program to unparalleled heights. In 13 seasons, he has taken a program that regularly missed out on the conference postseason tournament, to one which has become one of the best programs in the country.

The best news for SDSU fans is that the school exercised its contract option on Fisher prior to the 2011-12 season, which keeps the coach on Montezuma Mesa through 2014-15.

When Fisher arrived on the scene in March of 1999, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were set. The Aztecs were expected to lose. The year before Fisher's arrival on campus, San Diego State won just four games.

Now those days are a distant memory. Fisher has guided San Diego State to the NCAA Tournament five times, including three appearances in the last three seasons. In 2011, he led SDSU to a 34-3 record and a berth in the Sweet 16. Fisher has also taken the Aztecs to the NIT four times, including SDSU's run to the national semifinals in 2009. San Diego State has currently been to the postseason seven straight years.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene when it introduced Fisher as its new coach. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Co., raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, which put him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket after his stint in Ann Arbor. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to a NIT title as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great turn-arounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led SDSU back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

In 2006-07, he led SDSU to the MWC regular season and tournament crowns and a berth in the NCAA Tournament. That team finished with a Division I then-school-record 24 wins. And the last six seasons, Fisher has led the Aztecs to six additional 20-win seasons, including four straight 25-win campaigns, and six consecutive postseason appearances. In 2012, in what was perceived as a rebuilding year, Fisher led SDSU to a 26-8 record, a spot in the NCAA Tournament and its second straight Mountain West regular-season title.

## Brian Dutcher

Associate Head Coach  
14th Season at SDSU  
Minnesota '82

One of Steve Fisher's first moves as head coach at San Diego State was to hire Brian Dutcher as his top assistant. Dutcher, 51, was a regional scout for the Sacramento Kings before assuming the role of assistant head coach at SDSU.

When Fisher decides to retire, Dutcher will assume head coaching duties as he was anointed "head coach in waiting" in August of 2011.

Dutcher served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Steve Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native headed up UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship and a Big Ten tournament title (1998).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years.

His efforts at SDSU have gained accolades as well. The first full-year recruiting effort by Fisher, Dutcher and Co., resulted in a consensus top-40 group. Their second resulted in a top-25 class without counting a pair of high-profile transfers. Nine seasons ago, Dutcher helped attract SDSU's first McDonald's All-American. In 2004, freshmen Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter earned starting spots and all-league recognition. Dutcher was also instrumental in the recruitment of Ryan Amoroso, who earned all-MWC honors in 2007, and the four most recent classes that included a first-round NBA Draft pick and the No. 24 class in 2012.

Dutcher is firmly entrenched as one of the nation's top recruiters after showing that his rapport is as strong with potential student-athletes on the West Coast as it was in the vaunted Big Ten.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Bloomington (Minn.) Jefferson High School and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Minnesota head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten title, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.



## Mark Fisher

Assistant Coach  
11th Season at SDSU  
Michigan '01

Mark Fisher enters his sixth season as assistant coach and 11th overall at San Diego State. The son of 14th-year head coach Steve Fisher, Mark Fisher has taken on assistant coach duties after being the program's director of operations the five prior seasons.

Fisher's responsibilities include on-court coaching and skill development with SDSU's post players, opponent scouting, player development and recruiting. Fisher also plays a huge role in the Aztecs' offensive concepts, such as ball screening, spacing and the like.

In his first five years of coaching at SDSU, Fisher helped the Aztecs to their seventh straight 20-win season and seventh consecutive appearance in the postseason, including 2011's 34-3 record and Sweet 16 appearance.

When not on the practice court, Fisher can be found on the road in high school gyms around America recruiting.

The sixth-year assistant helped secure the 2009-10 incoming group, which featured the California Player of the Year in Kawhi Leonard. The class was ranked No. 15 in the nation by The HOOP SCOOP Online and was rated as the No. 1 class among non-automatic qualifying BCS schools by The HOOP SCOOP Online and Rivals.com. Meanwhile, ESPN.com slotted the Aztec incoming class at No. 4 in its "mid-major recruiting." The 2012 class, meanwhile, is rated the 24th-best by Rivals.

As the director of operations, Fisher handled many of the day-to-day operations, including scheduling, summer camps and organizing all aspects of team travel. He represented the basketball program with the athletic administration.

During his time supervising scheduling, the Aztecs have played high-profile games against Arizona, California, Providence, Iowa State, Washington and Washington State among others. In addition, he has arranged San Diego State to play in the BP Top of the World Classic in Fairbanks, Alaska, the Shamrock Invitational in Moraga, Calif., the World Vision Classic in Fresno, Calif., and the prestigious John R. Wooden Classic in past seasons.

In previous years, when San Diego State had two assistant coaches, Fisher officially took on coaching responsibilities, including conducting individual workouts and off-campus recruiting.

Fisher, the oldest of Steve Fisher's two sons, graduated from Michigan in December of 2001. A member of Psi Chi, a psychology honors fraternity, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in psychology.

Around basketball a majority of his life, Mark Fisher has amassed a variety of experience in a short period of time.

From 1998-2001, Fisher worked in a variety of capacities for Lincoln High School in Ann Arbor, Mich. He served as the varsity assistant head coach, head junior varsity coach and the head freshman coach during his tenure, assisting in all areas of the program.

He served as associate head coach for an Ann Arbor AAU team in the summer of 2001. Many of the players on that squad went on to play college basketball. He has also assisted in numerous camps, including the Steve Fisher Basketball Camps - both in Ann Arbor and in San Diego.



## Tony Bland

Assistant Coach  
2nd Season at SDSU  
San Diego State '09

Tony Bland, a two-time all-Mountain West selection who guided the Aztecs to a NCAA and postseason NIT appearance in his two seasons on The Mesa, enters his second season as an assistant coach at his alma mater.

Bland, 32, is the first San Diego State graduate to serve as a full-time assistant coach since the 1977-78 campaign. He also becomes the third former Steve Fisher-coached player to serve as a full-time member of the coaching staff at SDSU, following Gary Grant and Mark Hughes.

His duties as an assistant coach include on-court coaching, opponent scouting and recruiting.

In his first full season as an assistant, Bland helped secure the 24th-best recruiting class by Rivals.com, which was highlighted by five-star recruit Winston Shepard.

Bland transferred to San Diego State after playing two seasons at Syracuse. A native of Los Angeles, Bland played college basketball for two national championship coaches in Jim Boeheim and Fisher and was part of teams that won 84 games and advanced to three NCAA Tournaments and a post-season NIT in his four seasons at the collegiate level.

As a college player at San Diego State and Syracuse, Bland recorded 1,368 points, 331 rebounds, 319 assists while playing in 127 games and making 95 starts.

Bland, a captain on the 2001-02 Aztec squad, led the team to its first Division I postseason victory in school history, a 67-62 overtime win over UC Santa Barbara in the NIT. That year, as a senior, Bland averaged a career-high 16.4 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.4 assists. He earned second-team all-conference honors and was named a member of the NABC District 13 and USBWA District IX teams.

As a junior, Bland led San Diego State's magical run to a Mountain West tournament championship and the school's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1985. He averaged 15.7 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists, in becoming the first player in the history of the MW to rank among the league's top-10 players in scoring and assists and top-20 players in rebounding.

After college, Bland earned an invitation to take part in the Indiana Pacers training camp before playing in the United States Basketball League (USBL) where he played for former NBA player John Starks. During his stint in the USBL, Bland averaged 18.7 points, 5.1 rebounds and 5.7 assists en route to earning the league's Rookie of the Year award. From there, Bland participated in the Sacramento Kings' training camp in the fall of 2004 before signing a contract with the team. Following his stay with Sacramento, Bland played in Russia before moving on to the NBDL's Albuquerque Thunderbirds, where he played for two seasons for former NBA player Michael Cooper and won a championship in 2005-06. Shortly thereafter, Bland went overseas to play in Europe before returning to San Diego State prior to the 2008-09 campaign to serve as the team's head manager and ultimately finishing his degree. The last two seasons, Bland has been the personal trainer for Trevor Ariza, a forward for the New Orleans Hornets.
