@AztecWBB Readies for Thursday Matinee at LMU

Fresh off a thrilling come-from-behind victory earlier in the week, San Diego State returns to the City of Angels for a non-conference showdown with Loyola Marymount on Thursday at Gersten Pavilion in Los Angeles, Calif. The early tipoff of noon PT is part of a Kids Day at the Game promotion in conjunction with the Family of Schools and admission is free for all. SDSU alumnus Chris Ello will handle the play-by-play duties for a live audio stream on GoAztecs.com, while streaming video will also be available courtesy of the West Coast Conference's online platform, The W.tv.

The Aztecs (3-5) escaped with a 67-65 nail-biter at CSUN on Monday, as sophomore Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) hit the go-ahead bucket on a three-pointer with 9.4 seconds left in the game. Junior Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) came up with a crucial steal on the Matadors' next possession and sank a free throw with two seconds remaining to essentially ice the game for the Scarlet and Black. SDSU received double-digit scoring totals from three players, including sophomore McKynzie Fort (Fontana, Calif.), who tallied a game-high 18 points, while fellow classmate Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) chipped in 11 points and five rebounds, followed by Thorderson's 10-point effort.

On the flip side, the Lions (3-6) are returning home after posting a 1-2 mark during a three-game road swing, including an 80-48 defeat at Missouri in their last outing on Monday. Two weeks ago, LMU notched the fourth-highest point total in school history after crushing UC Irvine 95-50 in its home tournament on Nov. 28.

Despite the relative proximity of both schools, the Aztecs will face the Lions for just the ninth time ever on Thursday. SDSU holds a 6-2 lead in the series; however, the two sides have not met since December 2009 when the Aztecs registered a 75-54 triumph on the road. SDSU shot 60 percent from the field (33-55) in that contest to win going away. The Aztecs are 3-1 overall at Gersten Pavilion, posting their only loss in November of 2000 by a 69-59 count.

San Diego State is 76-64 against current members of the West Coast Conference. However, 29 of those defeats came against BYU when both teams were rivals in the Western Athletic and Mountain West conferences. The last time the Aztecs faced a WCC team other than USD occurred in 2012, when the Scarlet and Black suffered a 59-58 heartbreaker to Portland in the finals of the Rainbow Wahine Classic.

Entering the week, Fort ranks fourth in the Mountain West in scoring (15.8 ppg) and fifth in steals (2.5/gm) while occupying the seventh position in free-throw percentage (.651). In addition, senior Deidra Smith (Aurora, Colo.) shares the seventh spot in blocked shots (1.1/gm), while Thorderson is eighth in three-pointers made (1.4/g).

Following Thursday's encounter, San Diego State will break for final exams before returning to action on Saturday, Dec. 19, for a clash with Cal State Fullerton at Steve Fisher Court. Game time is set for 2 p.m. PT.

Scouting the Lions

After opening the year with three straight losses, LMU (3-6) has gone 3-3 in its last six outings. However, the Lions took one on the chin in their most recent game on Monday, suffering an 80-48 defeat to SEC member Missouri on the road. LMU was unable to keep pace with the unbeaten Tigers, who scored the first 21 points of the night and never looked back.

With just four upperclassmen on their active roster, the Lions' scoring burden has been shouldered by senior Sophie Taylor, who is averaging 13.8 points per game to go along with four double-doubles. She also leads the team in several other categories, including field goals (40), free throws (34) and steals (17), and ranks second in both rebounds (7.4/g) and blocked shots (1.1/g). In addition, LMU has received a boost from freshman Cheyanne Wallace (11.8 ppg), who is averaging double digits as well, while sophomore Bree Alford tops the squad with 8.0 rebounds per game and ranks second with 14 steals.

Taylor and freshman Bianca Velasco are the Lions' main three-point threats, with each draining 10 shots from beyond the arc this season. Velasco and her older sister Andee Velasco, who leads LMU in assists (3.4/g), were prep teammates of SDSU sophomore Allison Brown at Mater Dei High School.

Collectively, LMU is shooting 39.0 percent from the field, including a 28.6 percent clip from three-point range (50-149). As of Dec. 8, the Lions find themselves among the nation's leaders with 152 free throws made (4th) and 215 free throw attempts (7th). However, the resulting 70.4 free-throw percentage ranks just 105th in the country. LMU has been out-rebounding opponents by 2.1 boards per game, while its turnover average is nearly equal to its adversaries (17.7-17.1).

The Lions have faced one previous Mountain West opponent this season, posting a 69-58 triumph over Nevada at the Hawai'i Rainbow Wahine Classic. In all, LMU is 26-41 against current members of the MW.

The Lions and Aztecs share two common opponents during their respective non-conference schedules this year. LMU suffered an 80-62 setback on the road to UC Riverside on Dec. 1, while SDSU experienced a similar fate in a home loss to the Highlanders on Nov. 16. The Lions were also edged by Cal State Fullerton 75-73 in Gersten Pavilion on Nov. 15. The Titans are the Aztecs' next opponent when they invade Steve Fisher Court on Dec. 19.

Head coach Charity Elliott is in her fourth season at the helm of the LMU program and has compiled a 32-69 ledger since taking over the reins. Prior to her arrival on the Westchester campus, Elliott completed a successful five-year stint at Division II UC San Diego, where she posted a 127-34 overall record and a 90-16 mark in the California Collegiate Athletic Association, leading the Tritons to three regular-season conference championships and four NCAA tournament berths. For her efforts, Elliott earned CCAA Coach of the Year honors on three occasions and was named NCAA West Region Coach of the Year in 2012. She also served as head coach at Portland State for three seasons from 2004-07 after spending two years in the same role at California Baptist from 2001-03.

Notes With a 'W'

An SDSU victory over LMU on Thursday will mean:

- The Aztecs win their second straight road game and improve to 4-1 over their last five outings.
- SDSU raises its all-time record to 7-2 against LMU, including a 4-1 mark at Gersten Pavilion.
- The Aztecs improve to 37-18 in December contests since 2006.
- SDSU raises its record to 77-64 all-time against current West Coast Conference schools.
- The Aztecs move to 1-2 in Thursday games this year.

Rewind: Aztecs-Matadors Recap

game turned into a see-saw affair, with two sides battling through six ties and five lead changes for the remainder of the contest.

The Aztecs eventually built a 63-57 advantage following a jumper by sophomore McKynzie Fort with 2:42 remaining and had a chance to extend the margin after a steal by senior Ahjalee Harvey. However, the Scarlet and Black missed two layups on the ensuing possession, while CSUN's Tessa Boagni hit a basket at the 2:09 mark to spark an 8-0 outburst that put the host school up 65-63. The Matadors' Claudia Ramos capped the run by sinking one of two foul shots with 17.9 seconds to go, setting up Thorderson's heroics.

With SDSU clinging to a precarious 66-65 lead following a CSUN timeout, Boagni got free underneath the basket but was unable to control the inbounds pass cleanly on her way to the rim. Junior Ariell Bostick gained possession after a mad dash for the ball and hit one of two free throws following a foul at mid-court to secure the win.

The Aztecs were led by Fort, who finished with a game-high 18 points and dished out three assists, while fellow classmate Cheyenne Greenhouse totaled 11 points of her own, followed by Thorderson's 10-point effort, which included a pair of treys.

Conversely, CSUN was paced by Ramos' 14 points and five assists, while Boagni and Serafina Maulupe contributed 11 points each in the loss.

SDSU trailed by as many as 10 points late in the first quarter, but Harvey sank a three-ball as the horn sounded at the end of the period to ignite a 15-6 run. Fort punctuated the outburst with a pair of free throws to narrow the gap to 28-27 by the 3:52 mark of the second stanza. However, the Aztecs turned the ball over on their next five possessions and made just one foul shot down the stretch, as the Matadors took a 34-28 lead into the locker room.

Both teams connected on 24 field goals for the evening, including a trio of three-pointers for each side. In addition, the free-throw shooting was nearly equal, with SDSU sinking 16 of 27 attempts from the foul line (59.3 percent), while CSUN went 14 for 23 from the charity stripe (60.9 percent).

However, the Matadors turned the ball over 11 times in the second half, while the Aztecs committed just four miscues during that span.

SDSU-CSUN Postgame Notes

- The Aztecs won their 46th straight and improved to 76-1 since the 2012-13 campaign when leading with five minutes to go in the game. SDSU crept into the lead, 58-57, on a McKynzie Fort free-throw with 5:09 remaining in the fourth quarter.
- The Aztecs won their second in a row when trailing at halftime. SDSU also emerged triumphant for the second time this year when shooting 40 percent or below and dishing out fewer assists (12-11).
- SDSU finished with its second-lowest number of turnovers in a game this season (11).
- The SDSU bench outscored the CSUN reserves by a 32-23 tally. For the season, the Aztec bench has amassed 176 points (22.0/g).
- McKynzie Fort (18 points) reached double figures for the fifth game in row and 25th time in her career.
- Ahjalee Harvey came up with two steals, giving her 100 takeaways for her career.
- Ariell Bostick grabbed a season-high seven rebounds and came up with four steals to tie a personal-best.
- Cheyenne Greenhouse equaled her season high with five rebounds.
- Deidra Smith played in her 69th consecutive game at SDSU.

Taking Care of the Ball

San Diego State has improved its ball-handling over the past four games, committing five fewer turnovers per contest than the opposition. Not surprisingly, the Aztecs have posted a 3-1 record during that span, outscoring their foes 72-67 off those miscues. In victories over Wisconsin and CSUN, SDSU finished with its two lowest turnover totals of the season thus far with 10 and 11 miscues, respectively.

Fort Tabbed MW Player of the Week

McKynzie Fort has been named Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week for her stellar performances in three games from Nov. 23-29, as announced Monday by the league office. With her award, the Aztec sophomore garnered weekly conference accolades for the first time in her career and first for SDSU this season.

Fort averaged 17.3 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 3.3 steals, helping the Aztecs to a 2-1 record last week. The 5-9 guard was the team's top scorer in all three games, connecting on 66.7 percent of her shots on 24 of 36 field-goal attempts, all inside the three-point arc.

After recording 16 points on 8-of-13 shooting and four rebounds in a tough road loss to Washington on Nov. 23, Fort almost single-handedly propelled the Scarlet and Black to a 64-54 triumph over North Dakota State in the opener of the SDSU Thanksgiving Classic last Friday, posting a game-high 20 points and a personal-best five steals. Against the Bison, the Etiwanda High alumna drained a collegiate-high 10 field goals on 12 tries (83.3 pct) and matched her season best with four rebounds.

Not to be outdone, Fort capped off her brilliant week with a 16-point, 4-steal effort in the Aztecs' thrilling 63-57 overtime

victory over Wisconsin on Sunday, sinking 6 of 11 attempts from the floor to go with four clutch free throws. Against the Badgers, she converted two critical and-one opportunities, including one to punctuate a timely 23-7 run that erased an 11-point deficit in the second half.

For the season, Fort is averaging a team-high 15.8 points per game on 47.1 percent shooting and leads SDSU with 20 steals. She now has six double-digit scoring performances this year and 26 for her career.

In addition, Fort set a career high with 25 points against UC Riverside in the Aztecs' home opener on Nov. 16, and established collegiate bests in three-pointers made (2), field-goal attempts (17), free throws (11) and free throw attempts (12).

Decembers to Remember

The Aztecs are a combined 36-18 during the month of December since 2006. Eight of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll, including a defeat to Washington (rv) in 2014 following a pair of setbacks to No. 23 Texas A&M and North Carolina State (rv) the year before in 2013. The Aztecs have also come up short in previous seasons against No. 2 UConn (2007), No. 7 Texas A&M (2010), No. 14 Oklahoma State (2012), No. 17 George Washington (2006) and USC (rv - 2010). Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 38 of those 53 December contests at home.

@AztecWBB Picked Sixth in MW Preseason Poll

San Diego State has been predicted to finish sixth the Mountain West preseason poll released on Oct. 28 by the league office. The voting panel consisted of the MW's 11 head coaches and select women's basketball media from around the conference.

The Aztecs, who placed seventh in the MW standings during the 2014-15 campaign, earned 135 points from the panel, trailing fifth-place UNLV (132) by just three points while topping seventh-place Wyoming (125) by 10 points.

Two-time defending regular-season champion Colorado State was picked to repeat once again after receiving 21 of 28 first-place votes and 237 points, just ahead of New Mexico, which garnered seven first-place votes and 221 points, while 2015 MW tournament champion Boise State followed closely in the third spot with six first-place votes and 215 points.

With the league's forecast, SDSU has not been selected to finish among the top three places in the MW preseason rankings in back-to-back years for the first time since the 2006-07 and 2007-08 campaigns. The Aztecs completed conference play where they were projected last season, landing in the seventh spot with an 8-10 record.

Back Again

San Diego State returns three starters from a year ago, featuring sophomore McKynzie Fort, along with seniors Ahjaleé Harvey and Deidra Smith. A 5-9 guard, Fort earned Mountain West all-freshman honors last spring after finishing third among conference rookies with 10.9 points per game in league play while averaging 3.2 rebounds and 1.7 assists. In addition, Harvey made a successful recovery from a knee injury that sidelined her for the final 22 games of the 2013-14 campaign with 25 starts in 29 appearances last season. The 5-6 point guard was SDSU's top ball-handler and main three-point threat in 2014-15, dishing out 2.3 assists per contest to go with 21 triples. Meanwhile, Smith has played in all 62 games for the Aztecs the past two years following her transfer from Boston College. The tallest member on the squad as a 6-2 forward, Smith is the team's top returning rebound-

er after averaging 3.5 caroms last season.

Third-year head coach Stacie Terry and staff welcome back four additional letterwinners, including juniors Ariell Bostick and Aleiah Brandon and sophomores Cheyenne Greenhouse and Lexy Thorderson. Fellow classmate Allison Brown, who made seven spot appearances last season, also finds herself in the mix once again.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, four players will be wearing a Scarlet and Black uniform for the first time during the 2015-16 campaign. Guard Kymberly Ellison (Columbus, Ga.) practiced with the squad last year, but did not compete after transferring from Georgia Tech, while fellow backcourt mate Geena Gomez (Huntington Beach, Calif.) utilized her redshirt season as well following her transfer from St. Joseph's (Pa.).

With the departure of forwards Erimma Amarikwa, Khristina Hunter and Desi Culberson, who accounted for 43 percent of SDSU's rebounding total and 38 percent of the team's scoring offense from a year ago, a pair of newcomers look to gain significant experience on the frontline this season. Junior Kylie Herd (Phoenix, Ariz.) received second-team All-America recognition and was named the Arizona JC player of the year as a sophomore last year at Mesa Community College, following a solid freshman campaign when she helped the Thunderbirds to the NJCAA Division II national championship. Not to be outdone, freshman Arantxa Gómez (Valencia, Spain) brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after sharpening her skills as a six-year member on the Spanish club circuit, including an MVP performance in U18 regional competition last April.

Listen Live

For the 15th consecutive year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of regular-season games over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alumnus Chris Ello begins his ninth season of calling the action and is a familiar voice in the San Diego area. In addition to his responsibilities with the Aztec women's basketball squad, Ello is a member of the football broadcast team as a sideline reporter for the school's flagship station, The Mighty 1090 AM.

Ello started his career in sports talk radio in San Diego on XTRA Sports 690 in the summer of 1994. He has accumulated a wealth of experience doing play-by-play for a variety of sports at every level, including stints with the SDSU football (1985), baseball (1998-99) and men's basketball (2006-07) squads.

From 1996-2006, Ello was the voice of the San Diego Gulls hockey team and has called the action for the San Diego Sockers (indoor soccer), San Diego Spirit (outdoor soccer), San Diego Wildcards (CBA) and San Diego Riptide (arena football). He also has experience broadcasting high school CIF football and basketball games since 2000.

For the third straight year, nearly all regular-season Aztec home contests in 2015-16 will feature a live video stream via the Mountain West Network to supplement the audio call from Viejas Arena.

2015-16 By the Numbers

With excitement brewing for head coach Stacie Terry's third season on Montezuma Mesa, below are a few trends to watch for in 2015-16:

- SDSU enters the year having claimed 43 of its last 59 home games and has gone 75-28 on the Viejas Arena floor since the start of the 2008-09 campaign.
- The Aztecs have recorded 81 Mountain West victories in the last eight seasons after posting 31 wins in the league's first nine years.
- SDSU has won 46 straight games and is 76-1 over the last three seasons when leading with five minutes to go in the game, including an 12-0 mark in 2014-15. The Aztecs' lone blemish during that stretch was a heart-breaking 59-58 defeat at Washington in December 2012.
- SDSU is 35-19 in December games dating back to the 2006-07 campaign, with eight of those losses coming against teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national polls.
- The Aztecs have advanced to finals of the MW Championship in five of the last eight years after not winning a single game in the tournament's first eight years of existence.
- For the third straight season, SDSU will play 18 conference games. The Aztecs will complete a home-and-away slate with eight squads, while facing Nevada (home) and Air Force (away) just once.

NCAA Rule Changes at a Glance

Game Format

- Beginning with the 2015-16 campaign, NCAA women's basketball games will be played in four 10-minute quarters.
- Teams will now reach the bonus and shoot two free throws on the fifth team foul in each quarter. Previously, teams reached a one-and-one bonus on the seventh team foul of each half and reached the double bonus (two shots) on the 10th team foul.
- In the four-quarter format, team fouls reset to zero at the start of each quarter. However, if a team reaches the bonus in the fourth quarter, that team would remain in the bonus during any additional overtime periods.

Advancing the Ball

- Teams will be allowed to advance the ball to the frontcourt following a timeout immediately after a made basket in the last 59.9 seconds of the fourth quarter and any overtime periods.
- Teams will also be allowed to advance the ball to the frontcourt following a rebound or a change of possession. In these scenarios, the ball would be inbounded at the 28-foot mark on the side of the court where the scorer's table is located.

10-Second Backcourt Exceptions

- For the upcoming season, a team will not receive a new 10-second backcourt count when a throw-in results from the following situations:
 - The ball is deflected out of bounds by the defense.
 - There is a held ball and the possession arrow favors the offensive team.
 - A technical foul is called on the offensive team while the ball is in its backcourt.

Post Defense

- Defenders will be allowed to place a forearm or an open hand with a bend in the elbow on an offensive post player with the ball whose back is to the basket.

Bands and Amplified Music

- In an effort to improve the overall fan experience, bands or amplified music may be played during any dead-ball situation during a women's basketball game. Previously, rules allowed music to be played only during timeouts and intermission.

SDSU Holds Grand-Opening Ceremony for Jeff Jacobs JAM Center

San Diego State held a grand-opening ceremony for the 23,500-square foot Jeff Jacobs JAM Center on Sunday, Aug. 23. The event marked the official opening of the Aztecs' on-campus basketball performance center, which broke ground almost a year to the date on Aug. 27, 2014.

Speaking before the ceremonial ribbon cutting was SDSU president Elliot Hirshman, men's basketball head coach Steve Fisher and women's hoops senior guard Ahjalee Harvey.

Preliminary site work started in July 2014, just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields. The facility, which will support the continued growth and development of the SDSU men's and women's basketball teams, includes two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film room, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms.

Hundreds of supporters contributed to the effort to make the Jeff Jacobs JAM Center a reality. In addition to the naming gift from Jeff Jacobs, Hal and Debby Ja-

cobs, Steve and Lisa Altman and Jim Morris, creating the name "JAM" Center, sizeable donations were made from the Manna Charitable Foundation and the Walter and Betty Zable Foundation. The total cost of the project was \$15 million.

The project was designed by JCJ Architecture and was built by The Hunt Construction Group.

San Diego native Stacie Terry enters her third year at the helm of the Aztec women's basketball team after she was named the eighth head coach in program history on May 15, 2013.

Despite a 12-19 record and an 8-10 mark in the Mountain West, Terry's squad still showed dramatic improvement on defense last season, finishing second in the conference and 34th nationally in opponent three-point field goal percentage, compared to 2014 when SDSU ranked last in the league and near the bottom of Division I in that statistic.

In addition, the Aztecs were fourth in scoring defense during MW play a year ago, allowing nearly 10 points per game fewer than the previous campaign and topped the conference in rebounding defense for the second straight season.

Under Terry's watch, forward Erimma Amarikwa capped off her collegiate career with honorable mention all-MW accolades, while guard McKynzie Fort gave SDSU's its second consecutive all-conference freshman honoree.

Terry's charges also made tremendous strides in the classroom, with the squad posting the highest collective GPA in program history during the fall of 2014, while five Aztecs landed a spot on the MW all-academic team, the most since 2001-02.

During her first season on Montezuma Mesa, Terry was saddled with the unenviable task of replacing four senior starters who accounted for nearly 64 percent of the team's scoring offense from the previous year, as well as overcoming the loss of two key players to injuries prior to conference play, Amarikwa, who was a preseason all-MW selection, and starting point guard Ahjalee Harvey.

Despite those obstacles and a demanding schedule featuring nine games against teams that eventually advanced to postseason competition, Terry's squad flashed its resiliency during the 2013-14 campaign, finishing with a 13-17 overall record and a 9-9 ledger in the MW.

With Terry at the controls, the Aztecs led the league in rebounding margin and rebounding defense while ranking second in field-goal percentage.

Individually, Terry also oversaw the progress of senior center Cierra Warren, who became the fifth SDSU player in a six-year span to receive first-team all-MW recognition.

Prior to her arrival on The Mesa, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level for 14 years, including five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transformed UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. During that season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

Prior to her appointment at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA

tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN Hoop-Gurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyingifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Greutz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at the University of Texas at Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to UT Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry prepped at El Capitan High and held the Vaqueros' career scoring record for three years following her graduation. She was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
