#### Aztec Men's Golf Heads to Texas This Weekend for Final Regular-Season Tournament

In its final tune-up before the Mountain West Conference Championships, the San Diego State men's golf team heads to the Lone Star state this weekend to compete in the Texas A&M Aggie Invitational, April 18-19, in Bryan, Texas. The First two rounds of the 54-hole event will be contested on Saturday, while the final 18 holes are slated for Sunday at the 7,235-yard, par-72 Traditions Golf Club. A live scoring link will be provided on the home page of GoAztecs.com.

This will be the first appearance by the Aztecs at the Aggie Invite, which is only in its fourth year.

#### The Field: SDSU Among 10 Top-60 Squads

The three-round event features a highly competitive field of 12 schools, 10 of which are ranked in the top 60, according to the latest Golfstat rankings released April 15. At No. 4, Oklahoma State is the highest-ranked squad in the tournament, followed by Texas Christian (12), Texas Tech (13), the 20th-ranked Aztecs, host school Texas A&M (22), New Mexico (40), Lamar (41), Baylor (43), Kent State (45) and Ohio State (60). Kansas and Wichita State round out the list of competitors. This will be the last chance for SDSU to get an early look at MWC competitors TCU and New Mexico prior to the Mountain West Conference Championships, which are set to begin April 24.

#### For the Record: Aztecs vs. The Field

SDSU will be looking for its seventh top-6 finish of the spring season when it hits the fairways in Texas. The Scarlet and Black enter the week with a dazzling 118-24-3 record (.824) in head-to-head competition. SDSU has faced seven teams in the 2009 Aggie Invitational field, posting a 9-0 mark this year. The Aztecs will square off against Kansas, Kent State, Lamar and Oklahoma State for the first time this season.

#### This Week's Lineup

Head coach Ryan Donovan will field his ninth different lineup of the 2008-09 season, however, it will be the same as last week's squad that traveled to the ASU Thunderbird Invitational, with the addition of a sixth player. Leading the way for SDSU will be the sophomore duo of Johan Carlsson and Matt Hoffenberg. Senior Ryan Citarella, whose opening-round 65 at ASU ties for third best in SDSU history, will make his second consecutive start. Fellow senior Bryan Martin will make the trip for the Scarlet and Black, his fourth outing of the spring. Freshman Andrew Cooley returns to the Aztec lineup after competing as an individual at ASU, as does classmate J.J. Spaun.

Carlsson, Cooley, Hoffenberg and Martin were all part of the squad that finished runner-up at both the Barona Collegiate Cup (March 16-17) and the exclusive Callaway Collegiate Match Play Championships (March 22-24), while Carlsson, Hoffenberg and Martin all helped SDSU to the team's runner-up finish at the ASU Thunderbird Invitational (April 10-11).

Spaun leads the squad with a 71.92 stroke average this spring, followed closely by Hoffenberg (72.82), Carlsson (73.24), Citarella (73.31), Cooley (73.41) and Martin (73.85).

#### A Look At The Course

Traditions Club at Texas A&M is a Jack Nicklaus and Jack Nicklaus II co-design. This 7,146-yard championship course features stately hardwoods, many natural creeks and wetlands, and striking vistas of Kyle Field and the University skyline. The course opened in 2004.

#### On Deck

Following the Aggie Invitational, San Diego State heads back to the desert for the Mountain West Conference Championships, April 30-May 2, in Tucson, Ariz. For the third straight year, the nine league foes will compete for the title on the 7,136-yard, par-71 Catalina Course at the Omni Tucson National Golf Resort.

#### Carlsson Named Mountain West Conference Golfer of the Month

Sophomore Johan Carlsson was named the Mountain West Conference men's golfer of the month as announced by the league office on Nov. 19. The award is the first of his career.

Carlsson, a product of Gothenburg, Sweden, helped the Aztecs to a third-place finish at the Rees Jones Intercollegiate on Daufuski Island, S.C. in early November, followed by a second-place team finish at the Turtle Bay Resort Intercollegiate in Kuhuku, Hawaii.

Carlsson recorded five rounds below 70 during the fall campaign, including two during the month of November.

#### Freshmen Fantastic

San Diego State's freshman class is among America's best. The class currently ranks third on the Golfstat Top 25 Freshman Class Impact Ranking, released April 16. As a class, the SDSU freshmen hold a 72.91stroke average, according to Golfstat. Only Oregon and Alabama rank ahead of the Aztecs.

#### Last Time Out

The San Diego State men's golf team finished in a tie for second place at the ASU Thunderbird Invitational at the 7,057-yard, par-71 Karsen Golf Course in Tempe, Ariz. Arizona State shot a 14-under 838 to claim the team medal. The Sun Devils were led by Stephen Gross, who shared the individual medalist honors with New Mexico's Steve Saunders. The pair tied for first at 3-under 210.

Senior Ryan Citarella paced the Aztecs to their runner-up finish, finishing the tournament in a tie for seventh place on the individual leaderboard. Citarella led all Aztecs at the event after recording a 1-under par total, equaling his lowest three-round score in relation to par of the 2008-09 season. His seventh place tie on the final leaderboard is also his best this spring and equals his Aztec best. He posted rounds of 65-76-71 (212) en route to his lowest 54-hole total with the Scarlet and Black.

Classmate Bryan Martin moved up two places in the final standings with his final round 1-over 72. Martin fired three consecutive rounds of 1-over 72 for a 3-over 54-hole total. He finished the final day of play in a tie for 25th position.

Sophomore Johan Carlsson fired a 1-under 70 over the final 18-holes to wrap up the invitational with a 4-over 217 total. Carlsson improved 18 places on the final leaderboard to conclude the event in a tie for 32nd position.

SDSU freshman Colin Featherstone made the biggest improvement on day two. Featherstone improved 33 positions on the individual leaderboard with his 3-under par 68 performance over the final 18 holes. Featherstone finished with a 219 54-hole total.

Rounding out the scoring for SDSU was sophomore Matt Hoffenberg. The Simi Valley, Calif. carded a 5-over 76 in the final round to conclude tournament play in a tie for 53rd position.

Competing as an individual for the Scarlet and Black was Andrew Cooley, who shot a third-round 72, putting himself in a tie with Hoffenberg. Cooley improved six spots in the final standings and record a 220 three-round total.

### Two Former Aztecs Named to MWC 10th Anniversary Team

Former San Diego State men's golf standouts Aaron Goldberg and Mark Warman were named to the Mountain West Conference 10th Anniversary Men's Golf Team, as selected by a combined panel of media, institutional and conference personnel and online fan poll. In order to be eligible for consideration, candidates must have been a first-team all-MWC selection at least once in their careers.

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Goldberg earned first-team all-MWC accolades three times (2006-08) and was named the league's player of the year in 2008. Goldberg was named the MWC golfer of the month five times in his Aztec career, joining Ryan Moore of UNLV as the only two players to be recognized on a least five occasions since the league's formation in 1999-2000. A two-time All-American, Goldberg became the first SDSU golfer to gain All-America status in consecutive seasons since Kris Moe accomplished the feat in 1983-84. Goldberg ended his Aztec career with two individual tournament titles and currently owns the top 54-hole individual score in the SDSU record books (68-66-67--201 at the 2006 District 7 Shootout).

Warman, meanwhile, earned first-team all-MWC honors each of the three years he played for the Aztecs (2002-04). The San Clemente, Calif., product claimed medalist honors at the 2003 U.S. Intercollegiate, a tournament in which he shot a 62 which stands as the lowest individual 18-hole score in the SDSU record books. The MWC player of the month in March 2002, Warman was also an All-American candidate his senior season and was named one of Golf World's top 50 "Players to Watch" in 2004.

### Head Coach Ryan Donovan

Coming off San Diego State's best season since 1982 and the Aztecs' best showing during his tenure, San Diego State alumnus Ryan Donovan is now in his sixth season as the leader of the Aztec men's golf program. With Donovan at the helm, SDSU placed in the top 14 in all 15 outings with the 15th tournament being a 14th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Overall, the Aztecs compiled a 266-21 head-to-head record and finished 20th in Golfstat's final collegiate poll.

Individually, Donovan helped a pair of athletes in senior Aaron Goldberg and junior David Palm earn All-America accolades. Additionally, both were all-Mountain West Conference and all-Southwest Region selections. Other players to earn season-ending honors under Donovan were Matt Hoffenberg (MWC freshman of the year, all-MWC, all-Southwest Region) and Johan Carlsson (all-Southwest Region). Donovan himself was named the Eaton Golf Pride Division I Coach of the Year for the southwest region given out annually by the Golf Coaches Association of America.

In 2006-07, SDSU secured three team tournament

titles and reached the NCAA Regionals for the team's ninth straight appearance. Aaron Goldberg had one the program's finest campaigns, finishing with a scoring average of 70.71, while recording seven top-five finishes and capturing medalist honors at the District 7 Fall Shootout on his way to being named an honorable mention PING All-America honors, the program's first such honor since 2001.

The 2005-06 season was equally impressive as Donovan guided SDSU to three team tournament victories and its eighth consecutive NCAA regional appearance. Three Aztec golfers - seniors Andrew Scott and Josh Warthen and sophomore David Palm - all claimed individual titles during the season, while Scott and Goldberg garnered all-Mountain West Conference accolades.

Donovan was a four-year competitor for the SDSU golf squad from 1997-2001. His most successful season came as a junior when he posted five top-30 finishes.
