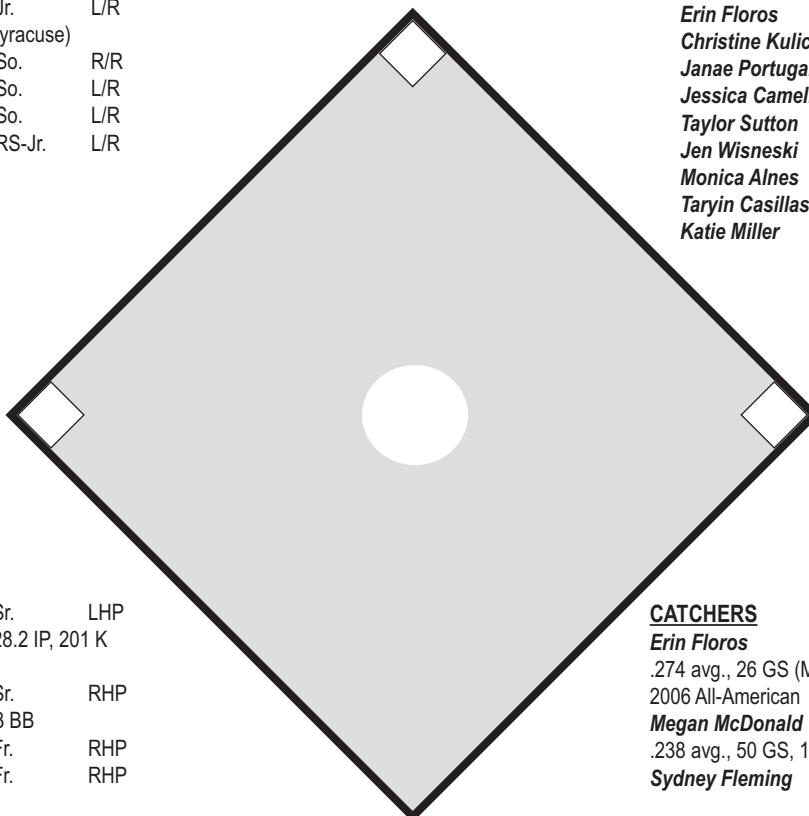

SDSU Career Rankings: 8th in doubles (22), T-8th in home runs (7)

A clutch hitter ... Swings the bat hard and rarely gets cheated on a swing ... Will most likely utilize her redshirt season.

JUNIOR SEASON (2007)

Tied for fourth (Lindsey Marquez) on the team with seven doubles ... The seven doubles were just one short of tying her career high of eight, set in 2006 ... Tied for the MWC lead and was tops on the team with three sacrifice flies after not recording any in each of her first two seasons on The Mesa ... Was a perfect 4-for-4 on stolen base attempts, also just one short of her career high of five (2006) ... Started 40 of the 46 games she appeared in ... Was second on the team with 76 assists ... Her 127 at-bats were sixth on the team ... Had five multiple-hit games and two multiple-RBI contests ... Had three game-winning RBI and three game-winning runs ... Was part of a game-winning play on six occasions, tied with Monica Alnes and Melissa Owens for the third-most on the squad ... Helped the Aztecs to an impressive 8-0 record when she was in the cleanup spot ... In the four hole, she went 9-for-26 (.346) with seven runs scored, three doubles and three RBI ... Batted .375 (3-for-8) in limited action against left-handed pitchers ... Was 8-for-24 (.333) when leading off an inning and had three RBI in three at-bats with the bases loaded ... Batted .270 (10-for-37) in 14 games during the first month of the season ... Through her first three seasons, she is batting .318 (35-for-110) with 20 RBI in February ... Had a season-long four-game hit streak from March 17-21 ... Batted .400 (6-for-15) during the streak with five runs and three RBI ... Had a run in five straight games from March 13-21 ... SDSU was 11-1 when she scored a run, 7-2 when she had at least one RBI and 5-0 when she had a multi-hit game.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

Named to the Mountain West Conference all-tournament team after batting .556 (5-for-9) with a home run and a team-leading eight RBI ... Tied with four others for first on the team with her seven multi-RBI games ... Third on the team with 29 RBI ... Also was third in doubles (8) and home runs (3) ... Started 46 of the 48 games she appeared in, fourth most on the team ... Had three games with three or more RBI (the most she had in one game in her freshman season was two) ... Went 3-for-5 with a career-high five RBI in SDSU's 21-5, five-inning win over New Mexico on April 23 ... Also homered

and scored two runs ... Was 5-for-6 on stolen base attempts ... Hit .450 (9-for-20) during a career-long six-game hitting streak from Feb. 23-March 1 ... Had two hits apiece in three consecutive games (vs. Colorado State - 4/9/06, vs. UNLV - 4/15/06, and vs. UNLV (game two) - 4/15/06) ... Batted .400 (14-for-35) in night games, the second highest night batting average on the team ... Was 11-for-32 (.344) in the month of February ... Hit .389 (7-for-18) with two home runs and 11 RBI in six games against perennial MWC power Brigham Young ... Was 4-for-8 (.500) with the bases loaded ... Her two homers in MWC play was second most on the team, while her 13 RBI was third ... Aztecs were 14-3 when she scored a run and 13-3 when she had at least one RBI.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2005)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-7th in home runs (4)

Tied Megan McDonald for the team lead with four home runs, despite playing in only 41 of the Aztecs' 57 games ... Four homers were tied for the seventh-most in a single season in SDSU history ... Led the squad with a .410 slugging percentage ... Tied for second on the team with seven doubles and was third in RBI (16) ... Batted .254 (31-of-122) with 15 runs scored ... Had eight multiple-hit games and four multi-RBI games ... Aztecs were 5-3 when she had at least two hits and 3-1 when she had two or more RBI ... SDSU was 8-4 when she batted No. 3 in the lineup ... Hit .324 (12-for-37) from the three spot with five doubles and eight RBI ... Had four-game hitting streaks on three occasions including the first four games of the year (Feb. 4-6) and the last four games of the season (May 8-13) ... Hit safely in 11 of her first 14 games ... Batted .341 (14-for-41) with 10 RBI in the month of February ... Was 4-for-13 (.308) with two RBI in the Mountain West Conference tournament ... Went 3-for-3 and added two RBI in a 3-0 Aztec victory over New Mexico on May 6 ... Recorded her first career three-hit game against BYU on April 22 ... Had two doubles and two RBI against St. Mary's (Feb. 6) ... Went 2-for-3 with two RBI in a SDSU 3-2 win over No. 20 Long Beach State on Feb. 5.

A three-year letterwinner who continues to improve ... On the verge of becoming SDSU's all-time home run leader and needs just one more round-tripper to move into sole possession of second place ... A vocal leader who has game-changing power ... Possesses a strong and accurate arm ... A patient hitter ... Not afraid to drop down a sacrifice bunt when the situation calls for it.

JUNIOR SEASON (2007)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-10th in doubles (10)

Was the junior class captain ... Became the Aztecs' starting catcher after teammate Erin Floros went down with a knee injury 27 games into the season ... Did well behind the plate, posting career-highs in chances (342), putouts (310) and assists (26) ... The 310 putouts led the team ... Threw out 18 of the 36 (50 percent) who attempted to steal on her ... The 50 percent mark was second in the MWC behind Floros (52.4 percent) ... Also filled in for the injury-riddled Aztecs at first base ... Hit 10 doubles which tied her for 10th on the single-season list and tied Melissa Owens for the team lead ... Came into the season with just five doubles her previous two years ... Also posted career-highs in at-bats (143), hits (34 - tied), sacrifice flies (2 - tied) and sacrifice bunts (7) ... Led the team in times hit by a pitch (3) for the second straight season after finishing second in the category in 2005 ... In fact, she has been hit by a pitch 13 times over her three-year career ... Tied Owens for second on the squad with 23 RBI and her seven sacrifices were also second on the team ... Was one of four Aztecs who walked at least 10 times ... Tied Lindsey Marquez and Owens for tops on the team with six multi-RBI games ... After going homerless her first 106 at-bats, she hit a solo shot against Colorado State in the second game of a doubleheader on April 13 and followed that up the next day with her second career grand slam at New Mexico ... Also had two RBI against No. 12 Stanford (March 10), and in back-to-back games against Fairfield (March 17) and Iona (March 18) ... Was a perfect 3-for-3 with two runs driven in against Long Beach State on Feb. 25 ... Went 2-for-3 with three RBI versus Siena on Feb. 24 ... Had a hit in three of the Aztecs' final four contests ... SDSU was 11-3 when she drove in at least one run, 9-1 when she doubled, 7-1 when she scored a run and 5-1 when she had at least two RBI in a game.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-2nd in home runs (6), T-8th in walks (21), 10th in RBI (31)

Hit six home runs, one short of the Aztec single-season record set by Erryn Gutjahr (7) in 1999 ... Led the team with the six home runs and tied for first with 21 walks ... Also led the team in hit by pitches (5) and was second on the squad in RBI (31) ...

The 21 walks were tied for the eighth-most in a single season, while the 32 RBI was the 10th-most in a season ... One of five Aztecs to record seven multi-RBI games ... Had three or more RBI on three occasions ... Reached base safely in 38 of the 48 games she played in, including 14 of the 18 MWC games ... Her walk (21) to strike-out (15) ratio of 1.40 was tops on the team for the second consecutive year ... Was intentionally walked a team-high three times ... Led the team with three MWC homers and was second with 15 conference RBI ... Reached base safely in a remarkable 13 straight games from Feb. 24-March 17 ... Went 1-for-3 with her first career grand slam in the Aztecs' 8-6 win over New Mexico (Game 1) on April 23 ... Had a three-run homer against Colorado State (first game) on April 21 ... After only earning four at-bats (1-for-4, .250) in SDSU's first four games, McDonald went on a tear over her next three contests, batting .778 (7-for-9) with a home run and seven RBI ... Reached base safely in seven consecutive plate appearances during the streak ... Finished 3-for-3 with an Aztec single-game record six RBI against Rider on Feb. 17 ... Went 3-for-4 with a home run, three RBI and two runs scored in the first game of SDSU's doubleheader against Brigham Young on March 31 ... Was 3-for-5 (.600) with the bases loaded ... The Aztecs were 20-4 when she got a hit, 15-1 when she had at least one RBI, 12-0 when she scored a run and 6-0 when she homered.

FRESHMAN SEASON (2005)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-7th in home runs (4)

Tied for the team lead with four homers ... Led Aztecs with 19 walks (seventh in MWC) and two sacrifice flies (tied for fourth in MWC) ... Fell one walk shy of tying for 10th place on the all-time SDSU single season list ... Was second on the team in RBI (19), on-base percentage (.351) and times hit by pitch (five) ... Led the squad with six multi-RBI games and three-RBI games (two) ... Aztecs were 6-0 when she had at least

two RBI ... Had eight multiple-hit games, tied for fourth most on the team ... Walk to strikeout ratio (1.0) was the best on the team ... Had a season-long four-game hitting streak from May 6-12 ... Batted a remarkable .583 (7-of-12) during the four-game stretch, including three consecutive games with two hits ... Committed only four errors in 252 chances behind the plate for a .984 fielding percentage ... Had a home run and drove in two runs against Longwood (March 19) ... Had two hits, including a home run, and two RBI against Southern Utah on March 5 ... Went 1-for-3 with a homer and three RBI in a 4-1 SDSU upset win over No. 21 Long Beach State ... Made her presence known on The Mesa in her first game, going 2-for-3 with a home run, three RBI and two runs scored.

Tri-captain ... An All-America candidate ... One of the best Aztec pitchers of all-time ... A crafty left-hander who throws a variety of pitches anytime in the count ... Can throw a finesse or a power game ... Fearless in the circle ... Is never satisfied ... A competitor and clutch performer who will pitch against any team in the nation ... Tossed the first known perfect game in school history in a Aztecs' 8-0 victory over Brown on March 28, 2007.

JUNIOR SEASON (2007)

NCAA Rankings: 33rd in wins (23)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-2nd in solo shutouts (9), 3rd in wins (23), 3rd in strikeouts (201), T-3rd in games started (33), 4th in appearances (45), 4th in innings pitched (228.2), 5th in total shutouts (9), T-5th in saves (2), 6th in complete games (25), 7th in win percentage (.657)

Ace of the pitching staff for the second consecutive year ... Arguably had a better season statistically than 2006 when she was named an NFCA all-West Region second-team pick and MWC Pitcher of the Year ... Improved from 17 victories in 2006 to 23 in 2007 ... Also saw improvements in appearances, games started, complete games, shutouts, innings pitched and strikeouts ... Earned all-MWC honors for the second straight season ... Led the league in ERA (1.90), innings pitched (228.2), wins (23) and appearances (45) ... Was second in opposing batting average (.229), strikeouts (201), games started (33) and saves (2) ... Posted nine shutouts, eclipsing her previous two-year total of eight (three at Kansas in 2005, five at SDSU in 2006) ... Had the first known perfect game in SDSU history, when she struck out six over five innings and did not allow a ball out of the infield in the Aztecs' 8-0 win over Brown on March 28 ... Earned MWC Pitcher of the Week honors for the effort, her second

weekly award of the year ... Did not allow an earned run in 19 of her 44 appearances ... Gave up five or less hits in 19 of her 33 starts ... Had 201 strikeouts in 228 2/3 innings (6.15/7 innings) after fanning 136 in 169 innings (5.63/7 innings) in 2006 ... Completed 25 of the 33 games she started (75.8 percent) after doing so 64 percent (16-of-25) of the time the previous year ... Was 7-6 with a 2.23 ERA in 88 innings in MWC play, despite having to play most road games at elevation ... In fact, she was 7-3 with a 2.10 ERA in road games ... Her teammates combined to go 0-5 with a 6.00 ERA in away contests ... Was 11-1 with a 1.49 ERA under the lights ... Was 2-1 with a microscopic 0.41 ERA against MWC foe Utah where she struck out 14 against two walks in seven innings ... Had a 1.27 ERA in 22 innings against UNLV ... Earned a complete game shutout in SDSU's 1-0 win over No. 6 Oregon State on Feb. 8 ... Allowed just two hits and two walks in a shutout win at No. 10 Texas on Feb. 16 ... Followed that up with a five-hit shutout over North Texas ... Struck out six and two-hit Minnesota on March 2 ... Struck out six and allowed five hits in a 5-0 Aztec win over Loyola-Chicago in the consolation game at the Stanford Invitational on March 11 ... Struck out a career-high 11 in SDSU's victory over Fordham on March 16 ... Followed that up with eight strikeouts against Fairfield (March 17) and a new career-high 12 against Miami (Ohio) on March 18 ... Tossed 5 2/3 innings of hitless ball against Miami (Ohio) before a bloop single in the sixth ended the no-hit bid ... Took a no-hitter into the seventh against BYU on April 5 before Emi Snow's single to center ... The hit ended a 12 2/3 inning hitless streak (1.2 at CS Fullerton, 5.0 vs. Brown, 6.0 vs. BYU) ... Three-hit UNLV and tied a career-high with 12 strikeouts on April 21 ... Had 11 strikeouts in SDSU's 1-0 loss to UNLV on May 6 ... Struck out 38 over four games and 28 innings (9.5 K/7 innings) from March 16-21 ... Aztecs were 21-11 when she earned the start in the circle and 11-13 when she didn't.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2006)

SDSU Single-Season Rankings: T-4th in solo shutouts (5), T-5th in saves (2), T-6th in wins (17), 7th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.39), 8th in strikeouts (136), 9th in winning percentage (.630), T-10th in opponent batting average (.224)

NFCA all-West Region second-team selection ... MWC Pitcher of the Year ... All-MWC selection ... Named to MWC all-tournament team ... Led the league in ERA (1.82) ... Was second in the conference in opponent batting average (.224), third in wins (17), fourth in innings pitched (169.0) and fifth in strikeouts (136) ... Did not allow an earned run in 15 of her 32 appearances including 10 of her 24 starts ... Completed 16 of the 25 games she started ... Went 8-2 with a 1.55 ERA in 67 2/3 innings of MWC play, and struck out 60 batters, while walking 10 ... Earned MWC Pitcher of the Week honors on April 4 ... Went 29 innings without giving up an earned run to start MWC play, her longest scoreless streak of the season ... Also had a 17-inning scoreless streak (Feb. 23-March 4) and a 11 1/3 inning streak to start the season from Feb. 9-Feb. 12 ... Did not allow an opposing runner to reach third base on four occasions ... Was 9-4 with a 1.20 ERA in home games and owned an impressive 6.64 strikeout-to-walk ratio ... From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West Conference has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MWC continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its ninth year, the MWC has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The MWC is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within MWC boundaries, including the majestic Rocky Mountain range, which borders four MWC schools (Utah, BYU, Air Force and Colorado State). The high plains of Wyoming contrast with the desert city of Las Vegas and the Pacific Ocean locale of San Diego State. The southwestern flavor of New Mexico complements the western heritage and culture of Fort Worth, Texas, home of the MWC's newest member, TCU.

History

The MWC was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, BYU, Colorado State, New Mexico, SDSU, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division I-A intercollegiate athletic conference.

The split from the former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long-standing athletic rivalries. Five of the MWC's eight original members have been conference rivals since the 1960s (BYU, Utah, New Mexico, Wyoming, Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longtime members as well. UNLV entered the fold in 1996 and TCU began its first year of competition in 2005-06, completing the membership in the MWC as it stands today.

2006-07 in Review

The MWC enjoyed another solid season in softball. Brigham Young won the conference to receive the league's automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. The Cougars advanced to the NCAA Regional final before falling to ninth-ranked and eventual NCAA Women's College World Series participant Arizona State. Brigham

Young went 16-4 in MWC play to lead the way and was followed by UNLV (12-8), Colorado State (9-10), New Mexico (9-11), San Diego State (8-12) and Utah (5-14). Overall, four of the six MWC teams - Brigham Young (43-20), UNLV (37-27), San Diego State (32-24) and Colorado State (30-28) posted winning records.

Exposure

On Aug. 26, 2004, College Sports Television (CSTV) and the MWC announced a visionary partnership that revolutionized the college sports landscape. The landmark agreement was the first NCAA Division I football and men's basketball conference-wide deal for CSTV. The advent of the new television model gives the fastest-growing independent cable network exclusive rights to all MWC events, including cable and satellite television coverage, national over-the-air and satellite radio, video-on-demand and online broadcast rights. The CSTV/MWC partnership has guaranteed greater levels of television exposure for all MWC sports and has resoundingly met the fundamental goals of more exposure, preferred start times and competition on select days of the week.

A succession of events since the fall of 2004 have improved the new television model, including the CBS purchase of CSTV, and the merger with Comcast to create The Mtn. — MountainWest Sports Network. The relationship with Comcast also delivered a new national broadcast partner in VERSUS. The MWC was the first exclusive college programming provider for the Comcast-owned entity, with football and both men's and women's basketball games, and is in more than 72 million homes.

In the summer of 2006, the centerpiece of this historic relationship was the launch of The Mtn. — the first sports net-

work dedicated to serving a single collegiate athletic conference 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. The Mtn. provides sports fans blanket coverage of MWC athletics across multiple sports, including football, men's and women's basketball, and men's and women's Olympic sports. The Mtn. features more than just live games and has added its own original programming. Fans get a comprehensive array of news, features and analysis about their favorite MWC teams and players. In 2006-07, more than 250 MWC events were shown live on The Mtn., CSTV and VERSUS. CSTV is currently available in over 65 million homes, while VERSUS is in more than 72 million households.

Opportunity

The MWC provides a first-class athletic and academic experience for over 4,000 student-athletes each year. The past five years, 12 MWC student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, and since the league's inception in 1999, an additional 16 student-athletes were named MWC Student-Athlete of the Year and awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships and two student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars.

Conference student-athletes are also given a voice regarding pertinent issues within the MWC and NCAA governance structure through representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). The MWC SAAC consists of 10 representatives; one student-athlete from each member institution and one faculty athletics representative. The committee reviews and reacts to legislation and to other topics referred by the league constituent groups or committees related to the student-athlete experience.
