THE STORY BEHIND THE CLASSIC

The San Diego State University Campbell/Cartier Classic is an annual event held in the memory of former Aztec softball players Susanne Campbell and Karin Cartier.

Campbell and Cartier lost their lives during the 1991 softball season in a single-car accident that took place in Rosarito, Mexico. It left a lasting mark on teammates, coaches and the program.

Campbell, a three-year starting catcher, was in her senior year. She had a .344 batting average, was an all-Western Athletic Conference selection and led the Aztecs in many offensive and defensive categories. She also set several single-season and career records and is among the top softball athletes to wear an SDSU uniform. Her jersey number (5) has been retired.

Cartier, a transfer pitcher from Hawai'i, had an excellent 1991 season at SDSU. She was emerging as a top pitcher and great hitter. Along with Campbell, Cartier was one of the strongest Aztecs in the weight room and possessed good leadership abilities and Division I playing experience.

To pay tribute to Susanne Campbell and Karin Cartier, the San Diego State softball team renamed the SDSU Spring Classic in 1994 to the Campbell/Cartier Classic in memory of their friendship and fine athletic ability. The 2004 tournament will be the 14th annual classic.

In honor of Susanne Campbell and Karin Cartier, an endowments fund has also been established bearing their names. The recipient of this annual scholarship is a student-athlete who is dedicated, has strong character, possesses leadership skills and demonstrates sportsmanship. About the MWC

ABOUT THE MOUNTAIN WEST

From its inception in 1999, the Mountain West Conference has been committed to excellence in intercollegiate athletics, while promoting the academic missions of its member institutions. Progressive in its approach, the MWC continues to cultivate opportunities for student-athletes to compete at the highest level, while fostering academic achievement and sportsmanship. Now in its sixth year, the MWC has been assertive in its involvement with the NCAA governance structure and has taken a leadership role in the overall administration of intercollegiate athletics.

The Mountain West Conference is noted for its geographic diversity. Some of the most beautiful terrain and landscapes in the nation can be found within Mountain West Conference boundaries, including the unparalleled Rocky Mountain range, which borders four MWC schools (Utah, BYU, Air Force and Colorado State). The high plains of Wyoming (elevation 7,220 feet - the highest Division I campus in the nation) contrast with the desert city of Las Vegas (the fastest growing metropolitan area in the West), the Pacific Ocean locale of San Diego State and the southwestern flavor of New Mexico.

The Mountain West Conference was conceived on May 26, 1998, when the presidents of eight institutions — Air Force, Brigham Young, Colorado State, New Mexico, San Diego State, UNLV, Utah and Wyoming — decided to form a new NCAA Division IA intercollegiate athletic conference.

The split from the former 16-team conference re-established continuity and stability among the membership within the new league and signaled the continuation of its tradition-rich, long standing athletic rivalries. Five of the MWC's eight members have been conference rivals since the 1960's (BYU, Utah, New Mexico, Wyoming, Colorado State), while San Diego State (1978) and Air Force (1980) were longstanding members as well. UNLV entered the fold in 1996, completing the membership in the MWC as it stands today.

Prior to opening it doors, an executive committee was established and named Craig Thompson commissioner. Thompson had less than nine months to name the new league, settle on a city to serve as the league's headquarters, find a television partner, arrange for bowl tie-ins, hire staff, and

develop a logo. When the MWC officially began operations on July 1, 1999, the new league had in place a sevenyear contract with ESPN, giving the broadcaster exclusive national television rights to MWC football and men's basketball; and three-year agreements to send the league's football champion to the Liberty Bowl and a second team to the Las Vegas Bowl. Thompson also arranged a third bowl tie-in each of the first three years (1999 Motor City, 2000 Silicon Valley, 2001 New Orleans) before securing a four-year deal with the Emerald Bowl in San Francisco in 2002.

In 2004, MWC member Utah became the first non-Bowl Championship Series team to be selected to a BCS bowl. The Utes appearance earned nearly \$1 million for all the conference member schools

EXPANSION

The MWC became a player in the changing landscape of intercollegiate athletics when it announced January 2004 that TCU would become the league's ninth member beginning with the 2005-06 athletic season. As realignment swept through several NCĂA Division I conferences, the MWC remained focused in its mission and objectives, strengthening its membership for the road ahead.

EXPOSURE

The MWC established a comprehensive television package to promote its sports, anchored in a partnership with ESPN. Currently in the sixth year of a seven-year deal, ESPN holds exclusive rights to MWC football and men's basketball, distributing the league's football and men's basketball games through ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 and syndication via ESPN Regional Television. MWC men's basketball is also featured in ESPN's Big Monday lineup.

Through the league's first five years, excluding institutional local packages, 423 football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball events have aired on television, with 95 football games and over 85 men's basketball contests broadcast nation-

The MWC was one of only three leagues (Big Ten, SEC) to televise all women's basketball conference tournament games in 2004 and one of only seven conferences with multiple appearances on ESPN2. In women's volleyball, the MWC was the only league to televise all matches live from its conference tournament and ranked third (behind the Big Ten and Pac-10) in total regional/national appearances for 2003.

With the advent of MWC Television Network, the in-house production entity of the MWC, and the league's partnership with College Sports Television (CSTV), the MWC assured itself of a wide-range of television exposure for various Olympic sports. The MWC-TV Network includes a combination of over-the-air cable affiliates and local outlets throughout the Rocky Mountain region and western United States, while CSTV is available via DirecTV and numerous cable entities.

EDUCATION INITIATIVES

Not only is the MWC committed to the highest academic standards for its member institutions, the league also launched an education initiative utilizing the platform of college athletics to provide a relevant teaching resource for K-8th students. This web-based learning program is available to every public and private, elementary and middle school in the six-state MWC region, impacting more that 6.5 million students. Designed by Learning Through

Inc., "Kid's Sports, College" captivates and motivates children using their favorite sports with Mountain West teams and mascots reinforcing skills taught in the classroom.

ACADEMIC CONSORTIUM

From the outset, the MWC's member institutions were committed to

creating academic relationships, as well as athletic competition. To that end, the chief academic officers of each institution meet on an annual basis and have

explored academic exchange programs, library crossovers and shared research. In addition, the faculty athletics representatives routinely provide academic assistance and test-taking services

for student-athletes visiting from fellow member institutions for competition.

OPPORTUNITY

The MWC provides a first-class athletic and academic experience for over 4,000 student-athletes each year. The past three years, nine MWC student-athletes have earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships, and since the league's inception in 1999, an additional 10 student-athletes were named MWC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and awarded league-sponsored postgraduate scholarships. Two student-athletes have earned distinction as Rhodes Scholars (Jessica Mellinger, Wyoming and Delavane Diaz. Air Force).

Conference student-athletes are also given a voice regarding pertinent issues within the MWC and NCAA governance structure through representation on the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. The Mountain West Conference SAAC consists of nine representatives; one student-athlete from each member institution and one faculty athletics representative. The committee reviews and reacts to legislation and to other topics referred by the Conference constituent groups or committees related to the student-athlete experience. On a national level, a Mountain West Conference representative has chaired the NCAA SAAC since January 2003.
