San Diego State is 3-3 in its four previous Mountain West Conference Championships. The Aztecs won the league title as the five seed in 2002. The Aztecs .500 record is tied for the third best record among the eight teams in the league. Last season, Colorado State won the tournament as the number six seed.

Sixth-Seeded Aztecs Battle Utah for the Second Time in Six Days; Play Third-Seeded Utes in MWC Championship Quarterfinals

For the second time in as many years, San Diego State's quarterfinal opponent in the Mountain West Conference Championships is the same team it ended the regular season with as the sixth-seeded Aztecs (14-15 overall; 5-9 Mountain West Conference) battle third-seeded Utah (21-8; 9-5 MWC) on Thursday afternoon in the first game of the league tournament.

Game time at the Pepsi Center in Denver is scheduled for 1 p.m. MST (noon PST) and the game will be televised by ESPN+Plus.

The two teams met in the regular-season finale on Saturday, with the Utes claiming a 66-53 victory over the Aztecs. Utah shot 52.4 percent from the field, including a 64.7 percent after intermission, which represented the highest field goal percentage allowed in a half by SDSU this season. San Diego State outscored Utah from the floor 50-49, but couldn't overcome a 17-3 disadvantage at the free-throw line.

San Diego State was paced by senior forward Aerick Sanders, who recorded his 12th double-double of the season and the 14th of his career with 20 points and 12 rebounds, both game highs. It was his ninth 20-point scoring effort of the season. Junior forward Chris Walton also ended the contest in double figures with 10 points and four rebounds. Utah was led by Tim Frost with 19 points and eight rebounds and Nick Jacobson with 16 points.

Last season the Aztecs played UNLV in both the regular-season finale and the MWC Tournament quarterfinal game.

In what many thought would be a rebuilding year for the Aztecs, San Diego State has given a glimpse of a bright future. After losing the top four scorers off last season's team and being picked in for sixth in the preseason poll by league media, San Diego State blended one returning starter, with a transfer point guard, a junior coming off a redshirt season and two true freshmen to form the starting five for the 2003-04 season. Aztecs Earn MWC Recognition

A school-record tying four San Diego State players earned recognition on Monday as the Mountain West Conference announced its award winners.

Senior Aerick Sanders was named to the second team. The forward is averaging team-highs in points (16.0) and rebounds (10.0), has 12 double-doubles this season, has earned the conference player of the week honors a league-high tying three times and is trying to become the first Aztec since Michael Cage (1983-84) to average a double-double.

Sanders joins Randy Holcomb (first team), Al Faux (2nd team) and Tony Bland (2nd team) as the only SDSU players to earn first or second team honors in the five season history of the league.

Three San Diego State players earned honorable mention. Junior guard Wesley Stokes, freshman forward Marcus Slaughter and freshman guard Brandon Heath all earned honorable mention accolades.

With four players earning recognition, the 2003-04 squad matches the school-record set last season.

is an Aztecs squad that has won 14 games for the fourth straight season for the first time since recording 14 or more victories in the five seasons from 1980-81 to 1984-85. In the 15 seasons between the two streaks, San Diego State reached the 14-victory plateau just one time. San Diego State finished the season tied for fifth place in the league.

The win total could be higher. San Diego State lost four conference road games by four points or less or in overtime (at Colorado State, at Utah, at Brigham Young and at UNLV).

Series history is not on the side of the Aztecs. Utah leads the all-time series 45-9 and swept the season series this season, claiming a 65-61 decision in Salt Lake City on Feb. 7 and 66-53 at Cox Arena last Saturday. The Utes have won 17 of the last 18 meetings between the teams and four of the five games all-time that occurred in postseason. It is worth noting that all five of the postseason games between the teams were in the WAC tournament and two of the five games were contested in Salt Lake City.

The winner of the Utah-San Diego State will meet the Brigham Young-Wyoming winner on Friday at 7 p.m. MST (6 p.m. PST).

Hot Shooting Leads Utah to 66-53 Win on Senior Day

SAN DIEGO - Senior Aerick Sanders scored 20 points and pulled down 12 rebounds in his final regular season game at Cox Arena, but it was not enough to beat visiting Utah

as the Aztecs dropped a 66-53 decision on Saturday.

The game went back and forth with nine lead changes and four ties in the first 15 minutes. However, after Sanders went to the bench with three fouls with 4:24 left in the first half, Utah took advantage, going on a 11-2 run to end the first half up 33-23.

The Utes slowly built an 18-point lead with 7:27 left to play, but Sanders led a late 10-1 run as the Aztecs chopped the lead to nine at 59-50 with 4:42 left.

An offensive put back by Tim Frost after a missed free throw put the Utes back up by double figures, and they held a comfortable lead in the remaining minutes.

Frost scored 14 of his 19 points in the second half to secure the win, while Nick Jacobson added 16 for the Utes.

With the victory, Utah (21-8, 9-5 Mountain West) clinched second place in the conference. San Diego State (14-15, 5-9) will meet Utah again Thursday in the quarter-finals of the conference tournament in Denver.

Chris Walton scored 10 points for the Aztecs, who were outscored from the free throw line 17-3. Wesley Stokes added five assists and four steals.

▶ SDSU allowed Utah to shoot 52.4% from the field, only the fifth time this season an Aztec opponent has shot over the 50% mark.

▶ SDSU was outscored 17-to-3 from the free throw line against the Utes. The Aztecs have been outscored 44-15 at the line over the last three games.

▶ AERICK SANDERS finished with his 12th double-double of the season and 14th of his career with a game high 20 points and 12 rebounds... It was the 13th time this season he has recorded 10+ rebounds and 24th time in his career... He also has 24 double-digit scoring games this season, including 20 of his last 21 games... It was the eighth time he has scored at least 20 points and the team-leading 12th time he has topped the Aztecs in scoring... Sanders made his 59th consecutive start in his 108th career game at SDSU... With 59 straight starts, Sanders moves past Myron Epps into fifth place on the consecutive start list (Cage holds the SDSU record at 112).

▶ CHRIS WALTON scored 10 points, his 10th double-digit scoring game this year.

The Utah Series

► San Diego State and Utah are meeting for the 55th all-time game between the schools, with Utah owning a 45-9 advantage including a 4-1 advantage in the postseason.

► All five of the postseason meetings between the teams came while Utah and San Diego State were in the Western Athletic Conference. The Aztecs won the first postseason encounter between the teams in 1986. The Utes have won the four encounters since then (1989, 1991, 1993 and 1995). The five postseason games between the teams include three games decided by nine or fewer points including a two-point Aztec victory in '86 and a one-point Utes victory in '91.

► The Aztecs' win on Jan. 18, 2003 over Utah at Cox Arena snapped a 14-game overall losing streak to the Utes. Since that game the Aztecs have dropped three straight to the Utes, giving Utah 17 wins in the last 18 encounters. Earlier this season, Utah claimed a 65-61 decision on Feb. 7 at the Huntsman Center and a 66-53 victory at Cox Arena last Saturday. The four-point loss in Salt Lake City is one of four conference losses SDSU has suffered by four points or less or in overtime.

► The series traditionally has not been all that close. The Utes claimed seven straight victories by 13 or more points from Feb. 17, 1996 to Feb. 10, 2001. Since that time there have been three games decided by a total of 12 points. In fact, three of the last six games between Utah and San Diego State have been decided by six points or less.

► The Aztecs' active leading scorer against the Utes is senior forward Aerick Sanders with 46 points in seven career games. The entire Aztecs roster has 171 career points against the Utes. Nick Jacobsen alone has 108 points vs.

Fisher's squads defeated the Utes 81-65 on Dec. 1, 1990 in Ann Arbor, Mich., and 73-69 in the third-place game of the 1994 Maui Classic in Lahaina, Hawaii. That victory over the Utes in Maui was Fisher's 125th career victory.

Earlier Meeting this Season

SALT LAKE CITY, UTAH - Nick Jacobson scored 10 consecutive points as part of a 21-5 Utah run as the Utes defeated San Diego State, 65-61 on Saturday afternoon at the Huntsman Center.

It was the 22nd consecutive victory for the Utes over the Aztecs in Salt Lake City, and 21st straight win for Utah over SDSU at the Huntsman Center.

San Diego State did not trail in the first 28:46 of the game, and led by as many as eight points in the second half at 38-30 with 17:35 to play.

The Aztecs led 42-35 with 15:41 left, when the Utes went on the 21-5 spurt over the next 9:38 to take a nine-point lead.

San Diego State battled back and trailed by just four points with 4:31 left. The Aztecs got the ball back and missed two shots from the field and the front end of a one-and-one before the Utes pushed the advantage back to nine with 2:30 to play.

Once again the Aztecs made a run, cutting the lead to three points on two occasions in the final minutes. SDSU missed four field goals and a free throw in the final 55 seconds.

Richard Chaney had 17 points, while Jacobson added 16 points for the Utes. San Diego State had four players in double figures, paced by Chris Walton's career-high 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting. Freshman Brandon Heath connected on four three-point field goals en route to 14 points.

The four-point margin of defeat marked the closest the Aztecs had played the Utes in Salt Lake City since a 93-89 overtime loss on Jan. 10, 1986.

Conference Tournament Time

► San Diego State's conference tournament history dates back to the 1976 Pacific Coast Athletic Association Tournament. In their first postseason league bracket, San Diego State won the PCAA Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Tournament. It is one of three titles SDSU has claimed in postseason conference competition. SDSU has won league tournament titles in three different conferences: the 1976 PCAA, the 1985 Western Athletic Conference and the 2002 Mountain West Conference.

► San Diego State's 3-3 record in the Mountain West Tournament is third best in the league, trailing only the 7-2 record of UNLV (which has played every game on its home court) and Brigham Young's 6-3 mark.

► San Diego State has a cumulative record of 17-16 in conference-tournament play, including a 3-3 record in the Mountain West Conference. Along with three championships....

► San Diego State enters the 2004 Mountain West Tournament as a sixth seed. It will be SDSU's third post-season appearance as a sixth seed. In its two previous appearances as a sixth seed, San Diego State is 2-0 in the opening round. In 1986, as a sixth seed, the Aztecs upset No. 3 Utah, 73-71, before losing in the semifinals to second-seed Texas-El Paso in the WAC Tournament. In 1998, in its last appearance as a sixth seed, the Aztecs upset Mountain Division No. 3 Wyoming, 60-57, in overtime. In the quarterfinals, the Aztecs lost to Fresno State. Overall, SDSU is 2-2 as a sixth seed.

► The Aztecs are 7-13 all-time in conference-tournament play when playing a higher seed. In 2002, San Diego State won the conference tournament as a five seed.

► The Aztecs and Utes have never met in the Mountain West Tournament. However, SDSU is 1-4 all-time against Utah in postseason play. SDSU's only win came as a No. 6 seed when it defeated No. 3 Utah, 73-71, in 1986, in Laramie.

► The Aztecs have a nice 13-6 record in opening-round games.

You Take the Good, You Take The Bad

Although San Diego State is flirting with .500 this season, the Aztecs have several statistics that are anything but middle of the road.

If it is steals, forcing turnovers, limiting its own turnovers or turnover margin the Aztecs are among the best. On the other hand, SDSU has struggled this season getting to the free throw line and connecting from the field.

Below is a look at the good and the bad 29 games into the season.

The Good:

► San Diego State's 239 steals are the most since recording 254 thefts in 1995-96 season.

► San Diego State owns a positive rebound and turnover margin for the third consecutive year. The last time the Aztecs were plus in both numbers in three straight seasons was 1982-83, 1983-84 and 1984-85.

The Bad:

► San Diego State's 524 free-throw attempts this season is its lowest in a season since the 1976-77 season when the Aztecs attempted 502. Oddly enough, the Aztecs have their highest shooting percentage from the line since 1996-97 campaign.

► San Diego State's 42.6 percent shooting from the field is the lowest since the Aztecs shot 40.9 percent in 1999-00.

► San Diego State's 32.0 percent shooting from three-point range is the lowest since connecting on just 29.9 percent from beyond the arc in 1999-00

Avoiding the Four-Game Streak

Just four seasons ago, in Steve Fisher's first campaign at San Diego State, the Aztecs ended the season with a 17-game losing streak. Since the end of the 1999-2000 season, the Aztecs have suffered through just one losing streak of four or more games (a five-game losing streak in February 2001).

The Aztecs have gone 100 consecutive games without losing more than three consecutive games. Five times during that stretch, SDSU has snapped a three-game losing streak with a victory.

March is Our Month

Few coaches have had as much success during the month of March as Steve Fisher. The Aztec head coach has a 45-28 record (61.6 percent) during the month and his teams are 19-5 at home during the month of March.

The Aztecs are looking to close the regular season out strong for the third straight season. In 2002, SDSU won five of its last six regular season games and in 2003, the Aztecs won three of the last five regular season games despite playing three of the final five games on the road.

Despite coaching 83 games in the month, only once has a Steve Fisher coached team lost three consecutive games

during the month. That was in Fisher's first season at SDSU (1999-00). SDSU is 0-2 this season during the month.

Among the National Leaders

Official NCAA statistics through the games of Monday, March 1, show Aerick Sanders and Wesley Stokes continuing to place well on the national charts (numbers below are current averages).

Sanders, who led the nation in rebounding for a day back in December, is currently 13th nationally in rebounding (10.0) and 39th in the country in field goal percentage (55.5).

Meanwhile, Stokes, who leads the conference in both assists and steals, is 27th nationally in assists per game at 5.8.

Sanders Earns NABC Honor

San Diego State forward Aerick Sanders' outstanding play during his senior season has been recognized by the National Association of Basketball Coaches as he was selected to the District 13 First Team.

Sanders currently leads the Aztecs in scoring and rebounding averaging 16.0 points and 10.0

rebounds per game. He is the only Aztec to start every game, has led the squad in scoring a team high 12 times, including a career high 34 points against Portland, and is shooting 55.7 percent from the field. As of Monday, March 1st, Sanders' rebounding totals rank 13th in the country, while his shooting percent is the 39th best in NCAA Division I. Overall, Sander ranks in the top seven of five Mountain West Conference statistical categories and in the top 13 of seven league categories.

Sanders joins elite company as Michael Cage in 1982 and 1983, and Randy Holcomb in 2002 are the only Aztecs to ever earn Division I NABC first team honors. This is the third straight season SDSU has earned all-district plaudits, however, as Tony Bland was a second team selection last year. This is the ninth all-district selection for the Aztecs since beginning Division I play in 1970.

We Hate the Run

San Diego State is enjoying yet another successful season under Steve Fisher. Despite losing the top four scorers off last season's team and being pegged for sixth by the media in the Mountain West Conference, the Aztecs have posted a 14-15 record against the most difficult schedule in school history.

Nonetheless, it is tough to look back and think what could have been. In 10 of San Diego State's 15 defeats a critical second-half run by the opponent has spelled disaster for the Aztecs. The runs have varied in length from 2:45 to 13:27, but the results have been similar.

Below is a look at the runs San Diego State would just as soon forget. The difference between 14-15, 24-5 or somewhere in between.

Same Time Next Year

Get use to the San Diego State team you see on the court this season because nearly the entire team is back. The Aztecs have just two seniors, starting forward Aerick Sanders and fifth-year former walk-on Ben Wardrop.

Despite the contributions of Sanders, who ranks among the top 13 of seven different statistical categories, the Aztecs are scheduled to return 77.2 percent of their scoring, 68.4 percent of their rebounding, 91.4 percent of the assists and 82.0 percent of the minutes played.

Both freshmen on this season's squad - Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter are making major contributions and are quickly moving up the school's freshman charts (page 39).

Below is a look at the breakdown of stats by class. The junior class made up of Wesley Stokes, Chris Walton, Tommy Johnson, Chris Manker and Travis Hanour (currently out with an injury) make up a strong portion of the returning numbers.

The Aztecs are scheduled to return eight of their top nine scorers next season. By contrast, SDSU lost its top four point producers from last season.

Find A Way

A common phrase used to describe the 2003-04 San Diego State basketball is "find a way," as in find a way to win. In many of the Aztec victories this season, San Diego State has overcome nearly insurmountable statistical disadvantages to win games.

Overall, the Aztecs have posted an 14-15 record against the most challenging schedule in school history despite NCAA statistical rankings that would

Diego State was well below .500 (see right box.).

But Steve Fisher's squad, which has only one scholarship senior (Ben Wardrop made it two when he was placed on scholarship for the second semester) and lost the top four scorers off last season's NIT squad has proven time and time again to find a way to win. Below is a look at some of the numbers the Aztecs have overcome to win games this season.

► Long Beach State (W, 74-44) - San Diego State shoots 37.9 percent from the field and has a -8 rebound margin but limits the 49ers to 44 points, 16 field goals and forces 26 turnovers.

► Ohio State (W, 83-61) - Aztecs shoot 38.6 percent from the floor but use a +2 edge in rebounds, a +8 turnover margin and outscore the Buckeyes 26-11 at the free-throw line to win.

► Portland (W, 67-61) - Atecs shoot 39.3 percent from the field and commit two more turnovers than the Pilots. SDSU outrebounds Portland 44-27 to mark the first time in the Steve Fisher the Aztecs shoot less than 40 percent and commit more turnovers and still win a game (1-18 in those games).

► Iowa State (W, 86-76) - San Diego State is outrebounded 39-28 but still win. The Aztecs -11 rebound margin is the second worst in a victory during Fisher's five seasons. SDSU ties a Cox Arena record for fewest turnovers with seven while recording nine steals to overcome an 11-point deficit for the win.

► Brigham Young (W, 65-61) - Aztecs shoot 37.9 percent from the field, 30.0 percent from three-point range and have a -6 rebound margin. Nonetheless, the Aztecs force 17 turnovers while committing just seven of their own in picking up the win. It marked the only time in Steve Fisher's five seasons that SDSU has shot less than 40 percent from the field, had fewer free throw attempts and won the game.

► UNLV (W, 83-78) - UNLV has an advantage in field goal percentage, free throws made and rebounding. The Rebels shoot 51.9 percent from the field, yet San Diego State ties a then MWC school record with 12 steals and forces 22 Rebel turnovers to win.

► Wyoming (W, 74-66) - The Aztecs shoot 34.4 percent from the field, including 8-of-28 from the floor in the second half (28.6 percent) and are out-rebounded 46-40. SDSU is +10 in the turnover margin and records 12 steals in the victory.

► Colorado State (W, 72-64) - Once again San Diego State is outshot from the floor (49.0-47.4) but has just nine turnovers and uses eight steals to help force CSU in to 14 turnovers.

On the season, San Diego State has defied the numbers to win several times. Below is a look at the Aztecs situational record in Fisher's first four seasons vs. this season.

This Program Keeps Building and Building

Steve Fisher and the Aztecs' journey from perennial basement dweller to a team that has made two straight appearances in the postseason is made all the more remarkable by the speed at which the turnaround was achieved.

Just four years ago in 1999-2000, the Aztecs won only five games, and three years ago in 2000-01, San Diego State finished seventh in the conference.

As if going from 5-23 in 1999-00 to 14-14 in 2000-01 was not enough, in the 2001-02 season the Aztecs went 21-12 for the second-highest win total in the school's Division I history and the 2002-03 Aztecs returned to the postseason and finished 16-14.

▶ San Diego State is now 51-41 (55.4 percent) since the beginning of the 2001-02 season and 65-55 (54.2 percent) since the start of the 2000-01 campaign. Remember, the Aztecs averaged 9.8 wins per season in the 15 years from 1986-87 through 1999-00, with just one winning season during that stretch. In those 15 years, SDSU was 147-281 (34.3 percent) and failed to advance to postseason play.

▶ San Diego State is now 19-38 in its last 57 road/neutral games since the beginning of the 2001-02 campaign. Those 19 road/neutral wins equals the total from the 91 road/neutral games prior to the 2000-01 season when they went 19-72.

Below is a look at the Aztecs' records since the start of the 2000-01 campaign. The record on the right shows how many games it took San Diego State to win the same number of games prior to the 2000-01 season.

Good Losses

Although it is never good to suffer a loss, the six non-conference teams that have handed San Diego State a loss this season are a pretty impressive group.

Dayton, Troy State, Texas Tech, Arizona, Washington and Saint Mary's have combined to post a 120-51 record through Saturday's games. Three of the six teams - Texas Tech, Dayton and Arizona - have been nationally ranked at one point this season and all six teams have a winning record.

The Aztecs have been impressive in several of the defeats. Below is a look at each of the four teams to top San Diego State this season (records and RPI through Saturday).

▶ Dayton (22-7, 41 RPI) - San Diego State trailed for just 23:32 of the contest and enjoyed a six-point second-half lead. The Aztecs led 59-54 with 6:49 to play and the game was tied inside of the two minute mark.

▶ Troy State (24-6, 65 RPI) - Troy State hit 19 three-point field goals, the fourth most by any team in a NCAA Division I game this season. SDSU led by as many as five point in the game and there were four ties and four lead changes in the second half.

▶ Texas Tech (21-9, 33 RPI) - San Diego State led by as many as eight points in the contest. Texas Tech's lead was two with 6:47 to play and the Red Raider advantage was four points with 4:36 remaining.

▶ Arizona (18-8, 35 RPI) - San Diego State trailed by just seven points with 14:51 left before the Wildcats went on a 15-0 run. Nonetheless, the Aztecs responded by outscoring Arizona 30-20 the rest of the way.

▶ Washington (17-10, 73 RPI) - Teams exchanged the lead 17 times and had 11 ties in the first half. San Diego State cut a 15-point second-half deficit to four points on three occasions before falling.

▶ Saint Mary's (18-11, 116 RPI) - Saint Mary's is 5-1 at home. The Aztecs trailed the entire second half, but cut deficit to one point before losing. Saint Mary's outscored the Aztecs 27-12 at the free throw line.

The Difference Between Winning and Losing

Want to know if San Diego State is going to win? Following three statistical trends may provide the answer. Three-point field goal percentage, rebounds and points from free throws have been three keys to victory for SDSU throughout the year.



Sanders One of the Nations' Top Rebounders



As we head into the final stretch of the regular season, San Diego State's lone scholarship senior is posting some eye-popping numbers worthy of consideration for conference, regional and national honors.

In addition to earning three Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors this season and earning a spot on the 2003 EA Sports Maui Invitational all-Tournament team (the only player selected from a team that did not reach the championship game), he has also been listed among the nation's leading rebounders.

Through last Monday's games, Sanders was ninth nationally in rebounds per game and 39th in the nation in field goal percentage.

Sanders, who entered the season never having recorded consecutive double-figure scoring games, is averaging 16.0 points, 10.0 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game. He has posted 12 double-doubles this season and has 10+ points in 20 of his last 21 games.

In addition, the Aztecs' lone returning starter from last season has made 59 consecutive starts dating back to last season. Other statistical information on Sanders:

▶ Sanders has 105 career blocked shots, good for 4th place in SDSU history (Leonard Allen holds the school record at 214).

▶ Sanders' 59 career starts are good for fifth place in SDSU history for most consecutive career starts (Michael Cage holds the record at 112).

▶ He is seventh in school history in career field goal percentage having connected on 54.0 percent of his attempts.

▶ He is seventh in career rebounds with 681, just 81 rebounds shy of third place.

▶ Maybe most impressive has been Sanders' overall efficiency. Utilizing the NBA definition of efficiency (efficiency = ((PTS + REB + AST + STL + BLK) - ((FGA - FGM) + (FTA - FTM) + TO)) / G), Sanders is having one of the greatest seasons in school history.

Below is a look at the best single-seasons based on the formula above. Sanders is currently rated as having the fourth best single-season by an Aztec player. Aztec great Michael Cage has three of the top five rated seasons entering the 2003-04 campaign.

After his remarkable performance in the Maui Invitational, ESPN analyst Jay Bilas called Sanders the best rebounder on the island. He wrote, "Sanders is a relentless rebounder who makes hustle plays and is always around the ball. He is long, athletic, and a workhorse that pursues the ball out of his area. He had 21 points and 18 rebounds against Dayton, a team that can rebound, and proved to me that he is among the best rebounders in the nation when he goes after it."

Sanders and Cox - A Tough Combo

As impressive as Sanders has been overall this season, the senior has been particularly tough at Cox Arena. In 15 home games this season, he is averaging 18.6 points and 9.8 rebounds. Most remarkable, is the senior is shooting a red-hot 63.0 percent from the field, having connected on 114-of-181 field goal attempts.

His remarkable shooting resulted in tying an arena record against Cal Poly for field-goal percentage in a game (9-for-10). He then preceded to match the school record and break the arena record in the very next game by connecting on all 11 of his field goal attempts. Against Portland, Sanders posted a new career high with 34 points on 13-of-20 shooting and 8-of-11 from the free throw line. In the contest against UNLV, Sanders connected on 10-of-11 field goal attempts en route to a 23-point, 10-rebound performance. In his last home games, Sanders posted his 12th double-double of the season with 20 points and 12 rebounds against Utah.

Heath Climbing Freshman Charts



Brandon Heath continues to make a major impact in his freshman campaign at San Diego State.

A native of Los Angeles, Heath became just the eighth freshman to start a season opening game for Steve Fisher. He is second on the team in scoring, averaging 13.8 points per contest and has shown the ability to post big games (30 at Texas Tech, 28 vs. Ohio State and 27 at San Diego) while showing tremendous consistency (he has scored in double figures in 20 of his 29 college games).

In addition to placing second on the team in scoring, he also ranked among the conference leaders in steals (40) as he has earned a reputation as a strong defensive player.

ESPN analyst Jay Bilas called Heath the best on-ball defender in the Maui Invitational. He went on to write, "Heath is an absolute ballhawk, who can put great pressure on the ball. He is quick, athletic and has a tenacity that marks a great defender. He is still young and learning how to best defend, but he can be a terrific player. Heath had 28 points against Ohio State, and has the chance to be an outstanding player."

In 29 games Heath is already climbing the Aztecs freshmen charts. He is currently second among Aztec freshmen in total points, second in three-point field goals, third in steals and fifth in games started and fourth in minutes played among Aztec freshmen.

His 13.8 scoring average would rank third on the all-time SDSU freshman chart, below is a look at the top five.

Brigham Young, Heath tallied four points, including a go-ahead three-point field goal, and two steals in the final 91 seconds as the Aztecs defeated the Cougars 65-61. He also hit a three to force a second overtime at Colorado State with less than 10 seconds remaining in the first overtime.

Sanders Claims Fourth Mountain West Conference Player of the Week Honor

San Diego State senior forward Aerick Sanders averaged 26.0 points and 11.5 rebounds the week ending Jan. 5 en route to his third Mountain West Conference Men's Basketball Player of the Week honor of the season. Sanders becomes just the third player ever to win three MWC POW awards in the same season, and ties Michael Cage for the most awards for an Aztec.

Overall, Sanders shot 61.3 percent (19-of-31) from the field and 73.7 percent (14-of-19) from the free throw line, while blocking four shots and recording five steals in the Aztecs' victories over Portland (67-61) and Iowa State (86-76).

Sanders joins Cage as the only player from SDSU to have three conference POW honors in the same season as Cage earned three from the WAC in 1984. The two are also tied for the most POW awards by an Aztec in a career with four. Sanders joins UNLV's Marcus Banks in 2002-03 and Kaspars Kambala in 1999-2000 as the only individuals to receive the honor three times from the MWC in the same season.

Sanders, a Carson, Calif. (Gardena Serra HS) native, collected his fifth double-double of the year with a career-high 34 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Portland. The 34 points is an MWC individual high this season. He shot 13-of-20 from the field and hit 8-of-11 free throws against the Pilots.

In the 10-point win over Iowa State, Sanders had 18 points, a team-high nine rebounds, a career-high four steals, two assists and two blocked shots in 39 minutes of action. The senior connected on 6-of-11 shots from the field and 6-of-8 from the line. With the Aztecs trailing by a point at the half, Sanders posted 12 points and five rebounds in the second half. The Aztecs trailed 44-43 with 14:44 left before SDSU used a 13-2 run to take control of the game. Sanders had six points and an assist during that key run to seal the victory.

Finishing Third in Maui is a Good Start

100 Games in Cox Arena and Beyond

San Diego State's matchup against Portland on on Dec. 31 was the Aztecs' 100th game in Cox Arena with the game against Utah marking the 108th in the building. The count includes regular-season games and the post-season NIT, but does not count exhibition games.

The Aztecs have posted three consecutive winning seasons in the building and are 11-4 this season marking the fourth straight season SDSU has recorded double-digit victories at home.

After posting a 16-28 record in the first 44 contests in the facility, San Diego State has gone an impressive 46-18 since.

Rarely Once, Hardly Ever Twice

Steve Fisher, now in his 13th full-season as a head coach, has compiled a rather impressive 72-12 record in non-conference home games. That includes a 35-9 mark at the helm of the Aztecs.

Only one non-conference opponent has defeated a Fisher-led club more than one time on the road. That team is Duke.

Fisher's 12 non-conference home defeats have come to Arizona, Ball State, Cal State Fullerton, Duke (twice), Eastern Washington, Pennsylvania, San Diego, Southern California, Texas Tech, Troy State, and Washington.

In addition, only three non-Mountain West Conference teams have defeated the Aztecs more than one time in Cox Arena (Fresno State, San Diego and USC).

A Rare Double

For just the second time in school history, San Diego State defeated Brigham Young and UNLV at home in the same season.

The only other time it occurred was in 1982, when the Aztecs defeated Brigham Young 80-66 on Jan. 28 and UNLV 81-68 on Feb. 6. That SDSU squad finished the season with a 20-9 record and advanced to the postseason NIT.

A First Time for Everything

Getting back to the Portland game for a second. San Diego State won despite shooting less than 40 percent from the field and committing more turnovers, marking the first time in 19 such games during the Fisher era that SDSU claimed a victory when those two negative stats

occurred.

Aztec Tidbits

- ▶ San Diego State ranks 68th nationally in fewest turnovers per game at 13.6. The Aztecs were ranked 190 in 2001-02 and 177 in 2002-03 in that category.
- ▶ In the Aztecs' five conference wins, SDSU has turned the ball over 49 times (9.8 tpg). In nine league losses, SDSU has 119 turnovers (14.4 tpg).
- ▶ San Diego State is 13-4 this season when committing fewer turnovers and 1-11 when committing the same or more turnovers.
- ▶ The Aztecs have lost eight consecutive games in which it has not had an advantage in the turnover category.
- ▶ San Diego State is 12-6 this season when allowing less than 76 points, 2-2 when allowing between 76-78 points and 0-7 when allowing more than 78 points.
- ▶ San Diego State is 11-3 this season when its opponent scores first (3-12 when the Aztecs score the first basket).
- ▶ San Diego State is a remarkable 8-10 when its opponent has a higher field goal percentage. The Aztecs are 6-5 when having an advantage in field goal percentage.
- ▶ San Diego State has won 28 of 29 games when leading with five minutes to play in regulation.
- ▶ In the nine conference losses, San Diego State has led a total of one hour, 46 minutes and 41 seconds.
- ▶ San Diego State is 11-4 this season when Wesley Stokes points, rebounds and assists add up to 20 or more.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 6-4 when Chris Walton scores in double figures.
- ▶ San Diego State has shot 40.0 percent or less from the field in four of its last six games.
- ▶ The Aztecs have made nine of its last 38 attempts from three-point range (23.7 percent).
- ▶ San Diego State has made 15 free throws in the last three games. The Aztecs have been outscored from the line 44-15 in that span.

Sometimes there are no adjectives. Sometimes the phrases don't do justice. Sometimes you just stick with the basic facts and let them tell the story. A five-win season followed by a 14-win season. A 14-win season followed by 21 wins, a conference championship and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. An NCAA Tournament appearance followed by a third-straight .500 or better season, a second consecutive trip to the postseason and the first Division I postseason victory in school history.

In four short seasons, Steve Fisher has changed the outlook, fortunes and expectations of San Diego State basketball. The Aztecs have been transformed from the ugly duckling that muddled through the first-ever Mountain West Conference campaign with an 0-14 record into a conference champion. It is a school that now regularly goes toe-to-toe with the west's best basketball programs on the court and in the recruiting wars. It may be the new program on the block but seniority rarely matters in the changing world of college athletics.

It is now Steve Fisher's program. When Fisher arrived on the scene, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were in place all right. The Aztecs were expected and expecting to lose. The year before his arrival San Diego State won just four games.

The hiring only dates back to March of 1999, so referring to the "Steve Fisher Era" at San Diego State might be considered a bit premature. But with the Aztec banner now flying over the Mountain West Conference, there is little doubt that San Diego State basketball has reached a new level.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament

history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at the University of Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Company raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led San Diego State back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

SAN DIEGO - After a slow start, San Diego State used an 18-0 run midway through the first half to take control and the Aztecs' never looked back winning their season opener 74-44 over Long Beach State at Cox Arena. Freshman Marcus Slaughter came off the bench to score a game-high 19 points.

Junior Wesley Stokes also had a solid debut for SDSU as he contributed 17 points and six assists in his first game with the Aztecs.

San Diego State didn't record a field goal until four minutes into the game, but the 18-0 run made the score 25-5. Slaughter made three 3-point shots from the baseline during the run and Stokes made another.

Stokes' most impressive play came late in the first half when he stole the ball from Kevin Roberts, led a 2-on-1 break and made an alley-oop pass to Slaughter, who made a slam dunk for a 34-11 lead.

Slaughter's debut put him in good company. The 19 points in a season opener is matched only by Chris Webber for freshmen who have played for Steve Fisher.

SDSU held the 49ers to just 21.4 percent shooting in the first half and 29.1 percent for the game. LBSU's 44 points is the fewest allowed by the Aztecs since they held Air Force to 43 on Jan. 20, 2001. In addition, the 30-point margin of victory is the largest in a season opener since 2000 when they defeated UCSD by 32.

MAUI - The San Diego State backcourt of Brandon Heath and Wesley Stokes combined for 50 points and the Aztecs connected on 13 3-pointers in an 83-61 victory over Ohio State on Monday night in the opening round of the Maui Invitational.

Heath had 28 points and was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc, while Stokes had 22 points and was 4-for-6 on 3s.

The game was tied 32-all at halftime and the Aztecs were in it only because of their long-range shooting. They were 7-for-14 from beyond the 3-point arc in the first half and 2-for-14 from inside it. SDSU finished the game 13-for-22 (59.1 percent) on three-point field goals.

Ohio State led 37-35 two minutes into the second half when the Aztecs took over with a 21-1 run that broke open the game. Heath had three of San Diego State's five 3-pointers in the run.

Ohio State missed four shots and turned the ball over five times in that span and its only point came on a free throw by Velimir Radinovic, who missed three other foul shots in the run.

San Diego State improves to 2-0 for the first time since the 2000-01 campaign and just the second time in the last eight seasons. The Aztecs also handed Ohio State their worst loss since were handed a 32-point loss by Purdue in 1998. Entering the game the Aztecs had not beaten a Big Ten team since a win over Ohio State in 1996.

MAUI - San Diego State was handed their first defeat of the season by Dayton in the second round of the Maui Invitational 76-71 on Tuesday. SDSU (2-1) was within 71-68 with 23 seconds left on a basket by Aerick Sanders, but Dayton went 5-for-6 from the free throw line the rest of the way to offset a last-second 3-pointer by Stokes.

Sanders led the way for the Aztecs with a career high 21 points and 18 rebounds. However, SDSU struggled to connect from three-point land as they hit just 4-for-22 from 3-point range after connecting on 13 treys opening-round win over Ohio State.

MAUI - San Diego State earned a third place finish at the Maui Invitational with a 75-67 over the host institution, Chaminade on Wednesday in Hawai'i. The Aztecs (3-1) took a 65-48 lead with an 11-2 run capped by a 3-pointer by Chris Walton with 4:57 to play. Chaminade (1-2) was able to get to 72-67 with 27 seconds left on a 3-pointer by Chris Acker. But Wesley Stokes went 3-for-4 from the free throw line the rest of the way to close out the game.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State scored on its first six possessions of the game, jumped out to a 16-2 lead, and led by no less than 16 in the second half on its way to a 76-51 victory over UC San Diego at Cox Arena on Saturday.

The Aztecs improve to 5-2 on the season, which marks the earliest points on the calendar year that SDSU has registered five wins in his history, and matches its best record since 1984-85.

SDSU shot a season high 50.9 percent from the field, including 58.6 percent in the first half. Leading five Aztecs in double-figures was Wesley Stokes with 18 points on six-of-nine shooting from the field.

Junior Chris Manker registered career highs in both scoring and rebounding with 12 points and nine boards. Chris Walton recorded his second career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds, while Aerick Sanders and Brandon Heath also poured in 12 points apiece.

Stokes tallied eight assists, while Heath posted eight rebounds, and four assists which were all season highs for the Aztec starting backcourt.

NOTES OF THE GAME: Freshman Marcus Slaughter made his first career start and posted seven points and seven rebounds in 30 minutes... Junior Steve Sir saw action for the first time this season after recovering from off-season surgery and scored three points in 14 minutes... SDSU led wire-to-wire for the 12th time under Steve Fisher... SDSU is 6-0 all-time against UCSD.

SAN DIEGO - Aerick Sanders scored 27 points and added 10 rebounds as San Diego State took control in the second half to top New Mexico 72-68 on Monday night.

USAFA, Colo. - Nick Welch scored 17 points and Air Force used its stifling defense to shut down San Diego State 62-49 on Monday night to clinch its first-ever conference title.

Air Force (21-5, 11-2 Mountain West Conference) had never before finished higher than sixth place, when it was in the Western Athletic Conference.

SDSU (14-14, 5-8) lost the turnover battle 19-10 and fell to 1-11 on the season when having more miscues than the opponent.

Aerick Sanders led the Aztecs with 15 points, while Wesley Stokes added 13 points. Marcus Slaughter posted a game-high seven rebounds and seven points, while Tommy Johnson scored nine points.

SDSU trailed by as many as 10 in the first half but the Aztecs cut the lead to 25-20 at halftime. That would be the closest they would get the rest of the way, however, as Air Force hit 3-pointers in consecutive possessions by Keller and Welch to take a 31-20 to open the period and were never threatened down the stretch.

Air Force made four of its first six 3-point attempts of the second half and finished with a season high 13 of 27 shots from behind the arc.

Joel Gerlach had 14 points for Air Force. Tim Keller and Antoine Hood each scored 12. A.J. Kuhle recorded 11 of the team's 16 assists.
