NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY: San Diego State is one of just 18 programs in the country, one of just two California programs (joined by Cal State Fullerton), one of just three west coast programs (Cal State Fullerton & Oregon State), and one of just four non-power 5 conference members (Cal State Fullerton, Dallas Baptist, Rice) to have five NCAA Regional appearances in the last six years.

The Aztecs are 11-26 all-time in NCAA Regional play and looking to advance to a Super Regional for the first time in program history. This will be SDSU's 14th NCAA Regional appearance in its 82-year history. San Diego State's No. 3 seed is its highest since 2014, when the Aztecs were the No. 3 seed at the Lafayette Regional.

VS. THE TIGERS: SDSU and LSU will meet for the first time on the baseball diamond on Friday. It's SDSU's second SEC opponent this season, having faced then-No. 4-ranked Arkansas on Feb. 24 at the Tony Gwynn Legacy tournament.

The Aztecs are looking to snap a nine-game losing streak against SEC programs, with the team's last SEC win coming against Kentucky on March 4, 2010 (12-4 win). SDSU is 4-21-2 all-time against current members of the SEC.

No. 3-seeded San Diego State faced No. 2-seed and No. 17 Mississippi State in the 2014 Lafayette Regional and suffered a 5-2 opening-round loss.

#### **AZTEC STORYLINES**

**ON THE AIR:** Friday's game will be televised on ESPNU. XTRA 1360 Fox Sports San Diego will also broadcast each game during SDSU's regional run.

THE CHAMPS ARE HERE: San Diego State won its sixth Mountain West Tournament Championship and its fifth in the last six years on Saturday, finishing an undefeated run through the tournament with a 14-5 win over UNLV. SDSU went undefeated in the MW tournament for the first time since 2000 and won a postseason tournament on its home field for the first time since winning the WAC Tournament in 1986. All three of SDSU's wins were in come-from-behind fashion.

The Aztecs are the only team in the nation to have won five conference tournament championships in the last six years and one of just 12 in NCAA Division I football (FBS), men's basketball, women's basketball, baseball, or softball (1,414 total programs) to have won five conference tournaments/championship games in the last six years:

Football (FBS): None.

Men's Basketball: New Mexico State, Gonzaga

Women's Basketball: Albany, Baylor, Chattanooga, UConn,

Green Bay, Notre Dame

Softball: Florida State, Fordham, North Dakota State

Baseball: San Diego State

Notable programs with four: Football (FBS): Alabama Men's Basketball: Kentucky

With last Saturday's win, SDSU improved to 23-6 in the Mountain West tournament over the last six years and 50-30 all-time, good for the most wins and best winning percentage among all active MW members. SDSU is the only MW program to have reached the MW tournament every year since the league was founded in 2000 and SDSU has participated in a postseason conference tournament in 18 consecutive seasons and 20 times in the last 21 years.

Mark Martinez earned his third Mountain West Championship in the just his fourth season as head coach. Martinez, who last season became the fastest head coach to earn 100 career victories in SDSU history, became the fastest head coach in Mountain West history to earn three Mountain West Championships.

UNFAMILIAR, BUT KIND OF FAMILIAR: Although San Diego State has not advanced passed a NCAA Regional, SDSU sees its fair share of experienced postseason opponents during the regular season. Head coach Mark Martinez enters Friday's game against LSU 5-4 in his career against teams that competed in the College World Series the year prior. Before Martinez assumed the head coach position in 2015, SDSU was in the midst of an 11-game losing streak against teams that played in the CWS the previous season.

THE TRIFECTA: Below is a list of the 15 NCAA Division I programs that reached the NCAA postseason in both men's

basketball and baseball and a FBS football bowl game during the 2017-18 academic year:

San Diego State and UCLA are the only two California schools to accomplish that feat in 2017-18, while SDSU is also just one of three (Houston & New Mexico State) to do so from a non-power 5 conference.

**WOW, THE BULLPEN:** The San Diego State bullpen was nearly been perfect for the duration of the MW tournament, allowing just onerun and two hits over 14.1 innings pitched. Over SDSU's last 23 games (17-6 stretch with four losses being by two runs or less) the bullpen owns a 9-2 record, 2.91 earned run average, and .200 opponent batting average.

In the Mountain West tournament, opposing hitters went just 2-for-44 (.045) against the Aztec bullpen.

AGAINST THE FIELD: San Diego State played three teams that reached an NCAA Regional in 2018, including Cal State Fullerton, Arkansas, and Washington. SDSU went a combined 3-2 against those teams and outscored their opponents 32-31 in 2018.

HISTORY WITH THE BEAVER STATE: San Diego State is playing in Oregon for the first time since 2016, when it split a two-game midweek series with Oregon State in February 2016. Those are the only two games the team has ever played in Oregon, however, SDSU has hosted Oregon-based teams 36 times in its history.

LOOKING FOR #40: San Diego State is looking for its 19th 40-win season and its fourth in the last five years. SDSU entered the season as one of 16 teams in the nation with 40 or more wins in three of the past four seasons, and with a win in the NCAA Regional, SDSU would join Dallas Baptist, Florida, Florida State, Louisville, and LSU as teams with four 40+ win seasons in the last five years. NCAA Regional participants Arkansas (39 wins), Houston (36 wins), Texas A&M (39 wins), Texas Tech (39 wins) and Vanderbilt (31 wins) are other possible teams that can join that category.

WE HAVE BEEN REALLY GOOD LATELY: SDSU is 17-6 in its

last 23 games, with four of those losses having come by two runs or less.

The Aztecs are hitting .314 as a team over the last 23 games, led by Chase Calabuig's .404 mark. The Aztecs have also outscored its opponents 155-99 over its last 23 games and are averaging 6.73 runs per game.

Jordan Verdon leads the team with seven home runs and 29 RBIs over the team's last 23 games.

FEATS OF CHASE CALABUIG: With his start Friday, Chase Calabuig will set the San Diego State career games played record, passing Tim Zier with his 237th collegiate appearance and has started in 122 consecutive games. Having played in 236 career games, he's missed just eight games in his entire four-year career.

Calabuig is ending his collegiate career in style for his senior season, leading the Aztecs with a .397 batting average in conference play and leading the MW with 51 conference hits

During the Mountain West tournament, Calabuig ended his career with a 54-game on-base streak in home games -- the longest streak in Tony Gwynn Stadium history.

Calabuig recorded his 250th career hit in the final regular season series of the season at Nevada, becoming the fourth player in Aztec history to reach that mark. Over the month of May (14 games), Calabuig is hitting .448 (26-for-58) with team-bests in runs scored (20), total bases (40), on-base percentage (.529) and slugging percentage (.690).

In addition to being a game away from tying the games played record, Calabuig is 12th in Aztec history with 11 triples, tied for fifth (Travis Lee) with 365 total bases, fourth with 256 hits, eighth with 160 runs, second with 847 at bats, and fifth with 115 walks.

Calabuig is one of just three players in Aztec histroy to have 150 or more runs scored, 250 or more hits, and 125 or more RBIs, joined by Bobby Meacham and Jake McLintock.

UNSCHMITTABLE: Since taking over the closer's role on April 2, Casey Schmitt leads the country with nine saves since the start of April and owns the lowest ERA by an Aztec in recorded history (minimum 30 IP) at 0.28. For his efforts int he Mountain West Tournament, Schmitt became the fifth freshman in league history to win Tournament Most Valuable Player and the first since 2013.

Schmitt currently rides a 25.2 consecutive scoreless inning streak (longest by an Aztec this season), with his last run allowed coming against CSU Bakersfield on March 20 (both runs in that outing were unearned). Schmitt enters this weekend having not allowed an earned run in over two calendar months, with his last coming at Cal Poly on March 17.

Schmitt, who has solidified himself as one of the best two-

way players in the nation as just a freshman, is the only freshman in the country to have driven in 25 or more runs at the plate while owning an ERA under 2.00 (minimum 15 IP). Schmitt is one of just two players in the country to have 25 or more RBIs while owning an ERA below 1.00 (minimum 15 IP), joined by only Duke senior Jack Labosky (36 RBI, 0.87 ERA in 31.0 IP).

Against Mountain West opponents, Schmitt owned a perfect 0.00 ERA over 10 appearances and 18.2 innings pitched. MW opponents have yet to score a run off Schmitt, who has held opposing MW hitters to a .116 batting average (7-for-60).

**GOOD IN ALL ASPECTS:** SDSU is one of six teams in the country to have a batting average above .300 and a ERA below 4.00, joined by Oregon State, New Mexico State, Southern Miss, Ole Miss, and Minnesota. The only team in the country to have a better ERA and batting average than SDSU is Oregon State.

**GOOD PITCHING:** SDSU enters the regional with a 3.90 earned run average, good for the best single-season ERA since 1996 when the team posted a 3.61 ERA. Including this year, SDSU has owned the Mountain West's best ERA in three of the last five seasons. SDSU's 3.92 ERA is the best in the MW since Fresno State posted a 3.72 staff ERA in 2016.

**FINISHING STRONG:** SDSU has won 85 consecutive games when leading after eight innings, good for one of the top five longest active streaks in the country.

**30-WIN MARK:** With SDSU's 31st win on against UC Riverside on May 1, the Aztecs are the only Mountain West program to have more than 30 wins in five of the last six seasons.

AMONG THE NATIONAL/CONFERENCE LEADERS: In addition to being the Mountain West leader in earned run average (3.90), WHIP (1.33) and hits allowed per nine innings (8.57), SDSU ranks among the top of the nation in numerous statistical categories.

- SDSU's .305 batting average is 10th best in the nation.
- SDSU's 56 double plays turned are 11th most in the nation
- SDSU's 122 doubles are the 14th most in the nation
- SDSU's 623 total hits are 10th most in the nation
- Jordan Verdon and Chase Calabuig are fourth and 21st in the country with 26 and 21 doubles, respectively.
- Chase Calabuig is 28th in the nation in total hits (85).
- Jordan Verdon is 17th in the nation with 65 runs batted in and 24th in the nation with 142 total bases.
- Chase Calabuig is 14th in the nation and leads the Mountain West with five triples.

**EXPERIENCE ON THE DIAMOND:** Despite having a team of 15 freshmen -- the program's largest freshman class since 2011 and a freshman class that was ranked No. 14 in the nation by Perfect Game -- the Aztecs have two of the most experi-

enced players in the nation this year in Chase Calabuig, who is third among all DI players with 236 career games played, and Jacob Erickson, who leads all DI pitchers with 119 career pitching appearances. The Aztecs are the only team in the nation to have a player in the top five of both categories. Erickson set SDSU's program record in pitching appearances earlier this season and is also the Mountain West all-time leader, while Calabuig owns a tie of the career games played record at SDSU with 236.

BIBLE BACK IN ACTION: After being diagnosed with stage 2 Hodgkin's lymphoma in January 2017, redshirt junior outfielder Chad Bible heard the good news in August 2017 that he was cancer free. Bible, who led all California junior college players in 2016 with 15 home runs, earned All-Mountain West second team honors in 2018. Despite his diagnosis last year, Bible was able to play in seven games, and recorded at least one hit in six of them. To cap his inspirational season, Bible recorded a double to right field in his final at bat of the season against Long Beach State after starting cancer treatment with Dr. Stephen Forman, M.D. at City of Hope in Duarte, Calif.

In his first at bat since defeating his battle with cancer, Bible ripped a single on the first pitch he saw, and later came around to score SDSU's first run of the 2018 season. He followed that up with a 3-RBI triple in a 8-4 win over UC Santa Barbara.

**HOMEGROWN:** 10 players on the San Diego State roster are from San Diego and played high school baseball in San Diego county. San Diego natives have collectively recorded 404 hits this season, good for 64.8 percent of SDSU's hit total of 623.

Became the first Aztec in the Mountain West era (since 2000) to hit two grand slams in a season after hitting his second against Nevada last Friday... One of two players in the Mountain West to have won MW Player of the Week twice this season (Chad Bible)... Hit walk-off sacrifice fly in MW seminfinal against UNLV last Friday... Mark Martinez is in his fourth season as the head coach at San Diego State, a position he assumed in 2015 after nine years as an Aztec assistant coach under the late Tony Gwynn.

Martinez won his third MW Championship in his fourth season leading the charge for SDSU, becoming the fastest head coach in league history to win three championships.

Martinez helped Gwynn transform and build the program into what it is today. He has helped guide the Aztecs to five regional appearances in the past eight years after an 18-year absence from the postseason. Along the way, he has guided the team to Mountain West Championships in four of the past five seasons.

He has also helped build an academic program that saw the highest APR in the history of the program last season, as well as the most scholar-athletes and highest team GPA in the history of the program.

Martinez has had 42 players drafted in his time at San Diego State, and had six of those draft picks make the major leagues (Stephen Strasburg, Addison Reed, Justin Masterson, Bruce Billings, Quintin Berry and Lance Zawadski). In addition, Martinez has helped guide 47 Aztecs to All-Mountain West honors and eight Aztecs to All-American accolades.

In 2017, Martinez guided SDSU to a 42-21 record and a fourth conference title in the past five seasons. Statistically, his offense was among the national leaders in several categories while the defense set a school record for fielding percentage. He also helped produce the Mountain West Tony Gwynn Player of the Year (Danny Sheehan) and the league's Pitcher of the Year (Brett Seeburger). A total of six Aztecs earned all-conference honors while two (Sheehan, Tyler Adkison) were recognized as third-team All-Americans

In his inaugural season at the helm of the Aztec program, Martinez saw his team capture its third consecutive Mountain West Championship and earn a third straight berth in the NCAA Regionals. The team's final 41-23 record marked the first time the Aztecs finished with back-toback 40-win campaigns since the 1990 and 1991 seasons.

Seven Aztecs earned all-league honors and the team produced a Freshman All-American, three All-West Region selections, three members of the NCAA Regional all-tournament team and five athletes on the conference championship all-tourney team including the MVP for the third year in a row. Four players (Bubba Derby, Steven Pallares, Mark Seyler, Ty France) were taken in the 2015 Major League draft as well.

During the 2014 season, Martinez helped lead the Aztecs to their second consecutive conference championship. The overall 42-21 record was the best win percentage in 30 years of the program. The Aztecs also made their second consecutive regional, playing in Lafayette, Louisiana, as the No. 3 seed.

After the season, the 2014 Aztecs saw six players drafted (Michael Cederoth, Greg Allen, Brad Haynal, Tim Zier, Brandon Thomas and Justin Hepner) and saw another sign as an undrafted free agent (Evan Potter). Of the six players that signed after the 2014 season, only one (Cederoth) had been drafted before their time at San Diego State.

In addition closer Michael Cederoth was also named a Baseball America First-Team All-American while third baseman Ty France was named a Baseball America Third Team All-American.

Martinez was also an integral part of recruiting the 2014 recruiting class, which was ranked as the 19th-best freshman class in the country by Baseball America.

Martinez was hired as an assistant coach on July 28, 2005, arriving at SDSU after 17 years as an assistant at the University of New Mexico. His responsibilities included being in charge of the Aztec infielders and serving as SDSU's third base coach during games. In addition, is involved with the Aztec baseball camps and clinics, a series of seminars offered each winter and summer.

During his tenure as a hitting and infield coach at New

Mexico, Martinez was a key member in leading the Lobo offense that became one of the most prominent in the nation under his tutelage.

New Mexico was ranked among the top 11 teams in the nation in hitting his final four seasons and the Lobos were ranked among the top 10 in batting, slugging, doubles, triples and homers in 2005. He also helped lead the Lobos to the 2000 Mountain West Conference regular-season title

Over his 17 seasons with New Mexico, he coached 47 all-conference selections and four conference players of the year. UNM also produced eight All-Americans, four freshman All-Americans and four Academic All-Americans during that span. In addition, 31 players were drafted in his 17 years at UNM.

The 55-year-old Martinez came to New Mexico in 1988 after a five-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Mesa State College in Grand Junction, Colo. He was an assistant there from 1984-88.

Martinez played shortstop at Mesa State from 1982-84, earning all-conference and all-district honors as a senior. He received his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1984. He completed his master's in sports administration from New Mexico in January 1990.

In addition to his work with the Lobos, Martinez gained valuable experience in the summers of 1993 and 1994 as head coach of the Mat-su Miners in the Alaska Summer League.

Born Dec. 18, 1961, in Aurora, Colo., Martinez graduated from Longmont (Colo.) High School in 1980. He and wife, Jada Lucey Martinez, formerly UNM's associate athletic director for development, have two children: a daughter, Marissa (18), and a son, Cade (13).

Jacob Maekawa and Jordan Verdon each had 2-RBI basehits in SDSU's five-run second innina.

Led by a Chad Bible pinch-hit two-RBI double and a Julian Escobedo go-ahead RBI single, SDSU used a four-run eighth inning to defeat Grand Canyon, 5-4, in the final game of the Tony Gwynn Legacy. Garrett Hill dominated GCU's hitters for the first three innings of the game, striking out eight while not allowing a hit.

- The Aztecs have won five of its last six meetings against Grand Canyon and win its first meeting with the Lopes since 1998.

The Aztecs used a then-season-high 11 runs in a game 2 win over the Spartans, led by a career-high four hits by senior David Hensley who finished his day 4-for-5 with three RBIs. On the mound, Garrett Hill continued his successful start to his 2018 campaign, tossing six shutout innings with five hits allowed, seven strikeouts, and no walks for his second win of the season.

- The 10-run margin of victory is SDSU's largest against SJSU since defeating the Spartans 14-3 on April 27, 2014.

The Aztecs swung the bat well in the early stages of the game, scoring a pair of first-inning runs in thanks to a Jordan Verdon double scoring David Hensley and Julian Escobedo. An inning later, the Aztecs built that lead to 3-0 with leadoff hitter Matt Rudick bringing home Escobedo on a single through the left side of the inning. Air Force jumped out to a 7-0 lead before Chad Bible's second home run of the year cut SDSU's deficit to 7-2. Chase Calabuig later drove in a run on a RBI single. Bible led SDSU with a 3-for-5 showing at the plate.

SDSU took an 8-3 decision over San Diego at Fowler Park, using a seven-run sixth inning to overcome an early 2-0 deficit and salvage a split of the season series against the Toreros. Facing a 2-0 hole heading into the sixth inning, the Aztecs broke out for its largest single-inning outburst of the season, scoring seven runs with the help of two hits, three walks, and three Torero errors.

- San Diego State's seven runs scored in the sixth inning is the most its scored this season and the most scored since scoring 10 in the first inning against Fresno State in the Mountain West tournament on May 25, 2017.
- San Diego State is 7-1 all-time at USD's Fowler Park and have outscored the Toreros 47-20 in those games.
- SDSU is 10-5 in its last 15 meetings against crosstown foe USD.
- Chad Bible logged his fifth multi-hit performance in his last seven games and is hitting .462 (12-for-26) over that span.

The Aztecs opened the game with a 6-0 lead, including a three-run first inning. Matt Rudick, who led the Aztecs at the top of the order with a 3-for-4 performance, started the game off with a leadoff single. The bats continued to produce after Chad Bible reached on a two-out error, with Jordan Verdon capitalizing on a 2-RBI double and Dean Nevarez following with an RBI single.

- Jordan Verdon led SDSU with four RBIs

Hill, who lowered his season ERA to 0.95 and earned his fourth win of the season in his Sunday outing, finished the day with 6.2 innings pitched, five strikeouts — all swinging — with five hits and three walks allowed.

SDSU scored all its runs in a three-run top of the third that started with back-to-back singles by Jacob Maekawa and Matt Rudick. Chase Calabuig later drove in Maekawa on a single up the middle, and to cap SDSU's scoring, Jordan Verdon continued his hot streak with a two-RBI single to right-centerfield to score Rudick and David Hensley.

- In San Diego State's 3-1 week, Verdon paced the offense to the tune of an 8-for-17 (.471) showing at the plate, logging six doubles with nine RBI for a .824 slugging percentage. He later went on to win both Collegaite Baseball National Player of the Week and Mountain West Player of the Week.

Dean Nevarez's walk-off single with two outs and the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth inning sealed SDSU's 5-4 win over CSU Bakersfield. The game started with three freshmen shining for the Aztecs on the mound, as Jacob Flores, Casey O'Sullivan, and Daniel Ritcheson combined to give the Aztecs six shutout innings. Four of the game's first six innings for SDSU pitching were 1-2-3 frames and the trio combined for two hits allowed, one walk, one hit by pitch, while striking out five.

The Aztecs responded to a 2-0 hole with Chase Calabuig hitting an RBI double in the top of the third to score Julian Escobedo before Dean Nevarez hit a game-tying solo home run in the top of the fourth to knot the score at 2-2.

- San Diego State's 39 runs over its last two games is the most over a two-game span since scoring 43 against Air Force from May 5-6, 2006. It is the first time since 2003, when SDSU defeated Air Force 19-2 and 18-4 on March 23, 2003, and March 22, 2003, respectively, that the Aztecs have scored 17 or more runs in back-to-back games
- The Aztecs improve to 9-2 in its last 11 games in Las Vegas.
- Chad Bible became the first SDSU player since Danny Sheehan and Seby Zavala (both homered in three consecutive games from May 22-23, 2015) to hit a home run in three consecutive games.

Justin Goossen-Brown made the midweek start for the Aztecs and performed well, allowing just one hit over 3.1 innings of work. Goossen-Brown struck out three, walked one, and retired nine of the first 10 batters he faced.

Adrian Mardueno improved to 3-0 on the year after pitching 1.1 innings of shutout, hitless relief, which included stranding a pair of inherited runners in the fifth inning.

- SDSU is 20-6 against Big West teams since the start of the 2017 season.
- SDSU is 8-2 in its last 10 games.
- Jordan Verdon extended his team-high on-base streak to 21 games and his team-best hitting streak to 10 games.

Jacob Erickson continued an impressive start to his senior campaign, turning in a quality start for the Aztecs with 6.2 innings pitched and scattering five hits and two runs. Erickson, who is now just one appearance shy of tying SDSU's all-time pitching appearance record, logged a career-high eight strikeouts in a 99-pitch outing against the Lobos Thursday night. The Aztecs showed signs of a potential comeback in the bottom of the ninth, as a leadoff Escobedo hit by pitch ended a run of nine consecutive SDSU batters retired. Escobedo advanced to second on a softly hit groundout by Schmitt and advanced to third after Maekawa grounded out to third base. With the tying-run just 90 feet away, New Mexico closer Chris Tripp forced Matt Rudick to fly out to right field and end the ballgame.

 The Aztecs are 8-3 in its last 11 games. All three losses over that span have come by a one-run margin.

An eight-run second inning for the Lobos dug a hole for the Aztecs early on, as the pitching staff surrendered three hit by pitches, five walks, two hits, and a balk. A two-out error allowed the Lobos to score six unearned runs in the inning.

The Aztec lineup immediately began to chip away at the deficit, however, with Jacob Maekawa drawing a bases-loaded walk and Matt Rudick driving in Julian Escobedo on a groundout to second base to help the Aztecs plate a pair in the bottom of the second. Garrett Hill turned in a season-high 8.1 innings with only one run allowed on three hits and four walks, while striking out seven. Hill's only run allowed was due to a two-run home run allowed by Jorge Fernandez in the ninth inning. Prior to that, Hill did not allow a New Mexico runner to reach second base. Joe Fitzhugh's first collegiate RBI coming on a line-drive single to centerfield scored Julian Escobedo for a 1-0 SDSU lead in the bottom of the second. Harrison Pyatt took a no-hitter bid into the eighth inning before surrendering his first and only hit of the game in SDSU baseball's 5-1 victory over Long Beach State at Lake Elsinore Diamond. SDSU got the bats going early with a three-run first inning. Jordan Verdon hit his 16th double of the season to give the Aztecs a pair of runners in scoring position and in the next at-bat, Dean Nevarez converted on the run-scoring opportunity with a single plating both Verdon and David Hensley. The Aztecs capped the scoring on an RBI single by Casey Schmitt that brought home Nevarez.

- Jordan Verdon hit his 16th and 17th doubles of the season in a 3-for-3 day at the plate to claim sole possession of the national lead in doubles. Teammate Chase Calabuig currently sits in a tie for fourth in the country with 14 doubles.
- SDSU's two hits allowed is a season-best for the Aztecs. It's the fewest hits allowed for the Aztecs since allowing one to Fresno State on March 25, 2017.
- Playing at Lake Elsinore Diamond for the fourth consecutive season, SDSU evens its record in Lake Elsinore to 3-3 and has won each of its last two games.

SDSU defeated Air Force in the series finale 15-11 with the help of 19 total hits, four home runs, and seven total extra-base hits. SDSU started its offensively-focused day with a four-run first inning that featured a three-run inside-the-park home run by David Hensley.

After Air Force made the game tighter with a run in the bottom of the first and a run in the bottom of the fourth, SDSU broke things open with a six-run fifth inning to take a 10-2 lead. A pair of freshman hit back-to-back homers in the frame -- both the first of their respective collegiate careers -- as Casey Schmitt hit a two-run shot just before classmate Joe Fitzhugh hit a solo homer to cap SDSU's fifth-inning outburst.

Jordan Verdon concluded SDSU's 15-run showing with a solo home run, good for his fourth long ball of the season.

On the mound, Justin Goossen-Brown posted 4.1 innings in his first weekend start of the year, allowing four earned runs on 11 hits. Adrian Mardueno improved to 4-0 on the year, posting 3.2 innings in relief of Goossen-Brown.

SDSU was shutout for the first time in the 2018 season. SDSU accumulated just five hits in the contest and were hindered in scoring opportunities by going 0-for-4 with runners in scoring position and 1-for-8 with runners on base.

Garrett Hill suffered his first loss of the season in tough-luck fashion, allowing just two runs over 6.2 innings of work while striking out five and walking one.

All the offense the Falcons mustered came in the second and third, with a Nic Ready solo home run in the second inning and a Colby Brown RBI single in the third.

 Jacob Erickson became SDSU's all-time career appearances leader after relieving Hill, recording the 107th outing of his career on Saturday. Erickson set the new all-time Aztec record in impressive fashion, retiring all four batters he faced.

SDSU found itself in a large hole early in the game, as UC Irvine jumped out to a 7-0 lead after a seven-run second inning. The Anteaters recorded seven base hits in the frame, including three doubles and a Ryan Fitzpatrick three-run home run that capped the second-inning outburst. UC Irvine's lead grew to 10-0 after a run in the fourth and two runs in the sixth.

The Aztecs avoided the shutout with a two-run bottom of the ninth that featured RBI singles by David Hensley and Grant Mayeaux.

The game-changing moment came off the bat of Jordan Verdon, who hit a two-out, game-tying grand slam in the top of the sixth to tie the game at 7-7. The Aztecs first three runs of the game came in thanks to a pair of Chad Bible RBI singles and a two-out RBI triple by Julian Escobedo in the top of the fifth. After Verdon's game-tying blast, the game remained tied until

Dean Nevarez gave SDSU an 8-7 advantage with an RBI single to score Chase Calabuig. SDSU added several insurance runs after Verdon scored on a wild pitch and Jacob Maekawa hit a 2-RBI single to bring the score to 11-7 after eight innings.

- Jordan Verdon hit his second grand slam of the season, marking the first time since 2015 that SDSU has hit multiple arand slams in a season. Verdon is the first Aztec in the Mountain West-era (since 2000) to have multiple grand slams in the same season (also hit a grand slam against UNLV on March 25).
- Jordan Verdon recorded his 37th extra-base hit of the season with his grand slam on Friday night, giving him the most extra-base hits in a single season since Chris Gwynn tallied 59 extra-base hits during the 1984 season.
- Calabuig recorded his 250th career hit, becoming the fourth player in Aztec history to reach that mark.

For the second consecutive game, SDSU jumped out to a 3-0 lead in the top of the first inning. The Aztecs capitalized on a two-out error by New Mexico left fielder Derek Marshall, as the miscue opened the door for Julian Escobedo's two-RBI double that plated Jordan Verdon and Dean Nevarez.

After New Mexico responded with a two-run third inning, SDSU extended its lead to 4-2 in the ensuing frame, as Casey Schmitt hit a sacrifice fly to right to score Escobedo.

The two-run third inning was SDSU starter Jorge Fernandez's one of few blemishes on the afternoon, as the senior right-hander was one out shy of his third consecutive quality start, pitching 5.2 innings with three runs and seven hits allowed.

Nine different Aztecs recorded at least one hit, led by four-hit performances by Hensley (4-for-6) and Calabuia (4-for-6) and three-hit showings by Matt Rudick (3-for-5) and Jordan Verdon (3-for-5). As a unit, the 1-4 hitters of Rudick, Hensley, Calabuig and Verdon combined to go 14-for-22 (.637) with three doubles. 10 runs scored, and 11 RBIs. Hensley set a new career-high with
