Saw action in nine games as a true freshman, mostly on special teams ... Also saw limited time in the secondary ... Helped the Wildcats go 8-5 on the season, including a 4-5 mark in the Pac-12, ending with a 42-19 win over Boston College in the AdvoCare V100 Bowl in Shreveport, La. ... ► Has the most tackles for loss (14.0) and sacks (6.0) of any current Aztec over the past two years, despite starting only 10 times (all in 2014).

► Recorded three pass breakups in 2014, one more than all of the SDSU defensive linemen combined had in 2013.

► Was one of three Aztecs with a blocked kick last year.

Physical defender who Coach Rocky Long called the best defensive tackle in the Mountain West in 2014 ... A quick and agile defender, who always seems to be in the right place at the right time ... Missed the final two regular season games last year and the bowl game after having foot surgery in December ... Also sat out the spring season, but should be healthy heading into the fall ... Will be moving to right defensive end this season, where he is slated to start.

### JUNIOR SEASON (2015)

Has been named a preseason first-team Mountain West pick by Phil Steele, and a second-team selection by *Athlon Sports* and *Lindy's Sports* ... Was also deemed an "SDSU Player to Watch" by *Lindy's*.

### SOPHOMORE SEASON (2014)

Was named an honorable-mention pick by the Mountain West media and coaches ... Was also selected as the team's Defensive Lineman of the Year ... Also was on the MW midseason second team by Phil Steele ... Started and played in each of the first 10 games before missing the Air Force and San José State contest with a foot injury, and also the Poinsettia Bowl vs. Navy ... Had 39 tackles (21 solo), 9.0 tackles for loss, three sacks, three pass breakups, six quarterback hurries, a forced fumble and a blocked kick ... Ranked second on the team in tackles for loss (9.0) and tied for second in sacks (3.0), despite missing the final three games ... Ranked ninth in the MW and sixth among defensive linemen with 0.90 tackles for loss per game ... Was also eighth in tackles per game (3.9) among defensive linemen ... The 9.0 TFL are the most by an Aztec defensive lineman since Ernie Lawson had 9.5 in 2010 ... Made his first career start in the opener

vs. Northern Arizona, making five tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss, while adding his first career blocked kick ... Had another good all-around game in another start at No. 21/23 North Carolina, recording three tackles (two solo), 1.0 TFL, his first two career PBUs and two quarterback hurries ... The first PBU was deflected to Jon Sanchez, who intercepted the pass and ran it six yards ... The play set up a 12-yard touchdown run by Donnell Pumphrey, giving SDSU its first lead of the game ... Started for a third straight game at Oregon State, recording five tackles ... Had another big game vs. UNLV, making three tackles (all solo), a career-high-tying two sacks and two tackles for loss ... Came up with four tackles (three solo) and a game-high two quarterback hurries at Fresno State in another start ... Had two solo stops and a quarterback hurry at New Mexico ... Made two tackles (one solo), including a 5-yard sack (and TFL) and his third pass breakup of the season vs. Hawai'i ... Started again at Nevada, where he recorded five tackles (three solo) and a TFL ... The five stops were tied for the third most on the team ... Set a career high with eight tackles (three solo),

1.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble in another start vs. Idaho ... Had already set a career high with six in the first half ... The eight tackles ranked third on the team and tied for fourth in the game ... Came up with two assisted stops and a quarterback hurry in a start at Boise State ... Missed the final three games - Air Force, San José State and Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl - with a foot injury ... Had surgery on the foot in December.

### FRESHMAN SEASON (2013)

Played well off the bench over 12 games in limited snaps, posting 15 tackles (eight solo), 5.0 tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks ... The three sacks were tied for second on the team, while the 5.0 TFL ranked sixth ... Did not play in the opener vs. Eastern Illinois ... Made one stop off the bench vs. No. 15/18 Fresno State ... Played against New Mexico without recording a stat ... Made two tackles with 1.0 TFL at San José State ... Made one assisted tackle off the bench at Hawai'i ... In his first game listed at No. 2 on the depth chart at defensive tackle rather than third at defensive line, he had two tackles (both solo), both for a loss and a 4-yard sack vs. Boise State ... Played again at defensive tackle off the bench at UNLV and tied a season high with four tackles ... Played against Buffalo in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl, but did not record a stat.

## At A Glance

► Became the second true freshman to start at quarterback in SDSU's Division I history at Fresno State (Oct. 3) and first since Spencer Brinton did it at Hawai'i on Oct. 25, 1997. He was the first to start a game having never thrown a pass prior to his first start.

► Also was the first San Diego State true freshman, and the second in school history (Brinton in 1997), to start at quarterback in an Aztec win.

Mobile and tough with a good quarterback IQ ... Enrolled in SDSU in January 2014 and practiced with the team in the spring season of the year ... Worked up from fourth on the depth chart after spring drills to the No. 2 position behind senior Quinn Kaehler heading into the 2014 opener ... Was the backup for most of the season after starting for an in-

jured Quinn Kaehler in two straight games at Fresno State and New Mexico ... Is listed fourth on the depth chart heading into the 2015 campaign.

## FRESHMAN (TRUE) SEASON (2014)

Was one of eight Aztec true freshmen to see action in a game and was the only one to earn a start ... Threw for 147 yards on the year, going 13-for-38 for a touchdown and two interceptions ... Also rushed 11 times for 43 yards (3.9 avg.) ... If you take away the three times he was sacked, he had 63 rushing yards on eight attempts (7.9 avg.) ... Came off the bench to play the final series in the opening win vs. Northern Arizona, but did not throw a pass ... Was on the travel squad to No. 21/23 North Carolina, but did not appear in the game ... Also was on the travel squad to Oregon State, but did not log any snaps ... Played in the team's final drive vs. UNLV, but only handed the ball off ... Became the second true freshman to start a game at quarterback and first without previ-

ously throwing a pass at Fresno State ... Only 12 FBS true freshmen had started at quarterback in the season with just seven earning the start without previously throwing a pass in college (as of Oct. 3, 2014) ... Was 9-for-24 for 84 yards with one touchdown and two interceptions ... Also rushed for 36 yards on eight attempts, averaging 4.5 yards per carry ... If you took away the two times he was sacked, those rushing numbers go to 48 yards on six attempts (8.0 avg.) ... Was the 39th player to make his quarterback starting debut for the Aztecs in the Division I era (since 1969) ... Became the second SDSU true freshman in school history (Spencer Brinton in 1997) to start at quarter-

back in an Aztec win at New Mexico ... Was 4-for-13 for 63 yards with no touchdowns and no interceptions, playing only the first half ... Also carried three times for seven yards (twice for 15 yards if you take away the 8-yard sack) ... Had a career-long 43-yard pass in the first quarter to Eric Judge ... Backed up Quinn Kaehler without seeing action in consecutive games vs. Hawai'i, Nevada, Idaho, Boise State and Air Force ... Came off the bench vs. San José State and threw a pass for the first time since the New Mexico game, but the pass was incomplete ... Was on the sidelines, but did not see the field vs. Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl.
