OFF THE BOUNCE (through games of Sunday, February 19)

- The No. 22-ranked San Diego State men's basketball team, in sole possession of first place in the Mountain West, faces Colorado State on Tuesday at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena, a venue where the Aztecs have defeated the Rams in nine of its last 11 meetings, including four of the last five.
- San Diego State has won 31 of its last 35 conference contests (31-4), since the start of the 2021-22 campaign, and overall has emerged the victor in 13 of its last 14 (13-1) and 23 of its last 25 (23-2) Mountain West home games.
- The Aztecs are battle tested having played the 10th toughest schedule in the nation based on its average opponent's NET rank, through the games of February 19. The only schools in the AP Top 25 to have played a tougher schedule than the Aztecs is No. 2 Alabama with the sixth most difficult slate, No. 3 Kansas with the toughest schedule in the nation, No. 9 Baylor which has played the fifth hardest schedule and No. 19 Creighton has played the ninth most difficult slate. Colorado State has played the 57th most difficult schedule.**
- San Diego State owns the seventh-best home record in the nation, since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, 197-25 (.887) and its 353-114 (.756) overall record in that time frame is the sixth best in the nation (see boxes on page 8).
- The last time out, San Diego State defeated Fresno State, 45-43, in its lone meeting with the Bulldogs in the regular season. It was the 15th time since the start of the 1999-00 season (780 games), SDSU has totaled 45 or fewer points, but the first time it has won a game when doing so. The Aztecs improved to 16-8 against Fresno State in the Mountain West era and have won the last eight straight against the Bulldogs, regardless of location.
- SDSU is 13-1 in its last 14 Mountain West home games and 78-11 since January 8, 2013, as a host in Mountain West games.
- SDSU is 52-1 in its last 53 games and has won 40 straight games in which it has shot at least 50.0 percent from the field, which it last did against UNLV (51.7 percent) on February 11 in its 82-71 win.
- San Diego State committed only three turnovers in its game against San Jose State. That is the fewest for an Aztec team, in a Division I game, since the start of the 1999-00 season, a span of 779 games.**
- On Tuesday evening, San Diego State and Colorado State will meet for the 93rd time overall and for the second time during the 2022-23 campaign. The Aztecs own a 49-43 series advantage. At home SDSU is 29-14 overall including a 19-4 mark at Viejas Arena. Since the start of the 2009-10, SDSU is 11-2 against the Rams on its home floor.
- The last time San Diego State played Colorado State was just over a month ago, on January 18, 2023, in Fort Collins, Colo., at Moby Arena. The Aztecs defeated the Rams in overtime 82-76. It was the third slimmest margin of victory for SDSU in 13 wins at Moby since the inception of the Mountain West.
- San Diego State's calling card is defense, and it is again playing it at a high level according to Kenpom, which has the Aztecs ranked No. 19 nationally in adjusted defense. In addition, the SDSU offense, which ended the 2021-22 campaign ranked No. 167 in adjusted offense,

slots in at No. 49 through 25 games this year and SDSU is No. 17 in adjusted efficiency margin.

- San Diego State has appeared in the Associated Press' Top 25 Poll for 98 weeks since the start of 2010-11 season. SDSU's 98 weeks in the top 25 are the 18th most nationally and are the most for any California school in that time frame (see graphic on page 9).
- SDSU enters tonight's game battle tested, including having played the fewest Quad 4 games, one (1), among the 363 Division I schools who compete in men's basketball. The only team with fewer than three Quad 4 games, and ranked ahead of the Aztecs is No. 2 Alabama which has played two (2) games against Quad 4 competition.
- San Diego State, which in 2021-22 reached the Mountain West championship game for the fifth time in head coach Brian Dutcher's five seasons, looks for its unprecedented 15th Mountain West men's basketball title. Entering the 2022-23 season, San Diego State, the most successful program in conference history, has won eight regular season and six Mountain West tournament titles.
- **San Diego State has a 29-8 record (78.4 percent) in true road games since the start of the 2019-20 season. That is the second best record in the nation trailing only Gonzaga's 29-4 record (87.9 percent).**
- San Diego State owns a 97-21 record (82.2 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign. That's the fourth best record in the nation, trailing Gonzaga's 113-12, Houston (107-20) and Baylor (101-20), and better than Kansas' 105-23.
- Senior **Matt Bradley** finished the Fresno State win with 10 points. It was his 17th 10-plus point game of the season and the 114th double-digit scoring effort of his career. In addition he led the team with three assists.
- Senior **Keshad Johnson** led the Aztecs with 10 rebounds at Fresno State. It marked the third time this season he has grabbed double digit boards and the seventh time in his career. Every time he has had 10-plus rebounds, the Aztecs have won (7-0).
- **Brian Dutcher** is now in his sixth season as SDSU's head coach and his 24th on the Aztec sidelines. In his five-plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, five MW championship game appearances, a 140-45 (.757) overall record - eighth best in the nation, has been named the national coach of the year and twice the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

QUICK HITS FROM THE FRESNO STATE GAME

- The Aztecs move to 5-0 this season, 42-2 in the Brian Dutcher era when it limits its opponent to less than 35 percent shooting.
- San Diego State's 45 points are the fewest it has scored in a road win since at least the 1996-97 season.
- SDSU moves to 96-94 in Mountain West road contests since the inception of the league in 1999-00, which is the best record in league history, and San Diego State is the only program with a winning percentage above .500 in conference road games.
- San Diego State records its 17th 21-win season in the last 18 campaigns.
- Head Coach Brian Dutcher records his sixth consecutive 21-win season. No other head coach in San Diego State history has put together that many 20-win seasons to start his career.
- SDSU wins the 21st of its last 24 Mountain West games overall (21-3).
- San Diego State improves to 7-1 on the road this season and its 100-58 record in road games since the start of the 2009-10 season is the fifth best in the nation.
- Since the start of the Brian Dutcher era, the start of the 2017-18 season, San Diego State improves to 31-18 (63.3 percent) in Mountain West road games.
- SDSU improves to 140-45 (.757) under Brian Dutcher.
- San Diego State, as a top-25 team, moves to 8-0 when it has played Fresno State and 6-0 when playing in the Bulldogs' Save Mart Center.

OUR RESUME

Below is a look at some highlights from San Diego State's NCAA tournament resume (through the games of February 19).

- The Aztecs have impressive metrics, including 17th in the NET (tops in the MWC), 17th in KenPom (tops in the MWC), 9th in T-Rank (tops in the MWC) and 32nd in Sagarin Rating (tops in the MWC).
- San Diego State has played the 10th toughest schedule in the nation based on its opponent's NET ranking.
- San Diego State has quality wins, including a 20-point win over No. 23 Boise State (72-52), a 9-point win over No. 34 Nevada (74-65), a 10-point home win over No. 33 Utah State (85-75) and a 63-61 win at Utah State, an 11-point neutral court win over No. 68 Ohio State (88-77), a pair of wins over No. 85 UNLV - 9-points (76-67 in Las Vegas and an 11-point (82-71) in San Diego, and a 7-point win over No. 94 Brigham Young (82-75).
- San Diego State has played the fewest number of Quad 4 games, one, in the nation. Only one program, other than San Diego State, has played less than three Quad 4 games No. 2 Alabama.
- The Aztecs are 2-4 in Q1 games, but it is worth noting that only one of those six games were played at home.
- San Diego State has suffered only one true road loss (at NET No. 34 Nevada).
- San Diego State has suffered three losses on a neutral floor (vs. NET No. 7 Saint Mary's, NET No.11 Arizona & NET No. 19 Arkansas).

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 10 of the last 12 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and after 15 home games this season, San Diego State has the seven-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 197-25 home record, winning 88.7 percent of its home games during that span.

In the midst of the 2022-23 season, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 233 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 207-26 mark (88.8 percent), including a 108-12 record (90.0 percent) against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 143-30 (82.7 percent) home record against conference opponents.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 152-21 (87.9 percent) at home, including a 67-9 (88.2 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 64-7, 90.1 percent, against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- The Aztecs are 75-11 (87.2 percent) in their last 86 conference home games and 71-9 (88.8 percent) in their last 80 non-conference home games.

MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last 57 home games, San Diego State is 52-5, with an average scoring margin of +14.3 points in those victories. In 44 of those 57 home wins, the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs current 13-game non-conference home court win streak, started on November 11, 2021, against UC Riverside, equals the sixth-longest in school history; a win streak that began on December 16, 2000 and ran to November 23, 2002.
- San Diego State is 63-6 in its last 68 home games dating back to January 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 45-5 in their 50 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

SWEET HOME CALIFORNIA

In the first 26 games of the campaign, from Cal State Fullerton (11/7) to at Fresno State (2/15), the Aztecs have won 15-of-16 contests in the state of California. Here is how important that is:

- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 215-36 (.861) in games played in the state of California.
- Since the start of the 2010-11 season, San Diego State is 183-24 (.884) in games played in Viejas Arena.
- Since the inception of the Mountain West, San Diego State is 150-44 (.773) in league games played in Viejas Arena, which includes a 4-14 record in its first 18 league home games.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 132-35 (.790) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but four of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 96 home games against those same 24 opponents, and starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 87-11 (.888).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 466-325 (.589) overall.

San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season hosting an in-state foe in Cal State Fullerton and improved to 23-10 against the Titans in the all-time series. The Aztecs won at Stanford, 74-62, to capture its first win against the Cardinal in five tries and downed UC Irvine 72-69. SDSU fell 61-68 to Saint Mary's in the Jerry Colangelo Classic at Phoenix, won 62-46 over UC San Diego, and 72-51 against San Jose State. SDSU

won (45-43) at in-state Division I opponents Fresno State on February 15 at the Save Mart Center.

97 WINS IN LESS THAN FOUR YEARS...AND MORE

Since the start of the 2019-20 season, San Diego State, through the games of February 15, has a 97-21 record.

- The 97 victories are tied for the ninth most in four seasons in program history and its 82.2 percent winning percentage is the best for any Aztec team over a four-year period since the start of its Division I era (1970-71).
- In the five-plus seasons Brian Dutcher has been at the helm of the program, his Aztecs' 140 triumphs are the fourth most in program history and his 75.7-win percentage (140-45), is the best of any head coach in the 101 years of San Diego State basketball and the eighth best in the nation in that time frame.

KEYS TO VICTORY

- San Diego State is 17-2 this season when leading at the half. (SDSU is 184-23 (.889) in the last 207)
- San Diego State is 17-1 this season when leading with five minutes to play. (SDSU is 380-14 (.964) in the last 394)
- San Diego State 15-2 this season when scoring first. (SDSU is 215-56 (.793) in the last 271)
- San Diego State is 17-2 this season when it outrebounds its opponent. (SDSU is 243-38 (.865) in the last 281)
- San Diego State is 16-1 this season when it attempts more free throws than its opponent. (SDSU is 229-33 (.874) in the last 262)
- San Diego State is 17-1 this season when it shoots a higher field goal percentage. (SDSU is 280-18 (.940) in the last 298)
- San Diego State is 10-1 this season when its opponent shoots 40% or lower. (SDSU is 299-39 (.885) in the last 338)
- San Diego State is 9-0 this season when it holds its opponent to under 60 points. (SDSU is 84-7 (.923) in the last 91)
- San Diego State is 15-2 this season when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponent. (SDSU is 142-25 (.850) in the last 167)

AZTECS AT NO. 22/20 IN THE POLLS

After a hard-fought victory at Fresno State last week, and in sole possession of first place in the Mountain West, the San Diego State men's basketball team slots into this week's Associated Press Top 25 Poll at No. 22 and the USA Today Coaches Poll at No. 20. The Aztecs totaled 336 points in the AP poll, garnered 180 in the Coaches poll, and remains the only program in the conference to be ranked in either.

With its appearance in this week's AP poll, San Diego State is ranked for the 98th week since the start of the 2010-11 season, more than any other program in the state of California and the 18th most in the nation in that time frame.

San Diego State is ranked No. 22 for the seventh time in school history. SDSU has appeared in every position in the AP poll between No. 4 and No. 25, except for No. 12.

The latest ranking, released on February 20, marks the sixth time SDSU has appeared in the AP Top 25 on this date., and for the year the Aztecs have been included in the poll for 10 weeks.

TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State opened the 2022-23 season ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll. It is the fourth time that SDSU has been included in the AP's preseason poll; all coming during the Dutcher/Fisher era and is the second highest ranking for the program in the initial poll of a year.
- The previous three occasions when San Diego State was ranked in the preseason poll by the AP voters was prior to the 2010-11 season when the Aztecs were initially No. 25; prior to the 2012-13 campaign, when SDSU was No. 20; and the most recent appearance before this year, was 2014-15 when the Scarlet and Black was No. 16, the program's highest ranking in the preseason poll.
- How important is the preseason ranking or what does it portend? The three previous Aztec teams which were ranked in the preseason AP poll, finished a combined 84-23, including a 44-3 mark in Viejas Arena. Each squad made at least the round of 32 in the NCAA tournament with the 2010-11 team reaching the Sweet 16 and finishing the season with a 34-3 record.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight (Dec. 2, 2013-to-Dec. 15, 2014).
- Entering this season, the Aztecs had appeared in the AP Poll for 88 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- As of the Monday, February 20 poll, San Diego State's 98 appearances since the start of the 2010-11 campaign, are the most of any school in California. (See box in the left column of page 9)
- Prior to this season's ranking, the last time the Aztecs appeared in the AP poll was March 15, 2021, the final poll of the 2020-21 season, and the Aztecs were ranked No. 16.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season San Diego State has appeared in the USA Today Coaches Poll 29 times, including this year's preseason ranking of No. 20.

OFF THE BENCH

San Diego State's bench scored 45 of the team's 85 points (52.9 percent) vs. Utah State (1/25), and this group of reserves may be the program's best since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00 season).

- San Diego State's bench scoring ranks No. 1 in the Mountain West and No. 25 in the nation.
- The Aztecs bench is averaging 26.7 points per game, 3.8 more than the 22.9 of the 2020-21 team's bench, the highest since the start of the 1999-00 season.
- SDSU's 12.9 rebounds from the bench are 1.3 more than the average of the 2015-16 reserves, the best in the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- In addition, the 2022-23 bench's, 9.0 defensive rebounds, 9.2 field goals, 3.2 three-pointers, 3.9 offensive rebounds, and 5.2 free throws are all currently single-season bests for the program, since the inception of the Mountain West (1999-00).
- The 2.3 steals and 73.8 free throw percentage rank second for the bench since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era.
- The Aztec bench has outscored its opponents bench 695-to-423 (26.7-to-16.3 points per game).
- San Diego State's bench has matched or outscored its opponents bench in 22 of the team's 26 games and in those 22 games, SDSU has come away with 18 wins (17-4).

SEIKO...EN FUEGO VS. UTAH STATE

Senior Adam Seiko missed the team's game at Air Force on January 21, but came to Viejas ready to go from the moment he stepped on the floor for the Aztecs game against Utah State on January 25.

- He checked into the game with 15:01 on the clock, took 1:06 to get acclimated and then exploded on the Aggies.
- He hit his first shot, a 3-pointer, at 13:55; his second, a 3-pointer, at 12:47; his third, a 3-pointer, at 11:53; his fourth, a 3-pointer, at 9:50 and, a heat check 3-pointer, his fifth, at 9:30.
- In the span of 4:25 on the floor, the Boston native was 5-of-5 from the bonus distance to propel San Diego State from a 9-7 lead to a

- To let the nets cool off, he subbed out for three minutes, and when he returned, made it an even six threes in the first half; nailing his last of the first period with 1:23 to play, making the score 42-27 at intermission.
- He sank his first triple of the second half, making him 7-of-7, all from the bonus distance.
- His seven threes equals the program record for a player coming off the bench (also: David Abramowitz, Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Utah) and was one off the program record for a game which has been achieved four times, most recently by Jordan Schakel dropped eight on Colorado State on January 4, 2021.

THE GOOD HANDS PEOPLE

In its game against San Jose State on January 28, the Aztecs committed only three turnovers. It is the fewest it has had in a game since at least the 1999-00 season, a total of 777 games. It bettered the previous best, four turnovers, which SDSU has achieved nine times, the last of which came on March 14, 2015 in the championship game of that season's Mountain West tournament against Wyoming.

- The team that holds the record for the fewest turnovers by a Mountain West program, since the inception of the league, is Wyoming which committed just one turnover in a February 28, 2012 game against TCU.

ONCE IS GOOD, BUT TWICE IS NICE

Senior Keshad Johnson has played 98 games in his Aztec career and in the first 92 he compiled two double doubles: 11 points, 10 rebounds at UNLV on Jan. 1, 2022 and 14 points, 10 rebounds vs. New Mexico on Jan. 31, 2022.

- Against Utah State (1/25) Johnson recorded his fourth with 11 points and 10 boards...right on the heels of his third which came the game before that, at Air Force (1/21) with 13 points and 10 rebounds.
- Double doubles are better than good for the Aztecs. When the Aztecs, currently on the roster, reach a double double, the team is a perfect 13-0.

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON TUESDAY

When the Aztecs play Colorado State on Tuesday here are some of the streaks that are on the line for SDSU:

- 40-game win streak when shooting 50 percent or better.
- 26-game win streak in games in which it scores between 80-89 points.
- 14-game win streak when leading with five minutes to play.
- 14-game win streak when it shoots a higher percentage than its opponent.
- 11-game win streak when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponent.
- 8-game win streak when holding its opponent less than 60 points.
- 6-game win streak in games played in February.
- 4-game win streak in games played in Viejas Arena.
- 2-game win streak against Colorado State, regardless of location.

ALL SCHEDULES AND RECORDS ARE NOT THE SAME

Through the games of February 13, San Diego State, 20-5 on the season, has played the eighth most difficult schedule in the nation, based on its opponent's NET rank.

- Of the 363 schools that are competing at the Division I level, the Aztecs have played just one game (1-0) against Quad 4 opponents. That is the fewest of any team in the nation. SDSU has played 4.0 percent of its schedule against Quad 4 teams.
- Boise State, a game behind San Diego State at the top in the Mountain West, has played six Quad 4 teams (6-0). Nevada has played four Quad 4 games and has a 4-0 record in those games, and Utah State has played four Quad 4 games and has gone 3-1 in them.
- Of the 16 teams ahead of the Aztecs in the NET, through the games of February 19, there is one close to the Aztecs' one (1) Quad 4 game: No. 2 Alabama which has played two (2-0).
- Houston, which is No. 1 in the NET, has feasted on Quad teams with a gaudy 8-0 record. Those eight wins equal nearly 30 percent of the team's Division I win total this season (25).
- No. 11 in the NET, Arizona, having tested themselves eight times against Quad 4 teams, is 8-0, and those eight wins account for 33.3 percent of its 24 Division I wins. In the latest AP poll, published on February 13, Arizona was ranked No. 7.

So all schedules and records are not the same.

SIX IS ENOUGH

When San Diego State defeated Air Force 70-60 on January 21, it marked the third time since the start of the 2017-18 season the SDSU recorded six or fewer assists in a Mountain West game. SDSU is 2-1 in those three games.

- Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, the Aztecs are 10-6 in league games when they tally no more than six assists in a game.
- Since the start of the Mountain West era (1999-00), the Aztecs have totaled six or fewer assists in a league game 24 times and earned 11 victories in those games.
- The fewest assists San Diego State has recorded and earned a win in a league game was four against Fresno State (58-47) on January 27, 2015.
- Overall, since at least the start of the 1996-97 season, the fewest assists San Diego State has recorded in a win are four. The Aztecs have done it three times; the aforementioned Fresno State game, vs. No. 25 Utah (53-49) on November 18, 2014, and vs. Wyoming (69-64 in overtime) on March 11, 2006.

SEIKO ALL-TIME WINNER IN MOUNTAIN WEST HISTORY

Playing in the Aztecs 82-76 win at Colorado State on January 18, senior guard **Adam Seiko** racked up his 56th career win in a Mountain West game. Those 56 wins are the most for any player in Mountain West & Aztec history (The league's initial year of existence was 1999-2000).

- Entering the game against Fresno State, Seiko has been a part of 62 wins in Mountain West games.
- With four Mountain West games remaining on the schedule for the Aztecs and if SDSU goes 3-1 in those contests (equal to the program's conference winning percentage since 2009-10 - 74.6 percent) and the Boston native stays healthy, Seiko could complete his career with 65 conference wins.
- San Diego State has eight of the top-10 players on the all-time league games won list.
- The only non-Aztecs among the top-10 of the most Mountain West wins are Justin Bean (Utah State), Max Rice and Chandler Hutchinson (Boise State) who are tied for eighth place with 50 victories.

Current SDSU players Nathan Mensah (52 wins), Aguek Arop (51 wins) and Keshad Johnson (45 wins) are ranked No. 4, No. 5 and No. 18 on

the league's all-time win list, respectively.

MENSAH SWATS HIS WAY TO HISTORY

Senior forward **Nathan Mensah**, the reigning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year, cemented his place in Aztec history in SDSU's 82-76 overtime victory on Jan. 18, 2023, at Colorado State.

- With his second blocked shot of the game, with 16 seconds remaining in the extra period, the Accra, Ghana native reached 200 blocked shots for his career achieving the final milestone of a three-part record. He became the second Aztec in the 102 years of the program to score at least 800 points, grab at least 700 rebounds and block at least 200 shots. He joined Leonard Allen, who accomplished the triumvirate during his career from 1982-1985, as the only two SDSU players to reach all three milestones.
- Mensah enters the Colorado State game with 912 career points, 825 rebounds (No. 3 on the program's career list) and 212 blocked shots (No. 3 on the program's career list).
- With 3 more blocks he will pass Allen's 214 career rejections to become the No. 2 shot blocker in SDSU basketball history.

WELCOME BACK MATT

Senior **Matt Bradley** is one of the nation's elite scoring guards. In 2021-22 he was one of six players in the nation to average 16.9 points and 5.4 rebounds, while shooting 43.8 percent from the floor, 40.1 percent from the bonus distance, 77.9 percent from the line. In addition, he was one of two players, who in a minimum of 15 home games, averaged 18.2 points while shooting at least 48.2 percent from the floor (with a minimum of 195 shot attempts) and 46.4 percent (on a minimum of 69 3-point attempts)...and is the only Division I player who has returned in 2022-23 with those stats.

- In the team's first eight games, he averaged 8.8 points on 15-of-52 FG (28.8 percent), with 3.4 rebounds and 1.0 assist.
- Since then, in the last 18 games, he is averaging 13.8 points on 87-of-201 FG (43.3 percent), including 32-of-80 3PTFG (40.0 percent), with 3.8 rebounds and 2.2 assists and tallied his first double double of the season (17 points and 10 rebounds vs. Nevada - 1/10/23) and second as an Aztec.
- For his career, Bradley is a 15.2 points per game scorer on 43.2 percent shooting with 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists per game.

MORE ON BRADLEY

Senior **Matt Bradley** finished the team's game against Air Force (12/28) with a season-high 27 points on 9-of-12 shooting, including 6-of-7 from beyond the arc, 3-of-5 from the charity stripe and added three rebounds, an assist, a steal and did not turn the ball over in 31 minutes of action. He is the eighth Aztec, since at least the start of the 1996-97 season, to enjoy a game of at least 25 points without a turnover and is the first to do so since Jeremy Hemsley (2016-19) scored 30 points in 33 minutes at Nevada without a turnover on January 4, 2017. The other Aztecs to accomplish those minimums are:

- Xavier Thames (January 25, 2014, at Utah State) 31 points, zero turnovers in 39 minutes.
- Xavier Thames (January 15, 2014, vs. Fresno State) 28 points, zero turnovers in 34 minutes.
- Chase Tapley (December 22, 2012, vs. San Francisco) 33 points, zero turnovers in 35 minutes.
- Brandon Heath (January 24, 2004, vs. Colorado State) 26 points, zero turnovers in 43 minutes.
- Aerick Sanders (December 31, 2003, vs. Portland) 34 points, zero turnovers in 40 minutes.
- Evan Burns (February 24, 2003, vs. New Mexico) 31 points, zero turnovers in 34 minutes.
- Jason Richey (December 2, 1997, vs. Oregon) 25 points, zero turnovers in 38 minutes.

TO 2,000 POINTS...AND BEYOND

Senior **Matt Bradley** emerged from the UNLV game (12/31) the eighth active player in Division I to score 2,000 career points.

- The product of San Bernardino, Calif., enters the Colorado State game with 2,170 points, No. 9 among active players, and is one of 22 active players who have reached the 2,000-point milestone.
- Among the group, there are 13 players who stand 6-4 or shorter, Bradley among them. Within that group he reached the milestone in the second fewest field goal attempts (1,509) and overall has grabbed the most rebounds (648).
- San Diego State will play a minimum of five more games this season, if he scores at his career average (15.2 points per game), he will add 76 more points and would complete his college career with 2,246 points.

HEAT CHECK FROM THE BONUS DISTANCE

San Diego State has hit 10 or more 3-pointers in eight contests this season, including six of the team's last 15 games, and has won each of the eight contests when it knocks down double digit treys. How effective has the 3-point shooting been in the last 15 games?

- In the last 15 contests, the Aztecs have totaled 119 treys and have shot 38.6 percent from the bonus distance (119-of-308).
- In its four previous games against Division I opponents, before this surge, SDSU made 13 threes and shot 25.6 percent (21-of-82).

DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING...AND ROLLING

Brian Dutcher is on The Mesa in now his 24th season, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 525 victories, 14 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 15 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each of his five years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 20 games in each of his first six seasons.
- His 119 wins in his first five seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first five campaigns.
- His 139 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.

SERIES HISTORY VS. COLORADO STATE

This is the 93rd meeting between Colorado State and San Diego State with the Aztecs owning a 49-43 advantage in the series, including a 36-16 lead in the Mountain West era.

- The Aztecs once trailed the series, 12-29, (SDSU is 37-14 since that time) and the last time the series was last tied was in 2017-18 (41-41).
- The Aztecs are 29-14 at home against the Rams, including 19-4 in Viejas Arena, and have a 16-2 home record against CSU since the start of the 2002-03 season.

- SDSU has won 27 of the last 34 regular-season matchups, 19 of the last 23 in Viejas Arena, since the inception of the Mountain West.
- San Diego State's two longest winning streaks against Colorado State are a nine-game run from Jan. 29, 2008 to March 5, 2011 & a five-game streak which started on Jan. 2, 2018 and was snapped on Jan. 2, 2021.
- Nineteen of the last 24 meetings between the teams have been decided by 11 points or less (the outliers came in 2015 in Las Vegas when the game was decided by 13 points, SDSU's 19-point win at home in 2017-18, the Aztecs 22-point victory on Dec. 4, 2019, a 13-point triumph on Jan. 4, 2021, and 30-point dismantling on Jan. 8, 2022).
- SDSU has held Colorado State below 50 percent from the field in each of the last 35 encounters (CSU shot 50.9 percent on March 8, 2007).
- When SDSU shot 55.6 percent from the field on Jan. 24, 2018, 51.9 percent on Feb. 12, 2019 and 55.8 percent on Jan. 4, 2021, it marked the only times either team shot 50 percent or better from the field in any of the last 27 meetings.
- In 30 of the last 35 meetings (27 of which have been won by SDSU), Colorado State has shot 40.9 percent from the field (795-of-1,943).
- San Diego State has 10 turnovers or less in 13 of the last 26 meetings (287 total; 11.0 tpg).
- The Aztecs have hosted Colorado State four times in its Mountain West home opener and are 4-1 in those games. (81-69 on Jan. 19, 2002, 83-75 on Jan. 4, 2006, 79-72 in overtime on Jan. 12, 2013, 67-70 on Jan. 2, 2021 & 79-49 on Jan. 8, 2022).

FORT COLLINS, Colo. — Lamont Butler scored a team-high 19 points and Micah Parrish was perfect from the field as the Aztecs earned an 82-76 overtime win at Colorado State on Wednesday evening. Colorado State tied the game with five seconds left in regulation before the Aztecs took control in overtime to earn the win.

SDSU (14-4, 5-1 MW) would set the tone early in overtime when Matt Bradley sank two foul shots and then the Aztecs made back-to-back threes. Parrish nailed his third of the game and Butler sank his second of the game to give San Diego State a 75-70 lead with two minutes to play. Then with 39 seconds to play Bradley iced the game with another from bonus distance to give the Aztecs an 80-73 lead and eventually their fifth conference win of the year.

Earlier on it was Colorado State (10-10, 2-5 MW) who jumped out to a 9-2 lead early on, before the Aztecs settled into the game courtesy of a Butler triple. Later in the half Jaedon LeDee threw down a monster dunk courtesy of a pass from Darrion Trammell, before Parrish picked off a pass and went the other way with it for another dunk, making it a 19-17 Colorado State lead with 11:23 left in the first half.

The Aztecs would take the lead with just over four minutes remaining in the half when LeDee scooped up a loose ball in the paint and dunked it home to give San Diego State a 26-25 lead with 4:22 left in the half. However, it was the Rams who would close the half strong and took a 34-28 lead into the halftime break.

Both teams opened the second half with multiple defensive stops, with the score 37-30 Colorado State with 15 minutes to play. Then the Aztecs defense continued to make plays. On back-to-back possessions the Aztecs picked off passes leading to an Adam Seiko triple and another Parrish dunk to cut the deficit to three, 40-37 with 13:59 left in the game.

A few minutes later Parrish drilled a three to give the Aztecs their second lead of the game, 44-43. The teams would trade buckets for the next few minutes as the Rams took a 54-53 lead with six minutes to go.

Parrish would make his basket of the game a few minutes later, this one a triple and the foul to tie the game at 56-56. He then made the following free-throw to give the Aztecs a 57-56 advantage with 4:59 remaining. Matt Bradley scored on a tough drive to the hoop with 2:59 to go to make it a 59-56 lead for SDSU.

The squads would trade baskets down the stretch and the Rams tied the game with five seconds left to force the game to overtime with the score tied at 65-65. The Aztecs then ran out 82-76 winners in overtime.

No. 21 San Diego State 45, Fresno State 43

FRESNO, Calif. — Matt Bradley scored 10 points and No. 21 San Diego State slipped past Fresno State 45-43 on Wednesday night. San Diego State (21-5, 12-2 Mountain West Conference) has won four in a row and eight of nine overall, extending its win streak against the Bulldogs to eight games.

"I told the guys I don't care what anybody says, it was a beautiful win," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "We find a way to win. That's it."

Nathan Mensah had eight points, eight rebounds and four blocks for SDSU, and Keshad Johnson added seven points and eight boards. Isaiah Hill converted a three-point play and Anthony Holland made a 3-pointer before Jemarl Baker Jr. hit a turnaround jumper to cap an 8-0 run that gave Fresno State a 41-40 lead with 4:51 to play.

Darrion Trammell answered with a layup about a minute later and Jaedon LeDee hit one of two free throws to put SDSU ahead by two.

Hill made a layup that tied it 43-all with 2:42 remaining, but Fresno State went 0 for 6 from the field the rest of the way. LeDee sank one of two free throws with 2:07 left to give the Aztecs a 44-43 lead, and Mensah added a foul shot with six seconds to go. Hill missed a shot for the Bulldogs as time expired.

"I couldn't be more proud of our effort, how we hung together," Dutcher said.
 "Sometimes when things aren't going well, teams will crumble. They'll separate. They'll get frustrated. And we just stay singularly focused on trying to win the game."

Hill led Fresno State (9-16, 5-9) with 16 points and Eduardo Andre had 10 points, nine rebounds, two blocks and two steals.
 The Bulldogs shot 31% (17 of 55) from the field and went just 2 of 25 from 3-point range.
 Hill scored 11 points and Andre added eight points with five rebounds in the first half as Fresno State took a 25-23 lead into the break despite shooting 1 of 10 from 3-point distance and committing 10 turnovers.
 Fresno State shot 6 of 28 (21.4%) from the field and scored just 18 points in the second half on its way to its lowest-scoring output of the season.

"Eighteen points we gave them in the second half," Dutcher said, "and it was just enough to get a victory."
 San Diego State is 9-0 this season when holding its opponent under 60 points.

WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- Overall, San Diego State has a 42-37 lead in the all-time series with UNLV. At one time, the Aztecs trailed 26-6 in the series, but is 36-11 in the last 47 meetings between the teams.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 campaign, San Diego State has 42 victories at Thomas & Mack Center. That is the most victories by any school in the nation in any venue in which they have not played a home game during that span. In second place is Villanova in Madison Square Garden with 34 victories.
- San Diego State is 13-1 in its last 14 games at UNLV (games played at Thomas & Mack Center).
- San Diego State is 20-2 in the last 22 games played between the Aztecs and Rebels.
- Brian Dutcher has been on the sidelines for 37 of San Diego State's 41 victories in the series. AZTECS PREDICTED TO FINISH FIRST IN MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

- San Diego State has won an unprecedented 14 Mountain West titles in men's basketball (eight regular season & six tournament), six more than any other Mountain West program, and despite not winning either the regular season and tournament crowns in 2021-22, but returning four starters, has been predicted to finish in first by a poll of the media that regularly cover the conference.
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West media's preseason poll in each of the last nine years.

BRADLEY EARNS SECOND MOUNTAIN WEST PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR IN 2022-23

Senior guard Matt Bradley has been named the Mountain West men's basketball Player of the Week for the seven-day stretch which ended on Sunday, February 12. The announcement was made Monday morning from the conference office in Colorado Springs, Colo.

Bradley averaged 17.5 points and 5.0 rebounds as the Aztecs won at Utah State and against UNLV in Viejas Arena last week to maintain its hold on first place in the league standings, with five games remaining in the regular season.

For the week, the native of San Bernardino, Calif., shot an astounding 72.2 percent (13-of-18) from the floor, 71.4 from beyond the arc (5-of-7) and knocked down 66.7 percent of his free throws (4-of-6). In a total of 50 minutes of floor time in the two games, he also averaged 2.0 steals, 1.5 assists and 0.5 blocks.

In snapping a three-game slide against the Utah State in Logan, Utah, he scored a game-high 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the floor (70.0 percent), was 2-of-2 from long range, made 2-of-4 from the line, grabbed six rebounds and had a game-high three steals in 26 minutes of action.

He drained his first seven shots and did not have a miss through the first 36 minutes of play. Four of his five defensive rebounds limited Utah State to single-shot possessions and two led directly to San Diego State scores the other way.

Against UNLV, he had 17 points on an efficient 6-of-8 from the field (75.0 percent), made 3-of-5 from the bonus distance (60.0 percent), and hit both his free throw attempts. He grabbed four rebounds and added two assists, a steal and a block playing 24 minutes.

He sank three of his first four shots, including a steal and dunk going the other way which capped a 14-0 run and left UNLV trailing 30-11 with 9:01 to play in the half. Bradley finished 3-of-5 from the field in the first 20 minutes, including 2-of-4 from long range, with a pair of assists, a steal and block as the Aztecs built an insurmountable 20-point halftime advantage.

One minute and 40 seconds into the second half, his 3-pointer put SDSU up 21 and the team cruised from there to its 20th win of the season. Among Bradley's four rebounds, two limited UNLV to single shot possessions.

This is the third Mountain West weekly honor an SDSU player has received this year, the second for Bradley in the 2022-23 season and the fourth in his two-year Aztec career.





Brian Dutcher enters his sixth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach, building on the previous five years in which he led the Aztecs to five title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th & 14th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament three times. He is the only coach in the 101-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first five seasons. His 119 victories in five seasons (119-40) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.8 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naimsmith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top-25 ranked opponents on 15 occasions and posted a 9-6 record (60.0 percent) and includes wins over Gonzaga, UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). Since the start of the 2018-19 season, his Aztecs are 4-2 against Pac-12 opponents and 8-4 in multi-team events in season. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the 14th best home win percentage in the nation (88.3 percent), and in the last three years, San Diego State has posted a 91.1-win percentage (41-4) in Viejas Arena, the ninth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned under his tutelage. In 2020 Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztecs to earn that honor and the following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors seven times to an Aztec in the last five years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first team designation. Flynn, Yannik Weitzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively and in 2022 Matt Bradley was a second team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors.

His players have earned 14 all-Mountain West designations and 15 player of the week honors. Two Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018 and Mitchell in 2021, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 10 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his five seasons, his charges have garnered 14 league all-academic team distinctions with Flynn being named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA tournament and its second consecutive single-digit seed, No. 8. Six of its nine losses were by 6 points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, five of the team's six defeats were by six points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

The team's No. 2 ranking in KenPom's adjusted defensive efficiency was the best for a Dutcher coached team and matched the program's best rating since the start of the 2006-07 season (the team was No. 2 following the 2010-11 campaign). Among its national rankings, SDSU was No. 2 in scoring defense, No. 4 in field goal percentage defense, No. 25 in 3-point field goal percentage defense and No. 32 in blocks per game.

The defensive success was in part due to Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Nathan Mensah. The Accra, Ghana native averaged 2.2 blocks per game to lead the Mountain West, totaled a career-high 71 blocks for the season, and was No. 5 in offensive rebounds, No. 7 in total rebounds and No. 13 in defensive boards.

Offensively, the team was led by first year player Matt Bradley, who transferred into the program in the summer of 2021. The Mountain West Newcomer of the Year and first-team all-league designee, led the team in virtually every offensive statistical category, including points (542), field goals (186), 3-pointers (57) and free throws (113).

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game

winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus second-team All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blowout victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, three days after Utah defeated then No. 6 Kentucky, the Aztecs handed the Utes a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the corona virus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his first season as head coach, he was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 23 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 16 times, including 11 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 14 Mountain West titles and record 17 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured 11 MW championships (seven regular season, four tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00) the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep. The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

- Was the only Aztec true freshman (2020-21) to start back-to-back games since Nathan Mensah on March 15 & 16, 2019 and is just the third freshman in the last five seasons to start a game for SDSU (Matt Mitchell & Nathan Mensah).
- Is the 25th Aztec since the start of the 1999-00 season to finish a game with a 6:1 assists-to-turnover ratio (vs. Cal State Fullerton - 11/7/22) and if you include his 4 steals, he is one of two SDSU players, and the first since Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on 3/1/01.
- Since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00) is just the second Aztec to have four steals & a 6:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in a game (also Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on March 1, 2001). He did it in the season opener vs. Cal State Fullerton (11/7).

As a Junior (2022-23 Season)

MW Rankings: No. 5 in steals, No. 9 in assists-to-turnover ratio, No. 13 in assists

- Scored 11 pts. vs. Cal State Fullerton (11/7) with three boards and a game-high 6 assists & 1 turnover and four steals. Since the start of the Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-00) he is just the second Aztec to have four steals and a 6:1 assist-to-turnover ratio in a game (also Deandre Moore vs. Wyoming on March 1, 2001).
- Back-to-back double digit scoring games for the first time this season, at Stanford (11/15) & vs. Ohio State (11/21), incl. a season-best 15 pts. vs. Ohio State, where he matched a career-high six FG.
- Set a career-high with 23 points at Wyoming (1/7) with a career-best five 3-pointers and overall eight made field goals.

- In the first seven games, averaged 9.7 points on 45.8 percent shooting (22-of-48), 47.1 percent from distance (8-of-17) and 72.7 percent from the line (16-of-22), 2.1 rebounds and 2.0 assists, before a wrist injury sidelined him for 40 days.
- Led the team and was second in the Mountain West in steals (46).
- Scored a career-best 16 points (6-of-6 FG & 3-of-3 3FG) vs. Georgetown in the semifinal of the Paycom Wooden Legacy (the first SDSU player in 26 seasons to post a perfect night shooting from the field with at least six field goal attempts and at least three 3-point field goal attempts).

- His 13 pts at Utah State (1/16) are the most by a San Diego State true freshman since Matt Mitchell scored 17 points at Air Force on Feb. 21, 2018.

Trending

- In the last 12 games averaging 9.7 pts., with 3.7 assists, and 2.6 rebounds.
- The team is 63-18 in games in which he has played, and is 41-12 in his starts.
- His 10 assists in the first two games of 2022-23 equal the best two game total in his collegiate career and he then equaled it in the second and third games of the campaign.
- In MW games this year, is averaging 9.4 pts. on 48-of-120 (40.0 percent) from the field, 17-of-51 (33.3 percent) from beyond the arc and 18-of-23 (78.3 percent) from the line.

SAN DIEGO - Darrion Trammell hit three 3-pointers during a 29-10 run to open the second half and finished with 18 points for No. 19 San Diego State, which beat Cal State Fullerton 80-57 Monday night to begin one of the most eagerly anticipated seasons in school history.

Fellow newcomer Jaedon LeDee and Lamont Butler scored 11 points apiece and Nathan Mensah had 10 for the Aztecs, who won their 10th straight opener and their 17th in 18 seasons.

Vincent Lee scored 11 and Jalen Harris 10 for the Titans, the defending Big West Conference champions.

SDSU was the preseason pick to win the Mountain West Conference and Trammell was selected preseason newcomer of the year.

"I just play basketball," Trammell said. "All the accolades are nice but I came here to win. I have bigger things on my mind, tournament dreams. I'm all about the team."

Trammell made a 3-pointer to open the game. The Titans stayed close throughout the first half and the Aztecs made only two shots in the last five minutes to lead 32-25 at halftime.

But SDSU came to life in the opening minutes of the second half. Trammell hit a 3 and Keshad Johnson and Matt Bradley had slam dunks for a 44-29 lead that prompted the Titans to call a timeout. SDSU continued to pour it on with two more 3-pointers from Trammell and 3s from Butler and Micah Parrish. The Aztecs pushed the lead to 61-35 with 11:25 to go.

"We can wear teams down," Trammell said. "We've got a very deep team. Everyone has their own thing that they do. That's definitely going to carry us deep all year."

San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said the Aztecs had too many turnovers in the first half so he called more set plays in the second half to get them into a pattern.

"I don't want to do that. I want to run, I want to play free and I want them to make better decisions on the break," Dutcher said. "I think that will come as the season goes on."

SAN DIEGO - Jaedon LeDee scored 26 points and Darrion Trammell added 21 to help No. 19 San Diego State beat rival BYU 82-75 on Friday night.

San Diego State led by two with 2 minutes left when Trammell hit a 3-pointer with the shot clock winding down to almost zero. BYU then respond to get back within two with 83 seconds left.

LeDee sealed the game with a layup that gave the Aztecs a five-point lead.

Spencer Johnson scored 17 points and Rudi Williams added 15 for BYU.

After a lackluster opening half, the Aztecs turned up their offense in the back-and-forth second half, but were unable to solve BYU's aggressive defense until the final minutes.

"I don't know if it was poetry, but it was hard-fought basketball," said Aztecs coach Brian Dutcher. "We've worn teams down in the first couple of games. We continue to play hard, even though we don't play great all the time. We just made enough plays to get a win today."

For BYU, San Diego State proved to be "a different animal" than Idaho State, the Cougars' season-opening opponent last Monday, reflecting Pope's post-game warning to his team after that tight five-point win.

Last Monday, when San Diego State opened its season with a convincing 80-57 win at home over Cal State Fullerton, 14 of its roster players saw action. That wasn't the case against BYU, as Dutcher went with his core starting lineup, with only four subs coming off the bench.

The Aztecs more than lived up to their preseason billing as a Top 20 team, which gave their raucous 2,500-strong student cheering section known as "The Show" plenty to cheer and jeer about.

Despite the loss, the Cougars retain a 50-26 overall advantage against SDSU. A year from now, the two teams are scheduled to meet in a non-conference game after BYU's move to the Big 12, ending 11 seasons in the WCC.

Friday night's first half ended with BYU holding a 4-point lead, 40-36 lead.

STANFORD, Calif. — Jaedon LeDee scored 10 of his 14 points in the first half and No. 17 San Diego State beat Stanford for the first time, 74-62 on Tuesday night.

The Aztecs (3-0) never trailed to improve to 1-4 in the series. "We play pretty hard against anybody we play," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "I told them that we're on a really hard five-game stretch — BYU at home, Stanford at home and then three in Maui. Let's see how we do, if we're ready for that kind of challenge."

Lamont Butler had 11 points and six assists and Keshad Johnson added 11 points for the Aztecs.

Spencer Jones led Stanford (1-2) with 15 points, six rebounds and three blocks. Harrison Ingram had 11 points.

"We knew coming in it would be a battle and we'd have to play our A game to be able to get there," Stanford coach Jerod Haase said. "I don't think we played our A game but I also think that they certainly deserve a lot of credit for playing really well."

San Diego State had a 10-0 run early to open a 17-5 advantage and led by 17 in the first half.

Stanford closed the half on a 6-0 spurt to cut it to 41-30. The Cardinal later had a 10-2 run to get within six with 10:10 remaining, but the Aztecs answered with a 16-6 surge to put it out of reach.

"We kind of jumped on them in that first half a little bit and then they kind of fought back, as I thought," LeDee said. "We knew that they were going to fight back. They're at home. They're talented. It's just a little adversity for us. But we just kept wearing them down."

San Diego State scored 21 points off 17 Stanford turnovers. The Aztecs shot 51% from the field, making 8 of 21 3-point attempts. "I was most pleased that our point guards had 12 assists and one turnover," Dutcher said. "That kind of play from the point guard position will get you wins."

BIG PICTURE

The Aztecs were victorious in their first road game of the season, fighting off every Stanford run in the second half. San Diego State displayed its depth and balance offensively, along with its usual tenacious defense. The Aztecs showed why they were picked first in the preseason Mountain West poll.

LAHAINA, Maui — Matt Bradley scored 18 points before fouling out in the final minutes and helped No. 17 San Diego State rally from a slow start to beat Ohio State 88-77 Monday night in the first round of the Maui Invitational.

Lamont Butler and Micah Parrish had 15 points apiece and Adam Seiko added 14 for the Aztecs (4-0).

Sean McNeil scored 20 of his 22 points in the second half for Ohio State (3-1), which was playing away from Columbus for the first time this season. Brice Sensabaugh scored 17 and Bruce Thornton 13.

Ohio State threatened to turn the momentum three times in the final minutes but the Aztecs answered each time.

Tanner Holden made a dunk and was fouled by Bradley, which was determined to be flagrant. He made both free throws to pull the Buckeyes to 80-72. Sensabaugh made one of two free throws for the Buckeyes before Parrish drained a 3 to give the Aztecs a double-digit lead.

Bradley fouled out with 2:53 left and Thornton made both free throws to pull the Buckeyes to 83-75.

Darrion Trammell of SDSU then made two free throws with 1:49 left.

In a crazy sequence with more than 13 minutes left, the Buckeyes closed within four points but then saw SDSU extend the lead back to double digits. Sensabaugh made a 3-pointer and there was a foul away from the play allowing the Buckeyes to keep the ball, and McNeil made a jumper to pull OSU to 51-47.

But the Aztecs came back to score eight points in less than a minute to jump ahead 59-47. Parrish had consecutive 3s and Butler had a steal and fed Aguek Arop for a layup. The Aztecs extended the run to 17-5 on a 3-pointer by Seiko.

Bradley made 4 of 6 3-pointers, including one to start the second half for a 40-26 lead. He scored 10 points in the first half, when the Aztecs missed their first eight shots and fell behind 5-0 before Seiko made a jumper about five minutes in to get SDSU on the board. Bradley began to heat up, including hitting two 3-pointers.

Seiko and Lamont Butler also hit big 3s to help the Aztecs to a 37-26 halftime lead.

Pelle Larsson sank a 3-pointer, Trammell missed a 3 and Oumar Ballo followed with a three-point play to put Arizona up 46-42. The Wildcats upped their lead to 10 on a Ballo free throw with 11:43 remaining and pushed it to 71-56 on a Cedric Henderson jumper with 6:58 left to play.

Ramey, a graduate transfer from the University of Texas, hit all five of his 3-point shots in his second game with Arizona. Kerr added five assists. Ballo finished with 12 points and nine rebounds before fouling out. Henderson scored 10.

Trammell topped San Diego State with 21 points. Micah Parrish scored 10.

Arizona, which came in leading the nation shooting 62.9% from the floor, shot 58.6% against the Aztecs and made 9 of 20 from beyond the arc. SDSU shot 38% overall and made only 3 of 19 from distance.

"UC Irvine's guards are dynamic," San Diego State coach Brian Dutcher said. "You go out there to take away the three away, you can't give him (Davis) the three."

Davis was 4-for-6 on threes despite the attempt by the Aztecs defense to limit his perimeter shots.

"He shot so far away I couldn't believe it," Dutcher said of Davis. "So you are going to give him angles. You are guarding him 30 feet from the hoop and he is going to get by you."

It was a tight game throughout, especially in the second half when the lead see-sawed between the teams. San Diego State maintained a small advantage throughout the first half and lead 32-30 at the break.

"The first game after Hawaii is always tough. I have been around long enough to know that. It's super tough when you schedule a team that is 6-1 and playing really good basketball," Dutcher said. "We made a lot of mistakes in the first half. Offensively too careless with the ball."

Matt Bradley had 14 points for the Aztecs and had the crucial assist to Parrish for the game-winner.

"Matt is one of the best passers on the team. I know last year he led the team in assists and he doesn't get enough credit for that," Parrish said. "He is a brilliant passer when he doesn't have a shot." San Diego State shot 6-for-21 for three-point shooting but hit several huge threes in the final minutes, which clinched the win.

"The key to the game is Troy hit seven 3s in the first half and if they would have made seven in the second half they would have won, but they only made two," Dutcher said. "We guarded like crazy tonight. ... Our defense won the game."

Troy played without guard Duke Miles and forward Nate Tshimanga, who were both in concussion protocol. Additionally, forward Lydell Geffrard left the game with an apparent right knee injury after playing only two minutes in the first half.

"We are grinding games out -- we have had a hard schedule. We have played a lot of great teams," Trammell said. "But we are a tough group of guys, so it is going to pay off."

The Aztecs won points in the paint versus Troy, 30-16, allowing them to get just enough offense to win.

"We our pulling out a lot of tough games," Bradley said. "It's been tough but I'm happy with our record and where we sit right now."

PHOENIX — Aidan Mahaney scored 20 points, Alex Ducas added 17 and Saint Mary's knocked off No. 22 San Diego State 68-61 in the Jerry Colangelo Classic on Saturday.

Two of the nation's best defensive teams got offensive early at the home of the NBA's Phoenix Suns before the Gaels (8-3) tightened up to take a nine-point second-half lead.

The Aztecs (7-3) took their turn clamping down to pull within 59-56, but Saint Mary's quickly pushed the lead back to seven. Saint Mary's hit 7 of 8 free throws down the stretch to knock off the Aztecs a week after playing a close game again top-ranked Houston.

Matt Bradley had 13 points and Keshad Johnson added 12 to lead San Diego State, which shot 3 of 15 from the 3-point arc.

Saint Mary's arrived in the desert No. 8 in defensive efficiency according to KenPom.com, and San Diego State was No. 18.

So, of course, the game turned into an offensive showdown.

Ducas scored in a variety of ways, putting up 10 points in the first 7 1/2 minutes and 14 by halftime. Johnson took his turn next, scoring eight quick points, and the Gaels shot 13 of 24 in the first half.

San Diego State made 13 of 26 shots in the first half, the last Micah Parrish's 3-point half-court heave at the buzzer to tie the game at 35-all.

Saint Mary's started clamping down defensively in the second half, holding San Diego State scoreless for more than five minutes to build a five-point lead. The Aztecs finally hit a shot, but went on another scoreless drought of nearly four minutes, falling behind 59-50 on a 3-pointer by Ducas.

San Diego State tried to fight back, but the Gaels pushed them away to pull out a key nonconference win.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State's men's basketball team, led by a game-high 19 points off the bench from Micah Parrish, defeated Kennesaw State 88-54 on Monday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

"Well, it felt great to be back in Viejas, we had a great crowd," Aztec head coach Brian Dutcher said. "They brought the energy and that's what I put on the board: we have to bring energy. It feels like we're playing every other night, but we've had a pretty good schedule. It's balanced out. Sometimes it just feels like you're playing every other night and so I was concerned about this game. I knew Kennesaw had a week off before us. We played a tough game against Saint Mary's in Phoenix, [had a] one day prep, but we did a really good job on that one day."

The 34-point loss was the Owls worst since a 35-point loss to No. 9-ranked Creighton in the 2020-21 season.

Parrish's 19 points are a season-high and one off his career-high, 20 points, which he achieved three times at Oakland.

Leading 39-25 at the intermission, SDSU shot 65.2 percent in the second half (15-of-23), finished the game at 50.8 percent (31-of-61) and had 21 assists on their 31 made buckets.

Joining Parrish in double-digits were Darrion Trammell and Jaedon LeDee, who each finished with 14 points. LeDee was 10-for-11 from the free throw line and pulled down seven rebounds.

Up 18-14 with 11:03 to play in the first half, SDSU went on an 11-0 run over the succeeding 3:30 to take its first double digit lead, 29-14 and had at 14-point advantage going into the half.

The Aztecs put together another double-digit scoring run in the second half, 10-0, led by eight points from LeDee. San Diego State pushed its lead to 40 points with 5:11 to play before earning the 34-point win.

SDSU used a size advantage to outscore the Owls 40-to-16 in the paint and 14-2 in second chance points

SDSU outrebounded the Owls 39-28 with Nathan Mensah pulling down a game-high nine boards and added three blocked shots.

Kennesaw State was led by Kasen Jennings' 17 points.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State wrapped up non-conference play Tuesday with a 62-46 triumph over UC San Diego at Viejas Arena.

With the victory, the Aztecs remain unbeaten in 13 all-time meetings against the Tritons.

Darrion Trammell was the lone player to reach double figures for SDSU (9-3), finishing with 18 points on 6-of-11 from the floor, including a 4-of-6 from beyond the arc, while Jaedon LeDee grabbed a career-high 12 rebounds.

However, both teams witnessed their share of offensive struggles, with the Aztecs shooting 36.1 percent from the floor (22-61) compared to the Tritons' 31.6 percent pace (18-57).

SDSU connected on 10-of-24 tries from three-point range (41.7 percent), while UCSD (5-7) was just 5-for-28 (17.9 percent) on its long-range attempts.

In addition, the Scarlet and Black maintained a sizeable 47-31 advantage in rebounds and a 17-10 edge in points off turnovers to help fuel their win.

The Aztecs never trailed, opening a 11-0 lead through the first five-plus minutes, capped by a Keshad Johnson dunk.

SDSU limited the Tritons to 22.2 percent shooting (6-27) in the first half, including draining just 2-of-15 from three-point range (13.3 percent).

Conversely, Trammell shouldered much of the Aztecs' offensive burden, nailing triples on three consecutive possessions late in the half to give the hosts a commanding 35-16 lead by intermission.

SDSU missed its first nine shots of the second period; however, UCSD could draw no closer than 13 points after Justin DeGraaf's layup cut the margin to 35-22 with 15 minutes remaining.

Unfazed, the Aztecs responded with a 16-3 blitz to quash any Triton comeback hopes. Nathan Mensah scored all six of his points during the run, including his first trey of the season at the 10:05 mark to give SDSU its largest lead of the night at 51-26.

In addition to Trammell's production, which included four assists, the Aztecs received nine points from Johnson, while Matt Bradley and Micah Parrish pulled down six rebounds apiece, with the latter notching a collegiate best.

After a slow start, UCSD's Bryce Pope scored 16 of his game-high 20 points on 7-of-11 shooting in the second half, while Francis Nwaokorie totaled nine points and seven boards for the Tritons in the loss.

SAN DIEGO - Senior guard Matt Bradley scored a season-high 27 points as the San Diego State Aztecs leaned on his strong shooting night to beat Air Force 71-55 on Thursday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

The win was SDSU's 15th straight at Steve Fisher Court, the eighth longest streak in program history, and improved to 31-1 in its last 31 games played at home. In addition, the Aztecs have defeated Air Force for the 16th consecutive time in Viejas Arena and overall is 20-3 in the venue against the Falcons.

Bradley finished the game 9-of-12 from the field, including 6-of-7 from the bonus distance and 3-of-5 from the line. He added three rebounds and an assist and a steal without turning the ball over. He the eighth Aztec, since at least the 1996-97 season, to score at least 25 points without committing a turnover. Of those eight, he played the fewest minutes (31).

The Aztecs (10-3, 1-0 Mountain West) started the game knocking down five of its first six shots to take a 12-2 lead capped off by a Bradley first of a career-high six 3-pointers. With just over 12 minutes left in the half, Bradley continued his hot start when he drove into the lane, beat the first defender, and then acrobatically put the ball in the basket to extend the Aztecs lead to 21-9.

Air Force (9-5, 0-1 Mountain West) would respond with an 11-4 run of its own to cut its deficit to five points with six minutes to go before the half. Bradley would again respond with another triple, his third of the half, to push the Aztecs' advantage to 28-20. After a Jaedon LeDee bucket on the next possession the lead back to double digits, 30-20. Adam Seiko would hit the Aztecs fifth triple of the half, and SDSU took a 36-23 advantage into the break.

Both teams would find buckets hard to come by to begin the second half, but Bradley put the Aztecs offense into high gear again. He sank a 3-pointer on back-to-back possessions to push the lead to a game-high 19 points, 44-25, with 15:13 left in the game.

The teams would trade buckets over the next few minutes, and each time Air Force would close the gap, SDSU would respond with a triple. First it was Micah Parrish nailing a corner three, before Seiko re-established the 19-point advantage on his second trey of the night to put the Aztecs up 59-40 with 7:58 remaining.

Bradley would sink his sixth and final three with just over four minutes to play, putting SDSU out front 66-47 and from there the Aztecs finished the game with a 71-55 victory.

LAS VEGAS — Matt Bradley surpassed 2,000 career points and the Aztecs had another strong offensive performance on Saturday afternoon, en-route to a 76-67 win over UNLV at the Thomas and Mack Center.

The Aztecs (11-3, 2-0 MW) and Rebels (11-3, 0-2 MW) traded buckets early on, with Bradley and Lamont Butler scoring five early points each, before UNLV used an 8-0 run to take a 17-10 lead with just over 12 minutes to play in the first half.

Aguek Arop ended the Rebels run with a dunk off a nice feed from Darrion Trammell to make it a 17-12 game. Trammell would get on the scoresheet himself a few minutes later, connecting on a tough three pointer, making it a two point UNLV lead, 19-17, with 10 minutes to go in the half.

Arop would tie the game at 21-21 and then give the Aztecs the lead 23-21 when he scored on two straight possessions before Trammell made another three to give the Aztecs a 26-23 lead with 7:02 left in the first half. Bradley then sank his second triple of the game to give the Aztecs a 31-23 lead, which capped a 14-2 San Diego State run to retake control of the game. That three gave Bradley 2,000 career points for his career, making him the eighth active player to reach that milestone.

San Diego State would end the half on a 34-16 run over the final 12 minutes to take a 44-33 lead at the halftime break. Bradley finished the half with 14 points, while Arop was a perfect 5-5 from the field for 10 points.

Both teams would find scoring hard to come by to begin the second half, with only the Rebels able to sink a basket in the opening four minutes of the half. Arop then came through again, for his sixth bucket of the game, this one a monster slam to get the Aztecs on the board in the half, and still lead 48-36.

UNLV would then go on a 7-0 run to make it a 48-43 game with 12:30 left, before Bradley and Trammell would answer with a run of their own, sinking back-to-back threes, extending the Aztecs lead to 57-43.

The Rebels would go on another run to make it a five point game, 59-54, with 4:08 left before Bradley made two free throws to bring the SDSU lead back to seven, 61-54. Trammell would then ice the game with another three with 1:40 to go to make it a 66-57 game. UNLV would result to fouling for the remainder of the game, but the Aztecs made their free throws to secure the 76-67 win.

LARAMIE, Wyo. — Lamont Butler scored a career-high 23 points, and the Aztecs played tough at altitude to earn an 80-75 win at Wyoming on Saturday afternoon.

The Aztecs (12-3, 3-0 MW) and Cowboys (5-10, 0-3 MW) traded buckets early on, with Butler scoring nine early points and was 3-3 from the three-point line as SDSU took a 14-11 lead early.

Wyoming would respond with a 7-2 run to take a 18-16 lead before Darrion Trammell hit another three for the Aztecs, who took a 19-18 lead with 12:36 left in the first half. San Diego State started the game 5-6 from beyond the arc.

SDSU would stretch the lead to seven, 31-24 with 9:40 remaining in the half when Adam Seiko sank another three. The teams would continue their hot shooting for the rest of the first half, and the Aztecs took a 43-42 lead into the halftime break. In total the Aztecs finished the half 17-29 (58.6%) from the field and 8-14 (57%) from behind the arc.

Wyoming would take an early second half lead, 48-47, with 17 minutes to go before Nathan Mensah made a contested basket at the rim to give SDSU a 49-48 lead. A few possessions later, Seiko picked off a pass and fed Micah Parrish who drilled the triple, giving the Aztecs a 54-50 lead with 15 minutes left in the game.

The Cowboys would respond with a 7-0 run of their own to take a 57-54 lead before Butler sank back-to-back triples, making it a 60-59 Aztecs advantage. Wyoming then took a 69-68 lead with 5:31 remaining before the Aztecs forced their 13th turnover of the game and followed that up with a Jaedon LeDee bucket down low to edge in front, 70-69. On the next possession, Matt Bradley drove to the basket and scored, giving SDSU a 72-69 lead with 3:54 remaining.

Bradley would come up clutch on the next possession to put the game out of reach for the Aztecs when he drained a three to give SDSU a 75-70 lead, and the Aztecs left Laramie with a 80-75 win.

Bradley and Butler finished with a combined 41 points in the win, and the Aztecs made 12 threes on Saturday afternoon.

SAN DIEGO — Matt Bradley had 17 points and 10 rebounds and Lamont Butler added 15 points for No. 23 San Diego State, which beat Nevada 74-65 Tuesday night to take sole possession of first place in the Mountain West Conference.

"We've got to hold onto it," Bradley said. "We have a big target on our back now."

The Aztecs (13-3, 4-0 MWC) dominated on both ends of Steve Fisher Court in a showdown between the last two undefeated teams in the conference to extend their winning streak to six games. Keshad Johnson added 11 points for SDSU, which has beaten Nevada nine straight times.

Nick Davidson had 17, Kenan Blackshear 12 and Jarod Lucas 11 or Nevada (14-4, 4-1), whose six-game winning streak was snapped.

SDSU led 65-43 with 9:10 left before Nevada began pressing in the closing minutes, forcing the Aztecs into turnovers and bad shots and allowing the close to single digits. SDSU didn't make a field goal in the final 5:09.

"That was a great performance," coach Brian Dutcher said. "I thanked them after the game for the last three minutes. I said if they'd have played 40 minutes like they did the whole game, then they wouldn't need any coaching. I thanked them because now I get to coach them a little bit again. We'll work on the press offense."

The Aztecs marked their return to The AP Top 25 by dominating from the opening minute. Keshad Johnson had a steal and scored on an alley-oop slam dunk on a pass from Lamont Butler. Johnson and Butler hit consecutive 3-pointers to give the Aztecs a 10-0 lead and force Wolf Pack coach Steve Alford to take a timeout.

Johnson had a steal and slam dunk for a 42-23 lead late in the first half. It was 44-27 at halftime.

SDSU shot 50% while holding Nevada to 39.7%. The Aztecs outrebounded Nevada 33-29 and made 8 of 21 3-pointers.

BIG PICTURE

Nevada: The Wolf Pack committed three early turnovers in falling behind 10-0 and never recovered. They had six turnovers total in the first half and, although they enjoyed a height advantage, were outrebounded 19-13.

San Diego State: The Aztecs improved to 11-0 at home against Nevada in the MWC era and to 13-1 all-time at home against the Wolf Pack.

Both teams opened the second half with multiple defensive stops, and then the Aztecs ratcheted up its defense. On back-to-back possessions the Aztecs picked off passes leading to an Adam Seiko triple and another Parrish dunk to cut the deficit to three, 40-37 with 13:59 left in the game.

A few minutes later Parrish drilled a three to give the Aztecs their second lead of the game, 44-43. The teams would trade buckets for the next few minutes as the Rams took a 54-53 lead with six minutes to go.

Parrish would make his basket of the game a few minutes later, this one a triple and the foul to tie the game at 56-56. He then made the following free-throw to give the Aztecs a 57-56 advantage with 4:59 remaining. Matt Bradley scored on a tough drive to the hoop with 2:59 to go to make it a 59-56 lead for SDSU.

SAN DIEGO — Adam Seiko drained seven three pointers, including six in the first half, and the Aztecs beat Utah State on Wednesday night, 85-75. Seiko finished seven of nine from bonus distance and totaling a career-high 25 points.

Seiko's seven 3-pointers tie David Abramowitz (Feb. 10, 2000 vs. Utah) for the most in a game by an Aztec coming off the bench since at least the 1996-97 season.

In addition to Seiko, it was the Keshad Johnson show early in the game. The junior forward set the tone with a monster block in the opening minute, had five points and three rebounds in the first four minutes, helping the Aztecs (16-4, 7-1 MW) to an early 7-3 lead. He would finish with his second double double in as many games, (11 points & 10 rebounds) and cracked double figure scoring for the fourth time in the last five games.

Up next it was Seiko who took over for the Aztecs. The senior made three straight from bonus distance to give the Aztecs an 18-11 lead with 11:40 remaining in the first half. He then hit his next two to give him five made threes over seven minutes played as the Aztecs lead ballooned to 17, 28-11 with 7:30 left in the opening stanza.

Utah State (16-5, 5-3 MW) would go on a run of their own to close the gap to 12, 39-27 with 1:30 left in the half, before Seiko hit his sixth triple in the first 20 minutes, tying his career-high. He finished the half a perfect 6-6 from deep and the Aztecs took a 42-27 lead into the break.

The Aggies would begin a comeback in the second half, and cut the Aztecs advantage to nine, 64-55 with just under 10 minutes left in the game. Micah Parrish then hit a deep three to give San Diego State a double-digit advantage again, this time 69-55 with 7:28 left in the game.

Utah State would make another run to cut it to six, 72-66, but Darrion Trammell made a basket to put the SDSU back up eight with 3:20 left. A few possessions later, Lamont Butler drilled another three, San Diego State's 12th of the night, putting SDSU up by double digits again, 79-68 with 2:05 remaining.

Down eight with 1:05 left, the Aggies were forced to foul, but the Aztecs knocked down their last six free throw attempts and emerged 85-75 winners.

The victory is the 16th for San Diego State in the last 22 games against the Aggies and in Viejas Arena, SDSU has defeated Utah State in each of its last nine meetings.

SAN DIEGO — Keshad Johnson scored 16 points and had eight rebounds, while Matt Bradley added 14 points, as the Aztecs beat San Jose State 72-51 on Saturday evening.

In the opening 12 minutes the Aztecs (17-1, 8-1 MW) limited the Spartans (13-9, 4-5 MW) to 5-17 from the field and 1-8 from deep.

Aguek Arop got the crowd into it with a nice pass to Jaedon LeDee who slammed it home to spark an Aztec run, and SDSU took a 22-13 lead with 6:20 left in the first half. Johnson then had another slam, putting the Aztecs up double digits, 24-13.

On the defensive end both Johnson and Arop had blocks in the first half. Arop's came with just under 3 minutes to go in the half, keeping the Aztec advantage in the double digits, 27-14. Then with 1:48 left in the first half, Darrion Trammell picked up a loose ball on the defensive end, threw it ahead to Micah Parrish, who threw a perfect lob to Johnson for his second slam of the night.

SDSU held the Spartans to 0-14 from the field in the final 10 minutes of the first half, taking a 33-14 lead into the halftime break. The Aztecs held San Jose State to 5-20 (25%) from the field in the first half and finished the first half on a 25-3 run.

San Diego State would open the second half on another run, outscoring the Spartans 13-5 over the opening 4:14 in the half, taking a 46-19 lead. During that span Matt Bradley scored six points, while Nathan Mensah added another dunk for the Aztecs.

San Jose State would then punch back, and go on a 18-4 run of their own, cutting the deficit to 51-37 with 10:40 left in the game. The Spartans would continue to chip away at the lead, and made it a 13 point game with 5:31 to play, 59-48.

A few minutes later, Adam Seiko, fresh off of his career-high 25 points on Thursday, drilled a three to give the Aztecs a 66-48 lead and they never looked back from there. Lamont Butler followed that up with a three on the next possession and put SDSU up 69-48 with 3:00 to play. Between the 6:45 mark and the 3:00 mark the Aztecs did not give up a point, and went on a 13-0 run to reestablish control of the game.

Nevada's victory snapped SDSU's nine-game winning streak in the series.

Baker scored five points as Nevada opened the second half with a 14-5 spurt to take a 42-35 lead. But then Lamont Butler drained a 3-pointer and Aguek Arop made a layup as SDSU quickly answered and tied it at 42 with 12:52 to play.

SDSU's Darrion Trammell was assessed a technical foul in the opening minutes when Lucas was knocked down after a whistle in front of the Nevada bench. Some jawing ensued and San Diego State coaches had to restrain some Aztecs players from leaving their bench.

Lucas and Bradley each had 11 points at the 7:23 mark of the first half, more than half their team's total in a 20-20 game.

Lucas, a senior who transferred from Oregon State following the 2021-22 season, scored seven points during a 10-1 Nevada run that erased the Aztecs' 11-4 lead. But neither team had more than a four-point edge the rest of the half and SDSU took a 30-28 advantage into the break.

The combination of SDSU's defense and the absence of Shaver was too much for the Broncos. BSU shot only 33.3% in the first half and was called for a 10-second violation late in the first half. The Aztecs blocked three shots in the first 20 minutes, two by Aguek Arop and one by Mensah.

Mensah blocked a shot with three minutes left that set up a slam dunk by Johnson on an alley-oop pass from Seiko for a 70-50 lead.

Mensah drew 10 fouls and made 9 of 12 free throws.

SDSU opened the game with alley-oop slam dunks by Mensah and Johnson, with Lamont Butler assisting on both, and then began raining 3s on the Runnin' Rebels.

Seiko and Micah Parrish opened the 14-0 run with 3-pointers before the Aztecs showed a strong inside game with three straight slam dunks by Butler, Mensah - who converted a 3-point play - and Bradley to take a 30-11 lead. Butler grabbed a loose ball and swooped in for his dunk and Bradley had a steal to set up his dunk.

Johnson's early points included a 3-pointer and a steal, after which he went coast-to-coast for a layup. Seiko had three 3-pointers in each half.

The Aztecs had 21 turnovers, including 13 in the second half.

Isaiah Hill converted a three-point play and Anthony Holland made a 3-pointer before Jemarl Baker Jr. hit a turnaround jumper to cap an 8-0 run that gave Fresno State a 41-40 lead with 4:51 to play.

Darrian Trammell answered with a layup about a minute later and Jaedon LeDee hit one of two free throws to put SDSU ahead by two.

Hill made a layup that tied it 43-all with 2:42 remaining, but Fresno State went 0 for 6 from the field the rest of the way. LeDee sank one of two free throws with 2:07 left to give the Aztecs a 44-43 lead, and Mensah added a foul shot with six seconds to go. Hill missed a shot for the Bulldogs as time expired.

"I couldn't be more proud of our effort, how we hung together," Dutcher said. "Sometimes when things aren't going well, teams will crumble. They'll separate. They'll get frustrated. And we just stay singularly focused on trying to win the game."

Hill led Fresno State (9-16, 5-9) with 16 points and Eduardo Andre had 10 points, nine rebounds, two blocks and two steals.

The Bulldogs shot 31% (17 of 55) from the field and went just 2 of 25 from 3-point range.

Hill scored 11 points and Andre added eight points with five rebounds in the first half as Fresno State took a 25-23 lead into the break despite shooting 1 of 10 from 3-point distance and committing 10 turnovers.

Fresno State shot 6 of 28 (21.4%) from the field and scored just 18 points in the second half.

San Diego State is 9-0 this season when holding its opponent under 60 points.
