SATURDAY'S PREVIEW...

UNLV (2-5/0-3) plays at home for only the second time in the last 49 days when it hosts first-place San Diego State (6-1/3-1) Saturday night ... The Rebels' final night game of the season, Saturday will also mark the final of three UNLV games appearing on CBS Sports Network in the month of October ... Last Saturday UNLV dropped a 56-27 decision at Fresno State while SDSU won its third straight outing, 27-17, at San Jose State ... UNLV junior quarterback Armani Rogers has not played in the last 18 quarters after getting knocked out of the game at Wyoming. That was the same game he became his school's career leader and moved into 10th place on the Mountain West all-time list for rushing yards by a quarterback with 1,549 ... Redshirt freshman signal-caller and local product Kenyon Oblad has spelled Rogers ever since and now, after earning his first career victory at Vanderbilt, leads the team with 996 passing yards and eight touchdowns ... Running back Charles Williams comes into Saturday ranked second in the MW and 28th in the nation with 97.1 yards per game, including a career-high 168 vs. Arkansas State in Week Two. The "Chuck Wagon" also leads all running backs in the conference with eight rushing touchdowns and three 100-yard games on the ground ... Linebacker Javin White has both of UNLV's interceptions this season and his eight career picks ties him for sixth in the nation among active FBS players. White's also tied for seventh nationally with seven career forced fumbles.

REBELS vs. AZTECS NOTES...

UNLV has played SDSU more than any other original MW team (28 times) and the Aztecs lead the series 18-10 ... The Rebels won last year's meeting to snap a four-game losing skid against SDSU ... Aztec head coach Rocky Long is 22-5 against the Rebels in his career after previously coaching more than a decade at New Mexico ... SDSU's associate head coach/OC Jeff Horton twice worked at UNLV, serving as an assistant in 1990-91 and then as head coach from 1994-98 ... Aztec receivers coach Hunkie Cooper played at UNLV at multiple positions from 1990-91 and later served as the program's radio analyst. He held the UNLV record for most rushing yards in a game by a quarterback with 165 vs. Oregon State in 1991 until Armani Rogers broke that mark with 193 at New Mexico in 2017 ... Second-year UNLV CB coach Steve Irvin played at and graduated from UNLV but later served as a GA coach at SDSU in 2002-03 and then an assistant director of operations for the Aztecs in 2004-05. He returned to Las Vegas after coaching at USD from 2011-17.

REBELATIONS...

at UNR

UNLV lost the turnover battle 5-0 last week at Fresno State (3 INT, 2 F) to mark the first time under Tony Sanchez that the Rebels turned the ball over as many as five times in a game and the first time overall since 2011 vs. Southern Utah. It was the first time UNLV finished as bad as minus-five in turnovers since matching that number during a loss at Utah (6-1) in 2006 ... Sophomore Noah Bean became the first Rebel of the season to earn 100 yards receiving in a game on Saturday and only needed the first half to do it. His 105 yards on two grabs also made him the first UNLV tight end to reach the century mark since Greg Estandia piled up 120 yards on 10 grabs vs. Utah in 2005 ... UNLV punter Hayes Hicken, who sits 35th in the nation with an average of 43.4 yards per attempt (with the 15th-most attempts on the FBS level) certainly had an up and down night vs. Ark State in Game Two. The senior had a career-short 17-yard punt in the first half and a career-long 71-yarder in the second. The former Utah transfer currently ranks third in school history

for career punting average at 43.7 behind only former All-Americans Randall Cunningham (45.6 from 1982-84) and Brian Parvin (44.3 from 1991-92) ... Sophomore RB Chad Magyar made his season debut vs. Boise State after missing the first four games because of personal reasons. Seeing the football for the first time as a collegian he quickly produced, catching two passes for 13 yards and rushing 10 times for a net of 43 yards. Magyar followed that up with a breakout game at Vandy, rolling up 116 yards and his first touchdown on 22 carries. He then added 44 yards on 10 carries at Fresno State ... Calling the plays for the Rebs this season is second-year assistant Garin Justice, who took over as offensive coordinator after veteran OC Barney Cotton announced in July that he was leaving the program to await a heart transplant ... UNLV has not returned a punt for a touchdown in 18 years -- believed to be the longest drought in the nation. The last Rebel to do it was Troy Mason, who went 52 yards vs. San Diego State on Oct. 13, 2001, at Sam Boyd Stadium. Hoping to change that stat is the team's new return man, Jacob Gasser, a receiver who signed with the Rebels in February out of Cerritos College ... Randal Grimes, who transferred to UNLV from USC during the off-season and earned a waiver from the NCAA for immediate eligibility, leads his new team with 26 receptions for 356 yards and four touchdowns through the air ... Preseason First Team All-MW selection Justin Polu, who started the first 40 games of his collegiate career at right guard, moved to right tackle three weeks ago. The local product is on track to become the first First Team All-MW honoree after a season since Tony Terrell in 2002 ... Starting his first game as a Rebel in Week One was linebacker Rayshad Jackson, a graduate transfer from the University of Florida who started three games for the Gators last season before heading to the desert for his final campaign. Jackson is second on the team with 49 total tackles and second with four pass breakups ... Joining Grimes in transferring back home from the Pac-12 Conference during the offseason was RB Biaggio Ali Walsh (Bishop Gorman HS) -- the grandson of the late legendary sports figure Muhammad Ali -- who transferred from Cal and did not play in the first three games because of injury but made his Rebel debut on special teams vs. Boise State.



OBLAD EARNS FIRST WIN IN STYLE AT VANDY

Redshirt freshman QB **Kenyon Oblad**, who graduated from Liberty High School in nearby Henderson as the Silver State's all-time leading passer (since surpassed) with 11,828 yards and 116 touchdowns, relieved three-year starter **Armani Rogers** late in the game against Ark State and completed all three of his attempts, including a 56-yard scoring strike to **Randal Grimes** for his first collegiate touchdown pass. Oblad, who also had one brief appearance during his redshirt season in 2018, saw his first significant action in Week Four at Wyoming, including spelling Rogers the entire second half (16 of 31 for 176 yards with two picks). With Rogers still not 100 percent, Oblad got his first career start vs. Boise State and threw two touchdowns to go with 262 yards and one interception. His 55 pass attempts (24 completions) against the Broncos were the fifth-most in UNLV history and second most by a Rebel freshman. At Vanderbilt, Oblad led his team to a 34-10 win by coolly directing the offense with 11 completions in 16 attempts for 172 yards and two more scores.



At Fresno State he threw a career-high three touchdowns but also a trio of interceptions. He is listed atop the depth chart heading into Saturday's game vs. San Diego State while recently returned Max Gilliam (who started seven games last fall after a Rogers injury) is at No. 2 to begin the week. Amazingly, UNLV has not seen the same quarterback start every game in a season since another local product, Jon Denton out of Green Valley High School, started all 12 in 1996. Oblad is the ninth freshman signal-caller to start for the Rebels since they joined the Mountain West in 1999.

FORMER STAR LB BEAU BELL TO SERVE AS #SBSFAREWELL HONORARY CAPTAIN

The Sam Boyd Stadium Farewell campaign, which features a unique logo and uses the hashtag #SBSFarewell, was launched to help Rebel fans unite around the 49th and final season of their off-campus home that opened in 1971. The department is celebrating the stadium's history during the final season before UNLV football moves to the state-of-the-art, \$2 billion Las Vegas Stadium currently under construction closer to campus. As part of #SBSFarewell, a guest former Rebel great represents all the players from their decade while serving as honorary captain during the pregame coin toss. The season-opener saw the winningest quarterback in school history -- former Dallas Cowboys (NFL) signal-caller **Glenn Carano** (1973-76) -- represent the 1970s players. Then, legendary running back **Elbert "Ickey" Woods** (1984-87) who shuffled his way to the national rushing title as a senior in 1987, repped the 1980s. The 1990s special guest was former receiving great **Randy Gatewood** (1993-94) who not only helped UNLV win a Big West Conference crown and Las



Vegas Bowl championship, but also set two major NCAA records when he caught 23 passes for 363 yards in one game. This week's Honorary Captain is former Mountain West Defensive Player of the Year Beau Bell (2004-07) who was the middle of three Bell brothers who played defense at UNLV during the decade. The star linebacker was a dominant force as a senior in 2007, leading the league in tackles and forced fumbles en route to becoming the program's first MW Defensive Player of the Week three times in the same season. Leaving UNLV ranked second with 320 career tackles, Bell was the top draft pick by the Cleveland Browns (fourth round) in 2008. He eventually made his way to the Philadelphia Soul of the Arena Football League and won two championships as a player, was named 2017 AFL Defensive MVP and winner of the Commissioner's Award, which recognizes an individual who has done considerable work to grow the game of Arena Football, and now serves as assistant head coach and general manager.

HEAD COACH @UNLVSANCHEZ

Tony Sanchez, who built a national powerhouse at Las Vegas' Bishop Gorman High School, is now on his way to creating another consistent winner in town as the 11th head coach in UNLV football history. Named to the job on Dec. 11, 2014, Sanchez in 2015 became the first Rebel coach to win at least three times in his first season since 1999. Sanchez also became only the third UNLV coach to win the fabled Fremont Cannon by defeating in-state rival UNR in his debut campaign and the first to do it on the road.

The improvement continued in 2016 when UNLV won four games and again in 2017 with five victories. That marked the first time in program history the Rebels won more games than the previous season for three straight years. Falling just one victory shy of reaching bowl-eligibility, the '17 Rebels finished with a .500 MW record, winning four league games for only the third time since the conference debuted in 1999. UNLV also won three road games in season for just the second time in 14 years and defeated three consecutive league opponents for the first time since winning the Big West Conference in 1994.

In 2018 the Rebels' 4-8 record included winning at San Diego State for the first time in 18 years and ending the season with the biggest comeback in school history. After trailing UNR 23-0, UNLV went on to down the Wolf Pack 34-29 and make Sanchez only the second UNLV head coach since 1981 to defeat the school's in-state rival more than once.

Sanchez's impact has been felt off the field as well. His unwavering fundraising efforts have led to the construction of the state-of-the-art \$37 million Fertitta Football Complex slated to open on campus this fall. In addition, the Rebels have boasted record success in the classroom, including last year posting the highest semester and cumulative GPA in program history along with earning the most academic all-conference honorees and Dean's List members the football team has ever seen. UNLV in 2017 rewarded Sanchez with a contract extension that will take him through at least the 2021 season.

Sanchez, who turned 45 in January, became a rising star in coaching circles after spending the previous six seasons leading Bishop Gorman to an overall record of 85-5 and six consecutive state 4A championships to go with a top-25 national ranking each year. His 2014 top-ranked Gaels squad finished 15-0 and won the mythical national championship.

The winning head coach at the 2014 All-American Bowl in San Antonio, Sanchez saw 41 of his players earn collegiate football scholarships during his time in Las Vegas, including 31 to FBS programs. Now he has attracted national attention as only the fifth man in the modern era of college football to go from the high school level directly to the position of head coach of an FBS team.

Having come to campus as one of the youngest head coaches on the FBS level, Sanchez is a 1992 graduate of Granada High School in Livermore, California. A decorated two-way player, he went on to become a standout receiver at Laney College in Oakland before transferring to New Mexico State. He would letter two seasons for the Aggies and finished his senior campaign with 42 receptions for 546 yards, including grabbing five passes for 80 yards at Sam Boyd Stadium when he played against UNLV on Nov. 18, 1995. His first taste of coaching came the next season when he served as an undergraduate assistant at his alma mater.

The son of a career policeman in the Oakland area, Sanchez was born Jan. 25, 1974, at Travis Air Force Base in California while his father was serving in the military. He earned a bachelor's degree in family and consumer science from NMSU in 1998 and then his master's in special education in 2003. He has two children: daughter, Alyssa, graduated from Bishop Gorman in 2019 and son, Jason, currently attends Bishop Gorman.

DANDY AT VANDY, WHITE WINS HONOR

UNLV senior linebacker Javin White was named Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week, the league announced October 14. White finished with seven total tackles, including 2.5 tackles-for-loss, and forced two key turnovers to help UNLV stun Vanderbilt, 34-10, in Nashville. The win was the program's first on the road vs. an SEC team and represented the fewest points allowed by a Rebel team in an away game since 2003. White hauled in his eighth career pick in the third guarter and returned it 44 yards to set up a UNLV field goal. Just a few minutes later, he and teammate Rayshad Jackson combined to sack a Commodore quarterback and force a fumble that was recovered by Jamaal Neal and eventually converted into a touchdown. One of four team captains, White is a native of Oakland, California, and graduate of McClymonds High School. He also earned the league's award last November after grabbing two interceptions in UNLV's season-capping win over UNR.

R O G E R S RUNNING TO RECORDS

Armani Rogers already has the UNLV record for yards rushing by a quarterback for a single game (former record 165 by Hunkie Cooper in 1991) with his 193 at New Mexico in 2017, for a season with his 780 (former record 599 by Jason Thomas in 2000), and now in a career (former record 1,528 by Thomas). This despite suffering injuries that cost him nearly three full games in 2017, six in 2018 and three so far in 2019. Rogers, who moved into the top 10 for MW QBs, needs 45 more yards to pass Air Force's Arion Worthman in ninth place (1,593 from 2016-18). Also, one more TD on the ground would move Rogers into a tie for ninth in league history for a QB.

Four players, two from each side of the ball and two of whom are repeat honorees, were voted UNLV football's permanent team captains for the 2019 season. After a vote by players, junior quarterback Armani Rogers (Los Angeles, CA/Hamilton HS) was named a captain for the second straight season after being one of just seven sophomore team captains on the FBS level a year ago. Rogers is joined by junior tight end Giovanni Fauolo Sr. (Oakley, CA/Freedom HS) on the offensive side of the ball. Senior defensive end Gabe McCoy (Pittsburg, CA/Pittsburg HS) is also a repeat selection and will be joined on the defense by



senior linebacker Javin White (Oakland, CA/McClymonds HS). "We are really proud of the group that the guys picked this year," said head coach Tony Sanchez. "Gabe and Armani being voted for the second year in a row tells you a lot about them as teammates. I'm really proud of Javin and the progress he's made and it was great to see him chosen to be a captain along with Gio -- who's become a huge leader in the locker room and all around campus."

REBEL PAIR UP FOR POLYNESIAN HONOR

UNLV senior offensive lineman Justin Polu and junior defensive lineman Kolo Uasike were two of 62 players from around the nation named to the 2019 Watch List for the Polynesian College Football Player of the Year Award. The honor is presented annually to the most outstanding Polynesian college football

player that epitomizes great ability and integrity. Polu (PO-lew) earned a spot on the list for the third straight year while Uasike made his debut. An honors candidate who has started all 36 games of his career at right quard, Polu is a local product (Silverado High School) who was named 2019 Preseason First Team All-Mountain West after helping the Rebels rank 19th in the nation last year with 224 yards rushing per game. Uasika (WAH-skay) was listed atop the depth chart at nose guard heading into fall camp. The Mesa, AZ, product (Skyline HS) played in every game last fall and totaled 24 tackles, including two TFL and a QB sack.

WHITE NAMED TO BUTKUS LIST

UNLV senior defender Javin White became the first Rebel named to the Butkus Award Watch List since John Lotulelei in 2012 as the preseason list for the prestigious award was announced in July. The Butkus Award is awarded each year to the nation's top linebacker on both the collegiate and high school level. Each watch list contains 51 linebackers, mirroring the legendary "51" pro jersey associated with the Award's namesake Dick Butkus. White is a 6-3, 205-pound ball hawk from Oakland, CA, who was named preseason Third Team All-MW by Athlon and Fourth Team by Phil Steele's. Previously a safety, he started all 12 games last year at the strongside linebacker spot. His 74 tackles included 6.5 tacklesfor-loss and two quarterback sacks to with 4 PBU, a team-leading four interceptions and four fourced fumbles. Originally formed in 1985, the Collegiate Butkus Award watch list includes candidates from 39 universities. Semifinalists will be named November 4, finalists November 25, and winners on or before December 10.







OPENING FOR BUSINESS: A STATE-OF-THE ART FOOTBALL HOME

On October 3, UNLV Athletics celebrated the official ribbon-cutting of its new, \$34.8 million, state-of-the-art training center the Fertitta Football Complex. Just over three years ago the department announced the largest single gift in its history as the Fertitta Family pledged an initial \$10 million toward the construction. The 73,000-square-foot, two-level complex was built on campus in the north end of the team's practice area and overlooks the Ernie Becker Sr. Football Fields at Bill "Wildcat" Morris Rebel Park. The FFC will now become the day-to-day home of the program and include an academic center, locker rooms, offices, meeting rooms, strength & conditioning center, media room, training table and nutrition bar, athletic training center and player lounge. A lead gift of \$2 million, which was previously the largest ever earmarked for UNLV Football and came from a donor who wished to remain anonymous, was announced in May 2016. "As I've said since the day I was hired here, I am excited about the future of this program and its limitless potential," said head coach **Tony Sanchez**. "I want to thank the Fertittas for not just this amazing gift but also for everything they do in the community. I also want to thank everyone else who has stepped up with significant and important contributions as they help us turn Rebel Football into a national program."



McCOY WEARING THE WIESNER JERSEY



Before UNLV's home-opening game vs. Southern Utah, senior defensive lineman **Gabe McCoy** was recognized as this year's recipient of the Tom Wiesner Award (pronounced "WEEZE-ner). For the 18th consecutive year, coaches and seniors on the football team selected the player who best exemplifies the courage,

enthusiasm, dedication and toughness of the late Mr. **Tom Wiesner**. McCoy, who started last year as a linebacker, is also in his second year as a team captain. An honors candidate who was named preseason Second Team All-MW by Phil Steele and Third Team by Athlon, has played in every game of his Rebel career and already earned his bachelor's degree from the school. McCoy is the fourth defensive lineman to earn the Wiesner, which is designated with special stitching on the front of his jersey. A Wisconsin native and three-time letterman on the Badger football

team, Mr. Wiesner sought his fortune out West and became one of the Las Vegas' leading businessmen,

philanthropists, politicians and ambassadors. The founder of the successful restaurants that are part of Big Dog's Hospitality Group, Mr. Wiesner helped guide Rebel Athletics from their infancy and was inducted into the UNLV Athletics Hall of Fame as a Distinguished Contributor in 1994. Also a member of the Nevada Board of Regents, he died in 2002 at the age of 63 after a battle with Leukemia.



in 2016. It marked the first time that the Rebels won a game that went longer than one overtime period and set a school record for points in extra time with 17. In 2008, the Rebels won back-to-back OT games at No. 13 Arizona State and then at home vs. Big 12 team Iowa State. They became only the sixth team to ever win in overtime in consecutive games.

1-OF-A-KIND DESIGN

Sam Boyd Stadium underwent a \$1.2 million renovation on its field level in the summer of 2015 that included a new \$800,000 playing surface. Two rows of seats on both the West and East sides were eliminated to create a wider field and a new official stadium capacity for football of 35,500. The highlight of the project, however, was the installation of a new football field for the first time since 2003. The state-of-the-art, 100-percent Made in the USA, SPRINTURF synthetic surface features a shock pad for player safety. Given the advantages of a blank green canvas with no sewn-in markings, UNLV head coach Tony Sanchez looked to go bold with the program's new field design and the Vegas-themed look made national news when the rendering was released. The world-famous "Welcome to Fabulous Las Vegas" sign makes an appearance in the black end zones along with "REBELS" in red. Yardage numbers are displayed in a unique retro Las Vegas font and lay atop red and gray diamonds made famous in the iconic old Stardust hotel sign. The 50-yard-line markers are gray sunbursts taken from the top of the aforementioned Las Vegas sign. Finally, a gray strip borders the entire field. The entire design, including the Mountain West Conference logos and midfield UNLV primary logo, is painted by stadium personnel in the final weeks leading up to kickoff.

With his 82 yards at Fresno State, junior tailback Charles Williams moved into 10th place on UNLV's career rushing list with 1,868. He needs just 58 more to pass another Fresno, California, product, the legendary Ickey Woods (1984-87) into ninth. A total of 65 yards would move Chuck past Omar Love (1992-96) into eighth place. With three 100-yard outings in 2019, the Chuck Wagon has already doubled his career 100yard efforts to six, which ranks 14th in school history. His 455 net yards rushing in the first three games in 2019 represented the most gained by any UNLV player in the first three games of a season. Former Rebel great Lexington Thomas had 425 (with the same amount of carries) at that point in 2017. Williams set the UNLV freshman rushing record (since surpassed by QB Armani Rorgers) with 680 yards in 2016 but missed all but one game in 2017 with an injury.

The Rebels won their opening game for only the second time in the last 10 years powered by big but abbreviated nights by running back Charles Williams (143 yards and three touchdowns on just 15 carries) and quarterback Armani Rogers (144 yards passing to go with 114 yards and two scores on the ground).

UNLV's defense, led by safety Evan Austrie's game-high nine tackles, was stellar as the hosts pushed the lead to 56-7 in the third quarter before the Thunderbirds scored 16 points in mop-up time.

TURNING POINT: After starting with a pair of three-and-outs, Charles Williams sprinted in for the game's first score with a 22-yard rush on third-and-five.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV's seven rushing touchdowns, which came via four different runners, tied the school record set in 1974 vs. Prairie View

REBEL OF THE GAME: After never having scored multiple touchdowns in a game. Charles Williams found the end zone three times as part of his 143yard night. It was the fourth 100-yard game of the junior's collegiate career.

EVANSTON, III. (UNLVRebels.com) -- Playing at Big Ten Conference foe Northwestern (1-1) for the first time since 1998, UNLV football (1-2) saw three costly turnovers quell the team's upset bid in a 30-14 loss at Rvan Field.

The Rebels used two Charles Williams touchdown runs to take a 14-10 lead in the first half and trailed by two points at halftime as the Wildcats answered by hitting two of their three field goals on the day. Williams ran for 132 yards on 12 carries in the first half alone but only gained 12 yards on four attempts after the break as Northwestern made adjustments to stop the iunior standout.

UNLV was still in the game when it missed a 38-yard field goal attempt that would have shaved the Wildcat lead to six points with 10 minutes remaining.

The Rebels were led defensively by linebacker Ravshad Jackson who had 11 total tackles (seven solo) and three pass breakups.

TURNING POINT: UNLV faced a third-and-one at its own 29-yard line while trailing 16-14 in the third quarter. The Wildcats stopped the drive short, forced a punt and two plays later hit a 50-yard touchdown pass to capture the second-half momentum.

LARAMIE, Wyo. (UNLVRebels.com) -- UNLV football (1-3/0-1) scored on its first two drives to take a 10-7 lead before Wyoming (4-1/1-0) reeled off 33 straight points en route to a 53-17 win before a big crowd at War Memorial Stadium

Rebel quarterback Armani Rogers was sharp early, completing five of his first seven attempts, including hitting tight end Gio Fauolo on fourth-and-one for what went for a 54-vard touchdown. That followed a 40-yard field goal by Daniel Gutierrez on the opening drive.

LAS VEGAS (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV football (1-4/0-2) returned home for the first time in nearly a month but fell 38-13 to No. 16/15 Boise State (5-0/2-0) at Sam Boyd Stadium.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Kenyon Oblad out of Henderson's Liberty High School made his first collegiate start as regular starter Armani Rogers continues to rebound from being knocked out of last week's game at Wyoming. Oblad, who graduated as the state's all-time leader in passing yards, threw two touchdown passes as part of his 262-yard night but was sacked five times and threw one interception.

- Oblad threw two touchdowns for the second straight game
- The 10 points were the least scored by any UNLV opponent since an 80-8 win over Idaho State in 2015

REBELS TURN GAME OVER TO FRESNO STATE IN FRIDAY LOSS

FRESNO, Calif. (UNLVRebels.com) - UNLV football (2-5/0-3) lost 56-27 at Bulldog Stadium as Fresno State (3-3/1-1) took advantage of a stunning amount of Rebel turnovers to win going away.

Redshirt freshman guarterback Kenvon Oblad threw for a career-high three touchdowns but also a career-high three interceptions while the UNLV defense, after early success, could not prevent a slew of big plays by the Bulldog offense. The Rebels also lost a pair of fumbles.

THE TURNING POINT: After Fresno State lost momentum by missing a 20-yard field goal attempt with four minutes left in the third quarter. Charles Williams on the very next play and the Bulldogs scooped and scored to take a 35-20 lead. It marked the first fumble returned for a TD by a UNLV opponent since Howard did it on Sept. 2, 2017. Fresno State outscored UNLV 28-0 after the lost fumble.

STAT OF THE GAME: UNLV failed to force a turnover for the third time this season and lost the turnover battle by an eve-popping 5-0 margin as the Bulldogs scored 28 points off turnovers. The Rebels' previous six opponents this season combined for only 31 total points off turnovers.

REBEL OF THE GAME: Sophomore Noah Bean became the first UNLV player this season to post at least 100 yards receiving in a game (and first overall since Darren Woods had exactly 100 vs. San Diego State on Nov. 10, 2018). Bean also became the first UNLV tight end to reach 100 yards receiving in a game since Greg Estandia had 120 on 10 catches vs. Utah in 2005. Bean only needed the first half to do it as he had 105 yards on just two catches at the break.

REBEL NOTES

- Each side finished with 21 total first downs
- UNLV fell to 8-7-1 all-time in games played on Friday
- Kenvon Oblad's three touchdown passes meant the freshman has hit for at least two in three consecutive games
- Randal Grimes had two 12-yard touchdown receptions, which gave him a team-leading four scores through the air this season
- Daniel Gutierrez made both of his field goal attempts to push his streak to five straight
- UNLV has not won away games in back-to-back weeks since 2000 when it traveled to San Diego State on Nov. 25 (W, 31-24) and Hawaii (W, 34-32)
- -Fresno State RB Jalen Cropper's 82-yard scamper was the longest allowed by UNLV since Tyler Ervin of SJSU went 83 yards on Oct. 4, 2014
- Fresno State missed three field goal attempts in the game (46, 50 and 20)
- Fresno native Charles Williams, playing in his hometown for the first time as a Rebel, finished with 107 all-purpose yards, including 82 rushing yards on 25 attempts
