The Wolf Pack Radio Network will call the game on 94.5 FM, 630 AM with John Ramey (play-by-play) and Mike Edwards (analyst) in the booth, with the 60-minute pregame show to begin at 6:30 p.m. PT ... Live stats are available for the game at Nevada. StatBroadcast.com ... The Wolf Pack and Aztecs are a fairly young series with just nine games between them in program history and SDSU ahead six games to three ... Nevada looks to make it two wins in a row for the first time this season after it routed San Jose State, 59-14, last weekend in Reno ... Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream the Tuesday press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conference.

#### **C**REDENTIALS

All requests for credentials & parking passes for Wolf Pack football games should be made through the Nevada Communications Office no later than 48 hours before game time. Please email credential requests to Jack Kuestermeyer (jkuester@unr.edu). Media can reach the Mackay Stadium press box (second level on the west side of the stadium) by using the elevator or the stairways on the north and south ends of the building.

#### WEEKLY RADIO SHOW

Jay Norvell's weekly radio show with John Ramey is on Wednesday evenings from 6-7 p.m. It is available in Northern Nevada on ESPN Radio 94.5 and an archive will be posted on NevadaWolfPack.com/audio within 24 hours. In addition to Norvell, Ramey will interview assistant coaches and players on the show.

#### POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

In general, no coaches or student-athletes are available to media on the field or en route to the locker room, with the exception of the live, originating television broadcast if pre-arranged. Nevada's locker room is closed to the media.

Interview requests should be submitted to Chad Hartley of the Nevada Communications office no later than the five-minute mark of the fourth quarter. Assistant coaches are not available after games. Generally, the Nevada Communications office will live-stream the post-game press conference via the Mountain West Network and archives will be available shortly after the conclusion of the press conferencé.

#### HOME GAMES

Postgame interviews will be conducted in the Peteresen Athletic Academic Center (which will also serve as a photographer work area during games). Coach Norvell will be available to media after the NCAA's 10-minute cooling off period, followed by selected student-athletes.

#### ROAD GAMES

Norvell and selected student-athletes will be available outside the visiting locker room or in the designated visiting media interview area after the cooling off period.

**MEDIA WORK AREA**The Paul R. Stuart Press Box in Mackay Stadium has wireless, ethernet and phone lines available during the game and up to one and half hours after the conclusion of each game. The postgame interview area at the Petersen Athletic Academic Center is similarly equipped. Media may work in either location but are asked to work in the Peteresen location if working more than 90 minutes postgame. The Mackay press box will also serve as a game and media operations location postgame so the Petersen location will likely be a quieter work environment after the conclusion of the press conference.

#### THE GRITIRON

Nevada head coach Jay Norvell and selected players will be available at the Wolf Pack's Gritiron luncheon. Four luncheons will take place throughout the season starting on Sept. 18. The first lunch and lunches on Oct. 9 and Nov. 6 will be held at the El Dorado. There will also be a lunch on Oct. 23 at the Carson Valley Inn. Doors open at 11:30 a.m. and the cost is \$20. This luncheon is open to the media and general public.

#### **P**ARKING

Media parking permits for gameday are available via the Nevada Communications Office are generally for level two of the West Stadium Parking Complex. Local television satellite trucks have designated parking near the main (southwest) entrance to the stadium. These trucks must be in place at least two hours before game time and cannot leave while crowds are present outside the stadium.





# HEAD COACH JAY NORVELL (@CoachJayNorvell)





Jay Norvell was hired as the 26th head football coach in Nevada program history on Dec. 9, 2016, ushering in a new era of Wolf Pack football.

The appointment marks the first head coaching tenure for Norvell, but he is certainly well versed in the game of football with a 31-year coaching career that spans college football's top levels and the National Football League. Norvell, 53, has coached in both the BCS National Championship Game with the Oklahoma Sooners and Super Bowl XXXVII with the Oakland Raiders.

Throughout his three decades of coaching, he has stops at Iowa, Northern Iowa, Wisconsin, Iowa State, the Indianapolis Colts, the Oakland Raiders, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, UCLA, and most recently, Arizona State.

An All-Big 10 defensive back during a stellar playing career at lowa, Norvell has made his coaching mark on the other side of the ball, coordinating offensive schematics while at Oklahoma, Texas and Arizona State. He's tutored a number of top players, including NFL wide receivers Kenny Stills, Sterling Shepard and Marvin Harrison as well Ryan Broyles, who left Oklahoma as the NCAA's all-time receptions leader.

Throughout his career Norvell has had a hand in postseason football as well with 14 bowl game appearances, including the 2009 National Championship, four NFL playoff games and the Super Bowl appearance.

He spent the 2016 season with Arizona State, his only year with that program, before coming to Nevada. Prior to his time with the Sun Devils he served the 2015 season as the wide receivers coach at Texas and took over play-calling responsibilities for the Longhorns at the beginning of the season, helping to produce two wins over top 15 teams.

Before his one year at Texas, Norvell spent seven seasons at Oklahoma, which included three as the assistant offensive coordinator and receivers coach (2008-10), and four years as co-offensive coordinator and receivers coach (2011-14). While with the Sooners he coached three of the top four players on OU's all-time receptions list, including Broyles, Stills and Juaquin Iglesias, oversaw five of the program's top six single-season reception marks, and helped his receiving corps earn 10 all-conference and three academic all-conference first team honors. In 2014, Oklahoma ranked 20th in the nation in scoring offense and was 23rd in total offense.

Under Norvell, the Sooners also had a strong rushing attack as the team ranked 10th in rushing offense in 2014 and was 18th in 2013, which were the program's highest averages since 1990. He worked with a number of talented running backs at OU, including All-Pro Demarco Murray and All-American Samaje Perine.

Prior to his appointment at Oklahoma, Norvell served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at both UCLA in 2007 and Nebraska from 2004-06. The Cornhuskers were one of only two teams in the nation to rank in the top 25 in total offense, scoring offense, rushing offense and passing offense in 2006. That same year Nebraska totaled nine wins and finished the regular season as Big 12 North Division Champions.

Aside from the college game, Norvell coached for six seasons in the NFL, four of which were with the Colts and two with the Raiders. While with Oakland he coached tight ends for two seasons and worked alongside an offense that included Hall of Fame receivers Jerry Rice and Tim Brown. His trip to the Super Bowl in 2002 was led by an offense that led the NFL in total yards and passing yards per game. Norvell joined the Colts coaching staff in 1998 as the wide receivers coach and mentored Harrison to 385 receptions, 5,376 receiving yards and 48 touchdowns during his tenure. His time with the Colts was also the first four seasons of two-time Super Bowl champion Peyton Manning's career.

Norvell was assistant head coach at lowa State from 1995-97 where he worked with quarterbacks and receivers, including Sage Rosenfels, who went on to play with the Minnesota Vikings. From 1989-94, Norvell coached offensive line, receivers and special teams at Wisconsin, which followed his first full-time position as receivers coach at Northern lowa in 1988.

A 1986 graduate of lowa, Norvell was an All-Big Ten defensive back and recorded a league-high seven interceptions in 1985 as he helped the Hawkeyes put together a 10-2 record, a conference championship and a spot in the Rose Bowl. He was a member of the Chicago Bears in 1987 before he began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater.

Norvell, who hails from Madison, Wis., has a wife, Kim, and son, Jaden. He is the author of a book, "Complete Wide Receiver," which was published in 2012.

#### LAST TIME THEY MET

The Wolf Pack scored the highest point total that the Aztecs allowed against a Mountain West opponent last season, but it was not enough as Nevada fell to San Diego State, 46-16.

Donnel Pumphrey ran 26 times for 198 yards and a touchdown and passed DeAngelo Williams for fourth place on the all-time list of FBS rushing leaders for San Diego State.

Pumphrey passed the 6,000-yard mark late in the third quarter and eclipsed Williams' 6,026 yards early in the fourth. It was the first time in four games that Pumphrey played into the fourth quarter and he finished the night at 6,051 yards. With two regular-season games left, he needs 32 yards to pass Tony Dorsett, 229 for Ricky Williams and 347 for Ron Dayne's record.

While Pumphrey made his mark on the record book, Rashaad Penny dazzled with touchdown runs of 40 and 72 yards. Penny had 208 yards on 10 carries.

#### **SERIES HISTORY**

The Wolf Pack and Aztecs have a fairly young series going on between them as they have played just nine games in their program histories. San Diego State leads that nine-game series, 6-3, including the last two contests. The series began in 1945 with Nevada dominating those first two games, but it has mostly been all Aztecs since then, winning four out of five in the last decade.

#### **OH BABER!**

Putting up the performance of his career last week vs. San Jose State, junior Dameon Baber was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week. Baber put up a historic line in the matchup against the Spartans. He scored three touchdowns on the day – two via interception return and one via punt block return – and tied an NCAA record, becoming just the third player in history to score three touchdowns via runback in the same game. He totaled three interceptions in the game, a 59-14 victory over the Spartans.

Baber set a school record with a 100-yard interception return, eclipsing a 96-yard return for a score by Scott Nader from 1972. He also scored on a 39-yard interception return. His first score of the game after a Spartans punt was blocked by teammate Wyatt Demps as Baber scooped and scored from six yards out. This is the second time Baber has picked off three passes in a game. He did so in 2015 as a true freshman against Fresno State. He also has a two-pick game in his career – his Wolf Pack debut at Buffalo, also in 2015.

Baber becomes the second Nevada player to earn conference honors this season, joining running back Kelton Moore, who won the offensive award after Nevada's win over Hawai`i.

#### **DEMPS CONTINUES TO SHINE**

Senior WR Wyatt Demps has been one of the Wolf Pack's top targets all season long. Demps leads the team with 58 receptions and is averaging 12.7 yards per catch. Demps has caught 10 touchdowns through 10 games, which ranks first in the Mountain West and is fourth nationally, eight behind the national leader, David Sills of West Virginia. Additionally his receiving yards total of 734 yards is in the top 45 in the nation, third in the league. He has a streak going of 22 consecutive games with a reception, dating back to last year. Thanks to his two receiving TDs against San Jose State, Demps now has 19 career receiving TDs, which breaks him in to the top 10 at Nevada.

#### MOORE PLEASE

Nevada sophomore RB Kelton Moore is playing some of his best football as of late. Moore has posted over 100 yards on the ground in three of his last five games. Additionally he has touchdowns in four of his last five games with a receiving TD in the win over Hawai'i and multiple games with a rushing TD. Moore is one of the most effective players on offense with over 700 rushing yards and over 150 receiving yards. He is now averaging nearly 6.0 yards per rush and 88.9 all-purpose yards per game.

#### **HONORING RUFUS**

Junior safety Asauni Rufus, one of the undoubted leaders of the Wolf Pack football team, suffered a season-ending injury at Boise State. In the final few games of the season, a different member of the defensive back core will wear Rufus' No. 2 jersey to honor their teammate. Last Saturday against San Jose State, senior Jaden Sawyer was the first player to wear the No. 2 jersey.

#### **SACKS AND WINNING**

Nevada junior DE Malik Reed posted one of the most effective games of his college career last week against San Jose State. The Alabama native made six tackles in the game, 4.5 of which went for a loss and 3.5 of which went for sacks. Reed's 3.5 sacks in that game was a career high and gives him 14.0 in his career, 11th-most in Nevada program history, needing 2.5 sacks to move into the top 10.

#### **HOLY POINTS**

Last week in the win over San Jose State, Nevada put up 59 points, the most points it has scored all season by far, and in turn, are the most points scored in the Jay Norvell era. In fact, it was the most points the Wolf Pack has scored since it recorded 69 points against Hawai'i on Sept. 22, 2012.

#### **SPREAD THE WEALTH**

Nevada and its Air Raid system have spread the wealth out to a high number of its receivers through 10 games. Wolf Pack quarterbacks have found the hands of 20 receivers this season, which is second in the nation behind Clemson. There were three Wolf Pack players who made the first reception of their collegiate careers last Saturday against SJSU; senior Tucker Melcher, junior Dominic Christian and true freshman Elijah Cooks.

### **DEFENSIVE SPARK**

Senior LB Austin Paulhus has established himself as one of the top defenders on the Wolf Pack. In just his second full season on the field with Nevada, Paulhus ranks first on the team with 94 total tackles, approaching the first 100-tackle season of his career. In the team's game against Air Force, Paulhus established a new career high with an almost unheard of 21 tackles, third-most all-time in a single game in program history. Paulhus has been especially good at dragging the opposition down behind the line as he enters week 12 with 11.5 TFLs, which total 28 yards, and include 3.5 sacks. With 9.4 total tackles per game, Paulhus ranks 23rd in the country in that category and fifth in the Mountain West.

#### PACK'S TOP FIVE MARKS IN THE MOUNTAIN WEST

Nevada ranks in the top five in the Mountain West in the following statistical categories: blocked kicks (5th, 1), blocked punts (3rd, 1), defensive TDs (3rd, 2), fewest penalties (4th, 53), fewest penalties per game (4th, 5.3), fewest penalty yards (4th, 464), fewest penalty yards per game (4th, 46.4), fumbles lost (1st, 4), fumbles recovered (4th, 9), kickoff returns (3rd, 21.7), passing offense (2nd, 253.7), sacks allowed (4th, 1.5), scoring offense (5th, 29.2), tackles for loss allowed (4th, 4.6), team tackles for loss (1st, 7.0), turnovers gained (4th, 17).





#### HONORS CONTINUE TO POUR IN FOR CORBETT

Senior offensive lineman Austin Corbett has earned a slew of award nominations this season. Most recently Corbett was named a semifinalist for the Burlsworth Trophy, a semifinalist for the Campbell Trophy, a candidate for the 2017 Senior CLASS Award and received an invitation to the Senior Bowl. He is one of just 63 Division I players to earn the nomination for the Burlsworth Trophy. He was one of 181 semifinalists for the Campbell Trophy, which is presented to the top football scholar-athlete in the nation by the National Football Foundation. Corbett was one of just 30 FBS players from around the country to earn a nomination for the Senior CLASS Award, which recognizes those who excel both on and off the field in four primary categories: community, classroom, character and competition.

### **YOUNG GUNS**

Through 10 games this season, head coach Jay Norvell hasn't wasted any time in getting his true freshmen some experience. So far there have been 11 true freshmen that have seen time on the field for Nevada: QB Kaymen Cureton, DT Chris Green, WR McLane Mannix, DB Nephi Sewell, TE Reagan Roberson, RB Russell Booze, WR Elijah Cooks, DB Austin Arnold, WR Berdale Robins, LB Mar'Quette Jackson and WR Daiyan Henley. Most have made significant contributions too. Mannix has six touchdown receptions and over 600 yards receiving, Henley has three touchdown receptions under his belt, Sewell is flying around on defense with 51 tackles and an interception, Robins totaled over 100 kickoff return yards against Idaho State and Cureton got his first start at QB vs. the Bengals.

Additionally, Nevada has started four of those true freshmen this season (Sewell, Cureton, Mannix, Henley).

#### **BREAKOUT PERFORMANCES**

True freshman WR McLane Mannix turned some heads in the season opener at Northwestern, racking up 76 yards on just two catches, but he has since followed that up with even more impressive outings. To date, the Texas native has made 45 receptions (second on the team) on the year, including a 75-yard touchdown reception against Toledo.

Not only was the 75-yard touchdown reception against Toledo a career long reception for Mannix and a career long pass for QB Ty Gangi, but it was also the longest pass play by the Wolf Pack since 2011 when Tyler Lantrip hit Rashard Matthews for 90 yards against UNLV. At Colorado State Mannix totaled 150 receiving yards, a new career best and his second 100-yard performance of the season. It was the most receiving yards in a game by a Wolf Pack player since Jerico Richardson posted 177 against Southern Utah in 2014.

Mannix began his collegiate career with touchdown receptions in back-to-back-to-back games and is approaching 700 yards receiving. His six touchdown receptions are in the top 50 in the nation, and his total of 650 receiving yards ranks in the top 65 nationally and sixth in the Mountain West.

#### **TWO-DEEPS CLASS BREAKDOWN**

The Wolf Pack's depth chart on offense and defense consists of: nine seniors, 15 juniors, 10 sophomores, eight redshirt freshmen and five true freshmen.

#### **WALK-ON SURPRISE**

In Nevada's game against Toledo, the Pack had a new face on kickoff duty for the second half. Ramiz Ahmed, who had been cleared to play the night before the contest, suited up for the Wolf Pack and handled two kickoffs in the second half. Ahmed impressed in his debut, sending both of his kickoffs well into the endzone for touchbacks. Through his nine games played, he has taken 45 kickoffs and had 26 go for touchbacks. Ahmed made the team via the walk-on tryouts held a couple of weeks prior.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP ALERT**

A total of four Wolf Pack student-athletes, formerly walk-ons, were awarded scholarships during fall camp: senior OL Thomas Newton, junior TE Trae Carter-Wells, sophomore PK Spencer Pettit and sophomore RB Maliek Broady.

#### STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

The Wolf Pack's 2017 schedule consists of eight teams that advanced to bowl games last season; Northwestern, Pinstripe Bowl; Toledo, Raycom Media Camellia Bowl; Washington State, Holiday Bowl; Hawai'i, Hawai'i Bowl; Colorado State, Famous Idaho Potato Bowl; Air Force, NOVA Home Loans Arizona Bowl; Boise State, Cactus Bowl; San Diego State, Las Vegas Bowl.

#### **GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM**

After summer classes had commenced, the Wolf Pack football team posted a cumulative grade-point average of 3.008 for the 5,667 credit hours current members of the team had logged. The 5,667 credit hours take in to account every credit hour by every current member of the team, which dates back to 2013. Nevada is one of just three FBS schools to accomplish this, along with Northwestern and Boise State.

#### **DEGREES COMPLETED**

A total of nine Nevada football student-athletes have already obtained a college degree prior to the start of the 2017 season. That number is tied for sixth-most in the nation along with Kent State, New Mexico, South Alabama, Texas Tech and West Virginia. The Wolf Pack players with degrees in hand are: Justin Brent, Austin Corbett, Ziad Damanhoury, Jimbo Davis, Sean Krepsz, Ryan Mack, Thomas Newton, Jaden Sawyer and Travis Wilson.

#### **OH BROTHER**

Nevada's roster for 2017 contains two sets of brothers: Clifford and Devin Porter, Gabriel and Nephi Sewell. The Porter brothers are local products from Reno and graduates of Hug High School. The Sewell brothers hail from Nevada's neighbor to the east, Utah, and are both graduates of Desert Hills High School in the town of St. George.

#### **LOGGING FEWER MILES**

The difference between miles traveled for Nevada's 2016 season compared to its 2017 season is significantly lighter. Last year, with two trips to Indiana and one to Hawai'i, the Wolf Pack logged a season total of 8,487 miles. In 2017, with just one trip to the Midwest and most others on the western side of the country, the Pack will log just 4,852 miles, a 3,635 mile difference.

#### **PROGRAM HISTORY**

Nevada is in its 111th season of collegiate football, seeking win No. 543 in the program's strong history. The Wolf Pack sports an all-time record of 542-482-33 (.549). Since joining the FBS in 1992, Nevada is 166-148 overall and 108-78 in conference play.

#### **NEW VOICES OF THE PACK**

Trailing 20-17 in the fourth quarter, Thorson directed a 75-yard drive that culminated in his following the block of right guard Tommy Doles to crash the end zone for a 24-20 lead. Thorson scored on another 1-yard plunge with 52 seconds to play, ending Nevada's upset hopes in Jay Norvell's first game as the Wolf Pack's coach.

Nevada led 17-7 lead after a pair of Ty Gangi touchdown passes and Spencer Pettit's 31-yard field goal late in the first half, only to squander the advantage in the third quarter. Following Charlie Kuhbander's 23-yard field goal, Northwestern tied the game at 17 on Thorson's 19-yard TD pass to Riley Lee.

Spencer Pettit's 33-yard field goal with 10:13 to play moved Nevada ahead, 20-17. But Thorson, 6 of 7 pass completions on the subsequent drive and 28 of 38 for 352 yards overall, moved Northwestern to the 1-yard line, then ran it in for the score that gave the Wildcats the lead for good.

**PULLMAN, Wash. (AP)** — Washington State quarterback Luke Falk said the Air Raid offense is a sight to behold when it's clicking.

Falk threw for 478 yards and five touchdowns, and No. 18 Washington State beat Nevada 45-7 for the team's best start in 16 years.

Washington State (4-0), which opened the 2001 season by winning its first seven games, piled up 560 yards of offense and five sacks.

Nevada, which also runs the Air Raid, was held to 151 total yards as the Wolf Pack (0-4) fell to 0-17 on the road against opponents in the Top 25. Nevada came in as a 28-point underdog.

Washington State led 35-0 at halftime.

Nevada coach Jay Norvell felt his team was overmatched by the Cougars of the Pac-12.

"This is the first game where I felt that we didn't handle the physical matchup on the defensive line," he said.

"Overall we didn't mount much of a charge offensively to get us back into the game," Norvell said. "I was disappointed about that."

A 52-yard pass from Falk to Tavares Martin Jr. set up Falk's 12-yard touchdown pass to Jamal Morrow in the first quarter as Washington State took a 7-0 lead.

Falk's shovel pass to James Williams went for 13 yards and a touchdown to put the Cougars ahead 14-0. It was the 100th touchdown pass of Falk's career, passing Matt Leinart of Southern Cal for third in Pac-12 history.

Nevada went three-and-out on its first three possessions and produced only seven yards of offense in the first quarter. Starting quarterback Kaymen Cureton was replaced by David Cornwell, but it didn't help much.

Martin caught a short pass from Falk and turned it into a 40-yard touchdown early in the second quarter for a 21-0 lead.

Williams ran for a touchdown and Jamire Calvin added a 6-yard touchdown reception before halftime.

Falk hit Martin for a 19-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

Maliek Broady ran 3 yards for Nevada's first touchdown with 1:56 left in the game.

**Play of the Game:** Maliek Broady helped the Pack avoid a shutout with a 3-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter.

**Player of the Game:** Nephi Sewell had another career game, recording a total of 10 tackles and picking off a ball late in the game.

**FRESNO, Calif. (AP)** - KeeSean Johnson had seven receptions for 104 yards and a career-high tying three touchdowns and the Fresno State defense forced six turnovers – including three on downs – to help the Bulldogs beat Nevada 41-21 on Saturday night.

Marcus McMaryion completed 24 of 32 passes for 296 yards and two touchdowns and Ronnie Rivers had 12 carries for 82 yards and a score for Fresno State (2-2, 1-0 Mountain West).

Jamire Jordan returned the opening kickoff 71 yards to set up a 10-yard scoring catch by Johnson on the fourth play from scrimmage. After James Bailey blocked Nevada's 45-yard field-goal attempt, Fresno State's Jimmy Camacho hit a 29-yard field goal at the end of the first quarter. Nevada went three-andout on its next three drives – during that span, Josh Hokit hit Johnson on a halfback pass for a 16-yard touchdown – before Jaron Bryant's 18-yard interception return for a touchdown made it 24-0 with 5:05 left in the first half.

Wyatt Demps had a career-high 10 receptions for 96 yards and a touchdown for Nevada (0-5, 0-1). The Wolfpack finished with 23 carries for 61 yards.

**Play of the Game:** In the final minute and a half of the first half, the Wolf Pack scored two touchdowns headed into the locker room. Ty Gangi connected with Wyatt Demps for a 17-yard toucdown, and then Trevion Armstrong from 21 yards out after Nephi Sewell forced a fumble on Fresno State's kick return.

**Player of the Game:** Wyatt Demps caught a career-high 10 passes in the game, totally 96 yards. He hauled in the Wolf Pack's first touchdown with 1:26 left on the clock in the first half, snagging a 17-yard pass from Ty Gangi.

**RENO, Nev. (AP)** - Ty Gangi accounted for five touchdowns, Kelton Moore became the first Nevada player to rush for over 200 yards in a game since 2012 and the Wolf Pack beat Hawaii 35-21 Saturday night for its first win of the season, and the first career win for coach Jay Norvell.

Moore had 19 carries for 216 yards, the first 100-yard rusher for Nevada (1-5, 1-1 MW) this season, and added five receptions for 46 yards and a touchdown. Gangi was 25-of-32 passing for 278 yards and four scores and had a 17-yard TD run.

Hawai'i (2-4,0-3) took a 14-7 lead when Dru Brown connected with Kade Greeley on a 42-yard touchdown pass with 3:55 left in the first half but, on the first play of Nevada's next offensive possession, Moore ran 43 yards to the 28, setting up Gangi's TD run. The Rainbow Warriors were called for three penalties and lost nine yards on their ensuing possession and then were called for two more, including targeting on linebacker Penei Pavihi, as the Wolf Pack went 66 yards in 26 seconds to take a 21-14 lead when Gangi hit Wyatt Demps for a 2-yard score with 18 seconds left in the half.

Moore added a 22-yard touchdown reception and, after a 75-yard scoring run by Hawai'i's Diocemy Saint Juste, Demps scored on a 32-yard catch in the second half. Demps finished with seven receptions for 111 yards.

**How it Happened:** Led by an incredible performance from Kelton Moore and pinpoint efficiency from quarterback Ty Gangi, the Wolf Pack was able to pick up its first win of the 2017 season.

**Play of the Game:** It's hard to pick just one of Kelton Moore's big runs, so we'll pick two. Moore ran for 66 yards in the first quarter and 43 yards in the second quarter. Both big rushes set up a touchdown for the Wolf Pack.

**Player of the Game:** Again, can't pick one. Going to go two. Kelton Moore rushed for 216 yards on 19 carries and coupled his runs with five receptions for 46 yards, including a touchdown. Ty Gangi accounted for all five of the Wolf Pack's touchdowns, completing 25 of his 32 attempts, a completion percentage of 78.

**FORT COLLINS, Colo. (AP)** — Nick Stevens threw three of his four touchdown passes to Michael Gallup and Dalyn Dawkins had a career-high 195 yards rushing, including a 59-yard scoring run, to help Colorado State hold off Nevada for a 44-42 win Saturday night.

Gallup tied his career best with 13 receptions for 263 yards – two shy of Olabisi Johnson's school record set last season. Stevens was 26-of-37 passing for 384 yards, his fifth 300-yard game of the season.

Dawkins' touchdown pulled Colorado State (5-2, 3-1 Mountain West) to 42-38 with 1:57 left in the third quarter and, after the Wolfpack went three-and-out on their next possession, Steven went 5-of-7 for 82 yards, including a 17-yard touchdown to Gallup to cap the scoring.

Nevada, which converted a fourth down earlier in the drive, missed a 35-yard field-goal attempt on fourth-and-1 with 5:33 to play.

Gallup's 56-yard touchdown opened the scoring fewer than 90 seconds in and then his 7-yard scoring catch made it 14-0 with 9:56 left in the first quarter.

Ty Gangi threw for 428 yards and four TDs and running back Kelton Moore had one score passing and another rushing for Nevada (1-6, 1-2).

The teams combined for 1172 total yards, including 608 by the Rams – their third game with at least 600 this season and fifth with 500-plus.

**How it Happened:** In a game where both offensses were ticking, it looked like the last team to score would be the one to win. However, Colorado State outscored Nevada 6-0 in the fourth quarter as Spencer Pettit was unable to make a field gold and the Wolf Pack was unable to convert key fourth downs late in the fourth quarter.

**Play of the Game:** Will the ball in his hand, Kelton Moore rolled right in what appeared to be a run. As the Colorado State secondary bit, Moore cocked the ball back and let it go. The former high school quarterback connected with McLane Mannix for a 57 yard touchdown to knot things up at 14-14.

**Player of the Game:** Ty Gangi. Ganhi completed 23 of his 40 passes for a total of 428 yards, the first Nevada quarterback to eclipse the 400 yard mark since Colin Kaepernick in 2007. Gangi also threw for four touchdowns, tying his career high.

**RENO, Nev. (AP)** - Timothy McVey led three Air Force rushers with 100-plus yards and Luke Strebel kicked a 30-yard field goal as time expired to help Air Force beat Nevada 45-42 on Friday night.

**BOISE, Idaho (AP)** - Brett Rypien threw for 258 yards and two touchdowns and Alexander Mattisonadded a pair of scoring runs to lead Boise State to a 41-14 victory over Nevada on Saturday night.

Boise State (7-2, 5-0 Mountain West Conference) won its fifth straight game and also recorded its fifth consecutive victory over conference rivals.

Nevada (1-8, 1-4), which lost its previous two games by a combined total of five points against Colorado State and Air Force, looked overmatched after putting up a fight early.

After falling behind 7-0 and then again at 14-10 early in the second quarter, Boise State turned to Rypien to spark the Broncos' offense. The result was more than enough firepower to extinguish any hopes Nevada had of an upset.

Rypien delivered a 44-yard pass less than a minute after Nevada had retaken the lead, hitting Cedrick Wilson at the goal line before he tumbled into the end

Leading 17-14, Boise State scored on its next two drives-one on a 1-yard run by Ryan Wolpinand the other on another 25-yard pass from Rypien to Jake Rohas the Broncos built a 31-14 halftime lead.

Mattison added a 6-yard TD jaunt on the Broncos' opening drive of the second half to take a 38-14 lead and the Wolf Pack never threatened after that. Nevada's Kelton Moore was the first running back to eclipse the 100-yard mark

against Boise State's defense this season, finishing with 106 yards. But an inaccurate passing game that threw three interceptions stunted the Wolf Pack's offense all game long.

### TAKEAWAYS

Nevada quarterback Ty Gangi threw three interceptions in a single game for the third time this season, something the Wolf Pack can ill-afford the rest of the season if they hope to notch a victory in their final three games. Nevada's offense has been steadily improving under first-year head coach Jay Norvell, but it's clear there is little margin for error with his young team.

**How it Happened:** Although Nevada was able to score early and make it a game in the first quarter, Boise State's offense surged while the Pack's stalled as Nevada failed to score any second-half points.

**Play of the Game:** Charging down the field on its first drive, Nevada was set up at the four yard line. Going to ole reliable, Gangi handed it off to Moore for a gut touchdown run.

**Player of the Game:** Kelton Moore. Moore went back-to-back with the 100 and games, racking up 106 yards on the ground with a touchdown. Moore is the only rusher to eclipse the century mark against Boise State this season.

**RENO, Nev. (AP)** - Dameon Baber claimed a spot in the NCAA record book with three touchdowns off returns and Nevada pounded San Jose State 59-14 on Saturday.

Baber returned a blocked punt six yards for the go-ahead score near the end of the first quarter, as Nevada (2-8, 2-4 Mountain West) took a 14-7 lead, then intercepted a pass in the end zone and returned it 100 yards for a score. He added another pick six, from 39 yards, in the third quarter, by which time the Wolf Pack led 52-7.

The junior safety intercepted Aaron Montel on the game's opening drive, his first pick since 2015. He finished as the first player in Mountain West history to have a pair of three-interception games and is the third player in NCAA history to score three TDs via runbacks (Johnny Jackson, Houston, 1987 and Antonio Perkins, Oklahoma, 2003).

Ty Gangi completed 16 of 23 passes for 232 yards and three touchdowns and Wyatt Demps had seven catches for 115 yards and two TDs.

Tyler Nevens rushed for 118 yards with a TD for San Jose State (1-10, 0-6).

**How it Happened:** Dameon Baber, that's how. Nevada capitalized off big passes from Ty Gangi and some of the best defensive play in NCAA history from Dameon Baber to snag a total of eight touchdowns and 59 total points, the most since the Pack scored 69 vs. Hawai'i in 2012.

**Play of the Game:** Stepping behind a missed ball and snagging his first pick of the day in the end zone, Dameon Baber took it end zone to end zone for the 100 yard pick six, a program record at Nevada.

**Player of the Game:** Dameon Baber. Baber recorded three picks, including two pick sixes. His two pick sixes were comprised of a 100 yarder and a 39 yarder. Baber also returned a block punt for a touchdown, becoming just the third player in NCAA history to record three touchdowns in the same game off returns.
