Having Matched its Best Start in 20 Seasons, San Diego State Looks for Fifth Consecutive Win at Nationally-Ranked Washington on Tuesday Night in Seattle

Having matched its best start since the 1984-85 NCAA Tournament team, San Diego State (4-1), winners of four straight games for the first time since Dec. 21, 2002-Jan. 3, 2003, concludes a brief two-game road swing at 14th/16th-ranked Washington (5-1) on Tuesday night (rankings as of Nov. 29).

Tuesday's game at Bank of America Arena at Edmundson Pavilion is set for 7 p.m. PST. There is no live television coverage for the contest, although pay-perview streaming video is available through gohuskies.com. The contest can be heard on XPRS-1090 AM (The Mighty 1090).

On Saturday afternoon in Santa Barbara, the Aztecs handed UC Santa Barbara just its seventh home loss in its last 37 home games with a 73-55 victory over the Gauchos. In its first road game of the season, San Diego State was in complete control throughout the game, shooting 60.0 percent from the field while limiting the Gauchos to 38.8 percent shooting from the floor. The Aztecs led by 36 points in the second half before settling for an 18-point victory, the largest margin of victory in a road game for SDSU since an 83-58 victory at Baylor on Nov. 29, 1988.

Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter led the Aztec attack with game-highs of, 24 points and seven rebounds. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath posted his second consecutive game with at least 20 points, tallying 20 points and a game-high seven assists. Junior guard John Sharper added a career-high 15 points as SDSU went 12-of-20 from three-point range.

Washington improved to 5-1 on Sunday afternoon, with an 89-56 victory over Eastern Washington. The Huskies, who are 13-3 on their home court since the beginning of last season, forced 30 turnovers in the game and raced to leads of 23-6, and 39-12 before settling for a 54-29 halftime lead. The starting backcourt of Tre Simmons and Nate Robinson each had 20 points for Washington.

There is not a lot of history between the teams, with Washington winning the only game played between the schools last season, 92-81, at Cox Arena in San Diego.

Brandon Heath Named MWC Player of the Week

Sophomore guard Brandon Heath earned Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors for the period ending December 5.

A native of Los Angeles, Heath averaged team-highs with 23.0 points and 6.0 assists in lopsided victories over San Diego (83-63) and at UC Santa Barbara (73-55).

Heath connected on 16 of his 25 attempts (64.0 percent) from the field and a remarkable 7-of-11 tries from three-point range (63.6 percent).

With a game-high and season-high 26 points against San Diego and 20 points at UC Santa Barbara, Heath now has 11 career games with 20 or more points. In just 35 career games, he has amassed 497 career points, most among all active SDSU players. He also ranks 10th on the school's three-point

field goal chart with 61.

Heath became the sixth different Aztec to win the weekly award since the 2000-01 season. In all, San Diego State players have won the MWC honor 11 times - Aerick Sanders (4), Randy Holcomb (3), Tony Bland, Evan Burns,

Al Faux and Brandon Heath. Heath is the first Aztec winner of the honor since Aerick Sanders claimed the honor on Jan. 5, 2004, following wins over Portland and Iowa State.

Last Time Out: Aztecs Claim Fourth Straight Win; Connect on 60.0 Percent Field Goal Shooting and 12-of-20 From Three-Point Range in 73-55 Rout of UC Santa Barbara

SANTA BARBARA, Calif. - San Diego State connected on 60.0 percent field goal shooting, including 12-of-20 three-point field goal attempts, to avenge its only loss of the season with a 73-55 victory at UC Santa Barbara on Dec. 4.

The Aztecs' 18-point win was their widest margin of victory on the road since an 83-58 victory at Baylor on Nov. 29, 1989 and snapped a 10-game road losing streak dating back to Dec. 3, 2003.

San Diego State, which led for 37:12 of the game and enjoyed a double-digit lead for 24:10, used a 17-0 run early in the second half and led 67-31 with 8:48 to play.

Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter connected on 8-of-13 shots, including 3-of-4 from behind the arc en route to 24 points and seven rebounds. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath added 20 points, his second consecutive and 11th career game with at least 20 points, making 8-of-10 shots, including 4-of-6 from three-point range, while adding seven assists. Junior guard John Sharper added a career-best 15 points and was 3-of-5 from bonus distance.

The offense was only half of the story, as the Aztecs completely shut down the Gaucho attack. UC Santa Barbara shot just 34.6 percent from the field, and had 31 points in the first 31:12 of the game. The Gaucho starting five connected on a mere 11-of-35 from the floor (31.4 percent).

The victory was the fourth straight for San Diego State and avenged an overtime loss to the Gauchos on opening night at Cox Arena. The home opening loss marked the Gauchos seventh defeat in their last 37 home games dating back to the opening of the 2001-02 season.

San Diego State vs. Washington: The Series

- ▶ This is the second half of a home-and-home series between the teams that started last season. Washington was a 92-81 winner on Dec. 27, 2003 at Cox Arena in the only meeting to date between the teams.
- ▶ Steve Fisher is 1-2 lifetime against Wshington. Fisher faced the Huskies on two ocassions while at Michigan, dropping a 65-61 decision in the championship game of the US West Cellular Air Time Tournament on Dec. 30, 1994, before guiding his squad to a 60-59 victory on Dec. 16, 1995, in Ann Arbor, Mich.
- ▶ San Diego State is 26-70 (27.1 percent) lifetime versus the Pac-10 conference. Steve Fisher is 5-11 (31.3 percent) against the Pac-10, although if you take out his seven meetings with Arizona he is 4-5 against the rest of the league.
- ▶ The Aztecs have lost three straight games to Pac-10 teams, although it may be fair to point out those losses are a 92-81 setback to 2004 NCAA Tournament participant Washington on Dec. 27, 2003 at Cox Arena, an 83-71 loss at 5th-ranked Arizona on Dec. 22, 2003 and an 89-81 loss to top-ranked Arizona on Dec. 7, 2002 at Cox Arena. San Diego State's last victory over the league was on Dec. 16, 2000 when the Aztecs defeated Arizona State, 64-62.
- ▶ For the second consecutive season, San Diego State is playing consecutive games against Pac-10 competition. Last season, the Aztecs traveled to 5th-ranked Arizona (L, 71-83) before facing Washington (L, 81-92) five days later at home. This season, San Diego State plays at Wshington (Dec. 7), before returning home to face California (Dec. 11) in the second game of the San Diego SLAM.
- ▶ In addition to playing against the Huskies last season, Aztec senior Chris Manker played against Washington while attending Oregon State. Manker logged one minute against the Huskies. Although not expected to play, senior Travis Hanour also faced the Huskies while a member of the Arizona Wildcats. While at Arizona, Hanour played the Huskies twice, logging 16 minutes and scoring four points and adding three assists.
- ▶ Current Aztecs career statistics against Washington can be found on page four of this release.
- ▶ <u>Last and Only Meeting: Washington 92, San Diego State 81 on Dec. 27, 2003 at Cox Arena.</u> Washington connected on 52.5 percent of its shots and used a 36-25 rebound edge to defeat San Diego State, 92-81, at Cox Arena on Dec. 27.

Coupled with the loss to Arizona earlier in the week, it marked the first time the Aztecs had lost consecutive games during the 2003-04 season and snapped a five-game winning streak following a loss dating back to last season.

The game was tight early, with 11 ties and 17 lead changes in the first half. The Huskies used a 12-3 run to close the first half with a 50-43 lead.

Washington opened the second half with a 10-2 spurt, (22-5 when coupled with the close of the first half) to build a 15 point advantage with 15:19 to play.

The Aztecs chipped away, pulling within four points on four different occasions, the final time at 73-69 with 7:35 left. Will Conroy hit a pair of three-pointers as part of an 11-2 Washington run that secured the victory for the Huskies.

Washington, which entered the game shooting 30.1 percent from three-point range and making 5.2 treys per game, connected on 9-of-20 attempts (45.0 percent). The Huskies were led by Bobby Jones with 19 points.

San Diego State was paced by Brandon Heath who tallied 23 points and added a then career-high four steals. Aerick Sanders continued his brilliant play with 18 points, on 7-of-9 shooting from the field, and eight rebounds. Wesley Stokes recorded his second consecutive nine assist game and also scored 13 points.

Four-Game Win Streak Most Impressive Since 1984

Although the Aztecs have had longer win streaks, you have to go back 20 years to find a more dominating four-game win streak than what SDSU has put together in the last four games.

Since a season-opening loss, San Diego State has posted four victories by a combined score of 311-234, or by 77 total points. That makes an average victory total of 19.3 points during the four-game streak.

The last time the Aztecs put together a more dominating four game run was when the 1984-85 NCAA Tournament team outscored its opponents by 81 points in four consecutive games during December, 1984. The four-game streak was part of an 8-0 record that squad posted to begin the 1984-85 season and marks the last time San Diego State got off to a better start than this season's 4-1 record.

During the four-game winning streak, San Diego State has put together some impressive numbers:

- ▶ San Diego State has shot 54.2 percent from the field during the four-game stretch, shooting above 50.0 percent from the floor in each of the last three games. That is the longest stretch since posting a 50 percent or better field goal percentage in five straight games from Feb. 22-Mar. 8, 2003. Since that time, SDSU shot 50 percent or better from the floor just twice in the 37 games prior to the beginning of the current three-game streak.
- ▶ The Aztecs have held their opponent to 40.1 percent field goal shooting, Since Steve Fisher's arrival at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 33-6 when their opponent shoots 40 percent or less from the field.
- ▶ A staple of the Aztec program has been strong rebounding. San Diego State has outrebounded four of five opponents this season and has a +8.2 rebound margin during the four-game winning streak.

As you might expect, four-game winning streak typically means good things for the rest of the season. The last two times SDSU has had at least a four-game winning streak in a season they have advanced to postseason play (2001-02 NCAA Tournament, 2002-03 NIT) and every season under Steve Fisher's direction that the Aztecs have a had four-game winning streak, SDSU has gone to finish .500 or better.

So Far, So Good

Through five games of the 2004-05 season, San Diego State has shown improvement in nearly every statistical trend over the 2003-04 season. Last season, the Aztecs finished 14-16, snapping a two-year postseason run and three consecutive seasons of finishing .500 or better.

It may be early, but field goal percentage, turnovers and close losses, which gave the Aztecs fits in 2003-04 have not only not been a problem for this San Diego State team, but have actually become one of the strengths.

Making the quick start even more impressive, is the fact that the Aztecs have already

Fast Starts on the Montezuma Mesa

As previously mentioned, San Diego State's 4-1 start matches its best start in the last 20 seasons, since the 1984-85 NCAA Tournament team opened play 8-0. A victory Tuesday would give the Aztecs a 5-1 start and be the best opening to a season since the 1984-85 squad (no other team has gone 4-1 since 1984-85 so the word match could be dropped).

Slaughter House Rules

Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter has gotten off to an explosive start this season. An honorable mention all-conference selection as a freshman, Slaughter is averaging team-highs in scoring (20.4 ppg) and rebounding (8.6). He enters the week among the league leaders in scoring (2nd), rebounding (4th), blocked shots (6th), steals (7th) and field goal percentage (10th).

Slaughter's fast start this season isn't such a big surprise when you track his growth as a player month-by-month throughout his career (see right box). Nonetheless, November easily represented the best month at San Diego State

Other notes on Slaughter's great jump out of the gate.

- ► He has produced double-digit scoring games in the first five games of the season marking the first time in his career the sophomore has scored 10 or more points in as many as three consecutive games.

- ▶ With 102 total points this season, he is 43.0 percent of the way toward matching his freshman point total of 237 points. Last season he did not reach 102 points for the season until his 15th game of the season.
- ▶ He led the Aztecs in scoring just once last season but has already led SDSU in scoring in three of the first five games this season.
- ▶ He is shooting nearly 10 percent better from the field this season, connecting on 56.4 percent this season as opposed to 47.3 last season. He also has alredy connected on four three-point field goals after making just eight last season.
- ▶ He continues to feel right at home at Cox Arena. In 19 career games at Cox Arena, Slaughter is averaging 11.3 ppg, 7.1 rpg, 52.1 field goal percentage (74-of-142) and 39.1 three-point field goal percentage (9-of-23).

Super Manker

Chris Manker could very easily be the biggest surprise in the Mountain West Conference this season. The senior entered this season with career numbers of 206 points and 139 rebounds but has played his way into the starting lineup and ranks among the league leaders (6th in field goal percentage, 10th in scoring, 14th in rebounding and 14th in blocked shots)

- ▶ One reason for his success has been his play in the low post. This season, Manker has 23 two-point field goals, six more than his total for the entire 2003-04 season when he had 17 two-point field goals. He had 34 two-point field goals in 75 career games entering this season.
- ▶ His 76 total points are 76.0 percent of the way toward his career-high season total of 100 points set last season as a junior.
- ▶ The Aztecs are 9-1 when Manker blocks a shot in a game and SDSU is undefeated in his six career starts at the school.

Heath Among League Leaders... In Everything

Sophomore Brandon Heath completed a remarkable week that saw him average 23.0 points, 6.0 assists and 2.5 rebounds in blowout victories over San Diego and at UC Santa Barbara. He connected on 16-of-25 field goal attempts, including 7-of-11 from three-point range.

For the season, a native of Los Angeles, is averaging 16.8 points, 5.2 assists and 3.8 rebounds. He has connected on 13-of-31 three-point field goals for 41.9 percent.

He is currently ranked among the Mountain West Conference leaders in seven statistical categories, including steals (2nd), three-point field goals made (2nd), assists (3rd) and scoring (6th).

Aztecs Enjoy Exhibition Success, Again

Despite substituting at liberty and a few nagging injuries, San Diego State ran its exhibition win streak to eight games with victories over Cal State San Bernardino (82-70) and Point Loma Nazarene (87-67). During those two games, the Aztecs were able to reverse a couple of the trends that proved to be fatal during last season. On the positive side, SDSU shot 48.0 percent from the field, 39.5 percent from three-point range and attempted 55 free throws. However, the Aztecs struggled from the free throw line (61.8 percent) and held a surprisingly small advantage in rebound margin (+4.0).

Individual tidbits from the two exhibition games:

- ▶ San Diego State's three returning starters from last season did not disappoint in the exhibition campaign. Sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter averaged 22.5 points and 7.0 rebounds while playing a total of just 50 minutes. Senior forward Chris Walton showed off his improved long-range shooting skills by connecting on 4-of-5 attempts from behind the line en route to average 16.0 points and 4.5 rebounds in 44 total minutes. Sophomore guard Brandon Heath, who has taken over the role of point guard for large stretches of time, averaged 9.0 points, 2.5 rebounds, but more impressively dished out 13 assists with a mere three turnovers in 49 minutes of action.
- ▶ The Aztecs got strong shooting from the field from their two leading scorers sophomore Marcus Slaughter and senior Chris Walton. The two each cleared 62.5 percent field goal shooting and combined to connect on 28-of-41 attempts (68.3 percent) and an even more impressive 10-of-12 three-point field goal attempts (83.3 percent). The other 11 players on the team combined to connect on 32-of-84 attempts (38.1 percent) and were just 5-of-26 (19.2 percent from beyond the arc).
- ▶ San Diego State showed good ball handling skills, dishing out 41 assists with 26 turnovers in the two games. In fact, the Aztecs had almost as many steals (22) as turnovers (26).
- ▶ Senior center Chris Manker missed the second exhibition game due to a strained tendon in his left foot, but his performance in the first exhibition game should not be overlooked. Manker had eight points, five rebounds and four blocked shots in 20 minutes of action. A native of West Des Moines, Iowa, Manker also produced the best hockey plus/minus number of the contest, with a +20 rating.
- ▶ A trio of newcomers made noise during the two exhibition games. Junior center Mohamed Camara scored 16 points, and added nine rebounds and three blocked shots in 33 minutes of action. The projected starter at center made six of his nine attempts from the field. Freshman point guard Matt Thomas played 43 minutes of action and logged 14 points and four assists, while fellow freshman Tyler Smith had three points and three assists in 29 minutes.

Aztecs Look to Continue Cox Arena Magic

Cox Arena has become quite a home court advantage for the Aztecs during Steve Fisher's rebuilding project at San Diego State. The Aztecs, now in their eighth season at the 12,414-seat on-campus venue, have recorded at least 11 home victories in each of the past four seasons. It is just the second time in school history that SDSU has won 11 home games in four straight seasons (1981-82 through 1984-85).

The numbers have even been better during the last three seasons, with SDSU posting a 37-15 record (71.2 percent). The Aztecs have been particularly hard on non-conference foes, winning 29 of their last 36 (80.6 percent) non-league games. During that span, two of the six losses have come at the hands of nationally-ranked opposition, making SDSU 28-5 against non-ranked non-conference foes since Dec. 9, 2000 (also subtract a non-conference win over 21st-ranked Fresno State during that time.

Postseason Play, Guaranteed

Given Steve Fisher's track record, San Diego State's prospects of returning to the postseason for a third time in four seasons appears to be good. In his 12 full seasons, Steve Fisher has returned at least three starters off a squad he coached the previous season eight times. He has guided all eight of those teams to postseason play, including six of those squads to the NCAA Tournament. Those eight teams have combined to post a 20-5 record in postseason play, including two appearances in the NCAA Tournament championship game (1991 and 1992) and a championship in the NIT (1996).

Some additional notes on Steve Fisher's success when returning at least three starters off a team he has coached.

- ▶ Is 8-for-8 in leading his team to the postseason. Six times he has guided a team to the NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ Has won at least one postseason game in six of those eight seasons and at least two games in five of those eight postseasons.
- ▶ Averaged 22.6 wins in those eight seasons. In six of the eight years his teams have won at least 21 games. Below is a look at Fisher's magic when returning at least three starters from his previous squad.

standings and the MWC poll was no exception, picking the Aztecs to finish seventh; however, a pretty strong case can be made that San Diego State will have a successful 2004-05 season.

- ▶ San Diego State returns four starters and nine letterwinners (includes Travis Hanour who sat out last season due to injuries) from the 2003-04 season. The Aztecs return eight of their top nine scorers from last season.
- ▶ Steve Fisher is 8-for-8 in his career in taking teams to the postseason when returning at least three starters off a team he coached the previous season. Included in those eight postseason trips are six NCAA Tournament berths and an average total of 22.6 wins. The last time a Steve Fisher-coached team returned four starters was 2001-02, when Fisher guided the Aztecs to their first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1985. Twice in his career, Fisher has returned at least three starters and at least nine letterwinners off a team he coached, both seasons he has led his team to the NCAA Tournament, posting a collective 56-14 record.
- ▶ San Diego State returns 77.0 percent of points, 74.2 percent of field goals, 99.4 percent of three-point field goals, 78.0 percent of free throws, 68.6 percent of rebounds, 91.3 percent of assists, 54.9 percent of blocked shots, 85.8 percent of steals and 81.9 percent of minutes from the 2003-04 season.
- ▶ The 2004-05 SDSU roster has played 538 games and made 161 starts. Nine players on the Aztec roster have played in at least 30 college games and five players have made at least 18 college starts. Last season, the Aztec roster (not counting Travis Hanour's total because he missed the season due to injury) entered the campaign with a total of 407 games and 72 starts. In 2002-03 when San Diego State advanced to the second round of the postseason NIT, the Aztecs entered the campaign with 413 games and 152 starts of experience. In 2001-02 when the Aztecs claimed the Mountain West Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament, San Diego State entered the season with 370 games and 194 starts.
- ▶ San Diego State was not that far away last season from making their third consecutive postseason appearance. Although the Aztecs finished 14-16 overall, they lost three games when they led with 59 seconds left, lost six games that were a one possession game with 25 seconds or less remaining and lost seven games when they led with 13:48 or less remaining in regulation. Part of that can be explained by the fact that SDSU had just one scholarship senior (Aerick Sanders).
- ▶ San Diego State returns three players that earned all-Mountain West Conference recognition last season. Senior guard Wesley Stokes, sophomore guard Brandon Heath and sophomore forward Marcus Slaughter are back for SDSU this season. This marks the first time in school history that three all-league performers return from an Aztec team. In fact, in the Mountain West Conference era, San Diego State has never returned two all-MWC performers the following season (2000-01 (0); 2001-02 (0); 2002-03 (1) Tony Bland; 2003-04 (0); 2004-05 (3) Brandon Heath, Marcus Slaughter, Wesley Stokes).
- ▶ San Diego State has two of the best underclassmen not only in the league, but also in the country in Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo was two of only four freshmen to earn all-league recognition last season. Heath and Slaughter combined to score 650 points and pull down 284 rebounds in their inaugural season.
- ▶ Another example of the stability of the Aztec program can be found by the number of players that have signed with San Diego State out of the prep ranks. Of San Diego State's 16-player roster, three are Division I transfers (Travis Hanour, Chris Manker and Wesley Stokes), two junior college players (Mohamed Camara and walk-on Jared Ines) and 11 players who signed with SDSU directly out of high school. Of the five newcomers, four signed with the Aztecs out of high school






