AZTEC HEADLINES

- Following a nine-day layoff for the Christmas holiday, San Diego State returns to the hardwood on Saturday when it opens the ninth annual San Diego Surf 'N Slam against UC Riverside, beginning at 2 p.m. PT inside Viejas Arena. A live video stream featuring Chris Ello on play-by-play will be available at www.goaztecs.com.
- Saturday's second game will pit Kansas State (5-4) against North Carolina State (11-1), starting at 4:30 p.m. PT. The Wolfpack are receiving votes in both national polls this week.
- SDSU is coming off an impressive 75-64 victory over Miami (OH) on Dec. 19 for its first home win of the 2013-14 campaign.
- Against the RedHawks, junior Khristina Hunter registered her second career double-double, scoring a collegiate-best 20 points to go with a season-high 12 rebounds.
- The Aztecs also received a career-best 16 points and seven steals from junior Ahjalee Harvey, while senior Cierra Warren and sophomore Deidra Smith posted 10 points apiece.
- Warren has connected on 60 percent of her field-goal attempts (45-75), which tops the Mountain West and ranks 17th in the nation entering the week. The SDSU center is averaging a team-best 14.4 points per game and has broken the 20-point barrier on three occasions.

#AztecWBB Opens Ninth Annual Surf 'N Slam Against Highlanders

San Diego State kicks off the ninth installment of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic on Saturday when it battles UC Riverside at Viejas Arena.

Despite their relative proximity, the two schools have faced each other just six times in varsity competition, with the Aztecs holding a 4-2 lead in the all-time series.

SDSU has captured the last two meetings, a narrow 54-52 decision at home in 2008, followed by a 66-59 road victory the following season in 2009.

The Aztecs have won 12 of their last 13 encounters against Big West Conference foes dating back to the 2008-09 campaign, including a 71-67 triumph at UC Santa Barbara on Nov. 30.

SDSU has advanced to the championship game of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam each of the last five years, winning three times in 2008, 2009 and 2011, while Texas A&M and Oklahoma State took home the title in 2010 and 2012, respectively.

San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic at a Glance

■ For the eighth time in the tournament's history, the San Diego Surf 'N Slam features a four-team format with two games each day separated by an off-day. The lone exception occurred in 2011 when the event was comprised of three schools (SDSU, Penn, UNC Greensboro) with a single game on three consecutive days.

■ Six different teams from five different conferences have won a tourney championship game in the Surf 'N Slam's eight seasons. SDSU is the only back-to-back winner in 2008 and 2009.

■ Kansas State, North Carolina State and UC Riverside are all making their first Surf 'N Slam appearances. K-State is the fourth Big 12 school to compete in the tournament following Texas (2008), Texas A&M (2010), which bolted for the Southeastern Conference prior to last season, and Oklahoma State (2012). In addition, NC State is the second Atlantic Coast Conference squad in the field joining Wake Forest, which made the trek west in 2009, while UCR is first Big West Conference representative to participate in the event. Current Big West member UC Davis played in the inaugural tournament in 2005, but was still in the transitional phase from the NCAA Division II ranks at the time.

■ SDSU and UC Riverside have met on six previous occasions, while the Aztecs and K-State have tangled with one another in three previous encounters. However, a potential matchup with NC State would be SDSU's first-ever in the 38-year history of its program.

■ The Aztecs sport an all-time Surf 'N Slam record of 11-5. The Aztecs have earned at least a split every season and advanced to the championship game six times (3-3), winning the title on three occasions.

■ A total of five teams have been ranked in the AP Top 25 when playing in the Surf 'N Slam, including No. 14 Oklahoma State last season, along with No. 7 Texas A&M (2010), No. 4 Texas (2008), No. 11 Georgia (2006) and No. 17 George Washington (2006). NC State finds itself just outside the AP Top 25 entering the weekend, landing in the the 28th spot after earning 22 points.

SDSU in Regular-Season Home Tournaments

■ This year marks the ninth straight season that SDSU has played host to a tournament. Prior to 2005, the last time the Aztecs conducted a home tourney was in November of 2000, when SDSU went 1-1 at the Pacific Bell Classic.

■ The Aztecs women's hoops squad has played host to 23 home tournaments in its previous 37 years of existence.

■ SDSU is 21-2 in the first game of a home tournament and has won the team title 12 times, including each of the first four.

■ SDSU has split games in eight of its last 11 home tournaments. The team won the first game and lost the second in 1998, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2010 and 2012, and did the opposite in 2005 and 2007.

■ The Aztecs are 8-2 in the last five Surf 'N Slams, winning the title over No. 4 Texas in 2008, vs. Auburn in 2009, and against Penn in 2011.

Dissecting the Slow Start

The fact that San Diego State sits at 2-6 can be at least partially attributed to the following factors:

▶ **Turnovers** - The Aztecs are committing over six turnovers more per game (22.1-15.9) than their foes this season, compared to last year when they were just one of three teams in the Mountain West to finish with a positive turnover margin (+2.9), along with Fresno State and Colorado State. Opponents have capitalized on SDSU's miscues by maintaining a combined 182-117 advantage in points off turnovers.

▶ **Offensive Rebounds** - Over the first seven games, the Aztecs got outrebounded by an average margin of 15.6-9.9 on the offensive glass. As a result, SDSU's foes maintained a 110-55 advantage in second-chance points during that stretch. The Aztecs showed signs of reversing that trend against Miami (OH), however, out-rebounding the RedHawks 26-5 on the offensive boards.

▶ **Three-Point Field Goals** - San Diego State's opponents have drained a staggering 61 three-pointers on the season for an average of 7.6 per game. The Aztecs have allowed opponents to shoot 36.5 percent from beyond the arc, which ranks 323rd among 343 Division I teams entering the weekend. Conversely, the Scarlet and Black has connected on just 24 treys for the year and combined for just 14 in the six games prior to the UCLA game.

▶ **Schedule** - The Aztecs have played one of the toughest schedules in the country so far this year, featuring a pair of games against AP Top 25 foes in No. 19 South Carolina and No. 23 Texas A&M. As of Dec. 24, SDSU's strength of schedule was rated 15th in the nation, according to Collegiate Basketball News, while realtimerpi.com ranked the Aztecs' slate the 26th toughest. Entering Saturday's contest, the combined record of SDSU's eight previous opponents stands at 54-31.

▶ **Experience** - San Diego State's starting lineup against Miami featured five players who have combined for just 29 starts in an Aztec uniform prior to Dec. 19. With that lack of experience, growing pains are certainly inevitable.

Despite the adversity, four of the Aztecs' six losses have come by a scant 12 points. The youthful SDSU squad has displayed much resiliency during the early part of the season, overcoming a nine-point deficit at UCSB and nearly rallying from a pair of 19-point deficits at Sacramento State and USC. In fact, the Aztecs owned late leads at Sac State and against San Diego, only to cede go-ahead three-pointers by the opposition.

Decembers to Remember

The Aztecs are a combined 32-12 during December since 2006. Six of those losses came to teams either ranked or receiving votes in the national poll, including a defeat to No. 23 Texas A&M earlier this month and a setback to No. 14 Oklahoma State last year in the final of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam. The Aztecs have also come up short in previous years against No. 2 UConn, No. 7 Texas A&M, No. 17 George Washington and USC (rv). The other six defeats were vs. UCLA last Sunday, at Washington in 2012, at Washington State and against USD in 2011, vs. Pepperdine in overtime in 2009 and against Quinnipiac in the opener of the 2007 Surf 'N Slam. Of course, it should be noted that SDSU has played 32 of those 44 December contests at home.

Scouting the Highlanders

UC Riverside (4-7) has dropped four straight, including a 75-59 setback at Arizona in its last outing on Dec. 21. The Highlanders have faced a daunting early-season schedule, falling to Iowa, then-No. 14 Dayton and then-No. 22 Gonzaga, all of whom qualified for the NCAA tournament last year. UCR has battled one Mountain West squad already this season, winning handily at San José State, 105-74, on Nov. 15.

Individually, sophomore Brittany Crain leads the Highlanders in scoring with 18.9 points per game and is UCR's top three-point threat, draining 22-of-54 shots (40.7 percent) from beyond the arc. In addition, fellow classmate Annelise Ito is averaging a team-best 7.5 rebounds per outing, while freshman Simone DeCoud tops the squad in assists (4.1/gm). The youthful Highlanders boast just one senior on their roster, Natasha Hadley, who ranks second on the team in both scoring (12.0 ppg) and rebounding (6.9/gm).

For the season, UCR is shooting 41.6 percent from the field as a team, including a 29.2 percent clip from three-point territory. Aside from Crain's aforementioned 40.7 percent pace from long-range, the rest of the Highlanders lineup is shooting just 23.4 (25-107) from behind the arc. Conversely, UCR has been fairly solid at the free-throw line, converting nearly 70 percent of its foul shots. Yet like San Diego State, the Highlanders have experienced ball-handling issues on occasion, committing almost four turnovers more per game than their opponents.

Head coach John Margaritis is in his 10th year at the helm of the UCR program, having amassed a 142-145 record, highlighted by a trio of first-round NCAA tournament appearances in 2006, 2007 and 2010. Margaritis was named Big West Coach of the Year following the 2006-07 campaign after the Highlanders claimed both the regular-season and conference tournament titles.

Prior to assuming the reins at UCR, Margaritis spent eight seasons as an assistant at Northern Arizona from 1996-2004, following a three-year stint at Cal State San Bernardino, where he served as interim head coach for the 1995-96 campaign. He began his coaching career at his alma mater Northeastern Illinois, where he compiled a record of 83-53 in four years with the NAIA program.

SDSU head coach Stacie Terry has never faced UC Riverside during her coaching career, nor as a player at UT-Arlington. Aztec junior forward Erimma Amarikwa and Highlander sophomore guard Tahvia Morrison both attended Vanden High School in Vacaville, Calif.

With a Victory...

An SDSU win over UC Riverside on Saturday will mean:

- The Aztecs win back-to-back games for the first time this season.
- SDSU improves to 13-1 in its last 14 meetings vs. Big West Conference schools.
- The Aztecs raise their record to 5-2 all-time against the Highlanders.
- SDSU advances to the finals of the Surf 'N Slam for the sixth year in a row and the seventh time overall.
- The Aztecs improve to 33-12 in December games played since the 2006-07 campaign.

The Last Time Out - SDSU vs. Miami (OH)

Bolstered by junior Khristina Hunter's second career double-double, San Diego State snapped a two-game losing streak in a 75-64 triumph over Miami University (Ohio) on Dec. 19 at Viejas Arena.

Hunter scored a collegiate-best 20 points on 8-of-16 shooting to go with a game-high 12 rebounds, helping the Aztecs raise their record to 2-6 on the season. Meanwhile, the RedHawks suffered their second straight setback, falling to 3-7 overall.

Also aiding the SDSU winning effort was junior Ahjalee Harvey, who posted career-highs of 16 points and seven steals, while senior Cierra Warren and sophomore Deidra Smith rounded out a balanced night on offense for the Scarlet and Black with 10 points apiece as Stacie Terry picked up her first victory at home as a head coach.

As a team, the Aztecs dominated the interior, maintaining a 47-29 rebounding advantage, including a hefty 26-5 margin on the offensive end, while outscoring Miami 44-8 in the paint. SDSU also flexed its muscle on defense with a season-high 16 steals, converting 26 RedHawk turnovers overall into 31 points.

Still, Miami hung tough, thanks in large part to a 10-for-24 performance (41.7 percent) from beyond the three-point arc. The Aztecs enjoyed their first halftime lead of the season at 31-26, but the RedHawks narrowed the gap to two at 35-33 following a triple by Haley Robertson with just two minutes elapsed in the second half.

However, SDSU quickly seized the momentum with 12 consecutive points over the ensuing 4:22, including five straight on a layup and a three-pointer by senior Danesha Long to build a 47-33 bulge with 13:38 remaining. The Aztecs led by as many as 15 points on four occasions over the next seven-plus minutes, including a 62-47 spread following a Warren layup at the 6:16 mark, before the Miami threw one last scare into SDSU's festivities.

Baskets by Jessica Rupright and Kindsay Brandt sandwiched around two Hannah Robertson free throws capped an 11-2 Miami run that trimmed the score to 64-58 with just 2:03 on the clock. However, the Aztecs responded with 7-0 spurt, punctuated by freshman Ariell Bostick's layup with 1:03 left to put the game out of reach at 71-58.

Brandt led the Redhawks with 15 points, while Hannah Robertson recorded 12 points and nine rebounds in the loss. Miami also received nine points on 3-for-3 shooting from behind the arc by Hannah McCue, while Haley Robertson and Nicole tallied seven points each.

McCue's only three-pointer in the first half gave the RedHawks their last lead of the contest at 20-18, before consecutive buckets by Long and Harvey nudged SDSU in front for good, 22-20, with 4:51 left in the period. The Aztecs overcame a cold start in which they missed their first eight field-goal attempts by shooting 18-for-39 (46.2 percent) from floor in the second half.

Noting the Miami Game

■ SDSU launched a season-high 78 field-goal attempts and came up with a season-best 16 steals against the RedHawks.

■ The Aztecs improved to 53-1 over the past two-plus seasons when leading with five minutes left in the game.

■ For the first time this season, SDSU committed fewer turnovers (14-26) than the opposition.

■ SDSU collected more offensive rebounds (26-5) than its opponent for the second straight contest.

■ The Aztecs boasted four double-digit scorers in the same game for the first time since the 2012-13 regular-season finale vs. Boise State.

■ In addition to her point total, Khristina Hunter logged career-highs in field goals (8), field-goal attempts (16) and free throws (4).

■ In addition to her points and steals, Ahjalee Harvey also set collegiate-bests in field-goal attempts (17), free throws (5) and free-throw attempts (7).

■ Alyssa Lawrence handed out her first career assist.

Warren Tabbed MW Player of the Week

Senior Cierra Warren (Rancho Cucamonga, Calif.) was named the Mountain West Women's Basketball Player of the Week on Dec. 2 for her dominating performance in the Aztecs' 71-67 victory at UC Santa Barbara.

With her award, the SDSU center garnered her first career weekly conference accolade and the first for an Aztec player this season.

Against UCSB on Nov. 30, Warren scored a team-high 21 points on 9-of-10 (.900) shooting from the floor and a 2-for-2 effort at the free-throw line. She also added one assist, one block and a steal to help SDSU notch its first win of the season.

In the second half, Warren tallied 11 straight points, including the first three-point basket of her career, during a 22-9 run that overturned a 42-33 deficit and catapulted SDSU into the lead for good at 55-51. She also secured the game-clinching rebound after the Gauchos missed a potential game-tying three-pointer with nine seconds remaining in the contest.

Scorching the Nets

San Diego State has finished with a .600 or better field-goal percentage in two games already this season (.623 - at Sacramento State and .652 - at UCSB) after recording just two since the 2000-01 campaign.

For the season, the Aztecs are shooting a collective .434 from the floor, which ranks 60th in the nation entering the weekend. Individually, Cierra Warren ranks 17th nationally with a sparkling .600 field-goal percentage on 45-of-75 shooting.

Nothin' Like Home Cookin'

Despite its 1-3 home record to start the season, SDSU has posted a 60-18 ledger on the Viejas Arena court since the beginning of the 2008-09 campaign and has captured 28 of its last 33 on The Mesa.

AztecWBB Inks Pair to NLI's

San Diego State head coach Stacie Terry inked her first pair of recruits last week with the signing of Cheyenne Greenhouse (Riverside, Calif.) and Lexy Thorderson (Castle Rock, Colo.) to National Letters of Intent. The two high school seniors are set to join the Aztecs for the 2014-15 season.

Greenhouse signs with SDSU out of Canyon Springs High School, where she captured CIF Division 1A co-player of the year honors as a junior last season after leading the Cougars to the Southern Section championship and a berth in the semifinals of the CIF regional tournament.

A 5-11 guard, Greenhouse averaged 18.4 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.4 as-

sists and 2.1 steals during the 2012-13 campaign, earning first-team all-state CIF Division 1A recognition while landing a spot on MaxPreps all-state first team.

"Cheyenne is going to be very important to us because she has can play multiple positions," Terry said. She will add tremendous athleticism to our program with her great leaping ability. Cheyenne is also a very intelligent player and her basketball IQ is off the charts."

Greenhouse makes her signing official as a three-star recruit, according to ESPN HoopGurlz. A three-time all-Inland Valley League selection for head coach Gail Hale at Canyon Springs, Greenhouse also brings three years of club experience with her to The Mesa, having played for Cal Swish in 2011, followed by a two-year stint with the West Coast Premier program. She intends to study biology or pre-medicine at San Diego State.

Thorderson, meanwhile, garnered first-team all-Continental Leagues accolades as a junior last year at Rock Canyon High School after averaging a team-best 16.1 points to go along with 5.7 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 1.3 steals. Under the tutelage of head coach Robbie Ballard, the 6-0 guard/forward received Colorado 5A honorable mention all-state distinction on two occasions in 2011 and 2013.

In a game against eventual state champion Regis Jesuit last February, Thorderson scored 32 points to earn player of the game honors by MaxPreps. Earlier in the season, she also gained recognition as the Denver Post's female student-athlete of the week.

"Lexy's addition will enable us to extend our offense because she is deadly from three-point range," Terry said. "Her ability to knock down that jumper will also help open up the game for our post players."

Thorderson, who also competed at the USA Basketball U16 national team trials in 2011, has a basketball pedigree in her family. Her father Eric Thorderson played collegiately at Wayne State (Mich.) from 1980-85, while two of her sisters, Ali and Abby, earned varsity letters at Weber State. She is undecided on a major at San Diego State, but is considering a career in physical therapy and physical education.

Noting the Newcomers

Of the 12 student-athletes on the current roster, five players will be wearing an Aztec uniform for the first time this season. Cierra Warren practiced with the squad last year but did not compete after transferring from Louisville, while Deidra Smith utilized her redshirt campaign as well, following her transfer from Boston College. In addition, sophomore Deajanae Scurry missed the latter half of the 2012-13 campaign to concentrate on academics.

With San Diego State losing nearly 67 percent of its scoring offense from a year ago, three true freshmen look to gain significant experience this season. Guard Ariell Bostick (Oakland, Calif.) led Bishop O'Dowd High School to a pair of CIF titles, while forward Alyssa Lawrence (New Rochelle, N.Y.) was an all-league and all-section honoree during her prep career. Not to be outdone, Chloe Johnson (Phoenix, Ariz.), who was named the Mountain West preseason freshman of the year, brings strong credentials with her to The Mesa after earning all-state honors for prep powerhouse St. Mary's High, which finished with a No. 1 national ranking in 2011-12.

Meet the New Staff

The talent at Viejas Arena is not just limited to the playing court as head coach Stacie Terry has assembled a prolific staff in her first season on The Mesa.

Assistant coaches Jesse Clark, Aisha Veasley and Ciara Carl bring a vast array of experience with them to "America's Finest City", while Mike Bynum returns for his fourth season as the Aztecs' director of player development.

A native of Tacoma, Wash., Clark spent seven years as an assistant at Saint Mary's College, where he helped the Gaels to four straight WNIT berths, including a quarterfinal appearance in 2012-13. He also had stints at Stanford, San Francisco, CSU Bakersfield and Pacific Union.

Veasley, who enjoyed a successful playing career at UCLA, returns to her Southern California roots after two productive stops as an assistant at Tulsa and Colorado. While at CU, Veasley played a pivotal role as the team's recruiting coordinator, helping to land three top-40 classes.

Carl also has ties to the area, having graduated from Point Loma Nazarene and coaching with San Diego club teams. Most recently, she served an assistant at Metro State in Denver, Colo., following a two-year run at Division II power Cal Poly Pomona.

Aztecs Garner MW Preseason Honors

San Diego State received three preseason Mountain West individual honors on Oct. 15, as forward Erimma Amarikwa was named to the all-conference team, center Cierra Warren was selected newcomer of the year, while guard Chloe Johnson was tabbed the MW preseason freshman of the year.

As a team, the Aztecs were picked to finish third in the MW preseason poll, which was conducted in a

combined panel of the league's 11 head coaches and select conference media members. SDSU collected 196 points and picked up two first-place votes, trailing second-place Wyoming, which received 212 points and four first-place votes, while preseason favorite Fresno State garnered 238 points and 17 first-place votes.

Basketball Performance Center On the Docket

San Diego State Director of Athletics Jim Sterk announced on Nov. 12 that a proposed 23,500-square-foot basketball performance center is under design, with a plan to break ground on the project in late spring 2014.

The \$14.5 million facility, which will be located just south of the Fowler Athletics Center and east of the football practice fields, will include two full-length courts, eight baskets, locker rooms, film rooms, team lounges, athletic training room and coaches locker rooms to help support the Aztec men's and women's championship basketball programs.

Although a majority of the funds have been pledged, fundraising continues for the project which is tentatively scheduled to be completed in 2015.

"This is an exciting day to be able to announce this project is moving forward," Sterk said. "It is a project that will greatly benefit our already successful men's and women's basketball programs. It is also an important day because we are going public with our drive to raise funds for the project and hope that the community that has enjoyed San Diego State basketball will get behind this project."

"The basketball performance center is more than just a building, it is our classroom," SDSU women's basketball head coach Stacie Terry said. "The facility will provide an opportunity for our student-athletes to enhance their individual games, which will in turn benefit our program. It also keeps San Diego State competing at the highest level not only in basketball, but in recruiting as well."

Two For The Show

Former SDSU All-Americans Courtney Clements and Chelsea Hopkins both earned roster spots with the WNBA this past season after completing their illustrious careers for the Scarlet and Black following the 2012-13 campaign. Clements joined the Atlanta Dream as a free-agent rookie last May, while Hopkins was signed by the San Antonio Silver Stars in September.

Clements appeared in 30 games for Atlanta in 2013, becoming the first former Aztec to compete for a WNBA title after the Dream advanced to finals against the eventual champion Minnesota Lynx. The Long Beach native totaled 59 points (2.2/gm) on the year to go with 26 rebounds, eight assists and five steals. Against the Seattle Storm on July 14, Clements recorded a season-best 12 points before logging season highs of five rebounds and 29 minutes played vs. San Antonio on Sept. 15.

Hopkins, meanwhile, averaged 14.3 minutes in three games during a late-season tour of duty with the Silver Stars, finishing with six points, six rebounds and five assists.

What's New in the Mountain West

With the addition of newcomers San José State and Utah State, the Mountain West will have a different look for the third year in a row. Following the departures of Brigham Young and Utah in 2011, the league added Boise State, while Fresno State and Nevada joined the circuit last year after the defection of TCU. The latest realignment means the Aztecs will now have 18 league games this season instead of 16, with the Scarlet and Black facing Wyoming (home) and Nevada (road) just once, while completing a home-and-home slate with the rest of the conference.

The Mountain West Championship, scheduled for March 10-15, 2014, has also been revamped to include three games with the six lowest-seeded teams during the first round. In addition, the four surviving squads from the quarterfinals will have two days to prepare for the semifinal round.

For the 13th consecutive year, Aztec women's basketball fans will have an opportunity to listen to live play-by-play of most regular-season games (home and away) over the internet at www.goaztecs.com.

SDSU alumus Chris Ello will handle the play-by-play duties both at home and on the road for the seventh straight season.

In addition, all Aztec home contests during the 2013-14 regular season will feature a live video stream via the Mountain West Network to supplement the audio call from Viejas Arena.

Up Next

The Aztecs will square off against either Kansas State or North Carolina State on Monday. If SDSU defeats UC Riverside, it would play in the championship final, beginning at 6 p.m. PT. Should the Aztecs falter against the Highlanders, they would tip off in the consolation game, starting at 3:30 p.m. PT. SDSU will then head straight into Mountain West competition on Thursday, Jan. 2, when it plays host to Colorado State at Viejas Arena. Game time for the Aztecs-Rams clash is set for 6 p.m. PT.

Stacie Terry was named the eighth head coach in the history of the San Diego State women's basketball program on May 15, 2013. A native of San Diego, Terry gained a wealth of experience as an assistant coach at the Division I level over the past 14 years, including the last five under head coach Nikki Caldwell, who transferred UCLA into a powerhouse before restoring LSU to national prominence.

During Terry's two seasons at LSU, the Lady Tigers compiled a 45-23 overall record and earned two NCAA tournament bids, including a Sweet 16 appearance during the 2012-13 campaign. This past season, the Lady Tigers also posted six victories against ranked opponents and finished with their second-highest scoring average (69.0) in the last seven years. Under Terry's guidance, forward LaShondra Barrett garnered first-team all-Southeastern Conference accolades and received honorable mention All-America distinction in 2012 before becoming a first-round draft choice of the WNBA's Washington Mystics.

"I am honored and humbled to be the next head coach at San Diego State University," Terry said. "I want to thank Jim (Sterk) and his staff for this amazing opportunity. This is such a special place for me. Not only is this my dream job, but it is home. SDSU is a first class university that has all the resources in place to be successful. I am so eager to get started and confident that we can continue the winning tradition that Aztec supporters have become accustomed to both on and off the court."

Prior to her arrival at LSU, Terry served as an assistant under Caldwell at UCLA from 2008-11, helping the Bruins gain national acclaim with a pair of NCAA tournament appearances. During Terry's tenure, UCLA posted 72 overall victories, as the 2010-11 squad finished with a 28-5 record, setting a school record for fewest losses in a single season to go with a No. 7 national ranking. In addition, the Bruins signed the fourth-ranked recruiting class that season, according to ESPN HoopGurlz, while Terry helped mentor first-team all-Pac-10 performers in Doreena Campbell, Darxia Morris and Jasmine Dixon, a 2012 honorable mention AP All-America selection, as well as all-conference freshman honorees Atonye Nyngifa and Markel Walker.

Terry spent the 2007-08 campaign at Southern Mississippi, as the Golden Eagles posted a 21-14 record and earned a postseason berth in the Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). While at Southern Miss, Terry spearheaded the development and coordination of the Lady Eagle recruiting campaign. Her responsibilities also included working with the perimeter players, scouting opponents and film breakdown, as well as coordinating all of the team's community service events.

Terry also coached for three seasons from 2004-07 as an assistant under Hall of Fame head coach Theresa Grentz at Illinois, where the Fighting Illini had three straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 25 in

the nation, according to Blue Star Basketball, and made three consecutive trips to the WNIT. Her primary duties included defensive instruction and working with the perimeter players.

In addition, Terry coached at Dayton during the 2003-04 season following a three-year stint at Louisville from 2000-03. With the Cardinals, Terry's responsibilities encompassed recruiting, scouting, player development, summer camps and serving as a liaison for the program's community service outreach. Louisville captured the Conference USA regular-season title and earned a trip to the NCAA tournament in 2001 before making a WNIT appearance in 2002. She also assisted in signing the nation's 21st-ranked recruiting class in 2002-03, according to All-Star Girls Report. Terry recruited and coached all-Conference USA honoree Lori Nero, a draft choice of the WNBA's Houston Comets, as well as Sara Nord, who finished her collegiate career as the Cardinals' all-time assist leader and ranks among the top 15 scorers in school history.

Terry enjoyed a successful collegiate playing career at Texas-Arlington, winning four varsity letters from 1994-98 under head coach Mike Dean. She earned first-team all-Southland Conference honors after leading the Mavericks in scoring with 17.4 points per game as a senior in 1997-98. Terry scored 1,169 points during her career at UTA and still ranks among the school's top 10 in three-point field goals made (third), assists (sixth), steals (seventh) and free-throw percentage (10th). She is just one of 17 players in Maverick history to surpass the 1,000-point plateau, while her .335 career three-point field-goal percentage is also a school and Southland Conference career record.

Terry played one season of professional basketball in Warsaw, Poland, averaging 12.0 points and 6.0 assists with the Polonia Phoenix, before returning to Texas-Arlington to begin her coaching career as a graduate assistant in 1999.

Terry, who graduated from El Capitan High, stills holds the Vaqueros' career scoring record and was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2008.
