## San Diego State Looks for Third Straight Home Win in the '07 Home Opener; Plays Host to Portland State Saturday Afternoon Followed By the KGB SkyShow

One of six teams nationally that will enter the weekend not having played a home game, San Diego State (0-2 overall) faces Big Sky Conference member Portland State (1-2) on Saturday afternoon at Qualcomm Stadium. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m.

Approximately 20 minutes following the game, the annual KGB SkyShow fireworks extravaganza will take place. The previous three years the Aztecs have played host to the SkyShow, SDSU has averaged 55,626 fans.

The Aztecs, which have played the seventh-most difficult schedule to date according to the Sagarin Ratings and the 12th-most difficult schedule according to the NCAA, concluded their two-game season-opening tour of the Pac-10 Conference with a 34-13 loss at Arizona State on Saturday night.

The Aztecs hung tough with the Sun Devils, and trailed 14-10 late in the second quarter before ASU struck for 10 points in the final 2:24 to open up a 14-point halftime advantage.

Once again, the Aztec offense impressed, compiling 323 yards of total offense (more than ASU's first two opponents - San Jose State and Colorado - combined). SDSU showed good balance, rushing for 143 yards against the nation's fourth-rated defense entering the game.

Senior quarterback Kevin O'Connell continued his impressive play, going 22-

for-38 for 180 yards. Senior wide receiver Brett Swain passed 1,000 yards in receptions for his career with six catches for 66 yards.

The Aztecs defense showed marked improvement over week one, holding the Sun Devils to four plays or less on four possessions. For the second consecutive week junior cornerback Vonnie Holmes intercepted a pass.

Senior place-kicker Garrett Palmer once again showed why he is one of the best in the nation connecting on field goal attempts of 48 and matching a career long with a 50-yarder. He now has seven field goals of 48 yards or longer in his career.

Portland State, a preseason top 20 team in the Football Championship Subdivision polls, opened Big Sky play last week with a 35-24 win over Sacramento State. The Vikings own a pair of victories over Football Bowl Subdivision teams, having won at Hawai'i in 2000 and at New Mexico last season.

The Aztecs are looking to extend a two-game winning streak at Qualcomm Stadium, having ended the home portion of the 2006 schedule with victories over UNLV (21-7) and Colorado State (17-6). SDSU is looking for a three-game win streak at the Q for the first time since winning four in a row at home during the 2003-04 seasons.

## SDSU Puts Up Fight in Desert, Falls 34-13 at Arizona State

TEMPE, Ariz. – Playing its second straight road game against a Pac-10 Conference foe, the San Diego State football team was unable to change the final result as the Aztecs fell to the host Arizona State Sun Devils, 34-13, in Tempe, Ariz.

SDSU turned the ball over just once at the end of the first half, but lost the battle in total offense (479-323) and was unable to get farther than the ASU 32-yard line on its four drives in the second half.

Aztec senior place-kicker Garrett Palmer accounted seven of the team's 13 total points, including field goals from 48 and 50 yards. The 50-yarder matched his career long, while he also added his 57th consecutive extra point after SDSU's lone touchdown of the night, a three-yard run for a score by quarterback Kevin O'Connell in the second quarter.

ASU, meanwhile, scored on two of its first three and four of its six possessions in the first half. The Sun Devils went up early with a touchdown on their opening drive, taking advantage of a 48-yard punt return.

After an SDSU field goal, the two sides traded touchdowns before Arizona State surged ahead 17-10 with a 48-yard field goal. The Sun Devils tacked on another score just before the half, putting together a 4-play, 76-yard drive that ate up just 36 seconds of clock time and ended with a 30-yard touchdown catch by Rudy Burgess.

Coming out of the locker room, SDSU advanced into ASU territory on two occasions, but was only able to come up with three points before falling, 34-13.

O'Connell ended the night with 218 yards of total offense with 38 on the ground and 180 via the air. Six of his 22 completions on the night went to classmate Brett Swain, who had six catches for 66 yards. Senior running back Brandon Bornes had 73 yards on the ground and matched his second-longest run of his career with a 41-yarder in the second quarter.

For the second straight game an Aztec safety led the team in tackles, as senior Corey Boudreaux had eight in his second career start. Cornerback Aaron Moore added six stops, while sophomore defensive lineman Jonathan Soto had five tackles, including the team's first sack of the season. Cornerback Vonnie Holmes had an interception for the second straight outing, returning it 23 yards in the fourth quarter.

Arizona State running back Keegan Herring ran for 161 of his team's 268 total rushing yards on 19 carries and also added a pair of touchdowns. Rudy Carpenter tossed a pair of TD scores and completed 15 of his 21 pass attempts for 200 yards for the 3-0 Sun Devils.

## Arizona State Postgame Notes

▶ San Diego State amassed 323 yards of total offense against the Devils, easily the most ASU had allowed this season (previous high was 204 against Colorado). SDSU's total offense total is the most allowed by the Sun Devils in Tempe, since 12th-ranked Oregon had 574 yards of total offense last season. Since the game against the Ducks, ASU had allowed the following total offense totals in home games: Stanford (145), Washington State (192), UCLA (274), San Jose State (115) and Colorado (204). Prior to Saturday night, the last five visitors to Sun Devil Stadium had averaged 186 yards of total offense.

▶ San Diego State had nine players catch at least one pass in the game against the Sun Devils, one better than the eight players that caught a pass in the opening contest at Washington State. The nine receivers are the most Aztecs to catch a pass in a game since SDSU had 10 players catch a pass in the game at Air Force on Sept. 10, 2005.

▶ At halftime of Saturday's game, San Diego State had produced more total offense (224) than either of Arizona State's first two opponents (San Jose State and Colorado) amassed in the entire game. Also, the Aztecs rushing total of 112 yards at the half, was greater than the entire game totals for the Spartans and Buffaloes combined (72 yards).

▶ The temperature at kickoff was 92 degrees which ties for the sixth warmest recorded temperature for an Aztec

game at kickoff. It is the warmest temperature for an Aztec game since SDSU experienced 97 degree heat when visiting Tempe on Sept. 8, 2001.

► San Diego State converted the second fake punt of the Chuck Long era on Saturday night when senior punter Michael Hughes rushed for five yards on a fourth and three. The Aztecs are 1-for-1 this season and 2-for-3 in the Long era when attempting a fake on fourth down. San Diego State also converted a fake punt at Wisconsin last season.

► San Diego State had just one turnover against the Devils, an end-of-half Hail Mary that was picked off in the endzone. It marks the second straight game and the seventh time in the last nine games the Aztecs have had one turnover or less. The two turnovers through the first two games are the fewest for an Aztec squad since opening the 1999 season with a pair of turnover-free contests against South Florida and Illinois.

► The Aztecs had two senior wideouts within striking distance of the 1,000 career receiving yards mark entering tonight's game. Brett Swain eclipsed the mark on a catch in the final seconds of the first quarter, while Chaz Schilens fell just one yard short, ending the night with 999 career receiving yards on 74 career receptions.

► Senior place-kicker Garrett Palmer logged his sixth and seventh career field goals of 48 or more yards in the first and third quarters. Palmer has made 13 career field goals for 40 or more yards and matched his career long with the 50-yarder in the third quarter.

► Aztec cornerback Vonnie Holmes already has two interceptions in just two career games. He had one last week versus Washington State and added another Saturday versus Arizona State. His two INTs account for both of SDSU's takeaways this season.

► Aztec place-kicker Garrett Palmer continued his streak of consecutive extra-point attempts made, hitting his 57th straight. The streak dates back to the Ohio State game in 2005.

► Senior wideout Brett Swain logged a reception in his 16th straight game ... Swain has four or more catches in each of the team's two games this season and four or more in 11 of his last 14 outings ... Defensive end Nick Osborn recorded a tackle for the 28th consecutive contest.

► Aztec senior quarterback Kevin O'Connell became just the eighth player in school history to pass for 5,000 or more yards in his career. He also continued to move up the SDSU career record books in other categories, including completions (5th to 4th) and attempts (7th to 5th). O'Connell made his 23rd career start, tying Dan McGwire for fourth all-time.

► Sophomore defensive lineman Jonathan Soto logged his first career sack and tackle for loss in the second quarter ... Tight end Alston Umuolo made his first career catch in his first career game ... Another true freshman Vincent Brown also had his first career reception vs. ASU ... Redshirt freshman Davon Brown had his first career carry in his first career game.

### Scheduling Quirks

Only six Bowl Subdivision (Division I-A) teams in the nation enter this weekend not having played a home game. The Aztecs join Buffalo, Bowling Green, Houston and North Texas, all of whom will open the home portion of their schedule on Saturday. San Jose State does not play a home game until Sept. 29.

This is one of a few scheduling quirks for San Diego State this season.

► The Sept. 8 opener marked the latest season-opener for the Aztecs since opening on the same date in 1991 (49-13 victory over Long Beach State). The last time San Diego State had a later lidlifter was 1985, when SDSU defeated Long Beach State 34-14 on Sept. 14.

► This was the first time since 2002 and just the second time in the last 17 seasons that the Aztecs have opened up on the road. SDSU fell at Fresno State, 16-14, to open up the 2002 campaign. Prior to that, you have to go back to 1990 to find the last time San Diego State opened a season away from home and the last time SDSU opened a campaign outside the Golden State.

► The Aztecs opened the 2007 season with consecutive road games for just the second time in the last 25 seasons. SDSU opened the 2002 campaign with games at Fresno State (14-16) and at 17th-ranked Colorado (14-34).

### San Diego State-Portland State: The Series

San Diego State and Portland State are meeting for the first time in school history. In fact, this will mark the first time the Aztecs have faced a team from the state of Oregon since battling Oregon State on Sept. 23, 2000 (a 35-3 loss). The Aztecs have not defeated a team from the Beaver State, since knocking off Oregon State, 25-0, on Sept. 13, 1975.

### Portland State Connections

► Portland State outside linebackers coach Kevin Emberton and Aztec head coach Chuck Long are both from the state of Illinois. Emberton, a Normal, Ill., native, grew up about two hours southwest of Long, who is from Wheaton, Ill.

► San Diego State head coach Chuck Long previously played under the tutelage of current Portland State offensive coordinator Mouse Davis in the NFL. From 1988-89, Long was a player for the Detroit Lions, while Davis served as the offensive coordinator.

► Davis spent the 2003 season in San Diego as the head coach of the Arena Football League's Riptide.

► Aztec senior defensive back Ray Bass was a member of the football team at the University of Hawai'i in 2004, when Portland State's offensive coordinator Mouse Davis and offensive line coach Brian Smith were a part of the UH coaching staff. Viking head coach Jerry Glanville made his way to Honolulu as the Warriors defensive coordinator.

## Big Sky Country

Although the Aztecs and Vikings are meeting for the first time, this will mark the Aztecs 10th game against current members of the Big Sky Conference, with SDSU owning a 9-0 advantage over current members of the league.

Earlier this decade, San Diego State opened consecutive seasons against members of the league. In 2003, the Aztecs opened at home with a 19-9 victory over Eastern Washington and the following season, SDSU defeated Idaho State 38-21 to open the 2004 campaign.

The other seven meetings between San Diego State and the Big Sky Conference occurred during a four-season span during the late 1960s. The Aztecs faced three opponents from the league during a perfect 11-0 season in 1966, and faced two members of the conference in a 10-1 campaign in 1967.

A few tidbits about SDSU and the Big Sky Conference:

- The last four meetings have all been decided by 17 points or less, with the average margin of victory during that span of 12.5 points.
- San Diego State set its regular-season home attendance record against Big Sky-member Idaho State in the season-opener in 2004. SDSU drew 57,216 for that contest, which also served as the first time the Aztecs played host to the KGB SkyShow.
- In 1966, San Diego State met Montana State in the Camellia Bowl in Sacramento, Calif. The Aztecs claimed a 28-7 victory as Don Horn went 23-of-38 passing for 343 yards and four touchdowns.

## Last Big Sky Meeting: SDSU Opens '04 Season with 38-21 Victory

SDSU 38, Idaho State 21 | Sept. 4, 2004 | Qualcomm Stadium | San Diego, Calif. SAN DIEGO - In front of a record crowd of 57,216, the 2004 Aztecs made a stirring debut as they systematically disposed of Idaho State, 38-21, at Qualcomm Stadium.

Aztec running back Michael Franklin scampered 67 yards for a touchdown on the first play of the season and San Diego State was on its way to a near-perfect first half. The Aztecs jumped to a 24-0 first quarter lead and extended the advantage to 31-0 at the break and eventually 38-0 before ISU dented the scoreboard. SDSU completed the first half without a turnover and without a penalty.

The first quarter was the most prolific for SDSU since it scored 24 points in the second quarter of a 1995 romp over UTEP.

The game would last just over four hours, thanks in part to an Idaho State offense that attempted 69 passes while rushing for just 46 yards.

Junior Matt Dlugolecki won the fall camp quarterback derby and he was strong in his debut, completing 16 of his 27 attempts for 233 yards and two touchdowns, one each to Robert Ortiz and Wesley Williams.

The star of the game, however, was Franklin. He rushed for 101 yards, marking his third straight game over the 100-yard mark. He also led the Aztecs with 84 receiving yards. Franklin ended the game with 233 all-purpose yards despite seeing limited action in the second half.

The Dark Side was its dominating self in the first half when the game was being decided. The first 14 Idaho State possessions resulted in just one drive that lasted more than six plays. The Aztec defense forced four turnovers, including interceptions by Heath Farwell, Josh Dean and Donny Baker. Farwell was also credited with a quarterback sack and caused a fumble.

Redshirt freshman quarterback Kevin O'Connell saw his first collegiate action and found Robert Ortiz for a 32-yard touchdown pass. Ortiz, who entered the game with two career TD grabs, had two more against the Bengals.

The home crowd was the largest in San Diego State history and the 20th-largest crowd in college football on the first full Saturday of the weekend.

### Patience is a Virtue

Although it is easy to forget, history shows us that many of college football's greatest turnarounds take time. Below are some of the modern day "big turnarounds", all of which have ties to Aztec coach Chuck Long through either Hayden Fry or Bill Snyder.

A few notes on the coaches listed above

- ▶ By winning three games in his first season at San Diego State, Long matched or surpassed every coach above in first-year victories with the exception of Hayden Fry. Long won as many games in his first season as K-State's Bill Snyder, Wisconsin's Barry Alvarez and Iowa's Kirk Ferentz - combined.
- ▶ The Good News: The seven coaches above combined to win 28 games in their second season, up from 16 the previous year.
- ▶ The Bad News: None of the seven coaches above enjoyed a winning season in either their first or second campaigns at the school.

### Aztecs to Get Stern Non-Conference Test

In 2007 San Diego State will face three teams from automatic qualifying conferences for the first time in five seasons. This year, the Aztecs face Washington State, Arizona State, Portland and Cincinnati.

In 2002, San Diego State faced Colorado, Arizona State and UCLA in the non-conference portion of the campaign. It marked the sixth straight season the Aztecs faced at least three non-conference games against teams from the power conferences.

This season's non-conference opponents are 9-3, with Arizona State and Cincinnati both currently undefeated and all four non-conference opponents claiming victories last week.

Through last Saturday's games, San Diego State had faced the seventh-most difficult schedule nationally according to the Sagarin Ratings and the 12th-most difficult schedule according to the NCAA.

### Youth Movement

Both of Chuck Long's first two recruiting classes have been highly rated and it has taken little time to get those players out on the field. San Diego State played 12 freshmen (eight redshirts and four true freshmen) in the season-opening game at Washington State and followed that up with 13 freshmen (eight redshirts and five true freshmen) seeing playing time last Saturday at Arizona State.

Including the sophomore class, the Aztecs had 26 players from the sophomore or freshmen classes participate in the opener and 25 players representing those classes in the most recent game against the Sun Devils.

The five true freshmen to see playing time thus far are wide receiver/kick returner Vincent Brown, defensive back Dey Juan Hemmings, defensive back Romeo Horn, defensive lineman Neil Spencer and tight end Alston Umuolo.

In the current two deep on offense and defense (a total of 23 positions), the Aztecs currently list 12 sophomores and nine freshmen.

### Playing as a Freshman is A Privilage Not A Right

Although Chuck Long has said that he will play freshmen who will help San Diego State on the field, playing as a true freshmen at San Diego State is uncommon.

In fact, in the previous three seasons, only eight true freshmen have played (one in 2006, four in 2005 and three in 2004). That of course was prior to this season, where five true freshmen have already seen playing time through two games.

The five freshmen are not only playing, but are earning significant playing time. Vincent Brown caught the first two passes of his career against Arizona State and has returned 10 kickoffs this season. Tight end Alston Umolo caught a pass in his debut against the Sun Devils, and defensive backs Romeo Horn and Dey Juan Hemmings have both seen field time. Defensive tackle Neil Spencer has been in the rotation in both games.

### Bigger is Better

San Diego State football head coach Chuck Long named six players as team captains for the 2007 season at the team's final fall scrimmage on Aug. 25. Seniors Ray Bass (safety), Mike Kravetz (offensive line), Kevin O'Connell (quarterback), Nick Osborn (defensive line) and Chaz Schilens (wide receiver), along with junior Russell Allen (linebacker) were elected by their teammates and introduced at SDSU's Family Day scrimmage at Qualcomm Stadium.

The six captains tie for the most among Division IA schools.

Bass enters his final season on Montezuma Mesa having lettered for the first time in 2006. The safety from Corona, Calif., started six times, tallied 39 tackles and had two interceptions last season. Bass was also valuable in the return game as he ended the campaign ranked eighth in the Mountain West Conference in kickoff return average (20.5 ypr.).

Kravetz, a Las Vegas native, comes into 2007 with 24 career games played and 22 lifetime starts on the offensive line. During his junior year, Kravetz earned the starting nod in all 12 games at right tackle after missing most of 2005 due to injury.

O'Connell enters his senior season atop the quarterback depth chart and has started 21 games during his time at SDSU. After missing six of the first seven games of 2006 due to injury, O'Connell returned to play in the final five contests, three of which were starts, and led the Aztecs to victory in their final game against Colorado State.

Osborn, at defensive end, has played in 32 games in his career at San Diego State, including starting all 12 a year ago. A model of consistency, Osborn has recorded at least one tackle in each of his last 26 outings and was an MWC honorable mention pick in 2006 with 58 total tackles and a quarterback sack.

A two-year starter at wide receiver, Schilens comes into his final campaign having played in all 12 games each of the last two seasons. The Mesa, Ariz., native has at least one catch in 17 of his last 18 contests and has 68 career receptions and four touchdowns in his three seasons at SDSU.

San Diego State's top returning tackler, Allen enters his junior campaign having started every game in 2006. Of his 12 starts, the initial four were at weakside linebacker and the final eight were on the strongside. With his 7.3 tackles per game average, Allen finished the season ranked ninth in the conference and among the top 100 nationally. For his career, Allen has 149 total tackles, four pass breakups and two interceptions to his credit.

### And Nelson Makes 85

On Thursday, Sept. 6, Chuck Long announced that sophomore defensive lineman Peter Nelson was awarded a scholarship. That increases San Diego State to the NCAA limit of 85 scholarships.



## Healthy For Once

It looks as though the Aztecs survived week one with minimal injuries on offense. That is a stark difference from last season when the Aztecs lost their top three tight ends before they took the field for the first time.

Last season, the Aztecs had 84 missed starts due to injury (an average of 7.0 missed starters per game). Most of those injuries occurred on offense, where the Aztecs had a rash of injuries that were particularly devastating to the quarterback, receiver and tight end positions.

In 2007, San Diego State has an opportunity to put an experienced unit on the field. The Aztecs have upperclassmen projected as starters in 11 of 12 offensive positions. The lone exception is at center where Trask Iosefa is starting as a redshirt freshman.


## About the Offense

► San Diego State has shown marked progress from this season to last season. The Aztecs are averaging more points, first downs, total offense, passing offense, rushing offense and a higher third-down conversion while averaging fewer turnovers this season.

► San Diego State is the only team in the nation not to fumble the ball yet this season. Additionally, the Aztecs are one of just eight teams in the nation not lose a fumble in 2007.

► San Diego State has posted 300-plus yards of total offense in consecutive games this season. It is the first time the Aztecs have hit that number in two straight games since the 2005 campaign.

► Against Arizona State, San Diego State produced more total offense (323 yards), than the Sun Devils first two opponents - San Jose State (115) and Colorado (204) - combined. SDSU set season highs for a Sun Devil opponent in rushing offense, passing offense, first downs and third-down conversions.

## O'Connell Set to Run The Offense

One of the most experienced quarterbacks in school history, Kevin O'Connell returns for his senior year at San Diego State.

A native of Carlsbad, Calif., O'Connell is returning 100-percent healthy for the first time since the 2006 opener. Last year, O'Connell broke the thumb on his throwing hand in the third quarter of the season-opening game against UTEP. Although he returned to play in six more games (seven total) and start the final three games of the season, he was never 100 percent healthy.

Because of the injury, O'Connell has stayed off the preseason pub-

lication radar, but with a host of new weapons this season and experience surrounding him, he certainly should be considered one of the top signal callers in the Mountain West Conference.

O'Connell won a quarterback battle last spring and was named the starter at the end of spring ball. For the first time in his career he entered fall camp as the clear-cut No. 1 quarterback.

A dual threat QB, O'Connell already holds the school record for rushing by a signal-caller, with 945 career yards and nine touchdowns rushing. That to go along with with 5,079 career passing yards, completing 457-of-794 attempts (57.6 percent).

Below is a look at some O'Connell numbers:

- ▶ The last full season O'Connell played (as a sophomore in 2005), he was 34th nationally in passing efficiency.
- ▶ O'Connell is one of just 13 players in school history to own a 400-yard passing game.
- ▶ Needs one passing touchdown to tie Rod Downhower (1963-64) for 10th place on the school's all-time chart.
- ▶ Needs just 55 yards rushing to become the first San Diego State quarterback to rush for 1,000 career yards.

### The Stable of Runners

How deep is San Diego State at running back? Well the four players with previous experience carrying the ball - senior Brandon Bornes, senior Lynell Hamilton, sophomore Attiyyah Henderson and senior (quarterback) Kevin O'Connell - have combined to rush for 5,130 yards, 35 touchdowns and 13 100-yard rushing games to their credit.

Although Bornes is currently listed as the starter at tailback and Hamilton is at No. 1 at fullback, expect the Aztecs to have a host of ball carriers this season.

Below is a quick breakdown on the five running backs (not including O'Connell at quarterback) expected to receive a lot of opportunities in the backfield this season.

▶ **Brandon Bornes:** SDSU's leading rusher two seasons ago, Bornes is difficult to bring down at 6-1, 225 pounds... The senior has 1,344 career yards and 11 touchdowns in 37 games... A scholar-athlete, Bornes has a pair of 100-yard rushing games to his credit... Bornes has a current streak of 213 consecutive touches without a fumble and 288 rushing attempts without losing a fumble... In his last 26 games, he has fumbled just once, recovering his own fumble against Wyoming on Nov. 19, 2005.

▶ **Tyler Campbell:** Son of Earl Campbell... Played mostly on special teams a year ago but has had some spectacular moments in practice... He had two touchdowns on just 10 rushing attempts... He ran for more than 1,500 yards as a prep senior at Westlake High School in Austin, Texas.

▶ **Lynell Hamilton:** One in a long line of talented backs to play the position for the Aztecs, Hamilton has earned freshman All-America honors, has been named to the Maxwell Award watch list and is a three-time Doak Walker nominee... As a freshman, he rushed for 1,087 yards in just 10 games before breaking his ankle at UNLV... That started a rush of injuries that have caused him to miss more time... Nonetheless, he remains one of the top running backs in school history, ranking 10th in career yards (2,051)... He will get some carries and remains a dangerous back in the passing game, where he has 54 career receptions... An unselfish player, Hamilton will also get on the field on special teams this season.

▶ **Attiyyah Henderson:** Exploded onto the scene last season as he ranked 74th nationally and eighth among freshmen in rushing yards per game... A native of Rockledge, Fla., Henderson rushed for 764 yards last season, including consecutive games of 142 yards against Air Force and 140 yards versus Cal Poly... He averaged 4.4 yards per rush... Last season he became the third player in four seasons to lead SDSU in rushing as a freshman... He has a streak of 63 consecutive touches without a fumble (48 rushes, 10 receptions)... At 5-9, he is difficult to find in the backfield and gives SDSU a different look from the other options.

▶ **Brandon Sullivan:** A redshirt freshman who has impressed during fall camp... Currently running as co-number two at tailback... Ranked as the 47th-best running back in high school by one recruiting service.

### The O-Line You Know and Love

The one area with very little change from a year ago is the offensive line. In fact three of the five players who have started the first two games this season were in the lineup a year ago in the opener against UTEP. Two of the five players in the starting rotation on the offensive line have started 24 or more career games and three of them have played in 15 or more games in their career.

The offensive line is comprised of three seniors (Fred Amano, Mike Kravetz and Will Robinson), one junior (Mike Schmidt) and redshirt freshman Trask Iosefa.

Although Brandyn Dombrowski did not travel the first two games, he could return to the lineup at any time.

### Return of the Tight End

After losing its top three tight ends before lining up for the opener last season, San Diego State looks as though it has recovered from the rash of injuries that hit the position a year ago. This despite the fact Eric Miclot has yet to return to action and Lance Louis has moved to the offensive line.

The current players in the mix at the position are senior Steve Schmidt and sophomore Matthew Kawulok. In addition, sophomore Waika Spencer and true freshman Alston Umuolo will give the Aztecs options throughout the year.

A year ago, the tight end position produced 10 catches for 107 yards and one touchdown. Those numbers have changed dramatically this season as Schmidt caught seven balls for 58 yards at Washington State and Schmidt, Umuolo and Kawulok combined to catch three passes for 16 yards against Arizona State.

### QB at WR

Junior Darren Mougey, who started three games at quarterback last season and has 10 career games at the position in his two years at San Diego State, has been moved to wide receiver. He has made a smooth transition to the wideout position, as he is currently listed as a starter at the X receiver.

Coaches tinkered with the move during the 2006 fall camp, but that plan was quickly put on hold when starting quarterback Kevin O'Connell went out of the first game with a broken thumb. That put Mougey, at that point the backup quarterback, back to his natural position.

With a healthy O'Connell returning, coaches committed Mougey to the receiver position last spring and it continued into fall camp.

In the opener against Washington State, Mougey received the starting nod, caught four passes for 52 yards and accounted for the Aztecs' only receiving touchdown of the game. The catches were the first since his junior year in high school. With the touchdown reception, Mougey became the second player in the school's Division I era to pass, catch and rush for a touchdown in their career. The only other Aztec to do so was Paul Hewitt (1987-88), who had 28 rushing touchdowns, one passing TD and six receiving scores.

In the desert against Arizona State, Mougey caught five passes for 46 yards. For the season, he is second on the team with nine receptions for 98 yards.

### Other Position Changes

Although Mougey has gotten the most attention for his move, junior Lance Louis has moved from tight end to the offensive line, where he is currently listed as second team at right guard. The staff has been pleased with the progress he has made and they hope to be able to utilize him as a backup at the position.

In addition, the right guard spot has another recent position change in Fred Amano. Amano played in six games at defensive tackle in 2006. He made nine stops, but missed five games due to a knee injury. Amano switched sides of the ball this past summer.

### One at 1K, One More to Go

Senior Brett Swain surpassed 1,000 yards receiving on Saturday, catching six passes for 66 yards against the Sun Devils. He now has 85 receptions for 1,032 yards.

Senior Chaz Schilens is closing in on the mark, currently with 999 career receiving yards. He has 74 receptions and is one yard shy of reaching 1,000 career receiving yards.

### Eight is Great, Nine is Better

SDSU had eight different players log at least one reception against Washington State. It is the most in a single game in the Chuck Long era and the most since Oct. 29, 2005, when the Aztecs also had eight different receivers versus TCU.

The Aztecs followed that up with nine players catching a pass against Arizona State. That marked the most players to catch a pass in a game since San Diego State had 10 at Air Force on Sept. 10, 2005.

### Putting the Performace at Arizona State in Prospective

San Diego State's offensive output against Arizona State may not have been eye-popping, but when compared against the Sun Devils first two opponents, the Aztecs graded out quite well on the curve. The Aztecs posted season-highs for ASU opponents in first downs, third-down conversions, total offense, passing offense and rushing offense.

Below is a look at SDSU's offensive numbers with those of San Jose State and Colorado.

San Diego State amassed 323 yards of total offense against the Devils, easily the most ASU had allowed this season (previous high was 204 against Colorado). SDSU's total offense total is the most allowed by the Sun Devils in Tempe, since 12th-ranked Oregon had 574 yards of total offense last season.

## > THE AZTEC OFFENSE

Since the game against the Ducks, ASU had allowed the following total offense totals in home games: Stanford (145), Washington State (192), UCLA (274), San Jose State (115) and Colorado (204). Prior to last Saturday, the last five visitors to Sun Devil Stadium had averaged 186 yards of total offense.

### **300-Plus Yards**

For the second time in two games this season, San Diego State surpassed 300 yards of total offense. That may not sound like a great accomplishment, but it does mark the first time since 2005 that SDSU has broken the 300-yard mark in consecutive games. Last season, the Aztecs passed the 300-yard benchmark only four times in 12 games.

## New Faces

San Diego State fans will need a roster early on to keep track of the new faces on defense. The Aztecs lost seven starters from last season's squad, including four starters in secondary.

The result is a young group, as few as four seniors could start on defense Saturday, and a revamped 3-4 look to try and take advantage of the strength at linebacker and shift pressure points on the defensive line.

The linebacking corps of Russell Allen, Brett Martin and Luke Laolagi bring a wealth of experience to the unit. The secondary is completely revamped. The D-line is captained by senior Nick Osborn and Siasoi Fifita, while Peter Nelson and Ornan Nwansi will see plenty of playing time.

Entering game week, six freshmen appeared on the Aztec defensive two deep. That group is joined by six sophomores, three of whom are scheduled to start.

## About the Defense

- ▶ San Diego State has gone nine out of the last 11 games without yielding a touchdown on a game-opening drive, and has allowed just 17 total points in the opponents' initial drive of the last nine games.
- ▶ In 2006, opponents started drives in plus territory (inside SDSU territory) 28 times, but came away with points just 14 times. So far this season, an opponent has started its drive in Aztec territory only once.
- ▶ The Aztecs have yielded six points in the fourth quarter in three of its last five games.

Junior linebacker Russell Allen resides over the linebacking corps this season, a group that has included some impressive names of late.

This decade, Matt McCoy, Kirk Morrison and Freddy Keiaho have all been drafted. Joe Martin, who led the 2006 Aztecs in tackles, signed a free agent contract with Baltimore and took part in camp this fall.

Allen takes over the leadership reigns at linebacker, after an impressive sophomore season. He made 88 tackles last season, second on the team, including six behind the line of scrimmage. A native of Oceanside, Calif., Allen has three career double-digit tackle games, including consecutive 10-plus tackle games against Air Force (14 stops) and Cal Poly (10 tackles, all solo) in 2006.

Below is a look at some Allen numbers:

- ▶ Has four or more tackles in 19 consecutive games.
- ▶ Averaging 7.14 tackles over the last two seasons, but over his last nine games, that number has jumped to 7.67.
- ▶ Started 14 consecutive games and has 21 career starts.
- ▶ One of six players to be named team captain during fall camp. He is the only non-

### Get to Know the Secondary

One of the biggest question marks this season for the Aztecs is in the secondary, where SDSU lost all four starters. Three of those four starters had been regulars in the lineup in both 2005 and 2006, as the quartet ended their careers with a combined 162 games played.

Despite the loss of experience, several of this year's players received some field time last season. At the top is senior captain Ray Bass, who played in all 12 contests and started six times. Bass has 39 tackles from his safety position, including four for a loss and added a pair of interceptions in 2006. He returned one of those for a touchdown to earn conference defensive player-of-the-week honors. Bass had eight stops in a pair of contests and also ranked eighth in the MWC in kickoff return average (20.5 ypr.).

Besides Bass, the Aztecs actually have three others with previous starting experience in the secondary. Junior safety T.J. McKay has four career starts and appeared in 25 career contests. A year ago, then redshirt freshman Aaron Moore started three times at cornerback, logging 20 tackles overall. Senior Scotty James, who joined the team in 2006, also was in the starting line-up last season at New Mexico.

San Diego State had a similar lack of experience in the secondary entering the 2005 campaign, when the four positions combined for 18 starts prior to the opener.

### Vonnie Gets a Pick

Junior transfer Vonnie Holmes became just the fifth player on the current Aztec roster to have a career interception, picking off a pass at the 2-yard line in the second quarter of the Washington State game. It is the second straight year in which an Aztec, playing in their first career contest, has recorded an interception in the season-opener. Ray Bass turned the trick in the 2006 game with UTEP.

He followed it up with an interception and a nifty 23 yard return last week against Arizona State.

## Putting the Special in Special Teams

In recent seasons, San Diego State has struggled in at least one area of special teams. That era may be coming to an end as for the first time in recent memory, as the Aztecs appear to possess a game-changing weapon in all of the major areas.

Senior punter Michael Hughes, a 2006 Ray Guy Award nominee, is coming off a spectacular fall camp. The senior suffered an injury to his kicking foot prior to last season that bothered him throughout the campaign. Nonetheless, Hughes still averaged 41.1 yards per boot, including nine kicks of 50 yards or more. This season, he is averaging 39.6 yards per punt with a long of 55 yards. In addition, Hughes has never had one of his punts blocked in 170 attempts.

Senior place-kicker Garrett Palmer capped a productive fall camp by making 10-of-11 field goal attempts in the annual Family Day scrimmage. Palmer booted a 50-yarder at Qualcomm Stadium and received the biggest ovation of the day. Palmer has connected on 57 consecutive extra-point attempts. He also owns 13 field goals from 40 yards or more and seven makes from at least 48 yards out. He went 2-for-2 last week with makes from 48 and 50 yyards.

The biggest difference in special teams this season is in the return game, where the Aztecs feel like they have an explosive pair of return men. Freshman Vincent Brown and redshirt freshman Vonnie Holmes will give SDSU speed in the kickoff and punt return games that has been lacking in recent memory. After two games, Brown has 255 return yards to his credit.
