Provided the Aztecs with solid minutes off the bench in his first eligible season at San Diego State after sitting out 2008-09 following his transfer from Illinois... Has been a member of two NCAA Tournament teams in his career, once at Illinois and last season at SDSU... Played better as the season progressed and was in the regular rotation... Started in the early part of the season... A vocal leader on and off the court... Gives San Diego State a legitimate center and inside presence... Has a nice left-handed touch around the basket and has the ability to knock down the mid-range jump shot... Continues to work on his conditioning.

As A Junior (2009-10 Season)

Averaged 4.7 points and 2.8 rebounds in 14.4 minutes... Played better as the season progressed and averaged 5.2 points in MWC games... One of four Aztecs to play in all 34 games... Blocked 17 shots, the fourth most on the squad... Made 50 of his final 79 field-goal attempts to end the season... Posted three double-figure scoring efforts... Started the first three

games of the season... Shot 61.5 percent from the field and has shot 50 percent or above from the field in 23 of 30 games in which he attempted a shot... Scored in a career-best 11 straight games, until he was held scoreless vs. Wyoming (2-10-10)... Had eight steals in the first 29 games of his career spanning two seasons, but finished with eight thefts in his first year at SDSU... San Diego State

In 15 minutes at UC Santa Barbara (12-5-09), he blocked a season-high two shots and had his first assist of the season... Scored 10 points and grabbed four rebounds vs. Cal State Fullerton (12-9-09)... Tallied five points and four boards vs. Arizona (12-12-09)... Connected on all three field-goal attempts en route to six points and added a season-high two blocks vs. UC Riverside (12-29-09)... Enjoyed his best game as an Aztec with 13 points and six rebounds vs. Pomona-Pitzer (12-31-09)... Connected on a career-best four free throws without missing vs. New Mexico (1-5-10)... As A Freshman at Illinois (2006-07 Season)

Played in 26 games... Averaged 1.7 points and 1.4 rebounds in 7.0 minutes... Illinois finished 23-12 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament... Led the team in rebounding in his first-ever game with his six against Austin Peay (11-13-06)... Played in the first 12 games and logged more than 10 minutes five times... Inside Carlwell

Brian Carlwell became the 12th Division I transfer to come to San Diego State during the Steve Fisher era when he enrolled in September of 2008. In 2009-10, his first eligible season at SDSU, Carlwell played in all 34 games while helping the Aztecs win 25 games. After just one season, Carlwell is one of the most successful transfers in Fisher's time on Montezuma Mesa. Below is a list of the winningest Division I transfers and those who helped the Aztecs reach the NCAA Tournament during Fisher's tenure.

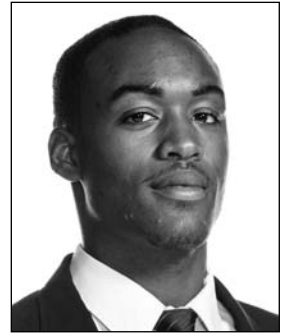
