San Diego State Concludes Three-Game Homestand; Opens New Year with Once-Beaten Big 12-Member Iowa State on Saturday

San Diego State (8-5), which looks to record its ninth victory on the second earliest calendar date in the 83-year history of the basketball program, plays host to upstart Big 12-member Iowa State (7-1) on Saturday night. The fourth meeting between the Cyclones and Aztecs is scheduled for a 7:05 p.m. PST start and the game will be televised locally in the San Diego market on Channel 4 San Diego (no satellite coverage) and can be heard on XPRS-1090 AM (The Mighty 1090).

The Aztecs responded from their worst performance of the season, with a gutsy 67-61 decision over Portland. The Aztecs shot just 39.3 percent from the field, but out-rebounded the Pilots 44-27, and used a Herculean-type effort from senior forward Aerick Sanders to rally from a seven-point deficit to win. Sanders posted his fifth double-double of the season with a career-high 34 points, on 13-of-20 shooting, and added a game-high 14 rebounds. That point total matched the highest scoring game by an Aztec player in the last 14 seasons. It was the first time in 19 games in the Fisher era that SDSU has shot less than 40 percent from the field, committed more turnovers and won the game (1-18).

One game after posting its worst rebound margin in 42 games, San Diego State's +17 advantage on the board was the best against a Division I team since Dec. 1, 2001. With the decisive rebound advantage, the Aztecs were able to win for the third time this season when shooting below 40 percent from the field.

The victory snapped a season-long two-game losing streak for the Aztecs which lost at fifth-ranked Arizona (83-71) and Washington (92-81).

The Iowa State game marks the fourth straight Aztec opponent that enters the contest with a .500 or better record. Including the Cyclones, the remaining 16 regular season games on San Diego State's schedule are against teams that currently have a winning record.

The Cyclones may have been overlooked in the preseason, but have raced out to a 7-1 record and are rated 48th in the RPI (through Wednesday's games). Iowa State was one of 12 undefeated teams before falling to an undefeated Virginia squad on Wednesday night, 85-74. The game was tied at half, and the Cyclones led a majority of the second half, and owned a 76-69 advantage with nine minutes remaining before the Cavaliers rallied. Iowa State have advanced to the postseason in three of the last four seasons, including the NCAA Elite Eight in 2000 and went 1-1 in last season's postseason NIT.

Iowa State is 17-2 since the beginning of last season in its pre-league schedule. The only teams to defeat the Cyclones during that stretch have been Boston College (78-85 on Dec. 10, 2002) and Virginia (85-74 on Wednesday).

Saturday will mark the fourth meeting between the teams, with Iowa State owning a 2-1 series advantage. The teams have split the two meetings in San Diego, with the Aztecs claiming the last game, a 92-75 decision on Jan. 8, 1976. That is the only time the teams have met since San Diego State went to the Division I level, prior to the 1970-71 season.

With a victory, SDSU would claim win number nine on Jan. 3. That would tie for the second earliest date to post a ninth win, just one day short of the record set by the 2001-02 NCAA Tournament team.

This marks the end of a season-long three-game homestand for the Aztecs, which leave Monday afternoon for a Tuesday game at Saint Mary's (8-5). Including the Cyclones, San Diego State's next four opponents are a collective 30-11 record, with three of the four teams ranked in the top 49 of the RPI.

Aztecs Snap Two-Game Losing Steak by Gutting Out Win Over Portland, 67-61

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State senior forward Aeric Sanders had a career-high 34 points and added a game-high 14 rebounds as San Diego State rallied for a 67-61 victory over Portland on Dec. 31.

Sanders recorded his fifth double-double of the season and the seventh of his career and matched the highest point output by an Aztec player since 1990.

Steve Fisher shook up the starting line-up following consecutive losses for the first time this season with three players making their first start of the season and two players making their first career start - John Sharper and walk-on Ben Wardrop.

San Diego State shot just 39.3 percent from the field and had a -2 turnover margin but used a 44-27 rebound advantage to claim the victory.

The Pilots led a majority of the first half, building advantages of seven points at 20-13 and 23-16 with 11:12 remaining. The Aztecs battled back and took the lead before a Pooh Jeter trey gave Portland a 36-34-half-time advantage.

The second half was close throughout, with neither team building more than a one-possession lead until the final seconds.

Sanders made a lay-up off a Chris Walton pass to give SDSU a 53-51 advantage with 7:18 to play. The Aztecs never trailed again, although the game would be tied four times in the final 7:08.

With the game tied at 61 with 2:12 left, Walton sank

jumper to put SDSU up two. Freshman Brandon Heath, San Diego State's leading scorer on the season who was held without a point for the first 39:41, made four free throws in the final 19 seconds to provide the final margin.

San Diego State held Portland without a point in the final 2:11 and allowed the Pilots just three points in the final 3:56.

Walton came off the bench to play his best all-around game of the season. The junior scored 11 points, while adding five rebounds and six assists. Freshman forward Marcus Slaughter scored nine points and added nine rebounds in 20 minutes of action.

Noting the Portland Game

▶ The game was the 100th contest for SDSU in Cox Arena, with the Aztecs posting a 56-44 record on their home court.

▶ SDSU earned its first win of the season after trailing at halftime. The Aztecs were behind 36-34 after the first twenty minutes and fell behind by as many as seven in the first half. SDSU entered the game 0-5 when not leading at the break.

▶ The win for the Aztecs snapped a four-game losing streak to Portland. However, last season's five-point loss in Portland was the first since 1964.

▶ SDSU won its fifth straight game entering the New Year, including every game under Steve Fisher.

▶ Aeric Sanders 34 points was the most for an Aztec since Feb. 10, 1990 when Shawn Jamison scored 37 vs. U.S. International.

▶ Sanders career-high 34 points and 14 rebounds are his fifth double-double of the season and seventh of his career.

▶ The game marks Sanders fifth consecutive game with 10+ points, the longest streak of his career. It is also the ninth time this season and 17th time in his career he has hit double-digits in scoring. Sanders has six games with 10 or more rebounds this year, and 17 in his career.

▶ Sanders connected on 13-of-20 shots from the field and has hit 76 percent (57-of-75) of his shots at Cox Arena this season. Sanders is averaging 19.1 points and 10.0 rebounds at home on the year.

▶ Sanders hit 8 of 11 from the free throw line, both career

- Freshman Marcus Slaughter scored nine points and pulled down nine rebounds.
- Freshman Brandon Heath scored four points, the first time in his career he failed to reach double-digits. However, Heath still moved into the top 10 freshman scorers at SDSU with 225 points already this year.
- The starting lineup (Sanders, Stokes, Wardrop, Sharper, Manker) is the third different starting line-up for the Aztecs this season and the first time the group of five has started.
- Sanders made his 43rd consecutive start.
- Wesley Stokes made his 34th career start, including all 13 games this season.
- John Sharper played in his 40th career game and made his first career start.
- Chris Manker made his fifth career start and his second as an Aztec (started last season vs. USD, 1-8-03)
- Ben Wardrop played in his 30th career game and made his first career start. His six minutes were a career-high against a Division I opponent.

The Iowa State Series

- This is the fourth meeting between the teams with Iowa State owning a 2-1 series lead.
- This is the first meeting between the teams since Jan. 8, 1976, a 92-78 San Diego State victory.
- San Diego State is scheduled to return the game next season in Ames.
- Steve Fisher owns a 2-1 record against the Cyclones from his days at Michigan. Fisher's squad claimed a 101-78 victory on Dec. 2, 1989 in Ann Arbor, while the Cyclones got revenge with an 81-72 win the following season in Ames (Dec. 15, 1990). Fisher won his third encounter with ISU, a 94-72 victory at The Palace of Auburn Hills on Dec. 19, 1992.
- Fisher's teams are 7-9 lifetime against current members of the Big 12 Conference. Fisher's Aztecs squads are 1-5 against the Big 12 (1-1 vs. Oklahoma State, 0-4 vs. Texas

Iowa State Connections

- San Diego State junior Chris Manker attended his first three-plus years of high school at West Des Moines (Iowa) Valley High, located about 40 minutes south of Ames. Manker, who helped lead the Valley Tigers to the 1999 state championship game, still calls West Des Moines home although he did graduate with Aztec teammate Travis Hanour from Laguna Beach (Calif.) High. Manker took a road trip this summer in a conversion van with four of his friends back to Iowa last summer.
- Aztec junior guard Wesley Stokes battled Iowa State during his two seasons at Missouri. He has faced the Cyclones five times, compiling a 3-2 record, including 3-0 outside Hilton Coliseum. He has posted 27 points (5.4 ppg), nine assists (1.8 apg) and 12 rebounds (2.4). He made his first career start at Iowa State on Feb. 11, 2000, played in the dramatic quadruple-overtime game in Columbia on Jan. 13, 2001 (a 112-109 Missouri win), as well as the first round of the 2002 Big 12 Championship (a 75-59 Missouri win).
- Aztec assistant coach Gary Grant has a history with the Cyclones he would like to forget. In Grant's sophomore season at Michigan, in 1985-86, Iowa State ended the Wolverines season with a 72-69 victory in the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Minneapolis. The Big Ten Champion team finished the season 28-5, including 14-4 in Big Ten play. Steve Fisher was an assistant coach on that squad under Bill Freider. Iowa State lost in the next round (Sweet 16) to North Carolina State, 70-66, in Kansas City.

► Aztec assistant coach Gregg Gottlieb lettered in basketball for two seasons at Drake University located in Des Moines, Iowa. Gottlieb went on to earn his bachelor's degree from UCLA and his M.B.A. from Cal Poly. Gottlieb's older brother Doug, who currently co-hosts a national sports radio show, did battle with the Cyclones while a standout player at Oklahoma State.

Among the National Leaders

Senior Aerick Sanders and junior Wesley Stokes are ranked among the national leaders in several categories through games of Dec. 30.

Sanders, who led the nation in rebounding for a single day earlier this month, is 12th nationally in rebounding (10.8 rpg) and is 23rd in the country in field goal percentage (64.5 percent).

With two nine-assist games in his last three starts, Stokes has moved into 25th place in the nation in assists per game at 5.9.

What a Difference a Game Can Make

San Diego State rebounded from one of its worst performances against Washington by defeating Portland three nights later. The Aztecs were able to beat a Portland team which entered the game with a 6-5 record, despite being outshot percentage wise from the field, three-point line and free throw line and despite committing more turnovers.

The two areas that SDSU improved on from the Washington game were defense and rebounding. After allowing the Huskies to shoot 52.5 percent from the field, the Aztecs held the Pilots in check, harassing Portland in to 43.4 percent from the floor. The biggest difference was on the glass, where the Aztecs went from a -11 rebound margin vs. Washington to +17 against Portland.

Despite an increased effort by the Aztecs, San Diego State was statistically worse in nearly every other statistical category, but still found a way to defeat Portland.

More on Rebounding

San Diego State has outrebounded eight of 12 opponents this season, posting a 7-1 record in those contests. In fact, the Aztecs have won the rebounding battle in 31 of their last 38 games dating back to last season.

The Aztecs have had two of the most extremes rebound games in the last two outings.

Against Washington, San Diego State was outrebounded, 36-25. The last time the Aztecs suffered a worse

rebound-margin was March 15, 2002, against Illinois in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. That was the worst rebound margin for San Diego State in a 42-game period.

Against Portland, San Diego State enjoyed a 44-27 rebound advantage. The +17-margin was the best for SDSU against a Division I opponent since Dec. 1, 2001, against Cal State Northridge.

100th Game in Cox Arena

San Diego State's matchup against Portland on Wednesday was the Aztecs' 100th game in Cox Arena. The count includes regular-season games and the post-season NIT, but does not count exhibition games.

The Aztecs have posted three consecutive winning seasons in the building and are off to a 5-2 start in the facility this season.

After posting a 16-28 record in the first 44 contests in the facility, San Diego State has gone an impressive 40-16 since.

Avoiding the Slump

San Diego State has done an excellent job of defending its home court. Since the beginning of the the 2000-01 season, the Aztecs have posted a 40-16 (71.4 percent) record at Cox Arena.

On those rare occasions when SDSU has lost at home, the Aztecs have almost always responded with a victory. Seven of the last eight times San Diego State has lost at home, the Aztecs won their next home game.

San Diego State has not dropped consecutive home games since Dec. 22 and Dec. 27 of 1999. Since the 2000-01 campaign, SDSU is 29-6 (82.8 percent) vs. non-conference opponents at home.

Initial Ratings Look Good

San Diego State continues to climb in the all-important Rating Index Percentage (RPI).

Through Wednesday, the Aztecs are 86th in the rankings. One reason San Diego State has consistently moved up since the rankings debut is because of the Aztecs growing strength of schedule. The Aztecs schedule to date is rated 76th nationally.

The other major index, the Sagarin Ratings, has also been kind to the Aztecs thus far. San Diego State is 101st in the poll. The Aztecs have been consistently around the top 100 of the poll since Dec. 1. By comparison, last season the Aztecs peeked at number 95 on Jan. 20 and March 3.

Earlier this season the Aztecs climbed to number 68, their best rating since SDSU ended the 2001-02 season at number 66.

Finishing Third in Maui is a Good Start

Start with a list of teams that have finished third in this tournament: Kentucky (2002, 1997), UCLA (2001), Dayton (2000), Florida (1999), Utah (1998), California (1996), Santa Clara (1995, 1990), Michigan (1994), Ohio State (1993), Memphis State (1992), Rice (1991), Louisville (1989), UNLV (1988), Illinois (1987), Missouri (1986), Virginia Tech (1985) and Virginia (1984).

This Program Keeps Building and Building

Steve Fisher and the Aztecs' journey from perennial basement dweller to a team that has made two straight appearances in the postseason is made all the more remarkable by the speed at which the turnaround was achieved.

Just four years ago in 1999-2000, the Aztecs won only five games, and three years ago in 2000-01, San Diego State finished seventh in the conference.

As if going from 5-23 in 1999-00 to 14-14 in 2000-01 was not enough, in the 2001-02 season the Aztecs went 21-12 for the second-highest win total in the school's Division I history and the 2002-03 Aztecs returned to the postseason and finished 16-14.

► San Diego State is now 45-31 (59.2 percent) since the beginning of the 2001-02 season and 59-45 (56.7 percent) since the start of the 2000-01 campaign. Remember, the Aztecs averaged 9.8 wins per season in the 15 years from 1986-87 through 1999-00, with just one winning season during that stretch. In those 15 years, SDSU was 147-281 (34.3 percent) and failed to advance to postseason play.

► San Diego State is now 17-20 in its last 37 road/neutral games since the beginning of the 2001-02 campaign. Those 17 road/neutral wins are two more the total SDSU had in the six seasons (1995-96, 1996-97, 1997-98, 1998-99, 1999-00 and 2000-01) combined when the Aztecs were 15-61 away from home.

► Below is a look at the Aztecs' records since the start of the 2000-01 campaign. The record on the right shows how many games it took San Diego State to win the same number of games prior to the 2000-01 season.

23:32 of the contest and enjoyed a six-point second-half lead. The Aztecs led 59-54 with 6:49 to play and the game was tied inside of the two minute mark.


► Troy State (4-2, 104 RPI) - Troy State hit 19 three-point field goals, the most by any team in a NCAA Division I game this season. SDSU led by as many as five point in the game and there were four ties and four lead changes in the second half.

► Texas Tech (10-2, 8 RPI) - San Diego State led by as many as eight points in the contest. Texas Tech's lead was two with 6:47 to play and the Red Raider advantage was four points with 4:36 remaining.

► Fourth-ranked Arizona (7-1, 15 RPI) - San Diego State trailed by just seven points with 14:51 left before the Wildcats went on a 15-0 run. Nonetheless, the Aztecs responded by outscoring Arizona 30-20 the rest of the way.

► Washington (4-3, 120 RPI) - Teams exchanged the lead 17 times and had 11 ties in the first half. San Diego State cut a 15-point second-half deficit to four points on three occasions before falling.

Sanders One of the Nations' Top Rebounder



The season is just more than a month old and San Diego State's lone scholarship senior has already posted some eye-popping numbers.

In addition to earning two Mountain West Conference Player of the Week honors this season and earning a spot on the 2003 EA Sports Maui Invitational all-Tournament team (the only player selected from a team that did not reach the championship game), he has also been listed among the nation's leading rebounders.

Through Sunday's games, Sanders is 12th nationally in rebounds per game at 10.8 and 23rd nationally in field goal percentage at 64.5 percent.

Sanders, who entered the season never having recorded consecutive double-figure scoring games, is averaging 16.7 points, 10.8 rebounds and 1.2 blocks per game. He has posted five double-doubles this season and has 10+ points in nine of his last 11 games, including a personal-best five straight double-digit scoring games.

In addition, the Aztecs' lone returning starter from last season has made 43 consecutive starts dating back to last season. Other statistical information on Sanders:

► Sanders has 85 career blocked shots, good for 5th place in SDSU history (Leonard Allen holds the school record at 214).

► Sanders' 43 career starts are good for 11th place in SDSU history for most consecutive career starts (Michael Cage holds the record at 112).

► Maybe most impressive has been Sanders' overall efficiency. Utilizing the NBA definition of efficiency (efficiency = ((PTS + REB + AST + STL + BLK) - ((FGA - FGM) + (FTA - FTM) + TO)) / G), Sanders is having one of the greatest seasons in school history.

Below is a look at the best single-seasons based on the formula above. Sanders is currently rated as having the third best single-season by an Aztec player. Aztec great Michael Cage has three of the top five rated seasons enter-

After his remarkable performance in the Maui Invitational, ESPN analyst Jay Bilas called Sanders the best rebounder on the island. He wrote, "Sanders is a relentless rebounder who makes hustle plays and is always around the ball. He is long, athletic, and a workhorse that pursues the ball out of his area. He had 21 points and 18 rebounds against Dayton, a team that can rebound, and proved to me that he is among the best rebounders in the nation when he goes after it."

Sanders and Cox - A Tough Combo

As impressive as Sanders has been overall this season, the senior has been particularly tough at Cox Arena. In seven home games this season, he is averaging 19.1 points and 10.0 rebounds. Most remarkable, is the senior is shooting a red-hot 76.0 percent from the field, having connected on 57-of-75 field goal attempts.

In his last four home games, Sanders is 40-50 for 80.0 percent from the field

His remarkable shooting resulted in tying an arena record against Cal Poly for field-goal percentage in a game (9-for-10). He then preceded to match the school record and break the arena record in the very next game by connecting on all 11 of his field goal attempts. In his last outing, Sanders posted a new career high with 34 points on 13-of-20 shooting and 8-of-11 from the free throw line.

Heath Climbing Freshman Charts



Brandon Heath continues to make a major impact in his freshman campaign at San Diego State.

A native of Los Angeles, Heath became just the eighth freshman to start a season opening game for Steve Fisher. He leads the team in scoring, averaging 17.3 points per contest and has shown the ability to post big games (30 at Texas Tech, 28 vs. Ohio State and 27 at San Diego) while showing tremendous consistency (he has scored in double figures in all but one of his 13 college games).

In addition to leading the team in scoring, he also ranked among the conference leaders in steals (23) as he has earned a reputation as a strong defensive player.

ESPN analyst Jay Bilas called Heath the best on-ball defender in the Maui Invitational. He went on to write, "Heath is an absolute ballhawk, who can put great pressure on the ball. He is quick, athletic and has a tenacity that marks a great defender. He is still young and learning how to best defend, but he can be a terrific player. Heath had 28 points against Ohio State, and has the chance to be an outstanding player."

It is hard to believe, but in just 13 games Heath is already climbing the Aztecs freshmen charts. He is currently 10th among Aztec freshmen, just 15 points shy of passing last season's freshman phenom, and MWC Freshman of the Year, Evan Burns.

His 18.4 scoring average would top the all-time SDSU freshman chart, below is a look at the top five.

Rarely Once, Hardly Ever Twice

Steve Fisher, now in his 13th full-season as a head coach, has compiled a rather impressive 71-12 record in non-conference home games. That includes a 34-9 mark at the helm of the Aztecs.

Only one non-conference opponent has defeated a Fisher-led club more than one time on the road. That team is Duke.

Fisher's 12 non-conference home defeats have come to Arizona, Ball State, Cal State Fullerton, Duke (twice), Eastern Washington, Pennsylvania, San Diego, Southern California, Texas Tech, Troy State, and Washington.

In addition, only three non-Mountain West Conference teams have defeated the Aztecs more than one time in Cox Arena (Fresno State, San Diego and USC).

A First Time for Everything

Getting back to the Portland game for a second. San Diego State won despite shooting less than 40 percent from the field and committing more turnovers, marking the first time in 19 such games during the Fisher era that SDSU claimed a victory when those two negative stats occurred.

Sometimes there are no adjectives. Sometimes the phrases don't do justice. Sometimes you just stick with the basic facts and let them tell the story. A five-win season followed by a 14-win season. A 14-win season followed by 21 wins, a conference championship and a trip to the NCAA Tournament. An NCAA Tournament appearance followed by a third-straight .500 or better season, a second consecutive trip to the postseason and the first Division I postseason victory in school history.

In four short seasons, Steve Fisher has changed the outlook, fortunes and expectations of San Diego State basketball. The Aztecs have been transformed from the ugly duckling that muddled through the first-ever Mountain West Conference campaign with an 0-14 record into a conference champion. It is a school that now regularly goes toe-to-toe with the west's best basketball programs on the court and in the recruiting wars. It may be the new program on the block but seniority rarely matters in the changing world of college athletics.

It is now Steve Fisher's program.

When Fisher arrived on the scene, he found a basketball program that wasn't good enough to be called average. The Aztecs had suffered through 13 losing seasons in 14 years. Members of the school's last NCAA team were in the early stages of middle age. The expectations were in place all right. The Aztecs were expected and expecting to lose. The year before his arrival San Diego State won just four games.

The hiring only dates back to March of 1999, so referring to the "Steve Fisher Era" at San Diego State might be considered a bit premature. But with the Aztec banner now flying over the Mountain West Conference, there is little doubt that San Diego State basketball has reached a new level.

On March 26, 1999, San Diego State announced its arrival on the basketball scene in the form of a news conference to introduce its new coach, Steve Fisher. Fresh from a stint with the Sacramento Kings and with three appearances in the Final Four and a national championship in his pocket, he rolled up his sleeves and went to work. And work was needed. It looked to be a daunting challenge and yet the man with one of the highest winning percentages in NCAA Tournament

history had no reservations.

No head-coaching career, at any level, started quicker than that of Steve Fisher. Six games into his head-coaching career he was undefeated and sporting a national championship ring. And the success didn't stop with the national title.

Fisher's eight-plus seasons at the University of Michigan produced a 184-82 (.692) record, nine postseason tournament berths and three trips to the NCAA championship game, including the magical run to the 1989 national title.

Under Fisher, the Wolverines also claimed an NIT championship, won at least 20 games four times and finished among the top three in the powerful Big Ten Conference five times. In 1995, Michigan set a league record by holding opponents to just 39.4 percent shooting from the floor.

Fisher and Company raised the bar even higher in the postseason. His seven NCAA Tournament teams at Michigan combined for a 20-6 record, ranking him fourth among active coaches and ninth in NCAA history with a winning percentage of .769 in the national bracket. Only 13 coaches have taken more teams to the Final Four, including just five that are still active. He is one of three coaches to take three squads to the Final Four in the first five years of a head-coaching career, and one of just six coaches to lead a team to the championship of the NIT as well as the NCAA.

His accomplishments may be even greater at San Diego State. In 2001-02 he led the Aztecs to the postseason for the first time since 1985 and for just the fourth time ever. The 21 wins were second most for the school as a Division I program and the most since 1985. The fact that those numbers came after just three seasons signifies what is one of the great recent turnarounds in college basketball.

He followed that up with a third consecutive season with a .500 or better record in 2002-03 and led San Diego State back to the postseason for the second consecutive season for only the second time in the school's Division I history. In addition, SDSU claimed its first Division I postseason victory with a win in the NIT.

SAN DIEGO - After a slow start, San Diego State used an 18-0 run midway through the first half to take control and the Aztecs' never looked back winning their season opener 74-44 over Long Beach State at Cox Arena. Freshman Marcus Slaughter came off the bench to score a game-high 19 points.

Junior Wesley Stokes also had a solid debut for SDSU as he contributed 17 points and six assists in his first game with the Aztecs.

San Diego State didn't record a field goal until four minutes into the game, but the 18-0 run made the score 25-5. Slaughter made three 3-point shots from the baseline during the run and Stokes made another.

Stokes' most impressive play came late in the first half when he stole the ball from Kevin Roberts, led a 2-on-1 break and made an alley-oop pass to Slaughter, who made a slam dunk for a 34-11 lead.

Slaughter's debut put him in good company. The 19 points in a season opener is matched only by Chris Webber for freshmen who have played for Steve Fisher.

SDSU held the 49ers to just 21.4 percent shooting in the first half and 29.1 percent for the game. LBSU's 44 points is the fewest allowed by the Aztecs since they held Air Force to 43 on Jan. 20, 2001. In addition, the 30-point margin of victory is the largest in a season opener since 2000 when they defeated UCSD by 32.

MAUI - The San Diego State backcourt of Brandon Heath and Wesley Stokes combined for 50 points and the Aztecs connected on 13 3-pointers in an 83-61 victory over Ohio State on Monday night in the opening round of the Maui Invitational.

Heath had 28 points and was 5-for-6 from beyond the arc, while Stokes had 22 points and was 4-for-6 on 3s.

The game was tied 32-all at halftime and the Aztecs were in it only because of their long-range shooting. They were 7-for-14 from beyond the 3-point arc in the first half and 2-for-14 from inside it. SDSU finished the game 13-for-22 (59.1 percent) on three-point field goals.

Ohio State led 37-35 two minutes into the second half when the Aztecs took over with a 21-1 run that broke open the game. Heath had three of San Diego State's five 3-pointers in the run.

Ohio State missed four shots and turned the ball over five times in that span and its only point came on a free throw by Velimir Radinovic, who missed three other foul shots in the run.

San Diego State improves to 2-0 for the first time since the 2000-01 campaign and just the second time in the last eight seasons. The Aztecs also handed Ohio State their worst loss since were handed a 32-point loss by Purdue in 1998. Entering the game the Aztecs had not beaten a Big Ten team since a win over Ohio State in 1996.

MAUI - San Diego State was handed their first defeat of the season by Dayton in the second round of the Maui Invitational 76-71 on Tuesday. SDSU (2-1) was within 71-68 with 23 seconds left on a basket by Aerick Sanders, but Dayton went 5-for-6 from the free throw line the rest of the way to offset a last-second 3-pointer by Stokes.

Sanders led the way for the Aztecs with a career high 21 points and 18 rebounds. However, SDSU struggled to connect from three-point land as they hit just 4-for-22 from 3-point range after connecting on 13 treys opening-round win over Ohio State.

MAUI - San Diego State earned a third place finish at the Maui Invitational with a 75-67 over the host institution, Chaminade on Wednesday in Hawai'i. The Aztecs (3-1) took a 65-48 lead with an 11-2 run capped by a 3-pointer by Chris Walton with 4:57 to play. Chaminade (1-2) was able to get to 72-67 with 27 seconds left on a 3-pointer by Chris Acker. But Wesley Stokes went 3-for-4 from the free throw line the rest of the way to close out the game.

Stokes scored 19 points to lead San Diego State, while Aerick Sanders posted his second consecutive double-double with 14 points and 16 rebounds. Sanders led SDSU to a 43-29 advantage on the boards, including 19-7 on the offensive end. Sanders, 7-for-14 from the field, had nine offensive rebounds.

The Aztecs shot a season high 43.1 percent from the field, and tallied 11 steals which led to 24 Chaminade turnovers.

The win also marks the first time since the 1987 Holiday Bowl Classic the Aztecs have won two games at an in-season tournament. Since then, the Aztecs have won only one game in tournaments during the regular season.

NOTES OF THE GAME: The last nine teams to finish third at the Maui Invitational have gone on to postseason action, including eight that have advanced to the NCAA tournament... The 3-1 record matches the Aztecs best start since the 1984-85 squad opened up 8-0.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State could not overcome a Cox Arena record 19 three-pointers from visiting Troy State as the Trojans handed the Aztecs a 93-84 defeat.

The game was tight throughout with 15 ties and nine lead changes, but the Trojans used a 12-1 surge to take a 40-31 lead and held on for a 48-43 lead over SDSU at half time.

In the second half, San Diego State went on a quick 7-2 run to tie the game at 50-50 with 18 minutes left on a three-pointer by Brandon Heath. The two teams battled back and forth until five quick points by Troy State with five minutes remaining gave the Trojans a lead they would not relinquish.

Aztecs senior Aerick Sanders tied a career-high with 21 points and had a game-high 15 rebounds for his third straight double-double and the fifth of his career. Teammate Brandon Heath also posted 21 points. Junior Tommy Johnson recorded career highs with 18 points on 7-of-10 shooting and four steals.

Troy State finished 19-for-40 (47.5 percent) from behind the arc with both three-pointers made and attempted setting Cox Arena records. SDSU shot 49.3 percent from the field but just 6-of-26 (23.1 percent) from behind the arc.

This was the first meeting ever between San Diego State and Troy State, which made its first trip ever to California for the game.

SAN DIEGO - The Aztecs held on to win their second straight crosstown matchup 66-63 against San Diego at the Jenny Craig Pavilion on Wednesday. SDSU built a 20-point lead in the second half but the Toreros' Brad Lechtenberg hit five three-pointers to give USD the lead with two minutes remaining. SDSU freshman Brandon Heath answered with a three-pointer less than 20 seconds later and the Aztecs' never relinquished the lead.

Heath scored a game-high 27 points, including the Aztecs last nine points on 9-of-13 shooting from the floor and four-of-five from behind the arc. Tommy Johnson was the only other Aztec in double figures, with 10 points.

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State scored on its first six possessions of the game, jumped out to a 16-2 lead, and led by no less than 16 in the second half on its way to a 76-51 victory over UC San Diego at Cox Arena on Saturday.

The Aztecs improve to 5-2 on the season, which marks the earliest points on the calendar year that SDSU has registered five wins in his history, and matches its best record since 1984-85.

TUCSON, Ariz. - Arizona made a 15-0 second-half run that propelled the fifth-ranked Wildcats to an 83-71 victory over San Diego State on Monday night.

The Aztecs stayed with Arizona through much of the first half as Aerick Sanders short jumper with 2:50 left in the period cut the lead to 32-29. However, the Wildcats finished the first half with a 9-2 run to go up 41-31, their biggest lead of the half.

Andre Iguodala had nine rebounds in the first 10 minutes of the second half, several during the 15-0 run that put Arizona (6-1) up 63-41 with 10:59 to play.

San Diego State (7-4) scored six straight points to cut it to 74-62 on Brandon Heath's layup with 2:12 to go. Adams hit a 3-pointer to make it 77-62. The Aztecs cut the lead to 10 in the final minute.

Sanders, who scored 16 points in the first half on 8-for-12 shooting, finished the game tying his career high with his second straight 24-point effort. Heath added 15 points and Wesley Stokes had 13 points and nine assists for the Aztecs.

Hassan Adams had 19 points and 11 rebounds and Chris Rodgers matched his career high with 17 points for Arizona. Channing Frye scored 15 points, and Andre Iguodala had 10 points and 12 rebounds for the Wildcats.

Rodgers, Arizona's first and essentially only player off the bench, was 3-for-6 from 3-point range, but the rest of the Wildcats were 4-for-18. San Diego State was just 6-for-25 on 3-pointers.

SAN DIEGO - Washington connected on 52.5 percent field goal shooting and used a 36-25 rebound edge to defeat San Diego State, 92-81, at Cox Arena on Dec. 27.

Coupled with the loss to Arizona earlier in the week, it marked the first time the Aztecs have lost consecutive games this season and snapped a five-game winning streak following a loss dating back to last season.

The game was tight early, with 11 ties and 17 lead changes in the first half. The Huskies used a 12-3 run to close the first half with a 50-43 lead at intermission.

Washington opened the second half with a 10-2 spurt, (22-5 when coupled with the close of the first half) to open up a 15 point advantage with 15:19 to play.

The Aztecs chipped away, pulling within four points on four different occasions, the final time at 73-69 with 7:35 left. Will Conroy hit a pair of three-pointers as part of an 11-2 Washington run that secured the victory for the Huskies.

Washington, which entered the game shooting 30.1 percent from three-point range and making 5.2 treys per game, connected on 9-of-20 attempts (45.0 percent) from bonus distance. The Huskies were led by Bobby Jones with 19 points.

San Diego State was paced by Brandon Heath who tallied 23 points and added a career-high four steals. Aerick Sanders continued his brilliant play with 18 points, on 7-of-9 shooting from the field, and added eight rebounds. Wesley Stokes recorded his second consecutive game with nine assists and also tallied in double figures with 13 points.

SAN DIEGO - Aerick Sanders had a career-high 34 points and 14 rebounds, and Chris Walton made a key basket in the final minute to lead San Diego State to a 67-61 win over Portland on Wednesday.

Sanders carried the Aztecs at times, especially in the first half when he scored 20 of his team's 34 points. But it was Walton who hit the biggest basket, scoring with 53.2 seconds left to snap a 61-all tie and trigger a 6-0 San Diego State run to finish the game.

Walton, who finished with 11 points, was bumped as he drove the lane, but still managed to hit an off-balance 10-footer that banked in.

Sanders, who has made 51 of his last 69 shots, was 13-of-20 from the floor and set career highs by making 8-of-11 free throws. His point total was the highest for San Diego State since Shawn Jamison scored 37 against U.S. International in 1990.

Pooh Jeter tied his career high with 25 points to lead Portland (6-6). The 5-foot-10 guard, who had a career-high seven assists, missed a 3-pointer with 20 seconds left and the Pilots trailing by two.

Jeter made a three-point play to tie the game 61-all with 2:12 remaining before Walton made his clutch shot to put the Aztecs ahead for good.

There were eight lead changes and seven ties in the second half, when neither team led by more than four points until the final five seconds. Portland led 36-34 at halftime.
