JUNE JONES PRESS CONFERENCE

Warrior head coach June Jones will hold a weekly press conference every Monday during the regular season beginning Sept. 5 and concluding on Dec. 5. All press conferences will be held at the Stan Sheriff Center Green Room and begin at 11:15 a.m. and last for no more than 30 minutes.

JUNE JONES TV SHOW

"The June Jones Show," a weekly television show recapping the weekend game and discussing the upcoming game airs every Sunday at 10:30 p.m., (through Dec. 4) on KHON2. KHON Sports Director Kanoa Leahey and KHON2 weekend sports anchor John Veneri will host the half-hour show that will follow the late news.

CALL THE COACH

Warrior head coach June Jones is scheduled for "Call The Coach" on Sportsradio 1420 every Tuesday during the football season (through Nov. 29). Bobby Curran will host the one-hour show which begins at 6:30 p.m. live from The Willows restaurant in Moiliili.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCE

Head coach June Jones and a few selected players will be available at the Aloha Stadium Hospitality Room approximately 20 minutes after the game ends. **The media will NOT be allowed to conduct interviews with players and/or coaches at any time on the field.** The locker room will be open to the media after the 10-minute "cooling off" period for all games (home and away) unless otherwise specified. Coach Jones will conduct a short radio interview before addressing the media at the press conference. This will be the ONLY interview opportunity for coach Jones immediately following the game.

"SENIOR NIGHT" ►► The senior members of the football team aren't the only ones who'll receive special treatment at Saturday's football game. In addition to honoring the senior players, fans who are 65 years or older will receive two-for-one ticket discounts (no maximum on number of tickets).

This offer is available at the Aloha Stadium Ticket Office in advance and on game day and at the Stan Sheriff Center Box Office in advance only. It applies solely to seats in non-premium areas.

Fans with the UH CreditBack card will receive four tickets for the price of three. Century 21, the game sponsor, will distribute tickets to the first 10,000 fans to enter the stadium.

THIS WEEK ►► Hawai'i says aloha to its seniors and the 2005 campaign in the season finale against the Aztecs of San Diego State. Kickoff is scheduled for 6:05 pm on Saturday, Dec. 3 at Aloha Stadium.

The Warriors are 8-15-2 against the Aztecs and are 5-8-2 when competing in Honolulu. The last meeting between the teams was on Dec. 7, 2002 in Honolulu. Hawai'i managed to pull out a 41-40 victory. This will mark the 27th time Hawai'i faces off with former WAC foe San Diego State.

The Warriors (4-7, 4-4 WAC) suffered a 41-24 loss to No. 24 Wisconsin last week at Aloha Stadium. Warrior quarterback Colt Brennan passed for 403 yards (33-of-53) and three touchdowns against the Badgers while receiver Ryan Grice-Mullen stepped up and led all Warriors with a career-high 11 catches for 139 yards. Fellow receiver Davone Bess left the game with a bruised lower back, but not before making four catches for 34 yards and two touchdowns.

Bess and Grice-Mullen became the first in UH football history to catch for over 1,000 yards each in one season. Bess (averaging 98.4 yards per game) has managed to record 85 grabs for 1,082 yards and 14 touchdowns in just his first year. Bess was recently named first-team Freshman All-America by Rivals.com. Grice-Mullen (averaging 96.5 yards per game) enters his final game of his rookie campaign with 75 catches for 1,061 yards and nine scores.

Brennan, who is 4-6 as the Warrior starter, has passed for 3,975 yards (478-of-325) and 30 touchdowns on the season. In only his rookie year at the Division I-A level, Brennan leads the WAC and ranks second nationally in total offense averaging 371.0 yards per game. He also leads the WAC averaging 361.4 passing yards per game and ranks ninth nationally in passing efficiency (153.5).

Linebackers Brad Kalilimoku and Kila Kamakawiwo'ole and safety Lamar Broadway led the Warriors with 10 tackles each last week against Wisconsin. Kalilimoku (66 total tackles, 39 solo) and Kamakawiwo'ole (70 total tackles, 42 solo), along with fellow linebacker Solomon Elimimian (73 total tackles, 51 solo) have led the Warrior defense for most of the season.

San Diego State (5-6, 4-4 Mountain West Conference) brings a two-game win streak into Saturday night's game. The Aztecs, coming off a 34-21 victory over Wyoming, scored 20 fourth-quarter points and picked-off two Wyoming passes to earn the win. SDSU head coach Tom Craft is 19-28 in his fourth season at his alma mater.

Quarterback Kevin O'Connell heads into Saturday's game 200-of-324 passing for 2,242 yards with 16 touchdowns against 11 interceptions, and has rushed for 391 yards on 134 attempts. The sophomore completed 16-of-27 passes for 202 yards and one touchdown last week against Wyoming.

O'Connell's main target is receiver Jeff Webb. The veteran leads the team in receptions (79) for 967 yards and eight touchdowns this season. Webb recorded 115 yards on seven catches last week against the Cowboys.

Running back Lynell Hamilton leads the Aztec rushing attack. The sophomore gained 154 yards and a touchdown last week against Wyoming. Hamilton leads the team in rushing this season with 709 yards and eight touchdowns on 164 carries.

The Aztec defense is led by linebackers Freddy Keiaho and Joe Martin, and safety Reggie Grigsby. Keiaho, a senior, leads the team this season with 99 total tackles (60 solo), while Martin, a junior, has 77 total tackles (36 solo). Grigsby, a senior, has managed to rack up 86 total tackles (55 solo) in 2005.

The efficient leg of place-kicker Garret Palmer has also helped the Aztecs this season. The sophomore has converted 14-of-16 field goal attempts (88 percent) and 31-of-33 PAT attempts. Palmer, who kicked field goals of 32 and 27 yards against Wyoming last week, leads the Aztecs in scoring with 73 points.

LAST MEETING BETWEEN THE WARRIORS AND AZTECS

▶ Timmy Chang threw for 437 yards and three touchdowns and Nate Ilaoa gained 131 all-purpose yards to help Hawai'i get past San Diego State, 41-40, in the regular season finale Dec. 7, 2002 at Aloha Stadium.

A loud crowd of 36,671 watched the Warriors get out-passed for the first time under Head Coach June Jones, 507 to 437, and out-gained in total offense, 632 to 610, but pull of a come-from behind victory in honor of their 18 seniors.

The Warriors took advantage of two blocked punts and a fumble to lead by as much as 19 (22-3) in the first half, but San Diego State crawled back on touchdowns by J.R. Tolver and Fred Collins, and a 32-yard field goal by Tommy Kirvovski to make it 22-20 at the break.

The Aztecs took a 26-22 lead out of the locker room on two field goals by Kirvovski, but the Warriors put together a 14-play, 79-yard drive that dissolved a season-long 5:52 off the clock, resulting in a 3-yard touchdown pass from Chang to Britton Komine, to reclaim the lead at 29-26.

San Diego State answered with touchdown catches by Tolver and Kassim Osgood to take a 40-29 lead with 12:46 to play.

Hawai'i struck back on the talents of John West, who gained gained 31 yards on the 5-play, 48-yard drive. Thero Mitchell took it in from 2-yards out to cut the SDSU lead to five at 40-35 after a failed two-point conversion.

After the Warrior defense forced the Aztecs to punt, Chang orchestrated an 8-play, 93-yard drive, capped by a 2-yard touchdown run by Ilaoa to put Hawai'i ahead for good, 41-40, with 4:45 left on the clock.

San Diego State threatened by driving down to the Warrior 37-yard line, but Sheriff was sacked by Travis LaBoy to end all hopes of an Aztec upset.

THE COACHES ▶ Hawai'i head coach **June Jones** is 52-37 in in his seventh season at the Warrior helm. This is Jones' first collegiate head coaching job after 11 years coaching in the NFL, including head coaching stints at Atlanta (1994-96) and San Diego (1998). San Diego State head coach **Tom Craft** is in his fourth season at the helm of the Aztec program and owns a 19-28 record. Craft, a former SDSU quarterback, is in his second go-around with the Aztecs, having served as offensive coordinator from 1994-96. This is his first NCAA Division I head coaching post.

CAREER WATCH ▶ Warrior quarterback **Colt Brennan** is seventh on the UH career passing list with 3,975 yards, 201 yards behind No. 6 Nick Rolovich (2000-01) who recorded 4,176 yards in 14 games, and 800 yards behind No. 5 Gregg Tipton (1985-86) who amassed 4,775 yards in 24 games. Brennan is also ninth on the school's career list for total offense with 4,081 yards, 120 yards behind No. 8 Nick Rolovich (2000-01) who compiled 4,201 yards in 14 games, and 535 yards behind No. 7 Gregg Tipton (1985-86) who compiled 4,616 yards in 24 games. Warrior punter **Kurt Milne** currently ranks 15th on the UH career punting list averaging 38.88 yards. Milne has 156 punts for 6,066 yards and a long of 55 in his two-year career. Receiver **Ross Dickerson** is 12th on the UH career kickoff return list. Dickerson has gained 707 yards on 31 returns and returned his first career kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against Appalachian State Aug. 30, 2003.

DEBUT ▶ Nose guard **Reagan Mauia** made his collegiate debut at running back in last week's game against Wisconsin. Mauia, who started at nose guard against Michigan State on Sept. 10, 2005, rushed twice for three yards.

ILAOA'S LONGEST RUN ▶ Running back/wide receiver **Nate Ilaoa's** 53-yard run against Utah State on Nov. 12 was the longest rush by a UH player since the 2002 season, when John West dashed 81 yards at Fresno State on Oct. 25. Ilaoa leads the Warriors in rushing with 70 carries for 492 yards and five touchdowns in 2005. He averages 7.0 yards per carry and 49.2 yards per game. Against Utah State, Ilaoa gained 55 yards on four carries, averaging 13.8 yards per carry. The Stafford, Va., native has also recorded 29 catches for 214 yards this season.

NATIONAL TELEVISION ►► The Warriors have appeared on national television 19 times in the June Jones era. Hawai'i's first-ever appearance on national television was Nov. 14, 1981 (ABC) against Brigham Young. The Warriors, who have appeared on the national tube a total of 38 times in UH football history, post a 9-28-2 record in nationally televised games. Eight of those nine wins came under Jones, who owns a 8-11 record. In 2003, the Warriors played in five nationally televised games, a school record. This season, Hawai'i appeared on national television three times. Two games aired on ESPN2 (USC and Wisconsin), while the Fresno State game was telecast on ABC.

TRIPLE THREAT ►► The trio of receivers -- **Davone Bess**, **Ryan Grice-Mullen**, and **Ross Dickerson** -- has posed a triple threat for Warrior opponents in 2005. All are ranked among the WAC leaders in both receptions per game and receiving yards per game. Bess has emerged as the pack leader and has gained more than 100 receiving yards in five of his last six games, including a career-high 171 at Nevada on Nov. 5. Grice-Mullen has reached the century mark four times this season, three of his last six games, and four of his last eight. Grice-Mullen, a redshirt freshman, recorded a career-high 188 yards against Boise State on Oct. 1, second-best in the WAC in 2005. Dickerson caught for 110 yards (five catches) at Nevada on Nov. 5, and had six catches for 112 yards against Utah State on Nov. 12. Bess, a true freshman, leads the WAC and ranks third nationally in receptions per game (7.73), and is second in the league and 11th nationally in receiving yards per game (98.4). Grice-Mullen ranks second in the WAC and 12th nationally in reception per game (6.82), and is third in the league and 14th nationally in receiving yards per game (96.5). Dickerson ranks sixth in the WAC in receiving yards per game (64.4), and is eighth in the league in receptions per game (4.55).

FUTURE SCHEDULES ►► Hawai'i has managed to get some of the top teams in the country on its non-conference schedule in upcoming seasons. In 2006, the Warriors open the season at Alabama and play home games against UNLV and Purdue. Hawai'i travels to UNLV in 2007, a city where the Warriors have a large following, and host Michigan State on Nov. 24. And, for the first time in UH football history, the Warriors meet Florida at "The Swamp" to open the 2008 season.

WINNING WAYS AT ALOHA STADIUM ►► Through the years, the Warriors have enjoyed much success playing in the friendly confines of Aloha Stadium. The Warriors beat Prairie View by 65 points (65-0) on Oct. 20, 1979, the largest margin of victory at home in UH football history. The largest margin of victory at home is 65 (vs. Prairie View in 1979). Under Jones, the Warriors are 39-19 (.672) in games played at Aloha Stadium, the best winning percentage among recent UH coaches. The largest winning margin at Aloha Stadium under Jones is 59 (vs. UTEP in 2001). Here's a look at how UH head coaches (since the opening of Aloha Stadium in 1975) have fared at the facility:

FAB FRESHMEN MAKE WARRIOR FOOTBALL HISTORY ▶ Freshmen receivers **Davone Bess** (true freshman) and **Ryan Grice-Mullen** (redshirt freshman) made Warrior football history last week. Both receivers reached the 1,000-yard mark, making it the first time two players gained 1,000 yards in a season. Bess, who has started all 11 games at the Y slot, ranks third nationally averaging 7.73 catches per game (1st in the WAC) and 11th nationally averaging 98.4 yards per game (2nd in the WAC). Bess also leads the Warriors with 85 catches for 1,082 yards and 14 touchdowns (second nationally among freshmen). Grice-Mullen is second with 75 receptions for 1,061 yards and nine touchdowns. Grice-Mullen, who has started the last 10 games, averages 96.5 yards per game (3rd in the WAC, 14th nationally) and 6.82 receptions per game (2nd in the WAC, 12th nationally). The duo combines for 160 receptions (45 percent of the team total), 2,143 yards (50 percent of the team total) and 23 touchdowns (72 percent of the team total). Grice-Mullen posted a career-high 188 yards and two touchdowns on nine receptions against Boise State on Oct. 1, had a career-high 11 receptions last week against Wisconsin, and also caught four touchdown passes against the New Mexico State, one shy of the school record. Bess posted a career-high 14 receptions, tying the school record, for a career-high 158 yards and a touchdown against Fresno State on Oct. 29, and eclipsed his career high with 171 yards at Nevada on Nov. 5. He has caught for more than 100 yards in five of his last six games and seven of his last nine. Bess left last week's game against Wisconsin with a bruised lower back after hauling in four catches for 34 yards and two touchdowns.

Fruean** (true freshman, 4 tackles), **Khevin Peoples** (redshirt freshman, 2 tackles, 1 TFL), and **Adam Leonard** (true freshman, 6 tackles, 1 TFL); safety **Dane Porlas** (redshirt freshman, 15 tackles, 1 INT); defensive tackles **Keala Watson** (redshirt freshman, 7 tackles, 1 hurry) and **Fale Laeli** (redshirt freshman, 1 tackle); defensive end **Jake Ingram** (true freshman, 4 tackles, half-a-TFL); cornerback/safety **Kirk Alexander** (true freshman, 9 tackles, 1 PBU), and **Guyton Galdeira** (redshirt freshman, 2 tackles); place-kicker **Dan Kelly** (true freshman, 10-of-15 FG, 35-of-38 PAT, WAC Special Teams Player of the Week on Nov. 14, 2005).

BRENNAN WRAPS-UP ROOKIE SEASON ▶ Warrior quarterback **Colt Brennan** earned the starting nod at quarterback after completing 70 percent of his passes in the first two games of the season. Brennan earned WAC Player of the Week honors (Sept. 26) for his performance at Idaho on Sept. 24 and again on Oct. 17 for his career performance against New Mexico State on Oct. 15. The Irvine, Calif., native completed 34-of-44 pass attempts for 347 yards and three touchdowns against the Vandals, and threw for a career-high 515 yards and seven touchdowns (one shy of the record) against New Mexico State. His 515 yards against the Aggies ranks fourth all-time in UH football history. He is 4-6 as a starter and has completed 325-of-478 passes (68.0 percent) for 3,975 yards, 12 interceptions, and 30 touchdowns. The rookie sophomore leads the league in both pass offense (361.4), ranks second nationally in total offense (371.0), and ranks second in the league in pass efficiency (153.5, 9th nationally). He is also seventh on the UH career passing list (3,975 yards) and ninth on the UH career list for total offense (4,081 yards).

HOME VS. ROAD ▶▶ The Warriors have enjoyed unparalleled success while playing in the friendly confines of Aloha Stadium, especially under the direction of skipper June Jones. The Warriors have posted a 40-19 record (68%) of all games played at Aloha Stadium in Jones' six-plus seasons, opposed to an 18-46 (28%) home record in the six previous seasons before Jones' arrival. Jones and the Warriors were almost perfect twice, posting 7-1 and 8-1 records in 2003 and 2004 respectively. In 2004, the Warriors posted the best record (8-1) and winning percentage (.889) under Jones. Only once in UH football history did the Warriors go undefeated at home, posting a 8-0 record in 1992 under head coach Bob Wagner. Jones has also posted a 12-18 (40 %) road record, opposed to a 2-23 (8%) mark in road games from 1993-98.

THE RUN-AND-SHOOT

Warrior head coach June Jones has enjoyed much success with the Run-and-Shoot offense while at Hawai'i. The Warrior passing offense has led the WAC and finished in the Top 5 nationally each of the six years under Jones. In 1999, Jones and the Warriors led the WAC in both passing offense (328.7) and total offense (417.7). In 2002, the Warrior offense led in the WAC and finished second in the nation in pass offense (386.1), and were second in the WAC and nation in total offense (495.6), and second in the league and eighth nationally in scoring offense (35.9). In 2003, Hawai'i ranked first in the WAC and second nationally in pass offense (384.4), were also first in the WAC and ranked sixth nationally in total offense (488.1), and second in the league and 14th nationally in scoring offense (34.7). Against Army in 2003, the Warrior offense amassed a school-record 741 yards and tied the school record for passing yards in a game with 543. At the end of the 2004 season, the Warrior offense ranked second in the WAC and 17th nationally. After 11 games in 2005, the Warriors lead the WAC and rank second nationally in pass offense (389.5), and also lead the WAC and rank 11th nationally in total offense (466.0).

HONOLULU – A sold out crowd (50,000) and a national audience on ESPN2 watched two-time defending national champion USC march through Hawai'i, 63-17, Sept. 3 at Aloha Stadium. USC's Matt Leinart, 2004 Heisman Trophy winner, threw for 332 yards and three touchdowns in less than three quarters of action.

It was a tale of two quarterbacks for Hawai'i with Tyler Graunke getting the start, but both he and Colt Brennan in on the opening series. What looked like a promising opening drive was halted by a 65-yard interception return by Trojan safety Darnell Bing.

The Warriors answered with a 30-yard field goal by freshman Dan Kelly, but the Trojans scored the next 21 points to take a 28-3 lead in the third quarter. Warrior running back Bryan Maneafaiga caught a 27-yard touchdown pass from Brennan to keep the Warrior hopes alive, but USC turned up the heat with four straight touchdowns in the next 12 minutes to end any dreams of an upset.

USC receiver Dwayne Jarrett led the Trojans with three touchdowns on 7-for-88 receiving, while Steve Smith led all receivers with seven catches for 185 yards and a score. Tailback Reggie Bush rushed 12 times for 86 yards and a pair of touchdowns. Leinart broke the USC school record for career touchdown passes (74), surpassing Carson Palmer (72).

Brennan threw for 250 yards and a score on 21-of-32 passing, while Graunke completed 12-of-17 pass attempts for 127 yards and a touchdown. Graunke also led the Warriors in rushing with seven carries for 43 yards. Receiver Ross Dickerson caught five passes for a career-high 116 yards.

Cornerback Kenny Patton, still healing from arthroscopic knee surgery less than two weeks ago, led all Warriors with six tackles and got his second career interception.

EAST LANSING, Mich. – Javon Ringer scored three touchdowns and Drew Stanton threw for 301 yards (21-of-26) and three touchdowns to lead Michigan State past Hawai'i, 42-14, Sept. 10 at Spartan Stadium. A crowd of 74,043, the second largest road crowd in UH football history, saw the Warriors drop their second straight game of the young season and their sixth straight on the road.

Warrior quarterback Colt Brennan completed 23-of-31 pass attempts for 219 yards and two touchdowns, while Nate Ilaoa gained a career-high 76 yards on nine carries in his first start at running back, but it was not enough to stop the spirited Spartans who gained 499 yards of total offense, converted 70 percent of third down attempts, and sacked UH quarterbacks four times.

Michigan State scored on its first four possessions to jump out to a 28-0 lead and didn't bother looking back. Hawai'i managed to move the ball to the Spartan 15-yard line, but a field goal attempt by Dan Kelly sailed wide left midway through the first quarter.

Michigan State did more of the same in the second half, adding seven on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Stanton to Jerramy Scott to take 35-7 lead.

Hawai'i got on the board in the third quarter when slot receiver Davone Bess came down with a deflected pass for a 3-yard touchdown, his first as a Warrior. The touchdown capped an 11-play, 70-yard drive by Brennan and the Warrior offense.

And Brennan kept the Warrior offense moving in the fourth quarter. The sophomore from Irvine, Calif., orchestrated a 10-play, 67-yard drive capped by a 16-yard touchdown toss to Ian Sample, his first career TD reception, to cut the lead to 35-14 early in the fourth quarter, but the game was already out of reach.

MOSCOW, Idaho – Colt Brennan completed 34-of-44 passes for a career-high 347 yards and three touchdowns and the Warrior defense shutout the Vandal attack to lead Hawai'i to its first win of the season, 24-0, over Idaho in the Western Athletic Conference opener for both teams Sept. 24 at the Kibbie Dome. A crowd of 15,635 saw Hawai'i snap a six-game road losing streak dating back to 2003.

After Dan Kelly kicked a career-long 45-yard field goal late in the third quarter, to put Hawai'i ahead 17-0, true freshman Solomon Elimimian, in his first collegiate start, intercepted Wichman, giving the Warriors the ball back at their own 47-yard line. And Brennan and the Warrior offense took it from there. Brennan completed five of his next seven pass attempts, including a 5-yard strike to Bess, to round out the scoring.

HONOLULU – Boise State blocked the game-tying PAT attempt and returned it for a defensive two-point conversion to steal a 44-41 Western Athletic Conference win from Hawai'i Oct. 1 at Aloha Stadium.

That's how it ended, but not how it began. Hawai'i gained a season-high 556 yards of total offense and allowed only 21 offensive points, but lost it on special teams, allowing Boise State to score 16 unanswered points.

Hawai'i built a 20-7 halftime lead before Boise State struck back in the third quarter. Quarterback Jared Zabransky hit Jerard Rabb for a three-yard touchdown to cut the Warrior lead to six (20-14). And after forcing Hawai'i to punt, Quinton Jones vaulted the Broncos into their first lead of the game with a school-record 92-yard punt return to make it 21-20.

But Hawai'i got the ball back on a mishandled punt, and two plays later, Nate Ilaoa darted 37-yards for a touchdown to help the Warriors re-claim the lead (28-21) after the two-point conversion.

Zabransky and the Broncos caught a break when punter Kyle Stringer muffed the snap but managed to gain 13 yards to keep the Boise State drive alive. A 6-yard toss from Zabransky to Legedu Naanee tied the game at 28.

Boise State stole the lead again after Orlando Scandrick picked up a blocked field goal attempt and returned it 69-yards to the endzone. But Brennan bought time on the next play and threw a 73-yard bomb to Ryan Grice Mullen to tie it up at 35 with 11:01 left to play.

Another 6-yard toss from Zabransky to Naanee, put Boise State ahead for good at 42-35. Brennan answered with a 19-yard touchdown toss to Ryan Grice-Mullen that had the Warriors thinking overtime. But Boise State parlayed the PAT attempt into two points of their own end any hope of an upset.

RENO, Nev. – Nevada parlayed two Hawai'i turnovers into 14 points in the fourth quarter to defeat the Warriors, 38-28, Nov. 5 at Mackay Stadium. Warrior receiver Davone Bess caught for a career-high 171 yards and one touchdown while quarterback Colt Brennan threw for 409 yards and three touchdowns in the loss.

Running back Nate Ilaoa got Hawai'i on the board first with a 3-yard touchdown run, but the PAT was blocked, allowing the Wolf Pack to take the lead on the conversion after Caleb Spencer caught an 11-yard pass from Jeff Rowe.

Early in the second quarter, Brennan began at his own 1-yard line and tossed an 87-yard strike to Ross Dickerson. It was the fourth-longest pass play in UH football history. Four plays later, Brennan completed a 4-yard pass to Dickerson on fourth-and-goal, and a two-point conversion to Jordan Slye to put the Warriors ahead, 14-7.

Nevada scored the next 17 points to take a 24-14 lead, but Hawai'i answered with a 74-yard drive, capped by a 22-yard touchdown pass from Brennan to Ryan Grice-Mullen to make it 24-21 Nevada midway through the third quarter.

Nevada got the ball in Warrior territory after Ilaoa fumbled, and eight plays later, added a 6-yard touchdown run by B.J. Mitchell to take a 31-21 lead with 11:34 to play.

Brennan's attempt to mount a comeback resulted in an interception by Joe Garcia, giving the Wolf Pack the ball inside Warrior territory for the second time in as many possessions.

After Rowe scored on a 2-yard run, Brennan orchestrated an 87-yard drive capped by a 24-yard touchdown pass to Bess to cut the Nevada lead to 10 with 6:52 left on the clock, but Nevada ran out the clock to seal the win.

HONOLULU – Hawai'i wrapped up Western Athletic Conference play with a 50-23 win over Utah State Saturday night at Aloha Stadium. The Warriors scored 28 points in the second quarter, led by quarterback Colt Brennan who passed for 386 yards and two touchdowns (24-of-36), and rushed 10 times for 33 yards and a touchdown, to earn the win.

Hawai'i got off to a slow start and was forced to kick a pair of field goals before going on a 28-point scoring spree. Brennan threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to Davone Bess and ran for another, while running backs David Farmer and Nate Ilaoa scored from 1-and 3-yards out respectively to help the Warriors take a 34-3 halftime lead.

The scoring was aided by a spirited Warrior defense which forced a fumble, and held the Aggies to three first downs and 81 total yards in the first half.

Utah State got moving in the third quarter with a quick touchdown, and added another after a Warrior interception to make it 41-16, but the game was already out of reach. Hawai'i got big plays in the second half, a 62-yard touchdown toss from Brennan to Bess in the third quarter, and a 32-yard touchdown pass from backup quarterback Tyler Graunke to Aaron Bain midway through the fourth quarter, to help seal the victory.

HONOLULU – Running back Brian Calhoun rushed for 149 yards and one touchdown and John Stocco passed for 191 yards and two touchdowns to lead No. 24 Wisconsin past Hawai'i, 41-24, Nov. 25, at Aloha Stadium.

Warrior quarterback Colt Brennan passed for 403 yards (33-of-53) and three scores, two to Davone Bess, in the loss. Receiver Ryan Grice-Mullen led the Warriors with 11 catches for 139 yards. The totals carried Grice-Mullen over the 1,000-yard mark for the season, while Bess finished with four catches for 34 yards. The duo became the first in UH football history to catch for over 1,000 yards each in a season. Bess leads the Warriors with 1,082 yards, while Grice-Mullen reached the 1,061 mark.

Wisconsin jumped out to a 14-7 lead in the first quarter. Calhoun scored the first touchdown of the game on a 10-yard run, while Stocco hit Jonathan Orr for a 23-yard touchdown. Hawai'i got on the board in between Wisconsin touchdowns when Brennan hit Bess for a 3-yard touchdown.

The Badgers added a field goal early in the second quarter to take a 17-7 lead. After the Warriors missed a 46-yard field goal, Orr caught his second touchdown of the night, a 17-yard strike from Stocco, to help Wisconsin take a 24-7 lead with 2:18 left in the first half. Hawai'i place kicker Dan Kelly added a 42-yard field goal to cut the Wisconsin lead to 14 at the break.

The Wisconsin defense, which sacked Brennan five times in the game, recovered a fumble in UH territory and added a 24-yard field goal to take a 27-10 lead in the third quarter. Hawai'i answered with an 8-yard touchdown toss from Brennan to Bess, to cut the Badger lead to 10 midway through the third quarter, but that was as close as it got.

Bess left the game in the fourth quarter with a bruised lower back. Brennan's first pass of the fourth quarter was intercepted by Wisconsin's Dontez Sanders. Ten plays later, the Badgers scored on a 6-yard run by Booker Stanley and never looked back.
