Finished Mountain West competition tied for 10th in the league in blocked shots (0.8/g) ... Totaled eight points on 3-of-3 shooting, including a pair of three-pointers vs. No. 14 Oklahoma State at the San Diego Surf 'N Slam (12-30-12) ... Tied her collegiate best with three blocks and added two assists at UNLV (1-16-13) ... Came away with a season-high three steals at home vs. Air Force (2-2-13) ... Went 4-for-4 from the charity stripe and dished out a pair of assists at Nevada (2-23-13) ... Finished with seven points, sinking all three of her field-goal attempts, while adding five rebounds and a block vs. Colorado State (2-13-13) ... Played a season-long 28 minutes at Air Force, recording her first collegiate double-double with career-highs of 15 points and 13 rebounds to help SDSU clinch its second straight Mountain West regular-season title (3-6-13) ... Tallied four points and eight rebounds vs. Boise State (3-9-13) ... Averaged 5.0 points, 2.3 rebounds and 18.3 minutes in three games at the MW tournament ... Blocked two shots in the Aztecs' win over UC Santa Barbara in the first round of the WNIT (3-20-13).

#### ► As A Freshman (2011-12)

Preseason Mountain West Freshman of the Year ... Only true freshman to log a start for the Aztecs in 2011-12 ... Played in all 32 games, earning a starting spot in the opening eight contests ... Finished the season tied with Courtney Clements as the team's second-leading rebounder with 5.3 per game and was tops among MW freshmen ... Had 83 offensive boards, which is 28 more than any other SDSU player ... Also chipped in just under five points a contest (4.6) and had 25 steals and 15 blocked shots ... Had an Aztec game high in rebounding seven times and had two double-figure efforts to her credit ... Led the squad in steals twice and in scoring once ... Notched nine rebounds in her opening two games of her collegiate career ... Had 10 points on 4-of-8 shooting as well as two steals in the upset of No. 18 DePaul ... Notched a career-high 14 points on 5-of-10 shooting, while knocking down her only 3-point attempt of the year vs. Washington on Nov. 26 ... Had nine boards, including six on the offensive glass, and a season-high three blocked shots against USD ... Was a perfect 3-for-3 from the field at UC Irvine ... First double-figure rebounding performance in the win over Penn, grabbing 10 total ... Was 4-for-4 at the free-throw line and ended with eight points and eight boards in the Mountain

#### ► As A Junior (2013-14)

Was the team's top reserve, averaging 26.8 minutes in 28 games last season ... Earned a starting assignment in four of the first five outings ... Ranks second among SDSU returners in rebounding after grabbing 4.3 boards per contest a year ago ... Helped the Aztecs overcome an early deficit against UC Riverside in the opener of the San Diego Surf 'N Slam, scoring a season-high 11 points to go with seven rebounds (12-28-13) ... Also tallied 11 points the following week at Boise State (1-8-14) ... Finished with 10 points on a personal-best five field goals in the Aztecs' triumph at Air Force (2-15-14) ... Dished out a career-high eight assists at New Mexico (3-7-14) ... Drained multiple three-pointers in a game on five occasions during the year, including a pair of crucial conversions in the Aztecs' victory over Air Force in the opening round of the Mountain West Championship (3-10-14) ... Registered season-highs of nine rebounds and three steals the next evening in the quarterfinals against Nevada (3-11-14).

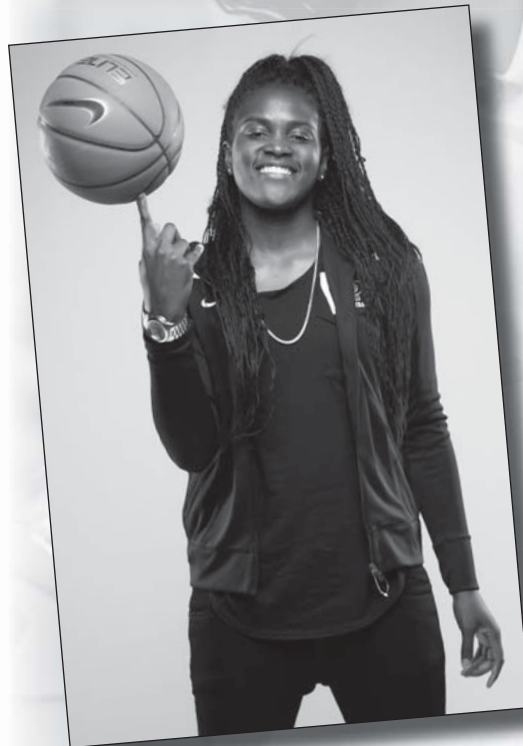

**► As A Junior (2013-14)**

Blossomed into one of the premier post players in the Mountain West during her first season as a full-time starter ... Ranked sixth among the conference leaders for all games in three categories, including field-goal percentage (.476), total rebounds (6.9/gm) and offensive rebounds (2.8/gm) ... Averaged 8.2 boards per outing in MW play, which was good for third in the league ... Collected four double-doubles on the year, highlighted by a career-high-tying 20 points to go with personal-best 17 rebounds in the Aztecs' win vs. Air Force (1-11-14) ... Also led all players with 20 points in SDSU's earlier triumph over Miami (OH) (12-19-13) ... Finished with double-figure rebounding totals on four other occasions ... Displayed her versatility with a collegiate-best five assists in two games vs. Wyoming (2-12-14) and at Utah State (2-19-14) ... Was one of two Aztecs to post a double-double in their big victory at San José State (2-26-14), recording 16 points and 14 boards ... Logged a career-high 37 minutes in SDSU's thrilling win over UNLV (3-4-14).

**► As A Sophomore (2012-13)**

Appeared in 31 games, making three starts ... Led the squad with a 52.2 field-goal percentage and ranked fourth with 23 steals ... Averaged 3.5 points and 3.6 rebounds in 14.7 minutes per game ... Tallied 10 points and a personal-best four steals vs. Cal State Dominguez Hills (11-18-13) ... Shot 5-for-6 from the field en route to a career-high 12 points against Fresno Pacific (12-19-13) ... Totaled eight points and three blocks vs. SMU at the San Diego Surf 'N Slam Classic (12-28-12) ... Made her first start as an Aztec a memorable one, completing a double-double with 11 points on 5-of-5 shooting to go along with a collegiate-best 14 rebounds vs. Savannah State (1-2-13) ... Also cracked the starting lineup in consecutive road games at Colorado State (1-13-13) and UNLV (1-16-13) ... Matched her career-high with three blocks in just 10 minutes of action at Nevada (2-23-13) ... Helped the Aztecs rally from a second-half deficit to defeat Cal Poly, shooting 5-of-7 from the field for a season-best 12 points to go with her four rebounds ... Combined for nine rebounds in two non-conference games vs. Penn and Longwood ... Was perfect on her only shots of the game vs. Longwood, UNCG and Boise State ... Four points at Boise State and one rebound ... Lone action at the Mountain West tournament was in the semifinals vs. Wyoming when she posted one basket, one assist and a steal in only five minutes of action ... Hopkins with four double-doubles and tied Kristina Hunter for third with 20 blocks ... Was one of five SDSU players to shoot over 70 percent from the free-throw line, draining 64-of-91 attempts (.703) ... Posted double-digit scoring performances on 17 occasions, including five times in a six-game stretch from Jan. 19-Feb. 9 ... Poured in 16 points and set a personal best with 12 rebounds to help the Aztecs knock off UC Irvine (11-14-12) ... Logged a career-high 35 minutes in a victory vs. Auburn at the Omni Hotels Classic (11-23-12) ... Tossed up her first collegiate three-point try with the shot clock winding down at Colorado (11-24-12) ... Was also 7-for-8 from the charity stripe against the Buffaloes ... Led all scorers with 16 points on 7-of-10 shooting in a win over Fresno Pacific (12-19-12) ...
