2005 SEASON RECAP

The 2005 season marked the re-emergence of the San Diego State men's soccer team onto the national scene. A team that was lightly regarded prior to the start of the season came on to finish in the middle of the Pac-10, crack the national rankings in four polls, and advance to the NCAA tournament for the first time in 16 years. The Aztecs were also the second-most improved Division I team in the nation last fall.

Along the way, SDSU received numerous individual honors, as it produced its first All-American since 1989 and saw its goalkeeper establish a new school mark for shutouts in a season. The team also showed its strength by defeating or tying no fewer than four nationally-ranked teams during its run to the postseason.

Signs of the good times to come during the season were evident from the start as the Aztecs opened their 2005 campaign at the Phillips/adidas Classic at Rutgers. In the opening day match-up with head coach Lev Kirshner's alma mater, SDSU got a goal from senior Heath Creager and defeated the Scarlet Knights, 1-0.

The next day, San Diego State tied fifth-ranked St. John's, 0-0, and served notice that it would be a side to reckon with the remainder of the year. Three Aztecs earned all-tournament honors including goalkeeper Tally Hall, defender Matt Couch and Creager. Hall also was named Defensive MVP of the tournament.

SDSU then returned home for a seven-

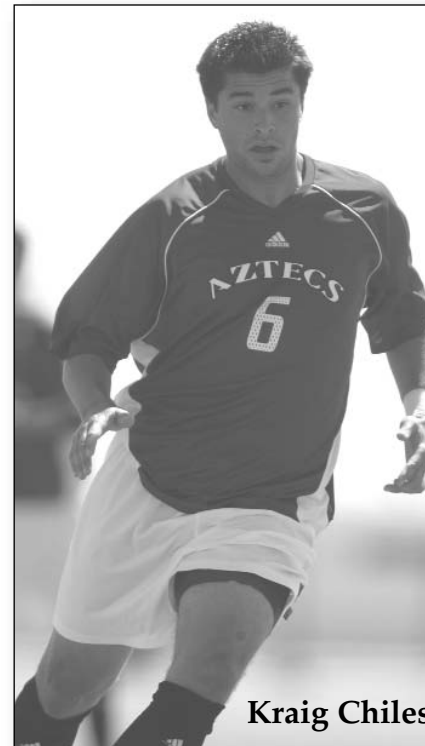
game homestand during which it recorded six victories and a tie. The run of seven contests began with a 3-0 win over UC Riverside. Sophomore Kraig Chiles put SDSU on the board with the first of what would be his team-leading seven goals on the season. Creager and Raul Bautista rounded out the scoring.

The Aztecs followed that up the next week with a 1-0 win over Point Loma Nazarene and a 4-2 defeat of Missouri-Kansas City to improve to 4-0-1. The first goal given up to UMKC (a late penalty kick) ended Hall's string of 453 minutes without allowing a goal. Hall, who was in the net for UMKC's second score, would go 717 minutes into the season without allowing a goal from open play until Stanford scored on him in late September.

Up next for SDSU was a 1-0 win over a tough Alabama A&M squad made possible by a Chiles penalty kick in the 88th minute after Bautista was brought down in the box. Three days later, the Aztecs hosted Duquesne, a team ranked third in the Middle Atlantic Region, and defeated the Dukes, 3-0. Freshman Kevin Werbner notched his first collegiate goal with Chiles adding a pair.

For his play in those two contests, Chiles was honored twice as he was named to the national college team of the week by both *Soccer America* and *College Soccer News*.

With a record of 6-0-1 and riding a five-match win streak, San Diego State was

ready to open its first-ever Pac-10 season at home against Stanford. The Aztecs entered the conference season having been picked to finish last in the six-team league in a poll among the head coaches.

Against the Cardinal, SDSU jumped out to an early lead on Chiles' sixth goal in four games, but Stanford got a late equalizer and the day ended in a 1-1 deadlock after two overtime periods. The next game, against the California Golden Bears, provided one of the many highlights of the season for the Aztecs.

With time running down and the score knotted at 0-0, Hall sent a long ball downfield that was flicked on by Couch to midfielder Dennis Sanchez, who knocked it home with just two seconds remaining to give SDSU the win. For their efforts during the week, Sanchez was named to *Soccer America's* national team of the week, while Couch earned the same honor from *College Soccer News*.

SDSU then traveled to Oregon State, where it suffered its first loss of the season at the hands of the Beavers by a score of 2-1. Two days later the Aztecs forged a 0-0 tie at Washington, then repeated that score line against three-time defending Pac-10 champ UCLA in Los Angeles.

With their record standing at 7-1-4, San Diego State was set for a match with local

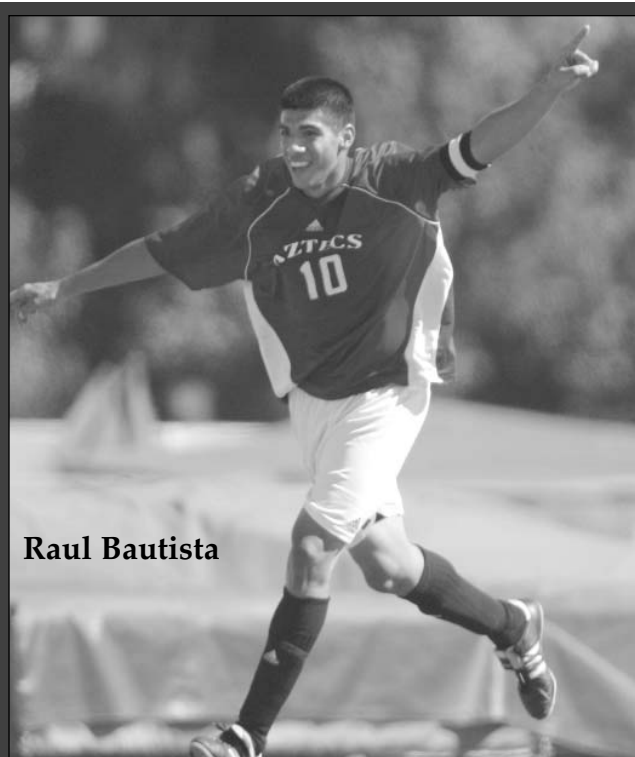

...had won the last four games between the two schools. A tight affair was settled midway through the second half when freshman Omar Persad struck from 18 yards out to give the Aztecs the 1-0 victory.

San Diego State returned to the Sports Deck for a pair of matches against Washington and Oregon State. Following a 0-0 tie against the 22nd-ranked Huskies, the Aztecs exacted a measure of revenge for the earlier loss to the Beavers, handing OSU a 2-1 setback on a pair of goals by Creager. Those results improved SDSU to 9-1-5 overall and 2-1-4 in Pac-10 play with three games remaining.

At Cal to open their final road trip of the year, the Aztecs found themselves a goal down and a man down (to a red card), but managed to tie the game late on a goal by Creager. A second red card, however, reduced the visitors to nine men and Cal scored in the first overtime to win, 2-1. The road trip concluded with another tie at Stanford with neither team scoring during regulation and two overtime periods.

The regular season finale was a home contest against sixth-ranked UCLA. On a day in which four SDSU seniors (Couch, Creager, Mike Mercuriali and Eric Santiago) were honored for their contributions to the program, the Aztecs came up

...st short, falling to the Bruins, 1-0, in double overtime. The game was played before an SDSU Sports Deck record crowd of 1,516 fans.

With a final regular-season mark of 9-3-6 overall and a fourth-place finish in the Pac-10 (record of 2-3-5), San Diego State received an invitation to play in the NCAA tournament. The first-round match at UC Santa Barbara, the runner-up at the 2004 NCAA tournament, marked SDSU's first postseason venture since 1989. Although they came up on the short end of a 2-0 score in that contest, the

2005 season was nothing short of an overwhelming success.

Over its 19 matches during the fall, San Diego State allowed only 11 goals, and did not concede a score in the first half of any game. The team's seven wins at home was the most in a season since 1998, when it recorded the same number. The six ties was also a team high in a season, surpassing the old mark of four set on seven occa-

sions. Even more astounding was the NCAA record six 0-0 ties the Aztecs played in.

SDSU received a number of individual awards at the conclusion of the 2005 campaign. Foremost among the honorees was goalkeeper Hall, who was named a third-team All-American. Hall finished the season ranked second in the nation in goals against average and first in save percentage, while setting a new SDSU record with 12 shutouts.

Hall was named to the all-Pac-10 first team while teammates Chiles and Couch received second-team accolades. In addition, Creager and Santiago were honorable mention honorees. Couch's overall excellent play enabled him to be selected by the Los Angeles Galaxy in the fourth round of the MLS supplementary draft in January.

Although San Diego State will lose four key seniors, the good news for the Aztecs is that eight of the 23 players who appeared in games in 2005 were freshmen. Four of those players found their name on the score sheet including Kevin Werbner, Sanchez, Persad and Nick Collins. A total of 14 freshmen appeared on the team's 29-man roster last fall, six of whom redshirted.

With seven starters returning along with a number of quality redshirts plus the addition of the 17th-ranked recruiting class the Aztecs are already looking forward to the new challenges of the 2006 season.
