## San Diego State Men's Soccer Welcomes Penn, Wisconsin in Second Annual The Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament

The San Diego State men's soccer team will look to pick up its first win of the season this weekend when it plays host to the second annual The Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament. The Aztecs (0-2-0), who dropped one-goal decisions to Loyola Marymount and San Diego last week, will meet Univ. of Pennsylvania at 4 p.m. Friday and Wisconsin at 1 p.m. Sunday. USD is the other school in the four-team tourney.

Last year, SDSU finished runner-up in the inaugural tournament after going 1-1. San Diego State lost to Michigan, 3-2, in overtime, before routing Albany, 6-0. Current sophomore Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.) was named the tourney's Most Valuable Defensive Player, while the Colorado contingent of Nick Cardenas (Thornton, Colo.), Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) and Evan Toft (Aurora, Colo.) each were selected to the all-tournament team.

## **Examining the Aztecs**

San Diego State enters the weekend looking to get on the win column for the first time this season. Both of the Aztecs' (0-2-0) setbacks have been by one goal, a 2-1 loss to Loyola Marymount on Sept. 1 and a 1-0 defeat to San Diego on Sept. 6.

The two losses are a bit deceiving, however, as SDSU has combined to outshoot its two foes, 30-24, including a 16-10 advantage on net. San Diego State also has more corner kicks (14-11) than its oppo-

nents and far less goalkeeper saves (15-7). In addition, the Aztecs had a 1-0 lead against the Lions and were victim of an own goal against the Toreros in the 1-0 loss.

Sophomore Daniel Steres (Calabasas, Calif.), who earned The Courtyard Marriott San Diego Central Tournament Most Valuable Defensive Player last year, has scored the only goal for SDSU this season. He also leads in points (two) and has put both of his shot attempts on net. Senior Evan Toft (Aurora, Colo.) and freshman Morgan Sacco (Greeley, Colo.) each earned assists on Steres' goal. Toft and junior Raymundo Reza (Denver, Colo.) lead the squad with six shots in the two games, while redshirt senior Jamel Wallace (San Diego/Oceanside HS) and senior *College Soccer News* preseason All-American Nick Cardenas (Thornton, Colo.) have played all 180 minutes. Redshirt junior Brad Byrns (Alamo, Calif.) has minded the net all 180 minutes and has a 1.50 goals against average and seven saves for a .700 save percentage.

## **Scouting the Quakers**

Penn enters Friday's game with a 0-1-1 record. Like the Aztecs, the Quakers have played two close games, falling, 3-2, at home to Seton Hall on Sept. 4 and settling for a double-overtime, 0-0 tie at crosstown rival Villanova on Sept. 7.

Alex Takakuwa has scored both goals for Univ. of Penn and also leads the squad in points (four) and shots on goal (three). Lee Rubenstein has an assist, while Nick Unger has a team-high seven shot attempts. Ben Berg has logged all 200 minutes in goal for the Quakers, posting a 1.35 goals against average and .786 save percentage.

Friday's match will be the second-ever meeting between the two schools. Penn won the only other game by a 2-0 score on Oct. 14, 1990.

## A Look at the Badgers

Wisconsin, which plays San Diego on Friday, is off to a 1-0-1 start two home matches into the 2009 campaign. The Badgers tied their opener against Virginia Tech (0-0) on Sept. 4, then knocked off Western Illinois, 1-0, two days later.

Mark Roos scored the game-winner against the Fighting Leathernecks, while Scott Lorenz and Austin Spohn lead the team with seven and six shots, respectively.

San Diego State and Wisconsin have never met.

San Diego State surrendered two unanswered goals in a 2-1 loss to Loyola Marymount ... The Aztecs got on the scoreboard 20:36 into the game when D Daniel Steres was on the receiving end of two perfect passes ... MF Morgan Sacco, who was one of two freshman starters, dribbled the ball down the right side and slid a pass to MF Evan Toft ... Toft then flicked a pass to Steres, who tucked the ball into the net for his fourth career goal ... It is the second straight year Steres scored a goal in the opening match ... F Raymundo Reza had a few good chances, including a shot that was stopped by a Lion defender on the goal line in the 22nd minute ... LMU tied it minutes later on a counterattack goal by Rafael Baca ... F Devon Sandoval had a breakaway stopped by the Loyola Marymount goalkeeper in the 36th minute ... Baca scored another early in the second half to secure the win for the Lions ... The Aztecs, who held a 15-10 advantage in shots and a 7-2 lead in corner kicks, received a game-high four shot attempts by Reza, including two on net, and three apiece by Sandoval (two on goal) and Toft ... GK Brad Byrns (0-1-0) played all 90 minutes and made two saves.

#### ▶ SAN DIEGO 1, SAN DIEGO STATE 0

SDSU couldn't overcome an early deficit on an own goal in a 1-0 loss to San Diego when, in the 15th minute, a San Diego State defender accidently knocked the ball into the net for an own goal ... The Aztecs had their chances, but Torero GK Kelin Briones was up to the challenge ... At the 33:21 mark, Briones came up with a save when SDSU MF Evan Toft ripped a volley off a corner kick right into Briones' stomach from 16 yards ... In the 60th minute, D Daniel Steres sent in a ball toward the box that was knocked out to a waiting F Raymundo Reza ... Reza then blasted a 25-yard shot low to the left side that was covered up nicely by the Torero's Briones ... SDSU arguably had its best chance to score minutes later, when MF Jose Altamirano beat two USD defenders on the left side and sent a low ball to a streaking Sacco ... Sacco was unable to get off a solid attempt on the play and another USD defender hit the ball out of the box ... SDSU outshot USD, 15-14, including a 9-5 advantage of shots on net, but lost the corner kick battle, 9-7 ... Aztec GK Brad Byrns (0-2-0) made five saves in 90 minutes, including a diving stop in the 40th minute and another key save in the 79th minute ... SDSU forced Briones to make nine saves.

#### At the Helm

Lev Kirshner is in his 10th year as the head coach and 13th season overall. Kirshner, just one of three coaches in the 40-year history of the program, has brought SDSU back to the national spotlight with back-to-back runner-up finishes in the Pac-10 (2006-07) and two trips to the NCAA tournament in the past four seasons.

Since the men's soccer team earned its full allotment of scholarships in 2005, the Aztecs have gone 32-28-17, including a 14-13-13 mark in the Pac-10.

Over his nine seasons, Kirshner has coached two All-America selections, three Academic All-America picks, eight professional players, six all-Far West selections and 40 all-conference picks.

## Aztecs Picked to Finish Fifth in Pac-10.....Again

Despite returning eight starters from last season, including six all-conference selections, the San Diego State

men's soccer team has been picked to finish fifth in the Pac-10 History Pac-10 Poll Conference in the preseason poll voted on by the league's coaches on Aug. 13.

SDSU picked up nine points, three behind fourth-place Washington (12). California is predicted to win the regular season title with 24 points, including four first-place votes, while UCLA grabbed the other two first-place votes and is picked to finish second with 22 points. Stanford is third with 15 points, followed the Aztecs (9) and Oregon State (8).

San Diego State, which has never been picked higher than fourth in its five preseason polls, has finished the season better than each of its predicted finishes. In its inaugural Pac-10 season in 2005, SDSU was picked sixth, yet managed a fourth-place finish. The Aztecs finished second in each of their next two seasons despite being picked fourth and fifth, respectively, in the preseason poll. Last year, San Diego State was picked fifth but finished third in league play.

## Aztec Men's Soccer Recruiting Class Ranked No. 22 in the Nation

San Diego State's 2009 men's soccer recruiting class has been ranked as the 22nd-best in America by College Soccer News. It is the third top-25 class by SDSU in the past four years and fourth top-40 recruiting class over the past five campaigns.

The accolades of the five-player group include, but are not limited to, an under-17, 18 and 20 U.S. national team starter, numerous high school All-Americans, multiple starters on ODP teams, a nationally-ranked goalkeeper and one of the top defenders from the state of Texas.

On the website, the Aztecs are one spot behind perennial power Indiana (21st) and ahead of South Carolina (23rd), Harvard (24th) and Santa Clara (25th). Other schools behind San Diego State include Big East members St. John's (26th), Connecticut (27th) and Georgetown (28th), Big West programs Cal Poly (33rd) and UC Irvine (38th), and SEC power Clemson (35th).

## Cardenas Named to College Soccer News Preseason All-America Team

San Diego State's Nick Cardenas (Thornton, Colo./Horizon HS) was named a preseason All-American by College Soccer News in early July. A senior, Cardenas was picked as a third-team selection by the website after being a third-team member in 2007 as well.

A defender, Cardenas has anchored a backline which has posted 18 shutouts over his three-year career. Last season, Cardenas tallied a career-high four assists while leading the team in minutes played (1,646).

A member of the 2008 preseason M.A.C. Hermann Award Watch List, Cardenas became the first Aztec to be named to three straight NSCAA/adidas all-Far West teams since Kyle Whittemore (1985-88) when he was picked as a second-team selection in December. He also garnered all-Pac-10 Conference accolades for the third consec-

A 2006 U.S. U-20 National Team Camp call-up, Cardenas has twice been named a national player of the week (Sept. 17, 2007 by Top Drawer Soccer and Nov. 1, 2006 by NSCAA/adidas). In 2006, Cardenas was picked as the Pac-10 Freshman of the Year, as well as a College Soccer News All-Freshman and a Top Drawer Soccer All-Rookie first-team selection.

## Altamirano Named One of 100 Freshmen to Keep an Eye On

San Diego State men's soccer incoming player Jose Altamirano (San Diego/Southwest HS) recently has been picked by College Soccer News as one of the 100 Freshmen From Coast To Coast To Keep An Eye On. Current Aztecs who have previously been named to the preseason list include seniors Daniel Ortega (San Diego/Eastlake HS) and Evan Toft (Aurora, Colo./Grandview HS), and redshirt sophomore Gemechu Abraham (Beaverton, Ore./Beaverton HS).

Altamirano (5-7, 135) comes to The Mesa as the most heralded recruit in recent history. Altamirano is a member of three U.S. national team age groups (U-20, U-18, U-17) and is a three-time NSCAA Youth All-American (2006-08). Altamirano, who ESPNRISE.com ranks as the third-best prospect in the country and Top Drawer Soccer.com rates as the fifth, also garnered All-America accolades from EA Sports, Parade Magazine and ESPN-RISE.com after the 2008 campaign. Additionally, Altamirano was picked as the CIF Player of the Year and San Diego County's Player of the Year.

## Aztec Men's Soccer and Kick for Hope Team Up to Raise Money for Africa

The San Diego State men's soccer team recently concluded a successful soccer clinic with Kick for Hope, a nonprofit organization that organizes soccer events to raise money for charities in Africa. It benefits children in Africa whose lives are ravaged by poverty and disease such as HIV/aids and malaria.

Following the Aztecs' game against San Diego on Sunday, SDSU head coach Lev Kirshner and the rest of the men's soccer team ran a one-hour soccer clinic for participating boys and girls from the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO). All the benefits went directly to Kick for Hope.

"We are extremely grateful to SDSU for hosting the AYSO clinic to benefit Kick for Hope," Kick for Hope President Kristen Chandler said. "While raising \$550 to support our efforts, we also raised awareness among the youth and their families about the struggles facing African children, who like them, have a passion for soccer. We hope each player left with a sense of satisfaction that their participation will not only impact their game, but will also impact on the lives of some of the poorest children in the world."

In addition to the Kick for Hope soccer clinic with the AYSO players, Kirshner also did a special coaches clinic with various coaches of club teams in the area. Some of the topics Kirshner focused on included practice organization, attacking and defending techniques and strength and conditioning methods, to name a few.
