## SCENE SETTER (through games of Oct. 31)

- Of the 103 FBS schools that have played football to date, 17 are undefeated. Two of those teams meet Friday night in Carson, Calif., when San Diego State (2-0) plays host to San José State (2-0). This is the first time in the 44 all-time meetings (44th meeting is Friday) that both teams enter the contest unbeaten and untied.
- Among schools that have played at least two games in 2020, only three games this week feature undefeated teams. In addition to the Spartans-Aztecs matchup there is also Clemson (7-0) at Notre Dame (6-0) and Brigham Young (7-0) at Boise State (2-0). If you relax the threshold slightly you could include Purdue (2-0) at Wisconsin (1-0).
- San Diego State carries a four-game win streak into Friday's game. That is the longest active win streak in the Mountain West and is tied for the ninth-longest win streak nationally.
- San Diego State improved to 2-0 for the fourth time in the last five seasons on Saturday with a dominating 38-7 victory at Utah State. The Aztecs enjoyed a 570-215 advantage in total offense and a +3 turnover margin (TO: SDSU 0, Utah State 3). The 31-point victory was the largest by any unranked visiting team in Logan in more than a decade (Oct. 23, 2010).
- The offense delivered for the second straight week, posting 38 points and 570 yards of total offense. Senior running back **Greg Bell** became the first San Diego State running back in at least 25 seasons to post consecutive 100-yard rushing efforts to open his Aztec career. Bell's second straight 100-yard effort, third of his career and 341st in SDSU history gives him 268 yards rushing through two games. He is third nationally in rushing yards per game at 134.0.
- The Aztec defense limited the Aggies to seven points and 215 yards, while forcing three turnovers. SDSU intercepted two passes, forced two fumbles (recovered one) and had four tackles for loss. SDSU limited the Aggies to 79 total yards on 22 plays after interception. Senior Aztec **Dwayne Johnson** leads the unit with 13 tackles through two games.
- The Aztecs appear among the national leaders in a host of categories this week. SDSU leads the nation in scoring defense (6.5), total defense (200.5), yards allowed per play (3.34) and rushing offense (347.0). In addition, the Aztecs also appear among the national leaders in other key metrics - third in scoring margin (+29.5), turnover margin (+1.50), passing yards allowed (109.0) and defensive third-down conversion (22.6), fourth in net punting (45.50), fifth in defensive pass efficiency (93.19) and tackles for loss (9.0), seventh in rushing defense (91.5) and ninth in time of possession (34:33).
- San Diego State is +59 in scoring margin in jumping out to a 2-0 start. The +29.5-point average ranks third nationally (all other teams in the top 10 are ranked in the AP Top 25 Poll), and is the best two-game scoring margin (contained in the same season) for the program since a +64 following wins at San José State (52-7) and Nevada (42-23) late in the 2017 season.
- The +59 scoring margin is the best in a decade for SDSU. In 2010, in the second season of Brady Hoke's first stint as head coach, the Aztecs were +67 after two games following a 47-0 season-opening win over Nicholls State and a 41-21 road win at New Mexico State.

preview of the upcoming game, a recap of the last game and much more.

- San Diego State carries a five-game win streak against teams from the state of California into Friday's game. The current win streak includes wins over UCLA, Fresno State, Sacramento State and San José State (twice). The Aztecs are 13-2 against the state since Oct. 3, 2015.
- For the second consecutive week, San Diego State is receiving votes in the AP Top 25 Poll. The Aztecs, who were nationally-ranked for three weeks in 2019 and have appeared in the AP Poll in three of the last four seasons, are currently 38th in the poll.

**INSIDE THE MATCHUP**

Friday's matchup features some interesting strength vs. strength matchups, but first, a few oddities.

- This marks the first time in the series (Friday is the 44th meeting) that both teams have come into the game undefeated and untied. In 1941, the Aztecs entered the Oct. 10 game with a 2-0 record, while the Spartans were 2-0-1. San José State won that game, 20-0.
- San Diego is the home team despite playing 113 miles away from its future home in Mission Valley (beginning in 2022 the Aztecs will play at a new multi-purpose facility being built in the shadow of where SDCCU Stadium sits). San José State's CEFCU Stadium is 354 miles away from the site of Friday's game giving the Aztecs a 241-mile advantage. No doubt that the Spartans flight (a flight from San Jose to LAX is approximately 1:10 minutes) will be shorter than the Aztecs two-hour bus ride to the area.

Now onto the items to keep an eye on.

- **Aztecs Pass Defense vs. Spartans Passing Game:** Through two games, San José State is 57-of-78 (73.1 percent, 8th nationally) through the air for 707 yards with seven touchdowns and one interception. The Spartans are fifth nationally in passing yards per game (353.5) and 12th in pass efficiency (176.27). San José State has seven consecutive 200-yard passing games, have one interception or less in 15 of its last 16 games (nine total since the start of 2019, tied for the 23rd fewest) and 24 straight games with a passing efficiency of 100 or better.

Through two games, SDSU opponents are 35-of-60 (58.3 percent) through the air for 218 yards with two touchdowns and two interceptions. The Aztecs are third nationally in passing yards allowed per game (109.0) and fifth in pass efficiency defense (93.19). San Diego State has gone three consecutive games without allowing an opponent to throw for 200 yards and has kept the opposition below that threshold in five of the last seven contests. In three of its last six games SDSU has held its opponent to a passer rating below 100 (last week: at Utah State, 86.2). SDSU has two interceptions this season and its 129 picks since the start of the 2012 campaign are tied for the fifth most nationally.

- **Turnover Margin:** Always a key indicator of the outcome, turnover margin is of particular importance because it is where both teams excel. Entering the week, San Diego State is +3 in the category for the season and the +1.50 average is tied for third nationally. San José State is +2 to date and the +1.00 average is tied for ninth in the country.

Both programs have been strong in this area for a while. San Diego State has ranked among the top five nationally in the category in three of the past five seasons, including second last season (+1.46). Last season, San José State tied for ninth in the country (+0.83).

Taking care of the ball has become a staple for the Aztecs. San Diego State has run 151 offensive plays this season without a turnover (lone turnover in 2020 came on a punt return). Since the start of the 2019 campaign (15 games), San Diego State has nine total turnovers (two of which came on special teams). The nine turnovers are the second fewest nationally during that span (Oregon State, 6).

Turnovers have been a huge indicator with regard to the outcome for San Diego State. The Aztecs are 34-2 the last 36 times they have had an advantage in the category.

In addition, SDSU has done a great job of taking care of the ball. The Aztecs have two total turnovers in its last five games combined and have one turnover or less in 14 of its last 15 games.

SEASON SETUP

- San Diego State is coming off a 10-3 campaign, culminating with a dominating 48-11 win over Central Michigan in the New Mexico Bowl. Among last season's highlights were the program's first-ever victory over UCLA (23 all-time meetings), a win over Brigham Young (first since 2005) and a 6-1 record in road/neutral games. SDSU spent three weeks in the Top 25 last season and ended the campaign at No. 31 in the final AP Poll.
- SDSU returns 16 starters (seven offense, eight defense and one kicker). Nine Aztec players on the defensive side of the ball have made at least nine career starts, led by senior **Tariq Thompson** with 41 starts (every game since arriving as a true freshman in 2017).
- Seventeen different Aztec players received preseason accolades, with nine players - sophomore kicker **Matt Araiza**, junior defensive end **Keshawn Banks**, junior tight end **Daniel Bellinger**, long snapper junior **Turner Bernard**, junior running backs/returner **Jordan Byrd**, sophomore guard **William Dunkle**, junior cornerback **Darren Hall**, sophomore defensive tackle **Cameron Thomas** and senior Warrior (safety) **Tariq Thompson** - on watch lists for national honors and/or named first-team all conference.
- The Aztecs are playing their 2020 and 2021 home games at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, Calif., while the University builds its future stadium in Mission Valley in the footprint of SDCCU Stadium. San Diego State is scheduled to play four games this season and seven games next year at DHSP, which is located 113 miles from the University's previous home stadium.

PROGRAM-AT-A-GLANCE

- SDSU's active consecutive streak of 10 straight bowl games is tied for the 11th-longest streak nationally. San Diego State is the only football team in the state of California - college or pro - to play in the postseason each of the last 10 years.
- SDSU is one of 13 schools and one of two Group of 5 schools in the nation to play in a bowl game each of the last 10 seasons.
- Since the start of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State is 51-18 record with a 73.9 percent winning percentage (11th nationally) and the Aztecs are 50-15 (76.9 percent) in winning percentage nationally (tied for eighth nationally) since Oct. 3, 2015.
- SDSU has four double-digit victory seasons in the last five years. Only 10 schools in the nation can say that - San Diego State, Alabama, Appalachian State, Boise State, Clemson, Georgia, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Wisconsin.
- Since the start of the 2019 campaign, San Diego State is 9-0 in games decided by seven points or more.
- The Aztecs' three losses last season came by a combined 13 points and seven of their last eight losses have been by nine points or less.
- San Diego State has 10 consecutive winning seasons, which is the second-longest streak in program history and the longest since a 17-year stretch from 1961-77.
- San Diego State is 50-15 in its last 65 overall games and 33-11 in its last 44 regular-season games against Mountain West opponents (35-11 against MW opponents, including conference championship games).
- The Aztecs are 13-8 in their last 21 games decided by eight points or less.

SPECIAL TEAMS / OVERALL TRENDS

- The Aztecs have are 34-2 the last 36 times when owning a turnover advantage.
- San Diego State is 12-1 the last 13 times it has an advantage in field position.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State is tied (Kansas State and Memphis) for the most kickoff returns for touchdowns with 11.

SERIES NOTES

- Friday marks the 44th meeting between San Diego State and San José State. SDSU leads the series, 22-19-2.
- As previously mentioned, Friday's game marks the first time both teams have entered the game with a perfect record (undefeated and untied). In 1941, the Aztecs entered the Oct. 10 game with a 2-0 record, while the Spartans were 2-0-1. San José State won that game, 20-0.
- San Diego State has won the last seven encounters (34-30 at Spartan Stadium in 2014,





38-7 at Qualcomm Stadium in 2015, 30-7 at Spartan Stadium in 2016, 42-3 at Qualcomm Stadium in 2016, 52-7 at CEFCU Stadium in 2017, 16-13 at SDCCU Stadium in 2018 and 27-17 at CEFCU Stadium last season).

- In the last seven games in the series (all won by San Diego State), the Aztecs have outscored the Spartans, 239-84, and have a 2,114-430 advantage in rushing yards.
- San Diego State entered this game in 2018 with a lead in the series for the first time since owning a 2-1 advantage following the 1937 game. San José State went on to win the next 11 games played between the teams.
- In San Diego against the Spartans, the Aztecs are 12-6-1. San Diego State is 10-1 against SJSU in SDCCU/Qualcomm/Jack Murphy/SDCCU Stadium and has won the last three encounters in America's Finest City.
- San Diego State has not trailed at any point of the game in five of the last six meetings between the teams (2018).
- When SJSU took a lead in the first quarter of the 2018 game it marked the first time the Aztecs trailed in a game against the Spartans since SDSU took a 34-30 lead with 3:32 to play in the 2013 game. SDSU did not trail for 249:36 of game clock between the teams.
- Against San José State, San Diego State has 15 100-yard rushing games and three 300-yard passing games.
- In the 2017 meeting at San Jose, San Diego State rushed for a school-record 554 yards against the Spartans.
- In the last eight meetings, San Diego State has produced eight 100-yard rushing efforts. In 2018, **Rashaad Penny** rushed 20 times for 234 yards and three touchdowns, while **Juwan Washington** added 16 carries for 134 yards and two touchdowns and **Chase Jasmin** had 14 carries for 82 yards and one score.
- SDSU and SJSU met annually from 1968 to 1977, but went 18 years before the two former PCAA rivals renewed acquaintances in 1995 as members of the Western Athletic Conference.
- San Diego State has outrushed San José State in 15 of the last 16 meetings.
- San Diego State has rushed for 2,114 yards in the last seven games against San José State (302.0 yards per game). The Aztecs have averaged 5.9 yards per rush and have 24 rushing touchdowns in those games.
- In the beginning of the series the Spartans dominated the Aztecs, going 12-0-1 in an early 13 game stretch from 1938-56. The men from Montezuma Mesa were shut out by SJSU in nine of those 13 meetings. Since then though, SDSU has posted a 16-5-1 record and has won 13 of the last 16 encounters.
- Eleven of the last 14 games between the two schools have been especially lopsided (21 or more points) and have ended in favor of the Aztecs 10 times. The winning margin in the last 14 contests has been 21.4 points, despite the fact that three of the last eight games have been decided by four points or less.

**SAN JOSE, Calif.** – San Diego State received contributions from all three phases of the game - offense, defense and special teams - and never trailed in defeating San José State for the seventh straight time, 27-17, at CEFCU Stadium.

The win made the Aztecs (6-1, 3-1 MW) bowl eligible for the 10th consecutive season.

SDSU ran for 260 yards and two touchdowns on offense, held a potent Spartan (3-4, 1-3 MW) offense well below their season average and got standout performances in the kicking and return game from a host of San Diego State specialists.

Kaegun Williams opened the game with a 95-yard kick return for touchdown. It marked the 11th time San Diego State has returned a kickoff for a score since the start of the 2015, the most in the nation.

SJSU responded with a quick 4-play, 66-yard drive, culminating in a 15-yard touchdown pass from Josh Love to Kaire Robinson.

After exchanging punts the rest of the first quarter, the Aztecs took the lead early in the second quarter on a 41-yard field goal by Matt Araiza.

Later in the quarter, SDSU put together an incredible 20-play drive over 10 minutes, 5 seconds (10:05), but had to settle for a 27-yard field goal by Araiza, heading into halftime with a 13-7 lead. The 20 plays were tied for the longest in a drive in FBS play this season (Wake Forest vs. Boston College), while the 10:05 was the sixth-longest possession time in a drive this year.

San José State came out of the intermission with the goal to take the lead, but San Diego State held the Spartans to a 25-yard field goal.

The Aztecs responded with another long drive, this time going 57 yards on 11 plays over 6:12, ending with a 1-yard touchdown run

by Jwan Washington. SDSU passed only one time on the drive - a 10-yard completion from Ryan Agnew to Jesse Matthews - while pounding the run for 47 yards on 10 carries to take the 20-10 lead.

After forcing a 3 and out, San Diego State went to the ground again as Chase Jasmin took a handoff on a third-and-3 situation 50 yards for the score. It was the longest run of Jasmin's career and longest play by the Aztecs this season.

SJSU later had an impressive drive in the fourth quarter when it went 99 yards on 11 plays before Love found Bailey Gaither for an 8-yard touchdown strike, cutting the deficit to 10 at 27-17.

After a failed onside attempt, SDSU tried to run out the clock, but was unable to overcome four penalties on the drive. Facing fourth-and-4, Brandon Hecklen punted the ball 54 yards to the San José State 1-yard line. Backed into its own end zone, Love's first pass attempt was picked off by Caden McDonald and returned 11 yards to the Spartan 2.

Three kneeldowns later, San Diego State completed the 27-17 win.

The 260 yards on the ground came from a host of Aztecs, including 78 by Washington, 70 from Jasmin, 45 by Chance Bell, a career-high 44 by quarterback Ryan Agnew and 27 from Williams.

Agnew was 13-for-20 for 86 yards through the air, extending his career-long streak to 102 passes without an interception.

Kyahva Tezino's 10 tackles led a SDSU defense that held SJSU to just 272 yards, its fewest in a game this season and fewest since gaining 200 on Nov. 17, 2018 vs. Nevada. San José State came into the game averaging 29.3 points and 415.8 yards per game.

San Diego State, which came into the game ranked second nationally in turnover margin and third in time of possession, won both categories once again, going +1 in turnover margin and an impressive 20:44 advantage in time of possession.

BULLET NOTES - OFFENSE

- San Diego State returns seven starters on offense this season - junior tight end Daniel Bellinger, junior running back Jordan Byrd, sophomore right guard William Dunkle, sophomore wide receiver Jesse Matthews, junior wide receiver Kobe Smith, senior left tackle Kyle Spalding and senior right tackle Zachary Thomas.
- Jeff Hecklinski is in his first season as offensive coordinator at San Diego State. Hecklinski was on Hoke's original SDSU staff in 2009 and 2010 as the assistant head coach, running backs coach and recruiting coordinator. He was also with Hoke at Michigan (2011-14) and Ball State (2004-08). He replaces Jeff Horton, who now serves as the associate head coach and running backs coach.
- Of all FBS schools that have played at least 38 games since 2015, San Diego State is tied with LSU for the fewest turnovers (67).
- Since the beginning of last season, San Diego State's offense has run 1,084 plays and is responsible for just six turnovers and only one fumble (one turnover every 180.7 offensive snaps).

**RUSHING OFFENSE**

- San Diego State is 46-2 the last 48 times it has rushed for at least 200 yards and is 43-1 in its last 44 regular-season games when rushing for 200-plus yards.
- San Diego State has a 100-yard rusher in 31 of its last 55 games since 2016 (40, 100-yard rushers total) and 40 of the last 69 games since 2015 (52, 100-yard rushers total). Since Jeff Horton arrived as the running back coach in 2011, SDSU has a 100-yard rusher in 76 of the 121 games and 92, 100-yard rushers overall.
- Rush average this season by down - 1st: 7.8; 2nd: 6.5; 3rd: 5.6; 4th: 7.5.
- Rush average and touchdowns this year by quarter - 1st: 5.9/0; 2nd - 6.8/2; 3rd - 7.8/2; 4th - 7.4/2 - and by half - 1st: 6.5/2; 2nd: 7.6/4.
- San Diego State had two rushers at New Mexico State (Jordan Byrd - 118 and Chance Bell - 116) on Sept. 14, 2019 for the 30th time in program history. The Aztecs are 29-1 in those occasions, including a 19-game win streak. SDSU has multiple 100-yard rushers nine times in the last 50 games.
- RB Greg Bell ranks third in FBS play in rushing yards per game (134.00, 1st in MW), eighth in rushing yards per carry (6.54, 1st in MW) and 14th in all-purpose yards per game (148.50, 8th in MW), while leading the league in rushing yards (268).
- G. Bell became SDSU's 80th different 100-yard rusher with 111 yards vs. UNLV in the 2020 opener on Oct. 24. He then followed with a career-high 157 yards at Utah State.
- G. Bell became the first Aztec since at least 1996 to record consecutive 100-yard games to start his SDSU career.
- G. Bell has three 100-yard rushing games in six career Division I games.
- RB Chance Bell is tied for first in the Mountain West in rushing touchdowns (3), tied for seventh in rushing yards per game (69.00, T-58th in FBS) and eighth in rushing yards (138).
- RB Jordan Byrd's 28.3 yard rush average is the highest in FBS play this season (min. 4 attempts).
- Byrd had a 73-yard touchdown at Utah State on Oct. 31, the longest by an Aztec since Rashaad Penny's 81-yard touchdown run against Army West Point in the 2017 Armed Forces Bowl (Dec. 23).
- If you take away the two times QB Carson Baker has been sacked for 10 yards, he has rushed seven times for 48 yards (6.9 avg.).

**PASSING OFFENSE**

- Since the start of the 2017 season, San Diego State has thrown 17 interceptions. That is tied for the second fewest picks in the nation over that span (min. 35 GP). In contrast, Temple has thrown 54 interceptions over that span, which is the most since 2017.
- QB Carson Baker picked up the win in his first career start (and appearance) against Brigham Young on Nov. 30, 2019, going 19-for-24 for 172 yards and a touchdown without throwing an interception. Baker became just the second quarterback in the Aztecs' Division I history (since 1969) to win in his starting debut having never previously thrown a collegiate pass (also Joe Davis vs. Arkansas State on Sept. 12, 1976) and the first SDSU quarterback to start in a game having never previously thrown a pass since Ryan Lindley started on Aug. 30, 2008 vs. Cal Poly. Baker also became the fourth straight San Diego State quarterback to win in his starting debut, joining Maxwell Smith (Aug. 30, 2015 vs. San Diego), Christian Chapman (Dec. 5, 2015 vs. Air Force in the Mountain West Championship game) and Ryan Agnew (Sept. 15, 2018 vs. No. 23/25 Arizona State). Aztec quarterbacks were 1-13 in the previous 14 debuts prior to this stretch. He finished with the most completions (19) by an Aztec quarterback in his starting debut since Lindley's 27 completions in the Cal Poly game on Aug. 30, 2018 and most completions in a SDSU win in his debut since Tim Gutierrez had 32 in a 48-17 win over Minnesota on Sept. 25, 1993.
- Baker has the 10th-most pass attempts in FBS this season (52) without an interception.
- Baker ranks fifth in the Mountain West in pass efficiency rating (125.19) and completion percentage (57.69), seventh in completions per game (15.00) and passing yards (300), and eighth in passing yards per game (150.00), total offense per game (169.00), yards per completion (10.00) and yards per attempt (5.77), and tied for 10th in points responsible for per game.
- WR Kobe Smith had back-to-back 100-yard receiving games last year, the first Aztec to do so since Ezell Ruffin had three straight in 2013.
- Smith is one of 40 players in program history with at least three 100-yard receiving games.
- WR Jesse Matthews finished with 19 catches and 340 yards (85.0 ypg) over his final four games of 2019.
- Among freshmen in SDSU single-season history, Matthews ranked second in receptions (48) and third in receiving yards (633) last year.
- Matthews had the fifth-most catches (48) in the country without a dropped pass last year (according to Pro Football Focus).
- Matthews has at least one catch in 15 straight games, the longest streak on the team.

**BULLET NOTES - DEFENSE**

- Kurt Mattix is in his first season as defensive coordinator at San Diego State. He previously served as defensive coordinator at Eastern Kentucky and worked with Hoke at Michigan.
- San Diego State's returns nine starters off a team that finished second in the nation in scoring defense and fifth in the national in total defense a year ago. Starters that are back for the Aztecs are senior linebacker Andrew Aleki, junior defensive end Keshawn Banks, junior cornerback Darren Hall, senior cornerback Tyler Hawkins (played safety last year), senior Aztec Dwayne Johnson Jr., junior linebacker Caden McDonald, sophomore defensive tackle Cameron Thomas, senior warrior Tariq Thompson and senior warrior Trenton Thompson.

**DEFENSIVE NUMBERS**

- SDSU has gone 38 straight quarters without allowing more than one score, which is the longest active streak in FBS, followed by Marshall (21 quarters) and Notre Dame (15).
- The 38 straight quarters allowing one or less score is the third-longest streak since 2010, trailing only Alabama (46 from 2011-12) and TCU (40 in 2010) and just ahead of Marshall (37 in 2015), and Boise State (32 in 2010).
- The last time San Diego State allowed multiple scores in a quarter was the second quarter vs. Wyoming on Oct. 12, 2019. The Aztecs have allowed just 107 points over the last 38 quarters (2.82 points per quarter).
- Last year SDSU allowed 165 points (12.7 ppg) and 3,741 yards (288.7 ypg). In the last year before Brady Hoke and Rocky Long took over the program (2008), San Diego State allowed 446 points (37.2 ppg) and 5,529 yards (460.8 ypg).
- The Aztecs allowed just 165 points last season in 13 games (12.7 ppg), their fewest allowed in a season since yielding 165 in 1977 in 11 games (15.0 ppg). The 12.7 points allowed per game were their fewest allowed since giving up 11.4 points per game in 1976 and the fourth fewest allowed in SDSU's Division I history (since 1969).
- SDSU has allowed just 178 points over the last 15 games (11.9 ppg).
- SDSU has held an opponent scoreless on its opening drive 51 times since 2015 (69 games).
- Opponents last year had 149 drives where they tried to score on SDSU's defense (excludes kneel downs to end half/game). The Aztecs forced three-and-outs (or better) in 65 of those drives (43.6 pct.). SDSU averaged 5.00 three-and-outs per game).
- This year there have been 24 drives where opponents have tried to score on SDSU's defense. The Aztecs have forced three-and-outs (or better) in 15 of those drives (62.5 pct.). SDSU is averaging 7.50 three-and-outs per game.
- Of the last 64 fourth-down chances against the Aztec defense dating back to 2016, opponents have converted just 23 times (35.9 pct.).
- WAR Tariq Thompson has played in 41 straight games, the longest streak on the defense and tied for the longest streak on the team.
- Ta. Thompson has the most consecutive starts among any offense or defense player on the team (41). Thompson's 41 career games are also the most among any Aztec on the defensive side of the ball.
- Ta. Thompson is tied for fifth all-time at SDSU in fumble recoveries (5) and tied for eighth in forced fumbles (5) (also tied for 10th among active FBS players).
- Ta. Thompson tied for sixth in SDSU single-season history last year in fumble recoveries (3).
- DE Keshawn Banks and LB Garret Fountain each rank in a tie for eighth in FBS (T-2nd in MW) in forced fumbles per game (0.50).
- LB Caden McDonald is tied for third in the Mountain West in tackles for loss per game (1.75, T-13th in FBS).
- LB Seydrick Lakalaka is tied for sixth in the Mountain West in tackles for loss per game (1.50, T-24th in FBS).
- McDonald was named the Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 26 for his play against UNLV (Oct. 24), when he posted career highs of eight tackles, three tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks after entering the season with 36 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks in 26 career games. The 2.5 sacks matched the most by a SDSU player since Jay Henderson's three sacks vs. Northern Illinois on Sept. 30, 2017.
- WAR Rashad Scott is tied for the MW lead (T-2nd in FBS) in fumble recoveries (2).

**RUSHING DEFENSE**

- Opponents rushed 356 times against the Aztecs last year and only five attempts were longer than 20 yards (1.4 pct.). This year opponents have rushed 60 times with one attempt longer than 20 yards (1.7 pct.).
- On third and fourth down tries this year, opponents have rushed 16 times for 41 yards (2.6 avg.).
- Opponent rush average by downs this year - 1st: 3.2; 2nd: 3.3; 3rd: 3.5; 4th: -1.3.
- LB Andrew Aleki and WAR Tariq Thompson lead the Aztecs with seven tackles on rushing plays.

**PASSING DEFENSE**

- Since the beginning of the 2015 campaign, San Diego State's 93 interceptions the second most in the country, while its 10 interception returns for touchdowns are tied for 11th in the country.
- WAR Tariq Thompson is tied for second among active FBS players in interceptions (11) and tied for the seventh most in program history.
- CB Darren Hall tied for second in SDSU single-season history with 16 pass breakups a year ago, six behind Marlon Andrews (22 in 1990).
- LB Seydrick Lakalaka and S Rashad Scott are ranked in a tie for second in the Mountain West in interceptions (1) and interceptions per game (0.50, T-10th in FBS).
- LB Caden McDonald is tied for fourth in the Mountain West in sacks per game (1.25, T-9th in FBS).
- Hall leads the Aztecs with six tackles on pass plays.

**BULLET NOTES - SPECIAL TEAMS**

- ESPN Team Efficiencies ranked San Diego State's special teams unit as the 23rd best in the country in 2015, 13th in 2016, 28th in 2017, 55th in 2018 and 10th in 2019.
- Former SDSU captain Doug Deakin is in his 10th season with the program and his third as special teams coordinator.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, San Diego State has 11 kickoff returns for touchdowns, tied for the most in FBS play over that time (tied with Kansas State and Memphis). To put that stat into perspective, 28 other teams have played at least 60 games over that span and do not have a single kick return touchdown.
- K Matt Araiza set a school single-season record with 22 field goals in 2019, surpassing John Baron II's 21 in 2016, and tied for fifth in field goal percentage (84.62).
- Araiza has made a field goal in 15 straight games, which is the second-longest active streak in FBS behind Kansas State's Blake Lynch (17).

**LOGAN, Utah** -- San Diego State pulled away in the second half with the final 28 points of the game in a 38-7 win over Utah State Saturday night in Logan, Utah.

Greg Bell ran for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown and added a 29-yard touchdown reception for the Aztecs (2-0, 2-0 MW), which racked up 407 yards on the ground.

Up 10-7 at the half after an Aggies' (0-2, 0-2 MW) 37-yard touchdown pass with no time left in the second quarter, SDSU dominated the rest of the way, scoring on four consecutive drives and outgaining USU, 345-81, over the final 30 minutes, including a 199-6 advantage in the third quarter.

San Diego State took its opening drive of the second half 75 yards on 10 plays before Greg Bell muscled his way for a 6-yard score.

After forcing a three-and-out, the Aztecs went 68 yards in just six plays, culminating with a Chance Bell sweep right on a fourth-and-1 situation for a 27-yard score to open up a 24-7 lead.

Forcing another three-and-out, SDSU methodically drove 82 yards on 15 plays, ending with a Greg Bell catch and run from Carson Baker for 29 yards and his first career touchdown reception.

On SDSU's next possession, Jordan Byrd broke free for a 73-yard touchdown run to cap the scoring with 5:14 left in the fourth quarter.

Baker hit Kobe Smith for a 15-yard touchdown to get San Diego State on the scoreboard late in the first quarter.

Matt Araiza, who missed two field goals earlier in the first half, made it 10-0 Aztecs with a 28-yard field goal with 1:10 left in the first half.

Utah State, however, went 73 yards in just 1:01, ending with a 37-yard touchdown pass from Jason Shelley to Deven Thompkins with no time left in the second quarter. It was one of only three times in the game the Aggies would get into SDSU territory.

The 31-point loss was the Aggies' worst home loss to an unranked team since a 38-point setback to Hawai'i on Oct. 23, 2010.

San Diego State's 304-yard rushing margin (407-103) was the fifth-largest margin in program history. Additionally, the Aztecs improved to 46-2 the last 48 time they rushed for at least 200 yards.

Chance Bell added 98 yards on the ground in just 10 carries, while Byrd got all 73 yards on his only rushing attempt.



Baker completed 18 of 27 passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns, improving to 3-0 for his career as the team's starting quarter-

**COACHING HIGHLIGHTS**

- Has amassed 35 years of coaching experience at the collegiate level including 12 seasons as a FBS head coach at Michigan (2011-14), San Diego State (2009-10) and Ball State (2003-08).
- Received conference coach-of-the-year recognition in three different leagues as a head coach while posting a 78-70 overall record. During his tenure as a head coach, Hoke's teams have produced 76 all-conference selections.
- Brings 20 years of experience as a collegiate defensive coach with stints at Grand Valley State (1983), Western Michigan (1984-86), Toledo (1987-88), Oregon State (1989-94), Michigan (1995- 2002), Oregon (2016) and Tennessee, where he was named interim head coach for the final two games of the 2017 campaign.

**AT SAN DIEGO STATE**

- Hoke returned to "America's Finest City" as the Aztecs' defensive line coach in 2019, helping SDSU rank second in FBS in rush defense (75.4), third in scoring defense (12.7), and sixth in both total defense (287.8) and pass efficiency defense (110.25).
- Spent two seasons as San Diego State's head coach (2009-10), earning Mountain West Coach of the Year honors in 2010 after leading the Aztecs to their first postseason appearance in 12 years with a victory over Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl.
- Coached 18 all-MW performers during his first stint at SDSU, as well as 25 conference all-academic recipients.

**OTHER COACHING EXPERIENCE**

- Served as head coach at Michigan from 2011-14, guiding the Wolverines to a 31-20 record, including an 18-14 conference ledger. He became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home (14-0) in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02.
- Directed the Wolverines to an 11-2 record and a victory in the Allstate Sugar Bowl in his first season on the Ann Arbor campus. For his efforts, Hoke collected the inaugural Hayes-Schembechler Coach of the Year award from the Big Ten Conference coaches while garnering Dave McClain Coach of the Year accolades from the Big Ten media. In addition, he was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year that season and was a finalist for three other national Coach of the Year honors: Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual.
- During Hoke's tenure in Ann Arbor, the Wolverine defense improved from a unit that in 2010 ranked 108th in the FBS in scoring defense and 110th in yards allowed to one that ranked among the top 20 in total defense in 2011, 2012 and 2014. Meanwhile, the offense averaged nearly 30 points per game (29.2) in his four years at the helm.
- Under Hoke's tutelage at Michigan, a total of 21 Wolverine players received all-Big Ten recognition.
- Earned his first head coaching job at his alma mater, Ball State, where he guided the program for six seasons, culminating with a 12-1 campaign in 2008 and an undefeated Mid-American Conference regular season.
- With Hoke at the controls, Ball State made its' first-ever appearance in the national polls in 2008, ranking as high as 12th by the Associated Press and 13th in the USA Today Coaches poll. For his efforts, Hoke was one of 10 finalists for the 2008 Liberty Mutual National Coach of the Year award.
- Led the Cardinals to back-to-back bowl game appearances (2007-08), the first time the feat was accomplished in school history. The 2008 team, which also advanced to its first MAC championship contest, earned an invitation to the GMAC Bowl in Mobile, Alabama.
- As a defensive line coach at Michigan, Hoke was part of three Big Ten champion teams (1997, 1998, 2000), including the 1997 national champion and Rose Bowl-winning squad, before his promotion to associate head coach in 2002.
- Began his coaching career as an assistant at Yorktown (Ind.) High School in 1981 before entering the collegiate ranks as a defensive line coach at Grand Valley State in 1983.

Big Notes

- SDSU has gone 34 straight quarters without allowing more than one score. The last time San Diego State allowed multiple scores in a quarter was the second quarter vs. Wyoming on Oct. 12, 2019. The Aztecs have allowed just 100 points over the last 34 quarters (2.94 points per quarter).
- The six points allowed by the Aztecs were their fewest given up in a conference game since shutting out Hawai'i, 52-0, on Nov. 5, 2016.
- UNLV was just 1-for-15 on third down against SDSU. The 6.7 third-down conversion percentage was the lowest since Sept. 24, 2005 against San José State (0-for-17).
- SDSU improved to 45-2 over its last 47 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.
- SDSU has scored 82 points over its last two games, outscoring the opposition, 82-17.

Season Opener Notes

- San Diego State improved to 52-42-5 all-time in season-opening games, including a 27-24-1 mark in the Division I era (since 1969).
- SDSU won its sixth consecutive opener that has been played at home. Over the six games, San Diego State has outscored its opponents, 184-33.

Team Notes

- The Aztecs scored 27 points in the first half, their most in a first half since scoring 35 at San José State on Nov. 4, 2017.
- The Aztecs outgained the Rebels, 313-25, at the half, including a 100-0 advantage in the air and a 213-25 edge on the ground.
- San Diego State's 14 tackles for loss were its most since at least the 2012 season.
- SDSU's five sacks were its most since recording six at New Mexico State on Sept. 14, 2019.

Aztecs Dominate UNLV, 34-6, in 2020 Opener

CARSON, Calif. -- San Diego State used a dominating first half in all three phases of the game and held steady in the second half in a 34-6 victory over UNLV at Dignity Health Sports Park in Carson, Calif.

Greg Bell rushed for 111 yards and a touchdown in his Aztec (1-0, 1-0 MW) debut, Kaegun Williams ran for a career-high 89 yards on 11 carries (8.1 avg.), and Chance Bell (two touchdowns) and Jordan Byrd each added 40 yards apiece on seven and three rushing attempts, respectively.

SDSU jumped out to a 27-0 lead, thanks to four consecutive scores as part of a 20-point second quarter. The four successive scores all came in the final 10 minutes, 36 seconds of the half on touchdown runs by Chance Bell (five yards) and Greg Bell (three yards), and a pair of field goals by Matt Araiza (27 and 22 yards).

UNLV, meanwhile, only got onto the SDSU side of the field once in the first half and missed a 42-yard field goal. The stout San Diego State defense forced six Rebel punts and forced six 3-and-outs (or better) over the seven drives in the first two quarters.

After 30 minutes, the Aztecs held a 313-25 advantage in total yards, including a 100-0 edge in passing yards and 213-25 lead on the ground. Additionally, SDSU had 17 first downs compared to just one for UNLV.

The Rebels, however, used a 13-play, 81-yard drive to begin the second half, culminating with a 4-yard pass from Max Gilliam to Steve Jenkins.

After each team traded punts for the rest of third quarter, UNLV tried to cut the 27-6 deficit (the Rebels missed a PAT after their touchdown) with another long drive. UNLV went 73 yards on 18 plays over 6:28, twice converting on fourth down. With a fourth-and-goal from the San Diego State 4-yard line, the Aztec defense snuffed out a screen pass into a 11-yard loss to stop any momentum left for the Rebels.

SDSU quickly raced 85 yards in five plays, thanks in part to a 40-yard rush by Greg Bell and a 33-yard pass from Carson Baker to Elijah Kothe. Chance Bell then took a counter almost untouched from 19 yards out for the final points of the game.

San Diego State outgained the Rebels, 424-186, for the game with a commanding 207-yard advantage on the ground (287-80). The Aztecs improved to 45-2 over their last 47 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.

Defensively, the Aztecs totaled 14 tackles for loss (SDSU's most since at least 2011), five sacks and five pass breakups, allowing their fewest points (6) in a conference game since shutting out Hawai'i, 52-0, on Nov. 5, 2016. UNLV was just 1-for-15 on third down, the lowest percentage (6.7 pct.) against San Diego State since Sept. 24, 2005 against San José State (0-for-17).

Dwayne Johnson Jr. had a game-high 10 tackles, while Tariq Thompson pitched in with nine stops. Caden McDonald, meanwhile, had career highs of eight tackles, three tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks.

Baker threw for 137 yards in his second career start, including a 4-yard touchdown pass to Ethan Dedeaux to get the Aztecs on the scoreboard in the first quarter.

SDSU improved to 52-42-5 all-time in season openers.

**Big Notes**

- San Diego State's 31-point victory marks Utah State's worst home loss to an unranked team since a 38-point loss to Hawai'i on Oct. 23, 2010.
- SDSU has outscored its opposition by 59 points this season (72-13).
- San Diego State improved to 2-0 for the fourth time in the last five seasons (2016, 2017, 2019 and 2020).
- The Aztecs improved to 2-0 in conference play for the fifth time in the last six seasons (2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2020).
- San Diego State improved to 46-2 over its last 48 games when rushing for at least 200 yards.
- SDSU is now 6-1 in its last seven road games dating back to the beginning of the 2019 season.
- San Diego State handed Utah State only its third loss in its last 14 home games and just its second loss in its last 10 conference home games.
- SDSU won its conference-opening road game for the sixth straight season.
- The Aztecs have now gone 38 straight quarters without allowing more than one score, which is the longest active streak in FBS play. The last time SDSU allowed multiple scores in a quarter was the second quarter vs. Wyoming on Oct. 12, 2019. San Diego State has allowed just 107 points over the last 38 quarters (2.82 points per quarter).
- SDSU outrushed Utah State by 304 yards (407-103), which is the fifth-largest margin in program history, largest since a 384-yard advantage Nov. 12, 2016 at Nevada.
- The Aztecs are now 40-0 in the Division I history (since 1969) when outrushing its opponent by at least 200 yards.
- SDSU's 355-yard margin is the 10th highest in school history and most since a 448-yard advantage at San José State on Nov. 4, 2017.

Aztecs Dominate Aggies to Remain Unbeaten

**LOGAN, Utah** -- San Diego State pulled away in the second half with the final 28 points of the game in a 38-7 win over Utah State in Logan, Utah.

Greg Bell ran for a career-high 157 yards and a touchdown and added a 29-yard touchdown reception for the Aztecs (2-0 2-0 MW), which racked up 407 yards on the ground.

Up 10-7 at the half after an Aggies' (0-2, 0-2 MW) 37-yard touchdown pass with no time left in the second quarter, SDSU dominated the rest of the way, scoring on four consecutive drives and outgaining USU, 345-81, over the final 30 minutes, including a 199-6 advantage in the third quarter.

San Diego State took its opening drive of the second half 75 yards on 10 plays before Greg Bell muscled his way for a 6-yard score.

After forcing a three-and-out, the Aztecs went 68 yards in just six plays, culminating with a Chance Bell sweep right on a fourth-and-1 situation for a 27-yard score to open up a 24-7 lead.

Forcing another three-and-out, SDSU methodically drove 82 yards on 15 plays, ending with a Greg Bell catch and run from Carson Baker for 29 yards and his first career touchdown reception.

On SDSU's next possession, Jordan Byrd broke free for a 73-yard touchdown run to cap the scoring with 5:14 left in the fourth quarter.

Baker hit Kobe Smith for a 15-yard touchdown to get San Diego State on the scoreboard late in the first quarter. Matt Araiza, who missed two field goals earlier in the first half, made it 10-0 Aztecs with a 28-yard field goal with 1:10 left in the first half.

Utah State, however, went 73 yards in just 1:01, ending with a 37-yard touchdown pass from Jason Shelley to Deven Thompkins with no time left in the second quarter. It was one of only three times in the game the Aggies would get into SDSU territory.

The 31-point loss was the Aggies' worst home loss to an unranked team since a 38-point setback to Hawai'i on Oct. 23, 2010.

San Diego State's 304-yard rushing margin (407-103) was the fifth-largest margin in program history. Additionally, the Aztecs improved to 46-2 the last 48 times they rushed for at least 200 yards.

Chance Bell added 98 yards on the ground in just 10 carries, while Byrd got all 73 yards on his only rushing attempt.

Baker completed 18 of 27 passes for 163 yards and two touchdowns, improving to 3-0 for his career as the team's starting quarterback.

Smith's six catches and 64 yards led SDSU, which improved to 2-0 for the fourth time in the last five seasons (2016, 2017, 2019 and 2020).

Andrew Aleki, Darren Hall and Tayler Hawkins led a balanced San Diego State defense with five tackles apiece. For the game, San Diego State limited USU to just 215 yards and forced three turnovers, including interceptions by Seydrick Lakalaka and Rashad Scott, and a forced and recovered fumble by Michael Shawcraft.

Continues to improve on his accuracy ... In addition to field goals, PATs and kickoff duties, is expected to punt this year ... For his career, ranks third at SDSU in field goal percentage (.806) (min. 25 att.) and 13th among active FBS kickers ... Has made a field goal in 15 straight games, which is the second-longest FBS active streak behind Kansas State's Blake Lynch (18).
- **2020 (Sophomore):** Has been named to the Lou Groza Award Watch List as the nation's top college placekicker ... Also is a preseason first-team all-Mountain West selection by Phil Steele Magazine and a third-team pick by Athlon Sports ... College Football News deemed him "SDSU's third-best offensive player" ... Has played in both games on the season, including twice as the kicker and kickoff specialist, and once as the punter ... Is 3-for-5 (.600) in field goal attempts and 9-for-9 in PATs ... Is tied for the team lead with 18 points ... Also has punted five times for 249 yards (49.8 avg.) with four of the five punts going for at least 50 yards and a long of 58 yards ... Two of his five punts have landed inside the 20-yard line ... Has kicked off 13 times for 839 yards (64.5 avg.) with seven touchbacks ... Is tied for first in the FBS in PAT percentage (1.000, T-1st in MW), and ranks third in net punt average (47.00, 2nd in MW), tied for fourth in field goal attempts per game (2.50, T-2nd in MW), tied for 13th in kickoff average (64.54, 3rd in MW) and tied for 21st in field goals per game (1.50, T-4th in MW) ... Is also tied for 31st in points per game (9.00, T-4th in MW), 35th in kickoff touchback percentage (53.85, 3rd in MW) and tied for 64th in field goal percentage (60.00, 8th in MW), while ranking in a tie for fourth in the MW in kickoffs (13) and tied for 10th in points responsible per game (9.00) ... vs. UNLV (Oct. 24) ... Made both of his field goal attempts and all four PATs against UNLV on Oct. 24, accounting for 10 of the team's 34 points ... Now has multiple field goals in nine of his 14 career games ... Has made at least one field goal in all 14 games ... Also recorded his first career six punts for 249 yards (49.8 avg.) with a long of 58 yards, with two going inside the 20-yard line ... The 58-yarder was the longest in an Aztec season opener in their Division I era (since 1969) ... Four of his six punts were for at least 50 yards, while posting a 47.0 net average ... Also kicked off six times for 389 yards for an almost perfect average of 64.8 with three touchbacks ... at Utah State (Oct. 31) ... Was 1-for-3 in field goal attempts at Utah State, connecting on a 28-yarder after having a 33-yard attempt blocked and missing a 45-yarder ... Made all five of his PATs ... Also kicked off seven times for 450 yards (64.3 avg.) with four touchbacks.

Tied for the FBS lead with a perfect PAT percentage, and led the Mountain West in touchback percentage (78.46, 6th in FBS), field goals (22, T-11th in FBS), field goals per game (1.69, T-12th in FBS), field goal attempts (26, T-15th in FBS) and touchbacks (51, T-16th in FBS), while ranking third in field goal percentage (84.62, 24th) and kickoff average (62.77, 34th in FBS), tied for fourth in kicking points (94, T-47th in FBS), fifth in kickoff yards (4,080, 57th in FBS) and points per game (7.23), sixth in total points (94, T-72nd in FBS) and seventh in kickoffs (65, T-60th in FBS) ... Among freshmen kickers in the country, he ranked first in field goals (22), and was third in field goal percentage (84.62) and eighth in points by kickers (94) ... Was one of only five kickers in FBS play to make at least one field goal in every game (min. 12 games) ... Accounted for all of San Diego State's points in a 6-0 win over Weber State in the opener, knocking in a pair of field goals (34 and 29 yards) in his first collegiate action ... Also kicked off three times for 195 yards and a perfect average of 65.0 yards per boot ... Was named the Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week for the first time of his career on Sept. 9 for his play at UCLA when he went 3-for-4 on field goal attempts and 2-for-2 on PATs, while posting five touchbacks in six kickoffs ... Made a then career-long 43-yarder in the first quarter, while his three field goals and 11 points were also a then career best ... His other makes came from 31 and 25, while his lone miss was from 47 yards ... Made multiple field goals for a second straight game ...
