#### **This Week**

The San Diego State track and field team opens the outdoor portion of its 2002 schedule this Saturday when it competes in the Trojan Invitational. The event will be held at USC's Cromwell Field. SDSU closed the indoor season last weekend in Colorado Springs at the Mountain West Conference Indoor Championships, the team finished in sixth place with 58.50 points.

#### Saturday's Schedule

Running events begin at 11:40 a.m. with the women's 3000-meter run, while throwing events will get underway at 8:30 a.m. with the women's hammer. Field events at Cromwell Field will start at noon with the women's pole vault. The meet will also include some open events.

#### The Field

Several schools from Southern California will participate in this weekend's event, including California, Long Beach State and Cal State Fullerton.

#### **Recapping The MWC Championships**

The highlight of the Aztecs' appearance in the league championships came in the pole vault pit, where Shayla Balentine set a MWC record. The freshman vaulted a first-place mark of 3.84 meters (12-07.25), her second NCAAprovisional mark of the indoor season. Junior Leslie Miller placed fifth in the pentathlon with second-place finishes in the 60-meter hurdles and 800-meter run. Junior Melinda Smedley placed-fourth in the 200-meter dash (24.54) and in the 60-meter dash (7.66). Junior Jini Hogg raced to a fourth-place time of of 55.91 in the 400-meter dash and freshman Alisha Lasswell placed fourth in the high jump (1.67m, 5-05.75).

#### **Vaulting To Success**

Two SDSU pole vaulters entered the MWC championships looking to improve on NCAA provisional marks. On Jan. 12, two Aztecs, senior Tricia Gutierrez and freshman Shayla Balentine, set school record and NCAAprovisional marks at the National Pole Vault Summit, in Reno. Balentine and Gutierrez both vaulted 3.90 meters (12-09.50). At the Wolf Pack Invitational, on Feb. 2, Gutierrez set another NCAAprovisional mark with a 3.82-meter (12-06.25) second-place vault. Balentine came in third in the competition (3.72m/12-02.25). Gutierrez's school-record mark bested the record of 12-07.50 she set last season.

#### **Aztec Honors**

Senior Tricia Gutierrez's school record and NCAAprovisional vault at the National Pole Vault Summit earned her Mountain West Conference indoor track athlete of the week honors for the period ending Jan. 14. The occasion marked her first career athlete of the week award.

#### **Coaching Staff**

The Aztecs are led by head coach Rahn Sheffield, who is in his 11th season with the Aztec program. Sheffield is assisted by Jennifer Nanista, Richard Fox, Leslie Coons and Kristi McGihon. Nanista oversees the team's distance corps, Fox works with the pole vaulters, Coons with the throwers and McGihon handles the jumps.

#### **League Leaders**

Several Aztecs are listed among the top-5 best indoor times and marks this season in the Mountain West Conference. Senior Tricia Gutierrez and freshman Shayla Balentine are tied for second in the pole vault with a 12-09.50 mark. Junior Jesika Englebretson is fifth in the vault (12-01.25). Junior Melinda Smedley and sophomore Tonnette Dyer are third (24.34) and fourth (24.42), respectively, in the 200-meter dash. Junior Jini Hogg is fifth (55.91) in the 400-meter dash. Junior Leslie Miller has the league's fifth-best score in the pentathlon (3,486).

#### A Year Ago

SDSU won three events at last year's USC Invitational. Senior Aimee Crabtree won the pole vault with a 12-foot clearing. Senior Aja Frary won flight 3 of the long jump with a 5.87 meter effort and senior Promise Mose turned in a second-place finish in the 400 meters (56.28).

#### Change In Plans

Earlier this week, the San Diego State track and field program announced a change to its 2002 outdoor schedule. The Aztecs' scheduled home meet against UC Irvine and UC San Diego on Sat., Mar. 9 has been canceled. The team will instead travel to Fullerton for the Ben Brown Invitational to be held March 8-9.

#### The Outdoor Season At A Glance

Following the Aztecs competition at the Ben Brown Invitational in Fullerton on Mar. 8-9, the team will return to Los Angeles to compete with USC and Tennessee in a 10 a.m. meet on Mar. 16. On Mar. 23, the team will host the Aztec Invitational and on Apr. 13 the All-

The 12th-ranked Aztecs, fresh off an 8-5 victory on Wednesday over the 13th-ranked Michigan Wolverines, will travel to UC Irvine for matches against the 17th-ranked Anteaters and the University of Redlands on Saturday. On Sunday, the Aztecs will look for revenge against Long Beach State after the Beach beat the Aztecs 6-3 at the UCSB Tournament last weekend. Games are scheduled at noon, 1:30 p.m. and noon, respectively. The Aztecs record currently stands 6-6 overall, 0-1 in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation.

#### **Aztecs Look To Build On Win At Burns**

Coming off its first win of the season at the John Burns Intercollegiate in Wahiawa, Hawaii, the 26th-ranked San Diego State men's golf team looks to make it two in a row as the Aztecs travel to the Pacific Coast Intercollegiate. The twoday, 54-hole tournament will be played at the La Purisima Golf Course (par 72; 7,105 yards) in Lompoc, Calif., March 7-8, and is being hosted by UC Santa Barbara. The Pacific Coast Intercollegiate gets underway with 36 holes on Thursday, March 7th. The final 18 holes will be played on Wednesday, March 8th.

#### The Field

In addition to the 26th-ranked Aztecs, ranked teams entered in the 2002 Pacific Coast Intercollegiate include No. 9 Fresno State and No. 35 Nevada. Rounding out the 18-team field are Cal State Bakersfield, Colorado State, Denver, Hawaii-Hilo, Long Beach State, New Mexico State, Pacific, San Francisco, San Jose State, Santa Clara, UC Davis, UC Irvine, UC Riverside and Wyoming.

#### **Aztecs Versus The Field**

San Diego State has finished in the top five in five of six tournaments this season and enters the week with a 75-14 overall record. SDSUhas faced 11 teams in this year's Pacific Coast field, posting an 18-5 mark against Colorado State (3-1), Denver (2-0), Fresno State (1-2), Hawaii-Hilo (1-0), Long Beach State (1-0), Nevada (1-1), New Mexico State (1-0), Pacific (1-1), San Francisco (2-0), San Jose State (3-0), Wyoming (2-0).

#### **Last Time At La Purisima**

Last year's Pacific Coast Intercollegiate was completely washed out as rain scuttled both days of the tournament. Two years ago, San

Diego State held a five-stroke lead following the opening day's action, but couldn't hold on down the stretch, combining for a final-round 307 and slipping to third.

Magnus Carlsson paced SDSU, finishing in seventh at 10over 224. The only current Aztecs in the lineup for San Diego State was Lars Johansson. Then a freshman,

#### Back Spin — Aztecs Win Burns

John Lieber took medalist honors and Brandon Kearney and Mark Warman each turned in top-20 finishes as the Aztecs topped the leaderboard from wire to wire at the John Burns Intercollegiate in Wahiawa, Hawaii, last week. The win was the first of the season for San Diego State, which defeated three top 20 squads in the event. Lieber opened the tournament with a career-low 7-under par 65 and led the entire way, finishing up with a pair of 71s en route to his third 9-under 207 of the season and his first collegiate tournament victory. But the win was a team effort for the Aztecs, who in addition to Lieber had three other players finish up among the top 25, including junior Scott Henderson, whose 2-over 218 was good enough to place him 22nd. Junior Lars Johansson, the 2001 Mountain West Conference Golfer of the Year, finished up strong with a final-round 72 to place 40th after back-to-back disappointing rounds.

#### **Aztec Chip Shots**

- SDSU has finished in the top 5 in 5-of-6 tournaments thus far, including a first and two seconds. The Aztecs' only non-top 5 finish was a sixth at UNM's Tucker Intercollegiate.
- Six of the nine players who have appeared in at least two tournament's this season own stroke averages under 73.0.
- In players with at least nine competitive rounds this season, junior John Lieber owns the Aztecs' stroke average lead at 71.2.
- John Lieber has finished below par in six straight rounds and has averaged 69.0 in SDSU's last two tournaments. The junior also owns three top-5 finishes this season.
- Three Aztecs have appeared in all-six tournaments thus far, including John Lieber, Mark Warman, and Brandon Kearney.

#### **Head Coach Dale Walker**

San Diego State is in its second season under the direction of head coach Dale Walker. He guided the Aztecs to a top-25 ranking and a 12th-place finish at the 2001 NCAA West Regional in his first year at the helm. A 1980 graduate of SDSU, Walker was a standout performer for the Aztecs from 1975-79. In his one-and-a-half seasons at the reins of the SDSUmen's golf program, Walker has guided the Aztecs to four tournament titles.
