# <u>Nevada Wolf Pack (4-5-1, 0-0 MW)</u>

## This Week

The University of Nevada soccer team (4-5-1, 0-0 MW) will open up Mountain West play on the road Friday, facing its consecutive ranked opponent with a match against No. 12 San Diego State (9-1-1, 0-0 MW) at 7 p.m. The Aztecs lead the overall series 2-0, defeating Nevada 3-1 in the previous meeting during the 2003 season in San Diego. The 12th-ranked San Diego State team will be the highest ranked opponent Nevada has faced as a program.

Sunday the Wolf Pack will face its final non-conference opponent, as the team travels to Spokane Wash., to face Gonzaga at 11 a.m. The teams tied their only previous match 1-1 in double overtime during the 2010 season, squaring off at a neutral site in Missoula, Mont.

Game-By-Game -Week Six-

### Sunday, Sept. 23- No. 15 Cal 3, Nevada 0

Nevada used the energy of the record crowd of 1,007 fans in the first half to battle the 15th-ranked Cal team. Cal took a 1-0 lead over Nevada with four seconds remaining before halftime, as a shot bounced off the back of a Wolf Pack defender and into the net. Cal forward Ifeoma Onumonu turned a cross from sophomore Kory Lamet into a goal in the 56th minute to extend their lead to 2-0. The Bears scored again two minutes later to take a 3-0 lead on a goal by junior Kaitlyn Fitzpatrick.

-Week Five-

Friday, Sept. 14- Nevada 3, Weber State 2 (OT)

Nevada's defense stifled Weber State in the opening period, as the Wildcats were unable to record a shot. The Wolf Pack offense struck the first blow in the 17th minute on a goal by junior Chelsea Fricke that was crossed in from a corner kick by sophomore Madison Lorenzen. Wildcats mid-fielder Chansi Crompton's unassisted goal in the 62nd minute knotted the game up at 1-1. Weber State followed up the goal with a second five minutes later, taking a 2-1 lead on a goal by Mackenzie Day. Nevada answered back with 17 minutes remaining in the match, as senior Sarah Schmeda received a pass from Chrisalyn Fonte and swiftly touched the ball pass the Weber State goalkeeper to tie the game at 2-2. Sarah Schmeda's second goal of the night came on a breakaway within the first two minutes of the overtime period to win the match 3-2.

-Week Four-

Friday, Sept. 7- Nevada 1, San Jose State 0

Nevada won its consecutive match on the road, defeating San Jose State 1-0 last Friday evening. The Nevada offensive attack came alive in the 64th minute, as sophomore Chrisalyn Fonte scored a goal to give Nevada a 1-0 lead. The goal gives the Union City, Calif. native five goals on the year. The Wolf Pack defense tightened up, allowing only one shot on goal in the final 16 minutes to give Nevada a 1-0 win.

Sunday, Sept. 9- San Francisco 2, Nevada 0

San Francisco got out to a 1-0 lead over Nevada in the 33rd minute, as Mackenzie Krieser scored a goal on an assist by Lauren Abuali. The Dons held a 15-5 shot advantage over the Wolf Pack in the opening half. Nevada made some adjustments after the break to create more shots in the closing half. The Wolf Pack and Dons each had eight shots in the second period. Nevada was unable to turn those chances into goals, as San Francisco held on to win the match 2-0. Moreno recorded a career high 12 saves.

-Week Three-

Friday, Aug. 31- Texas Tech 1, Nevada 0

The Wolf Pack and Red Raiders had a tightly contested first half, as the game was tied 0-0 at the break. Senior Dana Moreno and the Nevada defense remained active in the second half, denying the Red Raider attack. Texas Tech managed to pull ahead with a goal in the 81st minute to win the match 1-0. Moreno had a season high eight saves.

Sunday, Sept. 2- Nevada 1, TCU 0

Nevada picked up its first road win of the season, defeating TCU 1-0 in Fort Worth, Texas. The teams combined for one shot on goal in the opening half. Sophomore Chrisalyn Fonte's goal from an assist by senior Lauren Braman in the 63rd minute gave Nevada a 1-0 lead. The Horned Frogs had several opportunities within the last five minutes of the game to pull even, but Moreno and the Nevada defense came up big late to win the match.

### Game-By-Game

### -Week Two-

### Friday, Aug. 24- Nevada 1, Cal Poly 1 (OT)

Cal Poly struck first, as Mustangs forward Kacey Held touched in a cross from a corner kick to lead Nevada 1-0. Chrisalyn Fonte added her second goal on the year with a chip shot past the keeper in the 78th minute to tie the game 1-1. Both teams had several opportunities to score in each overtime period. Neither could capitalize, as the game ended 1-1.

### Sunday, Aug. 26- UC Davis 2, Nevada 1 (OT)

Playing in its consecutive overtime match, Nevada went down early to UC Davis 1-0 on a goal by Aggies forward Kiele Argente. Sophomore Chrisalyn Fonte responded with her third goal of the season, heading in a cross from Madison Lorenzen to tie the game at 1-1. The game went into overtime where UC Davis came up big in the final minute, claiming the win on a 45-yard set piece goal by Ana Marija Solo.

### -Week One-

### Friday, Aug.17- Nevada 2, Hawai`i 0

The Wolf Pack soccer team opened up Nevada's first athletic event as a member of the Mountain West with a 2-0 victory over Hawai`i. Junior Chelsea Fricke recorded her first goal at Nevada in the 18th minute. Junior Kori Disarufino extended the Pack's lead with eight minutes to go before halftime, striking an 18 yard shot off the Rainbow Wahine's goal keeper into the net.

### Sunday, Aug. 19- Sacramento State 2, Nevada 1

Nevada fell in its first road test at Sacramento State 2-1. After a scoreless first half, the Hornets went up 1-0 early in the opening minutes of the second half. Nevada responded by a goal by sophomore Chrisalyn Fonte in the 66th minute. Sacramento State won the match late on a goal by Elece McBride.

### <u>Team Notes</u>

-Nevada's consecutive match against a ranked opponent is the first time the program has faced multiple ranked foes in a season.

-The Wolf Pack is 0-3 as a program against ranked opponents, losing 3-0 to Cal this season, 3-1 to No. 16 Stanford during the 2006 season and falling 3-0 to No. 17 Santa Clara last season.

-Senior Sarah Schmeda provided a huge lift for the Pack in the team's 3-2 overtime win against Weber State. Her two goal performance was recognized by the Mountain West, as the Littleton, Colo., native was named MW Offensive Player of the Week on Sep. 17.

-Three of Nevada's 10 matches this season have gone into an extra period. Nevada is 5-5-4 under Dr. Price in overtime matches.

-The team's third win on the year with the 1-0 victory at San Jose State matched the win total of the 2011 season.

-Nevada's consecutive wins at TCU and San Jose State was the first for the season. The last time Nevada won consecutive matches was Sept. 16 and 18 during the 2011 season when the Pack defeated Idaho State and Eastern Michigan.

-Nevada's 1-0 win at TCU improved the program's record against BCS conference opponents to 4-13. The program's previous win came at Oregon during the 2006 season, where Nevada claimed a 2-1 win in Eugene, Ore.

-Sophomore Chrisalyn Fonte has been a force on the offensive end for Nevada. The Union City, Calif. native has scored a goal in five of Nevada's nine matches this season.

-Senior Lauren Braman has started every game for the fourth straight year, bringing her career total to 70. Braman sits tied at seventh on Nevada's all time list of career games started.

-Sophomore Madison Lorenzen has dished out an assist on four of Nevada's 10 goals this season.

-Nevada's shutout of Hawai`i broke a 15-match streak for the program. The Pack's last shutout came in a 1-0 win at Utah on Aug. 28, 2011. Nevada has had two shutouts on the year, the last in a 1-0 win at TCU on Sep. 2.

-Nevada's Chelsea Fricke started off the season with a bang after missing the majority of last season with an injury. The junior recorded her first goal at Nevada in the Pack's 2-1 win over Hawai i. The Dallas, Texas native scored her second goal in Nevada's 3-2 overtime win against Weber State.

### **Team Notes**

-With 14 letter winners returning, seven of which are starters, the Wolf Pack will look to make an immediate impact in its first year in the Mountain West.

-In 2011 Nevada was 3-16 overall, with a 1-6 conference mark in its last year as a member of the Western Athletic Conference. The Wolf Pack went 2-7 at home, 1-8 on the road and 0-1 at neutral sites, finishing in eighth place.

-Kori Disarufino and Chrisalyn Fonte, who led the team in scoring with three and two goals respectively will be leaned on to provide offensive production. Disarufino and Fonte also led the team in shots attempted with 35 and 23.

-Dr. Melissa (Missy) Price enters her third year as head coach and fifth overall at Nevada.

-Senior Dana Moreno will lead a corps of goalkeepers, playing in 13 games last year where she snagged 45 saves.

-Junior defender Chelsea Fricke returns to action for Nevada after missing the majority of the last season due to injury in which she used a medical redshirt. The Dallas native will look to bolster the Pack's defensive line.

-The 2012 season will mark the second consecutive year Nevada has had double digit newcomers wear Silver and Blue for the first time with 11 on board this year. Last season Nevada had 13.
