Aztecs Notes

Perfectionists

The Aztecs open their 2024 slate this week and welcome Cal State Bakersfield and Weber State to town. San Diego State beat the Roadrunners 3-0 in the teams' lone meeting in 2007. SDSU is looking to build on a 3-0 record against the Wildcats with the historical meetings coming in 2002, '03 and '16.

Snapdragon Stadium SuperpowersSDSU holds a 2-0 record and has yet to allow a goal when playing in Snapdragon Stadium following a 2-0 win over San Jose State in 2022 and a 4-0 victory against San Diego in 2023.

A Scorching Start

San Diego State is looking to begin its season with a win for the fifth consecutive season. The Aztecs have won those four matches by a combined score of 8-3 including a 2-0 win on the Sports Deck last season against Sacred Heart.

The Aztecs finished 9-1-1 in Mountain West play last season to take home their 12th Mountain West championship and 11th since Mike Friesen took over head coaching duties in 2007.

Home is Where the Heart Is

After bringing home last year's Mountain West regular season title, San Diego State will host this season's Mountain West tournament at the Sports Deck. Quarterfinal matches will take place on Sunday, November 3, semifinal matches will occur on Wednesday, November 6 and the final is on Saturday, November 9.

Somebody Call 9-1-1

SDSU also went 9-1-1 in home matches in 2023. The Aztecs won all seven home matches after the calendar turned to September. It started with a 4-0 win over San Diego at Snapdragon Stadium on September 14 before San Diego State posted wins in all six Mountain West matches on the Sports Deck.

Back to School Special

The Aztecs are in America's Finest City for the entirety of August this season, wrapping up the month with matches against Stanford on August 22 and Oklahoma State on August 31 on the SportsDeck.

Lighting Up the Scoreboard
San Diego State's offense led the Mountain West in 2023 in points (122), goals (43), goals per game (2.15), assists (36) and assists per game (1.80).

Friday Eve

SDSU has won eight consecutive matches on Thursdays going back to last season, when it went 9-1-1 on Thursdays.

SDSU also has an eight match win streak in night matches (5 p.m. or later). The Aztecs finished last season with a 9-2-1 record in evening matches.

GOAT Watch in Goal

Goalkeeper Alexa Madueno tallied 101 saves last season, becoming the second player in program history to notch 100+ saves in a season. Her stellar campaign catapulted her to second in school history in saves (308) and she is on pace to break Aubree Southwick's record of 338 saves this season. Madueno also ranks in the top seven in school history in shutouts (4th, 22) and goals against average (T-7th, 1.26).

Defense Wins Championships

Against her contemporaries around the conference, Madueno had the best save percentage in the Mountain West (.835) and the second most saves while leading the team to top three finishes in goals against average (0.99, 2nd) and saves (107; 3rd).

New Kids on the Block

San Diego State added six freshmen for the 2024 season: Brynn Korpela (GK; Santa Rosa, Calif.), Mia Lane (F; Chula Vista, Calif.), Riley Gumm (MF; Aurora, III.), Alexyz Nakamoto (MF; Wahiawa, Hawai'i), Alexis Leath (F; San Diego, Calif.) and Karoline Lundstrom (MF, Atlanta, Ga.).

Castronaut

Midfielder Denise Castro paced the squad last season with ten goals and six assists for a total of 26 points. Three of her goals were match winners. Her efforts ranked in the top three in the Mountain West in points (3rd), goals (T-2nd), assists (T-2nd) and shots (64; 2nd). After last season's totals, Castro has 25 career goals, tied with Lynn Murray for sixth most in program history.

All About the Gain(e)s(-Ramos)

Forward Emma Gaines-Ramos put together five goals (T-3rd on the team) and five assists (T-3rd) last season to score 15 points (2nd). She also landed in the top ten of the Mountain West in all three: points (T-6th), goals (T-9th) and assists (T-6th) and had three match winning goals to lead the team.

Forward Kali Trevithick tallied five goals (T-3rd on the team) and four assists (5th) for a total of 14 points (3rd). Her totals placed her in the top ten of the conference in points (T-8th) and goals (T-9th) while one of her goals won a match.

Forward Dori Savage placed second on the squad with six goals and had an assist to finish fourth on the team with 13 points. Savage had a pair of match winners and tied for fifth on the Mountain West leaderboard for goals scored.

Midfielder Olivia Sekimoto tied for third on the team with five goals to go with an assist for 11 points. Her goals, including one match winner, tied for ninth in the conference.

A Little Bit Alexys

Forward Alexys Ocampo tied for the team lead with six assists, which also tied for second in the Mountain West. Ocampo scored twice including a match winning goal for a total of ten points.

B-Lockay

Midfielder Carlin Blake had five assists, tied with Gaines-Ramos for second most on the team and sixth in the conference. Blake also had a goal during the season to finish with seven points.

Team Effort

In total, 11 different Aztecs scored goals and 13 had at least one assist to finish the season with one or more points. The team's 14 match winning goals were scored by eight different players.

SDSU brings back ten starters from last season's Mountain West champions, including their top two goal scorers in Dori Savage and Denise Castro who scored six and ten goals, respectively.

Back in (Red and) Black

San Diego State returns six of seven All-Mountain West players from last season. Denise Castro was named the Mountain West Offensive Player of the Year and First Team All-Conference while returners Alexa Madueno, Alexys Ocampo and Olivia Sekimoto joined her on the first team. Emma Gaines-Ramos and Grace Goins earned spots on the All-Conference Second Team while All-MW First Team member Kiera Utush graduated and is the lone Aztec representative not to return this fall.

Iron Mike

Head Coach Mike Friesen begins his 18th campaign leading the Mountain West's most successful women's soccer program. Friesen has guided his squad to 11 Mountain West championships (five tournament and six regular season), and five NCAA Tournament appearances, both the most among any current league head coach. Now in his 18th season of conference play, Friesen has an 107-35-19 record. His 107 league victories are the most by any head coach in Mountain West history (the inaugural season of the MW was in 1999).

Past the Century Mark
Friesen finished the 2023 campaign with 107 career regular season Mountain West wins at the helm of San Diego State women's soccer. The 17-year MW veteran head coach is the only coach in conference history to reach the 100 Mountain West wins plateau. The closest to his mark is Boise State's Jim Thomas, who has 65 conference wins.

Like Mike

Friesen's 186 victories (186-114-46) since the start of the 2007 season, the year he took control of the program, are the most by any current coach in the Mountain West. Boise State's Jim Thomas' 114 victories in that time frame ranks second among current MW head coaches.

Chasing Greatness

Friesen enters the 2024 season just four wins from tying Jennifer Rockwood's (Brigham Young) conference record for overall wins with 190 and five victories from having the top spot all to himself.

Looking into the Crystal Ball
San Diego State is picked to finish in first place in the MW coaches' preseason poll. This marks the 14th time in 15 seasons the Aztecs have been picked to finish in either first or second place. The only time SDSU was lower than second place in the preseason poll in the last 15 years was in 2019, a year in which the Aztecs were predicted to finish fourth. That team went 10-9-1, shared the Mountain West regular-season title at 8-2-0, and reached the championship match of the league tournament.

Best in the (Mountain) West

The Aztecs have won ten of the last 23 MW trophies (regular season and tournament), all of which have come under the direction of head coach Mike Friesen. In total, the 18th-year head coach has guided San Diego State to 11 conference titles.

Top of the Mountain (West)
San Diego State has earned 12 Mountain West titles since the conference's inception in 1999. SDSU was the regular season champions in 1999, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2019 and 2023. The program was the tournament champion in 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2017. The Aztecs' lead all current teams in each category and have the most regular season titles while trailing only Brigham Young (7 tournament titles, 13 overall) in all-time titles.

Above the Rest

SDSU holds a lead in the all-time series against every current conference member. The records: Air Force (24-1-1, .942), Nevada (13-2-0, .867), Colorado State (8-1-2, .818), San Jose State (15-2-4, .810), Utah State (9-1-3, .808), Fresno State (15-5-2, .727), Wyoming (18-7-2, .704), UNLV (20-10-2, .656), Colorado College (7-3-4, .643), Boise State (10-8-0, .556) and New Mexico (14-11-8, .545).
