Oregon State By The Numbers

- 1** - First win for Trent Bray as a head coach in the 38-15 victory over Idaho State.
- 4** - Consecutive wins by Oregon State over San Diego State dating back to 2000.
- 9** - Beavers who made their first collegiate starts in the win over Idaho State. Twelve players made their first starts in a Beaver uniform.
- 12.25** - Points allowed by the Beavers, on average, over those last four games against the Aztecs.
- 19** - Oregon State wins in the last 25 games.
- 24** - First downs by rushing in the win over Idaho State.
- 45** - Consecutive starts for Joshua Gray after getting the nod at left guard in the opener. He's now six starts shy of the OSU career record.
- 58** - Oregon State's rush attempts against Idaho State in the season opener, the most by a Beaver offense since 1996 when going for 64 against Northern Illinois.
- 315** - Rushing yards combined by Jam Griffin and Anthony Hankerson in the opener against Idaho State. Both surpassed the 100-yard mark for the first time in their respective careers.
- 362** - Total rush yards vs. Idaho State, the fourth time over 350 since 1996.

Against San Diego State

▲ Oregon State is playing San Diego State for the seventh time, and holds a 4-2 advantage in the series.

▲ The Beavers have won four consecutive games, all since 2000, with three of the victories coming in Corvallis. The lone win in San Diego was a 34-30 victory in 2013. Sean Mannion passed for 367 yards in that win, the No. 27 mark overall in OSU's record books.

▲ Brandin Cooks caught 14 of Mannion's pass attempts in that game, tying Mike Hass (2004 vs. Arizona State) for the OSU single-game record. Isaiah Hodgins later tied Cooks and Hass with 14 against Nevada in 2018.

▲ David Lose, SDSU's defensive line coach, spent three seasons as a quality control assistant with the Beavers, and went to the Los Angeles Bowl with OSU in 2021.

In The Booth

▲ Coaches in the press box this season include offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach Ryan Gunderson and defensive coordinator Keith Heyward.

▲ The two will be joined by graduate assistants Tristan Gebbia (offense), Kayden Lyles (offense) and Kuony Deng (defense). Defensive quality control staffer Kharyee Marshall will also be in the booth.

On This Date

▲ Oregon State has played on Sept. 7 seven times leading up to Saturday's matchup. The Beavers are 2-5 on the date, most recently dropping a 31-28 decision at Hawai'i in 2019.

Recapping The Idaho State Win

▲ Oregon State won its fourth consecutive home opener in the 38-15 victory. The Beavers won their home opener in 2021 (vs. Hawai'i), 2022 (vs. Boise State) and 2023 (vs. UC Davis).

▲ The Beavers also won their third consecutive season opener, after 2022 vs. Boise State and 2023 at San Jose State.

▲ OSU held Idaho State to just one play of 20 or more yards.

▲ The Beavers held on to the ball for 37:29, which was the fifth-most nationally after the first full weekend of action.

▲ OSU gained first downs by rush 24 times in the win. That ties the Beavers with SMU for the most first downs on the ground this season. The Mustangs, however, have achieved those 24 over two games.

▲ Oregon State averaged 53 yards per drive, which would have been the best mark in 2023, besting 48 versus Stanford.

▲ Jack Kane picked off his first career pass in the fourth quarter.

▲ Trent Walker, making his first career start, nearly equaled his career output in receptions. He totaled four for 32 yards after coming into the year with five catches for 66 yards.

▲ Pro Football Focus graded the Beavers at 82.9 run blocking, the No. 9 mark nationally.

That's It

▲ Oregon State and Georgia were the only two teams nationally to have a top-15 pick both of the 2024 MLB and NFL Drafts.

▲ Oregon State's Travis Bazzana became the Beavers' second-ever No. 1 overall selection, while offensive lineman Taliесе Fua-ga was the 14th overall selection by the New Orleans Saints.

▲ The Beavers, meanwhile, were the nation's only team with first-round selections in the MLB, NFL and MLS Drafts as Logan Farrington from men's soccer went third overall.

Griffin & Hankerson Team Up

▲ Jam Griffin and Anthony Hankerson combined to rush for 315 yards and four touchdowns in the win over the Bengals.

▲ Griffin tallied 160 yards, surpassing the century mark for the first time in his career. He now has 648 rushing yards as a Beaver after totaling 488 in 2022.

▲ Anthony Hankerson, in his first game as a Beaver after transferring from Colorado, ran for 155 yards. He also surpassed the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career.

▲ Griffin's 160 yards rank ninth nationally after the first full weekend of action, while Hankerson's 155 ranks him 12th.

That's No. 20

▲ Jam Griffin and Anthony Hankerson became the 20th duo to top 100 yards rushing in the same game and the first since B.J. Baylor and Deshaun Fenwick in 2021 at Washington State.

▲ Griffin and Hankerson are the first duo to top 150 since Don Shanklin (159) and J.J. Young (157) in 1994 at UCLA. That, in fact, has now happened just three times in Oregon State's history.

Speaking Of The Run Game

▲ Oregon State's 362 rush yards Saturday marked the team's most since the 2018 Beavers ran for 360 against Southern Utah in the second game of the year. OSU has surpassed 350 now four times since 1996,

following 640 versus Northern Illinois in '96, 474 against California in 2016 and the 360 versus Southern Utah in 2018.

▲ The 362 rush yards this past Saturday were the fourth-most on the weekend, trailing only UCF (454), Army (375) and Boise State (371).

▲ OSU averaged 6.2 yards against the Bengals. The 362 yards came on 58 carries, the most by a Beaver squad since 1996.

▲ The Beavers finished with 20 or more rushing first downs for the third time since 1996. The other two? Twenty-six against NIU in 1996 and 20 versus Oregon in 2016, both OSU wins.

New Unis

▲ Oregon State is sporting a fresh set of uniforms this season.

▲ Oregon State Football's new uniforms feature the historic branding and color system of black, white, and orange to reflect the school's core identity and historic team colors. These colors signify strength, tradition, and pride, honoring the university's rich athletic heritage.

▲ Iron Edition uniforms connect to the school's fight song, embodying an unyielding spirit and relentless determination. These uniforms offer an energizing alternative as an anthracite grey to compliment the full set, symbolizing the resilience and strength of Oregon State.

▲ The uniforms adopt a consistent striping system across all sets to unify and streamline the team's appearance. Orange serves as the center stripe, symbolizing Oregon State's distinctive identity, while black represents the primary home color and white signifies the away uniform.

▲ Oregon State helmets are shifting from matte to gloss to pay homage to our storied past with a nod to tradition and a touch of timeless elegance.

Bray Takes Over

▲ Trent Bray is in his first year as Oregon State's head coach, taking over the title in November 2023.

▲ Bray is in his 10th season at Oregon State, and second stint. He coached at OSU from 2012-14 before going to Nebraska for the 2015 season. He returned to Corvallis in 2018 and was elevated to defensive coordinator in November 2021.

▲ Bray played at Oregon State from 2002-

05, and left with 337 tackles. He started the last 34 games of his career and was a 2005 All-Pac-10 First Team selection.

Staff Ties To Oregon State

▲ The Oregon State coaching staff may generally be new but also has a great deal of connections to Oregon State.

▲ Head coach Trent Bray hired Ryan Gunderson (lettered 2004-07) to serve as offensive coordinator and Keith Heyward (1997-2000) as defensive coordinator. The two both played for and graduated from Oregon State. Kyle DeVan, meanwhile, lettered from 2004-07 and graduated from OSU. He is the team's offensive line coach.

▲ Jon Boyer, now coaching tight ends, was elevated after serving in quality control and as a senior advisor since 2018. He was the Beavers' offensive coordinator in the Tony The Tiger Sun Bowl.

▲ Jamie Christian, special teams coordinator, was a defensive graduate assistant at Oregon State from 2000-01. He was a part of the coaching staff at the 2001 Fiesta Bowl.

▲ AJ Cooper is back in Corvallis after one year at Sacramento State. He served as a defensive graduate assistant for the Beavers in 2021 and 2022.

▲ Kefense Hynson has been the team's wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator since 2018, serving as interim head coach at the Tony The Tiger Sun Bowl.

▲ Ilaisa Tuiaki is in his second stint at Oregon State. Now the defensive line coach, he served as an assistant coach for linebackers and special teams in 2015.

▲ Offensive graduate assistant Tristan Gebbia played for OSU from 2018-22, and defensive GA Avery Roberts played 29 games for OSU, earning All-American honors in 2021. They're joined by Kayden Lyles, who was a GA for OSU in 2023.

More On The Staff

▲ Oregon State has two assistant coaches who do not have direct ties to Oregon State, but who are familiar with the program.

▲ Rod Chance, secondary coach, comes to Corvallis and formerly squared off with the Beavers while at Colorado (2022) and Oregon (2018, 2020-21).

▲ Thomas Ford is in his first season as running backs coach. He was in offensive quality control for Washington from 2020-21.

▲ Additionally, Kuony Deng is a defensive graduate assistant. He played at California and recorded 10 tackles versus OSU in 2019, and four in 2020.

About Those Alums

▲ Oregon State is one of just two teams nationally to have its head coach, offensive coordinator and defensive coordinator as alums.

▲ OSU is joined by Air Force, whom the Beavers will play at in November. The Falcons' alums include Troy Calhoun (head coach), Mike Thiessen (offensive coordinator) and

Brian Knorr (defensive coordinator).

Meanwhile

▲ Per research done by Utah, OSU is one of six FBS schools nationally who have four or more alums on their full-time coaching staff.

▲ The Beavers join Air Force (seven), Utah (five), Fresno State (four), Georgia Southern (four) and Hawai'i (four).

One Of 18

▲ Trent Bray is one of 18 coaches nationally who are coaching at their alma mater or university they played at during their collegiate careers.

Captains

▲ Oregon State head coach Trent Bray announced the Beavers' 2024 team captains a week before the opener versus Idaho State. There are six captains this season.

▲ Four come from the defensive side of the ball. They include defensive lineman Semisi Saluni, inside linebacker Melvin Jordan IV and defensive backs Skyler Thomas and Jaden Robinson.

▲ Two are on offense: quarterback Ben Gulbranson and offensive lineman Joshua Gray.

▲ Gray is a captain for the second consecutive season.

At Home

▲ Oregon State is 16-2 at home since 2021 and the stats indicate a good reason why.

▲ The Beavers have scored 30 or more points 11 times over that stretch, and have a perfect 11-0 mark when that happens. Conversely, opponents have scored 20 or less 12 times, and the Beavers are 11-1 when that happens. The lone loss was a 17-14 defeat to USC in 2022.

▲ OSU has surpassed 400 yards of offense in 10 of those 18 games, going 10-0. Opponents, meanwhile, have been held to under 400 yards 14 times, and OSU is 12-2. Ironically, the Beavers are 4-0 when opponents have topped 400 yards.

▲ The Beavers have surpassed 500 yards twice; in 2021 vs. Hawai'i, picking up 558, and 2023 against Stanford, finishing with 598.

Gray Makes His Return

▲ Joshua Gray elected to return to Oregon State for his sixth season in 2024. The Rancho Cucamonga, Calif., native is a three-time second-team all-conference selection, earning the honors in 2020, 2022 and 2023.

▲ Gray has now started 45 games during his career at Oregon State. His 51st will push him past OSU record holder Roy Schuening, who started in 50 from 2004-07.

▲ Gray is on the initial watch list for the Outland Trophy, awarded annually to the nation's top interior lineman. He is also on the watch list for the Lombardi Award, given to the nation's top offensive or defensive lineman or linebacker.

▲ He is also on the watch list for the Senior Bowl.

Welcome Back Skyler

▲ Skyler Thomas started in the win over Idaho State, making his first appearance in a game since the 2022 Las Vegas Bowl against Florida.

▲ The defensive back proceeded to record the Beavers' first interception of the season in the first quarter. It was the second INT of his career and first since 2021.

▲ Thomas ended the day tied for the OSU team lead with seven tackles, one off his career high.

Collins Making His Mark

▲ Thomas Collins saw action in just three games last season, but certainly made a mark given a big opportunity this past Saturday.

▲ The native of Gothenburg, Sweden was credited with three quarterback hurries, leading a Beaver squad that had 12 on the day. He also recorded half a tackle for loss. That marked his first career tackle.

Don't Forget The Frosh

▲ A trio of freshmen made their marks on the offensive side of the ball against the Bengals.

▲ Salahadin Allah, a true freshman, carried the ball seven times, totaling 59 yards on the ground. He averaged 8.4 yards per carry.

▲ David Wells Jr., a redshirt freshman, made two catches for a team-best 63 yards. That included a highlight reel 55-yard touchdown reception from Gevani McCoy. That marked his first career touchdown.

▲ Taz Reddicks, who also redshirted last season, caught two passes for 35 yards. Fifteen of his 35 yards were credited as after the catch.

Robinson To Year 7

▲ Jaden Robinson returned to Corvallis for year seven as a Beaver. The Auburn, Wash., native has played in 35 career games, totaling 58 tackles with 1.5 sacks, eight pass breakups and one forced fumble.

▲ He started in 12 games for OSU last season and had his most productive year, recording 33 tackles with half a sack, eight

pass breakups and the forced fumble. His seven pass breakups placed him in a tie for seventh in the Pac-12.

▲ Robinson is one of 34 players nationally in their seventh season at the collegiate level.

Clemons To Corvallis

▲ "What he brings to the Earth. He's a good dude. He's a good football player. He's got size. He can run, you know, but he's still progressing and learning. He's awesome. Good good to have, good energy. He's got a maturity about him that that I appreciate. He's super coachable. He wants to be coached, which I think, is the most important thing for any player is to want to be coached."

▲ That was Oregon State wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator Kenese Hynson when asked about newcomer Darrius Clemons, and what he brings to Oregon State.

▲ Clemons is in Corvallis for his first season after winning a national championship last year at Michigan.

▲ Clemons played in 22 games over two seasons with the Wolverines, catching four passes for 40 yards. He was a four-star prospect out Westview High School in Portland.

Beavers At Home

▲ Oregon State plays seven home games in 2024, the most at Reser Stadium since 2016 when the Beavers went 4-3.

▲ The Beavers play four of their first five games at home for the first time since 2006. The 2006 squad went 3-2 over that stretch.

▲ Oregon State welcomes Purdue to Reser Stadium for the first time in week four. The Beavers and Boilermakers have played twice before, but both were in West Lafayette.

▲ UNLV visits Reser Stadium Oct. 19 and the Rebels will be in Corvallis for the first time since 2002. OSU won that game 47-17.

▲ San Jose State, meanwhile, makes its first trip to Corvallis since 2015 when the Beavers were 35-21 winners.

Against The Ground Game

▲ Oregon State, under former defensive coordinator Trent Bray, was strong against

the ground game. The Beavers' defense allowed an average of 3.2 yards per carry the last two seasons at Reser Stadium, and allowed 93.7 yards on average.

▲ OSU has given up just five rushing scores at home over the last 13 games in Corvallis.

From Colorado

▲ Oregon State welcomed three transfers from Colorado for the 2024 season, offensive linemen Gerad Christian-Lichtenhan and Van Wells and running back Anthony Hankerson.

▲ Christian-Lichtenhan played in 33 games for the Buffaloes from 2021-23, starting 19. Wells, meanwhile, was a two-year letter-winner at Colorado, playing 20 games, 11 of which were starts.

▲ Hankerson came to Corvallis after also spending two seasons at Colorado. He ran for 593 yards on 146 carries in 20 games. He scored four rushing scores in his two seasons.

Griffin's Return

▲ Jam Griffin is one of 13 players nationally competing at their respective programs after spending at least one season at another NCAA school.

▲ He is also 130-for-132 on extra-points.

Starts

▲ Oregon State’s offensive line is the most experienced group on the 2024 roster, amassing 106 starts coming into this week’s game.

▲ Conversely, the team’s defensive line came into the season with just zero starts. Semisi Saluni, who had played in 39 games in his career without a start, made his first in the opener against Idaho State.

Completed Reser Stadium

▲ Oregon State completed Reser Stadium prior to the start of the 2023 season.

▲ The \$161 million project has made Reser into a national best-in-class facility.

▲ An anonymous donor made a historic \$50 million lead gift to transform Oregon State University’s Reser Stadium into a national best-in-class football facility with year-round programs and facilities for all OSU students, faculty and staff.

▲ The project received approval by the OSU Board of Trustees Finance and Administration Committee on Jan. 28, 2021. The west side of the stadium was imploded nearly a year later in January 2022.

▲ The project involved the complete demolition and rebuilding of the west side of Reser Stadium and the construction of year-round university facilities, including a new state-of-the art interactive welcome center for new students considering attending OSU; new health center facilities for Corvallis campus students; health care facilities for OSU faculty and staff; and additional meeting space for university students, faculty and staff.

▲ Reser Stadium now features a 360-degree stadium concourse and includes expanded concessions and restroom facilities, enhanced sightlines, accessibility improvements and other fan amenities comparable to the east side of Reser, which was renovated prior to the 2005 season.

2024 Opponents

▲ Oregon State’s 2024 opponents combined to go 75-78 a year ago.

▲ The Beavers are playing the top-four finishers in the 2023 Mountain West Conference standings, a quartet that combined to go 33-21, including a 23-9 mark in conference play.

▲ Oregon State will take on three of those four MWC teams in November - San Jose

State, Air Force and Boise State. UNLV, the fourth, will play in Corvallis in October.

Reser Stadium

▲ The home of the Beavers has had over \$360 million in fiscal improvements completed since the 2005 season.

▲ The stadium was re-named on that date after a personal seven-figure gift by Al and Pat Reser of Beaverton, Ore.

▲ The Valley Football Center, which houses the coaching staff’s offices and the team’s locker room, underwent an enhancement that was completed in the summer of 2020. It included new graphics to celebrate the accomplishments of Beaver football alumni and a stronger presence highlighting bowl victories.

▲ A new videoboard, measuring 145 feet high by 50 feet wide, was installed before the start of the 2022 season. It measures approximately 6,750 square feet and has more than 6.3 million pixels. It is the 14th largest in the country.

▲ “Trent is an outstanding football coach, and he has a great quality of being able to really connect with young men. This quality enables him to be both a great teacher of the game and a great recruiter.” - former Oregon State head coach Mike Riley

▲ “I’m very proud of him and what he’s done with his career. Trent’s IQ football-wise is as good as I’ve ever seen. Oregon State got the best.” - former Oregon State and NFL head coach Dennis Erickson

▲ “As soon as the head coaching spot opened, I hoped Coach Bray would get the position. He is what Oregon State Football stands for and represents.” - former Oregon State linebacker and quarterback Jack Colletto

▲ “There’s nobody more deserving, and there’s nobody better fit to lead us, and really help us take the next step. I know everybody’s fired up. There’s nobody more deserving, more fit, to lead us to accomplish the things that this program aspires to.” - former OSU defensive back Jaydon Grant

Low Margin Of Loss

▲ Oregon State is 19-6 the past two seasons, with four of the six defeats coming by three points.

▲ Four of those six losses have come away from home.

▲ In wins, meanwhile, the Beavers have out-scored their opponents, 726-332, a 394-point difference. That’s an average of 20.7 points per victory.

Beavers In The NFL

▲ As of Sept. 2, 20 Beavers are in the NFL.

▲ Three Beavers were selected in the 2024 NFL Draft, including Taliese Fuaga at No. 14 to New Orleans. Fuaga became the first Oregon State offensive lineman to go in the first round.

▲ He was also the first Beaver taken in the
