### PRESEASON NOTES

- San Diego State embarks on its 104th season in 2024-25. In 103 seasons, SDSU is 1,619-1,159-1 overall, and in its 53 seasons at the Division I level has posted a 931-714 mark.
- San Diego State preps for the 2024-25 campaign after finishing last season 26-11, with an 11-7 mark in league play. The Aztecs have captured a league-high 16 conference titles and have finished champion or runner-up in 16-of-25 Mountain West Tournaments. Since 2006, SDSU's 15 appearances in its conference championship game are tied for the second most in the nation.
- Entering the 2024-25 season, SDSU will look to return to the NCAA tournament for the sixth time in the last seven years in which a champion has been crowned (the 2020 NCAA Tournament was canceled due to COVID-19). The Aztecs' appearance in 2024 was their 16th postseason berth (12 NCAA, 4 NIT) in the last 18 years in which a national champion has been crowned.
- San Diego State is one of 11 programs in the nation to have appeared in at least 11 of the last 15 NCAA Tournaments. (also: Baylor, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Kentucky, Michigan State, North Carolina, Purdue, Villanova and Wisconsin)**
- Head coach **Brian Dutcher** is set for his eighth season after guiding San Diego State to a 26-11 record in 2023-24 and has a career mark of 177-58. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first seven seasons. Among head coaches whose first season guiding his current program was 2017-18, his 177 victories lead the nation and are 21 more than the next highest total (Furman's Bob Richey).
- In 2018, **Brian Dutcher** was the only first-year head coach to lead his team to the NCAA Tournament and in the previous 96 seasons of SDSU basketball, no other coach had won more games and/or a conference title in his initial season on Ther Mesa.
- Since his ascension to the top chair, prior to the start of the 2017-18 campaign, **Brian Dutcher's** Aztecs have compiled a 17-4 record in the Mountain West Tournament, and has guided SDSU to the championship game in each of his seven seasons
- Brian Dutcher** is the only coach in program history (since 1921-22) to lead his team to 113 or more victories in his first seven seasons (177 total). Smokey Gaines (1999-00 through 2005-06) ranks second with 112 wins. In addition, Dutcher is one of two head coaches in SDSU history to lead his team to the NCAA Tournament in his first season coaching at San Diego State (also: Tim Vezie in 1974-75).
- Brian Dutcher's** .753 winning percentage (177-58) is the highest in program history and in 2021-22 became just the fifth Aztec coach to reach 100 career wins. His 177 victories are the fourth most in program history and he can move into third place alone with 14 wins. In addition, his .583 winning percentage (14-10) against top-25 competition is the best for any Aztec coach and he is the only Aztec coach to post a winning record against the top-25.
- Brian Dutcher** welcomes back one starter in senior guard **Reese Waters**. Waters was the team's second leading scorer in 2023-24 and returns as the squad's leading scorer. He was the 2024 SoCal Showcase Most Valuable Player & Oscar Robertson Award National Player of the Week honoree, as well as 2023 Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year. Waters appeared in all 37 games last year with 23 starts.
- SDSU loses five starters (Lamont Butler, Jaedon LeDee, Micah Parrish, Elijah Saunders and Darrion Trammell) from its 2023-24 squad that went 26-11, played for the Mountain West Tournament title for the 10th time in the last 11 seasons, reached the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year and the fourth time in the last 14 years. LeDee led the team in points (21.4) and rebounds (302) last season.
- When the season tips off, the Aztecs will have eight players on the roster who have never played a game in an SDSU uniform. **Nick Boyd** (Florida Atlantic) is a transfer who has two years of eligibility. **Jared Coleman-Jones** (Middle Tennessee State), **Wayne McKinney III** (San Diego) and **Kimo Ferrari** (Brown) are transfers who have one year of eligibility. **Magoon Gwath** (Eules, Texas, Veritas Prep) is a redshirt freshman while **Pharaoh Compton** (Chicago, Ill., Arbor View High), **Taj DeGourville** (Las Vegas, Nev., Wasatch Academy) and **Thokbor Majak** (Bor, South Sudan, Dream City Christian High) are true freshmen.
- As well as **Reese Waters** (senior guard), SDSU welcomes back junior **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** (forward). In addition, sophomores, **Miles Byrd** (guard), **Miles Heide** (forward) and **BJ Davis** (guard) as well as non-scholarship players **Cam Lawin** (guard) and **Desai Lopez** (guard) return to the Aztecs in 2024-25. In 2023-24, among returning scholarship players, Waters averaged 9.6 points, 3.7 rebounds and 1.2 assists, Byrd (4.0 ppg, 2.5 rpg), Heide (1.9 ppg, 2.2 rpg), Johnson Jr. (0.4 ppg/0.9 rpg) and Davis (1.2 ppg, 0.4 rpg) are all forecast to play larger roles and make larger contributions in 2024-25.
- Among this year's newcomers with Division I experience, last year Coleman-Jones averaged 11.0 points, 7.6 rebounds and 2.3 assists, Boyd (9.3 ppg, 2.7 rpg & 1.8 apg), McKinney III (13.5 ppg, 3.6 rpg & 2.9 apg), Ferrari (6.7 ppg, 2.5 rpg & 2.0 apg).

## TEAM NOTES

- The Aztecs finished last year with a 26-11 record and an 11-7 mark in the Mountain West. SDSU posted its 19th straight season with at least 19 victories, which is tied for the third most consecutive seasons with at least 19 wins in the nation. **With a 64.6 percent opponent win percentage, SDSU's 2023-24 schedule was tied with Purdue for the second hardest in the nation. Alabama led the country with opponents which won 66.6 percent of their games.**
- San Diego State was one of the most dominant defensive teams in the nation in 2023-24, finishing No. 39 in scoring defense (66.7 ppg) and in the last 14 years, beginning in 2010-11, has finished in the top 20 in the nation nine times. In addition, the Aztecs were No. 16 in field goal percentage defense (.405) and No. 32 in 3-point field goal defensive percentage (.310).
- According to KenPom, nationally the Aztecs were No. 11 in adjusted defensive efficiency, No. 29 in three-point percentage defense and No. 32 in effective field goal percentage defense. In Mountain West action, SDSU ranked No. 1 in defensive efficiency, effective defensive field goal percentage, and turnover percentage. In addition, the Aztecs ranked No. 2 in 2-point field goal percentage defense and steal percentage. No other program in the Mountain West could equal or surpass SDSU's three top-20 rankings. New Mexico was the only other team in the league to lead as many as two categories.
- San Diego State is one of three programs in the nation who have been in the top 25 of Kenpom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency ranking in each of the last five seasons. The other two programs are Houston and Kansas.**
- San Diego State has done a good job in close games the last five seasons, going 29-15 in games decided by five points or less. In addition, SDSU is 51-23 in games where the margin of victory was 10 points or less since the start of 2019-20.
- The Aztecs rank among the most successful in closing out games when it has a lead with five minutes to play. SDSU was 23-2 last season, 159-12 under **Brian Dutcher** and 412-16 in its last 428 games in which it has led with five minutes left on the clock.
- San Diego State is 14-3 in its last 17 games that have been decided by one possession or which have gone into overtime.
- Last year when the Aztecs won, it was usually by a wide margin. In the team's 26 victories in 2023-24, 18 were decided by 10 or more points...10 by 15 or more, seven by 20 or more and six by 25 or more points.
- In the last five seasons, the Aztecs have posted 85 double-digit margin of victory wins among its 134 total victories (63.4 percent)...85 came by 10 or more points, 57 by 15 or more, 35 by 20 or more and 25 by 25 or more points.
- Lamont Butler, Jaedon LeDee, Jay Pal, Micah Parrish, Elijah Saunders, Darriion Trammell and **Reese Waters** made 184 of a possible 185 starts last season. Entering the 2024-25 season, San Diego State will have to replace 161 of those 185 starting assignments (37 from Butler, 36 from LeDee & Parrish, 21 from Saunders, 18 from Trammell and 13 from Pal).
- San Diego State is replacing six scholarship players from its 2023-24 squad. The 2024-25 campaign will mark the sixth time in the Dutcher/Fisher era that the Aztecs have lost at least six letterwinners. In addition to 2024-25, SDSU replaced six letterwinners in 2011-12, 2009-10, 2005-06 and 2000-01. The most letterwinners that San Diego State has replaced from one season to the next, in the Dutcher/Fisher era, are eight from the 2012-13 team to the 2013-14 squad. Not necessarily drawing any type of comparison, but that 2013-14 team went 31-5, won the Mountain West regular-season title, and reached the Sweet 16 in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.
- The Aztecs were once again the top defensive team in the Mountain West in 2023-24, ranking first in scoring defense (66.68 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.405), was second in steals (275), was third in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.310) and blocked shots (149), defensive rebounds (16.11/g), and had a 12-steal game among a total of four games with double digit steals. In conference games only, San Diego State ranked first in scoring defense (65.78 ppg), field goal percentage defense (.413), was second in steals (125), scoring margin (+6.72), blocked shots (4.17), forced turnovers (223), and rebound margin (+5.17).
- SDSU has posted at least 20 wins 18 times in the last 19 years, 21 times in its Division I history (53 years) and 28 times overall. Head coach **Brian Dutcher** has been on the San Diego State bench for 19 of those 28 seasons.
- Since 2001-02, San Diego State has appeared in the NCAA Tournament 13 times and played 26 games (13-13). All 26 of those games have occurred with **Brian Dutcher** on the sideline and are the most in Mountain West history.
- SDSU has claimed a Mountain West-leading 16 conference titles, including seven MW Tournament crowns (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2018, 2021 & 2023). In 2024, the Aztecs played in their 10th Mountain West championship game in the last 12 seasons and advanced to the postseason for the 16th time in the last 18 years in which a national champion has been crowned (does not include 2020).
- San Diego State has been one of the elite programs in the nation since the start of the 2005-06 season, posting a cumulative record of 482-170. SDSU's 482 wins & .739 winning percentage are the sixth-best nationally over the last 19 seasons. SDSU is one of two in the top 10 of those lists not in a men's basketball power conference: also Gonzaga), and has won an average of 25.4 games per season.**
- Head coach Brian Dutcher enters the 2024-25 campaign with 177 victories, 23 from the 200-victory milestone. When he reaches 191 wins, he will move into third place on the program's all-time win list, passing Morris Gross who totaled 190 wins in 14 seasons (1929-42). He will then trail only a pair of Aztecs Hall of Fame coaches: George Ziegenfuss who totaled 316 wins in 20 years as Aztec head coach (1949-69) and Steve Fisher who finished his SDSU career with 386 victories in 18 seasons on The Mesa (2000-17).
- In the last two years San Diego State is 7-2 in the NCAA Tournament. That is the second-best record in the event trailing only Connecticut (12-0). The team that handed the Aztecs its two defeats...Connecticut.
- The Aztecs have won the Mountain West regular-season crown (outright or shared) eight times (2010-11, 2011-12, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16, 2019-20, 2020-21 & 2022-23) in the last 14 years.
- Among teams that played home games ONLY in their own facility, SDSU's attendance percentage (99.65 percent of capacity) was the 7th highest in the nation in 2023-24.

## PLAYER PERSONNEL

- In senior guard **Reese Waters**, San Diego State returns one of its starters from the 2023-24 squad which reached the Sweet 16 at the 2024 NCAA Tournament. A transfer from Southern California prior to the 2023-24 season, Waters started 23 of the team's 37 games, was its second leading scorer and is in his final year of college eligibility.

Waters enters 2024-25 with 802 career points and is 198 from the 1,000-point plateau. If he reaches the milestone, he will be the eighth player to reach the 1,000-career point mark since Brian Dutcher took control of the program. In 2023-24, Waters, the team's second leading scorer, averaged 9.6 points, a career-best with 3.7 rebounds, and 1.2 assists. Among his single-season best 355 points, he posted 18 games with double digit points, including a career-high 24 points at the SoCal Showcase, where he also had seven boards and two steals to earn the event's MVP. In addition, last year, Waters recorded his first collegiate double double (10 points/12 rebounds vs. UC Irvine) and was named the Oscar Robertson National Player of the Week (Jan. 3) for his 22 points, five rebounds, two assists and two steals without a turnover at No. 13 Gonzaga. In his final year at Southern California, he was named the Pac-12 Sixth Player of the Year and was one of five players nationally last season, who in a minimum of 21 games off the bench, averaged at least 10.3 points (shooting at least 46.0 percent from the floor), 3.1 rebounds and 1.5 assists and had at least nine blocks. A four-star rated recruit coming out of St. Bernard High in Playa del Rey, Calif., he was the No. 11 shooting guard in California and the nation and overall was No. 77 nationally.

- Miles Byrd** is a 6-7 sophomore guard who, based on his 38 games played in the Scarlet and Black in the last two seasons, is the longest tenured Aztec on the 2024-25 roster. In 2023-24, he set career-bests in every statistical category averaging 4.0 points, 2.5 boards and nearly an assist per appearance.

He is a classic Aztec wing who is long, can run the floor, score from three levels and play tenacious defense. He appeared in four games and averaged 5.3 points and 0.5 rebounds and 1.5 assists in his initial collegiate season (2022-23) but got the year back due to a medical redshirt. Byrd is graduate of Lincoln High School in Stockton, Calif., and was a 4-star recruit. At the time of his signing he was nationally rated as the No. 162 recruit, the No. 20 shooting guard and No. 15 in California. He led Lincoln to a 26-6 record while averaging a team-best 17.2 points, 5.2 rebounds, 2.8 steals, and 1.2 blocks and ranked second with 3.3 assists as a senior.

- Miles Heide** is a 6-10 sophomore forward out of Mount Si High School in North Bend, Washington. He appeared in all 37 games in his freshman campaign with one start. His 37 appearances are the most for any freshman in the Dutcher era (since 2017-18) and the second most for a first-year player since at least the start of the 1999-00 season (Zylan Cheatham had 38 appearances as a freshman in 2015-16). His 63.3 percent shooting from the floor is the fifth highest, with a minimum of 45 shot attempts, since at least the start of the 1996-97 season and the second highest among Aztec freshman in the same time frame (Skylar Spencer shot 66.2 percent as a freshman in 2012-13).

A three-star prospect by 247Sports.com, he was ranked No. 218 nationally and No. 32 at power forward and No. 3 in Washington. As a senior, Heide averaged 17.4 points (shooting 68.7 percent), 13.4 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.0 blocks per game according to MaxPreps and had 26 double doubles in 29 games and was named the 2022-23 4A KingCo Player of the Year. In three seasons at Mount Si (not including 2020-21 due to the COVID-19 pandemic), according to MaxPreps, his teams went 76-9, including 44-1 in league play & won three 4A KingCo championships and won the 2020 4A state championship and was the state runner-up in 2022 and finished fourth in 2023.

- Nick Boyd** is a 6-3 senior point guard from Florida Atlantic who arrives on The Mesa with two years of eligibility. Boyd was member of the FAU squad that the Aztecs defeated in the 2023 Final Four, sinking four 3-pointers in the game. He begins the 2024-25 season, 292 points from reaching the 1,000-career point plateau and if he reaches it will be the 8th player who achieved the milestone in Brian Dutcher's eight seasons leading the program. In 88 college contests, he has a 2.04 assist-to-turnover ratio, and his effective field goal percentage is 53.8 percent. He never shot below 40.0 percent from the field in any of his three seasons at FAU.

Last year he was limited to 27 appearances and 14 starts due to an injury early in the season, but posted his highest scoring average, 9.3 points per game. For the third consecutive season he shot at least 40.0 percent (80-of-200) from the field, made 42-of-123 three-pointers (34.1 percent) and hit a career-best 84.2 percent (48-of-57) from the line. He added 72 rebounds, 48 assists and 23 steals in 644 minutes of action for a team that went 25-9 overall and 14-4 in the American Athletic Conference, good for second place in the league. In 2022-23, Boyd was one of two guards in the nation, who stood no taller than 6-3, shot at least 44.9 percent from the floor, 40.0 percent from the bonus distance, dished out at least 92 assists, and scored at least 340 points.

- Jared Coleman-Jones** is a 6-10 senior forward who transferred to San Diego State from Middle Tennessee State for his final year of college eligibility and will start the year 388 points from 1,000 for his career. He started his career at Northwestern (2019-20) and has been at Middle Tennessee State for the past four seasons, competing in three of them. He can score from three levels and handle the ball while on the other end of the floor he anchors a defense that in seven of the last 14 years has been ranked in the top 10 by KenPom.com. He is one of four Division I players who from the 2022-23 season to the 2023-24 campaign tripled both his points and rebounds per game average.

Last year, as a third-team All-Conference USA performer, he averaged 11.0 points and 7.6 rebounds with a team leading eight double doubles. Coleman-Jones ranked No. 2 in C-USA in rebounds, No. 4 in free throw percentage and No. 6 in blocks per game (1.1). He led the team in offensive (59), defensive (192) and total rebounds (251), free throws (91) and attempts (118), blocks (35) and astoundingly assists (75). Among those that attempted at least 4.1 shots per game, Coleman-Jones led the team in shooting percentage (.452). He tripled his best single-season averages in points (3.7-to-11.0) and rebounds (2.5-to-7.6). A full-time starter for the first time in 2023-24, he totaled more defensive rebounds (192-to-112) and overall boards (251-to-179) than in his first three college seasons combined.

- Wayne McKinney III** is a 6-0 senior guard who transferred to San Diego State from the University of San Diego and has one year of eligibility remaining. Despite his size, he plays a physical brand of basketball on both ends of the floor and enters his senior season 140 points from reaching the 1,000-career point milestone. He is one of two active players in the nation who stand 6-0 or less that have scored at least 860 points and blocked at least 20 shots in the last three seasons and is the only one in the nation who has those stats while shooting at least 42.5 percent for his career.

As a junior at San Diego, McKinney III was named a second team All-West Coast Conference performer. In three seasons, and 93 games, as a Torero, he averaged 9.2 points, 2.1 assists, 2.9 rebounds, 1.2 steals in just under 27 minutes per game. He's never shot less than 41.8 percent from the floor and for his career is 291-of-683 (42.6 percent) from the field. He reached double figure scoring in 26 of his 32 appearances last season, including five games of at least 20 points and a career-high 31 at Pacific.

- BJ Davis** is a 6-1 sophomore point guard out of Modesto (Calif.) Christian High School. He appeared in 12 games in his initial college campaign and per 40 minutes played, averaged 8.5 points and 3.0 rebounds.

Davis was four-star prospect according to 247Sports.com who was rated, at the time of his signing, the No. 122 recruit nationally, the No. 17 point guard and No. 18 overall in California. In leading the Crusaders to a Sac-Joaquin Section Division I championship and the NorCal Regional Open Division final, he was named a California All-State third-team honoree, the Sac-Joaquin Section co-MVP, and the Sacramento Bee's Player of the Year in his senior campaign. He completed his high school career with over 1,400 points, 500 rebounds and 400 assists.

- **Kimo Ferrari** is a 6-0 senior guard who transferred to San Diego State for his final year of eligibility after graduating from Brown. He scored a career-high 39 points in his final home game for Brown, which included a program record 10 buckets from the bonus distance.
- **Demarshay Johnson Jr.** is a 6-10 junior forward out of Salesian College Prep in Richmond, Calif. In 2023-24, he appeared in a career-high 16 contests, all off the bench. In two seasons and a total of 25 games, he's shot 50.0 percent (6-of-12). Per 40 minutes played he averages 5.3 points, 7.6 rebounds, 1.9 blocks and 1.1 steals. In four high school seasons, he helped Salesian College Prep to a 101-12 record, including a 37-0 mark in Tri-County Athletic League (TCAL) play. The program won three TCAL championships and back-to-back (2017-18 & 2018-19) CIF North Coast Section Division III titles.
- **Magoon Gwath** is a 7-0 redshirt freshman forward out of Veritas Prep in Garden Grove, Calif. Has a 7-4 wingspan and can handle the ball and distribute, score from all three levels and run the floor. Gwath spent the first three years at Trinity High School in Euless, Texas.
- **Pharaoh Compton** is a 6-8 freshman forward with a 7-4 wingspan out of Las Vegas' Arbor View High. At the time of his signing he was a 4-star rated recruit (ESPN, Rivals & 247Sports) who entered college physically ready for the rigors of a college season. He was rated as high as the 24th best player at the power forward position in the nation and the No. 1 player overall in the state of Nevada as a senior. In his final campaign at Arbor View, he averaged 19.7 points on 68.7 percent shooting (224-of-326) from the floor, 9.0 boards (including 3.8 on the offensive glass), 3.6 blocks and 1.7 assists per game. Chose San Diego State over offers from Houston, Tennessee, Maryland, LSU, Iowa, and Texas A&M among others.
- **Taj DeGourville** is a 6-5 freshman guard with a 7-0 wingspan from Las Vegas, who spent last year at Wasatch Academy in Mount Pleasant, Utah. A four-star rated recruit (ESPN), he was rated as the 36th best guard nationally and the No. 2 player overall from the state of Nevada, completing a front row lockout for the Aztecs in Nevada recruiting. Chose the Aztecs over offers from Oklahoma, Southern California, Iowa, California and Harvard among others.
- **Thokbor Majak** is a 7-0 freshman, who will likely redshirt the 2024-25 season. A product of Dream City Christian High in Glendale, Ariz., and a native of Bor, South Sudan, this rim protector had a high school game in which he blocked 11 shots, and would have finished with 13, but two were ruled goal tending. Looks to add weight and muscle while working on his offensive game.
- **Ryan Schwarz** is a non-scholarship, 6-1 shooting guard out of Orinda, Calif., and Miramonte High. He appeared in seven games last year, all off the bench. Schwarz was a two-time All-Diablo League performer in his final two seasons of high school.
- **Desai Lopez** is a 6-3 non-scholarship senior guard who appeared as a reserve in three contests and eight total minutes last season. A native of Fremont, Calif., he attended Saint Francis High and two years at College of San Mateo before transferring to San Diego State
- **Cam Lawin** is a 6-3 sophomore shooting guard who is a non-scholarship player out of Chicago's Orr High. He appeared in nine games in 2023-24 averaging 0.7 points in an average of 2.4 minutes per appearance. He was a fourth-team *Chicago Sun-Times* All-City Team performer as a senior.
- With the graduation of Jaedon LeDee, Jay Pal and Darrion Trammell, and the departures of Lamont Butler, Micah Parrish and Elijah Saunders, head coach **Brian Dutcher** will replace major parts of his roster in 2024-25. The six combined to average 59.1 points, 24.5 rebounds and 11.0 assists per game last season. Look for Waters, transfers **Wayne McKinney III** (San Diego), **Nick Boyd** (Florida Atlantic), and **Jared Coleman-Jones** (Middle Tennessee State) as well as returners **Miles Byrd** and **Miles Heide**, both sophomores, to fill the majority of the production lost from last year. Those six combined to average 49.5 points, 22.3 rebounds and 9.2 assists in 2023-24.
- San Diego State enters the 2024-25 campaign with four players on the cusp of reaching and surpassing the 1,000-career point plateau. Senior **Wayne McKinney III** is 140 points from 1,000 for his career after totaling 860 in his first three seasons spent at the University of San Diego. **Reese Waters** has scored 802 points in college and is 198 from achieving the 1,000-point milestone. **Nick Boyd**, who has two years of eligibility, is 292 points from reaching the career plateau and **Jared Coleman-Jones** needs 388 points in his final season to total 1,000 for his college career.

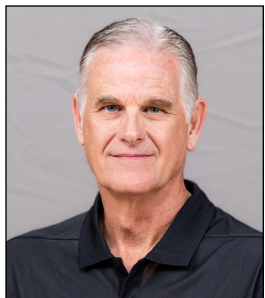

# BRIAN DUTCHER

HEAD COACH

EIGHTH SEASON • 26TH SEASON OVERALL AT SDSU • MINNESOTA, 1982

Career Record: 177-58 (.753)

MW Record: 92-32 (.742)

Brian Dutcher enters his eighth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach and is coming off back-to-back Sweet 16 appearances and a run to the program's first national championship game appearance in the 2023 NCAA Tournament. He is building on the previous seven years in which he led the Aztecs to seven title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th & 16th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament in five of the six years in which a champion was crowned. He is the only coach in the 103-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first seven seasons. His 177 victories in six seasons (177-58) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 75.3 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, Dutcher earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top 25 ranked opponents on 24 occasions and posted a 14-10 record, which includes wins over No. 1 Alabama, Gonzaga (twice), UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). From the start of the 2018-19 season to its demise after the 2023-24 campaign, his Aztecs were 8-3 against Pac-12 opponents and 11-6 in multi-team events. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the seventh best home win percentage in the nation (89.8 percent), and in the last five years, San Diego State has posted a 92.1-win percentage (70-6) in Viejas Arena, the fourth best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned. In 2020, Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztec to earn that honor. The following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker and 2024 Jaedon LeDee was named the Karl Malone Award winner for the best power forward in the nation as well as being named an All-American by multiple organizations.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors eight times to an Aztec in the last seven years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first-team designation. Flynn and Yanni Wetzell were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively. In 2022, Matt Bradley was a second team performer and in 2023, LeDee was a first-team designee.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year, and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors. 2023 saw Mensah again named the Defensive Player of the Year, a third-team performer, and a member of the all-Defensive Team, while Bradley earned first-team honors and Lamont Butler was a third team and All-Defensive Team designee. Last year, Butler was the Defensive Player of the Year, a member of the All-Defensive Team and an honorable mention performer, while Jaedon LeDee was tabbed a first-team honoree.

His players have earned 20 all-Mountain West designations and 21 players of the week honors. Three Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018, Mitchell in 2021 and Bradley in 2023, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 13 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his seven seasons, his charges have garnered 18 league all-academic team distinctions, a pair of Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar awards, and Flynn was named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2022-23 season saw SDSU fulfill a promise coach Dutcher, and Hall of Fame coach Steve Fisher, made the day they stepped on campus prior to the 1999-00 season... that the program's goal was to compete for national championships. The Aztecs finished with a 32-7 record, played Connecticut for the NCAA championship in Houston's NRG Stadium in front of more than 72,000 spectators and finished the season as the national runner-up. The team ranked No. 2 in the final USA Today Coaches poll, the highest the program has ever achieved.

SDSU's 32 victories are the second most in a season in San Diego State history, trailing only the 34 wins in 2010-11. In conference play, SDSU was 15-3 and secured both the regular-season and tournament titles to earn a No. 5 seed, its third consecutive season with a single-digit seed in the NCAA Tournament. Five of the team's seven losses were by nine points or less, with three of its losses coming against top 25 opposition and in each of its seven losses its opponent was receiving votes in the national polls. Senior guard Darrion Trammell was named the South Regional Most Outstanding Player with Lamont Butler also included on the South Regional All-Tournament Team. Butler, who hit the biggest shot in SDSU history, the game winner as time expired against Florida Atlantic in the Final Four to send the Aztecs to the national championship game, earned a spot on the 2023 NCAA All-Tournament Team.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a No. 8 seed. Six of its nine losses were by six points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, four of the team's six defeats were by three points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6-seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego

State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the fourth most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program and Mountain West history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

In 2017-18, Dutcher was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament in his initial season after going 22-10, including winning the 2018 MW Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 25 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 18 times, including 13 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 19 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has four NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014, 2023 & 2024) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016) appearances, won at least 25 games nine times and captured 16 MW championships (nine regular season, seven tournament).

In his first year on The Mesa (1999-00), as an assistant coach, the Aztecs won only five games but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.
