## OFF THE TOP (entering the 2021-22 season)

- San Diego State enters its 101st season of basketball, its 52nd at the Division I level and the fifth under the direction of Brian Dutcher on Tuesday evening, when the Aztecs play host to UC Riverside.
- The Aztecs and Highlanders are meeting for the 12th time in school history, with the Aztecs claiming the previous 11 contests. The 11-game win streak is tied for the second-longest active streak for the Aztecs, trailing only LaVerne (13, a team the Aztecs have not played since 1938).
- San Diego State has won 14 straight season-openers against unranked teams, a run dating back to the start of the 2005-06 season. SDSU's last loss to an unranked opponent on opening night came on Nov. 19, 2004, when it came out on the wrong end of a double-overtime 80-72 defeat at the hands of UC Santa Barbara.
- San Diego State has won eight straight season openers and 15 of the last 16 lidlifters to begin a campaign. The lone blemish during the stretch came at the start of the 2012-13 season when SDSU fell to No. 9/9 Syracuse on the USS Midway. Taking into account that the Syracuse game was played outdoors, on the flight deck of the USS Midway, the Aztecs have come out victorious in its last 15 season openers played indoors.
- The Aztecs are currently in an 11-game winning streak in season openers that have taken place at home.
- San Diego State is the two-time defending outright Mountain West Conference regular-season champion and doubled up last season by also winning the conference tournament. The Aztecs have a record 14 Mountain West men's basketball titles.
- Once again this season San Diego State is unranked in the preseason AP Top 25 Poll. That is no problem for the Aztecs. SDSU has been unranked each of the last two seasons but nonetheless have spent 22 weeks in the polls since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, climbing as high as No. 4 in 2019-20 and to No. 16 in 2020-21. Each of the last two seasons the Aztecs have ended the season nationally-ranked.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, San Diego State owns a 53-7 record (88.3 percent). That is the third best record in the nation, trailing only Gonzaga (62-3) and Baylor (54-6).
- San Diego State prepped for the regular season with a 65-44 victory over Saint Katherine. The Aztec defense was in regular-season form, holding the opposition to 14 points in the first half and not allowing consecutive made field goals until the 49th and 50th attempts of the evening.
- Senior transfer **Matt Bradley** announced his presence with a game-high 15 points on 6-of-11 shooting from the field, while adding two rebounds, two assists and no turnovers in 18 minutes of action. The forward, who was named the Mountain West Conference preseason newcomer of the year, was +25 while on the court.
- Senior forward **Nathan Mensah** added 14 points and a game-high 11 rebounds in 15 minutes of action. Mensah was 6-of-9 from the field, and had a pair of monstrous dunks in the contest.
- Brian Dutcher** enters his fifth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 23rd season on the Aztec sidelines. In his four seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, a 96-31 overall record and has already been named the national coach of the year and twice named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year.

## BRADLEY INCLUDED ON WOODEN, NAISMITH & JERRY WEST AWARD WATCH LISTS

Senior Matt Bradley has been included on three of the most prestigious watch lists in college basketball.

On Monday it was revealed that he is one of 50 players to be included on the Naismith National Player of the Year watch list.

On Tuesday he was named one of the early favorites to earn the 2022 John R. Wooden Award Men's Player of the Year and is the first Aztecs to garner the honors recognition since Malachi Flynn appeared on the national ballot in 2020.

In 2020-21, his third and final season competing for California, Bradley was 1-of-5 players in Division I to average 18.0 point per game, while shooting at least 45.5 percent from the floor, 36.4 percent from distance, a minimum of 82.1 percent from the line, and grab 4.6 rebounds per game. Except for his rebounding average, those other statistics would have all ranked the top-5 in the Mountain West last year. In addition, the San Bernardino, Calif., native, was one of 23 players in a Power-5 conference to shoot at least 45.5 percent overall and 36.4 percent from the bonus distance in 2020-21 and would have been the only player in the Mountain West to compile those stats last season.

A 2020-21 second-team All-Pac12 performer, he scored in double figures in 21 of the 22 games in which he appeared, finishing with 15+ points 15 times, and 20+ points 11 times, including a career-high 29 points vs. Colorado (2/13). His 11 20+ point games ranked No. 2 in the Pac-12 in 2020-21.

Over a three-year, 85 game career with the Bears, he scored 1,292 points and left California as the program's No. 21 career scorer. The 2021-22 Mountain West Preseason Newcomer of the Year is one of 12 players nationally to score at least 1,290 points in the last three seasons.

Bradley is the only player in the Mountain West conference to be included on the watch list.

Just under two weeks ago, Bradley was included on the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's initial watch list for the Jerry West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, the most prestigious individual honor a collegiate shooting guard can earn.

## TOP-25 FACTS

- San Diego State spent seven weeks overall and five consecutive in the AP Top-25 Poll last season.
- The Aztecs debuted at No. 24 on Dec. 7, 2020 and then from Feb. 15 to March 15, 2021, went from No. 25 to 22 to 19 to 19 and finished No. 16.
- San Diego State's longest consecutive streak of weeks being ranked in the AP Top-25 is 22 straight polls (Dec. 2, 2013 to Dec. 15, 2014).
- In total, the Aztecs have appeared in the AP Poll for 88 weeks, and all have come since the start of the 2010-11 campaign.
- Prior to the 2019-20 season, the last time the Aztecs had been ranked in the Coaches Poll was March 9, 2015. Since the start of the 2019-20 season San Diego State has appeared in the Coaches Poll 20 times.
- From the start of the 2010-11 season to the end of the 2020-21 season, San Diego State's 88 appearances in the AP poll are the most of any school in California.

## CALIFORNIA DREAMIN' FOR SDSU...CALIFORNIA NIGHTMARE FOR IN-STATE OPPONENTS

- San Diego State opens the 2021-22 season hosting an in-state foe in UC Riverside. In the history of the program, SDSU has never lost to the Highlanders (11-0).
- Since the start of the Coach Dutcher/Fisher era (1999-2000), the Aztecs are 116-33 (.778) against 24 of the other 25 current Division I schools in California (SDSU has not played Cal Baptist), and have a winning record against all but our of those 24 opponents.
- In the last 88 home games against those same 24 opponents, and also starting in 1999-2000, San Diego State is 77-11 (.875).
- In program history against the 24 schools, the Aztecs are 450-323 (.582) overall.

## HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament eight of the last 11 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinalist appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 170-23 home record, winning 88.1 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2021-22 season kicking off, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- In its last 197 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 173-24 mark, including a 80-10 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 126-19 at home, including a 55-9 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (46-7 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- The Aztecs are 51-10 in their last 61 non-conference home games.

## MORE HOME COOKING

- In the last two seasons, San Diego State is 27-3 at home, with an average scoring margin of +15.1 points. Of the 30 home games, 21 were decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.
- The Aztecs 11-game non-conference home court win streak, snapped on Dec. 18, 2020 by Brigham Young, is the seventh-longest in school history and longest since a 13-game win streak from Dec. 16, 2000 to Nov. 23, 2002.
- San Diego State is 34-4 in its last 38 home games dating back to Jan. 1, 2019.
- The Aztecs are 31-3 in its 34 Mountain West Conference home games since Jan. 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has ended the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on seven occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20).

## SERIES HISTORY VS. UC RIVERSIDE

- San Diego State's game against UC Riverside marks the 12th time in the series and the first encounter since SDSU's 61-33 victory over the Highlanders on Dec. 22, 2014, in Viejas Arena.
- Every game in the series has been contested in San Diego and the Aztecs have never been defeated by UC Riverside (11-0).
- The Aztecs have faced UC Riverside once in a season opener, with San Diego State defeating the Highlanders 73-57 on Nov. 24, 1999, Coach Dutcher's first game on the Aztecs bench.
- Four of the 11 meetings have been decided by less than 10 points.

- The Aztecs and Highlanders started the series in 1967 with a 90-68 win and in the last matchup SDSU won 61-33 on Dec. 22, 2014.
- Brian Dutcher is facing UC Riverside, as a head coach, for the first time, sixth time as a Division I institution, and the seventh time overall. His previous encounters have all come as a San Diego State assistant coach.

**SAN DIEGO (AP)** - San Diego State's Dwayne Polee II collapsed during the first half of the Aztecs' 61-33 victory against UC Riverside on Monday night and Viejas Arena fell silent for about 15 minutes while the senior forward was tended to by trainers and a paramedic.

Polee was alert and responsive at a hospital and was scheduled to begin a battery of tests on Tuesday, coach Steve Fisher said. The Aztecs don't know why he collapsed, he added.

As Polee was wheeled off the court on a gurney, his teammates and Fisher spoke with him.

"I said, 'Dwayne, you're going to be fine,'" Fisher said. "He said, 'I'm OK coach. Tell them to win the game.'"

"It's definitely difficult," JJ O'Brien said. "Basketball becomes something that's not important anymore and just looking out for your teammate and hoping he's OK is what's on your mind. I think it was good when we saw him leave and he was OK and told us all, 'Just go get a win for us.' That made us feel a little bit better. But basketball takes a second hand to what happened."

Polee had missed a layup and O'Brien scored on a tip-in for a 14-8 lead with more than 11 minutes left in the half. Polee, who is from Los Angeles, turned and ran down the floor. He stumbled and fell face-first near the key in front of SDSU's bench.

Polee's father, Dwayne Sr., and mother, Yolanda, came out of the stands to be near their son. Dwayne Sr. is director of player development at the University of San Francisco.

"I'm glad they were here, to be honest," Fisher said, adding that Dwayne Sr. went with his son in the ambulance and his mother followed in a car.

Fisher said Polee didn't need to be resuscitated and was not given oxygen.

The crowd gave Polee a standing ovation as he was lifted onto the gurney and his teammates, who had been standing together near their bench, came over and gave him fist-bumps. Polee pumped his fists toward the crowd as he was wheeled off.

When play resumed, SDSU went on a 12-3 run to close the half and take a 26-11 halftime lead.

Aqeel Quinn scored 18 points and O'Brien 12 for SDSU (9-3), which fell out of The Associated Press Top 25 earlier Monday.

Jaylen Bland scored nine for UCR (6-5).

The Aztecs have won 46 straight games against teams from California.

## DUTCHER KEEPS THE BALL ROLLING ON

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for 22 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time he experienced 482 victories, 14 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 15 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each year.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 20 games in each of his first four seasons.
- His 96 wins in his first three seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's first four campaigns.
- His 96 wins to date are the most of any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.

**SAN DIEGO** — San Diego State men's basketball held the Saint Katherine Firebirds to just 16 percent shooting in the first half and 27 percent for the game in a 65-44 exhibition game victory on Wednesday night in Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs defense was so dominant that Saint Katherine failed to hit back-to-back buckets until its 49th and 50th shot attempts, which came just prior to the four-minute media timeout. It went the first five-plus minutes without a bucket and with 13:25 to play in the first half was down 8-4. That is when the Aztecs offense turned the screws.

The team finished the half on a 26-10 run, which included at one point, eight straight points from senior transfer Matt Bradley. The Aztecs took a 34-14 advantage into the halftime locker room and cruised to the 21-point victory. It is the 28th consecutive victory for the program in an exhibition contest.

Overall, San Diego State was solid from the floor, shooting 40 percent for the game (25-of-62), but just 19 percent (5-of-26) from the bonus distance.

The offensive attack was shared by a game-high 15 points and a pair of assists from Bradley and Nathan Mensah, also a senior, had a double double with 14 points and 11 rebounds.

Junior Keshad Johnson had nine rebounds and a rim rattling dunk in the second half that brought the crowd of over 10,000 to their feet. Seniors Trey Pulliam and Adam Seiko scored seven and six points, respectively.

In total, 16 of the 17 eligible players for SDSU played and 12 appeared in the scoring column.

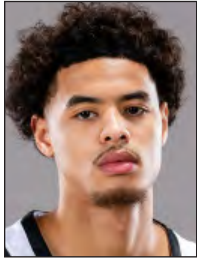

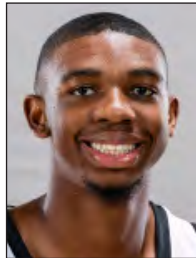

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Fifth Season • 23rd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fifth season as San Diego State head coach after four years in which he led the Aztecs to four Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th and 14th Mountain West crowns and two NCAA tournament bids. He is the only coach in the 100-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first four seasons at the helm of the program.

In the COVID-affected season of 2020-21, the Aztecs were once again the cream of the Mountain West crop posting a 23-5 record, including a 14-3 mark in league play. San Diego State won the league's regular season and tournament crowns to earn an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, where it was a 6-seed. For the second straight year, Dutcher was named Coach of the Year of both the Mountain West and NABC Division I District 17.

The Aztecs opened the season with a win over No. 22 UCLA and just over two weeks later won at No. 23 Arizona State. The team reached the Mountain West title game for the fourth straight season and earned a measure of revenge in the championship game, defeating Utah State, 68-57, the team that had knocked them off in the previous two league title games.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title,

and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.
