OFF THE TOP (through games of Friday, Mar. 11)

- San Diego State looks to add to its Mountain West Conference record 14 league titles, including a conference-high six tournament championships when the 3rd-seeded Aztecs face top-seeded Boise State in the championship game.
- This marks the fifth consecutive season the Aztecs are in the title game (all five seasons Brian Dutcher has been head coach), the eighth time in the last nine seasons and a league-high 14th time SDSU has played in the event (UNLV has the second most championship game appearances among current members with eight).
- San Diego State has won this event a record six times (2002, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2018 and 2021).
- San Diego State has won the event as the one seed (twice), two seed, four seed and five seed (twice).
- Amazingly, San Diego State has played for the tournament title in eight of the last nine years and in 12 of the last 14 seasons (2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021 and 2022).
- Overall, San Diego State is 39-16 in the Mountain West tournament for a winning percentage of 70.9 percent. The Aztecs' 39 tournament wins are the most by any team - current or former - in league history. This is particularly impressive because 10 of SDSU's 55 tournament games have been played on the road (8-2 at UNLV), while UNLV has played 40 of its 47 tournament games at home.
- San Diego State owns 41 victories in Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign. That is the most victories by any school in any venue in which it has not played a home game in the past 14 seasons. What is particularly impressive is that 17 of those 41 victories came as the road team playing at UNLV. Villanova is second with 34 victories at Madison Square Garden (see below).
- This marks just the second time since joining the Mountain West Conference that the Aztecs have been the third seed (2007). The Aztecs are 2-1 in the event on the third line (including victories the last two days).
- San Diego State and Boise State are meeting for the 27th time, with the Aztecs owning a 17-9 series advantage. The Broncos won both meetings this season by a combined six points (42-37 win in San Diego (Jan. 22) and 58-57 in Boise (Feb. 22)).
- San Diego State has won a season-best six straight games and is 11-1 in its last 12 games.
- San Diego State is playing its best basketball of the season. The Aztecs are 12-2 in their last 14 games with just a pair of one-point road losses at NET No. 27 Colorado State (57-58) and at NET No. 29 Boise State (57-58).
- San Diego State continues to boast an impressive NCAA metric profile. The Aztecs are 24th in the NET (tops in the MWC), 22nd in KenPom (tops in the MWC), 29th in BPI (tops in the MWC) and 30th in Sagarin Rating (tops in the MWC).
- SDSU head coach **Brian Dutcher** is in his fifth season as San Diego State's head coach and his 23rd season on the Aztec sidelines. In his four plus seasons as head coach, he has led the Aztecs to four conference titles, a 119-38 overall record and has already been named the national coach of the year and twice named Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year. Among first time head coaches who started in the 2017-18 season, Dutcher's 119 wins are the most and he is one of two head coaches in the group to reach triple-digit victories (also: Bob Richey of Furman with 109 victories).

- SDSU is 37-1 last 38x when outrebounding its opp.
- SDSU is 35-1 last 36x when leading at the half.
- SDSU is 73-3 last 76x it has had a higher FG pct.
- SDSU is 3rd nationally in win percentage (84.4) since start of '19-20 season and 8th in win percentage (75.6) since start of the '09-10 season.

THE AWARDS

- Senior guard **Matt Bradley** earned first-team all-conference by the coaches and was named newcomer of the year by the coaches and media. Bradley, who announced last week that he plans to return to school next season, is averaging 17.0 points, 5.3 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game for the season. He is playing sensational of late, averaging 18.6 points, 5.6 rebounds, 3.1 assists, while connecting on 37-of-74 (50.0 percent) of his three-point field goal attempts over his last 16 games.
- If that was not enough, **Bradley** was named ESPN and NCAA national player of the week last week for scoring 80 points and adding 21 rebounds in helping the Aztecs go 3-0 in a six-day period last week.
- Senior forward **Nathan Mensah** swept the Mountain West Conference Defensive Player of the Year honors. The anchor of the nation's number two ranked defense (per KenPom), led the league in blocked shots and is 10th nationally in points allowed per possession (per Synergy). Mensah, who was a third-team all-conference selection by the media, is averaging 7.4 points, 7.0 rebounds and 2.2 blocked shots.
- Sophomore forward **Chad Baker-Mazara** earned sixth man of the year honors by the coaches. He is averaging 6.2 points, 2.0 rebounds for the season but has seen his number rise considerably of late. In his last eight outings, Baker-Mazara is averaging 8.3 points, 2.8 rebounds and has made 8-of-15 (53.3 percent) from bonus distance.
- Sophomore guard **Lamont Butler** earned inclusion on the all-defensive team. He ranks second in the league in steals, averaging 1.8 per game. He entered the tournament ranked No. 61 nationally and his 45 total steals rank No. 188 in the nation.

HOW WE WIN

- Once again this season San Diego State ranks among the nation's best in defense. For the entire season, the Aztecs are 2nd in scoring defense (57.8), 4th in field goal percentage defense (38.2), 7th in two-point field goal percentage (43.0) and 6th in effective field goal percentage (44.0). In addition, the Aztecs are 2nd in Kenpom adjusted defensive efficiency (86.2).
- San Diego State has won 35 straight games when scoring at least 65 points.
- San Diego State has won 31 consecutive games when shooting 50 percent or better from the field (something the Aztecs have done in four

- San Diego State is 37-1 the last 38 times it has outrebounded its opponent.
- San Diego State is 10-0 this season and 12-0 in his career when Keshad Johnson scores in double figures.
- San Diego State is 19-2 in Trey Pulliam's career when he scores 10 or more points.
- San Diego State is 12-1 in Nathan Mensah's career when he reaches double figures in rebounds.

OUR RESUME

Below is a look at some highlights from San Diego State's NCAA tournament resume.

- San Diego State is playing its best basketball of the season. The Aztecs are 12-2 in their last 14 games with just a pair of one-point road losses at NET No. 27 Colorado State (57-58) and at NET No. 29 Boise State (57-58).
- San Diego State continues to boast an impressive NCAA metric profile. The Aztecs are 24th in the NET (tops in the MWC), 22nd in KenPom (tops in the MWC), 29th in BPI (tops in the MWC) and 30th in Sagarin Rating (tops in the MWC).
- San Diego State has quality wins, including a 10-point neutral court win over No. 19 Saint Mary's (63-53), a 30-point win over No. 27 Colorado State (79-49), a 7-point win at No. 48 Wyoming, 19-point win over No. 73 Utah State (75-56) and a 17-point win at No. 69 Fresno State (61-44).
- San Diego State entered the tournament 18-0 in games against teams currently in Quadrants 2, 3 and 4. As of Wednesday, San Diego State is one of eight teams nationally that is perfect in games outside of Q1 (No. 1 Gonzaga 16-0, No. 2 Arizona 25-0, No. 4 Kentucky 17-0, No. 8 Tennessee 15-0, No. 10 Auburn 19-0, No. 12 Texas Tech 17-0, No. 19 Saint Mary's 19-0 and No. 29 San Diego State 17-0).
- As of Wednesday, San Diego State has played its most games in Quadrant 1, with 12 Quad 1 games played out of 30 total contests.
- As of Wednesday, the Aztecs are 4-7 in Q1 games, but it is worth noting that only two of those 11 games were played at home.
- San Diego State has suffered two one-point road losses (at NET No. 25 Colorado State and at No. 31 Boise State).
- San Diego State has suffered three losses in which it held a lead in the final 66 seconds of the game.
- San Diego State has the number two ranked defense in the nation (per KenPom).
- In three of San Diego State's four conference losses, the Aztecs have held a lead inside the final 64 seconds of the game (vs. Boise, at Colorado State and at Boise State). By contrast, three of San Diego State's 13 conference victories have come by at least 25 points (Colorado State, UNLV and New Mexico) and eight have been by double-figure margins.
- That is a major reason San Diego State owns the league's best scoring margin in conference play at +9.2 (second is Boise State at +6.6).

SERIES HISTORY VS. BOISE STATE

- This is the 27th meeting between Boise State and San Diego State with the Aztecs owning a 17-9 advantage in the series.
- Since 2012, when Boise State joined the Mountain West, San Diego State has won 9 of the 13 regular season meetings (9-3) in Viejas Arena, including five of the last six.
- The first meeting, a 78-68 Aztec win in Peterson Gym, came on Dec. 12, 1976 and the programs didn't get back together until 36 years later when they were Mountain West Conference opponents, on Feb. 1, 2012.
- Brian Dutcher has been on the Aztec sideline for the last 11 games against the Broncos and is 7-4 against Boise State.
- Ten of the 12 meetings in San Diego have been decided by 10 points or less, the exceptions being an 83-65 Aztec win on Jan. 11, 2020 & an 78-66 victory on Feb. 27, 2021.
- These programs have met 11 times when SDSU has been ranked in the AP top-25, regardless of location, and the Aztecs are 10-1.
- Nathan Mensah averages 8.3 points and 6.8 rebounds and 1.5 blocks in six games against the Broncos.
- All-time series meetings against Boise State can be found in the column on page four.

- San Diego State ranks 74th nationally and No. 1 in the Mountain West in steals per game (7.6).

In second place is Villanova in Madison Square Garden with 34 victories.
- San Diego State is 12-1 in its last 13 games at UNLV (games played at Thomas & Mack Center)..

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

With San Diego State playing its 16 road/neutral contest of the season, in its championship game of the Mountain West Championship, here are some road and neutral site facts about SDSU:

- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 95-57 (.625) record in road games is the **ninth best in the nation**.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 148-83 (.641) record in road/neutral games is the **eighth best in the nation**.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 66-43 (.606) in road games against the Mountain West, **which leads the conference**.

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON SATURDAY

- 37-game win streak when San Diego State is leading with five minutes to play.
- 31-game win streak when San Diego State shoots 50% or better.

- 4-game win streak in the month of March
- 3-game win streak in games played on Saturday.

AZTECS DON'T MISS A BEAT WITH DUTCHER

Brian Dutcher has been on The Mesa for 23 seasons, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he experienced 384 victories, 10 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 13 postseason tournaments, including 10 NCAA appearances and a pair of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014).

- Since his ascension to the top job prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured four Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament each year.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first five seasons.
- His 119 wins in his first five seasons are a program record for victories in a coach's initial five campaigns.
- His 119 wins to date are the most of any first-time head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season, and he is one of two in that group who has reached triple digit wins (also: Bob Richey, Furman).

ONE WEEK...THREE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR BRADLEY

Senior guard Matt Bradley, in leading the Aztecs to a 3-0 record in the final week of the regular season, was named the **Mountain West Player of the Week** as well as the **ESPN National Player of the Week** and **Andy Katz's NCAA Digital March Madness Player of the Week**.

The San Bernardino, Calif., native averaged 26.7 points, 7.0 rebound and 2.3 assists last week. He was 24-of-48 from the field (50.0 percent), 8-of-19 from distance (42.1 percent) and knocked down 24-of-29 attempts from the charity stripe (82.8 percent).

In the three games: at Wyoming on Monday (2/28), vs. Fresno State on Thursday (3/3) and at Nevada on Saturday (3/5) he totaled 80 points, marking the second time this season, in a three-game stretch he scored 80 or more points. Bradley scored 81 points in three games from Feb. 4-9, the most since Jamaal Franklin scored 84 in three games from Feb. 25-March 3, 2012.

The Aztecs started the week in Laramie Wyo., where Bradley led all scorers with 30 points on 10-of-20 shooting from the field, hit 5-of-9 triples and sank 5-of-7 free throws. He snatched five rebounds and led the team with four assists on the way to a 73-66 win. It is the only loss the Cowboys suffered at home this season and snapped a 14-game win streak for Wyoming on its home floor.

In an epic double overtime win over Fresno State, Bradley recorded his first double-double as an Aztec with a game-high 26 points and 10 rebounds. He was successful on 8-of-18 shots, including a 2-of-7 mark from beyond the arc and sank 8-of-10 free throws. His 10 boards matched a career-best and he added a pair of assists, a steal and a block as the Aztecs defeated the Bulldogs 65-64.

Less than 48 hours later, San Diego State was in Reno for its final regular season game, a matchup against the Wolf Pack. The transfer from Cal, who earlier in the week announced that he would be returning to San Diego State next year, was 6-of-10 from the floor, including a 3-pointer and knocked down 11-of-12 free throws, including a pair with just 26 seconds remaining to give SDSU a 79-75 lead. Bradley shared the team lead with six rebounds and had an assist, as San Diego State held off a furious rally from Nevada to win 79-78.

This is the first time Bradley has been recognized as player of the week by either outlet and is the first time an Aztec has been recognized by either this year.

Head Coach

Fifth Season • 23rd Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher enters his fifth season as San Diego State head coach after four years in which he led the Aztecs to four Mountain West title games, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th and 14th Mountain West crowns and two NCAA tournament bids. He is the only coach in the 100-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first four seasons at the helm of the program.

In the COVID-affected season of 2020-21, the Aztecs were once again the cream of the Mountain West crop posting a 23-5 record, including a 14-3 mark in league play. San Diego State won the league's regular season and tournament crowns to earn an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament, where it was a 6-seed. For the second straight year, Dutcher was named Coach of the Year of both the Mountain West and NABC Division I District 17.

The Aztecs opened the season with a win over No. 22 UCLA and just over two weeks later won at No. 23 Arizona State. The team reached the Mountain West title game for the fourth straight season and earned a measure of revenge in the championship game, defeating Utah State, 68-57, the team that had knocked them off in the previous two league title games.

In 2019-20 his squad ripped off a program-record 26 straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches top-25 polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2 on the year, including 17-1 in Mountain West play and Dutcher earned *USA Today* National Coach of the Year, Mountain West Coach of the Year (in both the coaches and media polls), National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year. In addition, he was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladder Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the third most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak which set a new Mountain West record.

Led by junior guard and consensus All-American Malachi Flynn, the team won the Continental Tires Las Vegas Invitational with a blow out victory over Creighton and a 16-point comeback win against Iowa in the championship game. A month later, the Aztecs handed Utah a 28-point drubbing in the Basketball Hall of Fame Classic three days after the Utes defeated then No. 6 Kentucky.

In addition to Flynn, forwards Matt Mitchell and Yanni Wetzell and guard KJ Feagin, were recognized by the MW in its postseason awards as well as numerous national outlets.

With the expected return for the postseason of forward Nathan Mensah, who had been sidelined for the final 19 games of the year, San Diego State was poised for a deep run in the NCAA Tournament. The Aztecs were projected to be either a No. 1 or No. 2 seed and some felt were a Final Four team, but the coronavirus pandemic put an end to the postseason and fans were left to wonder what could have been.

In 2017-18, his inaugural season as Aztecs head coach, Dutcher was the only Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament after going 22-10 in the regular season, including winning the 2018 Mountain West Tournament championship.

Dutcher, who took the helm of the program following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017, was on The Mesa for all 18 of Fisher's seasons. He held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting for the six years prior to his ascension to the top job and is the 15th head coach in the program's history.

Over the course of his 21 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 12 Mountain West titles and record 15 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games eight times and captured nine MW championships (six regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at San Diego State shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid, and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the program's first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 campaign that produced the school's first MW regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories. That run to the 2009 NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and two-time NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11, when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and freshman Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title,

and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next season, San Diego State was again an at-large selection to the NCAA tournament, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the campaign by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, San Diego State won three games and qualified for the NIT national semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

SDSU completed the 2016-17 slate with a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries. The 2016 Hawaiian Airlines Diamond Head Classic champions entered 2017-18 as one of 12 teams to have won at least 19 games in 12 consecutive seasons, which was a sign of things to come in Dutcher's first year.

Dutcher's first roster as head coach featured a pair of seniors that had won multiple Mountain West titles and owned NCAA tournament experience in Trey Kell and Malik Pope.

Prior to coming to SDSU, Dutcher spent 10 seasons on Steve Fisher's bench at Michigan, where the program reached the postseason each year and participated in the NCAA Tournament eight times, including three trips to the Final Four and the championship game including a national championship in 1989.

SAN DIEGO – Playing its first game since Jan. 8, San Diego State dropped a 42-37 decision to visiting Boise State in a defensive struggle Saturday night at Viejas Arena.

The Aztecs (10-4, 2-1 MW) utilized a 13-0 run, capped by Lamont Butler's three-pointer to grab a 37-35 lead with 2:48 to go. However, the Broncos (15-4, 6-0 MW) closed with seven straight points over the final 1:04 to escape with their 12th straight victory and remain undefeated in conference play.

SDSU was led by Nathan Mensah and Lamont Butler, who scored 10 points apiece, while Matt Bradley finished with seven points in the defeat. Mensah just missed out on a double-double, leading all players with nine rebounds while Butler grabbed seven boards.

Neither team shot the ball well, with the Aztecs connecting on 28.1 percent of their field goals (16-57), while Boise State mustered a 31.1 percent clip from the floor (14-45). Despite committing four more turnovers for the contest (16-12), the Broncos maintained a 39-33 rebounding advantage and sank 9 of 11 free throws to help snap a six-game slide against SDSU.

The Aztecs trailed 6-0 after missing their first eight shots of the first half while committing three turnovers. However, SDSU battled back, forging a trio of ties, including a 17-17 deadlock on a three-pointer by Adam Seiko at the 3:51 mark and took its first lead on a Trey Pulliam floater with two tick left on the clock for a 23-22 halftime lead.

SDSU misfired on its first nine shots of the second half, as Boise State fashioned a 13-1 run to surge in front, 35-24, by the 10:55 mark.

The Aztecs then flashed their resiliency, erupting for 13 straight points over an eight-minute stretch to forge a slim 37-35 advantage. Butler scored five points during the run, including the aforementioned triple that put the Scarlet and Black in front, while Mensah and Bradley added four points each.

Tyson Degenhart then drew a foul and drained both free throws to tie the game at 37-37 with 1:04 to go.

The Aztecs came up empty on their next trip down the court, setting the stage for Shavers' heroics. Degenhart then sank two foul shot to account for the final score.

With the loss, SDSU had its 16-game home court winning streak halted, as well as a 16-game victory streak against Mountain West Conference opponents, including the 2021 league tournament.

BOISE, Idaho - The San Diego State men's basketball team had a one-point lead with 24 second to play but couldn't convert a pair of free throws with seven seconds left, which would have given it a three-point lead and lost 58-57 to the Boise State Broncos on Tuesday night in ExtraMile Arena.

Nine of the 10 Aztecs who played appeared in the scoring column led by Nathan Mensah's first double double of the season, 13 points and 11 rebounds, and Matt Bradley added 12 points, six boards and a team-leading five assists.

SDSU jumped on the Broncos early and had an 8-2 lead at the first timeout, sinking four of its first seven shots, but for the remainder of the half hit just six of 18 finishing the first period shooting 40.0 percent. The Broncos matched SDSU's shooting percentage, 40.7 percent, but also knocked down four 3-pointers and made four free throws. San Diego State was 0-4 from distance and did not attempt a free throw in the first half and trailed by as many as 12 points before heading to the break, down 30-20.

In the second half, the Aztecs slowly chipped away at the Bronco advantage. Boise State had its last double-digit lead, 36-25, with 17:18 to play. From there it was like a pair of heavyweight boxers trading punches and from the 12:35 mark on, neither team had more than a five-point lead.

San Diego State, which had not led since the 10:41 mark of the first half, drew even twice in the second half, at 44-44 with 7:21 to play and again at 47-47 with 5:23 to go.

SDSU retook the lead, 55-53, on a Chad Baker-Mazara three from the corner with 1:04 to play. The Broncos retook the lead, 56-55 off a triple from Emmanuel Akot with just 35 seconds to go.

Aztec coach Brian Dutcher called timeout and on the ensuing play, Bradley drove into the lane from the right elbow. As the defense collapsed on him he lobbed the ball up and Mensah slammed it home to give SDSU a 56-57 lead with 24 seconds left.

After a Broncos' timeout, Marcus Shaver Jr. missed a stepback jumper with 11 ticks on the clock. Bradley grabbed the rebound, was fouled and went to the line with seven seconds left.

He could not convert on either of his attempts and with no timeouts the Broncos had to go the length of the court. But Mensah's feet got tangled up with a Bronco and he was whistled for his fifth foul with just 1.7 seconds to go and SDSU still leading 57-56. Boise State's Abu Kigab made both of his free throws to give the lead back to the Broncos. A last second half-court shot by Bradley came up short as did the Aztecs 58-57.
