San Diego State vs. Air Force Postgame Notes Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena | San Diego, Calif. January 8, 2025

Big Notes

- San Diego State defeated Air Force for the 17th consecutive time at home, which is its longest active home winning streak against any team.
- SDSU's last home loss to Air Force was Feb. 28, 2005, which is 7,254 days ago, or 19 years, 10 months and 11 days.
- San Diego State gave up only 14 points in the second half, which is its' second fewest allowed in a second half since at least the 1996-97 season.
- The 38 points allowed by SDSU are tied for its third fewest allowed in a Mountain West game.
- The 38 points allowed by the Aztecs are their fewest given up since also allowing 38 vs. Air Force on March 1, 2017. They match the fewest allowed since giving up 34 vs. New Mexico on Jan. 26, 2014.
- SDSU held the Falcons to their fewest points (38) since that March 1, 2017 game at San Diego State and it matched their fewest points scored in any game since scoring 34 at San Diego State on Feb. 7, 2009.
- It was the second straight time the Aztecs held an opponent to their fewest points in a game this season (also at Boise State on Jan. 4).
- San Diego State outrebounded Air Force by 25, its largest rebound margin ever in a Mountain West game.
- SDSU improves to 194-68 in Mountain West play since the start of the 2009-10 season, which is the best record in the conference in that time frame.
- In Mountain West play, the Aztecs are now 90-13 since the start of the 2013-14 season.
- San Diego State called a timeout down, 20-8, with 11:01 left in the first half. The Aztecs outscored the Falcons, 59-18, the rest of the way, including at one point a 40-4 run.
- **F Jared Coleman-Jones** logged his first double-double as an Aztec and ninth of his career with 10 points and 14 rebounds. Ten of his 14 rebounds were on the offensive end, which was a career high.

Series Notes

- The Aztecs are now 66-24 all-time against Air Force, including 21-3 at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.
- SDSU is 36-14 against Air Force in the Mountain West era (since the start of the 1999-00 season).
- San Diego State defeated the Falcons in the last 10 meetings, regardless of location.
- The Aztecs have won 17 straight at home against Air Force.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher is now 12-1 against Air Force.

Team Notes

- In home games, the Aztecs are now:
 - 102-13 under Brian Dutcher
 - 217-28 in its their last 245
 - 5-2 this season
- San Diego State stands at 256-93 at home against the current members of the Mountain West.
- SDSU improves to 121-24 under Brian Dutcher and overall is 239-60 in its last 299.
- In games played in the month of January, the Aztecs are now 41-17 under Brian Dutcher and as a program have won 85 of its last 113 (85-28) January tilts.
- The Aztecs are 166-17 under Brian Dutcher when leading at the half, including 97-6 in their last 103 games, 135-10 in their last 145.
- In its last 254 games when leading at the half, SDSU is 229-25.
- San Diego State improves to 168-13 (.928) under Brian Dutcher, including 9-1 this season when leading with five minutes to play.
- SDSU improves to 7-1 this season and 137-17 under Brian Dutcher when outrebounding its opponent.
- San Diego State logged an offensive rebound on 24 of its 44 missed shots, which is 55 percent.
- The Aztecs improve to 8-1 on the season, 129-31 under Brian Dutcher and 100-19 in its last 119 games when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent.
- San Diego State won its 25th consecutive game when holding an opponent to under 35 percent shooting and improves to 61-2 under Brian Dutcher when holding its opponent to under 35 percent (7-0 this season).
- SDSU improves to 7-0 on the season when it has a scoring run of at least 10-0.
- The Aztecs have won 77 of their last 96 (76-20) Wednesday games, including 32-of-40 under Brian Dutcher.
- San Diego State did not trail in the second half for the seventh time this year and the fourth time in the last five games.
- In its white uniforms, SDSU is 117-19 under Brian Dutcher, including 87-10 in its last 97.
- When out rebounding their opponent, the Aztecs are now:
 - 137-17 under Brian Dutcher
 - 105-9 in their last 114 games
 - 278-43 in their last 321 games
- San Diego State had a season-high six dunks (previous high was 3).
- The Aztecs forced four Air Force shot clock violations.
- SDSU rallied from a 12-point deficit to win, its most points overcome in a win this season.

Game Flow

- San Diego State won the tip, Magoon Gwath to Jared Coleman-Jones.
- San Diego State scored the first points of the game on a Jared Coleman-Jones putback at 19:23.
- Air Force's first points came on a 3-pointers by Ethan Taylor at 19:06.
- Air Force hit seven of its first 11 shots and led 20-8 at the 11:01 mark.
- From the 15:44 media timeout to the 11:01 media timeout, Air Force outscored the Aztecs 12-2.
- From the 11:01 mark, San Diego State went on an 12-0 run to tie the game at 20-20 at with 5:00 to play in the first half.
- Air Force started the game 5-of-6 from the floor but finished the half 4-of-14.
- Trailing 20-8 at the 11:01 mark, SDSU closed the half on a 25-4 run.
- In the first half, SDSU forced 13 turnovers which it turned into 20 points.
- BJ Davis went on a personal 11-0 run, and scored 11 of the team's first 13 points of the second half.
- San Diego State went on a 40-4 run from the 11:01 mark of the first half to the 13:40 mark of the second half: 17:21 of game action.

Player Notes

Nick Boyd – 16 points, 6-10 FG, 3-5 3PTG, 4 rebounds, 1 assist, 5 steals, +26 plus/minus rating
Reached double figure scoring for the 10th time as an Aztec and 41st time in his college career ... Led the team in scoring for the fifth time this season and 12th time of his career ... Had multiple three-pointers for the ninth time this season (SDSU is 7-2) and 44th time of his career ... Logged a career-high five steals ... Is the third Aztec to

record five steals in a game this season (also BJ Davis, twice, and Miles Byrd vs. UC San Diego) ... The Aztecs outscored the Falcons by 26 points when he was on the floor, the highest plus/minus rating in the game.

BJ Davis – 15 points, 5-9 FG, 3-4 3PFG, 5 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 steal

Scored in double figures for the seventh time this year and in his career ... It was his most points since scoring 18 vs. Oregon on Nov. 27 ... Over the seven games since that Oregon contest, he logged only two double-digit scoring games ... Tied a career high with three 3-points ... Knocked down multiple 3-pointers for the sixth time in 2024-25.

Jared Coleman-Jones – 10 points, 4-7 FG, 14 rebounds (10 offensive)

Had his first double-double as an Aztec and ninth of his career ... Reached double figure scoring for the third time this season and 24th time in his college career ... Established a new career-best in rebounds ... Led the team in rebounding for the third time this season and 32nd time of his career ... The 10 offensive rebounds were four more than his previous career high.
