Aztecs Notes

Let's Get it Started

San Diego State has won its season opener in each of its last five seasons. Those wins came by an 11-3 combined score following last year's 3-0 shutout win over Cal State Bakersfield at Snapdragon Stadium.

Scarlet Against Red

The Aztecs and Red Raiders have faced off four times, once a year between 2016 and 2019. Texas Tech came out on top in all four but three of the matches were decided by one goal (2016-18). The matches in 2016, 2018 and 2019 all took place in San Diego on the SDSU Sports Deck.

Shut Them Down

SDSU has not allowed a goal across two matches against Cal State Bakersfield. Both times, the final score was 3-0. The first time the teams played was way back on October 7, 2007, on the SDSU Sports Deck. They battled again to begin last season on August 15 at Snapdragon Stadium.

Like Mike

Friesen's 195 victories (195-122-50) since the start of the 2007 season, the year he took control of the program, are the most by any coach in MW history after passing Brigham Young coach Jennifer Rockwood's 190 while the Cougars were in the Mountain West. Boise State's Jim Thomas' 130 victories rank second among current MW head coaches.

Team of the Future

San Diego State has just five upperclassmen on the roster this season: senior Grace Goins and juniors Boston Girman, Taryn Grobbel, Alexys Ocampo and Katie Senn. The other 20 players on the roster are underclassmen (nine sophomores and 11 freshmen).

Above the Rest

SDSU holds a lead in the all-time series against every current MW member that it has played. The records: AFA (24-1-2, .926), Nevada (14-2-0, .875), CSU (9-1-2, .833), SJSU (16-2-4, .818), USU (9-1-4, .786), Fresno State (16-5-2, .739), Wyoming (18-7-4, .690), UNLV (22-10-2, .676), Colorado College (7-3-5, .633), UNM (15-11-8, .559) and Boise State (11-10-0, .524).

Goin(s) the Distance

A 2024 and 2025 Mountain West Preseason Watch List selection, Grace Goins came through with four goals a season ago. She is an extremely reliable defender and has played every minute of every match for the Aztecs since joining the team for the 2022 campaign. Goins had one assist as a freshman, which accounted for her lone career point until her four goals last season. Her first came in a 1-1 tie with Weber State on August 18. Her other three goals all came off Trinity Coker corner kicks. She scored in back-to-back matches at Air Force on October 13 (2-2 tie) and vs. San Jose State (2-1 win) on October 17 as well as in the Mountain West Semifinal against Boise State on November 6.

Staying in Our Lane

- A two-time Mountain West Freshman of the Week in 2024 (Sept. 30 and Nov. 2), Mia Lane was the first player in program history to earn the award multiple times. Denise Castro (Sept. 13, 2021) was the only other Aztec to be named Freshman of the Week in school history. Lane garnered those accolades after logging a goal and an assist in a 5-0 win against Nevada on September 26 before another goal in the regular season finale at New Mexico on October 31.

Flyin' Hawaiian

- Alexyz Nakamoto scored her first collegiate goal on September 15, 2024, to tie the match against Eastern Washington at one (the Aztecs would go on to win 4-2). In the team's next match, Nakamoto struck again, scoring against Utah Valley on September 22.

Shipping up to Boston

- In her 2024 season debut against Nevada on September 26, Boston Girman attempted the second shot of her career and scored her first career goal.

Charlie Hustle

- Against Air Force on October 13 last season, the Aztecs trailed the Falcons 2-1 with just under three minutes remaining before Charlie Gerson found Dori Savage for the game-tying goal. It was the first assist and first point of Gerson's career.

Something to Chew On

- Riley Gumm picked up her first career assist and took a shot on goal on September 26 against Nevada last year. It would be the only time that Gumm did either in her freshman season.

Jumping Into the Deep End

- Last season, Alexyz Nakamoto and Mia Lane became the first pair of Aztec freshmen to score in the same season since Denise Castro and Alexys Ocampo in 2021.

Iron Mike

- Head Coach Mike Friesen is in his 19th campaign leading the Mountain West's most successful women's soccer program. Friesen has guided his squad to 11 Mountain West championships (five tournament and six regular season), and five NCAA Tournament appearances, both the most among any current league head coach. Through his 18th season of conference play, Friesen has an 113-37-22 record. His 113 league victories are the most by any head coach in Mountain West history.

Looking into the Crystal Ball

- San Diego State is picked to finish in fourth place in the MW coaches' preseason poll. This marks just the second time in 16 seasons the Aztecs have been picked to finish outside the top two. The only previous time SDSU was lower than second place in the preseason poll in that time was in 2019, a year in which the Aztecs were also predicted to finish fourth. That team earned a share of the Mountain West regular-season title at 8-2-0, and reached the championship match of the league tournament.

Best in the (Mountain) West

- The Aztecs have won ten of the last 25 MW trophies (regular season and tournament), all of which have come under the direction of head coach Mike Friesen. In total, the 19th-year head coach has guided San Diego State to 11 conference titles.

Top of the Mountain (West)

- San Diego State has earned 12 Mountain West titles since the conference's inception in 1999. SDSU was the regular season champions in 1999, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2019 and 2023. The program was the tournament champion in 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2017. The Aztecs' lead all current teams in each category and have the most regular season titles while trailing only Brigham Young (7 tournament titles, 13 overall) in all-time titles.

Got My Eye On You

- SDSU had three players selected to the Mountain West Preseason Watch List. This year's selections were senior Grace Goins (for the second straight season) and juniors Alexyz Ocampo and Katie Senn.

Hitting the Books

- Five current Aztecs were named Academic All-Mountain West last season for maintaining a cumulative 3.0 GPA or better while competing in at least half of the team's matches. Charlie Gerson, Grace Goins, Riley Gumm, Mia Lane and Alexyz Nakamoto earned the honor during the 2024 season. Goins also did so the year prior. Six members of the 2025 squad were named Mountain West Scholar-Athletes in 2024: Emma Fuller, Charlie Gerson, Riley Gumm, Brynn Korpela, Karoline Lundstrom and Alexyz Nakamoto. To become a Mountain West Scholar-Athlete, student-athletes must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or better while completing at least two semesters of school.

Finishing Strong

- San Diego State was exceptional when it came to finishing off opponents in 2024. SDSU finished with a 9-2-1 record in matches in which it led including wins in the last eight matches led by the Aztecs prior to the Mountain West Semifinals. When that lead was at halftime, the team went 6-1-0 in 2024, and had a 19-match winning streak when leading at halftime that was snapped in the Mountain West Semifinals.

Home Cooking

- SDSU went 8-5-1 at home in 2024 with victories in its final five regular season home matches, all during conference play. The Aztecs had a whopping 14-1 goal differential during those five contests. San Diego State was perfect at home during conference play in 2023 as well and is 11-0-0 over the last two seasons in conference home matches with a 28-4 goal differential.

A Hot Start

- When the Aztecs scored first during the 2024 season, they went on to win eight and tie one of their eleven matches. They were riding a seven-match winning streak before scoring first in a defeat in the Mountain West Semifinals.

We Have Portal at Home

- Of the 25 players on SDSU's 2025 roster, 23 have spent their entire careers as Aztecs. Just two players, newcomers Victoria Miller and Rory Schank joined the Aztecs through the transfer portal. Schank redshirted during her season at Auburn and did not see the field in any matches while Miller is the lone Aztec to compete in a different uniform. She played in 15 matches, starting twice at Ohio State last season.

Going Global

- San Diego State has five international players on its 2025 roster. A native of Montpellier, France, Lily Boudet is in her third season on the Aztecs and attempted two shots (one on goal) across ten matches back in 2023 before not seeing any action last season. Joining her are a pair of freshmen defenders from Northern Europe. Alexandra Myrestam is a native of Stockholm, Sweden, while Mia Hambro Svendsen hails from Oslo, Norway. In addition to the European trio, SDSU also has a duo of Canadian freshmen forwards: Ciara Jade Mitchell from Vancouver, British Columbia, and Eva Vespa, a native of St. Leonard, Quebec.

Across the Nation

- The Aztecs have players from eight different states. 12 of the 25 players on the roster are in-state California natives. Two players: Victoria Miller and Taryn Grobbel come from Michigan. Meanwhile, SDSU has a player each from Colorado (Mia DeJohn), Georgia (Karoline Lundstrom), Hawai'i (Alexyz Nakamoto), Illinois (Riley Gumm), Pennsylvania (Eva Wierzbowski) and Texas (Rory Schank).

On the Hunt

- SDSU's newest addition to the coaching staff for 2025 is goalkeeper coach Louis Hunt. He served as an assistant coach and the Head of Goalkeeping for San Diego Wave FC from their inaugural 2022 season through 2024. Hunt has previously worked at the collegiate level, as he was an assistant coach at DII Cal Poly Pomona from 2013-15. Finally, he has also worked with US Youth National Teams. Hunt has been a coach and scout for the U15-U20 age groups since 2015 and now is also the Goalkeeper Coach for the U23 squad.

Pacific Specifics

- San Diego State played two exhibition matches and has 17 regular season matches this year. 11 of those 19 matches come at home (ten on the SDSU Sports Deck, one at Snapdragon Stadium). Seven of the eight road matches are in the Pacific time zone, meaning SDSU will leave PT just once, for a match at Colorado State on October 23. Of the other seven road matches, five are in California, one is in Arizona (during the part of the year that the state aligns with PT) and one is in Nevada.
