Washington State hosts San Diego State Saturday night on Homecoming Weekend at Gesa Field. Kickoff is scheduled for 7:25 p.m. on The CW.

ABOUT WASHINGTON STATE

JIMMY ROGERS

ALMA MATER: South Dakota State, 2010 CAREER RECORD (SEASON): 28-3 (3rd) WSU RECORD (SEASON): 1-0 (1st)

Washington State are led by first-year head coach Jimmy Rogers who coached South Dakota State the previous two seasons highlighted by an FCS National Championship in 2023. The Cougars went 8-5 last season and earned a trip to the Holiday Bowl for the program's eighth bowl game in the last nine full seasons. The Cougars eight wins were the most since the 11-2 campaign in 2018. The 2025 rosters features just three returning starters on offense and 75 newcomers.

SERIES HISTORY

The Cougars lead the all-time series 2-1 with San Diego State after posting a 29-26 win over the Aztecs in San Diego last season. Saturday will be the first meeting of the series in Pullman.

COLLEGE GAMEDAY RECORD

Dating back to the 2003 season, ESPN College GameDay has had the WSU flag appear throughout the show. The streak reached 321 last week in Columbus for Texas-Ohio State. The first appearance came in Austin, Texas (10/4/03) and the streak began two weeks later in Madison, Wisc. (10/18/03). Two flags — Ol' Crimson and Gray — have been flown in the background of the GameDay set. The Gray flag was added in 2014 after Whitey was retired in honor of Steve Gleason's "No White Flags." Appearance No. 217 was its first in Pullman (10/20/18), a 34-20 win over Oregon.

POTTER LEADS GAME-WINNING DRIVE IN SEASON-OPENING WIN OVER IDAHO

Redshirt-freshman Jack Stevens kicked a 32-yard field goal with three seconds left to lift Washington State to a 13-10 season-opening win against Idaho at Gesa Field, giving Jimmy Rogers a win in his head coaching debut for the Cougars. Making his first career start, quarterback Jaxon Potter threw for 209 yards, completing 24 of 31 attempts, including six completions on the game-winning 9-play, 59-yard drive after Idaho tied the game at 10 with 1:42 left. The Cougar defense recovered a pair of fumbles and held Idaho to 221 yards of total offense including 33 passing yards.

COUGAR SPORTS NETWORK

Washington State football games are broadcast live on the radio across the region via the Cougar Sports Network. In addition to the expansive radio network, games can also be heard worldwide by streaming on the WSU Cougars app, at wsucougars.com and on Sirius XM Satellite radio. Cougar football broadcasts begin two hours before kickoff, carry through the game and conclude with coach and player interviews on the Coug Talk postgame show. Derek Deis hosts pre and postgame coverage and is joined by former WSU players Grady Emmerson and Billy Newman throughout the season.

Chris King enters his second season as Voice of the Cougs, handling play-by-play duties for WSU football, men's basketball and select baseball games along with hosting coaches shows and podcasts. King returned to Pullman in 2024 – where he graduated from the Edward R. Murrow College of Communication in 2009 - after gaining 13 years of DI broadcasting experience in neighboring Idaho.

Jessamyn McIntyre returns for her 14th season as a sideline reporter for Cougar football. McIntyre is the assistant program director of Sports Radio 93.3 KJR in Seattle and previously was an executive producer for Q13 FOX in Seattle, was an executive producer for 710 ESPN Seattle (2009-20) and for ESPN Radio in Bristol, Conn. (2005-09).

Alex Brink begins his eighth year as an analyst on the Cougar football broadcasts. As a student-athlete for WSU, Brink was a three-time All-Pac-10 quarterback from 2004-07, setting school records for career touchdowns and passing yards. He is also the only starting quarterback in school history to lead the Cougars to three Apple Cup victories. Brink was selected in the seventh round of the 2008 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans, where he played two seasons before spending six seasons in the Canadian Football League. Brink is cofounder of EForce Sports, a performance training, skill development and fitness company in Portland and has served as a quarterback coach at the Elite11 Quarterback Competition.

JIMMY ROGERS NAMED HEAD COACH

WSU Director of Athletics Anne McCoy announced December 28 that Jimmy Rogers had been named the Cougars' Head Football Coach. Rogers agreed in principle to a five-year contract in becoming the 35th head football coach in program history. Rogers arrived at WSU having spent the last 12 years at South Dakota State University, the past two as head coach. In those two years, he guided SDSU to a 27-3 record, led the Jackrabbits to the 2023 FCS Championship and reached the FCS semifinals last season.

The 2026 Apple Cup will be contested Sept. 5 at Husky Stadium in Seattle, while the 2027 game will be held Sept. 18 at Gesa Field in Pullman. The 2028 contest, the fifth in the five-game agreement signed in 2023, will be played at Husky Stadium though no date has been announced. WSU signed a home-and-home agreement with the University of Arizona, beginning in 2026. The 2026 contest will be played Sept. 26, in Pullman, while the return game is set for Sept. 25, 2027, in Tucson.

KYLE WILLIAMS SELECTED BY PATRIOTS IN 2025 NFL DRAFT

Wide receiver Kyle Williams was selected by the New England Patriots in the third round of the 2025 NFL Draft. Williams, taken No. 69 overall, was the first Cougar wide receiver drafted since Dezmon Patmon in 2020 and was the highest drafted wide receiver since Jason Hill went in the third round to San Francisco in 2007. Williams played his last two seasons in Pullman after playing his first three seasons at UNLV (2020-22). The Inglewood, Calif. finished his career with 248 receptions for 3,609 yards, 29 touchdowns, seven 100-games and caught a pass in all 50 career games played. Williams caught 70 passes for 1,198 yards and 14 touchdowns with five 100-yard games last season.

PULLMAN, Wash. – Redshirt-freshman Jack Stevens kicked a 32-yard field goal with three seconds left to lift the Washington State Cougars to a 13-10 win against the Idaho Vandals, Saturday at Gesa Field, giving Jimmy Rogers a win in his head coaching debut for the Cougars. Making his first career start, WSU quarterback Jaxon Potter threw for 209 yards, completing 24 of 31 attempts, including six completions on the game-winning 9-play, 59-yard drive after Idaho tied the game at 10 with 1.42 left. After a scoreless first quarter, WSU drew first blood when Potter connected with Josh Meredith for a six-yard touchdown pass to take a 7-o lead, an advantage the Cougars took into halfitime. Stevens' 30-yard field goal extended the Cougars' lead to 10-0 in the third quarter, a score set-up by a Kyle Peterson fumble recovery that gave WSU the ball on Idaho's 18-yard line. Idaho finally was able to break through in the scoring column on Art Williams 3-yard touchdown run with 7:25 left in the fourth quarter. After an exchange of drives, Idaho's Matyus McLain forced an Angel Johnson fumble, which was recovered by Idaho's Donovan Parham at WSU's 11-yard line. The Cougars' defense held, and the Vandals settled for the game-tying 21-yard field goal by Cameron Pope. Defensively, redshirt-senior Caleb Francl recorded a game-high 11 tackles, while redshirt-senior Matthew Durrance and redshirt-freshman Anthony Palano each had nine for the Cougars. Saturday's matchup was the 94th meeting between the two schools. The Cougars have won 11 consecutive games in the series.

Rogers arrives at WSU having spent the last 12 years at South Dakota State University, the past two as head coach. In those two years, he guided SDSU to a 27-3 record, led the Jackrabbits to the 2023 FCS Championship and reached the FCS semifinals this past season.

In 2024, Rogers led the Jackrabbits to a 12-3 overall record, including a semifinal showing in the 2024 FCS Championship. By earning a share of the 2024 Missouri Valley Football Conference title, SDSU secured three-consecutive league titles for the first time since 1961-63. Through the end of the regular season, the Jackrabbit defense led all FCS schools in scoring defense (12.4 ppg), was fourth in total defense (272.9 ypg) and sixth in rushing defense (90.5 ypg). Offensively, SDSU ranked first in sacks allowed (0.5 pg) and tackles for loss allowed (2.58 pg), while being ranked third in running offense (243.2 ypg), seventh in scoring offense (36.6 ppg) and ninth in total offense (441.9 ypg).

During the season, nine players earned a



total of 27 All-American honors, led by senior center Gus Miller who earned firstteam honors by four different media outlets.

In his first season as a head coach, Rogers led the Jackrabbits to their second consecutive Football Championship Subdivision national title and finished the 2023 campaign with a perfect 15-0 record. SDSU held the top spot in both major FCS polls throughout the 2023 season and carried a 29-game winning streak — the third-longest winning streak in subdivision history — into his second season. He became the second SDSU head coach in as many years to be honored with the Eddie Robinson Award as the top FCS coach, joining his mentor, John Stiegelmeier, in 2022.

SDSU led the FCS ranks 10 different statistical categories on both sides of the ball in 2023, most notably scoring defense (9.3 points per game), total defense (257.2 yards per game), team passing efficiency (174.26) and third-down conversion percentage (.535). The Jackrabbits raised their level of play during their four-game postseason run, outscoring the opposition by a combined 146-15, including posting a

pair of shutouts.

Six members of the 2023 team were honored on All-America teams, including Walter Payton Award winner Mark Gronowski at quarterback. In addition, a total of eight players were either drafted or signed free agent NFL contracts.

Rogers also played an integral role in the Jackrabbits winning their first national title in football during the 2022 season by directing a defense that led the Football Championship Subdivision in rushing defense by allowing only 88.1 yards per game on the ground. SDSU tied for the FCS lead with 18 interceptions and also ranked second in total defense (274.1 yards per game), third in scoring defense (15.8 points per game) and fourth in turnovers gained (26).

The Jackrabbits finished the 2022 season on a 14-game winning

streak and held the No. 1 ranking in both the Stats Perform media poll and FCS coaches' poll the final two months of the year.

Rogers was honored as the 2022 FCS Coordinator of the Year by FootballScoop.com, and also was selected to participate in the AFCA's 35 Under 35 Coaches Leadership Institute.

A former standout defensive player for South Dakota State, Rogers returned to his alma mater in June 2013 to coach the Jackrabbit linebackers. The 2022 campaign marked his first, and only, season as the team's sole defensive coordinator duties after sharing the role for three seasons. He previously was elevated to assistant head coach after the 2019 campaign.

In his first season, Rogers directed a linebacking corps whose three regular starters — R.C. Kilgore, T.J. Lally and Charles Elmore — combined for 290 tackles. Kilgore led the team with 134 tackles and also led the nation with five fumble recoveries en route to first-team all-Missouri Valley Football Conference recognition.

Rogers again coached a 100-tackle performer

in 2014 as Lally led the squad with 117 tackles en route to earning second-team all-MVFC recognition.

The 2015 Jackrabbit linebacking crew again featured the squad's top two tacklers as Lally turned in the third 100-tackle season of his career with a team-best 102 stops and Jesse Bobbit added 97 tackles. Lally received second-team all-MVFC recognition for the third time, while Bobbit was an honorable mention selection.

Under Rogers' guidance, Christian Rozeboom burst onto the Football Championship landscape in 2016 by being named MVFC Freshman of the Year and finishing second in the balloting for the STATS FCS Jerry Rice Award as the top freshman in the Football Championship Subdivision after tallying a team-best 132 tackles. In addition, fellow linebackers Jesse Bobbit and Dallas Brown capped strong careers in 2016. A second-team all-league selection, Bobbit ranked second on the squad with 110 tackles, while Brown led the team with three interceptions.

Rozeboom anchored the Jackrabbit linebacking corps over the next three seasons as he registered 100-plus tackles each year in becoming the SDSU career tackles leader with 475. He also earned first-team all-MVFC

honors four times and was a three-time All-America selection. A multiple-time finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award as the top defensive player in the FCS ranks, Rozeboom would later sign a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Rams.

Besides Rozeboom's team-leading 111 tackles, fellow starting linebackers Seven Wilson (83 tackles) and Logan Backhaus (79 tackles) ranked second and third, respectively, on the team in 2019. Backhaus also shared the team lead with four interceptions and three forced fumbles.

In taking on a new and expanded role in 2019, Rogers helped direct a Jackrabbit defense that ranked in the top three of the MVFC in seven different defensive categories, including a second-place showing in total defense (294.8 yards per game) and third in scoring defense (16.7 points per game).

Rogers' linebacking corps again earned multiple awards en route to the FCS title game during the 2020-21 season that was moved to the spring. The team's starters ranked as the top three tacklers during the 10-game season as Adam Bock (74 tackles), Logan Backhaus (72 tackles) and Preston Tetzlaff (70 tackles) paced the squad. Backhaus was honored on a number of All-America teams, while Bock was

a freshman All-America honoree and Tetzlaff was awarded the NCAA Elite 90 Award at the national championship.

Jackrabbit linebackers were again the team's top two tacklers during the 2021 season as football returned to the fall. Sophomore Adam Bock registered a teamhigh 125 tackles and Isaiah Stalbird was second on the squad with 73 total stops. Bock was a late addition to the list of finalists for the Buck Buchanan Award and received All-America honors from several organizations after earning first-team all-MVFC recognition.

Rogers coached a 100-tackle linebacker in eight of his 10 seasons leading the position group.

Depth within the linebacking corps was key to the Jackrabbits' success as the defense overcame injuries to several players at various points of the 2022 season. Eight different players drew starting assignments at linebacker,

with transfer Jason Freeman leading the team with 84 tackles. Bock, who repeated as a first-team all-MVFC selection despite missing the second half of the conference season due to injury, ranked second on the squad with 76 tackles, with Stalbird ranking third with 55 stops. Tucker Large, who split time between linebacker and safety, joined Freeman on the MVFC All-Newcomer Team.

Earlier during his tenure with the Jackrabbits, Rogers helped mentor special teams units that consistently ranked among the best in the FCS ranks. SDSU ranked in the top five nationally among FCS programs for blocked kicks two seasons in a row (2017, 2018) and also ranked seventh in kickoff returns during the 2017 season with an average of 25.13 yards per return as Cade Johnson set a single-season SDSU record with 839 kickoff return yards and returned a pair of kicks for touchdowns en route to being named to a pair of freshman All-America squads.

A native of Hamilton, Arizona, Rogers previously served as a graduate assistant at Florida Atlantic University in Boca Raton, Florida. He spent the fall of 2012 as an offensive graduate assistant, working with the offensive line. In the spring of 2013, he transitioned back to the defensive side of the ball as he worked with the team's linebackers.

Immediately after his collegiate playing career ended, Rogers spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at South Dakota State, working with the team's defensive backs in 2010 and linebackers in 2011. He also assisted with the special teams units both seasons.

As a player, Rogers lettered for the Jackrabbits from 2006-09 and was a two-time all-conference selection. He led both the team and the Great West Football Conference with 110 tackles in 2007 as South Dakota State claimed the league title and Rogers was a first-team all-GWFC selection. He again led the squad in tackles in 2008 with 93 en route to earning second-team all-Missouri Valley Football Conference honors.

He was a captain on the Jackrabbits' first FCS playoff team in 2009, recording 66 tackles his senior season to finish his four-year career with 312 stops in 46 games. He also intercepted three passes and forced three fumbles in an SDSU uniform. Bottom of Form

Rogers and his wife, Haley, have two children, a daughter, Reese, and son, Trace.
