San Diego State vs. Wyoming Postgame Quotes

San Diego State 24, Wyoming 7

Snapdragon Stadium | San Diego, Calif. | November 1, 2025

San Diego State Head Coach Sean Lewis

Opening Statement:

"Good win, another dominant performance by the defense. Aside from that opening drive, I think Wyoming had 49 yards in the second half, which is outstanding. Another great step by our players. In the other two phases of the game, there are moments of greatness, but far too much inconsistency that we need to clean up. I'm disappointed with the number of penalties that occurred. We'll make sure that we do a better job with that as we go forward. It's good to be mildly upset about a three-possession win. It's a good spot to be in. At the end of the day, there's not going to be a picture on the scorecard. It's great to have another one, to win six in a row as we have momentum going into the fourth quarter of the season. It's great to be in the position that we are right now. Ultimately, it doesn't matter. We've got to get a heck of a lot better as we go forward. It's a good spot to be in. There's going to be lots of cleanup this week, because we have to go play a really good Hawaii team and other future opponents. The Aztecs have to get better as we continue to go forward, so that we can achieve all of our dreams and goals."

On if the team should be ranked after this win:

"How many 7-1 teams are there in the country? At this point in the season, we're not talking about preseason polls and what people think they are. We're going to be in the second week of November. There are only four weeks left in the regular season before hitting championship weekend. We're focused on the present. How many teams are 7-1? The resume speaks for itself. If you're talking about the Top 25 teams in the country that are consistently showing up, the resume matters, and not what we think people. We are what we thought we were going to be as we entered the season. We talk all the time in here about 'This is a what have you done for me lately business.' We've won six in a row. How many teams in the country have won six in a row? I think we're one of the best in the country. We should be in the Top 25. I can't wait to see our community show up and give us a Top 25 performance from their support and from the community as well. We have one of the best cities in the world, not just in the country, but in the world. I can't wait to see them show up with us at the next opportunity."

On the offense not being as efficient as in past weeks:

"It's a special spot for us to be sitting here when we're talking about almost 400 yards of total offense and talking about our lack of inefficiency. It's great that the standards are that high. Wyoming did a really good job. Coach Jay Sawvel does an unbelievable job with his defensive background, his defensive staff, and being really gap-sound. They're a one-man, one-gap, aggressive, uphill unit that's going to attack you and be very physically stout. They're a really developed team. There are

things within the run game that we had to refine. Ultimately, I have to do a better job of getting us into some heavier personnel sooner and quicker. I am more disappointed in myself. We got to spring Lucky Sutton there at the end for a big run. Valuing the football is critically important now. It's been two weeks in a row that we've done a poor job with turnovers. We have got to go back to emphasizing that. We need to go back to the basics, but we'll continue to refine it. We'll continue to go forward, but I'm always going to look inward at what we can do better as a staff and what we're doing offensively, so better execution comes out of it."

#2 Running Back, Lucky Sutton, San Diego State

On setting a career high in yards:

"Wyoming has a great defense, and I have to give kudos to them. It was not a perfect game. It's a career high for me, but there's still a lot to clean up on offense. I have a lot I need to clean up. I didn't play a perfect game. It's a great feeling, but it's time to get back to work and winning."

On playing behind a great offensive line:

"It means a lot. I have a lot of trust in those guys, and I'm really proud of how they play every single week. They keep on getting better and better. We started off slow, but they figured out the way to get the job done at the end and keep on getting better and better. I'm really proud of those guys and really appreciative of them."

#2 EDGE, Trey White, San Diego State

On what it means to own a 7-1 record:

"The best thing about that is we're 7-1, and we still haven't played a complete game as a team in all three phases. The locker room wasn't as excited as it usually is, because we know we can play so much better. We're just a really hungry team, and we know that we have a lot left to play ahead of us. We know we have to take it game by game. That's the only way to do it. We'll eventually keep stacking wins. We're still 0-0 right now. We just have so much to work for, and that's what's exciting."

On how the defense was able to slow down Wyoming's offense:

"We knew that they were going to try to run the ball on us. That's what they leaned on during their games. Once we shut that down, we forced third-and-long situations. Every time it's third-and-long, we get after it. Forcing them in those long down distances was the key for us there."

Wyoming Head Coach Jay Sawvel

Opening Statement:

"First of all, credit to Coach Lewis and their team. That's a really, really good football team that we played tonight. There's a reason they have the record they have, and there was going to be a narrow window and narrow lanes that we were going to be in to win that game. When you get to that, teams that make the least mistakes win, and we made too many tonight. We gave them points and took points away from ourselves. There are a lot of things that we can't do, that we did, and it cost us in that situation."

On Kaden Anderson's play:

"Number one is the fact that that's a really good group that you're throwing against, too. He looked very comfortable a week ago, right? Well, he wasn't playing against the same people in that regard. But he's got to be better. He's got to be a lot better. There were some mistakes, particularly in the first half, and that's part of quarterbacking. He's going to have to learn from that and minimize those. That's a piece and a part of it. Look, Landon [Sims] will be out, so there's not like, you know, put Sims in, because he's now going to be out for the season."

On the defense's effort:

"Until that last possession with the [Lucky Sutton] touchdown run, I thought defensively, we did what we needed to do to win the game, and to give us a chance to win the game. I'm out there telling them, 'Hey, make sure this turns into a field goal. Don't give them a touchdown.' [linebacker] Evan Eller was like, 'We're going to get a takeaway right, and then we got a takeaway. Defensively, I thought that we did what we needed to do to put ourselves in a position to win the game. With the way we were playing in the third and fourth quarters, we gave ourselves enough opportunities to potentially have the ball to kick field goals or get it to a one-score game, and made too many mistakes offensively

#53 Defensive Lineman, Tegen Seeds, Wyoming

On his interception not being returned for a touchdown:

"I wasn't frustrated. I was pretty happy. To get a pick as a defensive tackle, man, that's pretty cool to me. It would have been cool to get a touchdown there, but I got a pick and an offensive ball.

On being from Wyoming and playing on national television:

"It means a lot. I'm a very proud Wyoming kid. I'm blessed. I have a great opportunity every week to go out and make the best of it."

#5 Defensive End, Brayden Wilson, Wyoming

On struggling offensively:

"Football is a team sport. Defense has to do their part. Offense has to do their best. It all works into one. So, overall, they scored 24 points. That's on the defense, that's not on the offense. Defensively, we need to stop them."

On his overall thoughts about the game:

"Honestly, I am disappointed with how we did. I didn't play my best. I need to do more to step up and help our team out. Overall, 24 points, I'm not happy with that. I don't think anyone is, and that's on the defense."
