OFF THE BOUNCE (through the games of December 18)

- San Diego State and the Arizona Wildcats meet Saturday evening at PHX Arena in Phoenix, Ariz., as part of the Naismith Hall of Fame Series.
- The Aztecs and Wildcats are meeting for the 33rd time, with SDSU trailing 7-25 in the series, including a 0-5 record against top 5 ranked U of A teams.
- Saturday's game is the sixth time the Aztecs have faced a No. 1-ranked program and has a 1-4 record in the previous five occasions, including an 81-89 defeat at the hands of No. 1 Arizona on Dec. 7, 2002, and a 71-64 win against No. 1 and 2023 NCAA Tournament top-seed Alabama in that year's Sweet 16.
- Since the start of the 2019-20 season, San Diego State is 32-16 (.667) record in neutral site games ranks No. 8 nationally among those which have played at least 48 neutral site contests.
- SDSU is playing its second of three games in just over five days: an 81-58 win over Air Force (12/17), vs. Arizona (12/20) & vs. Whittier (12/22) at 1 p.m. PT.
- Against Air Force, the Aztecs had a season-high 27 assists on 31 field goals (87.1 percent). It's 27 dimes are the most for an Aztecs team since it recorded 30 against New Mexico on January 15, 2019.
- Since the start of the 1999-00 season, SDSU has recorded 69 games with at least 20 assists (SDSU is 64-5 in those contests). The only other time San Diego State has assisted on more than 80.0 percent of its made buckets in that time frame was on November 22, 2019 vs. LIU when it had 26 assists on 32 baskets (81.3 percent).
- For a program known for its defense, the 2025-26 Aztecs are filling it up on the offensive end of the floor. The team is averaging 81.8 points per game through nine contests. SDSU's best scoring team as a Division I program was its 1970-71 team, its first at the Division I level, which averaged 86.9 points per game. San Diego State, in its Division I history, has had five seasons where it's scored at an 80-plus point per game clip. The program's best scoring year in the Mountain West era was the 2017-18 squad which averaged 77.1 points per game.
- SDSU ranks No. 2 in the nation with 43.0 bench points per game and has totaled at least 40 bench points in each of the last five games and in 6-of-9 games this season.
- San Diego State ranks No. 2 in percentage of bench points vs. total points among the top 10 bench scoring teams in the nation.
- In the last three games, the Aztec bench has scored 60.7 percent of its total points (150-of-247) and **BJ Davis** is responsible for 35.3 percent of those points (53-of-150).
- San Diego State is 1-of-2 programs in the nation with at least six games in which its bench has scored at least 40 points and in which none of those games were against non-Division I opponents. (also: Texas A&M)
- The Aztecs bench totaled 59 points in its 77-66 win over Utah Valley. The 59 bench points are its highest against a Division I opponent since totaling 57 at Air Force (1-22-20) & the most for a Mountain West team, against a Division I opponent, since December 16, 2018.
- San Diego State's 76.6 percent of bench points-to-total points against Utah Valley is the ninth highest in a Division I game since at least the start of the 1996-97 season.

- **BJ Davis** leads the Aztecs in scoring (13.3 ppg) without the benefit of a start. Among those who have played no more than 195 minutes without a start, Davis ranks No. 1 in the nation in points per game off the bench and free throw percentage (.947).
- **Its game against Oregon at the Players Era Festival marked the second time since the start of the 1999-2000 season, that the SDSU was successful on at least 65.0 percent of its field goal attempts against a Division I opponent, bettered only by a 69.6 percent (48-of-69) effort against Campbell on December 12, 2006, in a 119-82 victory. The Aztecs shot over 65.0 percent in each half; 69.0 percent (20-of-29) in the first half and 65.5 percent (19-of-29) in the second half.**
- Against Oregon, **BJ Davis** finished with a career-high 21 points and in five of the team's six games played in last and this year's Players Era Festival. In the event, Davis is averaging a team leading 14.3 points per game.
- **Reese Dixon Waters** led the team in scoring (22 points) vs. Oregon at the Players Era Festival, and his nine field goals are a career high and the most since **Magoon Gwath** had nine vs. San Jose State (1/28/25). **His 69.2 percent shooting (9-of-13) is the best an Aztec has shot on a minimum of 13 attempts since Nick Boyd went 10-of-14 (.714) vs. Boise State (2/15/25).**
- Freshman **Elzie Harrington** earned his first start in his sixth game as an Aztec, which is the fewest games for a freshman to crack the starting line up since Jeremy Hemsley started each of the first 25 games of the 2015-16 season.
- **Elzie Harrington** is the only true freshman in the nation who is shooting at least 73.3 percent from the bonus distance on a minimum of 15 attempts (11-of-15).
- Under **Brian Dutcher**, the Aztecs have held opponents to 60 points or less 120 times and have won 113 of those games (113-7, 94.2 percent). **Overall, Dutcher's Aztecs have held their opponent to 60 or fewer points in 43.6 percent (120-of-275) of the games he has coached. Nationally, only Houston (168), Virginia (151) & Liberty (134) have held opponents to 60 points or less more times than SDSU since the start of 2017-18.**
- **Brian Dutcher** is the only San Diego State head men's basketball coach to accumulate at least 21 wins in each of his first eight seasons and is averaging 24.8 wins per season coming into the 2025-26 campaign.
- **Brian Dutcher** reached the 200-win plateau with a 73-57 victory against Idaho State (11-9-25), becoming the third Aztec head coach with at least 200 wins. The other two are Aztec Hall of Fame inductees **George Ziegenfuss (1949-69)** with 316 wins and **Steve Fisher (2000-17)** with a program record 386.
- San Diego State owns a 161-47 record (77.4 percent) since the start of the 2019-20 campaign, which is the **FOURTH BEST** record in the nation.

ELITE LEADER

Now in his ninth season, head coach Brian Dutcher has led the Aztecs to 204 wins, third most by any SDSU coach in the 105 seasons of basketball on The Mesa.

Since the start of the 2017-18 season, and through the games of December 17, only two first time head coaches who were hired that year, have amassed at least 185 victories:

1. Brian Dutcher, San Diego State (204)

2. Bob Richey, Furman (188)

SDSU trails Gonzaga at 185-31 (85.6 percent), Houston at 193-33 (85.4 percent) and Duke at 170-46 (78.7 percent) and is ahead of the likes of Kansas 164-53 (75.6 percent) and Connecticut 160-53 (75.1 percent).

- **San Diego State owns the SIXTH BEST record in the nation since the start of the 2005-06 campaign, 508-183 (.735), and is 282-39 (.879) in home games in that time frame which is also the SIXTH BEST in the nation.**
- **San Diego State returns 61.9 percent of its minutes from a year ago, according to T-Rank, and those are the second most returning minutes in the nation among teams Torvik ranks in its top 50, behind Purdue (69.7 percent).**

BETTER OFF THE BENCH?

Junior guard **BJ Davis** has played in 52 career games and has averaged 7.9 points, 2.3 rebounds and 1.1 assists while shooting 42.4 percent from the field, 37.3 percent from the bonus distance and 84.3 percent from the line.

- Last season as a starter, his numbers from 1.2 points, 0.4 rebounds and 0.1 assists as a freshman to 9.0 points, 3.0 rebounds and 1.2 assists on 42.2 percent (97-of-229) shooting from the floor, 35.9 percent (42-of-117) from beyond the arc and 78.2 (43-of-55) percent from the charity stripe in 23.9 minutes per game.
- So far this season, in nine games and an average of 21.3 minutes per game as a reserve, he is averaging a team leading 13.3 points, 2.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists on 47.2 percent (34-of-72) shooting, 53.3 percent (16-of-30) from distance and 94.7 percent (36-of-38) from the line.
- **Among players who haven't had a start this season and have played no more than 195 minutes, Davis ranks No. 1 in the nation with 13.3 points per game off the bench and free throw percentage, 94.7 percent.**

THEY'RE COMING IN WAVES

San Diego State has one of the most elite benches in Division I basketball as evidenced by it scoring 59 of the team's 77 points in its victory over Utah Valley.

- **Through the games of December 17, San Diego State is the No. 2 team in the nation averaging 43.0 bench points per game.**
- San Diego State's 59 bench points vs. Utah Valley is its most against a Division I opponent since totaling 57 at Air Force (1-22-20) & the most for a Mountain West team, against a Division I opponent, since December 16, 2018, when New Mexico scored 60 against Central Arkansas.
- San Diego State's 76.6 percent (59-of-77) of bench points-to-total points are its highest in a game since at least 1996-97...bettering its 58.2 percent (57-of-98) of its bench points-to-total points at Air Force (1-22-20).
- **San Diego State's 76.6 percent of bench points-to-total points against Utah Valley is the ninth highest in a Division I game since at least the start of the 1996-97 season.**
- Since the start of the 1996-97 season...
 - San Diego State has totaled at least 40 or more bench points 38 times.
 - San Diego State has totaled at least 50 or more bench points 7 times.
 - San Diego State has totaled at least 60 points one time, vs. St. Katherine's (12-27-13).
- **The Air Force contest marked the sixth time in nine games this season that San Diego State totaled at least 40 bench points, and it was the fifth game in a row the team has totaled 40+ bench points.**

ROAD (AND NEUTRAL) WARRIORS

Through the games of December 17, here are some road and neutral site facts about San Diego State:

- **Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State is 74-39 (.655) in neutral site games which is the 10th best in the nation.**
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 187-110 (.630) record in road/neutral games is the 6th best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 113-71 (.614) record in true road games is the 9th best in the nation.
- Since the start of the 2009-10 season, San Diego State's 82-55 (.599) record in regular season road games against the Mountain West, leads the conference.
- **In the last two regular seasons, the Aztecs are 4-3 in neutral site games and had wins over No. 2 Houston, No. 21 Creighton and Oregon at the last two Players Era Festivals as well as a 71-50 pounding of California at the San Jose Tip-Off. Its neutral site losses came against No. 23 Oregon at the 2024 Players Era Festival and No. 7 Michigan and Baylor at this year's Players Era Festival.**

MOUNTAIN WEST CENTURY CLUB

With the Aztecs 63-61 win over Wyoming on February 1, 2025...

- **Brian Dutcher** became the fourth head coach in Mountain West history to reach the 100-victory plateau in league games.
- Dutcher (107 wins) joins Steve Fisher (168), Leon Rice (158) and Steve Alford (129) as the only head coaches with at least 100 Mountain West wins.
- Dutcher is the fastest coach in league history to reach 100 victories ... Dutcher - 135 games (100-35), Alford - 151 games (100-51), Rice - 173 games (100-73) and Fisher - 190 games (100-90).

SAN DIEGO STATE IS....

- 114-15 under Brian Dutcher and 230-30 in its last 260 **games played at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena**.
- 180-9 under Brian Dutcher, 243-27 in its last 270 games and 177-9 in its last 186 home games **when it takes a lead into the intermission**.
- 179-12 under Brian Dutcher, has won 24 straight, and is 435-16 in its last 451 games **when leading with five minutes to play**.
- 146-18 under Brian Dutcher, 177-25 in its last 202 games and 287-44 in its last 331 games **in which it outrebounds its opponent**.
- 139-39 under Brian Dutcher and 263-60 since the start of 2010-11 in games **in which its bench outscoring its opponent's bench**.
- 129-10 under Brian Dutcher, 100-5 in its last 105 and 267-35 in its last 302 games **in which it has attempted more free throws than its opponent**.
- 102-7 under Brian Dutcher, has won 36 straight, 114-4 in its last 118 games, and 189-8 in its last 197 home games **in which it holds its opponent to less than 60 points**.

HOME COOKING

- In the last 103 home games, San Diego State is 92-11, with an average scoring margin of +14.2 points in those victories. In 69 of those 92 home wins (.750), the game was decided in the Aztecs' favor by at least nine points.

- San Diego State is 140-23 (.859) in its 163 home games dating back to the start of the 2015-16 season.
- A 21-game non-conference home court win streak, the second longest in program history, trailing only a 27-game win streak which ran from November 22, 2008, to November 30, 2011, was snapped by Gonzaga, 80-67 on Nov. 18, 2024.
- The Aztecs are 64-8 (.889) in their 72 Mountain West Conference home games since January 24, 2018.
- San Diego State has never had an undefeated home season as a Division I program. The last time the Aztecs made it through the home portion of the schedule unscathed was 1966-67. That season, San Diego State went 16-0 at home en route to a 24-5 record. In the Division I era, SDSU has completed the home portion of its schedule with a single loss on 10 occasions (1977-78, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2012-13, 2013-14, 2014-15, 2019-20, 2021-22, 2022-23 and 2023-24).

DEPTH IS ALWAYS A GOOD THING

San Diego State's rotation this year is a solid 11-men deep, each averaging over 10 minutes per game, and 10 players playing more than 15 minutes a game.

- At the post position, **Miles Heide** and **Pharaoh Compton** are averaging a combined 12.9 points and 8.9 rebounds on 68.1 percent (49-of-72) shooting with 1.8 assists, 1.4 blocks and 1.2 steals in an average of 34.0 minutes per game.
- At forward, **Magoon Gwath**, **Jeremiah Oden**, and **Tae Simmons** are averaging a combined 20.9 points and grabbing 10.1 boards on 55.2 percent (58-of-105) shooting from the field with 1.9 steals and 2.0 blocks.
- At wing, **Miles Byrd**, **Reese Dixon-Waters**, and **BJ Davis** are averaging a combined 34.0 points and pulling down 9.1 rebounds on 42.6 percent (98-of-230) shooting from the floor, including 39.1 percent (43-of-110) from the bonus distance and 87.5 percent (56-of-64) from the line with 6.5 assists, 4.1 steals and 1.0 blocks.
- At the point, **Elzie Harrington**, **Sean Newman Jr.**, and **Taj DeGourville** are averaging a combined 17.2 points and 8.2 assists, with 4.6 rebounds, and 1.5 steals and a 6.0:1 assist-to-turnover ratio.

STREAKS ON THE LINE FOR THE AZTECS ON SATURDAY

When the Aztecs play Arizona on Saturday here are the streaks that are on the line for San Diego State:

- 45-game win streak when holding its opponent to 30 percent or less shooting.
- 36-game win streak in contests in which SDSU has limited its opponent to fewer than 60 points.
- 29-game win streak when scoring between 90-99 points.
- 24-game win streak when leading the five minutes to play.
- 12-game win streak when holding opponents to less than 50 points.
- 9-game win streak when shooting better than 50 percent.
- 6-game win streak when committing fewer turnovers than their opponent.
- 6-game win streak when taking a lead into the intermission.

HOW WE WIN? ... DEFENSE

- At the end of the regular season last year, the Aztecs were No. 1 in block percentage, No. 6 in effective field goal percentage defense, No. 8 in 2-point percentage defense, No. 13 in adjusted defensive efficiency and No. 19 in 3-point percentage defense. With the 2025-26 season underway, San Diego State is continuing to trend as one of the nation's best in defense.
- San Diego State has won 123 of its last 132 games (123-9; 93.2 percent) when holding its opponent to less than 60 points.
- San Diego State is 116-10 (92.1 percent) the last 126 times it has outrebounded its opponent.
- San Diego State has won 218 of its last 253 games (218-35; 86.2 percent) when limiting opponents to 30.0 percent or less from 3-point range.
- In its last 470 games in which it has forced at least 10 turnovers, San Diego State has won 369 times (369-101; 78.5 percent).
- San Diego State is 101-27 (78.9 percent) in its last 128 games in which it has blocked at least three shots.
- San Diego State has won 38 of its last 45 games (38-7; 84.4 percent) when it limits its opponent to five or fewer offensive rebounds.
- San Diego State is 102-33 (75.6 percent) in its last 135 games in which it has at least five steals.

CONTINUITY AND CULTURE

One of the hallmarks of San Diego State men's basketball is continuity and culture...

- San Diego State head coach Brian Dutcher has been on the Aztec bench for the last 27 years.
- Dutcher, now in his ninth season leading the program, has compiled the best record (204-71, .742) among Mountain West programs since his ascension to the top job.

- Dutcher spent his first 18 years at SDSU working as Hall of Fame head coach Steve Fisher's top assistant. Coach Fisher compiled the best record in the Mountain West during his tenure (386-209, .649).
- Since the start of the NIL/Transfer Portal era (2021), San Diego State has lost just one undergraduate starter and in total five undergraduate players.
- San Diego State has returned 61.9 percent of its minutes from its 2024-25 NCAA Tournament team and, according to Bart Torvik, that is the second highest percentage of minutes returning in the nation, among teams he ranks in the top 50 of T-Rank.**

1,000-POINT MILESTONES

San Diego State has two players who are on the cusp of scoring 1,000-career points.

- Jeremiah Oden** is 53 points from scoring 1,000 for his career (947 career points). If, this season, he scores at his 2025-26 season average (6.7 ppg) he would reach the milestone in eight games.
- Reese Dixon-Waters** is 110 points from the 1,000-point plateau (890 career points). If he matches his 2025-26 season average (11.0 ppg) he would reach the milestone in 10 games.

SENDING THEM BACK FROM WHENCE THEY CAME

Blocking shots, the back line of the defense, are critical to San Diego State's defensive dominance and that continues this season.

- The Aztecs, No. 49 nationally, lead the Mountain West with 4.67 blocks per game, nearly half a block more per game than any other program in the league.
- The Aztecs welcomed the services of **Magoon Gwath** against Troy and has now played in seven contests. The Euless, Texas native's 68 blocks led the Mountain West last season and ranked No. 17 nationally, and his blocks per game (2.62) again led the league and ranked No. 7 nationally.
- Gwath picked up right where he left off last year with 12 rejections in seven games (1.7 per game) to rank No. 1 in the conference and No. 1 nationally, among those who have played no more than seven games. Overall, he ranks No. 2 in the MW in blocks per game.**
- Pharaoh Compton** matched his career best with three blocks vs. Utah Valley and his 1.0 blocks per game ranks No. 4 in the Mountain West.

SERIES HISTORY VS. ARIZONA

- Today's game against Arizona marks 33rd meeting between these programs, with Arizona emerging the victors in each of the last five encounters and 25 of the previous 32.
- The series began on Dec. 28, 1945 with an Aztec win, but SDSU drop the next seven and eight of the next 11 and 12 of the succeeding 13 matchups before San Diego State put together back-to-back victories in 2009 and 2011, before the current four game win streak for the Wildcats.
- Brian Dutcher is facing Arizona, as a member of the Aztec coaching staff, for the 12th time in his 27 seasons on The Mesa, with 10 of them while the Wildcats were nationally ranked.
- The game will mark the sixth time the programs have met while the Wildcats have been a top 5 ranked team. SDSU is 0-5 in those games.
- All-time series meetings against Arizona can be found in the column on page four.

LAHINA, Maui - Courtney Ramey and Kerr Kriisa scored 21 points apiece and No. 14 Arizona pulled away in the second half to beat 17th-ranked San Diego State 87-70 on Tuesday night in the semifinals of the Maui Invitational.

Arizona (5-0) will play No. 10 Creighton in Wednesday's championship game. San Diego State will take on No. 9 Arkansas in the consolation finals.

Azuola Tubelis had all 14 of his points in the first half and Ramey scored 12 for Arizona. A twisting layup by Tubelis on an alley-oop pass gave the Wildcats a 31-15 lead at 5:06 before intermission. Darrion Trammell hit a 3-pointer for San Diego State and turned two steals into layups to help the Aztecs close out the half on an 18-6 run to get within 37-33.

Keshad Johnson had two put back baskets and a three-point play dunk and San Diego State used a 9-3 spurt to grab a 42-40 lead just 2:40 into the second half. It was the Aztecs first and only lead of the game.

Pelle Larsson sank a 3-pointer, Trammell missed a 3 and Oumar Ballo followed with a three-point play to put Arizona up 46-42. The Wildcats upped their lead to 10 on a Ballo free throw with 11:43 remaining and pushed it to 71-56 on a Cedric Henderson jumper with 6:58 left to play.

Ramey, a graduate transfer from the University of Texas, hit all five of his 3-point shots in his second game with Arizona. Kerr added five assists. Ballo finished with 12 points and nine rebounds before fouling out. Henderson scored 10.

Trammell topped San Diego State with 21 points. Micah Parrish scored 10.

Arizona, which came in leading the nation shooting 62.9% from the floor, shot 58.6% against the Aztecs and made 9 of 20 from beyond the arc. SDSU shot 38% overall and made only 3 of 19 from distance.

ON TO A THIRD CENTURY OF WINS

- With the Aztecs' 73-57 victory over Idaho State, **Brian Dutcher** earned the 200th win of his career, all at San Diego State.
- Dutcher got to the 200-win milestone in 268 games (200-68), reaching the mark quicker than any head men's basketball coach in San Diego State history.**
- Before Dutcher, the only head coaches who had earned at least 200 victories from the Aztec bench were San Diego State Hall of Fame inductees Steve Fisher and George Ziegenfuss, who picked up their 200th win in their 349th and 357th games, respectively.
- Dutcher, now with 204 victories, and his father Jim, who was a head coach at both Eastern Michigan and Minnesota for a combined 17 seasons and won 312 games and have 516 combined victories.**
- Some of the top father/son combined win totals entering the week of December 8 include Homer, Scott and Bryce Drew (1,152), Eddie and Scott Sutton (1,134), Rick and Richard Pitino (1,124), Ray and Joey Meyer (955), John and John Thompson Jr. (942), Gene and Murray

Bartow (829), Dick and Tony Bennett (750).

IN DUTCH WE TRUST

Brian Dutcher is in his 27th season on The Mesa, 18 of them as the top man on San Diego State Hall of Fame Head Coach Steve Fisher's bench. In that time, he's experienced 590 victories, 16 Mountain West titles and helped the Aztecs to 19 postseason tournaments, including 14 NCAA appearances, four of Sweet 16 berths (2011, 2014, 2023 & 2024) and in 2023 guided the team past the Sweet 16, to the Elite 8, Final Four and national championship game.

- Since his ascension to the top job, prior to the 2017-18 season, he has captured six Mountain West crowns and guided his team to the championship game in the league tournament seven of his first eight years.
- In his inaugural campaign, in 2017-18, he was the only first-year Division I head coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament.
- He is the only head coach in program history to win at least 21 games in each of his first eight seasons and is averaging 24.8 wins per year.
- His 198 wins entering this season are a program record for victories in a coach's first eight campaigns.
- His 204 wins are No. 3 on the program's head coaching wins list.
- His 204 wins to date are 16 more than any head coach who started at his current institution at the start of the 2017-18 season.
- His 107 Mountain West wins rank No. 4 on the league's all-time win list.
- His .736-win percentage in Mountain West games is the highest in league history (min. 100 games).

SCHEDULING UP

San Diego State has never been afraid of playing anyone, anywhere, and it's borne out by the Kenpom rating of its non-conference schedule in the last five years.

- Nationally, San Diego State has played the No. 6, 11 and 17 ranked non-conference schedule in each of the last three seasons.
- In the last five campaigns, the Aztecs' non-conference schedule has been ranked in the top 35 four times, with the outlier a No. 93 rated schedule in 2022.
- In 2025-26, the Aztecs played at the time No. 7/6 Michigan and both Oregon & Baylor, which were receiving votes in the AP and Coaches Poll, at the Players Era Festival in Las Vegas and now faces No. 1/2 Arizona at the Naismith Hall of Fame Series in Phoenix.
- In the last five-plus seasons, since the start of the 2020-21 campaign, San Diego State has played 19 games against top 25 competition and has an 11-8 record in those games, including a 63-60 overtime win against No. 6 Houston at the 2024 Players Era Festival.

AZTEC BLOCK PARTY

With defense the calling card of San Diego State basketball, the 2024-25 Aztecs were dealing in the category of shot rejections.

- San Diego State ranked No. 8 in the nation in blocks per game per (5.5) last year and has swatted 42 (4.7/g) in the team's first nine-contests.
- In 31 games in 2024-25, 59.8 percent (101-of-169) of the Aztecs blocks came from its freshmen (**Pharaoh Compton, Taj DeGourville & Magoon Gwath**)
- The Aztecs had a game with 10 blocks, four with 9 blocks, five with 8 block contests, two with 7, two with six, and five with 5 blocks, recorded multiple blocks in 25-of-31 games last year, and was shut out of a block just twice.
- **Magoon Gwath**, a redshirt freshman and despite not playing in five of the last six games, ranked No. 6 in the nation in blocks per game (2.62) and No. 17 in total blocked shots (68).
- So far in 2025-26, San Diego State has blocked at least four shots in 7-of-9 contests and had recorded multiple blocks in every game played, averaging 4.67 blocks per game, which leads the Mountain West and is No. 49 nationally.

WELCOME BACK...DIXON-WATERS & GWATH

San Diego State opened the 2025-26 campaign without two critical pieces, but in its last five games, those pieces, senior **Reese Dixon-Waters** and sophomore **Magoon Gwath**, have returned.

When Dixon-Waters took the floor against Idaho State it had been 591 days since he played in a game.

- Before the Idaho State game, the last contest he played in was versus Connecticut in the Sweet 16 at the 2024 NCAA Tournament at Boston's TD Garden.
- In his 45 games played as an Aztec, the team is 31-14 and Dixon-Waters is averaging 9.8 points on 40.2 percent shooting from the field, including 33.9 percent from long range and is knocking down free throws at an 88.1 percent clip.
- Dixon-Waters is one of five active players who have shot at least 88.1 percent from the line on a minimum of 80 attempts since 2023-24.
- In eight games this season, Dixon-Waters is averaging 11.0 points (33-of-82 FG, .402), 2.8 rebounds & 1.9 assists.

When Gwath checked into the game against Troy, it was just the second game he's played since February 22 when a knee injury and subsequent surgery sidelined him.

- In 33 career games, Gwath has compiled 80 blocks (2.42/game, which ranks No. 10 nationally among active players).
- Against Troy he had 20 points (5-5 FG, 2-2 3FG, 7 rebounds, 3 blocks, 2 steals) becoming just the third Aztec since at least the 1996-97 season to record at least 20 points without missing a field goal (also Aerick Sanders vs. Eastern Washington on Dec. 20, 2003 and Billy White on Feb. 14, 2009 vs. Wyoming)
- He blocked three shots in his 2025-26 debut & four vs. Oregon (11/25); and has recorded multiple blocks 22 times of his career (SDSU is 16-6 in those games).
- In the Troy game, Gwath knocked down multiple three-pointers in a game for the sixth time in his career.

DEFINITION OF A RIM PROTECTOR ... LOOK NO FURTHER THAN MAGOON GWATH

In sophomore forward **Magoon Gwath**, San Diego State has one of the nation's top rim protectors.

- After playing seven games this season after sustaining a knee injury on February 22, Gwath has totaled 12 blocks, including a season-high four against Oregon at the Players Era Festival.
- Despite missing five games last season, Gwath ranked No. 6 in the nation in blocks per game (2.62) and No. 17 in blocked shots (68).
- Gwath was rated No. 4 in the nation in block percentage per Kenpom and ranked No. 1 in the Mountain West.
- Since the start of the 2024-25 season, his 80 blocks rank No. 18 among active players, but Gwath has played 7 FEWER games than any player ahead of him on the list and his 2.42 blocks per game rank No. 5 among active players with a minimum of 30 games played.
- He has recorded multiple blocks in 22-of-33 (.667) career games and has at least one block in 29-of-33 games (.879).
- His 6 blocks against Boise State equal the most in a game in the Brian Dutcher era (since 2017-18), matching Nathan Mensah, who sent 6 back against Saint Mary's on December 22, 2020. Gwath also had 5 block games against No. 3 Gonzaga, Oregon, and No. 6 Houston.

- Against Occidental (11-12-24) Gwath became just the second Aztec to record at least 15 points, 4 blocks and 2 three-pointers in the same game since the 1999-00 season.
- Gwath passed Skylar Spencer's freshman program record (51 blocks in 34 games) in his 21st college contest.
- With 68 blocks last year, Gwath is in seventh place on the program's single season blocks list, and with 80 total blocks for his career, he is No. 11 on the program's all-time blocks list.
- His 80 blocks through his first 33 games are a San Diego State record to start a career.

FILLING IT UP VS. OREGON

In San Diego State's 97-80 win over Oregon at the Players Era Festival, it shot 67.2 percent (39-of-58) from the floor...

- It was the second time since the start of the 1999-00 season, that the team was successful on at least 65.0 percent of its field goal attempts against a Division I opponent, bettered only by a 69.6 percent (48-of-69) night against Campbell on December 12, 2006, in a 119-82 victory.
- It marked the 19th time in the Aztecs' Mountain West era that the team shot at least 60.0 percent in a game against a Division I opponent. (SDSU is 19-0 in those contests)
- It was the 8th time, in that timeframe, that SDSU shot at least 60.0 percent in a non-conference game and the first since San Diego State sank 60.4 percent (29-of-48) of its shots against Wisconsin-Green Bay in a 79-70 win on November 20, 2010.
- The Aztecs are 13-0 against Mountain West teams, with six of those games coming on the road, when they shoot at least 59.0 percent and have reached or exceeded the shooting percentage three times against Air Force and Colorado State and twice against Wyoming.
- The Aztecs shot over 65.0 percent in each half; 69.0 percent (20-of-29) in the first half and 65.5 percent (19-of-29) in the second half.
- SDSU's first half shooting percentage (69.0 percent) is its best in a first half against a non-conference, Division I opponent since the start of the Mountain West era; topping its 62.5 percent (15-of-24) first half vs. Pittsburgh on November 25, 2014 in the semifinal game at the Maui Invitational.
- Its 65.5 percent shooting second half is its best against a non-conference, Division I opponent since it hit 65.4 percent (17-of-26) against Cal State Fullerton on November 7, 2022.
- Before its game against Oregon, San Diego State had never shot at least 65.0 percent in both halves of game since at least the start of the 1999-00 season.

THE ELITE OF THE ELITE DEFENSE

Known for one of the stanchest defenses since former head coach Steve Fisher arrived on The Mesa prior to the 1999-00 season, current Aztecs' head coach Brian Dutcher has kept the stifling defense as the calling card of his program as well.

- San Diego State has ranked in the top 25 of KenPom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency in each of the last five seasons: No. 10 in 2019-20, No. 21 in 2020-21, No. 2 in 2021-22, No. 4 in 2022-23, No. 11 in 2023-24 and No. 13 in 2024-25.
- San Diego State is one of three programs in the nation who have been in the top 25 in Kenpom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency ranking in each of the last six campaigns. The other two are Houston and Kansas.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament 11 of the last 13 seasons in which a national championship has been crowned, and has an NIT national semifinal appearance during that span as well. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2005-06 campaign, San Diego State has the sixth-highest winning percentage in the country (.736), and has amassed a 283-39 home record, winning 87.9 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2025-26 campaign underway, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on:

- In its last 271 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 240-31 mark (88.6 percent), including a 133-16 record (89.3 percent) in its last 149 home games against non-conference competition.
- Since the start of the 2002-03 season, San Diego State has a 163-33 (83.2 percent) home record against conference opponents.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 185-26 (87.7 percent) at home, including a 81-11 (88.0 percent) record in non-conference home contests during that stretch and 78-8 (90.7 percent) against non-top 25 non-conference foes.
- SDSU is 103-14 (88.0 percent) in their last 117 MW home games and 110-12 (90.2 percent) in their last 122 non-conference home games.

JUST MORE GOOD STUFF

- Against Air Force, **BJ Davis** scored in double-figures (19 points) for a seventh consecutive game, extending the longest streak of his career, with a career-high six assists in 26 minutes off the bench. He's averaging 16.3 points per game over the seven-game stretch, with shooting splits of 50.8 FG pct. (31-for-61), 54.2 3PFG pct. (13-for-24) and 94.7 FT pct. (36-for-38).
- The Aztec starting forwards of **Miles Heide** and **Magoon Gwath** combined for 24 points (10-for-14 FGs), 12 rebounds and 3 blocks in just under 43 minutes against Air Force. Including **Pharaoh Compton**, those numbers improve to 35 points (15-for-19 FGs), 14 rebounds and 4 blocks in 60 minutes.
- In making his season debut and going 5-of-5 vs. Troy, **Magoon Gwath** became just the third Aztec since at least the 1996-97 season to record at least 20 points without missing a field goal (also Aerick Sanders vs. Eastern Washington on Dec. 20, 2003, and Billy White on Feb. 14, 2009, vs. Wyoming).
- Freshman **Tae Simmons** scored a career-high 15 points versus Utah Valley and matched a career best with seven rebounds. Simmons had 11 points and four rebounds combined over his previous five games (2.2 PPG, 0.8 RPG).
- **Pharaoh Compton** had 12 points against Utah Valley after combining for 12 over his last three games, while logging a career-high 22 minutes, and matching career bests with three blocks and two steals.
- **BJ Davis** scored a career-high 21 points against Oregon, reaching double figures for the fourth time in the Aztecs five games at the Players Era Festival (14.6 ppg). He was 6-of-7 from the field, including 3-of-4 from distance and 6-of-7 from the line.
- **Reese Dixon-Waters** led the team in scoring versus Oregon, and his nine field goals are a career high and the most since Magoon Gwath had nine vs. San Jose State (1/28/25). His 69.2 percent shooting is the best an Aztec has shot on a minimum of 13 attempts since Nick Boyd went 10-of-14 (.714) vs. Boise State (2/15/25).
- **Pharaoh Compton** scored career-high 14 points on 7-of-7 shooting in just 11:04 of time on the floor against Idaho State. Compton is the second Aztec under Brian Dutcher to have a game with a perfect field goal percentage on a minimum of 7 attempts (also: Magoon Gwath vs. Nevada on Jan. 25, 2025) and the sixth in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era.
- **Miles Byrd**, versus Idaho State, is the first Aztec since at least the start of the 1996-97 season to have a game with 6 assists and 6 steals against a Division I opponent.
- With the team's win over Long Beach State in the season opener, San Diego State has won 19 straight season openers against unranked

teams, a streak dating back to the 2005-06 season. SDSU's last loss to an unranked opponent on opening night came on November 19, 2004, in an 80-72 overtime defeat at the hands of UC Santa Barbara.

- Overall, San Diego State has won 13 straight season openers and 20 of its last 21 to begin a campaign. The lone blemish during the stretch came at the start of the 2012-13 season when SDSU fell to No. 9/9 Syracuse on the USS Midway. Taking into account that the Syracuse game was played outdoors on the flight deck of the USS Midway, the Aztecs have come out victorious in its last 20 season openers played indoors.
- Junior guard **Miles Byrd** is one of two players nationally who have scored at least 13 points on 50.0 percent shooting with at least three 3-pointers, eight rebounds, 3 assists, an assist and a block in a game this year. Byrd compiled those stats in the Aztecs season opener against Long Beach State.
- With defense as its calling card, San Diego State has been a menace to opposing offenses. Since the start of the Fisher/Dutcher era, the 1999-00 season, SDSU has held its opponent to 40.0 percent or less from the field 390 times in 869 games (44.9 percent), recording 341 wins in those 390 games (87.4 percent). **Under Brian Dutcher, since the start of the 2017-18 campaign, the Scarlet and Black has played 273 games and has limited the opponent to 40.0 percent shooting or less 140 times (140-of-273; 51.3 percent) and won 126 of those games (126-14; 90.0 percent).**
- San Diego State, one of the most dominant defensive teams in the nation, has ranked in the top 20 in Kenpom's Adjusted Defensive Efficiency in 10 of the last 15 years, in the top 10 in seven of the last 15 campaigns, and finished last season at No. 16 in that ranking.
- Since the start of the 2020-21 season, San Diego State is 82-12 (87.2 percent) in games in which they score at least 10 straight points.

AZTECS UNANIMOUS PICK TO FINISH FIRST IN MOUNTAIN WEST PRESEASON MEDIA POLL

San Diego State has won an unprecedented 16 Mountain West titles in men's basketball (nine regular season & seven tournament), and in a poll of media members who regularly cover the league, San Diego State was the unanimous selection to win the conference in its final year as a member.

- San Diego State is just the third program since the inception of the Mountain West (1999-00) to be selected as the unanimous choice to win the league in its preseason poll (also: Utah in 1999-00 and Utah State in 2019-20).**
- It is the 11th time overall, including the fourth time in the last six seasons, the Aztecs have been predicted to win the league.
- In nine of the last 10 times SDSU was predicted to win the league, the team advanced to the postseason (seven NCAA and two NIT appearances).
- SDSU has been predicted to finish either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in 10 of the last 11 years.
- It is the 16th time in the 27 seasons the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the preseason poll. Additionally, those 16 times have occurred in the last 21 years.

THE PRESEASON HAUL

Junior **Miles Byrd** and freshman **Elzie Harrington**, both guards, have been tabbed the Preseason Player of the Year and Preseason Freshman of the Year, respectively. Senior guard **Reese Dixon-Waters** and sophomore forward **Magoon Gwath**, along with Byrd earned inclusion on the 10-player Preseason All-Mountain West Team.

- Miles Byrd** is the second Aztec to be named Preseason Player of the Year in the Mountain West, joining Jamaal Franklin (2012-13).
- Last season, Byrd garnered second-team National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-Pacific Division and second-team All-Mountain West designation, as well as inclusion on the Mountain West All-Defensive Team and the inaugural Players Era Festival All-Tournament Team.
- Reese Dixon-Waters**, who sat out last season with a foot injury, but was a Preseason All-Mountain West selection in 2024-25, returns to the list this year. He was also previously, in 2023-24, named the Mountain West Preseason Newcomer of the Year, the 10th Aztec to earn that moniker.
- Magoon Gwath** is the reigning Mountain West Freshman and Defensive Player of the Year, joining former Utah State post Neemias Queta (2018-19) as the only players in league history to garner both awards in the same season.
- In addition, Gwath was honorable mention All-Mountain West, a Mountain West All-Defensive Team selection, and his three league Freshman of the Week honors are the most by an Aztec in a season, since the distinction was instituted by the league for the 2021-22 season.
- Elzie Harrington** is the fourth Aztec to be named Preseason Freshman of the Year and the second in as many seasons. He joins Pharaoh Compton, who earned the distinction last year, and Jalen McDaniels (2016-17) and Kawhi Leonard (2009-10).

THE FUTURE IS NOW...SEEMS TO BE A MULTI-YEAR THEME

Aztec freshmen are usually very well acquainted with the bench and limited minutes, but last year's three frosh: **Pharaoh Compton**, **Tai DeGourville** and **Magoon Gwath** broke that mold and it appears that **Elzie Harrington** and **Tae Simmons** are going to keep that trend going.

Harrington & Simmons in 2025-26

- The pair each scored in double figures in the season opener, 13 and 10 points, respectively, becoming the first Aztecs freshmen to reach double digits in a season opener since Jeremy Hemsley to open the 2015-16 campaign.**
- Harrington earned his first start in the sixth game of his college career, becoming the first Aztec to earn a start that early in his true freshman season, since Jeremy Hemsley started the first 25 games of the 2015-16 season.
- Harrington is the only true freshman in the nation who is shooting at least 73.3 percent from the bonus distance on a minimum of 15 shot attempts.**
- Harrington led the team with six assists in the conference opener vs. Air Force.
- Among MW freshman who have attempted at least 55 shots, Harrington's 52.7 percent field goal shooting ranks No. 4 and he leads the league's freshmen with his 73.3 three-point percentage.
- Simmons is 1-of-10, 6-6 or shorter, true freshmen who has come off the bench against a Division I opponent this year and grabbed at least seven rebounds in multiple games and the only one who has shot at least 67.0 percent from the field in those games.
- Simmons' 65.0 percent shooting ranks No. 2 among Mountain West freshman, on a minimum of 20 shot attempts, and his 1.25 blocks per 40 minutes played ranks No. 6 among MW frosh.
- Simmons is 1-of-9 freshman in the MW with double digit offensive boards and the only one with at least as many offensive as defensive boards (10 ORebs & 10 DRebs).

Compton, DeGourville & Gwath in 2024-25

- The threesome made up half of the top six on the Mountain West's freshman scoring list (Gwath No. 2, Compton No. 5, DeGourville No. 6).
- With a minimum of two field goal attempts per game, Compton's 65.1 percent shooting percentage led MW freshmen.
- Gwath, who stands 7-0, had 16 three-pointers which was No. 8 among MW frosh and No. 5 in three-point field goal percentage (.372) among players who had at least 10 makes from the bonus distance.

- Among the team's points, it got 24.7 percent of its production from its three freshmen (541-of-2,194).
- Each of the three won multiple Freshman of the Week honors from the Mountain West.

- Matched a single-game high in a season opener with 15 points (also: Cal State Fullerton, 11-6-23) and set a personal best with six boards vs. Idaho State (11-9-25).
- Has scored in double figures in 22-of-45 in his Aztec career.
- Recorded his first collegiate double double with 11 points & 12 rebounds vs. UC Irvine (12-9-23).
- Each of Waters' 12 boards vs. UC Irvine came on the defensive glass and he joined Trey Kell (March 1, 2017, vs. Air Force) as the only Aztecs in the Dutcher/Fisher era to have a game of at least 12 rebounds without at least one coming on the offensive glass.

- When he shoots at least 40.0 percent, SDSU is 14-4.
- Has knocked down multiple 3-pointers in 29 college games and his team is 22-7 when he does, including 12-4 as an Aztec.
- When he records at least two assists in a game, his team is 24-8, including 14-5 in his Aztec career.
- In his first 45 career games, averaged 4.0 points, 1.6 rebounds & 0.4 assists vs. the last 72 games in which those numbers have gone up to 9.8 points, 3.4 rebounds & 1.3 assists.

- Is one of three players in the Mountain West this season with a game of a league-leading six steals.
- With six assists and six steals against Idaho State, he became the first Aztec since at least the 1996-97 season to have those stats in a game against a Division I opponent and is the eighth player in Mountain West history to compile them in a contest.
- **The only player in the nation who shot a minimum of .381 from the field, .301 from distance, .83.2 from the line with at least 82 assists, 64 steals and 32 blocks in 2024-25.**
- Received a medical redshirt for his freshman campaign (2022-23) in which he appeared in four games.
- At UNLV (3-4-25), he became the first player in Mountain West history, and third player in the nation since at least the start of the 1996-97

- Along with Tae Simmons is the first Aztec freshman, who in the season opener, scored in double figures since Jeremy Hemsley did against Illinois State on November 13, 2015.
- On a minimum of two attempts, is the only player in the MW with multiple games of perfect 3-point shooting. (3-of-3 vs. Baylor & 2-of-2 vs. Oregon and Long Beach State)
- Has led the team in scoring and assists twice each.

- His 13 rebounds at Nevada (1-25-25) are the most by an Aztec freshman since Jalen McDaniels grabbed as many against Air Force (2-3-18).
- Gwath was 7-of-7 from the field, including 1-of-1 from beyond the arc, for game-high 15 points and career and game-high 13 rebounds at Nevada (1-25-25). SAN DIEGO — San Diego State began Mountain West play, welcoming the Air Force Falcons to Steve Fisher Court for the first conference showdown of the season. The Aztecs would pull away in the second half to end the night with a convincing 81-58 victory that extends their winning streak to three games.

The first half of play was a tightly contested affair with the Aztecs taking a 33-30 lead into the break. The Aztecs controlled the interior early, leaning on the play of Magoon Gwath, Miles Heide and Pharaoh Compton. The trio would combine for 18 points and eight rebounds while shooting 8-10 from the floor. As a team, San Diego State created separation from the Falcons midway through the half thanks to an 11-0 run capped off with a Miles Byrd midrange jump shot.

The start of the second half saw the two teams exchange baskets before the Aztecs put together a 10-3 run with 15 minutes on the clock giving San Diego State an 11-point lead that would eventually balloon to over 20 points.

Super sixth-man BJ Davis exploded in the second half after a quiet 11 minutes in the first. Davis scored 17 points, was a perfect 4-4 from three and handed out four assists without committing a turnover. As a team, San Diego State was firing on all cylinders, finishing the second half with a scorching 68.0 percent field goal percentage while also hitting seven threes to the tune of 58.3 percent from behind the arc.

The Aztec defense shined by limiting Air Force to just 41.3 percent shooting from the floor, including 33.3 percent shooting from three-point territory. San Diego State also won the rebounding battle decisively by a margin of 35-to-26. Their 13 offensive rebounds led directly to 16 second chance points. Davis finished with a game-high 19 points, and his six assists were tied with Elzie Harrington for the game high as well. Miles Heide has continued to be a force on the glass with eight more rebounds leading all players; this marks the fourth time this year he has been the Aztec's leading rebounder.

WHAT HAPPENS IN LAS VEGAS...IS USUALLY PRETTY GOOD FOR SAN DIEGO STATE

- In five regular-season MTEs in Las Vegas, San Diego State has three tournament titles (2010 Las Vegas Holiday Hoops Classic, 2019 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational & 2023 Continental Tire Main Event), was the runner up at the 2015 Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational and finished third at the inaugural 2024 Players Era Festival.
- San Diego State is 37-14 in its last 51 games in Las Vegas, regardless of facility & 19-7 in its last 26 games at Thomas & Mack.
- In going 10-4 in its Las Vegas MTEs, the Aztecs are 4-2 vs. ranked opponents with wins against No. 6/7 Houston & No. 21/19 Creighton last year and No. 14/13 California & No. rv/22 West Virginia in 2015.
- San Diego State's 47 victories at Thomas & Mack Center since the start of the 2008-09 campaign (28 neutral and 19 road wins) are the most by any team in any building in which it has not played at least one home game. Gonzaga is second with 37 victories at Orleans Arena.
- San Diego State is 39-12 in its last 51 games at UNLV's Thomas & Mack Center. Since March 5, 2014, San Diego State is 14-3 against the Rebels in TMC, while the rest of the country is 57-122 in the facility.
- Since the start of the 2008-09 season, no Division I team has won more road games against a single opponent than San Diego State's 19 victories over UNLV at Thomas & Mack Center. Saint Mary's (at Loyola Marymount) and Gonzaga (at Pepperdine) are second with 16 wins.





Brian Dutcher enters his ninth season as San Diego State head men's basketball coach and is coming two Sweet 16 appearances in the last three seasons and a run to the program's first national championship game appearance in the 2023 NCAA Tournament. He is building on the previous eight years in which he led the Aztecs to seven title games in Mountain West tournament, its conference-record 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th & 16th Mountain West crowns, and to a bid to the NCAA tournament in six of the seven years in which a champion was crowned. He is the only coach in the 104-year history of San Diego State men's basketball to win at least 20 games in each of his first eight seasons. His 198 victories in eight seasons (198-68) are the most for any Division I head coach whose first year guiding his current program was 2017-18 and the accompanying win percentage, 74.4 percent, is the highest for any head basketball coach in San Diego State history.

Dutcher has been recognized twice, following the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons, with Mountain West Coach of the Year honors and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I District 17 Coach of the Year in both those years as well. In addition, he earned USA Today National Coach of the Year and United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District IX Coach of the Year distinction following the 2019-20 campaign and was one of five finalists for the 2020 Werner Ladd Naismith Men's College Coach of the Year Award.

His teams have faced top 25 ranked opponents on 27 occasions and posted a 16-11 record, which includes wins over No. 1 Alabama, No. 6 Houston, Gonzaga (twice), UCLA and Arizona State as well as Nevada (four times) and Colorado State (twice). From the start of the 2018-19 season to its demise after the 2023-24 campaign, his Aztecs were 8-3 against Pac-12 opponents and 11-6 in multi-team events. Since the start of the 2017-18 season, SDSU has the eighth best home win percentage in the nation (88.6 percent), and in the last six years, San Diego State has posted a 90.1-win percentage (82-9) in Viejas Arena, the seventh best in the nation.

The team's success on the court is reflected in the honors his players have earned. In 2020, Malachi Flynn was a consensus All-American, the third Aztec to earn that honor. The following season Matt Mitchell was recognized by the Associated Press with the All-American moniker and 2024 Jaedon LeDee was named the Karl Malone Award winner for the best power forward in the nation as well as being named an All-American by multiple organizations.

San Diego State put a player on the USBWA's All-District IX first team in 2020 (Flynn) and 2021 (Mitchell). The NABC has bestowed its All-District 17 honors nine times to an Aztec in the last eight years. In 2019, Jalen McDaniels earned first-team designation. Flynn and Yanni Wetzel were first team and Mitchell was second team in 2020. In 2021, Mitchell and Jordan Schakel earned first team and second team honors, respectively. In 2022, Matt Bradley was a second team, in 2023, LeDee was a first-team designee and in 2025 Miles Byrd was tapped as a second-team performer.

Within the Mountain West, Flynn was named the 2020 Mountain West Male Athlete of the Year, Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Newcomer of the Year, and a member of the All-Defensive Team. In the same season, KJ Feagin was named to the all-defensive team and one year prior, Jeremy Hemsley was included on the league's all-defensive team. In 2021, Mitchell earned Mountain West Player of the Year, first team All-Mountain West and inclusion on the all-defensive team along with Nathan Mensah. In 2022, Mensah was the Defensive Player of the Year and a member of the all-defensive team. Bradley was the Newcomer of the Year. Chad Baker-Mazara was named the Sixth Man of the Year and Lamont Butler garnered all-defensive team honors. The 2023 campaign saw Mensah again named the Defensive Player of the Year, a third-team performer, and a member of the all-Defensive Team, while Bradley earned first-team honors and Lamont Butler was a third team and All-Defensive Team designee. In 2024, Butler was the Defensive Player of the Year, a member of the All-Defensive Team and an honorable mention performer, while Jaedon LeDee was tabbed a first-team honoree. Last season, Magoou Gwath was the league's Freshman of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, an honorable mention performer and a member of the all-defensive team. Byrd and Nick Boyd were second-team honorees with Byrd also earning all-defensive team designation.

His players have earned 23 All-Mountain West designations and 29 freshman or players of the week honors. Three Aztecs, Trey Kell in 2018, Mitchell in 2021 and Bradley in 2023, were named Mountain West tournament MVP among 13 SDSU players who have been included on the league's all-tournament team. In his eight seasons, his charges have garnered 18 league all-academic team distinctions, a pair of Arthur Ashe Jr. Sports Scholar awards, and Flynn was named to the 2020 NABC Honors Court.

The 2022-23 season saw SDSU fulfill a promise coach Dutcher, and Hall of Fame coach Steve Fisher, made the day they stepped on campus prior to the 1999-00 season...that the program's goal was to compete for national championships. The Aztecs finished with a 32-7 record, played Connecticut for the NCAA championship in Houston's NRG Stadium in front of more than 72,000 spectators and finished the season as the national runner-up. The team ranked No. 2 in the final USA Today Coaches poll, the highest the program has ever achieved.

SDSU's 32 victories are the second most in a season in San Diego State history, trailing only the 34 wins in 2010-11. In conference play, SDSU was 15-3 and secured both the regular-season and tournament titles to earn a No. 5 seed, its third consecutive season with a single-digit seed in the NCAA Tournament. Five of the team's seven losses were by nine points or less, with three of its losses coming against top 25 opposition and in each of its seven losses its opponent was receiving votes in the national polls. Senior guard Darrion Trammell was named the South Regional Most Outstanding Player with Lamont Butler also included on the South Regional All-Tournament Team. Butler, who hit the biggest shot in SDSU history, the game winner as time expired against Florida Atlantic in the Final Four to send the Aztecs to the national championship game, earned a spot on the 2023 NCAA All-Tournament Team.

The 2021-22 campaign featured a 23-9 record and SDSU's second straight appearance in the NCAA Tournament, garnering a No. 8 seed. Six of its nine losses were by six points or less and after Dec. 8, 2021, four of the team's six defeats were by three points or less. Twice during that stretch, the Aztecs defeated nationally ranked Colorado State.

In 2020-21, he guided San Diego State to the Mountain West regular-season and tournament crowns and earned a No. 6 seed in the NCAA tournament. The Aztecs went 23-5 and finished the regular season ranked No. 7 in field goal percentage defense (.387), No. 8 in scoring defense (60.6), No. 12 in scoring margin (+13.5), No. 14 in total steals (233), and No. 16 in turnover margin (+3.9) nationally. Among the Mountain West teams, San Diego State led the league in turnovers forced (15.15), steals per game (8.19), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.25:1), three-point field goal percentage (.381), field goal percentage defense, scoring defense, scoring margin, turnover margin and total steals. The team posted a 14-game win streak, which is the fourth longest in school history and is the third of at least nine games under Dutcher.

The 2019-20 squad ripped off a program-record 26-straight wins to open the season and peaked, for eight weeks, at a No. 4 ranking in both national polls, before finishing the regular season at No. 6. The Aztecs went 30-2, including 17-1 in Mountain West play.

In program history, his team's 30 wins in 2019-20 are the fourth most in a season and its two defeats are the fewest. SDSU's 17 wins in conference play are the most in program and Mountain West history, and its one loss is the fewest in the Aztecs' Division I era and equals the fewest since 1926-27, when it moved from junior college competition to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). San Diego State opened the 2019-20 league slate with a 15-game winning streak, which set a new Mountain West record.

In 2017-18, Dutcher was the only Division I coach to guide his team to the NCAA Tournament in his initial season after going 22-10, including winning the 2018 MW Tournament championship.

Over the course of his 26 years at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the postseason 19 times, including 14 trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 16 Mountain West titles and record 19 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, SDSU has four NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014, 2023 & 2024) and NIT semifinal (2009, 2016) appearances, won at least 25 games nine times and captured 16 MW championships (nine regular season, seven tournament).

SAN DIEGO - San Diego State Men's Basketball entered Viejas Arena and took to Steve Fisher Court for their 2025-2026 season opener against Long Beach State. The Aztecs entered the evening with an eight-game winning streak against The Beach and continued their success with a 77-45 victory.

San Diego State's first score of the night would come via a baseline drive from Sean Newman Jr. who found Miles Heide under the basket for a quick two points at the rim.

With roughly five and a half minutes left in the half SDSU's offense would catch fire with Mountain West Preseason Player of the Year Miles Byrd erupting for eight straight points off a contested layup at the rim and a pair of shots behind the arc. The Aztecs closed the first frame of play on a 20-5 run with Byrd leading all players in both points (11) and rebounds (5) at the half.

Sophomore guard Taj DeGourville got things going for the Aztecs in the second half with four straight points within the opening minutes kicking off a balanced scoring effort from coach Brian Dutcher's team. Nine different Aztec's contributed points across the final 20 minutes of the game.

For the game Byrd and freshman Elzie Harrington each posted a team high in scoring with 13 points apiece. Byrd was also dynamic on the glass, pulling down a team high eight rebounds.

The trio of Tae Simmons, Miles Heide, and DeGourville all chipped in 10 points and Harrington handed out four assists.

Long Beach was led by Sophomore forward Petar Majstorovic who had a double-double to the tune of 13 points and a game high 10 rebounds.

The Aztec's defense once again was stellar forcing 21 turnovers that resulted in 24 points. They also limited The Beach to 32% shooting from the floor and only 21% from three. BJ Davis swiped three steals while four different SDSU' players blocked a shot as well.

Elzie Harrington and Tae Simmons are the first Aztec freshmen to score in double figures in the season opener since Jeremy Hemsley scored 20 points against Illinois State on November 13, 2025.

SAN DIEGO - Reese Dixon-Waters scored 15 points in his return to the court for the first time since the 2023-24 season to lead San Diego State past Idaho State 73-57 on Sunday afternoon on Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

San Diego State (2-0) remains unbeaten and is now off until a home game against Troy on November 18.

Idaho State (2-1) suffers the first loss of its season and will look to get back in the win column at Seattle U on November 15.

San Diego State scored the first seven points of the game, with five coming from Reese Dixon-Waters.

After the Bengals got within four points with five minutes to go in the first half, Jeremiah Oden responded by scoring the next seven points on a pair of free throws, a dunk and a three-pointer to put the Aztecs back up by 11 points with 2:30 remaining.

Freshmen Elzie Harrington and Tae Simmons scored the final five points of the half, coming on a three-pointer and dunk, to send the Aztecs into the break with a 34-21 advantage.

SDSU opened the second half with a 14-5 run, including the first six points of the half, to go up 48-26 with 16 minutes to go in the game.

The Bengals got within 16 points with three minutes left before a pair of Pharaoh Compton dunks extended the Aztec lead back up to 20.

In addition to Dixon-Waters' 15 points and six rebounds, Compton had 14 points and a pair of blocks and Jeremiah Oden reached double figures for the first time with the Scarlet and Black with 13 points. Miles Byrd finished with six assists and six steals to lead the team.

The Bengals were led by Connor Hollenbeck (17 points), Jamison Guerra (seven points, six assists), Cheikh Sow (five points, five rebounds) and Caleb Van De Griend (eight points, five rebounds).

San Diego State shot better from the field (59.2%-44.4%), three-point range (35.3%-33.3%) and the free throw line (75.0%-71.4%). SDSU had more assists (17-12), steals (11-6) and blocks (5-0). The Aztecs also scored more points in the paint (40-22) and off turnovers (30-12).

Brian Dutcher earned the 200th win of his career.

After limiting Long Beach State to 20 points in the second half in the season opener, San Diego State held the Bengals to 21 points in the first half on Sunday. It marked the first time SDSU held its opponent to 21 points or fewer in consecutive halves since the 2019-20 season, when the Aztecs held Nevada to 20 points in the second half on January 18, 2020, before keeping Wyoming to 19 in the first half on January 21 of that season.

San Diego State was led by Miles Byrd who poured in a team high 21 points on 58% shooting from the floor. Byrd's heroics reached a high point late in the game on multiple occasions. First, the junior guard hit a deep, halfcourt shot as time expired to complete the second half comeback and send the game into overtime. He followed that shot up by drawing a charge as the first overtime period ended to force another five minutes of game action. Byrd rounded out his night with three rebounds and three assists.

The other big story of the night was the return of the reigning Mountain West Freshman and Defensive Player of the Year, Magoon Gwath. After spending months rehabbing a knee injury suffered last season, Gwath returned to the lineup in emphatic fashion. The seven-foot center stuffed the stat sheet to the tune of 20 points, seven rebounds and three blocks while knocking down all five of his shot attempts including a clutch pair three-point shots late in regulation.

The Aztec's trio of Reese Dixon-Waters (16 points), BJ Davis (15 points) and Jeremiah Oden (11 points) all reached double figures in scoring. Dixon-Waters scored five points across both overtime periods and played a team high 43 minutes. Miles Heide led the Aztecs with nine rebounds while Taj DeGourville dished out a career best six assists.

As a team San Diego State shot 47% from the floor and 39% from deep. The Aztecs were able to win the rebounding battle 50-41 with five players pulling down at least five rebounds. Turnovers proved to be a key factor in the game with San Diego State giving up the ball 20 times compared to 13 giveaways by the Trojans. Troy was led by Thomas Dowd who chipped in a game high 25 points to go along with a game high 19 rebounds.

San Diego State opened the game hot, scoring the first five points on a Taj DeGourville layup and a three-pointer from Miles Byrd.

Following a Michigan three at 7:22, SDSU responded with a three of their own by Reese Dixon-Waters and BJ Davis, who combined for 43 points, as it downed Oregon 97-80 in the Players Era Festival on Tuesday night.

Michigan (5-0) will face the No. 21 Auburn Tigers at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday.

Michigan opened the scoring in the second half, but Harrington drained yet another shot following a pair of Magoon Gwath free throws.

The Aztecs made the most of their free throw opportunities in the second half, sinking 9-of-11 shots from the charity stripe (81.8%).

Davis, who scored 18 points in each of the Aztecs' first two games in the Players Era Festival last season, reached double figures with 11:38 remaining by making his second three-pointer of the night.

Following a dunk by Jeremiah Oden with 5:51 to go, Harrington equaled his career-high of 13 points by making two free throws.

Harrington surpassed his total in the season opener against Long Beach State with a jumper in the final minute.

Miles Heide pulled down eight rebounds including five on offense to lead the way and dished out a game-high five assists after never previously having tallied more than two in a game during his collegiate career.

The Wolverines were led by Yaxel Lendeborg's 15 points and four assists as well as Aday Mara's eight rebounds.

San Diego State shot better from the free throw line (81.3%-68.2%) while Michigan was better from the field (50.0%-27.4%) and from long range (33.3%-30.4%).

San Diego State continues the Players Era Festival at 8 p.m. on Tuesday night against Oregon. The game will be televised on TNT and broadcast on San Diego Sports 760.

LAS VEGAS – San Diego State's offense exploded for 97 points, led by Reese Dixon-Waters and BJ Davis, who combined for 43 points, as it downed Oregon 97-80 in the Players Era Festival on Tuesday night.

San Diego State (3-2) will finish its stay in Las Vegas on Wednesday night against the Baylor Bears at 7:30 p.m. PT.

The teams battled back and forth early, leading to a 15-15 score with 12 minutes remaining in the first half. SDSU rattled off the next 12 points to pull ahead 27-15, a lead it would not relinquish the remainder of the night. Davis accounted for the first eight points of the run, making two free throws before back-to-back three-pointers.

The lead held constant between seven and 12 points for the rest of the half as the Aztecs brought a ten-point lead into the locker room at halftime.

After Oregon cut the lead to six at 17:58, the Aztecs scored the next eight points to go back up 14 with 16 minutes left. Dixon-Waters started the stretch with a three before a Davis free throw and layups from Miles Heide and Jeremiah Oden.

SDSU's lead was again at 14 with eight and a half minutes to go in the game and Elzie Harrington connected from beyond the arc, Dixon-Waters made a jumper, and Oden drained a pair of free throws to put the Aztecs up 21, their largest lead of the night so far.

At the final media timeout, the lead was back down to 18, but Magoon Gwath made a layup and Heide and Davis had consecutive dunks to push the lead back out to 24, the largest of the night.

Oregon finished the contest on a run, but it was too little, too late as San Diego State earned the 97-80 win.

Magoon Gwath scored 13 points and pulled down six rebounds while logging four blocks and two steals on defense. Freshman Elzie Harrington scored in double figures for the second straight night, pouring in 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting. Harrington was one of four Aztecs with four assists, along with Davis and Taj DeGourville.

San Diego State shot better from the field (67.2%-40.3%), beyond the arc (47.7%-42.9%) and the free throw line (88.9%-81.2%). SDSU won the rebounding battle (34-26) and scored more points in the paint (36-22), on fast breaks (20-8) and off the bench (47-18).

San Diego State scored its most points in regulation against a DI opponent since scoring 98 points against Wyoming on January 30, 2021.

San Diego State improved to 21-5 in its last 26 games when wearing red jerseys, going back to the start of the 2010-11 season.

San Diego State wraps up the Players Era Festival at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesday night against Baylor. The game will be televised on TruTV and broadcast on San Diego Sports 760.

LAS VEGAS – San Diego State scored 80 points with five players in double figures on Wednesday night, but it was not enough as the Aztecs came up short 91-81 against the Baylor Bears in SDSU's final contest of the 2025 Players Era Festival.

San Diego State (3-3) returns home to face the Wolverines of Utah Valley on Wednesday night at Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena.

Baylor (5-1) will host Sacramento State in Waco, Texas, on Tuesday night.

The Bears scored the first five points of the game before San Diego State scored the next ten points, highlighted by three-pointers from Elzie Harrington, Reese Dixon-Waters and Jeremiah Oden.

Baylor battled back, going up by four with 11:38 to go in the half before a pair of Taj DeGourville free throws, a Tae Simmons dunk and a Miles Byrd layup put the Aztecs back up by two.

A few minutes later, Dixon-Waters made a go-ahead jumper before Simmons had a dunk to put SDSU up 26-23 with 6:26 remaining in the half.

Heading into halftime, Baylor clung to a four-point lead.

In the first four minutes of the second half, three-pointers from Byrd and Harrington as well as a Harrington dunk brought the Aztecs within one at the 16-minute mark.

With 14:30 to go, Baylor was up by six before consecutive threes from Oden and DeGourville tied the game, and BJ Davis made a layup to cap the 8-0 run and put the Aztecs up by two.

DeGourville responded to a Baylor three with a jumper of his own to put SDSU up 54-53 at 12:30, but it was the Aztecs' final lead of the night as the Bears ultimately finished ahead by ten points due to a pair of free throws in the waning seconds of the contest.

Byrd tallied 13 points with four rebounds and Harrington and Dixon-Waters (four assists) each scored a dozen points. Davis (11 points) and Sean Newman Jr. (ten points, six assists) also both finished in double figures. Oden grabbed seven rebounds to go with his two three-pointers.

The Bears were led by Tounda Yessoufou's 18 points and Dan Skillings Jr.'s eight rebounds and five assists.

San Diego State shot better from beyond the arc (42.3%-39.1%) and the free throw line (82.4%-73.3%) while Baylor was better from the field (52.6%-47.5%). SDSU had more assists (10-9) and scored more off turnovers (17-12) and off the bench (44-20).

BJ Davis scored in double figures for the fifth time in the Aztecs' six Players Era Festival games, averaging 14.0 points in the event.

San Diego State scored 80 or more points for the third time in its last four games, which it achieved for the first time since the first four games of the 2022-23 season, the year the Aztecs made the NCAA National Championship Game.

San Diego State returns to Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena for a game against Utah Valley at 7 p.m. PT next Wednesday night. The game will be televised on KUSI and broadcast on San Diego Sports 760.

SAN DIEGO — The Aztecs returned to Steve Fisher Court after two weeks away from the confines of Viejas Arena to face the visiting Wolverines of Utah Valley University. Despite it being a tightly contested game at the half, the Aztecs would pull away in the second frame of action to secure a 77-66 victory and earn their fourth win of the 2025-2026 season.

The first half was highlighted by BJ Davis's continued offensive efficiency. The junior guard entered the evening having scored double figures in five consecutive games. His 12 first half points were critical as the Wolverines would go on a 12-0 run over the final three minutes to head into halftime trailing by a single point.

After a relatively slow start as a team coach Brian Dutcher's squad rallied in the second half, led by freshman Tae Simmons. As a team they shot 56% from the floor and 50% from behind the arc. The team's defense also emerged, coming away with five steals and blocking three shots. Despite only playing eight minutes in the second half, Simmons was highly effective. The freshman forward scored 11 of his career-high 15 points on perfect 3-3 shooting while also pulling down three rebounds. The freshman would go on a 5-0 run by himself to put the Aztecs up by 12 with roughly 10 minutes remaining. While Utah Valley pulled within five late in the game, a 6-0 run pushed San Diego State ahead by 11 and they would never look back.

As a team, the Aztecs won numerous key statistical battles across the 40 minutes of game time. SDSU controlled the interior, scoring 34 points in the paint compared to Utah Valley's 26. They would also win the rebounding battle securing 35 total rebounds including 12 offensive rebounds. Yet, the most critical component of the matchup was the dominant showing by San Diego State's second unit. The Aztec's reserves scored 59 points as the trio of BJ Davis (18 points), Tae Simmons (15 points) and Pharaoh Compton (12 points) overwhelmed the Wolverines.

San Diego State kicked off a stretch of three straight home games with their win tonight. They will return to Viejas Arena next Wednesday for a 7:00 p.m. matchup against Lamar University on Dec. 10 as they look to pick up their second consecutive victory!

SAN DIEGO — The Aztecs picked up their second straight victory on Steve Fisher Court, defeating the visiting Lamar Cardinals by a final score of 89-71. It was a balanced effort six different players scoring at least eight points and five different players securing at least five rebounds.

The first half of action was defined by the excellent play of the Aztec's backcourt duo of Miles Byrd and BJ Davis. Across the first 20 minutes the pair combined to score 26 points while shooting 70% from the floor. Byrd handed out two assists while also blocking two shots. Meanwhile, Davis was explosive leading the second unit. The junior guard had scored in double figures in five consecutive games and only needed 10 minutes of play in the first half to extend that streak to six straight games. To go along with the scoring exploits of their veteran guards, the Aztecs shot 43% from behind the arc during the first frame of play with five different players knocking down at least one three.

San Diego State entered the second half with a 10-point lead but wasted little time pulling away from the Cardinals. A 10-0 run capped off by a Reese Dixon-Waters pull-up jump shot, pushed the Aztec's lead to 20 within the first four and a half minutes of the second half. Starting center Magoon Gwath came alive as well scoring eight points, grabbing four rebounds and swatted away a pair of shots. Byrd also continued to stuff the stat sheet with seven more points and a pair of steals. For the game he chipped in a team high 19 points, five rebounds, four assists, two blocks and two steals.

As a team coach Brian Dutcher's squad won multiple statistical categories. They limited the Cardinals to just 36% from the floor while forcing 18 turnovers. They also won the rebounding battle decisively 40-30 while corralling 12 offensive rebounds on the night. As has been the case for much of this season, San Diego State's bench has continued to produce at an elite level. After having scored 59 points against Utah Valley, the second unit contributed 44 more points tonight. The trio BJ Davis (16 points), Sean Newman Jr. (8 points) and Pharaoh Compton (8 points) outscored the entirety of Lamar's bench on their own.

The Aztecs will take this winning streak into next week as their homestand continues with Mountain West Conference play beginning. The Air Force Falcons will make the trip to Viejas Arena to face off against San Diego State on Wednesday, December 17. Tip-off is scheduled for 7:00 p.m. PT and will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego State officially began Mountain West play, welcoming the Air Force Falcons to Steve Fisher Court for the first conference showdown of the season. The Aztec's would pull away in the second half to end the night with a convincing 81-58 victory that extends their winning streak to three games.

The first half of play was a tightly contested affair with the Aztecs taking a 33-30 lead into the break. The Aztec's controlled the interior early, leaning on the play of Magoon Gwath, Miles Heide and Pharaoh Compton. The trio would combine for 18 points and eight rebounds while shooting 8-10 from the floor. As a team, San Diego State created separation from the Falcons midway through the half thanks to an 11-0 run capped off with a Miles Byrd midrange jump shot.

The start of the second half saw the two teams exchange baskets before the Aztecs put together a 10-3 run with 15 minutes on the clock giving San Diego State an 11-point lead that would eventually balloon to over 20 points. Super sixth-man BJ Davis exploded in the second half after a quiet 11 minutes in the first. Davis scored 17 points, was a perfect 4-4 from three and handed out four assists without committing a turnover. As a team, San Diego State was firing on all cylinders, finishing the second half with a scorching 68% field goal percentage while also hitting seven threes to the tune of 58% from behind the arc.

The Aztec's defense shined by limiting Air Force to just 41% shooting from the floor and 33% shooting from three-point territory. San Diego State also won the rebounding battle decisively by a margin of 35-26. Their 13 offensive rebounds led directly to 16 second chance points. BJ Davis would finish with a game-high 19 points, and his six assists were tied with Elzie Harrington for the game high as well. Miles Heide has continued to be a force on the glass with eight more rebounds leading all players; this marks the fourth time this year he has been the Aztec's leading rebounder.

The Aztecs move to 1-0 in conference play and have won three straight. They now turn their attention to a highly anticipated road matchup against the AP Poll No. 1 team in the nation, the Arizona Wildcats. This marks the second matchup this year against an AP Top 10 program for the Aztecs. Tipoff on Saturday, December 20th is set for 7:30 p.m. PST at the Mortgage Matchup Center on ESPN2.
