Aztecs Notes

- **San Diego State** enters this weekend's play half a game out of first place in the Golden Coast Conference (GCC) standings, ranked No. 19 in the Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) national poll, and host its first two conference home games this weekend at Aztec Aquaplex. SDSU faces Santa Clara on Friday and then No. 25 Pacific on Sunday, both games slated to start at 1 p.m. PT.
- The Aztecs are ranked No. 19 in the CWPA poll for the fifth consecutive week and have been ranked in the top 25 in each of the organization's six weekly and its preseason polls.
- SDSU and Santa Clara last played at Aztec Aquaplex in a 14-8 win for San Diego State on April 13, 2024. With a hat trick, **Claudia Valdes** (Sr., ATT, Madrid, Spain) led three Aztecs who scored multiple times, including **Sydney Gish** (Sr., ATT, Clovis, Calif.) who finished with a pair of strikes, and **Tiaare Ahovalo** (Sr., GK, Auckland, New Zealand) earned the win with three saves against six goals allowed with a pair of steals and an assist in the first half.
- In its GCC home openers, San Diego State has an 8-3 since it joined the league for the 2014 season. (Note: With the 2020 season being halted on March 7 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, SDSU did not get to host a conference home game, but was 3-0 in GCC play.)
- San Diego State leads the all-time series with the Broncos, 17-1, including a 5-0 mark at the Aquaplex. The Aztecs are currently riding a 14-game win streak against Santa Clara, its longest active streak against a GCC opponent. The Broncos have not defeated SDSU since Feb. 8, 2014, in a 9-8 overtime victory at the Triton Invitational. That is a total, at game time, of 4,402 days.
- San Diego State and Pacific have played 45 times with SDSU owning a 35-10 advantage all-time, including a 12-3 mark at the Aquaplex. The Aztecs opened the series, which began in the 1996 season, with 32 straight wins and didn't suffer a defeat to the Tigers until 2017. However, 10 of the last 13 get together. SDSU has come out on the short end of the outcome. The last meeting in America's Finest City, an 8-5 win for UOP, came on March 23, 2024. **Sydney Gish** (Sr., ATT, Clovis, Calif.) led the Aztec attack with a pair of goals.
- With its GCC opening win at No. 21 California Baptist last week, SDSU moves to 10-3 its last 13 conference openers, regardless of location. When the Aztecs' conference opener is on the road, they are 6-1.

- Senior attacker **Claudia Valdes** (Sr., ATT, Madrid, Spain) was named Golden Coast Conference (GCC) Player of the Week on February 19. The Madrid, Spain native, posted game highs in goals (4), assists (5), points (9) and steals (2) and drew an exclusion. She completed a hat trick, her sixth of the season, with 4:13 to play in the first half, totaled four total goals for the second straight game and for third time in the campaign's 14 contests. The five assists were her second most in a game this season and nine points match her career high. It is Valdes' second GCC Player of the Week honor in her college career and the second for an Aztec.
- Following its 15-9 win over Claremont-Mudd-Scripps (1-16-26) in its season opener, SDSU has an overall record of 22-10 in lid lifters. In openers away from the Aquaplex, the Aztecs are 15-9, while at home they boast a 7-1 mark in season openers.
- Junior two-meter **Mimi Stoupas** was named the initial 2026 Golden Coast Conference (GCC) Player of the Week. At the season opening Titan Invitational, Stoupas scored 19 goals, drew 12 exclusions, had nine steals and shot a team-leading 67.9 percent (19-of-28) with two blocks and an assist. It is Stoupas' third GCC Player of the Week honor in her college career.
- With her first of four goals against UC Santa Barbara (2-7-26), **Sydney Gish** (Sr., ATT, Clovis, Calif.) passed the 100-goal milestone and enters the LMU game with 111 career tallies.
- With her first save against No. 6 Arizona State (2-8-26), **Tiaare Ahovelovelo** (Sr., GK, Auckland, New Zealand) became the seventh player in the 32 seasons of Aztecs water polo to reach the 500-save plateau. She enters the Santa Clara game with 507 for her career and is 12 away from equalling No. 6 Maura Cantoni's (2017-19) and her 519 career saves.
- **Claudia Valdes** (Sr., ATT, Madrid, Spain) enters the weekend with 158 career assists good for No. 5 on the program's career list and is one from tying Anique Hermann (2012-15) for No. 4 in program history. In addition, Valdes passed the 200-goal milestone vs. Biola (1-17-26), sits in eighth place on the San Diego State career goals list with 221 and is eight from No. 7 Amber Pezzolla's (2010-13) career 229 tallies.
- **Mimi Stoupas** (Jr., CTR, Melbourne, Australia) drew four exclusions at No. 21 California Baptist, has drawn 162 exclusions in her Aztec career to move into No. 10 on the program's career list.
- **San Diego State** will play all but four games of its 2026 season, its four at the ASU Invitational in Tempe, Ariz., in the state of California. In its 13 years in the GCC, SDSU has played all its regular-season games in the state of California just three times (2015, 2022 & 2023).
- After guiding the Aztec to a 32-30 record in her two seasons as the full-time head coach, **Dana Ochsner** is in her fourth season leading San Diego State after serving as the interim head coach for the 2023 campaign.
- Since the program's inception prior to the 1995 season, San Diego State has had just three head coaches: Deena Schmidt (1995-98), Carin Crawford (1999-2022) and **Dana Ochsner** (2023-present).
- In its now 32nd season of competition, **San Diego State** has an overall record of 616-425 (.592), including a 136-108 (.557) mark in league contests. In 17 of the previous 31 seasons, the program finished ranked in the top 10 nationally, has only finished outside of the top 20 four times and has never finished a season ranked outside the top 25.
- Since it joined the Golden Coast Conference (GCC) for the 2014 season, **San Diego State** has posted a 68-18 (.791) mark in league contests. Among the six original members of the league - Santa Clara, Azusa Pacific, Loyola Marymount, Pacific, Cal Baptist and San Diego State - that are still members, SDSU is one of three programs with a winning league record entering this year [also: Pacific - 60-17 (.779) & Loyola Marymount - 58-18 (.763)] and **SDSU is the only one of the original six to not have suffered a league season with a losing record.**
- With three appearances, the Aztecs are tied with Pacific for second most NCAA Tournaments among programs in the Golden Coast Conference. The pair trail only Fresno State and the four NCAA bids it has earned.
- In the 12 seasons of women's water polo in the Golden Coast Conference, **San Diego State's** five tournament championship game appearances are tied with Pacific and Fresno State for second most in GCC history. LMU has appeared in the most tournament championship games with seven. With the 2020 championship canceled, there have been 11 championship games with San Diego State, Fresno State, Pacific and LMU the only teams to have reached the final game of the tournament.
- In the 11 years that a champion has been crowned by the GCC, the 2020 season was canceled after the games of March 7, **San Diego State** has never failed to reach the final day of the tournament and has never finished lower than 4th place.
- Among the original six schools in the GCC - Azusa Pacific, Cal Baptist, Loyola Marymount, Pacific, **San Diego State**, and Santa Clara - the Aztecs are the only program to have finished in the top 4 in every league tournament.
- San Diego State is picked to finish in fourth place in the GCC coaches' preseason poll. This marks the third time in the last three years

the Aztecs have been predicted to finish fourth.

- San Diego State returns its five top scorers from the 2025 season and, overall, 78.0 percent of its tallies (320-of-410), 66.7 percent (53-of-87) of its blocks, 66.4 percent (168-of-253) of its steals, and 52.4 percent (182-of-347) of its assists.

Player Notes

- Claudia Valdes** (Sr., ATT, Madrid, Spain) leads the team in points (64) and assists (35) and ranks second in shots (67) and exclusions drawn (12). In addition, she has 21 steals, which are third best on the squad. She is No. 8 on the program's career goals list (221). Her 158 career assists rank No. 5 all-time and she stands one assist from No. 4. Her six assists against Long Beach State (1/16) are tied for the second most in a game in program history. Valdes was named GCC Player of the Week (2/19) after totaling nine points on four goals and five assists against No. 21 California Baptist.
- Sydney Gish** (Sr., ATT, Clovis, Calif.) has bent the back of the net 33 times on 67 shots and passed the 100-goal milestone at the ASU Invitational (2/7-8). Her 33 strikes are No. 2 on the team as are her 67 shots and 54 points. In addition, she ranks third with 21 assists and a .493 shot percentage. She has drawn six exclusions to go along with 17 steals and three blocks. Her five assists against Claremont-Mudd-Scripps are tied for the seventh most in a game in program history.
- Mimi Stoupas** (Jr., CTR, Melbourne, Australia) leads the team in goals (401), shots (75), shot percentage (.547) and exclusions drawn (38). In addition she's second in steals (22) and third in points (45). She has added a pair of steals and four assists for the campaign. Stoupas was named the GCC Player of the Week (1/22) for totaling 19 goals with an assist for 20 points, a team-leading .679 shot percentage, converting 19-of-28 shots at the Titan Invitational (1/16-17). At Cal State Fullerton (1/17), she scored six times, becoming the 15 player in program history to score at least that many in a game. At No. 21 California Baptist (2/14) her four exclusions drawn gave her 162 for her career and tied her for No. 10 on the program's all-time exclusions drawn list.
- Ioanna Petiki** (Fr., ATT, Stuttgart, Germany) scored 15 times on 37 shots and is second on the team in assists (25). Her 11 exclusions drawn and four blocks are third on the team and she has nine steals. Her six assists vs. Biola (1/17) are tied for the second most in a game in program history and are tied for the most by an Aztec freshman.
- Shannon Murphy** (Sr., ATT, Orinda, Calif.) has scored 15 times, including a season-high four times vs. Pomona-Pitzer (1/31), on 40 shots. In addition, she has 15 assists, 14 steals and a career-high four blocks, which along with her shots are good for third on the team. Murphy owns 24 of the team's 27 sprint victories. Her single game marks of six shots vs. UC Santa Barbara (2/7), four goals and four points vs. Pomona Pitzer (1/31), and three assists vs. Concordia (2/1) match single-game career highs and two blocks vs. Cal State Fullerton (1/17) are career-best.
- Sammi Byers** (Jr., ATT, Yucaipa, Calif.) has a .517 shot percentage, second best on the team, converting 15 of her 29 shots into goals and has assisted on eight others. She has 13 steals and is tied for third with four steals. She has produced three multi-goal games, including a season-high three against Cal Lutheran (2/7). Twice, vs. Cal Lutheran (2/7) and UC Santa Barbara (2/7), she picked up a single-game career high three steals. Her two steals against Marist and at No. 21 California Baptist (2/14) are also career-bests.
- Poppy Phillips** (Fr., ATT, Melbourne, Australia) has 12 goals, second highest among SDSU freshmen, including a single game best four vs. Cal Lutheran (2/7) on 30 shots. She has five assists to go along with three exclusions drawn, six steals and two blocks. At Arizona State (2/8) she produced a single-game best six shots.
- Megan Holcomb** (Sr., UTL, La Verne, Calif.) transferred from Indiana prior to the 2025. She has appeared in all 15 games, has produced 24 shots and bent the net 10 times, including season-high four versus Concordia (2/1). She has seven assists, five steals and three exclusions drawn and two blocks.
- Lucy Bullock** (Jr., DEF, London, England) has scored seven times on 27 shots and assisted on nine more in 15 games. She leads the team with six blocks and 23 steals, including a pair of career-high four steal games (vs. Pomona-Pitzer & Concordia). In addition, she has five exclusions drawn.
- Julianne Stark** (So., ATT, Danville, Calif.) has scored nine goals on 19 shots, has five assists, five steals, two blocks and three exclusions drawn. Her two blocks are a career-high and four steals equals her career-best.
- Avery Sullivan** (Fr., DEF, Moraga, Calif.) has scored six times on 16 shots, including her initial collegiate tally against Biola (1/17). She has eight assists, including a single-game best two vs. Pomona-Pitzer & UC Davis (1/31) and Cal Lutheran (2/7) to go along with six steals, five blocks, second most on the team, and an exclusion drawn.
- Hannah Bell** (Sr., CTR, Auckland, New Zealand) has, through 15 games, produced 28 shots and scored on 10 of them. She has totaled a season-best two goals came against Cal State Fullerton (1/17), Pomona-Pitzer (1/31), Concordia (2/1) and Cal Lutheran (2-7). Bell has two assists, 12 ejections drawn, No. 2 on the team, with two steals and a block.

- **Natalia Barrot** (Fr., ATT, Santa Ana, Calif.) has produced 10 shots, scored her first collegiate goal against Concordia (2/1), and enters the weekend with two goals on the year. She has eight assists to go along with six exclusion drawn and five steals.
- **Aiyana Mendoza** (Sr., UTL, Union City, Calif.) has played in 15 games, taken six shots, and has a goal versus Long Beach State (1/16) and four assists. She has totaled five points and has four steals, two blocks, and three exclusions drawn. Her two exclusions drawn against Biola (1/17) are a season and career high.
- **Mackenzie Dollander** (Fr., ATT, Newport Beach, Calif.) has produced four shots, scored her first collegiate goal against Concordia (2/1) and enters the weekend with two tallies and an assist on the season.
- **Mandy Lagerlof** (Sr. GK, Irvine, Calif.) has started all 12 games in which she has appeared, played a team-high 212:54 minutes and owns a 7-4 record. She has made 50 saves and surrendered 85 goals. Her GAA is 12.78, save percentage is .370 and she has totaled 10 steals and two assists.
- **Tiaare Ahovelov** (Sr., GK, Auckland, New Zealand) has played 194:37 minutes across 12 appearances and two starts this year and has an 0-2 record. She has stopped a team-high 65 shots against 60 goals allowed. She has a 9.87 GAA and has saved 52.0 percent of the shots that reached her. In addition she has two assists and six steals.
- **Kyla Pranajaya** (Fr., GK, Orange, Calif.) has played 78:29 minutes in six appearances and one start, and is 1-1 on the season. She has made 28 saves, let 24 goals in and has 9.79 GAA and .538 save percentage, with five assists and two steals.
- **Mimi Stoupas** (Jr., CTR, Melbourne, Australia) and **Ioanna Petiki** (Fr., ATT, Stuttgart, Germany), earned the ultimate honor in representing their country on an international stage. The pair competed at the FISA World University Games in Duisburg, Germany over the summer. Petiki's German squad won the gold medal as she scored a pair of power play goals to go along with three steals and a block across six games. Stoupas scored nine times, tied for third most on the team and her four tallies from in front of the goal led the team, which finished in sixth place.

Record Book Assault

- **Mimi Stoupas** (Jr., CTR, Melbourne, Australia) has drawn 38 exclusions this season and enters the weekend tied with Amber Pezzolla (2010-13) for 10th place on the program's career list with 162 drawn exclusions each. She has averaged 62 exclusions drawn per season and she keeps that pace, by the end of the year she will sit at No. 8 the program's career list.
- **Tiaare Ahovelov** (Sr., GK, Auckland, New Zealand) entered 2026 with 442 career saves and in seventh place on the program's all-time saves list, added 65 so far and now sits at 507. She enters the Santa Clara game 12 saves from Maura Cantoni (2017-19) and her 519 stops, which are the sixth most in program history. If Ahovelov continues to make saves at her career pace, 147 per year average, she will finish the season and her Aztec career with 589 saves, which will slot her in at No. 5 on the program's career saves list.
- **Claudia Valdes** (Sr., ATT, Madrid, Spain) has scored 221 goals in her three-plus years as an Aztec, which ranks No. 8 on the program's all-time list and eight from equaling Amber Pezzolla (2010-13) for seventh place on the career list. Valdes came into the season scoring an average of 64 strikes a year. If she continues at that pace, she will complete her college playing career with 256 goals which would rank No. 3 in Aztec history.

In addition to her goal scoring prowess, Valdes is equally adept at setting up her teammates for success. She has assisted on 158 of her teammate's goals in her three-plus years in America's Finest City. She currently ranks No. 5 on the career list, one assist from tying Anique Hermann (2012-15) at No. 4 with 159 assists.
