**9.00-10.15** Workshop: How to facilitate high-quality student mobility (F312 and online). Ms Jonna-Maria Peltoniemi and Ms Tiina Välimäki, SeAMK. International skills and competence are required in globalised working life. Mobility is one effective tool for students to develop those skills. How to promote mobility and facilitate unforgettable mobility experience for students? How to use Internationalisation at Home activities as part of mobility processes? Join the workshop and share your best experience and innovate new methods with international colleagues. The workshop consists of short presentations, group work and networking.

# **9.00-10.45 Workshop: Critical Incidents** (F308). Dr Doris Fetscher and Ms Susanne Klein, University of Applied Sciences Zwickau, Germany

In this workshop we will work with stories about experiences that the participants themselves have experienced as irritating or conflictual in the intercultural context. We call such stories Critical-Incident Narrations. We will look at these situations together and analyse them from different perspectives. The primary goal is not to find "the right" solution to the irritation, but to broaden our interpretive horizons and thus our understanding of our own culture and other cultures. How do we perceive ourselves and others? How do others perceive us? What stereotypes influence us? What happens in the dynamics of a complex intercultural situation? How can we develop intercultural sensitivity? We would wish active participation from the participants.

# **10.45-12.00 Workshop: Talent Boost programme** (F144 and online). Ms Tiina Ojanperä and Mr Jiuliano Prisada, SeAMK.

Talent Boost Finland is a national service package that help companies to recruit international professionals and develop multicultural organisations. The talents needed by the companies can be found in Finland, for example, among the international students who have graduated here, or they can also be recruited from abroad. Seinäjoki University of Applied Sciences is strongly committed to support its international students in their plans to learn Finnish language, integrate into the Finnish society and find jobs or start their own companies. We invite partner universities, which are interested to share their experiences related to these topics, to take part in this workshop. We will discuss about concrete policies, tools and examples that universities use to support integration and employment of international students. The workshop consists of short presentations, group work and networking.


