Background



- SECCLO Master's Programme in Security and Cloud Computing
- Continuation of former NordSecMob-Master's Programme in Security and Mobile Computing (running 2006-2017) with Erasmus Mundus label and funding
- **SECCLO** has been selected in 2018 under the Erasmus Mundus programme and is entitled to receive **European Union funding** for scholarships to selected students from **any other country of the world until 2026**

Key features of SECCLO


- **Two-year** Master's Programme in Security and Cloud Computing

Admission process



Basic information

- Application period 23 November 2020 8 January 2021
 - Selection results published in Mid-March 2021
 - Possible 2nd application period without EM scholarships in March-April 2021
 - Studies begin in September 2021
- Fully online & fully document-based application process
 - If selected, selection conditional until hard copies submitted (DL 9 August 2021)
- English language test result is required from most applicants to be eligible
 - Separate lg test deadline of 31 January 2021
 - Two at-home tests accepted

Joint admission process

Only one application needed to apply to SECCLO




- Joint evaluation criteria and selection process
- Applicants are first selected only to Aalto University (entry university)
- NB! If you are interested in other Master's programmes offered by the consortium universities, you will need to apply to them separately

Selection of second-year specialization (exit university)



- After the first semester of studies at Aalto
- Selections based on motivation, suitability for specialization area & study success
- All SECCLO students are guaranteed a placement

Applying in 6 steps



- Take a language test (if required) **now** & start collecting application documents
- Fill in and submit your online application form (link => How to apply page)
- Submit your language test scores for verification (how? => How to apply page).
- Monitor your email for the results of our general eligibility check
- Complement your application and once eligible, wait for the selection results

Application documents

	How
1. Bachelor's degree certificate (+ translation)	Scanned colour copy of the original document uploaded to the application portal
2. Bachelor transcript (+ translation)	Scanned colour copy of the original document uploaded to the application portal
3. Motivation letter	Part of the online application form, max 500 words
4. CV	Uploaded to the application portal
5. Passport/ID	Uploaded to the application portal
6. English proficiency	Uploaded to the application portal AND test result submitted for verification (e.g. TOEFL via ETS)
7. Two (academic) recommendation letters	Uploaded to the application portal and/or using referee request function in the application portal
8. Course descriptions	Part of the online application form
9. Other supporting documents (extra transcripts, work certificates, publications, GMAT/GRE etc.)	Uploaded to the application portal
10. Proof of place of residence	Uploaded to the application portal

English language requirements

Only two exceptions:

- Higher education degree in English at a university in Australia, Canada, New Zealand, South Africa, the United Kingdom, the United States, an EU/EEA country or Switzerland.
 - At least one half of the degree if double/joint degree
- 2. Degree and exchange students from **SECCLO consortium universities**

All other applicants => a valid English language test result is required by our language test deadline (31 January 2021). No exceptions for any reason!

Important deadlines!

8 January 2021 at 3 pm (GMT +2)	Online application portal closes. Deadline for all document uploads (except when given individual complementation deadline*).
15 January 2021 (= one week after DL)	Final deadline for the referees to submit their recommendation letters.
31 January 2021	Deadline for the English language test result to be <u>verifiable by the SECCLO</u> <u>Admissions Office.</u>

^{*)} Given if submitted application checked less than two weeks before our application deadline. Individual complementation deadline is always two weeks from the date the application was checked.










SECCLO admission process



General eligibility check

- 1. Higher education **institution is officially recognized**
- **2. Bachelor's degree** or equivalent studies (= must entitle the graduate to apply for a Master's degree at a university in the awarding country)
 - Applicants with an incomplete degree can apply if they graduate by the end of July
 2021
- 3. All compulsory application documents submitted as instructed
- 4. Fulfils English language requirements

Problem in one of these? Not eligible and application not processed further.

SECCLO admission process



Student selection criteria 1/2


- Contents of the previous degree
- Study success
- Recognition and quality of applicant's home university
- Motivation and commitment to studies in the programme
- Other relevant achievements (work experience, publications, etc.)
- Recommendation letters
- English language proficiency

<u>During the evaluation process, contents of the previous degree(s) and study</u> <u>success are assessed first</u>. Only the applications that meet the requirements for these criteria will be evaluated further.

Student selection criteria 2/2

- Contents of the previous degree
 - **Required background**: mathematics, programming, algorithms and data structures, databases, theory of computation, computer networks, software engineering
 - **Knowledge of the following areas is considered an advantage**: additional knowledge of mathematical methods, mobile applications, web software and online services, etc.
 - > Evaluated from the transcript(s) submitted & course descriptions (online application form)
 - Professional certificates/online courses do not, in general, compensate for university studies
 - ➤ Students w/ a Master's degree in CS will be evaluated case-by-case
- Study success
 - Graces achieved and pace of studies
 - Very good previous study success is expected
 - > Evaluated from the grade point average (GPA) achieved and results in key courses

Tips for applicants



Tips for applicants

- Start preparing documents as soon as possible
 - Sometimes preparing documents takes much more time than expected.
- Show your <u>best sides in CV</u>
 - Explain what you accomplished during your studying or/and work experience.
 - Any extracurricular activities, awards, certifications?
- Be honest in you <u>motivation letter</u>
 - Why are you a good fit for the program?
 - Why SECCLO, and not any other program?
 - Why are you interested to study in consortium universities? What is of particular interest to you?
 - How does your experience align with the program?
 - How do your professional goals can be reached with the help of the SECCLO program?
- Mindfully choose people for <u>recommendation letters</u>
 - Pick a person who knows about your experience, who won't use general sentences, but who will
 explain your strength in working in the group, doing research, etc.

 - 4 ACP Countries: African countries.
 - *3 ENI South*: Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Palestine, Syria, Tunisia.
 - 2 IPA-Western Balkans: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo, Montenegro
 - 2 Central Asia-L-LMI Countries: Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan.
 - 2 Latin America: Brazil, Mexico.
 - *2 Latin America-Remaining Countries*: Argentina, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, Panama, Peru, Venezuela.
