We are now gearing up towards the next <u>SECEC Congress</u> which will be held in **Munich** on September 4-6 2024. Patric Raiss and Kilian Wegmann are working hard together with the Programme Committee to offer you the best scientific congress experience with new types of sessions and great networking and learning opportunities!

well deserved retirement!

I am glad to say that our association is growing stronger. We are excited to welcome **Roger van Riet** from Belgium as our new President Elect, bringing his specific expertise in elbow surgery, which will undoubtedly enrich our society. Additionally, we have <u>two new committee chairs</u> and <u>twelve new committee</u> <u>members</u>, all of whom are dedicated to advancing our shared goals. Our committees are working on various topics (education/ multicentric studies/ fellowships/ membership...), to offer high-quality content to SECEC members throughout the year.

The SECEC Office is also growing with the recruitment of a new staff member Marie Bougrain (Association Coordinator). Welcome on board everyone!

Lastly, I would like to congratulate the <u>2023 Didier Patte Awardee</u>, **Philipp Moroder** (Switzerland), for his outstanding work entitled "*The ABC of Posterior Shoulder Instability*" which will be published soon. I would also like to mention the two teams (**Raúl Barco et al.** and **Enrico Bellato et al.**) awarded **SECEC research grants** for their very promising projects. Each team will receive **20,000 EUR** to carry out their studies, with results that will undoubtedly benefit SECEC members in the long term.
