As we value our members, we have therefore decided, from the next meeting in Rotterdam onwards, to award all SECEC members a competitive advantage in the selection process. With so many great papers rejected last year, this new rule will not affect the quality of papers accepted but will give our members an improved opportunity to present their work at our annual meeting.
