STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW

- Last week: Florida State was a perfect 4-0 last week, including a walk-off win over Jacksonville on Tuesday and a three game sweep at Notre Dame. The week improved FSU to 18-7, 6-3 in the ACC, and was the first ACC road sweep for the Noles since 2014 at Boston College.
- Parrish shines at Notre Dame: On Saturday, freshman Drew Parrish threw a complete game, three-hitter in Florida State's 5-1 win over Notre Dame. Only twice, in the 4th and 9th innings, did Parrish face more than one batter, and the Irish's lone run came on an error in the 4th inning. It was FSU's first complete game of the season.
- 3 Noles record second seven-run comeback win: On March 21, FSU trailed Jacksonville 7-0 before having an at-bat, and slowly chipped away at the JU lead until freshman J.C. Flowers' walk-off, two-run single with two outs in the ninth inning. Against Oakland (3/3), FSU also trailed 7-0 before winning 18-10.
- Walls leads country in walks: After notching seven walks in the final two games at Notre Dame last week, junior Taylor Walls lead the country with 33 on the season. As a team, the Seminoles have been walked 167 times, 14 more than the next closest school, South Alabama.
- **5 Q among nation's leaders:** Senior first baseman/designated hitter Quincy Nieporte is fourth in the country with 36 RBI. He hit his third and fourth grand slams of the year at Virginia Tech, and he is now the single-season record holder for grand slams in a season at FSU. His four grand slams are the most in the country.
- **6** Holton among nation's best: Two-time ACC Pitcher of the Week Tyler Holton is 4-0 with a 2.31 ERA in six starts this season. At Notre Dame on Friday, the sophomore from Tallahassee pitched 6.1 innings, allowing five runs, and FSU rallied to win in the 13th inning.

Noles on the basepaths: Florida State opened the season a perfect 27-for-27 in stolen bases and are currently 30-34 on the year. The Seminoles had the most stolen bases without being caught in the country. Freshman Nick Derr and junior Dylan Busby are both a perfect 5-for-5 on the year.

B Martin active leader in wins: Head coach Mike Martin, now in his 38th year as head coach at Florida State, is the active wins leader with 1,916. He also is the all-time winningest coach by percentage, with a .738 mark. He needs just 60 wins to pass Augie Garrido's all-time wins record (1,975).

Miscellaneous: FSU sweep at Notre Dame were the first wins at Frank Eck Stadium in school history. FSU was swept in the only previous meeting in Indiana, in 2015...Parrish's complete was the first thrown by an FSU freshman since Sean Gilmartin did it twice in 2009...Walls is fifth nationally with 33 runs scored.

11 GETS WIN NO. 1.900

- Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- For perspective, if a head coach started » coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 34 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,598 as head coach (1980-present).
