VIRGINIA AND FLORIDA STATE REACQUAINT THEMSELVES

- Virginia and Florida State are playing for the first time since a March 20-22, 2015, series in Charlottesville.
- FSU owns a 53-27 edge in the all-time series against Virginia, although UVA head coach Brian O'Connor is 19-18 against the Seminoles.
- Virginia has won five of its last seven series against FSU, but the Seminoles won two of three in 2015 at UVA.
- UVA took two of three from the Seminoles in 2014 in the Cavaliers' last visit to Tallahassee.

NOTING THE NOTRE DAME SERIES

- Virginia batted .339 in the series, while limiting ND to a .235 average.
- UVA trailed for just a half-inning total in its two wins.
- Caleb Knight (4-8, .667 OBP), Cameron Simmons (6-13), Jake McCarthy (5-11) and Andy Weber (4-10) topped the Cavaliers in batting.
- UVA committed five errors which led to four unearned runs.
- The Cavaliers' bullpen allowed two earned runs in 12 2/3 innings.

CAVALIERS MASHING

- UVA has hit 47 home runs, which already is third most in the Brian O'Connor era.
- The top two home run seasons under O'Connor: 2010 (61) and 2009 (59), both of which came with the old bats.
- The Cavaliers hit 42 home runs in 2016 (60 games).
- Eleven Cavaliers have gone deep this year, and UVA is fourth in the ACC in homers.
- Adam Haseley is fifth in the ACC with 12 HR, while Pavin Smith is 11th (10).
- UVA had a streak of 10 straight games with at least one home run snapped Wednesday (longest since 11-game stretch from Feb. 28-March 15, 1998).

RUN, RUN AND RUN SOME MORE

- Virginia has stolen an ACC-high 72 bases this year (in 84 attempts), its most since swiping 72 in 2012 (59 games) and 90 in 2011 (68 games).
- UVA ranks 13th nationally in stolen bases.
- Four Cavaliers already have at least nine stolen bases. UVA's leader in 2016 was Ernie Clement with six.
- Jake McCarthy has an ACC-best 25 steals in 27 tries. He ranks fourth nationally.
- It marks the fourth-most steals in a season for a UVA player and the most since Greg Midat had 30 in 2008.
- UVA stole 27 bases in 60 games last year, its fewest stolen bases during the Brian O'Connor era.

THINGS TO KNOW

- Virginia has stolen an ACC-best 72 bases. With one more stolen base, the Cavaliers will have their most steals since swiping 90 in 2011.
- UVA has five Florida natives on its roster (Coman, Haseley, Shambora, Smith, Sousa).
- Virginia ranks fourth nationally in hits (488).
- UVA leads the ACC in batting in all games (.326) and ACC games (.313) and is sixth nationally.
- UVA has four players among the ACC's top 10 in batting.
- Adam Haseley is on a 10-game hit streak and has reached base in 42 of 43 games, including 25 straight.
- Jake McCarthy was 7-for-16 with six runs in five games last week.

IF YOU DON'T READ ANYTHING ELSE, READ THIS

- Virginia is 13-3 in April with three straight ACC series wins.
- In the first four weeks of the ACC schedule, UVA played UNC and Clemson on the road and Louisville at home; each is currently ranked in the top five (UVA lost two of three games in each series).
- Virginia leads the ACC in batting at .326, with seven regulars hitting over .300.
- Two-way standout Adam Haseley is having an All-America caliber year, batting .396 with 12 homers, 10 doubles and 42 RBI, in addition to pitching on Sundays.
- Cleanup hitter Pavin Smith also has put up big numbers, batting .357 with 10 homers and 54 RBI.
- UVA has one of the nation's most aggressive offenses, and the Cavaliers strike out at a low rate, averaging just 3.7 strikeouts per game. UVA has more walks than strikeouts this year (178/159).
- Fifth-year catcher Robbie Coman is the veteran leadership presence on the team and the lone remaining Cavalier to have played in both the 2014 and 2015 CWS.
- The Cavaliers have picked up their running game this year, swiping an ACC-high 72 bases, including Jake McCarthy's league-best 25 (most at UVA since 2008).
- UVA's rotation has been in flux throughout the season. Haseley is the only pitcher to start each of UVA's first 10 weekends.
- UVA inserted freshman Noah Murdock into the rotation for the UofL series. He has allowed three runs in 22 1/3 innings over four ACC starts.

KNIGHT BOLSTERS OFFENSE

- Caleb Knight has provided a boost to UVA's lineup over the last month, starting 17 games since the Duke series. UVA is 15-2 in his starts.
- In those starts, Knight has gone 23-for-51 (.451) with 14 RBI and 17 runs scored. His on-base percentage is .592 in his 17 starts.
- His four homers all have come in ACC games.
- He was inserted in the lineup as a defensive replacement in the first game against Duke.

SIMMONS HEATS UP

- Cameron Simmons has had a tremendous April, batting .458 (27-59) in 16 games.
- Simmons has upped his batting average to .374, which currently ranks sixth in the ACC.
- He also is batting .403 in ACC games, tops among UVA players and third best in the league.
- He had a career-high 12-game hit streak snapped April 19. He batted .500 (21-42) during that stretch.
- Simmons had his streak of seven straight multiple-hit games broken on April 18. No other UVA player has more than four straight multi-hit games this year.

HASELEY CONTINUES STRONG 2017

- Adam Haseley is putting up team highs in batting (.396), extra-base hits (23) and on base percentage (.495) while hitting in the 3-hole.
- He is on the John Olerud Two-Way Player Award, National Pitcher of the Year and Golden Spikes Award watch lists.
- Haseley also owns a team-high 12 home runs – seven of which have gone to the opposite field. He is tied for ninth in UVA single-season history in homers.
- He ranks third in the ACC in batting and leads the conference in runs (52). He also is second in total bases (113) and OBP (.495), third in hits (65), fourth in slugging (.689) and walks (32), sixth in home runs and eighth in RBI (42).
- Haseley also is 6-1 with a 3.28 ERA in 60 1/3 innings on the mound. He is ninth in the ACC in innings and 14th in ERA.

PAVIN SMITH: NOT YOUR NORMAL POWER HITTER

- Pavin Smith has put up some big numbers in the first half of the season, hitting for power as well as contact.
- Smith ranks as the second toughest to strike out of any player in Division I, with six strikeouts in 168 official at bats (198 plate appearances).
- He is tied for 63rd nationally with 10 home runs.
- Only one other player among the top 75 nationally in home runs has 15 or fewer strikeouts – UVA's Adam Haseley with 15.

DOYLE NAMED TO STOPPER OF YEAR WATCH LIST

- Junior right-hander Tommy Doyle was named to the midseason Stopper of the Year Watch List on Wednesday.
- Doyle is 1-1 with 11 saves in 17 outings this year.
- He is third in the ACC and eighth nationally in saves. Seven of his saves have come in ACC play.
- He has struck out 23 and walked four over 22 1/3 innings out of the bullpen.

BETTINGER OUT OF PEN

- Senior right-hander Alec Bettinger has worn many hats during his career, working as a starter, reliever and closer.
- This year he primarily has worked as a long reliever. In nine of his 14 appearances this year, he has worked more than two innings, including each of his last five outings.
- He is 6-0 with a 2.03 ERA in 40 innings in 2017.

- He is tied for fourth in the ACC with six wins and is now 20-10 in his career.
- Bettinger has appeared in 75 career games (ninth in school history) and is tied for 10th in the program annals with 20 career victories.

TIME TO ... GO TO WORK!

- Pavin Smith and Adam Haseley are the first UVA teammates to each record at least 10 homers in a season since Phil Gosselin (11), Jarrett Parker (10) and Steven Proscia (10) in 2010.
- Haseley (12) is sixth in the ACC in homers; Smith (10) is 13th.
- With 25 career homers, Smith is one round-tripper from reaching the top 10 in program history. He also has cracked the top 10 in RBI at 155 (ninth place).

OFFENSE LOOKS TO KEEP HUMMING

- Virginia tops the ACC in batting in all games (.326) as well as ACC games (.313)
- UVA already has faced the conference's top three teams in ERA (North Carolina, Louisville, Clemson).
- In ranking 10th nationally in scoring at 8.0 runs per game, UVA is fourth among all Division I teams in hits (488) and sixth in batting.

WHATEVER IT TAKES

- A key part of Virginia's scoring numbers has come from execution.
- UVA is second nationally in sacrifice flies with 28 (FSU is No. 1 with 30) and 13th in sacrifice bunts with 38.
- UVA also has been hit by 50 pitches, which is fourth most in the conference and 38th nationally.

AGGRESSIVE CAVALIERS PUT BALL IN PLAY

- Virginia batters have struck out an ACC-low 159 times in 43 games (3.7 strikeouts per game).
- That total by far the fewest among ACC teams (Louisville, 228), and less than half the total of six teams.
- UVA is the only ACC team to walk more than it has struck out (178 BB).
- The Cavaliers have struck out five or fewer times in 37 of 43 games. That figures to be challenged this weekend as FSU's pitching staff ranks second in the ACC in strikeouts (395).
- Ernie Clement (first), Pavin Smith (second) and Robbie Coman (sixth) all rank among the top 10 nationally in toughest to strike out and are the three toughest in the ACC.

BIG INNINGS PLAGUE CAVALIERS

- Virginia has given up 16 innings of four or more runs this year, including 11 in ACC play.
- In seven of UVA's nine ACC defeats, the Cavaliers surrendered at least one inning of four-plus runs.
- UVA allowed 12 innings of four or more runs in 2016 and 16 in 2015.

HASELEY, SMITH NAMED TO MIDSEASON GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

- Virginia's junior duo of Adam Haseley and Pavin Smith were named to the 40-man midseason watch list for the Golden Spikes Award.
- UVA is one of six schools to have two players on the list.
- Haseley was named to the midseason watch list for the second year in a row.
- The semifinalists will be named May 31, with the finalists unveiled on June 14. The trophy will be presented June 29 in Los Angeles.

O'CONNOR REACHES 600 WINS

- Brian O'Connor won his 600th career game on Feb. 21 against VMI. He was the 10th coach in ACC history to reach the 600-win plateau and, in 825 games, the second-fastest in league history to hit 600 wins (Mike Martin, 802 games).
- Now with 629 career wins, O'Connor ranks ninth in league history.
- The winningest coach in program history, O'Connor also holds the UVA record for career ACC wins (256) and NCAA tournament wins (47).

IN THE POLLS

- Virginia is ranked as high as No. 8 in the latest polls (NCBWA). UVA is 10th in the USA Today Coaches poll.
- UVA is 3-6 against ranked teams this year, all of whom currently are ranked in the top five.
- UVA has played nine games against teams currently ranked in the USA Today poll: Louisville (2), Clemson (3) and North Carolina (4). FSU is receiving votes in the NCBWA poll.
- The Cavaliers do not play Wake Forest (19) in league play this year.

RECORDS WATCH

- Having pitched in 75 career games, RHP Alec Bettinger is ninth in UVA history. He will move into an eighth-place tie with Justin Thompson (2009-12) with his next outing.
- With 10 career saves, he needs two saves to reach the top 10 in UVA history.
- Adam Haseley stands seventh in school history with 169 runs scored and needs six to pass David Stone (1999-2002) and seven to eclipse Adam Robinson (1994-97) for fifth.
- Haseley is ninth in program history with 10 triples and will move into a fifth-place tie with his next triple.
- Pavin Smith (25 HR) is one long ball shy of the top 10 at

- Jake McCarthy (25 SB) is fourth in single-season stolen bases and needs one to reach the No. 3 slot. The record is 32, set by Greg Miclat in 2007.

O'CONNOR RANKS THIRD IN ACTIVE WIN PCT., 18TH ALL-TIME

- Virginia head coach Brian O'Connor is 629-233-2 (.729) in his 14th season as UVA's head coach.
- O'Connor surpassed Dennis Womack (594 wins, 1981-2003) as the winningest coach in program history on May 28, 2016, against Louisville.
- O'Connor's 72.7 percent winning percentage entering the season ranked No. 3 among active Division I head coaches.
- O'Connor also ranks 18th all-time in career winning percentage among all coaches with at least 10 years of head coaching experience.
- Virginia won at least 38 games in each of O'Connor's first 13 seasons, including 10 40-win seasons and four 50-win campaigns.

RECENT PROGRAM NOTES

- Virginia owns the most wins in the nation this decade (367).
- UVA has won 529 games since 2004 – an average of more than 45 victories per season.
- UVA has four 50-win seasons: 2010 (51), 2011 (56), 2013 (50) and 2014 (53).
- UVA has recorded at least 38 wins each of the last 13 years, including 10 40-win seasons.
- Every UVA recruiting class since 2005-06 that has completed its eligibility has played in at least one College World Series.

THE TOURNAMENT STREAK

CAVALIERS TOP ACC IN BATTING SINCE 2009

- Virginia owns the ACC's top offense over the past eight years with a combined .303 average and is tops this year (.326).

 - Moving the UVA bullpen to left field to make room for chairback seats along the third baseline.
 - New concessions, merchandise, and restroom facilities.
 - Areas for player training and development, including an indoor pitching development center.
 - New offices for the baseball coaches.
