STARTING 9: WHAT TO KNOW

- Against Pacific: Florida State and Pacific are squaring off for the first time in a four-game series May 5-7. The original three-game series was turned into a four-game set due to FSU's rain out at Miami on April 23. The series will be FSU's first four-game set since the Grambling State series in 2009.
- Against the WCC: Florida State has only played three games against teams currently in the West Coast Conference, all in the postseason: a 7-1 win over BYU in the 1994 Tallahassee Regional, a 5-1 win over Santa Clara in the 1962 College World Series and an 11-6 loss to Santa Clara in the 1962 College World Series.
- **13 Last weekend:** Florida State lost 2-of-3 to No. 14 Virginia. The Seminoles beat the Cavaliers, 6-4, on Friday night, behind three home runs from **Dylan Busby**, **Jackson Lueck** and **Drew Mendoza**. Busby and Lueck's home runs were back-to-back in the first inning, and Mendoza's two-run HR broke a 4-4 tie in the sixth inning.
- **Busby National POTW: Dylan Busby** was named the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week (4/25) after going 8-for-18 with three HR, two doubles and 10 RBI in four games. Busby hit two home runs against Stetson (4/18) and had three RBI in five straight games, the first player in FSU history to do so.
- **Busby** was also named the ACC Player of the Week for the first time in his career. Since missing the Florida game (4/11), Busby is hitting .381 (16-for-42) with 4 doubles, 6 home runs and 20 RBI. His average has jumped 29 points to .299 in that span.
- Holton among nation's best: Tyler Holton is the fourth FSU pitcher to earn three ACC Pitcher of the Week honors in one season after throwing seven innings of no-hit ball against No. 7 North Carolina. He is one of 40 players on the Midseason Watch List for the Golden Spikes Award, given to the nation's top player.
- Stopper of the Year: Reliever Drew Carlton was named one of 40 players on the midseason Stopper of the Year list, the NCBWA announced. Carlton has a 1.11 ERA in 32.1 relief innings, with 30 strikeouts and just 8 walks. The junior also has all four of FSU's saves on the season and a pair of wins.
- Martin's 3,000th game: Game 1 against Virginia (4/28) was head coach Mike Martin's 3,000th as a member of Florida State (Player 96 1965-66; Asst. Coach 288 1975-79; Head Coach 2,618 1980-Present). Martin is the NCAA active leader in wins (1,925) & pct. (.736) and just 51 wins from the all-time mark (Augie Garrido, 1,975).
- J.D. Drew jersey retired: Florida State baseball retired the No. 39 jersey of J.D. Drew (1995-97) on April 15. Drew, a two-time All-American and the only member of the 30 HR/30 SB club in college (1997), is just the second FSU player to have his jersey/number retired (No. 34 Dick Howser).

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005

MARTIN (CONT.)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1.900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program.
- » Martin participated in his 3,000th game against as a Seminole vs. Virginia on April 28 - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,618 as head coach (1980-present).
- » Here is a look at the other milestone wins of Martin's illustrious career:

OPP. NOTES vs. PAC

AGAINST THE TIGERS

- » This is Florida State's first game against the University of the Pacific, and just the fourth game against a team currently in the West Coast Conference.
- » The previous meetings against the league, vs. BYU and Santa Clara, took place in the postseason. FSU beat BYU 7-1 in the 1994 Regionals in Tallahassee.
- » In 1962, FSU and Santa Clara split a pair of games in the College World Series. FSU beat Santa Clara 5-1 before being eliminated by SC 11-6 three days later.
- » Pacific coach Mike Neu is in his second season leading the Tigers. Neu was a member of the 1999 Miami team that beat head coach Mike Martin and Florida State in the National Championship game. Neu was named to the All-Tournament Team that season after appearing in four games in Omaha.

- Tallahassee native Tyler Holton continues to show why he is one of the top pitchers in college baseball this season, with a 3.00 ERA and 5-2 record in 11 starts.
- Holton is a three-time ACC Pitcher of the Week, joining Paul Wilson (1993 & 1994), Mike Ziegler (2000) and Sean Gilmartin (2011) as the only FSU pitchers to earn the award three times in one season.
- Against No. 4 Clemson (4/16), Holton threw a career-high 8.0 innings, allowing three runs while striking out nine.
- Holton was stellar against No. 8 North Carolina (4/1), pitching a no-hitter before being pulled after 109 pitches in the eighth inning. He walked only one batter, his final of the game, and struck out 8.
- Against Oakland (3/4). Holton struck out a career-high 13 batters in just six innings of work without allowing a walk.

- » At UCF (3/8), redshirt junior Will Zirzow pitched a career-high five innings, allowing one hit & striking out a career-high seven in earning the win in a 5-0 shutout.
- Only two batters reached base against Big Z a single that was erased on a pickoff, and a strikeout that reached on an error that was then erased on a double play.

WALLS NAMED ALL-AMERICAN

- Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America in 2016.
- The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State in 2016 and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
- To begin 2017, Walls has seven doubles, two triples and five home runs, including two that led off games. He is eighth nationally in walks with 40 and 35th with 46 runs scored.
