# **STARTING 9:** NOLES PLAY in 40TH CONSECUTIVE NCAA TOURNEY

- NCAA Tournament: Florida State is hosting a regional for a 7th-straight season and now holds the nation's longest streak of postseason appearances at 40, including all 38 years under head coach Mike Martin. The Seminoles will host Tennessee Tech (Friday, 6 p.m.) as well as UCF and Auburn. It is the 55th appearance in 70 seasons for FSU.
- Last time out: Florida State went 4-0 in the ACC Championship, including a 7-3 win over No. 2 North Carolina in the Championship Game on Sunday. The win was FSU's 7th ACC Championship, and second in the past three seasons.

  Drew Mendoza hit two HR in the title game, and MVP Jackson Lueck was 7-for-16 in the tournament with two HR.
- **31** All-ACC: Five Seminoles were named to the All-ACC & All-Freshman teams, the league announced last week. Sophomore **Tyler Holton** is one of three First Team starting pitchers; **Quincy Nieporte** is Second Team DH, and **Dylan Busby** is Third Team 3B. **J.C. Flowers** (OF) and **Drew Mendoza** (1B) both earned All-Freshman nods.
- Holton pitching: Tyler Holton is just the second pitcher in ACC history to earn Pitcher of the Week honors five times in one season Mike Rogers (NC State). The First Team All-ACC selection has 10+ K's in five games this year, the first player since Jonathan Johnson (6 in 1995) to do so for Florida State.
- Holton 10+ K: Holton has tallied 119 strikeouts this season, second-most in the ACC behind Player of the Year Brendan McKay. Over the course of a week against No. 2/5 Louisville, Holton struck out 21 batters in 16 innings (11 in regular season finale, 5/19; 10 in ACC Championship pool play, 5/26).
- **Quincy Nieporte:** Senior designated hitter **Quincy Nieporte** has 70 runs batted in this season after recording 7 in two games at No. 2 Louisville and two in the ACC Championship. Q's 70 runs batted in are the most for a Seminole since **Mike McGee** had 73 in 2010. Nieporte also has four grand slams this season, the most in the country.
- **T** Busby National POTW: Dylan Busby was named the NCBWA National Hitter of the Week (4/25) after going 8-for-18 with three HR, two doubles and 10 RBI in four games. Busby also hit .444 in the ACC Championship, with four doubles and a two-run home run against Duke, to earn All-Tournament honors at third base.
- Martin's 3,000th game: Game 1 against Virginia (4/28) was head coach Mike Martin's 3,000th as a member of Florida State (Player 96 1965-66; Asst. Coach 288 1975-79; Head Coach 2,632 1980-Present). Martin is the NCAA active leader in wins (1,937) & pct. (,737) and just 39 wins from the all-time mark (Augie Garrido, 1,975).
- J.D. Drew jersey retired: Florida State baseball retired the No. 39 jersey of J.D. Drew (1995-97) on April 15. Drew, a two-time All-American and the only member of the 30 HR/30 SB club in college (1997), is just the second FSU player to have his jersey/number retired (No. 34 Dick Howser).

# THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL. MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.737)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,937)
- » has led Florida State to 38 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances (40 overall for FSU)
- » has taken the Noles on 15 trips to the College World Series

# MARTIN (CONT.)

# 11 GETS WIN NO. 1.900

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program.
- » Martin participated in his 3,000th game against as a Seminole vs. Virginia on April 28 - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,632 as head coach (1980-present).
- » Here is a look at the other milestone wins of Martin's illustrious career:



#### **NOLES WIN 7TH ACC CHAMPIONSHIP**

- Florida State became just the second 8-seed to win the ACC Baseball Championship, going 4-0 last week in Louisville, Ky., to secure the league's automatic bid.
- FSU beat 12-seed Notre Dame and 1-seed Louisville in pool play, before beating 9-seed Duke and 2-seed North Carolina in the semifinals and finals, respectively.
- Four Seminoles were named to the All-Tournament team, led by MVP Jackson Lueck.
- First baseman Drew Mendoza, third baseman Dylan Busby and starting pitcher Tyler Holton also earned All-Tournament honors
- Against Notre Dame, starting pitcher Drew Parrish allowed just one earned run in six innings, and Lueck reached base in all six plate appearances (three hits,
- Lueck had a first-inning single and a pair of two-run home runs, including the walk-off in the bottom of the 12th inning that moved FSU to 4-0 on the season against the Irish.
- Playing Louisville for the third time in a week, the Seminoles used a powerful effort from Tyler Holton to reach the semifinals. Holton struck out 10 and allowed just four hits in eight innings in the 6-2 win.
- Against Duke, starting pitcher Cole Sands set career-highs in innings pitched (6.2) and strikeouts (8) in FSU's 5-1 win. Sands would have pitched longer, but a 90-minute weather delay effectively ended his day.
- In the Championship Game, the Seminoles fell behind

- 3-0 in the second inning, but clawed back for a 7-3 win. It was the third consecutive season the Seminoles have played in the Championship Game, winning the title in 2015 against NC State and falling to Clemson
- in 2016. FSU scored six runs against North Carolina reliever Josh Hiatt, who entered the game having allowed just five on the season and none in his past 15 appear-
- Drew Mendoza hit a pair of home runs off Hiatt, in the 7th and 8th innings. FSU took the lead in the 8th on Cal Raleigh RBI single, followed by Mendoza's threerun home run.

# FSU PITCHING DOMINATES

- Going 4-0 in the ACC Tournament, Florida State pitching tallied a 1.62 earned run average, allowing just seven ER in 39.0 innings.
- The team combined to allow just 30 hits and 10 walks while striking out 41, with opponents hitting .205 against the unit.
- Cole Sands, Tyler Holton, Andrew Karp and Alec Byrd each picked up wins in the tournament.

#### BUSBY, LUECK LEAD BATS

- Sophomore Jackson Lueck hit .438 with 7 RBI and a .550 OBP over four games en route to MVP honors.
- Dylan Busby led FSŬ with a .444 average, four doubles and a home run, adding 15 RBI and a .524 average.
- Combined, the two were 15-for-34 with five doubles, a

- triple and three home runs.
- Lueck and Drew Mendoza each had 2-HR games in the tournament as well. Entering the ACC Championship, FSII had just two multi-HR games on the season

#### TOURNAMENT HELD IN LOUISVILLE, KY.

- For the first time in league history, the ACC Championship was held in Louisville at Louisville Slugger Field, the Triple A home for the Louisville Bats.
- It is the 12th different city to host the ACC Championship. FSU previously won titles in Durham, N.C.; Greensboro, N.C.; Greenville, S.C.; Salem, Va.; and St. Petersburg, Fla.
- FSU has won 11 games over the last three Championships, going a perfect 4-0 in 2015 and 2017 and 3-1 in 2016. The 11 wins since 2015 are the most in a threeyear span since winning 13 from 2002-04.
- With four selections to the All-Tournament Team. Florida State tied Clemson (60) for the most all-time selections, though FSU missed the first five tournaments before joining the league in 1992.

#### **EXTRA INNING WINS**

- FSU beat Notre, 5-3, in 12 innings in game one of the tournament. It was FSU's first extra-innings win the event since beating North Carolina, 3-2, in 12 innings
- FSU improved to 4-3 all-time in extra innings games. Before Wednesday, FSU's last extra-inning game in the ACC Championship was a 7-4 loss to Virginia in 2013.

#### **8-SEED WINS IT ALL**

- FSU was the 8-seed in the 2017 ACC Championship, the lowest in FSU's 26 appearances in the tournament.
- FSU is just the second 8-seed to win the tournament, joining Georgia Tech in 2012. In 2014, the Yellow Jackets became the only 9-seed or lower to win the event.

- J.C. Flowers added FSU's seventh assist against Jack-sonville (5/9), gunning a runner down at the plate. FSU entered the NC State (4/9) game with three out-
- field assists on the season. In the 5th inning against the Wolfpack, Aplin and Flowers each had an assist.
- At Louisville (5/19), Jackson Lueck had his first two assists of the season, including one in the seventh inning at the plate to help preserve FSU's lead.
- Lueck is the first player with two in one game since Steven Wells had a pair against Miami (5/21) in 2016.
- Wells had perhaps FSU's biggest assist this season, throwing out a runner after a pop fly in the ACC Championship opener against Notre Dame in the 11th inning. FSU would go on to win the game in 12 innings.

#### **NOLES SWEEP IRISH**

- When FSU swept Notre Dame on March 24 and 25, it was the first three-game road sweep for Florida State since winning three times at Boston College in 2014.
- » It was FSU's first time winning a game at Frank Eck Stadium after the Noles were swept in 2015. Notre Dame joined the ACC prior to the 2014 season.
- FSU added a 5-3, 12-inning win over the Irish in the ACC Tournament (5/24).
- The sweep was the fifth for the Seminoles since 2010, and only once in that span has FSU swept two opponents on the road in one season:

#### **WALK-OFF WINS**

- For the first time this season, FSU won on a walk-off hit when freshman J.C. Flowers' two-run single capped FSU's 10-9 comeback win vs. Jacksonville (3/21).
- » The Seminoles trailed 7-0 after the top of the first inning, the second time this year that FSU rallied from a 7-0 deficit (Oakland, 3/3).
- » Against the Dolphins, the FSU bullpen allowed just one earned run in 8.1 innings, striking out 8 without walking a batter.
- » Against FGCU on April 4, Jackson Lueck tallied his third hit of the game, an RBI double that scored Taylor Walls in FSU's 7-6 win.
