#### **STARTING 9: NOLES HEAD EAST ON I-10 FOR FIRST ROAD GAME**

- Tuesday: Florida State faces Jacksonville for the first of three games in 2017. Tuesday's game is scheduled for 5:00 p.m. at John Sessions Stadium in Jacksonville. FSU holds a 124-40 all-time lead in the series, dating back to 1960. Jacksonville has won each of the last two (in 2016) - JU's longest win streak in the series is three games.
- Last time out: the Seminoles swept Samford to improve to 5-2 on the season. Florida State outscored the Bulldogs 37-7 on the weekend and won by scores of 16-3, 8-0, and 13-4. Sunday starter Drew Parrish threw six innings of two-hit ball, allowing one run and striking out six, in his first career start.
- Last year against Jacksonville: the Dolphins swept FSU in two games, 7-3 in Tallahassee and 6-2 in Jacksonville. It was the first time the Seminoles got swept by JU since 1991, when the teams played only one game. JU has won three straight games against FSU only twice before - in 1972 and 1982.
- In the Polls: Florida State remains in the Top 10 across all six polls this week, peaking at No. 2 in the Baseball America poll, where they began the season.
- Florida State's starting pitching has dominated through the first seven games, compiling a 1.28 earned run average in 42.1 innings pitched. Tyler Holton (0.69 ERA) and Cole Sands (1.69) are both 2-0; Andrew Karp went 7.0 IP and had 9 K vs. USF; and Drew Parrish is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA after allowing just one earned run against Samford.
- FSU Newcomers: The three players with the highest batting average are all newcomers freshman Nick Derr (.471), JUCO transfer Rhett Aplin (.400) and freshman J.C. Flowers (.381). Those three have combined for 22 hits, 4 doubles, 3 home runs, 18 runs and 18 RBI while drawing 11 walks.
- FSU Newcomers: On the mound, four freshman have played this season. Drew Parrish threw 6.0 innings against Samford in his first start, allowing just one run. Clayton Kwiatkowski and Grant Stewart allowed no runs in their first FSU action against Samford, and Brandon Reitz allowed one run against the Bulldogs.
- Top in the ACC: Junior All-American shortstop Taylor Walls leads the Atlantic Coast Conference with 13 walks in R seven games this season, including a season-high three against Samford on Sunday. Despite hitting .211, Walls ranks second on the team with a .515 on-base percentage while striking out only four times.

ACC Player of the Week: With his 11-strikeout performance last week against Samford. Tyler Holton earned ACC g Pitcher of the Week honors on Monday. Holton allowed just two hits in seven innings in FSU's 8-0 win. He is the first Seminole to earn Pitcher of the Week honors since 2015 (Boomer Biegalski).

#### <u>11 GETS WIN NO. 1,900</u>

- » Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU on February 19.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 36 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,580 as head coach (1980-present).

# GAME NOTES vs. JU

#### AGAINST THE DOLPHINS

- Florida State and Jacksonville will face off for the first of three times in 2017, and the only time in Jacksonville.
- » FSU and Jacksonville have played annually since the first meeting in 1960, with the exception of 1962-63 and 1992.
- » Florida State leads the all-time series, 124-40, and hold a 43-27 edge in Jacksonville. JU has won each of the last two games in the series and is looking for a three game winning streak for just the third time in series history.
- » FSU's last win in Jacksonville was in 2014, when the Noles beat JU 12-6 on February 18.
- Outside of the Florida and Miami series, Florida State has played Jacksonville more than any other opponent (164 times).
- » While Jacksonville is looking to tie its longest winning streak in the series at three, FSU's longest streak is 20 straight wins from 1994-2002.

#### AGAINST THE ATLANTIC SUN

- FSU will play three teams from the Atlantic Sun in 2017: Jacksonville three times; Stetson for three mid-week games in April; and Florida Gulf Coast in for three games in March and April.

#### PITCHING SHINES TO BEGIN YEAR

- » Seminole pitching has been great to open the year, with the team holding a 2.29 ERA through seven games.
- » FSU's starting pitching has a remarkable 1.28 ERA between five pitchers - Cole Sands, Tyler Holton, Drew Parrish, Andrew Karp, and Drew Carlton.
- » Sands and Holton are both 2-0 on the year, and Parrish picked up the first win of his career on Sunday against Samford.
- » Tyler Holton struck out a career-high 11 Bulldogs on Saturday, becoming the first Seminole to reach 10+ strikeouts since Mike Compton had 11 against Coastal Carolina in 2015.
- » Drew Carlton, a hard luck loser in the season opener against VCU, allowed just two earned runs in 5.2 innings. He struck out four and walked zero. It was the second consecutive start that Carlton has not walked a batter after last season's 3-0 win in the Super Regionals at Florida.
- In that game against Florida last season, Carlton threw a complete-game shutout, FSU's first shutout in 15 appearances in the Super Regionals.
- Andrew Karp, the Noles midweek starter, allowed no runs and struck out nine against USF (2/21). It was the most strikeouts for Karp in his career and the longest outing (7.0).
- » For just the fourth time in school history, the Seminoles have allowed no more than four runs in any of the first seven games of a season.

#### WALLS NAMED 2016 ALL-AMERICAN

- Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.
- » The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- Walls also earned thid team marks from NCBWA and DIBaseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.
- To begin 2017, Walls has a .333 average with three of his four hits going for doubles. He leads FSU with 5 runs scored, 6 RBI and 6 walks. His .556 on-base percentage ranks 10th in the ACC through the opening week.
