KARP MAKES THIRD CAREER START

Last week: After a season-opening loss that snapped an 18-game win streak on Opening Day, FSU outscored VCU 23-6 over the last two games to take the series 2-1. FSU won 12-3 on Saturday and 11-3 on Sunday. **Sunday's win was the 1,900th win of head coach Mike Martin's career**, becoming just the second coach all-time to reach that mark. Martin is 75 wins shy of tying Augie Garrido for the all-time mark.

Newcomers shine: Led by **Nick Derr** and **J.C. Flowers**, the Seminole newcomers more than held their own at the plate last weekend. Derr was 5-for-8 with three runs scored, Flowers was 4-for-9 with three runs and a pair of RBI, and junior college transfer **Rhett Aplin** hit FSU's first home run of the season, a towering shot to the circus in right field. All told, first-year Noles were 11-for-24.

Along with Flowers and Derr, LF **Jackson Lueck** and SS **Taylor Walls** also hit over .400 during the opening weekend. Walls, a 2016 first team All-American, hit 4-for-10 with 3 doubles, 4 runs scored and 6 RBI and tallied 4 walks. Lueck had FSU's lone hit Friday and went 5-for-12 with 3 RBI and a run scored. **Quincy Nieporte**, FSU's first baseman, had 4 RBI and 3 runs scored, including a home run to left on Sunday.

Florida State's starting pitching was masterful opening weekend. All told, **Drew Carlton**, **Cole Sands**, and **Tyler Holton** combined to go 2-1 in 17.1 innings pitched, allowing 16 hits and six runs (three earned runs) while striking out 14 and walking just three (1.56 ERA). Sands finished one out shy of tying his career high of six innings pitched, while Holton was one K away from matching his high of nine.

In Saturday's game against VCU, freshman **Tyler Daughtry** registered four walks against the Rams, just one shy of the school record of five, done three times, most recently by Stephen Drew against Siena in 2003...Martin is the winningest-active coach and has the highest winning percentage among active coaches with at least five years experience.

THE WINNINGEST ACTIVE COACH IN COLLEGE BASEBALL, MARTIN...

- » was inducted into the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame January 5, 2007
- » was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2005
- » has 24 50-win seasons (no other coach at FSU has one)
- » owns the highest career winning percentage among active DI collegiate coaches (.738)
- » owns the second-most wins all-time in NCAA Division I baseball history and most among active coaches (1,900)
- » has led Florida State to 37 consecutive NCAA Regional appearances
- » has taken the Noles on 15 trips to the College World Series
- » has overseen 17 conference championships (11 Metro Conference, 6 Atlantic Coast Conference - 95, 97, 02, 04, 10, 15)
- » coached eight consecutive ACC Atlantic Division Championships (2007-2014) including setting the school record for the most conference wins in a season with a 24-6 mark in 2008 & 2012

MARTIN (CONT.)

11 GETS WIN NO. 1,900

- » On Sunday, Florida State head coach Mike Martin won the 1,900th game of his 38-year career in FSU's 11-3 win over VCU.
- » For perspective, if a head coach started coaching today and went 56-0 each season (the maximum number of regular season games a team can play under current NCAA rules), it would take almost 34 seasons for a coach to get 1,900 career wins.
- » Martin becomes just the second coach in NCAA history to reach 1,900 career wins and the first to do so at one program. In fact, Martin is just 40 games away from participating in his 3,000th FSU baseball game - 96 as a player (1965-66), 288 as assistant coach (1975-79) and 2,576 as head coach (1980-present).

GAME NOTES vs. USF

AGAINST THE BULLS

- » The fifth-ranked Seminoles enter Tuesday's game against the Bulls on a 15-game winning streak against USF. FSU's last loss against the Bulls was March 1, 1989, in Tampa.
- » USF's last win in Tallahassee came earlier that season, on Feb. 25, when USF notched its second shutout in series history, 10-0.
- » Florida State leads the all-time series against USF, 73-16, including a stellar 47-4 mark in Tallahassee.
- » The series began in 1969 and FSU won the first six meetings.
- » The team's met nearly every season from 1969 to 1989, but played only three regular season games from 1989 to 2013 (1998-2000).
- » The series was renewed in 2013, and FSU has won all eight games in that time span.
- » The teams have met five times in the postseason, most recently in the Tallahassee Regional in 2002, a 13-6 FSU victory.

AGAINST THE AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

- » USF is the first of two programs in the American Athletic Conference that FSU will face in 2017 (UCF, March 8-9 in Orlando).
- » Against teams currently in the American Athletic Conference, FSU holds a 212-61 record.

- » Sands (5.2 IP, 0 ER) finished just one out shy of tying his career high of 6.0 innings pitched.
- » On Sunday, Holton threw 6.0 innings and struck out eight Rams, one shy of his career high of nine from last season.
- » Drew Carlton, a hard luck loser in Friday's season opener, allowed just two earned runs in 5.2 innings. He struck out four and walked zero. It was the second consecutive game Carlton has not walked a batter after last season's 3-0 win in the Super Regionals at Florida.
- » In that game against Florida last season, Carlton threw a complete-game shutout, FSU's first shutout in 15 appearances in the Super Regionals.

NEWCOMERS IMPRESS

- » Seven Seminoles made the first appearances of their careers in the opening series against VCU.
- » Five players - Nick Derr (LF), Rhett Aplin (LF), J.C. Flowers (CF), Kyle Cavanaugh (DH) and Tyler Daughtry (DH) made the first starts of their career.

saw action against VCU, and Byrd was the only pitcher on the staff to play in more than one game.

- » For the opening weekend, the bullpen allowed just three runs in 9.2 innings of work, giving up seven hits while turning in a 9/2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

WALLS NAMED 2016 ALL-AMERICAN

- » Taylor Walls, one of the top shortstops in the country, was named the 43rd first team All-American in school history after earning the honor by Baseball America.
- » The Cordele, Ga., native started all 63 games for Florida State and became just the third first team All-American shortstop at FSU, joining Dick Howser (1957-58) and Stephen Cardullo (2009).
- » Walls also earned third team marks from NCBWA and D1Baseball.com. Walls led FSU with 72 runs scored (No. 2 in the country) and had a .355 average on 88 hits.
- » Over the past summer, Walls played for the USA Collegiate National Team, leading the team with a .405 on-base percentage in 19 games.

NOLES SPREAD OUT TO PLAY SUMMER BALL

- » Thirteen current Seminoles played summer ball throughout the country this season, including shortstop Taylor Walls and pitcher Cole Sands on the Team USA Collegiate National Team. 
